

All SISD campuses meet TEA standards

All Salado ISD campuses met the standard for the 2014-15 Accountability Rating released recently by the Texas Education Agency and received distinction designations for performance in seven ar-

TEA recently released the 2015 School Report Card for Texas schools. The TEA accountability rating has only three ratings: Met Standard, Improvement Required and Not Rated. The State accountability ratings are based on four performance indices: Student Achievement, Student Progress, Closing Performance Gaps and Post-secondary Readiness.

Campuses that achieve the Met Standard are eligible for seven Distinction Designations for academic achievement in the following areas: Reading/ English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Top 25 percent: Student Progress, Top 25 percent: Closing Performance Gaps and Postsecondary Readiness.

Salado High School achieved the Met Standard on the accountability rating. The campus exceeded the target score in all four performance indices. SHS students exceeded the target score of 60 in Student Achievement by scoring 91; scoring 27 in Student Progress (target score of 15); scoring 44 in CLosing Performance Gaps (target score of 31) and scoring 81 in Postsecondary Readiness (target score 57).

According to the financial indicators, Salado High School spends 63.3 percent of its budget on instructional expenditures. SHS expends \$8,451 in total operating expenditures per student, compared to the \$8,692 state average and the \$7,238 per student spent in the district.

SHS also earned Dis-

tinction Designations in Mathematics, Social Studies, Science and Postsecondary Readiness.

Salado Junior High School also achieved the Met Standard rating and earned distinction designations in Science, Postsecondary Readiness and Top 25 percent Student Progress.

Junior High students scored the following on the four indices: Student Achievement, 85, target score of 60; Student Progress, 44, target score of 28; Closing Performance Gaps, 37, target score of 27 and Postsecondary Readiness, 41, target score of 13.

The Junior High spends 63.3 of its budget on instructional expenditures and spends \$5,021 per student on operating expenditures.

Salado Intermediate School achieved the Met Standard and earned distinction designation in Science.

Salado Intermediate School students scored the following on the four indices: Student Achievement, 85, target score of 60; Student Progress, 39, target score of 30; Closing Performance Gaps, 41, target score of 28 and Postsecondary Readiness, 45, target score of 12.

The Intermediate School spends 63.3 percent of its budget on instructional expenditures and \$4,456 per students in total operating expenditures.

Thomas Arnold Elementary is paired with Salado Intermediate School for the TEA School Report Card and achieved Met Standard.

Thomas Arnold spends 63.3 percent of its budget on instructional expenditures and spends \$3,699 per student for total operating expenditures.

Despite town hall, questions unanswered

To the Editor:

Although not a Salado resident, I have made an effort to stay abreast of negotiations between the Aldermen and Sanctuary representatives. Thursday's paper was the most detailed description to date, yet it posed about as many questions as it answered. Hopefully positive elements of the glowing presentation by Mr. Hanks will come to fruition with this development eventually becoming an asset to the city's residents and businesses.

Obviously this venture, like most of its ilk, depends greatly on "corporate welfare" wherein resident taxpayers indirectly and sometimes directly fund a significant portion of the investment. With the various tax abatements, refunds, and rebates, it appears that the city fathers have "gone the other mile" to subsidize its implementation - allegedly anticipating enhanced paydays on the backside.

Because elements of

the agreement are vague or unpublished, I reviewed other cities' economic development guidelines and policies re: Tax abatements and Chapter 380 agreements. While the Salado Village Voice article outlines Sanctuary's preferentially discounted property evaluations, including the city's subsidizing of assessed rollback penalties ancillary to those evaluations, there has been no mention of possible similar impact on other taxing authorities in the county. Logically Salado officials cannot obligate such entities; however, depending on aspects of certain Chapter 380 agreements, counties and school districts may be offered the "privilege" of subsidizing such ventures. Either I missed that discussion, or it never came up. Such tax concessions might be minimal on Bell County's

balance sheet; however, if applicable they would be dramatically negative for Salado ISD. Should Salado ISD join the Sanctuary parade, the district's taxpayers could be significantly penalized. While there might be promised future enhancements to the district's tax base, the schools would have to make up-front provisions for the potential influx of students even if the promises never come to fruition, and those costs would be paid by current district taxpayers while forgiving much of Sanctuary's school tax obligations.

Of course, due to the minimal details supplied, such potential offers or agreements of subsidization beyond the City of Salado are purely speculation or supposition - but it would be nice to know of any such intent or action.

Climate Make-Believe in Paris

Saving the planet has never been so easy.

The Paris climate talks concluded in a rousing round of self-congratulation over an agreement that, we are told, is the first step toward keeping Earth habitable. If generating headlines and press releases about making history were the metric for anything, Paris might be as consequential -- if misbegotten -- as advertised. The fact is that Paris is very meta. The agreement is about the agreement,

The fact is that Paris is very meta. The agreement is about the agreement, never mind what's in it or what its true legal force is -- namely, nil. Paris is a legally binding agreement not to have legally binding limits on emissions. It might be the most worthless piece of paper since the Kellogg-Briand Pact outlawed war -- about a decade prior to the outbreak of World War II.

The Paris summit operated on the principle of CBDRILONCWRC, or "Common but Differentiated Responsibility in Light of National Circumstances With Respective Capability." That means nothing was actually mandated on anyone because that proved -- understandably enough, dealing with all the countries in the world -- completely unworkable.

Instead, countries came up with so-called Intended Nationally Determined

Contributions. That's climate bureaucratese for "You make up your emissions target, whatever it is, and we will pretend to take it seriously." Thus, do the waters recede and Earth is saved from looming climate catastrophe.

President Barack Obama praised 180 countries for coming to Paris "with serious climate targets in hand." This was ridiculous climate grade inflation. As Oren Cass of the Manhattan Institute points out, Pakistan produced a onepage document promising to "reduce its emissions after reaching peak levels to the extent possible." For this we needed a headline-grabbing global confab?

No one will mistake Pakistan for an industrial juggernaut. How about China, the world's largest carbon emitter? It promises to reach peak emissions around 2030, when one U.S. government study estimates that it would hit peak admissions anyway, Cass notes. The more China promises to confront climate change, the more it stays the same.

India's assurance that it will make a roughly 30 percent improvement in

carbon intensity is, according to Cass, also about where it was projected to be headed anyway. India still wants to double its output of coal by 2020. As The Guardian put it, India "says coal provides the cheapest energy for rapid industrialization that would lift millions out of poverty." India would be correct.

The agreement's celebrants believe that by making countries report their progress on cutting carbon emissions and by sending a stern signal against fossil fuels, Paris will catalyze painful cuts in carbon emissions somewhere off in the future. It speaks to a naive belief in the power of global shame over the sheer economic interest of developing countries in getting rich (and lifting countless millions out of poverty) through exploiting cheap energy -- you know, the way Western countries have done for a couple of centuries.

If this is the best hope of the climate alarmists, their global campaign will be a welcome fizzle. All things considered, it probably is best that they occupy themselves with grand meetings and with the exertions attendant to believing their own PR. Otherwise they could do real damage.

Sup't explains reasons for, impacts of influx of transfers students

In response to drastic cuts in state funding over a four years period beginning in 2011, school trustees in 2014 changed the local transfer policy that it had in place for two reasons: to end the punishment to Salado in the state funding formula because Salado ISD was considered a property rich district and to bring new students and state revenue into the district.

Superintendent Michael Novotny explained to an audience of more than 100 parents, teachers and students gathered on Dec. 17 what the impact has been for Salado ISD from the revised state funding formulas.

Faced with a massive loss of state funds due to a downturn in the economy, Texas lawmakers cut \$5.4 billion from education funding during the 2011 Legislative Session. Salado ISD lost \$616,388 in state funding the first year (2011-12) and \$862,076 the second year (2012-13). The following biennium, the Legislature added \$3 billion back into state education funding, but the distribution of funds was not even among school districts and many property rich school district such as Salado continued to see a loss of state funds in 2013-14 and 2014-15; for Salado that loss was \$710,556 in 2013-14 and \$702,555 in 2014-15, according to Dr. Novotny.

About a third of SISD's total operating budget is from state funds. The rest is predominantly from local effort. Every penny of the SISD generates \$62,821 in local funds, according to Dr. Novotny. Furthermore, the district is already at the M&O tax rate ceiling of \$1.04 without having a tax increment election. Only two Bell County school districts have had this type of election to raise their M&O rate above the state maximum of \$1.04: Belton at \$1.17, the highest allowed by state and Temple at \$1.12.

If Salado voters were to approve a 13-cent increase in the Salado ISD M&O tax rate, Dr. Novotny explained, it would generate \$816,673 in revenue. It would increase taxes on a \$200,000 home by \$260 per year.

"There are only two ways to increase state funding," Dr. Novotny said. "Increase the tax rate or increase the enrollment and Weighted Average Daily Attendance (WADA)."

Local school trustees opted for the latter when they voted to waive the \$750 tuition fees that SISD had collected prior to that decision. By doing so, the current transfer students that the district was accepting at the time would count toward the WADA part of the state funding formula. State law prohibits property rich schools that collect transfer fees and tuition of any kind from counting those transfer students in the WADA funding formula.

The school district, after waiving the transfer fees, saw an influx of transfer students, increasing enrollment and the WADA for the district. Dr. Novotny told the audience that the 237 transfer students "increase our state

funding by \$1.5 million per year."

He added that the district has had to add only \$400,000 in expenses to accommodate those additional students and therefore has a net of more than \$1 million in added state funding.

During a question and answer portion of the meeting, parents expressed concerns about the influx of new students. Some were unhappy that Salado High School and Junior High will continue to compete at the 4A level in University Interscholastic League in athletics, academics and music.

Parents said that Salado is one of the smallest 4A districts in the state, making the cut to compete at the higher level by 12 students and accepting 76 transfer students at the High School.

parents said Those that they would rather see Salado compete with

historic rivals like Rogers, Academy, Troy and Jarrell, all within a 40 mile drive, than the likes of La Grange, Giddings, Caldwell and Smithville, Llano and Lampasas, all at least an hour or more drive.

Parents said that the burden on young competitors during the midweek competition such as basketball and volleyball may result in lower academic performance by tired kids the day after a two-hour trip for games the night before.

"As much as I love watching my kids play," one parent said, "it is more important that they get the best education they can."

Dr. Novotny told the audience that as Salado ISD grows organically, the district will naturally accept fewer and fewer transfer students.

He pointed out recent subdivisions in the school district, which is one of the larger districts in the county in terms of square miles, will have an impact of student enrollment.

Dr. Novotny said that the district continues to keep track of the potential impact that accepting transfer students has on class sizes and the potential for having to hire additional staff and the burden on facilities.

"We also do not accept transfer students who are discipline problems and who are not performing adequately academically,"

One parent said jokingly that perhaps the district should look at the student's athletic performance when considering transfers.

"We don't do that," Dr. Novotny said.

After the meeting, the district announced that it will conduct a second public meeting on the transfer policy at 6:30 p.m. Jan. 5 at the Intermediate School cafeteria.







Phase 1 of walking/bike trail



A walking/biking trail will connect the historic Salado College Park and Salado Creek in a loop. Salado was awarded a \$300,000 Transportation Alternative Program grant.

Salado walking/bike trail approved as part of \$300,000 TAP grant

The Village of Salado learned late last week that it was one of 33 nontraditional transportation projects to be awarded grants approved by the Transportation Commission. Funding for the bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure projects was made available through the federal Transportation Alternative Program

The Village will receive \$240,000 in federal funds for a \$300,000 walking and bike trail that connects Salado Collge Hill Park with Salado Creek in a looped trail.

The proposed offroad trail connects Salado's College Hill Park with Salado Creek in a looped trail that parallels Main Street along Peddler's Alley, extends north to the south bank of Salado Creek, extends east along the banks of Salado Creek and then to the west side of Center Circle and back again

returning to Salado College Hill Park.

Salado aldermen voted 4-0-1 in April in favor of the grant application and matching local funds of \$60,000 in order to meet a May 4 application deadline. The grant application had been researched and developed but a subcommittee that included Alderman Michael Mc-Dougal, Alderman Amber Preston Dankert, Will Lowery, Darlene Walsh, Claire Hartman and David Olsen.

According to City Manager Kim Foutz, construction of the hike and bike trail will not begin until

fall 2016. Other Bell County projects to receive grants were these: City of Belton's, \$2.1 million Chisolm Trail Hike and Bike Facility Phase II, and nearly \$500,000 in Old Nolanville Road Elementary Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety improvements for crossing Royal Street and the City of Nolanville

"We are pleased to have these projects approved as we work with our local communities to enhance their local multi-modal transportation systems," said Bobby Littlefield, District Engineer for Tx-DOT's Waco District.

Earlier this year the Texas Department of Transportation announced a call for TAP projects in small urban and non-urban areas. Using federal TAP funding, the Texas Trans-Commission portation then authorized funding for 17 small urban projects in September and 33 nonurban projects at today's meeting.

In accordance with Tx-DOT's TAP rules, eligible project activities were limited to bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure projects, and the TAP funding was identified for construction only. It is anticipated that all TxDOT selected 2015 TAP projects will be let for construction within three years.

This deal occurred years ago in a high-stakes rubberbridge game. Looking at only the North-South cards, it is hard to believe the eventual outcome.

Certainly North had a tough choice of responses after his partner opened with a game-forcing two-heart bid and West cramped the bidding by leaping to five clubs. It seemed likely, from North's viewpoint, that there was a slam somewhere, and he elected to go for it in his partner's suit. East interjected a jarring note by doubling, and West made the killing lead of a club, selecting the three rather than the queen to direct a diamond return if his partner won the first trick.

Ordinarily, declarer would have made six hearts easily, but in the actual case he suffered a catastrophe of

cataclysmic proportions. East ruffed the club and returned a diamond to partner's ace, whereupon West led another club, East ruffing again.

East would now have had a problem as to whether to return a spade or a diamond, except that West's second

club lead had been the four, asking once again for a lowsuit return. Had West been void of spades, he would have asked for that return by leading the queen of clubs instead of the four. So East led a diamond at trick four, ruffed by West, who continued the onslaught by giving his partner a third
