Snyder is top of SHS Class of 2015; Polkowski is named SHS Salutatorian

The top two graduates for Salado High School graduating class of 2015 are Valedictorian Barrett Snyder and Salutatorian Orion Polkowski.

Salado High School Valedictorian Barrett Snyder will attend Washington & Lee University in Lexington, Virginia this fall, after graduating Salado High School with a career full of activity in athletics, academics and art.

The son of Dan and Laura Snyder, Barrett will graduate at the top of his class with a grade of 105.79. His sister Alyssa is a sophomore at Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio.

Snyder will study Business Administration at Washington & Lee University and says he will return after college to work in the family business.

Barrett played baseball for four years at Salado High. He played both catcher and first baseman and was named to the 2014 First Team All District team at his first baseman position. This year, Barrett was Team Captain of the District Champion Eagles and was named to All-District Second Team as catcher.

All four years, the Eagles made the playoffs, including a run that ended in the state semi-final round. Barrett says he will have "the special memories I made and shared on the baseball team."

In high school and junior high, Barrett received several distinctions for his artwork. Congressman John Carter's office awarded him first place in the drawing category of its 2013 Congressional Art Competition.

Snyder also earned a Superior Rating at the Regional and State Levels for his ink drawing "Rat Rod" in the 2014 Texas Art Education Association Visual Art Scholastic Event.

His ink drawing "Rattlesnake" earned Superior Ratings at the Regional and State VASE and was distinguished by the judges as one of their favorites.

His Ink Wash "Telephone Pole" earned a 2012 Superior Rating at the Regional and State VASE

SB frontage will remain closed until new construction completed

Texas Department of Transportation has closed the southbound access road (west side of interstate) in Salado south of Thomas Arnold Road until the construction of the new access road and access road bridge over Salado Creek.

Shortly after the flooding early last week, TXDOT announced the closure of the southbound access road over Salado Creek.

"Due to the severity of the damage they found when they examined the old southbound access-road lanes, they are not going to try to repair it," Jodi Wheatley, public information office for TXDOT Waco District I-35 told *Salado Village Voice*.

Wheatley stated that James Construction is working to turn the northbound access road from FM 2268 to Thomas Arnold two-way to relieve traffic feeding onto Main Street. But as of press-time late in the afternoon June 2, traffic is still being directed to travel south on Main Street until it reaches the access road and then south to the FM 2268 overpass.

TXDOT stated last week that it expected the northbound frontage road to be two-way from FM 2268 to Thomas Arnold no later than late in the af-

ternoon on May 29. Then it was pushed to June 1.

"Because this was an unplanned emergency situation, the contractor did not have the required signage on hand to complete the second stage for the detour setup," Wheatley said of James Construction, which is the contractor on the \$70.4 million expansion of I-35 through Salado. "New signs are being made and the lanes will be re-stripped to make the conversion of the east-side access road to two-way complete by Monday morning (June 1), if at all possible."

Wheatley said that there is no date for the completion of the southbound access road south of Thomas Arnold.

According to Wheatley, the decision to close the southbound access road south of Thomas Arnold was not an easy one: "The section of the access road at the creek suffered breaks in the surface asphalt layer, which allowed the rushing water to get under it and cause more damage to both the asphalt and the road base, which was washed out pretty badly."

Wheatley added that she spoke to the project manager and that it was determined that "It would

Sen. Fraser: 'I won't seek another term'

State Senator Troy Fraser announced June 2 that he will not seek another term for the Texas Senate.

"It is with a heavy heart, an overwhelming sense of pride, and not an ounce of regret, that I am announcing I will not seek another term for Texas Senate," Sen. Fraser said in his announcement.

Sen. Fraser said that he ran for office in 1988 because he was "frustrat-

ed with the overreach of government and wanted to make a difference," adding, "I saw firsthand that the workers' compensation insurance market was crippling our state's economy."

"Little did I know I would be here nearly three decades later, still striving to make a difference," Sen. Fraser said.

A slow/right lane closure on the northbound mainlane from North Main St. to Fm 2484 is scheduled for overnight June 8. The closure will begin at 7 p.m. June 8 and will re-open 7 a.m. June 9. The lane will be closed to reset portable barrier for the detour.

take a complete rebuild rather than just repairs to the access road there, which would slow down the construction work on the mainlanes and would also be very expensive and then in just a few months it would have to be torn out again permanently."

Using the northbound access road as a two-way road "will save time and money and should actually make the mainlane construction go faster because access will be easier for the work crews." Apparently the access road bridge that has been closed is unsafe for cars and traffic, but safe enough for construction trucks and equipment.

"It was a hard decision," Wheatley said. "It is safer not potentially confuse driver by making the access road one-way, the two-way and the one-way again, but this is a tough situation and the made a difficult decision."

"There have been so many delays already they really didn't want to sub-

ject Salado to more if we didn't have to," Wheatley said, adding that work crews "will be able to do some preparatory work on the closed area of the southbound access road while they are working on the new mainlanes."

"All of it is expected to take several months," Wheatley said.

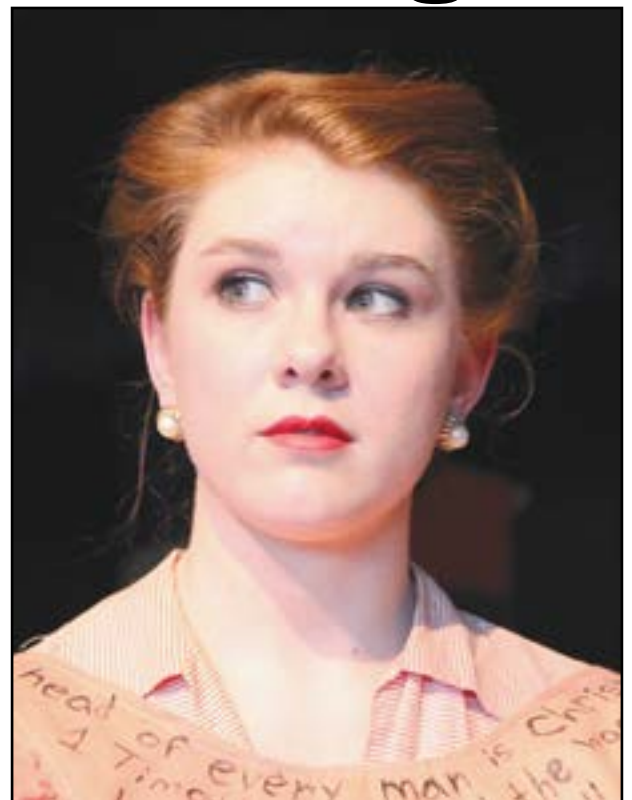
One-Act Play is runner-up in state; Clay Best Actress

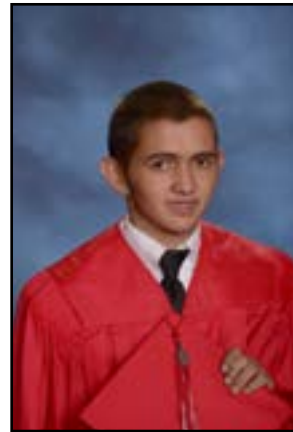

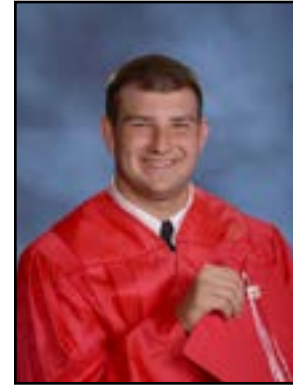

It all started when Ray Benson, Floyd Domino, and Lucky Oceans, along with a Vermont farm boy named Leroy Preston; Virginian Chris O'Connell;

and Gene Dobkin, a bass player and fellow classmate of Benson's from Antioch College in Yellow Springs, Ohio, joined

forces. They began with a simple goal: to play and help revive American roots music. Since their inception, the band has won nine Grammy awards, released more than 20 studio albums and charted more than 20 singles on the Billboard country charts.

In 1971, the band signed their first record deal after Van Morrison mentioned they "play great country music" in an interview in Rolling Stone. Their debut record, Comin' Right At Ya, was released in 1973 on United Artists. The release of Texas Gold in 1975 brought the band national recognition, with the single "The Letter That Johnny Walker

Read" becoming a top-ten country hit. The band has been awarded "Touring Band of the Year" (CMAs, 1976) and the "Lifetime Achievement in Performance" (Americana Music Awards 2009). In 2010, they earned a Grammy nomination in the newly minted Best Americana Album category for their critically acclaimed Willie

& The Wheel.

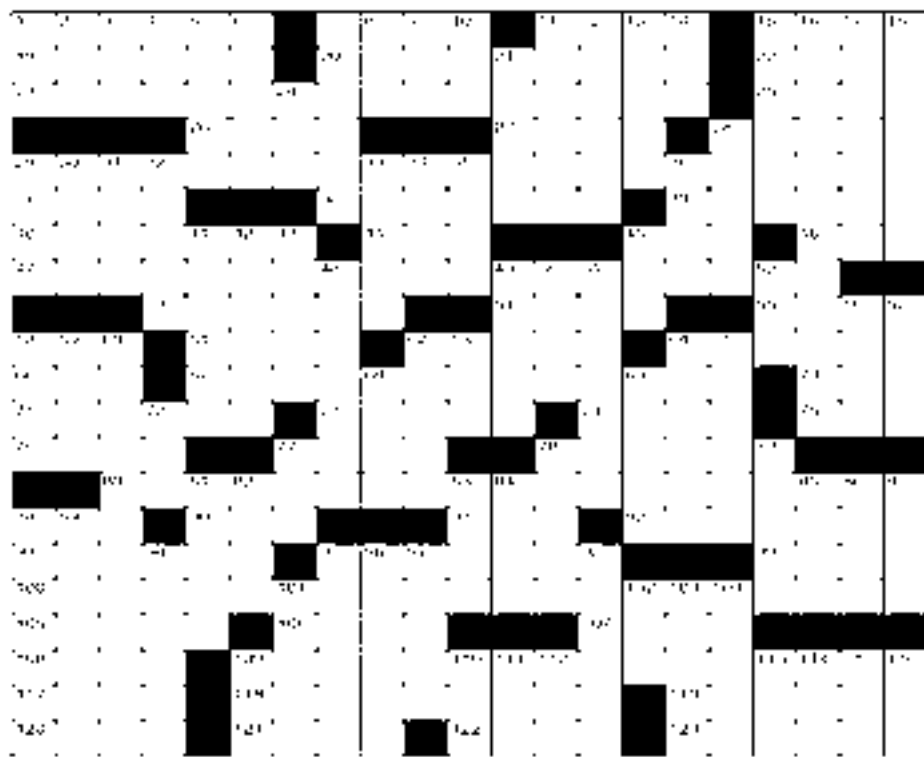

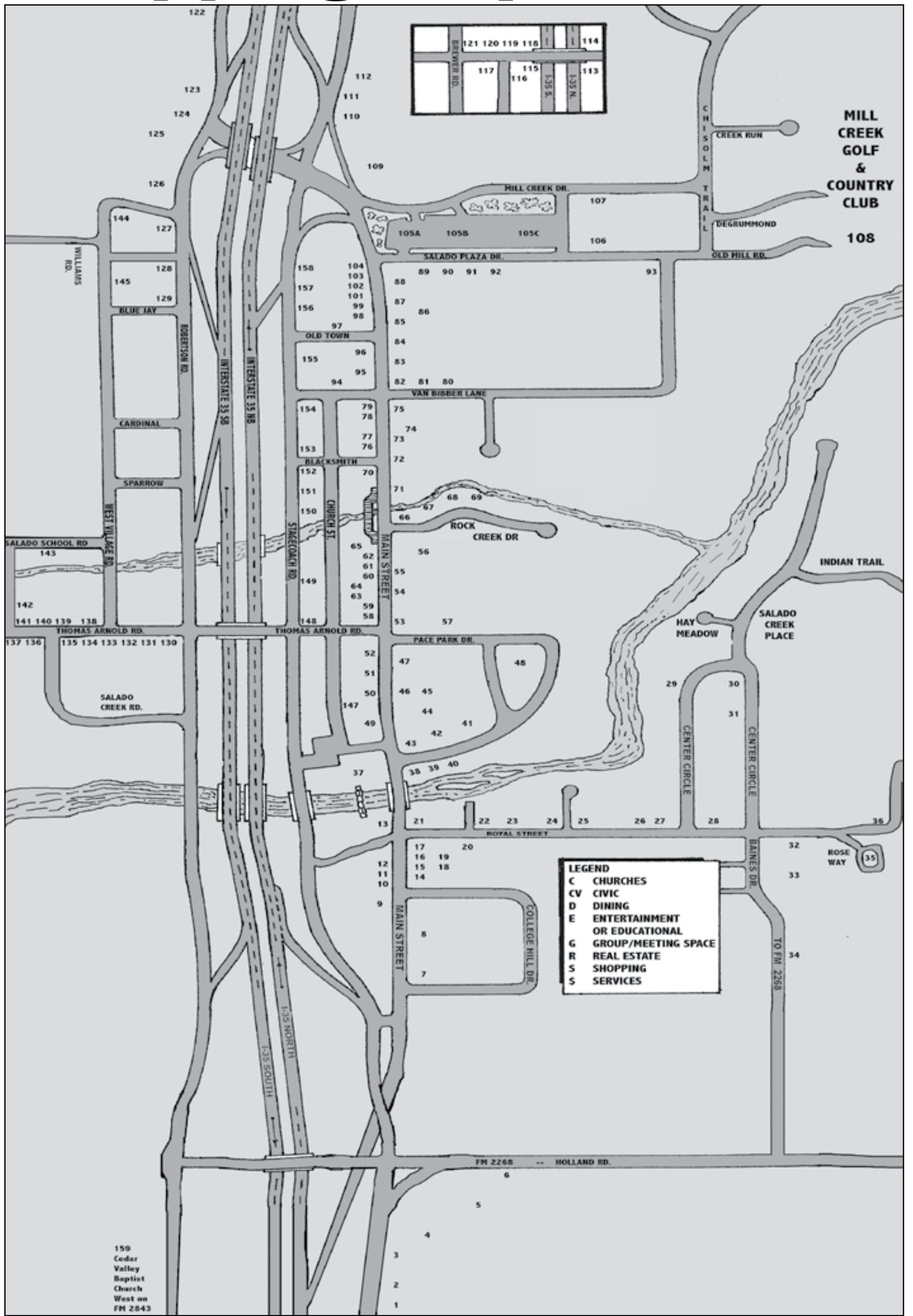

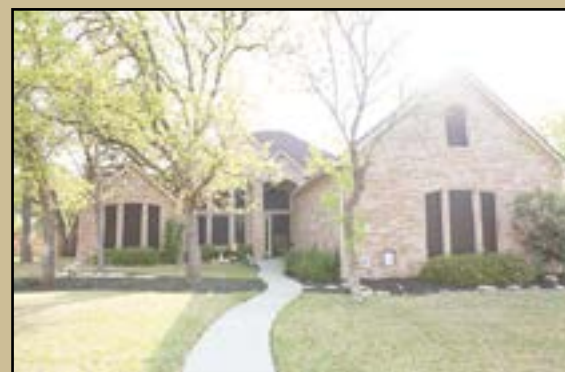
