Eco. development, Master Plan top Aldermen agenda

At their June 18 meeting, Salado aldermen will consider adopting a Resolution to establish an Economic Development Policy as well as a Resolution to establish guidelines and criteria for granting tax abatement.

The board will also discuss economic development projects and real estate in executive session that will follow a workshop session.

After the executive session, the board will return to open session then have a "presentation, discussion, and possible action on 1) a Master Development Agreement with 4T-LFT Ventures, LP, for redevelopment of Stagecoach Inn and Restaurant; and 2) a Tourism Marketing Agreement with 4T-LFT Ventures, LP."

The Stagecoach Inn is owned by Terry Potts. "There has been no sale," Potts said. "I am under no contract with that entity" he added when asked about the agenda item. "It is not something I can discuss at this time because there has been no sale."

In other business on the regular agenda of the meeting, aldermen will consider a Resolution "designating the West Amity Bridge of Interstate Highway 25 as the 'Clark Davis Memorial Bridge.'"

City manager Kim Foutz told *Salado Village Voice* that she has not contacted the surviving family members about whether they have requested or wanted this memorial designation. "That has been left up to the alderperson who is asking for the designation," she added.

Salado Village Voice contacted alderman Amber Preston Dankert via

email on June 16 to ask if she had contacted the surviving family members. "No," Dankert replied. "Honestly, I'm not sure where to start to find his mom's phone number. I don't even know her name."

Aldermen first discussed naming of a bridge during a May 7 workshop session. According to the minutes of that workshop, Alderman Dankert stated she has noticed some bridges are named after people and thought it would be an appropriate gesture and honor.

The process for having a bridge named in memory of a person is nine steps, according to the TXDOT policy. A local resolution in support of the naming is the third step. The proposal then is investigated for appropriateness and adequate space before landing on the desk of the Executive Director of TXDOT for final approval.

Clark Davis was killed on March 26 when the truck he was driving southbound on I-35 was crushed by a beam of the FM 2484 overpass bridge being constructed at the time. A northbound 18-wheeler struck the beams, causing them to collapse onto the roadway as well.

Davis is survived by his mother Pamela Evans and two children, Paris Davis and Dominic Jones and Leatha Katavi Jones.

A negligent death lawsuit has been filed on behalf of Evans, Patrice Anderson as next friend of Paris Davis and Leatha Katavi Jones as Next Friend of Dominic Jones, naming Primoris Services Corporation, James Construction Group, LLC, Einer Julian Lares dba Lares Trucking, United Rentals North American, Inc. and Valentin Martinez.

Local sales tax revenues take slight dip

Sales tax rebates to the Village of Salado and Salado Public Library were down slightly, while state sales tax revenues are up 5.2 percent.

The Village received its monthly check last week for \$25,678.19, down less than one percent from last year's payment of \$25,882.11. For the year, sales tax revenues are down 1.5 percent. So far,

the Village has received \$185,362.22, compared to \$188,143.39 paid through June last year.

Payments to Bell County cities was also down slightly to \$4.09 million from \$4.11 million last year. For the year, though, payments to county cities are up 5 percent to \$26.9 million.

The Salado Library District received a check for

\$21,917.99 in June, down slightly from last June's payment of \$22,512.44. For the year, the Library has received \$140,639.99, which is 2 percent less than it received through June 2014, \$143,597.75.

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar said that state sales tax revenue in May was \$2.6 billion, up 5.2 percent compared to May 2014.

"This marks the 62nd consecutive month of growth in sales tax collections," Hegar said.

"Sales tax revenue growth was relatively strong, spurred by consumer spending at retail stores and restaurants. Remittances from the construction, wholesale trade and services sectors were also up significantly. Collections from the oil and gas min-

ing sector declined, as was expected, due to the slowdown in drilling."

Hegar sent cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts their June local sales tax allocations totaling \$629.2 million, up 5.9 percent compared to June 2014.

The June allocations are for sales taxes that were collected in April.

Have you seen this fish? Magical catfish reported stolen

Sirena is missing her catfish.

Sometime last week, someone cut the 14" by 42" long bronze Magical Catfish from the stone base of Sirena in order to steal it.

After discovering that the catfish was missing, local artist Troy Kelley contacted Salado Police, who are investigating the theft of the bronze statue.

Kelley has also contacted local scrap metal businesses in hopes of saving the catfish from the smelter. He told *Salado Village Voice* that the bronze catfish probably weighs no more than 40 lbs. which means that its value in metal is no more than \$160 at tops.

"But its value to the children of Salado is much more than that," Kelley said.

The Magical Catfish has been a companion to Sirena since 2008. Susan Humiston and Nancy Mills Mackey commissioned Kelley to sculpt the magical catfish and place

it in Salado Creek with Sirena as a gift to their mother Jackie Mills.

"The Magical Cat Fish is what I wanted as a gift to the Village on my birthday," Mills said. "The Village children as well as visiting children love Sirena and her Magical Fish!"

"It was....no, it still is... my dream, to also have a bronzed Indian Brave to complete the picture by the creek," she added. "I refuse to let this disappointment darken my dreams for the Village!"

Mills incorporated the Legend of Sirena into her 20-year outdoor play Salado Legends. In 1991, for

the five-year anniversary of Sirena being placed by Kelley in Salado Creek, Mills wrote the children's book, "Sirena of Salado." In the story, the catfish convinces Sirena that she will find the love of her life, but will have to become a mermaid once a month. If her true love sees her in this form, she will have to remain that forever.

The catfish made the move from the Sirena Springs to the new location on the west side of the Main Street bridge. Kelley decided after the floods of 2009 and 2010 and the major landscaping done

around the Sirena springs that the new Sirena would find a new home on a little higher ground.

Sirena has been a part of Salado's story since just past midnight on Jan. 1, 1986. Kelley and friends

shared a toast and dedicated Sirena at that time as the first dedication of public art during the Texas Sesquicentennial.

Mills and Kelley are hopeful that the catfish will be returned.





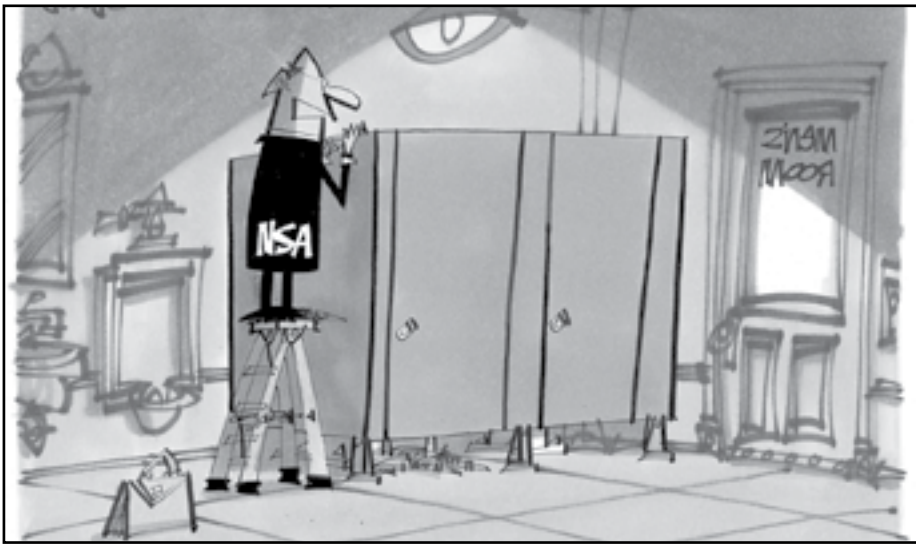

The End of the Clinton Coalition

Every time Hillary Clinton makes a left-wing policy pronouncement, it is, in effect, another eulogy marking the death of the coalition and style of politics that twice made her husband president.

Bill Clinton got elected by peeling off working-class whites and suburbanites from the Republican Party, while holding traditional Democratic voters. He made significant geographic inroads, winning a handful of Southern states both in 1992 and in his 1996 re-election, when he narrowly won the popular vote in the region as a whole.

This is all very interesting, but the Clinton coalition is rusty and up on blocks in some overgrown backyard like the El Camino pickup he once boasted about. And Hillary knows it.

Who is pushing Hillary to the left? Hillary is. It's sheer electoral necessity.

As Sean Trende of the website RealClearPolitics puts it, President Barack Obama has narrowed but deepened the Clinton coalition.

He blew the doors off it among base Democratic voters. As Philip Klein of the Washington Examiner points out, Democrats had won the 18- to 24-year-old vote by 11.5 points

on average and the 25- to 29-year-olds by about 7 points on average from 1992 to 2004. Obama won those groups by more than 30 points in 2008 and 20 points in 2012.

He outdid himself among minorities, liberals and upper-class suburbanites. Obama, Klein notes, amped up not just his margin among African-American voters, but their turnout. Elsewhere in the former Clinton coalition, though, his support collapsed, with older and blue-collar whites continuing to flee the Democrats.

Even if Hillary wanted to try to recapture those kinds of voters, it's not clear that she could, and the effort would risk alienating the Obama supporters she needs.

So the question for Hillary is whether a 67-year-old candidate who's not a racial minority or particularly exciting can re-energize the electoral coalition defined by a youthful African-American who rose to prominence on rhetorical flights of fancy about hope and change.

She's certainly not going to do it by recapitu-

lating the politics of Bill. He hewed to the political center. He played defense on cultural issues. He balanced the budget (at the insistence of a Republican Congress). He touted, at least after his first two years, small-scale government programs of symbolic significance. He was tough on crime and relatively hawkish.

Everything indicates she's going to do and be the opposite. Hillary will make herself a paladin of the left, and hope to energize and frighten the constituent parts of the Democratic base enough to walk the treacherously narrow electoral path of President Obama.

This is the price of victory Obama-style. Despite his rhetoric of unity, Obama depends on a politics that writes off much of the country and depends on turning out voters already inclined to support him. It is less a politics of persuasion than of mobilization.

For Hillary, this means the centrism and practicality of her husband have to be jettisoned, so what remains from the Clintonism of yore is mostly the shady dealings and shameless insincerity. But she really has no choice. It's go left or go home.

Access to track extended

We finished up another outstanding school year and the Salado High School Class of 2015 graduated on June 5.

This month my article is about public access to our track. We used to keep our track open to the community twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. However, a couple of years ago we limited access to the track to Monday through Friday, from 5 a.m. until 5 p.m. There were two reasons that we limited access to the track. The first reason was vandalism. This vandalism occurred multiple times and involved damage to the press box, drinking fountains, and water tank. The second reason was overuse of the football/soccer field. This overuse was the result of groups of people (both adults and youth) playing football and soccer on the field. This additional use

made it much more difficult, time consuming, and expensive to maintain the field for junior high school and high school football and soccer games.

We would like to provide our community members greater access to the track so we are going to extend the hours on a trial basis for the next month. The track will be open Monday through Thursday from 5 a.m. until 9 p.m. and Friday through Sunday from 7 a.m. until 9 p.m. This will also provide access to the baseball batting cages. However, we ask that everyone stay off of the football/soccer field. We are also going to order signs to put up as

a reminder for everyone to keep off of the field. Those that want to practice on a field can use the practice fields located at Salado Schools Road and West Village Road or the "Field of Dreams" fields located on the north side of Salado behind the Holiday Inn Express. I hope that we will not have any issues with vandalism or use of the football/soccer field during this trial period and that we will be able to continue to provide this greater access to the track for all of our community members.

I hope all of you have an enjoyable and restful summer.

Do what we've always done?

For several years, we bemoaned I-35 construction. However, nothing changed until a group of citizens said "enough" and sent letters to elected officials, TxDoT officials, and senior construction officers. "Let's put it to a vote." In November, the majority said. "Yes." As a result, you will soon own a water treatment plant complete with sewer lines down Main Street and connections to the west side of I-35. And, from all indications, it appears EDA is giving a million dollar grant toward it. More important, it can be done between 12 and 18 months. Engineers are beginning to work on the plans for it to be operational by Nov, 2016; Sanctuary will pay for their sewer infrastruc-

ture cost plus give 6 acres of land and the permit free.

What else? Look what Billy Helm and the Golf Course Directors did with 4th of July, Keep Salado Beautiful with pocket gardens, Pals with unusual events, and Tablerock with their performances. Super success!

In the works? Awaiting to hear about the grant for parks and trails; a grant for upgrading Pace Park; and continued downtown refurbishing using Texas A&M Student proposals.

Odd Bedfellows for Liberty

How one Democrat, one Republican, and one American in exile fought back against bulk surveillance.

Let's now praise a threesome of odd bedfellows: a Democratic ex-senator, an exiled American citizen, and a current Republican senator.

I don't think they've ever met, yet their separate efforts over 14 years have now guided our ship of state away from some perilous authoritarian straits.

First came Russ Feingold of Wisconsin, a former Democratic senator who refused in October 2001 to sacrifice our fundamental liberties to the fears and rank political opportunism that followed the horrific 9/11 terrorist attacks.

The Bush-Cheney regime was using 9/11 as an excuse to hustle their liberty-busting "USA PATRIOT Act" into law. But Feingold dared to object, pointing out that it would impose a 1984-ish secret security state over our freedoms. He was the lone senator to vote against it.

Just as he warned, the act proved to be deeply unpatriotic. But Congress, the media, and We the People were kept in the dark about it — until 2013, when a young security analyst named Edward Snowden blew the whistle. He revealed that cyber-snoops were collecting and storing all of our phone records.

The spy establishment retaliated by forcing Snowden into Russian exile. Yet their dirty deeds were now exposed, roiling the public and increasing congressional opposition to this wholesale invasion of our privacy.

Enter Rand Paul, a Republican senator and longtime libertarian opponent of PATRIOT Act madness. That law had to be renewed by June 1, and the establishment assumed no lawmaker would dare block it.

Paul did. He used 11th hour procedural moves to force a rewrite that ended some of its worst intrusions, including the government's bulk collection of our phone calls.

Liberty depends on people like Feingold, Snowden, and Paul daring to put themselves on the line to steer America away from authoritarianism. That's what patriots do.

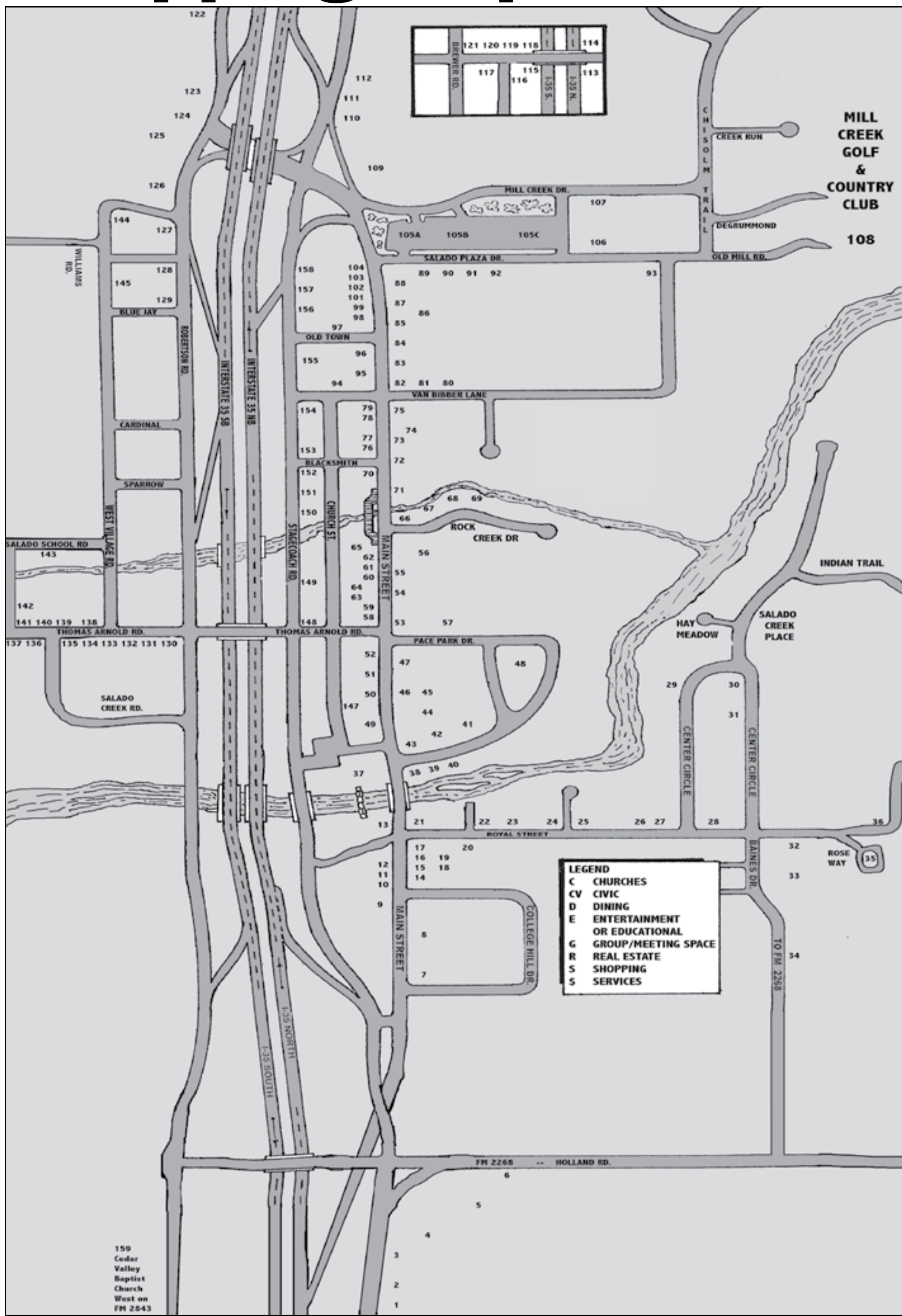

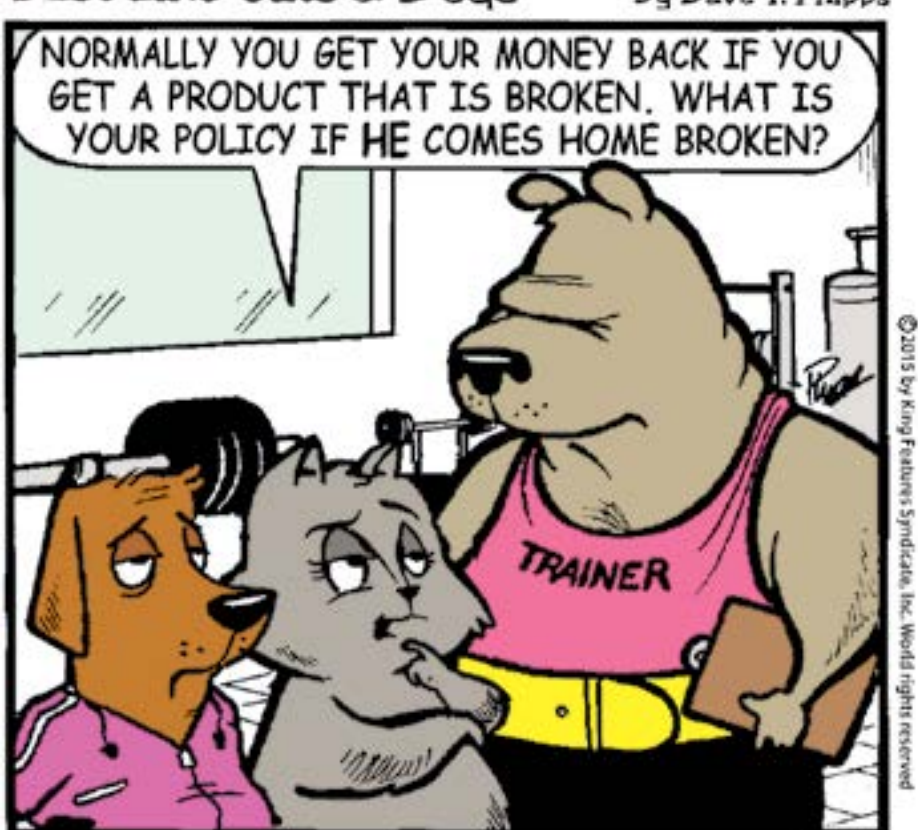

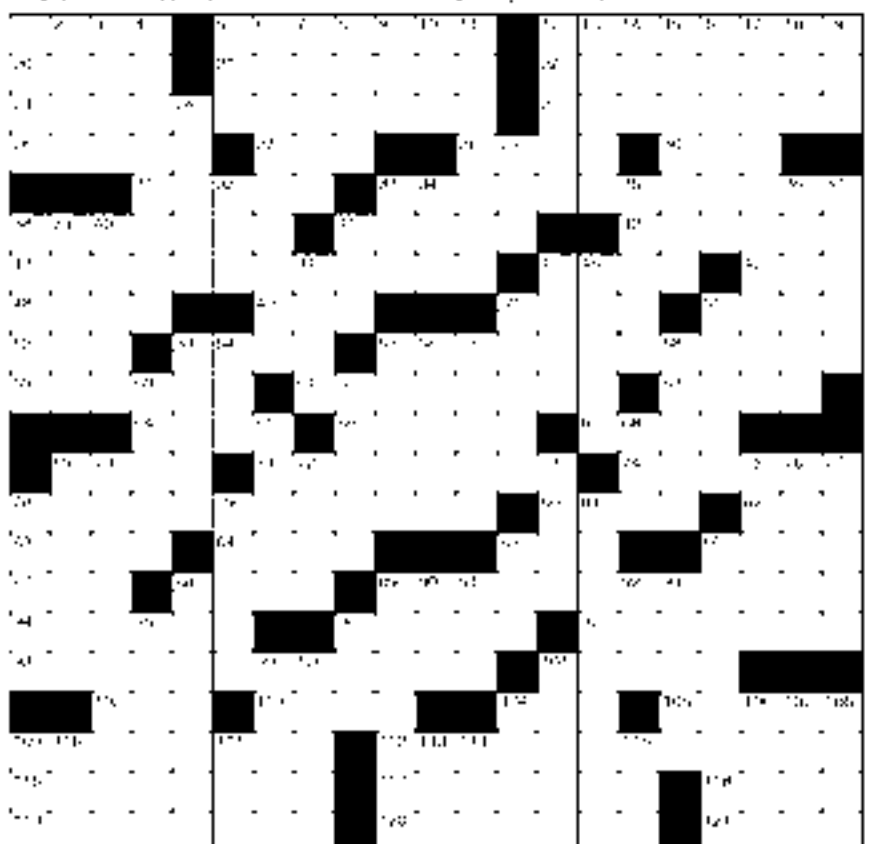

The Hidden Power of a Pass

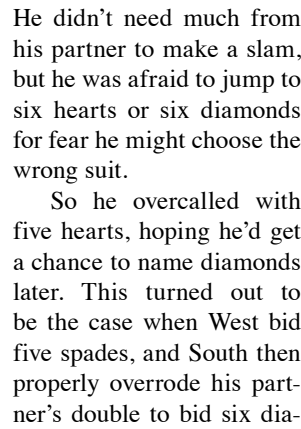
Contract Bridge

One of the hardest words in bridge to say, it seems, is "pass." There is no way of knowing how many thousands of points are lost, hand after hand, as a result of the injudicious use of bids other than pass when the latter action is called for.

Consider this deal, from a tournament, where West failed to utter the magic word. The bidding began when East, taking advantage of the favorable vulnerability, opened with four spades.

This posed a difficult problem for South. Certainly he had to bid something with his fine hand, but the question of what to bid was not easy to answer.



monds. West passed, and North, seeking the maximum score, corrected to six hearts. When this rolled around to West, he chose to double instead of pass.

West led the ace of clubs and continued with the queen. Declarer ruffed and led a low heart. After West played low, South, mindful of the double, finessed the eight, correctly deciding that West had all five missing trumps. The rest was easy, and South made the slam after drawing trumps.

It is possible that declarer would have finessed the eight anyway, but the double drew a diagram for South that could hardly be misread. West should have been satisfied with the six-heart contract and maintained a stoic silence.
