



# **B. Herd: Painter of Delight**

"Ann called me and told me that we had sold nine of my paintings that weekend," Bascomb Herd recalls of the time more than 45 years ago when he and wife Ann decided to make what began as a hobby into a livelihood.

"Of course, they were just \$75 or so," he adds of the paintings he sold the first time he showed at an outdoor art show. He, along with countless Texas artists, have developed their reputations as artists by first cultivating relationships with customers by first meeting them at outdoor art shows, like the Salado Art Fair, which celebrates its 50th anniversary this summer.

"We did the Salado Art Fair several times before moving down here," Herd recalls.

Today, Bascomb and Ann are marking 20 years since opening their gallery at #12 Old Town Salado. The gallery that the Herds had in Dallas closed with the shuttering of the Olla Podrida Mall in 1996. They were wanting to open a new gallery location and Salado fit their needs.

Herd began painting in the 1960s as a hobby of sorts. He found that he had a talent for capturing colors and details in the Texas landscapes that he painted.

In 1981, he and Ann opened their gallery in Dallas at the Olla Podrida Mall. Since then, Bascomb has been working fulltime as a professional artist.

In the earliest days, he and Ann traveled around the state several weekends of the year to show in outdoor art shows. But, as their gallery took off and as the couple aged, they cut back on those numbers of shows.

Painting in oils, Bascomb has worked four decades in refining the B. Herd signature style. Part of that signature is the little red cardinal that finds its way into many of his paintings.

Bascomb is self-taught, which adds to the dramatic effect of his paintings, especially the way in which he turns an ocean of bluebonnets into individual flowers captured in indigo and white.

A few years ago, though, it was questionable whether Bascomb would ever paint again. The doctors who cared for him in the intensive care unit and later in the rehabilitative unit did not think he would ever walk again. But with Texas tenacity and the help of friends, Bascomb proved the doctors wrong. Though he moves a bit slower (he is after all in his mid-80s), Bascomb is still active and paints almost every day.

You can find him sitting in front of the big window at the front of his gallery adding touches of color and detail to his latest commissions.

He is always willing to take a break from the canvas to talk with customers who wanderer into his gallery, greeting everyone with Texas hospitality.

But, then, it is back to the canvas where he finds himself so much at home painting the Texas that he has loved for more than eight decades.



# Our Heritage Speaks cemetery tour on Oct. 1

Salado Historical Society and Tablerock are sponsoring this second annual walking tour of the Old Salado Graveyard on October 1, from 5-6:30 p.m. The historic Old Salado Graveyard is on Baines Street.

The program is titled "Our Salado Heritage Speaks" referring to the lives of Salado settlers buried in the Old Graveyard who will have their biographies presented by historical reenactors. Besides being noted Salado pioneers, these individuals made significant contributions to the educational, religious, political, and civic lives of people in the county and the State of Texas.





# The Art of Virginia Kinnison, Salado Artist and early Chair of the Salado Art Fair

The late Virginia Kinnison opened an antique shop in the rock building next to the Anderson House in April 1963. Shortly after opening the shop, she began painting on old weathered boards rescued from an abandoned hen house being torn down on the property. The paintings were called "Hen House Art" by her son who tore the hen house down. As the paintings sold in her shop, the stockpile of wood diminished and Virginia began to look elsewhere for her special type of canvas. She searched for boards that were weathered, knotted, had square nails or other hardware. She created over 2,000 pieces by the time her career ended.

In 1967, Virginia enlisted the support of local Jack Jones to organize an "art fair" in the center of Salado. The plan was to invite artists, from professionals to amateurs, to display and sell their art works at a site open to the public. It was held on the Stagecoach property off Main St. next to the creek. The Art Fair attracted 50 artists and had over 3,000 visitors. It was a success and has continued to be a major event in Salado for the past 50 years. Virginia was the co-chair of the Art Fair two years and her husband was chairman the following two.

Virginia was an early leader and organizer in Salado. She was a founding member and president of the Historical Society, the Garden Club (became Ladies Auxiliary), and the Monday Club at the Methodist Church. She was a one woman information bureau for visitors who came to her shop. Her shop was only one of nine in Salado at the time. Virginia appreciated Salado's uniqueness and worked diligently to promote and preserve its history, beauty and natural charm.

# Sirena's magical life comes to life at Tablerock in Salado Legends

"Once upon a time" .....and then the story unfolds. It all started eons ago when Indian children were taught morals woven into legends and those legends were kept alive by word of mouth. The Legend of Sirena and the Magical Cat Fish was passed down from generation to generation and from tribe to tribe. As a child Troy Kelley's grandmother told the legend of Sirena over and over when Troy pleaded, "Tell it again Grandma."

In 1984 Troy, a retired U.S. Army officer, had finished college art courses, studied abroad, and had moved to the little Village of Salado. As he sat by Salado Creek enjoying the natural springs bubbling up in the creek, he spied a huge catfish swimming among the watercress. The realization that he had found the creek his Indian Grandmother has spoken of in the Sirena Legend made him vow to sculpt a life size bronze statue of the Indian girl called Sirena and place her in Salado Creek.

The Texas sesquicentennial was in 1986. Sirena had been sculpted, bronzed, and was ready to be placed in the creek on December 28, 1985. A New Year eve party was planned and at 11:30 p.m. on December 31 the partygoers caravaned to the Creek with champagne to toast and dedicated Sirena at 12:01 a.m. on January 1, 1986. Sirena is noted in the book, A Comprehensive Guide to Outdoor Sculptures in Texas, as the first outdoor sculpture dedicated in Texas for the Sesquicentennial.

Salado, home to many artists, authors and talented people, became the home for retired Engineer Denver Mills and his writer wife, Jackie, in 1987. Jackie became a member of the Contemporaries at the Cultural Activities Center in Temple and wrote the Hands-On programs for 3,000 school children a year. One year the theme for Hands-On featured "Native Americans" and Jackie asked Troy Kelley if she could use Sirena and the legend his grandmother had told him for a participatory play she would write for the third and fourth grade school children from all over Bell County. Troy's permission for the play and Jackie's promise to Troy to write a children's book about the legend brought about Sirena's second life to be spread far and wide by school children.

In 1991 Jackie wrote the children's book "Sirena of Salado." She toured schools all over Texas, Arizona and California telling the legend and selling "Sirena of Salado" books. Sirena had a third life and over 30,000 Sirena books found homes with school children.

In 1992 Jackie was handed the keys to Tablerock Amphitheater in Salado and a check book with \$1.34 balance "There was no place to go but up," and so she did. After a few short plays, Jackie realized a big extravaganza was needed. She wrote an outdoor musical historical drama about the Scottish people who were led to Texas by Sterling Robertson. Jackie incorporated the Sirena legend into "Salado Legends" and for the past 24 years Sirena has enjoyed a fourth (but not final) life. The Sirena Legend lives on and on! Performance of Salado Legends will be July 23, 30 and August 6.



### **Mills on Salado Creek**

(excerpts from History of Bell County, Third Edition George W. Tyler)

...mention should be made of the numerous small flour and grist mills which were to be found along the streams from the late sixties to the early eighties. They were nearly all run by water power. The Salado Creek was especially well adapted to milling, and more mills than any other stream in the county. The oldest one on this creek was Ferguson's Mill. It had first been built by Ira E. and Whitefield Chalk in 1849 or 1850 and after some years had been owned and operated by Jr. James P. Reed. The Reverend James E. Ferguson bought it in 1867 and ran it until his death in 1876. It was then carried on for many years by his family. In 1866 Mr. W.A. Davis formerly of Round Rock built a mill and dam on this creek a little way below the big springs at the town of Salado. At first it was a wool carding establishment but was later converted into a flour and grist mill. In the same year John Meyers erected a mill several miles further down on Salado Creek, which later passed through the hands of several owners but is best remembered as the Summer's Mill. Other mills built on this stream were Dulaney's (1867), T.J. Jones' (1869), Stinnett and Orgain's (1874) later known as Stinnett's and finally as the Highland Mill and "Ike" (Isaac V) Jones' Mill (1880) . On the Lampasas, after the little pioneer Children's Mill, built in 1848, came Guthrie's (1870) and W.K. Hamblen's (1871).



### Historic bridges over Salado Creek

For several years after the town was laid out, the citizens of Salado crossed the shallow creek by stepping from rock to rock, or on logs laid across the wider places. These logs were chained to the rocks and would sink down stream during freshets and be replaced when the flood subsided. But when in 1866 a dam was thrown across the stream at the lower end of the village, the water was backed up over the rocks. Then for a time "foot-logs" raised on legs standing in the water and chained to the rocks below were used; but they were narrow, rickety and unsafe, and pedestrians not infrequently tumbled off into the water. A general demand arose for a bridge. To meet this problem as well as others, it was decided to incorporate the village. Application for incorporation was made under the general law and the county court in January 1867, authorized and election for town officers. On February 23, Judge O.T. Tyler was elected mayor and a board of aldermen was chosen. These officials appointed the other officers, among the Colonel Thos. H. Jones as treasurer. The town officials first tried to raise funds for a bridge by voluntary donations, but finding they could not raise enough by this means, on December 3, 1868, they ordered an issue of bonds...


The bonds were purchased by the citizens of the town. With the proceeds and subscriptions amounting in all to some \$2,500, the municipal authorities proceeded to build a wire cable suspension foot-bridge of substantial construction of unique design and graceful proportions. Two large galvanized rope-wire cables, anchored at each end in strongly built stone abutments, were carried over two double-turreted dressed-stone piers of towers. From these suspended cables wire cords extended down to catch and support the ends of sawed cedar cross bars or joists on which the plank floor was laid. It was one of the first of its kind in the Southwest and was designed, engineered and constructed entirely by home talent-Judge Tyler, Colonel Thos. H. Jones, Judge Wm. H. Garrett, Wm. A.

Davis, John Hendrickson and others. It swung some twenty feet above the water and although it could be made to sway enough from side to side to frighten timid souls--especially groups of squealing girls when mischie-vous boys chose this method of teasing them--it served the people well for more than thirty years. After the county built a combination wagon and foot bridge a few yards upstream the suspension bridge gradually fell into disuse. In 1913 it was finally swept away when a cloud burst in the upper water-shed of Salado Creek sent down a terrific flood that carried away the county bridge as well. The latter was promptly rebuilt, only to be carried away again in the still greater flood of September 9 and 10, 1921.


