## Sanctuary petitions for MUD

Sanctuary developers have filed a request with the Village of Salado for consent to the creation of a Municipal Utility District on 284.345 acres of land in the Extra Territorial Jurisdiction (ETJ) of the Village.

According to the consent request, the ultimate costs of the development contemplated will be \$50 million. The MUD is be-

ing formed for the design and construction of a waterworks and sanitary sewer system for domestic purposes, drainage improvements for the district, construction of roadways and bridges within the district and the construction, improvement and operation of parks and recreational facilities within the Sanctuary development.

Aldermen will discuss the request, which was filed with the Village on

Oct. 2, at a workshop session 6:30 p.m. Oct. 8 at the Municipal Building.

The Village has 90 days in which it can approve or deny the request. If the Village should deny the request, the property owners will have the ability to petition to provide the services requested. If the Village cannot provide the services requested, then the landowners can file with Texas Commission for Environmental Quality Financing (TCEQ) for the

formation of the MUD.

TCEQ will conduct a public hearing and rule whether the MUD can be established, at which point a temporary board of directors will be appointed until an election can be held to elect directors and set a tax rate.

When the MUD is filed with TCEQ, the developer must pay for or provide a letter of credit for 30 percent of the cost of subdivision utilities. This would

## BOA postpones Sanctuary talks

Salado aldermen by a 4-1 vote Oct. 1 have postponed indefinitely any further discussion or action regarding a series of agreements with Sanctuary Development Co. The agreements include a land donation agreement, wastewater services agreement and economic development agreement as part of a plan to bring the future mixed use development into the Village as it develop.

Getting to that vote on Oct. 1 was an exercise in frustration as motions failed to bring the matter up for discussion and others failed to receive a second during an hour spent discussing the topic.

"The one reason I am pushing for this is one of the reasons I ran for this position," Alderman Frank

Coachman said. "My interest in this is making sure we have control of how the village grows. We can either participate or have it bulldoze us over. To me, this is about that development that will come to Salado."

Coachman told aldermen that he reviewed the economic development agreement from Sanctuary that was received on Sept. 25, giving Sanctuary input on it from the Village discussions. Chief among the items were the length of the period and amount of effluent to be used by Sanctuary, the length of time and amount of the property tax abatements and rebates of hotel-motel revenues for marketing as part of the incentive packages to the Sanctuary.

In earlier renditions, Sanctuary would receive the effluent from the wastewater treatment plant

for a period of 45 years, as well as property tax abatements and hotel motel tax rebates for a period of 45 years.

"That is ridiculous," Alderman Fred Brown said, iterating his position that the use of effluent and economic incentives be for no longer than 10 years.

"They have accepted the same economic development package as was accepted by the other property (Stagecoach Inn)," Coachman said.

Coachman told aldermen that the agreements were complete with the exception of three exhibits. "They will need our help with these," Coachman said.

"They should have asked us before now," Alderman Amber Preston-Dankert said.

Coachman said that Sanctuary was planning to meet with engineers

for a period of 45 years, as well as property tax abatements and hotel motel tax rebates for a period of 45 years.

## Feminists Should be Terrified of Carly

Carly Fiorina is a no-nonsense former business executive who is showing she can play -- and throw elbows -- with the big boys in the Republican presidential nomination battle.

Feminists have noticed, but their admiration is tinged with dread -- and it should be. An eloquent, fearless critic of abortion, the latest outsider to climb into the Republican race is a clear and present danger to what feminists hold most dear.

Even if she had said nothing else at the CNN debate, Fiorina would have stood out for her gut-punch of a statement about the horror of the guerrilla Planned Parenthood videos capturing the ghoulish organ harvesting that is an important side business of the organization (the main business, of course, is aborting babies).

The novelist Jennifer Weiner told The New York Times for a story about the conflicted feelings of feminists, "It's so weird -- she looks like one of us, but she's not." The managing editor of the feminist website Jezebel tweeted the night of the debate, "I'm in love with and terrified of her."

Yes, be afraid, very afraid. Fiorina already may be the most effective,

high-profile woman that the pro-life movement has. At the debate, she captured the enormity of the Planned Parenthood scandal, for which there are almost no words, speaking of it in the harshly indignant terms that it deserves.

No sooner had she made her statement than the media fact-checkers got to work. Fiorina had described a video of a living fetus and a technician working to harvest its brain. This was wrong. The video was stock footage of a briefly living victim of an abortion that played while a former technician described -- in a different case -- her horrifying experience cutting an aborted baby's face open to preserve its brain for sale.

Fiorina should have been more precise, but her electric condemnation of Planned Parenthood has inevitably gotten the attention of the pro-abortion sisterhood. In Iowa, protesters chanted and threw condoms at her, even though Fiorina had said nothing about birth control.

At the same event, a woman accosted Fiorina to ask, "How can you as a woman not support our health care?" Fiorina probably left the woman determined never to try that again. "Oh, I support your health care," she shot back. "I don't support butchering babies."

Fiorina is so formidable because she has a tough-as-nails public persona, together with an ear for the music of public speech. At their best, her riffs are pungent, memorable -- and persuasive. "Liberals and progressives will spend inordinate amounts of time and money protecting fish, frogs and flies," she said after a visit to a pro-life pregnancy center. "They do not think a 17-week-old, a 20-week-old, a 24-week-old is worth saving."

Hillary Clinton's fans can be forgiven for wishing their candidate had some of Fiorina's flare as a communicator. A writer at Cosmopolitan lamented, "Carly Fiorina Is the Candidate I Wanted Hillary Clinton to Be." She and others ought to get used to feeling envious and chagrined. Even if she flames out as a candidate, in Carly Fiorina conservatives and pro-lifers have discovered a formidable champion.

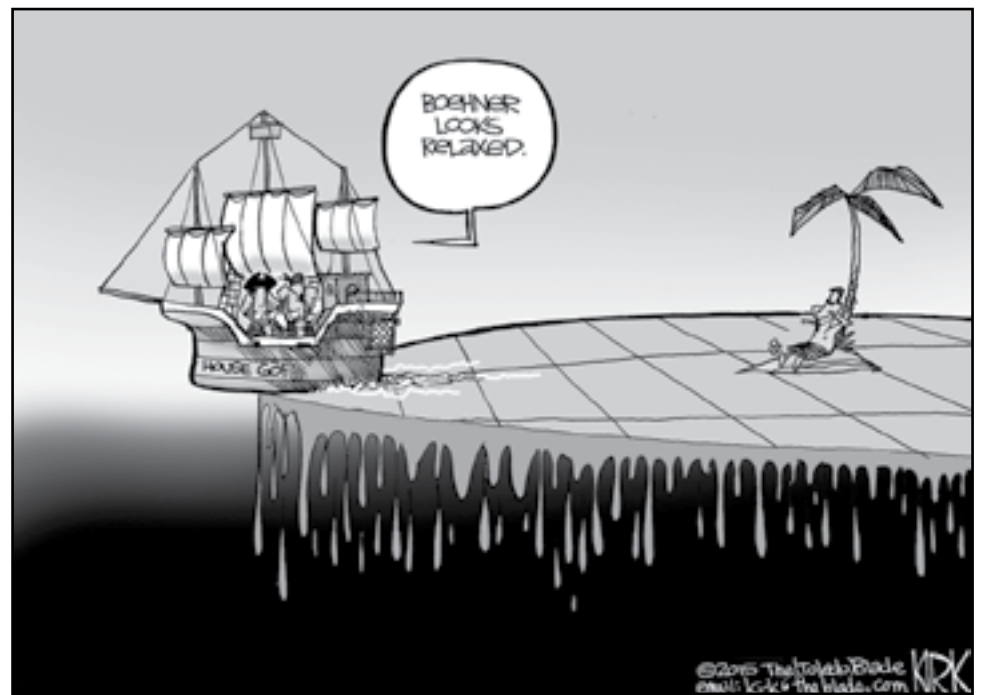

## Carly Fiorina Proves You Don't Want a CEO for a President

This personification of corporate greed is now throwing out a blizzard of lies to hide who she is.

In 1992, independent candidate Ross Perot chose Admiral James Stockdale, a complete unknown, as his presidential running mate. In his first debate, the VP candidate began by asking two good questions: "Who am I? Why am I here?"

Carly Fiorina, the Republican presidential contender who's surged in recent polls of GOP primary voters, ought to ask those questions, too. For now, she's positioning herself as a no-nonsense, successful corporate chieftain who can run government with business-like efficiency.

In a recent debate, Fiorina rattled off a list of her accomplishments as CEO of tech conglomerate Hewlett-Packard: "We doubled the size of the company," "quadrupled its top-line growth rate,"



"quadrupled its cash flow," and "tripled its rate of innovations," she declared in PowerPoint style.

Brandishing statistics, however, can be a sophisticated way of lying.

In fact, the growth Fiorina bragged about was mostly the result of her buying Compaq, another computer giant, in a merger that proved to be disastrous. Hewlett-Packard's profits declined 40 percent in her six years, its stock price plummeted, and she cut loose 30,000 workers -- even saying publicly that their jobs should be shipped overseas. Finally, she was fired.

Before we accept her claim that "running government like a business"

would be a positive, note that the narcissistic corporate culture richly rewarded Fiorina for failure.

Yes, she was fired, but unlike the thousands of HP employees she dumped, a golden parachute let her land in luxury: Counting severance pay, stock options, and pension, she pocketed \$42 million to go away.

But, here she comes again. Lacking even one iota of humility, this personification of corporate greed and economic inequality is now throwing out a blizzard of lies to hide who she is -- and to bamboozle Republicans into thinking she belongs in the White House.

be \$15 million of the \$50 million proposed. In Texas, MUDs may have an ad valorem rate of up to \$1.50 per \$100 valuation. To retire a \$50 million bond over 30 years at 4.5 percent would require semi-annual payments of \$1.9 million. This would require a taxable property value within the MUD of more than \$253 million at the tax rate of \$1.50 per \$100 valuation.

MUDs may also engage in conservation, irrigation, electrical generation, firefighting, solid waste collection and disposal and recreational activities (such as parks, swimming pools, and sports courts). For all of 2015, Sanctuary and Village of Salado officials have been in negotiations for the formation of a Public Improvement District and annexation of the Sanctuary into the Village.

working smoke alarms in the home and testing them monthly.

According to the latest NFPA research, working smoke alarms cut the chance of dying in a fire in half. Meanwhile, almost two-thirds of home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.



# A farsighted play

## Contract Bridge

West dealer.  
North-South vulnerable.

The bidding:  
West North East South  
Pass 1♦ Pass 1♥  
2♣ 4♥

Opening lead — king of clubs.

A fine declarer plays many hands as though he can see through the backs of the cards. For a good example, examine this deal from the 1978 Olympiad Pairs.

It might seem that at four hearts declarer must lose four tricks -- two clubs, a spade and a heart -- but that's not the way it turned out.

West led the king of clubs and continued with the ace after East played the nine. West then led the jack, which declarer, Peter Nagy, ruffed in dummy with the king of hearts. East in the meantime had discarded a spade and a diamond on the second and third clubs.

Nagy now led the nine of hearts from dummy, a very

farsighted play, and went up with the ace after East followed low. When West showed out, Nagy led a spade to the ace and returned the seven of trumps, covered by the eight and jack.

Next came a diamond to the king, followed by the four

of trumps, covered by East's five and declarer's six. After cashing his last trump, the queen, Nagy led the queen of clubs, which East refused to ruff because he would have to return a diamond into dummy's A-J.

This merely postponed East's agony. Declarer next led a spade to dummy's king, presenting East with the choice of whether to ruff and return a diamond or whether to discard and allow declarer to score the king of spades as his ninth trick. In the latter case, dummy would then cash the king of diamonds for his 10th trick.

And so, thanks to his careful play, Nagy made four hearts where most of the other declarers in the same contract failed.

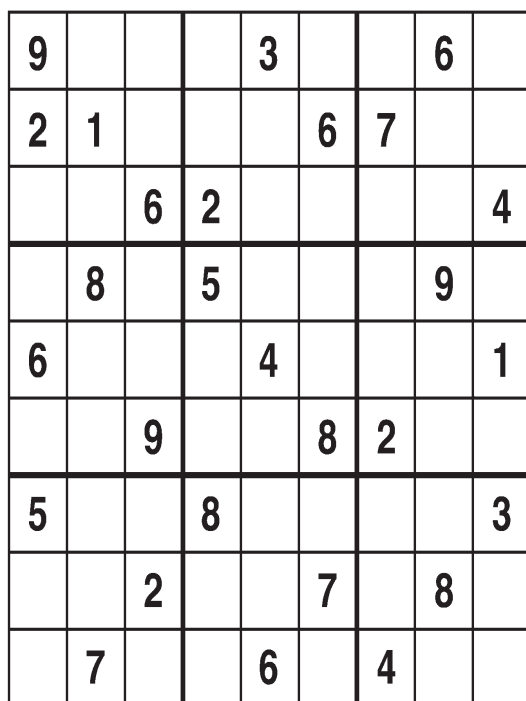

**PUMPKIN DUTCH BABY PANCAKE**  
 Serves 4

- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 4 eggs
- 3/4 cup whole milk
- 1/4 cup pumpkin purée
- 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- Pinch grated nutmeg
- Pinch fine sea salt
- 1 tablespoon powdered sugar (optional)
- Pure maple syrup for serving (optional)
- 3/4 cup whole wheat pastry flour



Preheat the oven to 425°F. Put butter in an 11- or 12-inch cast-iron skillet and place in the oven until melted.

Meanwhile, in a bowl, whisk eggs until blended. Whisk in flour, milk, pumpkin purée, granulated sugar, vanilla, cinnamon, nutmeg and salt until mixture is well combined and no longer lumpy.

Pour batter into the skillet over melted butter. Bake until pancake is puffed and golden brown, 28 to 30 minutes.

Cut pancake into wedges and transfer to a plate. Sprinkle with powdered sugar and serve with maple syrup, if using.

- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed with a press
- 1/4 teaspoon fine sea salt
- Flour, for rolling dough
- 1 pound whole wheat pizza dough
- 1 Granny Smith apple, halved and thinly sliced
- 1 Bartlett pear, halved, cored and thinly sliced
- 1 cup thinly sliced Yukon Gold potatoes
- 1 cup thinly sliced butternut squash
- 1 cup red grapes, halved



In a small skillet, heat oil, garlic and salt over medium heat for 2 minutes until garlic is golden brown. Remove from heat.

On a lightly floured surface with a lightly floured rolling pin, roll dough out to a circle about 14 inches in diameter. If the dough pulls back strongly, stop rolling, cover the dough with a kitchen towel and let rest 10 minutes before continuing. Transfer dough to a round pizza pan, stone or large baking sheet; reshape dough as needed.

Preheat the oven to 400°F and place a rack in the lowest position of the oven. Brush dough with 1 tablespoon garlic-infused oil. Spread sliced apple, pear, potatoes and butternut squash in concentric circles, leaving a 1-inch border. Brush entire surface with remaining oil. Bake 20 minutes. Add grapes and bake 10 minutes longer. Let cool for 5 minutes; slice and serve.

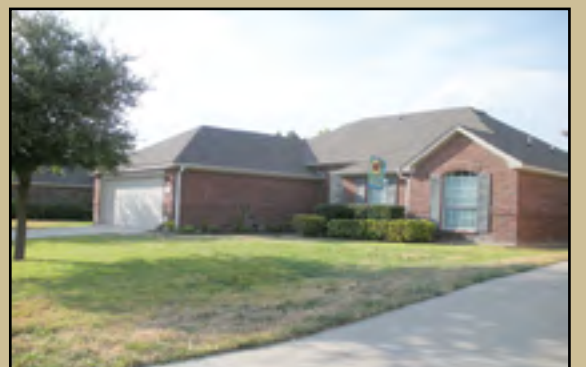


