Village seeks workday help at municipal buildings

The Village of Salado is asking for volunteers to help to finish the renovations of the existing municipal buildings.

Join in the Village Volunteer Day to complete renovations to the municipal building and new police department building at 301 and 313 N. Stagecoach Rd.

Work day will take place 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Jan. 31.

Salado aldermen in December approved \$25,000 in renovation expenses to move the police department to the original Village municipal building that in recent years housed staff members for the Scott & White Ambulance service and to build an office area for the City Manager in the current municipal building.

The cost of renovations to the Police Department Facility totaled about \$14,000 and include laminate wood floors (\$3,500), painting throughout (\$500), technology expenses of about \$3,500, furniture and fixtures and construction of an entry way totaling about \$1,400.

The cost to renovate the current municipal building for continued use as a municipal court, aldermen meeting room, and municipal offices totaled about \$9,500.

The cost includes about \$2,000 in technology expenses for presentation screens and \$1,300 for fans and lighting in the meeting room. Another \$3,000 will be for furniture and fixtures for the new city manager's office and conference area.

Other costs include painting, carpet cleaning and flooring.

Village negotiates with two large potential developments in ETJ

The Village of Salado is in negotiations with two developers on opposite sides of I-35 to bring sewer service to those mixed use developments as well as to the downtown commercial district and west side commercial districts of Salado.

The Village began discussions with the developers of The Sanctuary on several items, most especially the use of the permit awarded by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for the construction of a sewer system on The Sanctuary property.

Having the state permit

already in-hand will save the Village several months of the permitting process.

Robert Sulaski has proposed to Village leaders, partnering with The Sanctuary development corporation for the construction of the sewer system.

The Sanctuary developers already have in hand a permit from TCEQ for construction of a sewer plant with adequate capacity to serve both the immediate needs of the development and the needs of the village. According to the design specifications for the permitting process, the plant will be built on the northeast section of the 300 acres on property near Royal Street just outside

the current city limits. The design specifications call for water to be treated and then pumped southward on the property to be released into Smith Branch Creek, running through the residential elements of The Sanctuary.

"We have wanted the effluent for our own water elements on this project," Sulaski explained.

James McCann, an engineer for The Sanctuary, told the audience that the standard for the effluent is what is referred to as 5:5:2. "We are proposed at one of the highest standards in the states for what is released into the waterway," McCann said. "This is the same quality that is

required for the Barton Creek recharge zone. It is considered safe for human contact and is treated to a higher standard than the water that is already in the creek system."

Developers of The Sanctuary and Village officials have begun meeting to discuss the possible partnership on a sewer system, as well as annexation, incentives and taxation of the development.

City Manager Kim Foutz said that the sewer system will need a capacity of 750,000 gallons to 1.5 million gallons per day to meet the needs of the Village, as well as those of The Sanctuary and the SEE DEVELOPMENTS, PAGE 6A

SISD set to hire new Athletic Director Feb. 9; will begin duties at high school this July

Salado ISD Trustees are scheduled to vote on Superintendent Michael Novotny's recommendation for the Athletic Director at a Feb. 9 meeting. Prior to that meeting, the second round interview committee will interview five candidates for the position on Jan. 30.

Dr. Novotny said that 40 candidates applied for the job, which was posted on the school website and on statewide education websites on Jan. 6.

Three committees will have had involvement in the hiring process: an application review committee, a first round interview committee and a second round interview committee. Each committee is composed of three administrators, three coaches and a parent.

The new Athletic Director, when hired by the district, will begin duties on July 6 for a one year contract. After the first year, the contract can be

extended to two years.

After that first year, the job description may change as well, according to Dr. Novotny.

"While the initial position will be director of athletics," Dr. Novotny said, "my long range plan is to expand the duties to include all extra-curricular activities such as Academic UIL, fine arts, and agricultural science."

Part of the duties will be overseeing girls athletics going forward. Previously, Cindy Mewhinney acted as Girls Athletic Coordinator as well as head cross country coach and head girls track coach. She officially retired in December, but Dr. Novotny said Mewhinney is returning for part-time coaching duties.

"Now that we will have a non-coaching athletic director, that person will assume those responsibilities," he said.

Novotny said he had two reasons driving the separation of the athletic director and head football coaching positions. "The

head football coach and the athletic director roles are both very demanding and time consuming roles that would be better split between two people," he said. "The athletic director is the only administrator position in Texas public schools that doesn't require a master's degree or administrator certification. We are hoping to find a qualified candidate with those credentials."

Dr. Novotny said the additional position will not be an additional expense to the district. "We are eliminating another teacher/coach position through attrition to offset this change," he said.

Brent Graham will remain as head football coach and will take on teaching assignments next year in health and physical education.

The job description for Director of Athletics requires a Master's degree in educational administration, a Texas principal or other appropriate Texas certificate.

Primary purpose will

be to "direct and manage the overall program of extracurricular and intramural athletics for the district. Work to provide each student with opportunity to participate in an extracurricular athletic activity and ensure compliance with all state, University Interscholastic League (UIL), and local requirements," according to the job description.

With the hire of the Athletic Director, Salado ISD will be the only single high school district in the area to have an Athletic Director who does not also serve as the Head Football Coach.

Among the teams that Salado competed against in football are these Athletic Directors/Head Football Coaches: Ronnie Porter, Troy, David Woodard, West, Jeff Miller, Rockdale, Michael Nichols, Academy, Kyle Cooper, Gatesville, Craig Slaughter, Llano, Bobby Jack Goforth, Caldwell, Chris Jones, Giddings, Matthew Kates, LaGrange and Cyril Adkins, Smithville.

In Bell County, only Killeen ISD with four 6A high schools, has a separate Director of Athletics, David Manley. Each of the individual campus Head Football Coaches also serve as the Athletic Coordinator for those campuses: Jerry Edwards, Harker Heights High, Channon Hall, Shoemaker High and Trent Gregory, Ellison High. The head football coach/athletic coordinator position at Killeen High School was posted on Jan. 23 at the Texas Association of School Administrator website as being open (http://careercenter.tasanet.org/job_listing.php?id=61795).

Bob Shipley is the Athletic Director/Head Football Coach at 6A Belton High, Jack Welch is the Athletic Director/Head Football Coach at 6A Copperas Cove High and Mike Spradlin is the Athletic Director/Head Football Coach at 5A Temple High, state finalists in 2014 football.

'American Sniper' marks return of the War Hero

Clint Eastwood's new movie, "American Sniper," marks the return of the American war hero.

Heroism on the battlefield had never gone away, of course, far from it (witness the Medal of Honors awarded for acts of extraordinary valor in Iraq and Afghanistan). But the classic war hero is more than just brave or fierce. He is famous and almost universally acclaimed. On top of his battlefield exploits, he is a cultural phenomenon.

That is what "American Sniper" unquestionably makes of Chris Kyle. The late Navy SEAL sniper had already written a best-selling memoir and was known as "The Legend" within the military for his record number of confirmed kills during four tours in Iraq. The success of the movie, where he is played by Bradley Cooper, also means he will be remembered as a larger-than-life figure. Such is the power of the silver screen.

"American Sniper" had the largest opening weekend ever in January. It is producing the kind of numbers usually reserved for mindless comic-book superhero movies. It has played especially well in Middle America, with its top-grossing theaters in places like San Antonio,

Oklahoma City, Houston and Albuquerque.

All of this is profoundly disquieting to the left, which has so much sway in Hollywood. It hates and distrusts the idea of the war hero, believing it smacks of backwardness and jingoism. Its notion of compelling war movies were the tendentiously anti-war flops "Green Zone," "Stop-Loss" and "In the Valley of Elah." Its reaction to "American Sniper" has been to belittle the movie and smear Chris Kyle.

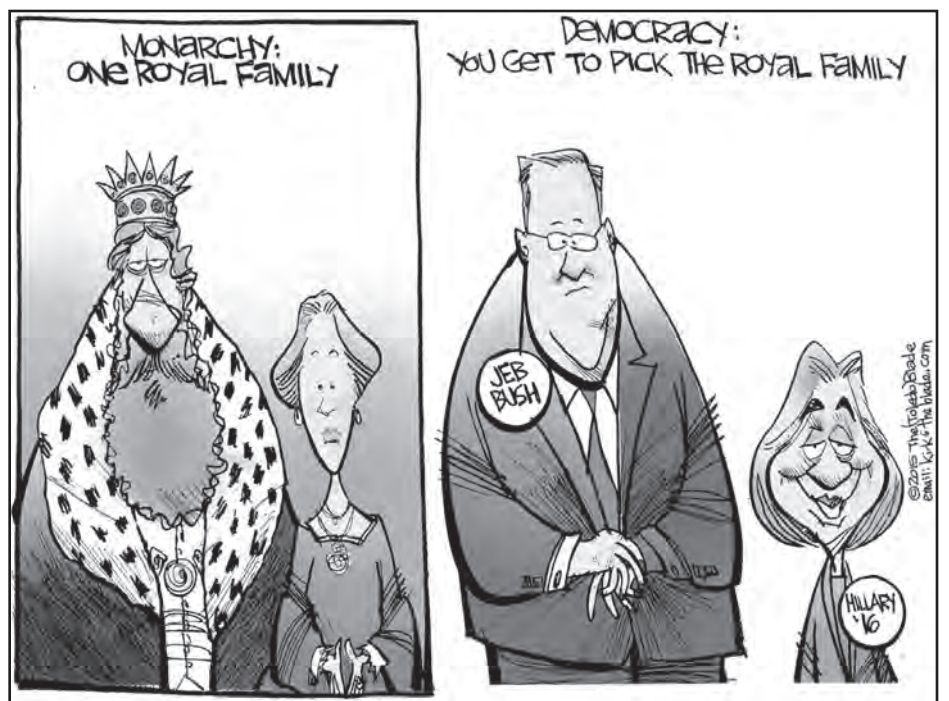
Actor Seth Rogen compared "American Sniper" to the Nazi propaganda film featured in the movie "Inglourious Basterds." Director Michael Moore tweeted that he'd been taught to consider snipers cowards. Kyle "was a hate-filled killer," according to The Guardian, which also deems him "a racist who took pleasure in dehumanizing and killing brown people." One member of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences -- "American Sniper" is up for best picture -- told the website TheWrap that Kyle "seems like he may be a sociopath."

One can only imagine, in this spirit, the criticisms that might have been made of past American war heroes. Why did John Paul Jones have such destructive urges toward British shipping? Did Joshua Chamberlain have to be so bloodthirsty when under assault on Little Round Top? What was wrong with Alvin York and Audie Murphy that they were so obsessed with killing Germans?

Despite the reaction against it in some quarters, "American Sniper" is hardly a simplistic glorification of warfare. It shows its terrible cost, in lost and broken lives. The New Yorker, accurately, calls it "a devastating pro-war movie and a devastating anti-war movie." Kyle himself is nearly consumed by the horrors of what he experienced in Iraq, and his tragic death at the hands of a disturbed vet is a heartbreaking coda to his service.

Chris Kyle, who had his flaws like anyone else, wasn't a saint. He was an exceptional warrior whose bravery and feats on the battlefield will now be remembered for a very long time. He is, in short, a war hero.

Protecting Salado Salamander

It is not new information that the Salado Springs Salamander (*Eurycea chisholmensis*) was listed as Threatened by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) in February, 2014. The listing provides the Salado Springs Salamander all the protections of the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended (ESA).

Section 9 of the ESA provides for the prohibited acts regarding Threatened and Endangered Species, like the salamander. This section prohibits the "take" of the species, which includes "harm" and

damaging or destroying its habitat. Section 7 and Section 10 of the ESA provide exceptions to the take prohibition in the form of scientific permits and incidental take permits for otherwise lawful activities. Take is permitted to the federal government in Section 7 and to non-federal entities in Section 10. In order for incidental take to be permitted, Section 10 requires that a conservation plan must be submitted to the USFWS. The plan must include the resulting impact of the take, how the take will be minimized and mitigated to the greatest extent possible, and what alternatives were considered. Although

a Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) was considered, the expense of such an undertaking to the Village of Salado makes this option unreachable at this time.

Therefore, a compromise was discussed at a Bell County Adaptive Management Coalition meeting, that an ordinance approved by the Village of Salado that limited activities in and around the springs would be beneficial. In a more recent conversation regarding the proposed ordinance, USFWS representatives stated that the ordinance would help prevent any

Sewer -- The Village Engineers are studying Sanctuary's schedule proposal. The Village Water Treatment/Sewer Committee will begin studying it this week. Negotiation recommendations will be made to the Aldermen/lady.

Annexation -- The Village Committee with Alderlady Dankart, Alderman McDougal, Larry Sands, and Claire Hartmann will have their first meeting this week.

Downtown -- Texas A&M will begin talking to citizens and shop owners on how they perceive the Downtown to look. This semester student class project will be presented to Salado early June.

Environment -- Salamanders and low water bridge cleaning are at the center of discussion along with buzzards and deer.

With Sanctuary and Robertson Ranch and all the other issues facing the Village, a perfect storm has formed. However, the Village team is prepared; the citizens are involved, and we are going forward knowing that we are weather-worthy to withstand any storm.

Remembering greatest 'Babe' in modern sports

Didrikson Zaharias shattered stereotypes

I recently addressed a rather odd topic for an audience of political progressives: "Who was your sports hero growing up?"

Of course, sports today is very political -- from billionaire team owners demanding that taxpayers build sports palaces for them, to the recent show of political solidarity by athletes who have "Hands up, Don't shoot" written across their jerseys.

In the 1950s and '60s, when I grew up playing ball, athletes were not supposed to be political. Yet just by being in the game, some players were making profound political statements every day. Jackie Robinson, for example, heroically endured fierce racism to break down the solid wall of segregation in baseball.

I never considered athletes to be heroes, but some heroes do happen

to be athletes, including the one I chose. Even as a boy, I knew that "Babe" was unusual, excelling in sports, but doing something bigger.

Not Babe Ruth, but Babe Didrikson Zaharias -- a woman who cast off the stereotype that female athletes were delicate, half-court players.

Raised in a hardscrabble working family in Texas, Babe was a national champion basketball player. She also won countless events in national track meets and set four world records in the Olympics.

She even went on to pioneer the women's

golf tour, winning 82 tournaments and founding the LPGA. She was rightfully named sports' "Woman of The Year" five times.

But Babe Zaharias' greatest triumph was to alter America's cultural biases about what a woman couldn't do. She changed the political climate so girls and women who came after her could get more programs, funding, coaching, opportunities, and respect for developing their athleticism.

"My main idea," she said, "always has been to go out there and cut loose with everything I've got. I've never been afraid to go up against anything."

further listing actions (i.e. Endangered status) for the species, and with enough conservation measures in place along with results from the Coalition's research projects, populations of the salamander could recover to a point that the species can be de-listed altogether. It is the goal of the USFWS to Recover the Salado Springs Salamander such that the species no longer warrants ESA protection. However, concern has been raised recently about the conditions outlined in the proposed ordinance. Many of these concerns have stemmed from misinformation; therefore, the information from the most recent draft is included below. It should be noted that although USFWS previously commented on, and approved, the draft ordinance, the document has been re-submitted to USFWS in hopes that some of the conditions may be changed.

Currently, the ordinance defines the conservation zone of the salamander as follows: "The length of the conservation zone shall be located along the Salado Creek, bound by the Interstate 35 (I-35) access road bridge to the west, and 10 meters east of Anderson

Spring to the east. The width of the conservation zone is ten (10) meters outside the ordinary high water mark of the Salado Creek. Other areas protected by this ordinance shall be the area within 300 meters of spring sites that are known to be connected to, or directly recharge, the Salado Creek."

There are six prohibited activities within the Conservation Zone; however, only three of these prohibited activities are not currently regulated. Existing State and Federal laws, including but not limited to the Clean Water Act, prohibit the harvesting or movement of creek rock, soil, and other materials within the streambed, use of pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers in excess of the product label standards, and creation of dams, impoundments, and other structures that obstruct stream flow.

The three new prohibited activities include swimming, wading, or other human entrance into the creek within the conservation zone, harvesting or cutting of vegetation within the conservation zone, and allowing pets to enter the creek within the conservation zone.

The Village is currently

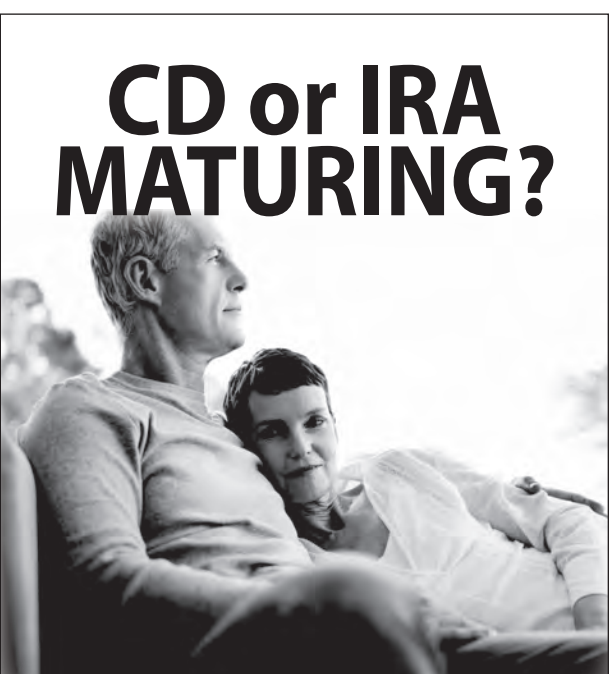
talking to USFWS to determine whether human activity within the creek can occur at a small location near the First Baptist Church to allow baptisms to continue there. It is proposed that all other human activity, such as swimming and wading, would occur near the Table Rock area of Pace Park. Therefore, the ordinance does not prohibit all human activities within the creek, but rather shifts the activities downstream and further east. Pets would also be allowed to enter the creek in the Pace Park area, downstream from the protected springs.

Another source of concern was the lack of mowing up to the stream bed on both Village and private property. The ordinance specifically states that it would be prohibited "unless it is determined by Village officials that this is in the best interest of the species." If it is determined that mowing will not negatively impact the salamanders, then there should be no reason that mowing could not occur up to the creek bank outside of the immediate vicinity of the springs.

Finally, it has been noted that the Village is not doing enough to prevent

contamination within the recharge zone of the aquifer, which has been stated as being located as far south as the Williamson County/ Georgetown. Although these areas do fall within the Edwards aquifer, most experts agree that the recharge zone for the northern section of the Edwards aquifer (where the Village of Salado is located) is west of I-35 and north of Prairie Dell. This is the focus area for the research currently being conducted through the Bell County Adaptive Management Coalition, of which the Village of Salado is a member. However, any ordinance cannot extend past the Village boundaries.

The Village of Salado strives to protect the best interest of Saladoans and the Salado Springs Salamander, so that our way of life, water rights, recreation, and growth are not inhibited by further federal regulation should the species be up-listed to Endangered. 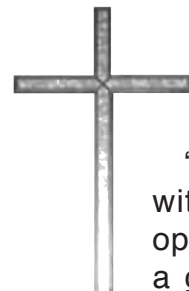

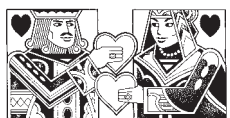

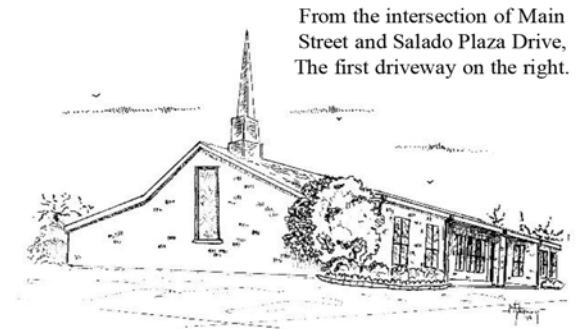

Fly Fish Texas March 14 at Texas Freshwater Fisheries Center

Learn to tie a fly, cast a fly and catch a fish all in one day during the annual Fly Fish Texas event at the Texas Freshwater Fisheries Center March 14.

Throughout the day, experienced fly-tiers will be demonstrating and teaching fly-tying in the Anglers Pavilion on a one-on-one basis. In addition, group instruction in beginning fly-tying will be offered in the Hart-Morris Conservation Center classroom beginning at noon. Both are offered on a walk-up basis.

Beginning casting instruction will take place continuously in the Conservation Center parking lot from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. In the Conservation Center Room B, attend fly-

fishing 101 at 10 a.m. and learn about essential flies for Texas fresh water at 11 a.m.

Fly-fishing kayak style will be presented on the shore of the casting pond at 2 p.m.

Vendors will be displaying and selling fly-fishing gear, and seminars will brief visitors on where and how to fly-fish in fresh and salt waters for a variety of species. proposed development on approximately 450 acres of the Robertson Ranch.

That property has been put under contract, but has not yet closed. Developers are discussing sewer service to the area.

Time lines for these discussions have been

truncated into a "super aggressive" schedule, Foutz said, with pressure from both sides.

Additionally, Salado remains competitive for an Economic Development grant of \$1.5 million for a centralized sewer system.

Foutz said she expects to

know within four to six weeks if Salado will qualify for that grant.

In order to do so, however, the Village cannot move forward with plans on the sewer system until after the grant is awarded.

At that time, if the Village has made sufficient progress in discussions with the two local developments, a request for qualifications will be sent out for the design work on the sewer system.

Foutz said that the design of the system will take a minimum of eight months. Construction will take a minimum of another 10 months, while financing the bonds will take at least two months.



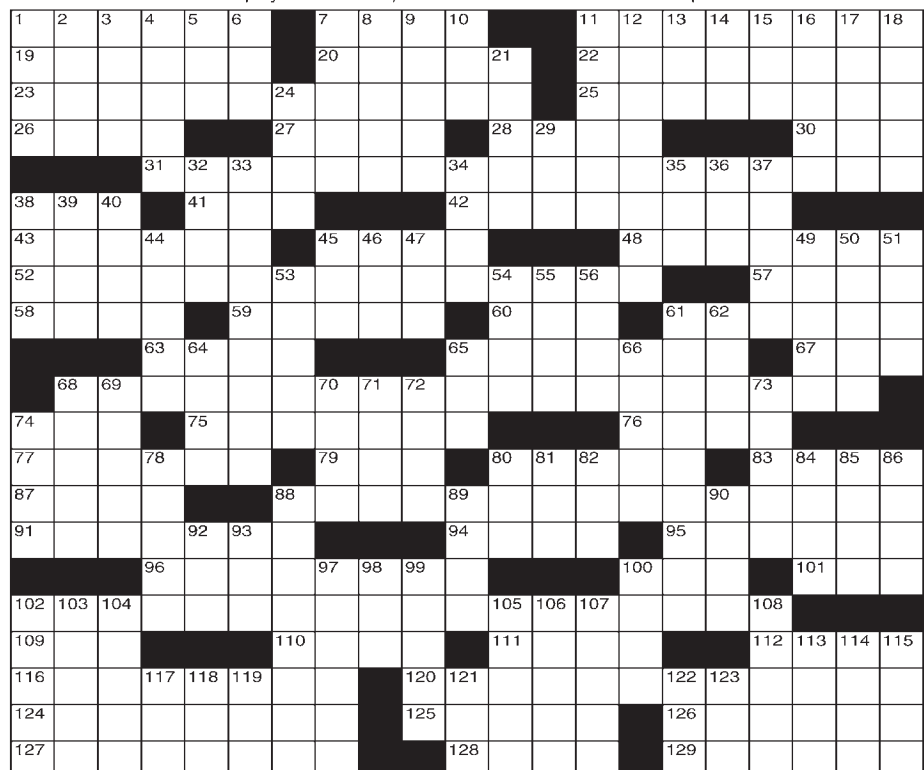

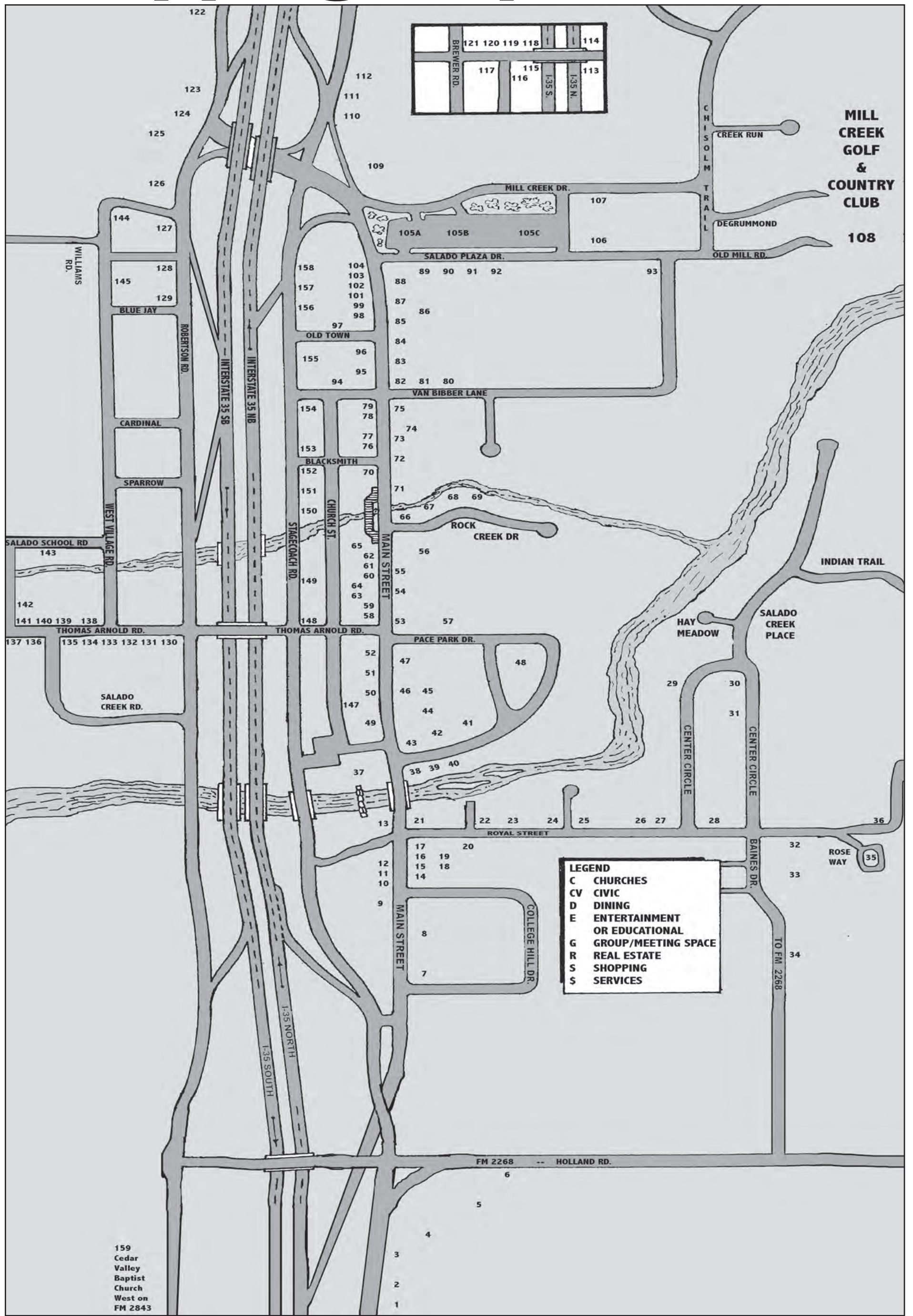

Consumer Alert - TDI Warns Consumers of Timeshare Fraud

AUSTIN – The Texas Department of Insurance (TDI) warns owners of timeshare vacation properties of a fraud scheme involving unlicensed title insurance companies. Consumers should always make sure they are dealing with properly licensed title companies and can contact TDI's Consumer Help Line at 1-800-252-3439 for assistance. Timeshare fraud typically begins when a person contacts timeshare owners and either says they are representing a buyer or offers to help them sell their properties. The person sends the owner to work with a specific title company, but the company doesn't exist. The company address, phone number, and website are legitimate-looking but are all fake. Finally, the person asks the owner to send money to an account in Mexico and then disappears without providing any services. "These fraudulent schemes typically involve a company that has

gone by several different names, but none are licensed by TDI," said Commissioner David Mattax. "Timeshare fraud is a serious crime, which can cost consumers thousands of dollars." TDI urges consumers to follow these tips to avoid becoming a victim of timeshare fraud: Make sure any title company you work with is licensed or registered to sell title insurance in Texas by calling the TDI Consumer Help Line at 1-800-252-3439. Know the company's exact name. Unlicensed companies often use names that are similar to the names of licensed companies. Verify that the title insurance company you're using has a physical office with a real address and a working phone number. If possible, visit the office in person. Ask the buyer's representative to send you details in writing about


