Village pursues plans to reduce deer count through limited hunts

The Village of Salado is working with the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department to get the growing white tail deer population under control.

Overpopulation of white tail deer in suburban residential areas is a modern problem of the "suburban sprawl" generations that find more and more people leaving the cities for the suburbs.

The lush, green lawns associated with the 'burbs provide forage for deer, but not the quality forage of more natural surroundings. Because many homeowners also install lawn sprinklers, deer find a ready source of water during drought conditions.

And many folks feed the deer, contributing to the problem even more.

Considering that as deer move into residential areas (or remain when residential areas move into their areas), they lose many of their natural predators.

In a few generations, the deer population seems to explode and the result are weak, sickly deer.

Also, they become a nuisance as they contribute to accidents on the streets (nearly 29,000 per year), a possible increase in Lyme disease, and damage to landscapes by foraging.

The Village has begun the process of applying for a number of Managed Lands Deer Permits for property owners. The MLDP will allow for hunting of the deer by bowhunters, perhaps even beyond the normal hunting season.

The MLDPs will not allow for hunting by rifle in residential areas.

The Village will work with TP&W and property owners to organize the process for multiple

Each land owner that participates will have an MLDP and will be connected with a bowhunter to take a certain number of deer.

According to TP&W literature, these programs are intended to drastically reduce the population of deer in an area in a short amount of time (usually one season) and then maintain the lower numbers over the long-term.

"We want to work with the larger landowners first," Dr. Dankert said, referring to large tracts of land in the Village such as the Cemetery, Golf Course and other tracts that are do not have large numbers of houses on them yet.

Before the MLDPs can be issued, the Village will conduct a census before hunting season to help determine just how many deer there are and how many should be killed to bring the population under control.

Some TP&W literature states that without taking half of a deer population in a suburban or urban area, the efforts may prove fruitless as the deer will quickly repopulate.

Depending upon the local deer population, there are three levels of MLDP issued by TP&W. Level 1 allows for hunting of antlerless deer. Levels 2 and 3 allow for the killing of antlered deer as well, under restrictions.

Hunters who take deer under the MLDPs cannot keep the meat nor the antlers for themselves. These are not typical hunting permits, but special permits that require that the deer be field dressed and meat donated and that the antlers be destroyed. In addition, MLDPs require information on each deer harvested under the permits, including the sex and age of the deer.

Salado seeks fed's help to get rid of black & turkey vultures

At dusk and after dawn, they circle overhead and seem to have grown in numbers in the past year or so in Salado. Many Saladoans consider the black vulture and turkey vulture to be more of a nuisance than a necessity, though the large birds are nature's garbage disposals.

And as migratory birds, they are protected by a treaty dating to the early 20th Century. So dealing with the committees (or volts, or venues - which is somewhat ironic since they gather in large numbers near Salado's The Venue on Center Circle) comes under the jurisdiction of the federal government.

Salado alderman Amber Dankert reported that she is working with the Department of Agriculture's Wildlife Services

department to address the growing concern of the growing population of vultures along Salado Creek.

Vultures are a very adaptable species of birds and choose to live near human populations for the ready supply of food and cover. They like to roost in large numbers on anything tall, from cell phone towers, to high rises to trees barren of leaves. It gives them a vantage point to spot small animals, either dead or living.

An emergency Depredation Permit from the USDA Wildlife Services division will allow for the harassment of the vultures at their roosts as well as the possible take, or killing, of some of the birds in order to bring their numbers back into a manageable realm.

The problem with these large garbage disposers is that the genetic strengths that make them immune to

the possible bacteria and diseases associated with eating carrion can cause trouble in populate areas.

It comes down to the three Ps: pee, poop and puke. All of which are very acidic and can cause damage wherever they do it, which according to biologists with USDA is just about everywhere.

The birds pee down their legs. The high uric acid is a form of protection against the bacteria swarming around the road kill and natural kills that they consider a fine meal.

The birds puke, as a natural reaction to being disturbed. "The birds regurgitate a reeking and corrosive vomit as a natural defense," according to a 2010 USDA fact sheet on vulture damage.

And their poop is more corrosive than other birds, which is trouble for the paint job of cars parked beneath their roosting ar-

eas.

And their long claws, used for tearing apart dead flesh, is damaging as well to car rooftops, paint jobs, building roofs, window ledges and anywhere else they might choose to set down.

But they are doing a necessary job in ridding the ecosystem of dead and dying animals, including white tail deer, which are also overpopulating areas populated by humans.

The birds, in Salado at least, seem to have gathered mostly along Salado Creek in Pace Park and along properties on Center Circle.

Dr. Dankert said she has contacted three of those property owners about the black vultures and has their support for pursuing an abatement/population control of the birds. She meets this week with a biologist out of the

Aldermen amend operating, hotel/motel fund budgets

Salado aldermen amended the general fund budget and the hotel/motel budget Jan. 15, increasing expenditures and dipping into the fund balances of both considerably.

The amended general operating budget increases expenditures by \$287,251. Of the \$287,251 increase in expenses, \$225,000 should be one-time for roads and the municipal

building.

The majority of this increase is \$200,000 rolled over from the 2013-14 budget for street repairs to increase those expenses to \$464,200.

Municipal building costs increased by \$25,000 for renovations to the two buildings owned by the Village on Stagecoach Rd. This will allow for the police offices to be moved to the northern building (Salado's original municipal building which had been

leased to Scott & White Ambulance services for \$1 per year for the last few years). The City Manager will move into the current police offices and other changes will be made for staff.

The amended budget also increases administrative costs by \$58,445, to include additional personnel costs of about \$25,000, \$15,000 for participation in the Bell County Coalition contract. The mu-

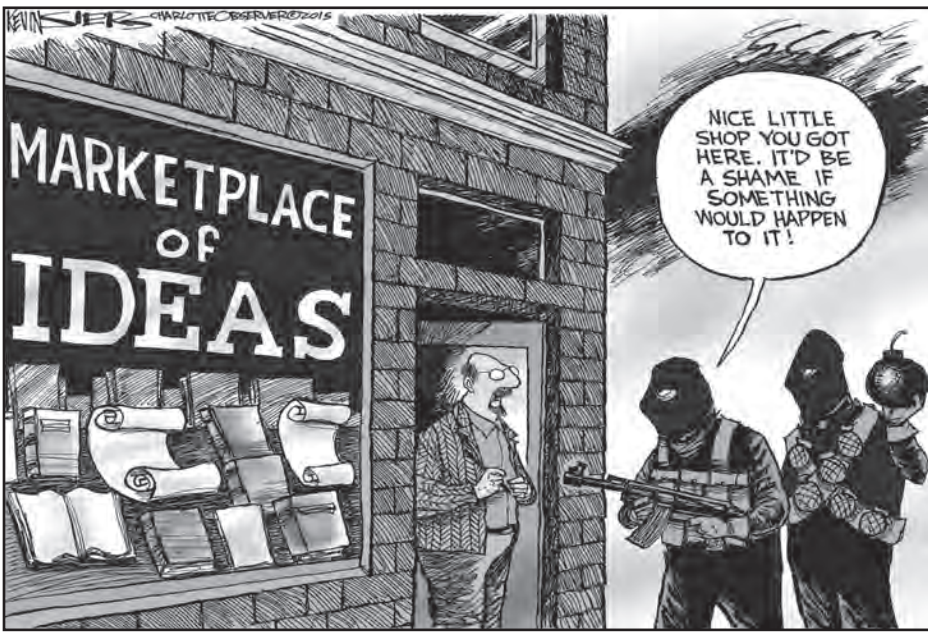

Europe's Problem With Immigration

The New York Times ran a front-page article after the Charlie Hebdo massacre on Europe's "dangerous moment." As terrorists rampaged through Paris, ultimately killing 17, what was the cause of this particular alarm? That anti-immigration parties in Europe might gain.

The Times article captured perfectly the reaction of polite opinion to the Paris attacks, which is driven almost as much by fear that someone might notice that Europe has an immigration problem as it is by fear of the terrorism itself.

Europe's anti-immigration parties run the gamut, from the loathsome (Greece's Golden Dawn), to the unsavory (France's National Front), to the more or less respectable (Britain's UKIP). What they all have in common is that they benefit from the refusal of mainstream parties to admit the obvious: If a country is manifestly having trouble assimilating the immigrants it already has, it shouldn't add to their numbers willy-nilly.

Much more important than solidarity and unity -- stirring as those things are, exemplified in the massive march in Paris -- would be a dose of honesty and realism on this issue. The case of France is

stark. Roughly 12 percent of its population is foreign-born, about the European average, according to the Migration Policy Institute. But it also has a particularly high percentage of descendants of immigrants. Because of France's colonial history in Algeria and other countries in the Maghreb, many of them are Muslim.

It has the largest Muslim population of any Western European country, both in absolute numbers and in percentage terms. These immigrants have tended to cluster in the suburbs of Paris, where they have become self-reinforcing religio-ethnic islands in the broader French sea. These areas are not just alienated from the French state; they are actively hostile to it. Although France's problem has peculiarly French characteristics, a version of the Paris attacks easily could have happened in Britain, Sweden, the Netherlands or Germany. They, too, have Muslim populations that, in some areas, haven't fully integrated.

Why does the United States not have the same problem (although it has experienced its own home-

grown attacks)? Its assimilationist machinery, for all its flaws, is in better working order. It is an open, economically dynamic society. But this is partly a function of numbers. Immigrants to the U.S. still largely come from Christian countries and don't feel the powerful pull of a religious identity putting them at odds with their new country.

This is a rather basic point: The quantity of immigration inevitably affects the quality of assimilation. The elite's reflex on immigration is always to say "more." The populations of many European countries want to say "less." Their case is stronger after the horrors of the last week, although much intellectual and political energy will be devoted to denying that the Paris attacks had anything to do with immigration or Islam. Addressing a long-ago crisis in Athens, Demosthenes said of those demanding to know his alternative, "I will first give them this answer -- the most just and true of all -- 'Do not do what you are doing now.'" On immigration, that is the counsel that Europe needs to hear, and to heed.

for further study of the Salado salamander, \$7,500 for computer and network upgrades.

The municipal court budget more than doubled in costs from \$21,500 to \$44,757 to incorporate a part-time administrative assistant for the court.

The amended budget can be found in this edition.

Foutz explained that the amended hotel/motel budget brings into the Village the partnership agreement with the Salado Chamber of Commerce, and spends down some of the fund balance in the hotel/motel coffers.

The amended budget increases income and expenses for the hotel/motel budget by \$97,500 to reflect the participation of the Chamber of Commerce income and expenses. The amended budget also spends down \$50,000 in hotel/motel reserves for total income and expenses of \$392,400 in the 2014-15 fiscal year. The hotel/motel budget includes additional expenses of \$13,131 for special projects and \$11,007 for way-finding signage. It also adds salaries and benefits for an events coordinator and public relations specialist, as well as \$7,000 for contract labor expenses. The hotel/motel budget also includes \$55,000 in annual advertising expenses. A detailed budget can be found in this edition.

The board, on a motion from Fred Brown and second from Ambert Dankert, approved the budget amendments with Hans Fields casting the only vote against.

Dallas office of the USDA to pursue an emergency Depredation Permit for ridding the area of the birds.

The first step will be harassment, coming in the form of noise, and a lot of it. Air cannons and other noisemakers will be set off near the roosts of the venues of vultures. In Pace Park, where the birds have taken up in dead trees, the dead trees along the banks of the creek will also be removed.

If harassment doesn't work on bringing the problem under control, then the next step will be "a taking," Dr. Dankert said.

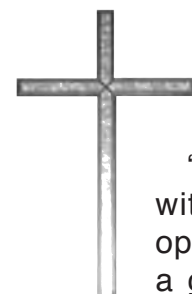

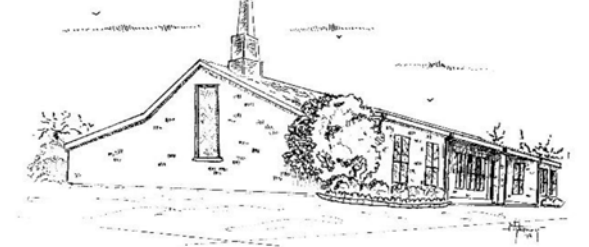

Village, Sanctuary developers to begin early negotiations

City manager Kim Foutz and Mayor Skip Blacett met with Robert Sulaski, CEO of Sanctuary Development Company on Jan. 19 to begin negotiations between the Village of Salado and the developer of the 300-acre Mixed Use Development located mostly in the extra-territorial jurisdiction (ETJ) of Salado.

Mayor Blacett has appointed three committees to discuss various issues of the Village concerning the development that may bring more than 500 homes, 325 apartment units, 400 hotel rooms and an indoor and outdoor live music venue, as well as 65,000 square feet of office space, 345,000 square feet of retail space.

"We are about to enter into negotiations with The Sanctuary and other developers who are coming to the Salado area," Mayor Blacett said last week. "If we don't build a solid foundation for working with developments,

we will suffer for years to come."

"The historical and cultural district of this town is extremely important," he added, "and must be protected at all costs. As a citizen and as Mayor of Salado, I intend to stick by that."

Blacett added that he will "certainly have an open mind. We are not going to make outlandish demands, but will take to heart what the citizens of this community want and what they desire for the future."

Blacett outlined the three committees and their tasks. The committees will begin meeting with Sanctuary developers in February.

Annexation and ETJ Committee will include these members: Aldermen Amber Preston-Dankert and Michael McDougal, Claire Hartman, Larry Sands and Paul Schoenrock. In addition to discussing annexation of The Sanctuary development, the committee will also investigate what other communities are doing to

bring in properties, ETJ agreements, Development Agreements in relation to ETJ annexation and how communities bring in properties through voluntary annexation.

Water Treatment and Sewer System Committee will include Dave Olson, Hans Fields, Travis Quicksall and Fred Brown. It will discuss a wastewater agreement with The Sanctuary, as well as financial contributions to the sewer system from The Sanctuary, taxes, impact fees, land and location of a wastewater treatment plant, right-of-way issues, the permitting process, ownership of the WWTP and how effluent is to be handled.

The Development Agreement and Economic Development Committee will be composed of Frank Coachman, Fred Brown, Dave Broecker and Steven Ervin. This committee will consider the technical specifications and details of a Development Agreement in terms of how the development will look, street widths, open spaces, building use, parks, bike lanes, ponds, landscaping and the relationship of buildings. It will also discuss an Economic Development Agreement in terms of the roles and relationship of the developer and the city, funding sources, incentives and timing of possible annexation.

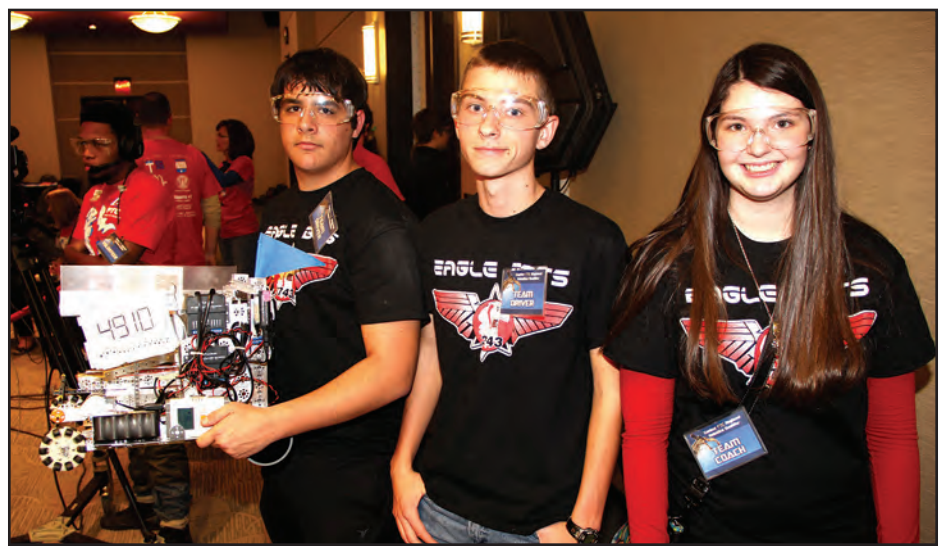

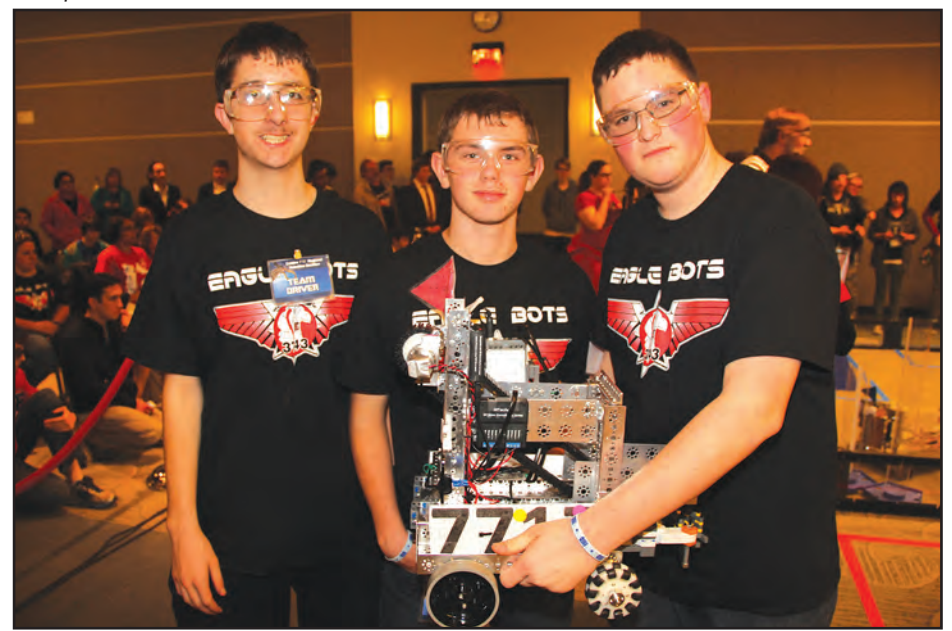

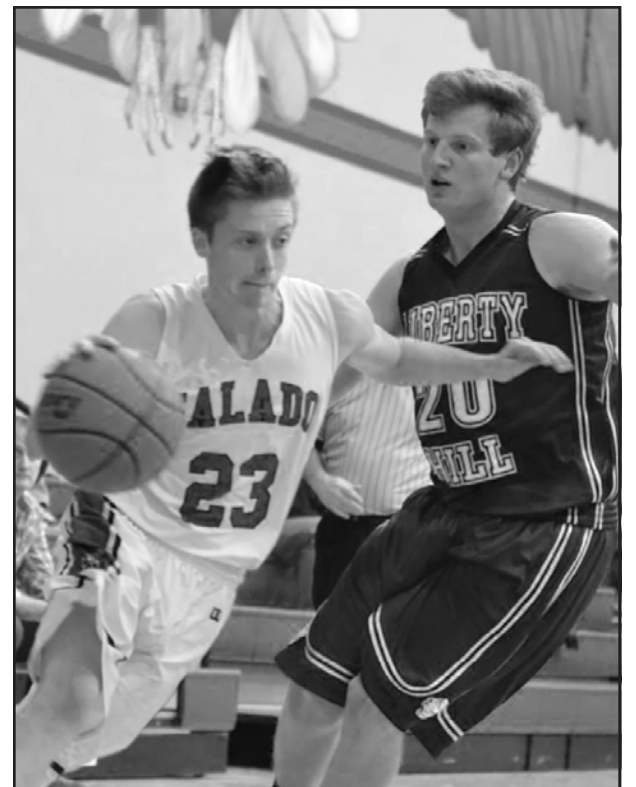
Education Act (IDEA), enacted in 1990.
