New principal kicks off year

Ross Sproul will greet Salado High School students for their first day of class on Aug. 25 as the new SHS principal, taking over a school which has had a great deal of awards and merits lately, including back-to-back UIL Lone Star Cups.

He was hired in late February by a unanimous vote of trustees, taking over from Burt Smith.

At the time he was hired, Sproul was the Associate Principal in charge of curriculum and instruction at Lake Travis High School, a position he has held since July 2011.

"We are very excited that he is going to be the new Salado High School Principal and I'm confident that he will continue our tradition of excellence and work in a collaborative manner with students, employees, and parents to make it an even better school," Dr. Novotny said.

Prior to Lake Travis, Sproul was the Associate Principal in charge of curriculum and instruction at Westlake High School from 2008 to 2011.

From 1999 until 2008, Sproul was employed by the Humble ISD at Kingwood Park High School. He was assistant principal of the Kingwood Ninth Grade Campus from January 2004 through July 2007.

Sproul holds a Master of Education in Administration and Supervision from University of Houston. He has a bachelor of science in biology from Stephen F. Austin State University and an associate of arts in social science from San Jacinto College.

As a classroom science teacher, Sproul was a state semifinalist for the H-E-B Excellence in Teaching award and was named the Teacher of the Year for the Kingwood High School Ninth Grade Campus.

Sproul is married to Stacy. They have three children: Jeb, 13, Raimy, 9 and Kenady, 5.

"I look forward to coming to Salado and becoming part of the community here," he said.

When the position was announced, there were 50 applicants for the job, according to Dr. Novotny.

A committee of six employees (KL Groholski, Lisa Nix, Dr. Novotny, Joe Rex, Susan Rushing and

Burt Smith) reviewed the applications and selected the candidates to interview.

Another committee of seven employees and one parent (Tara Beaty, Ron Byrd, Chris Diem, Brent Graham, Gloria Hodge, Anita Morales, Michael Novotny, and Burt Smith) interviewed nine candidates during the first round interviews. That committee chose Ross Sproul as the top candidate, but it invited the top three candidates back for second round interviews.

A third committee comprised of seven employees and one parent (Jill Baumgart, JJ Jonas, Rachel Lee, Cindy McWhinney, Dr. Novotny, Terri Seaton, Burt Smith, and Jennifer Umpleby) interviewed those three finalists during the second round interviews. All eight committee members unanimously chose Ross Sproul as the top candidate.

"I spoke with several of Ross Sproul's current and former supervisors, co-workers, and community members and all of them said that he is an outstanding school leader," Dr. Novotny said. "Sproul is an expert at curriculum and instruction, course selection, and ensuring students are prepared for college and careers."

St. Stephen Catholic Church celebrates 25th anniversary

St. Stephen Catholic Church will celebrate 25 years since its founding with a special service on Aug. 24.

The Most Reverend Joe S. Vasquez, Bishop of Austin Diocese and the St. Stephen pastor, Father Aloysius Nzekwe, MSP will be celebrating Holy Mass at 10 a.m. Aug. 24.

The Rosary will precede the Mass at 9:25 a.m. A noon lunch will be catered.

A handful of Salado Villagers came together 25 years ago with a dream to celebrate Mass in their own town. In the spring of 1989, Bishop McCarthy asked Reverend Charles Davis from Christ the King in Belton to start a mission in Salado and designated Christ the King Catholic Church in Belton as the "mother" church.

This mission would be a place where both English and Spanish speaking residents would be able to celebrate Mass. Sister Nancy Pewterbaugh came to Salado to work with the people and to help orga-

nize the new mission.

The first Mass was celebrated on Mother's Day, 1989, at Tablerock Amphitheatre in Salado.

In July, 1989, the Bishop asked Deacon Jordon Pfunter, from Hewitt if he would become the Pastoral Administrator of the mission Salado as there would be no resident priest.

The people (about 15 families) named the mission Holy Rosary, however, the Bishop suggested that the name be changed to St. Stephen (after the first deacon martyr) since the mission was to be under the administration of a deacon instead of a priest which was an unusual situation.

In less than five years, the mission moved from having Mass held at Tablerock Amphitheatre and later at Thomas Arnold Elementary to purchasing eight acres on FM 2268 and establishing a small chapel.

Cathy Michna and Winnie Buckley remembered that Deacon Jordon held a dedication for the newly

purchased land. The song, "On Holy Ground" was sung at this dedication in 1990 with about 15 people attended standing in the ditch along the Holland Road on a very warm and windy day.

During this time, space is rented from Methodist church for religious classes.

In 1991, a building is established for classrooms and living quarters. A building is also moved onto property to accommodate the growing church community.

On Easter Sunday April 19, 1992 the first Mass is held at the new building with standing room only in the chapel.

The church published its first directory in 1994 with 79 families.

In 1999, a pavilion is enclosed for a parish hall with kitchen added.

Plans began in 2013 for a new church building to be constructed.

The family of St. Stephen continues to grow with more than 168 families attending.

Salado schools expect an influx of new students to increase the enrollment by some three percent, but there are also many new staff members and teachers to greet them.

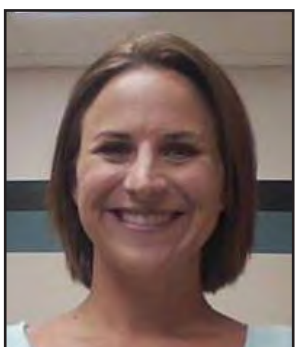

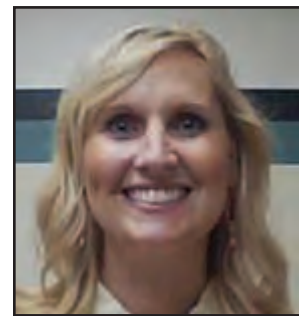

The Callow President

Missouri, rally, imploring congressional Republicans to start cooperating with him. The line struck a characteristically -- and tellingly -- juvenile and plaintive note.

How many books and articles have been written by conservatives seeking to divine the philosophical beliefs and psychological motivations lurking beneath the president's smooth exterior?

It's certainly true that the president is much further left than he'd ever admit, but the deepest truth about Obama is that there is no depth. He's smart without being wise. He's glib without being eloquent. He's a celebrity without being interesting. He's callow.

It's a trope on the right to say that Obama has quit, that he's not interested in the job anymore. It isn't true. If you are smug and unwilling to bend from your (erroneous) presumptions of how the world works, this is what presidential leadership looks

like.

Obama evidently has no conception of the national interest larger than his ideology or immediate political interests. In terms of his sensibility, he's about what you'd get if you took the average writer for The New Yorker and made him president of the United States.

The notion that Obama might be a grand historical figure was always an illusion. Once the magic wore off, it became clear he's not really an orator. His greatest rhetorical skill turns out to be mockery.

The man who once promised to transcend political divisions is an expert at the stinging partisan jab. What Winston Churchill was to thundering statements of resolve, Obama is to snotty put-downs.

During the 2012 campaign, he hit Republican nominee Mitt Romney with relish over his promise to cut funding for public television: "Elmo, you better make a run for it." He has called the Ryan budget a "meanwich." He has made the Republican reaction to his lawlessness an ongoing joke.

The president's constant complaints about

everyone else in Washington playing politics while he high-mindedly devotes himself to substance have all the maturity of Holden Caulfield's complaints about "phonies." Please, grow up.

Ever since he lost the House in 2010 and could no longer operate on the basis of sheer brute force, the president has relied almost entirely on tactical cleverness. It has been impressive on its own terms, whether it involves the invention of the "war on women" in 2012 or the double-dog dare to Republicans to impeach him now.

But this is basically all he's got -- besides his infamous "pen and phone." He has already expanded the powers of the office beyond their legitimate bounds and may well take another quantum leap with an executive amnesty. But rarely has the presidency felt so small, at the same time discontents at home and chaos abroad loom so large.

It's not "hatin'" to expect something better -- or at the very least a little less pettiness.

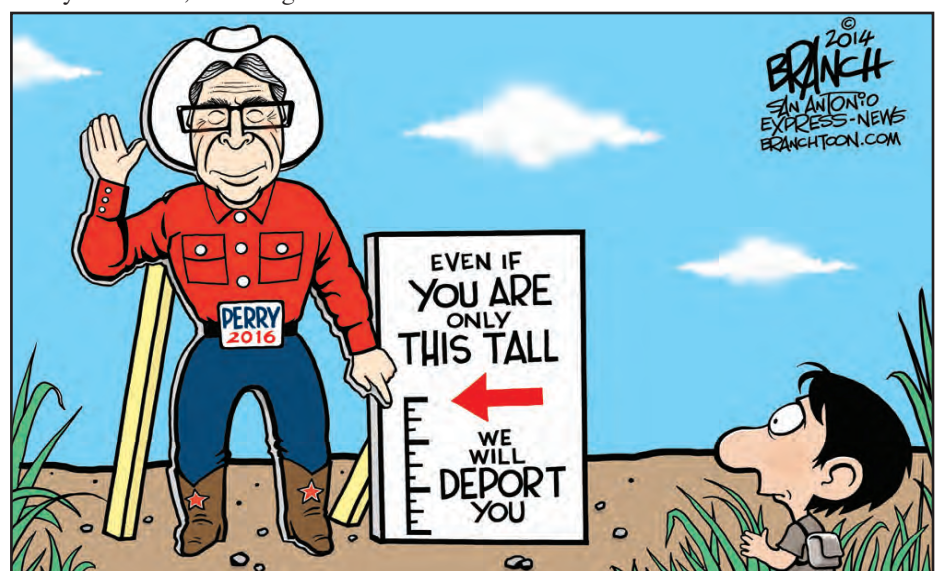



70 applicants in line for a new ramp

 The Texas Ramp Program, based out of Richardson, assists local organizations in building handicap accessible ramps.

Working with the Salado Rotary Club, the Texas Ramp Program built a wheelchair access ramp at the Central Texas Area Museum.

Sixteen cities are chartered in the state, with the local program out of Salado serving a seven county

area. Rolly Correa spoke about the program to the Salado Rotary Club at its Aug. 19 meeting.

In all 16 areas, Correa said, they received considerable community support and positive fundraising.

Salado United Methodist Church provides a small warehouse and production site for the local program, and a team of volunteers meet several Wednesdays a month to pre-build all

the parts needed for the ramp projects. An engineer helps assure all codes are met and designs the ramp specific to the particular site. An average 30 foot ramp costs about \$500 in materials.


Once permitting is in place, and all the permissions required by homeowners and property owners are in place, the team works against a priority list of applicants.

This year the Salado

based team has built 14 ramps, well ahead of last year's pace which built 14 for the year. There are 70 applicants currently on the waiting list.


Salado Rotary provided a \$700 donation for the most recent ramp project. The ramp's 70 foot length was the second longest built in the state. Volunteers needed.



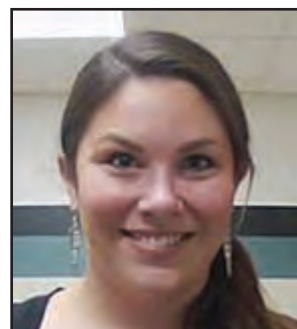

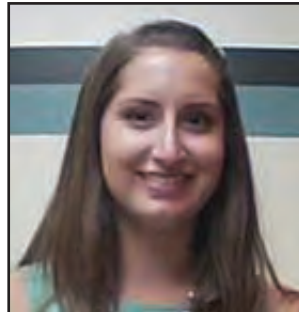

New hunting, fishing licenses on sale

New licenses for the 2014-15 hunting and fishing seasons are now available. The current year Texas hunting and fishing licenses (except year-to-date fishing licenses) will expire Aug. 31.

Every year, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department issues about 2.5 million hunting and fishing licenses through the agency's 28 field offices, more than 50 state parks and at over 1,700 retailers across the state. Licenses may also be purchased online through the TPWD website at www.tpwd.state.tx.us/buy or by phone at 1-800-895-4248. Call center hours are Monday through Friday, 8 p.m. to 5 p.m. and there is a required \$5 convenience fee for each phone or online transaction.

For online and phone orders, a physical license

will be mailed within three business days. During that time period, a transaction receipt will be provided via email that will be sufficient proof of hunting license that can be used for dove hunting, though it will not be allowed for the take of fish or wildlife that require a tag.

Hunting and fishing regulations for the new season can be found in the 2014-2015 Outdoor Annual, available at license retailers August 15 and online at www.txoutdoorannual.com. Starting this fall, hunters and anglers can take the Outdoor Annual with them in the field or on the water via a new app available by the end of August for free download on iPhone and Android platforms.

Up with the king

Contract Bridge

By Steve Becker

There are times when one must violate a basic rule because the situation calls for it. For example, consider this deal where South was in four spades and the defense started with three rounds of hearts, declarer ruffing the third.

South started by cashing the K-Q of trumps and A-K-Q of diamonds before leading the ten of trumps to dummy's ace and returning a club.

After East followed low, South inserted the nine, losing to the queen. It didn't matter whether West returned a club into declarer's A-J or yielded a ruff-and-discard by leading a heart. Either way, South had the rest of the tricks and so made the contract.

However, South would have failed had East risen to the occasion by playing his king on the club lead from dummy at trick ten. This would have violated the general defensive principle of playing second-hand-low, but it would also have made South's position untenable. Whatever he did next, declarer would have had to lose two club tricks.

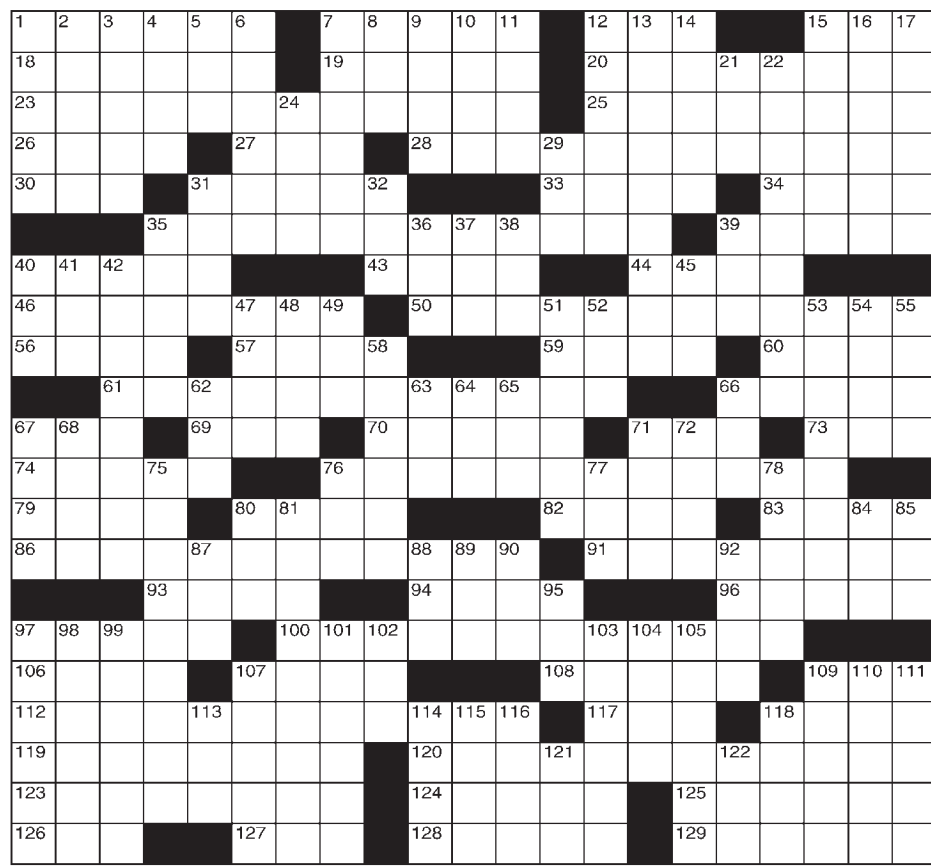
In retrospect, it is easy to see that East should have gone up with the king. He knew from the play to this point that declarer had started with precisely five spades, two hearts and three diamonds, and therefore had to have exactly three clubs.

If South had the A-Q-x, the king play would make no difference, since the club finesse was due to succeed. But if South had his actual holding, the king play was absolutely necessary to defeat the contract.

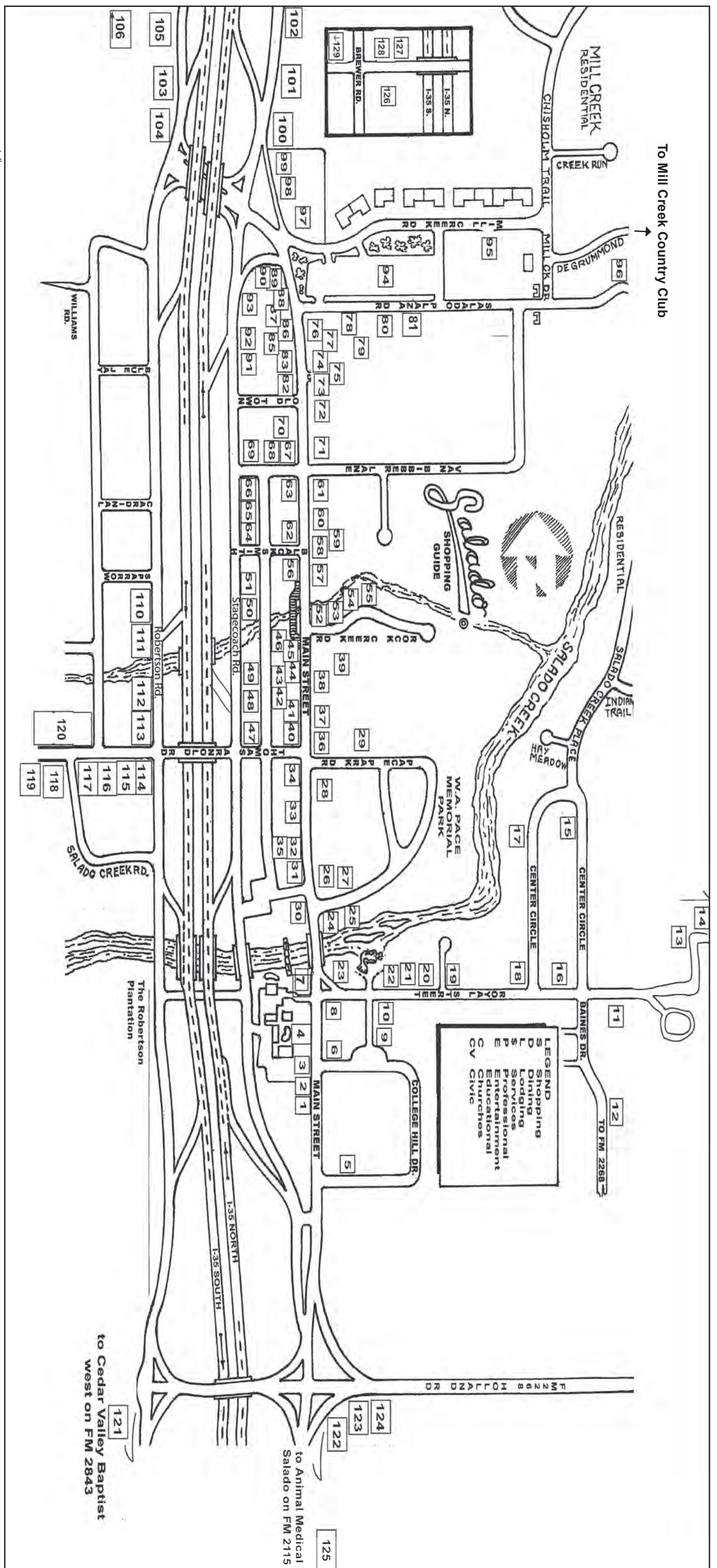

Mosquito Control Around the Home



niques. Mosquito control is often complex and expensive, requiring the cooperation of individual homeowners as well as such groups as state agencies, local governmental agencies, industry and agriculture.

The Texas A&M University System, U.S. Department of Agriculture, and the County Commissioners Courts of Texas Cooperating

Mosquitoes not only irritate and annoy people, but they also can transmit many disease-causing organisms to humans and animals. They spread such diseases as West Nile virus, encephalitis, dengue, yellow fever, malaria and filariasis. Mosquitoes are also responsible for transmitting heartworm in dogs.

To control mosquitoes effectively around the home, it helps to know about their lifecycle. There are different control strategies for different lifecycle stages.

Mosquitoes have four distinct stages during their life cycle: egg, larva, pupa and adult. They can complete this life cycle in as little as 10 days, depending on food availability, weather conditions and the species of mosquito.

Adult mosquitoes typically live for about a week to a month, but this can vary, depending on a number of environmental factors. Some species spend the winter as mated females that may live up to 6 months or more.

Some adult mosquitoes seldom travel more than 200 yards from the breeding sites; other species can travel for more than a mile. This ability to travel long distances can create problems in management. If the source of the mosquito problem is far from your home, you may not be able to control them without cooperation from other individuals or groups.

How to reduce mosquito problems

Here are some ways to alleviate mosquito problems around your home:

Eliminate breeding sites for larvae

Reduce standing water that provides breeding sites. Eliminate containers such as old tires, buckets, cans and bottles that

collect and hold rainwater and become good breeding sites for mosquitoes. Drain water from flower pots, bird baths, rain gutters, rain barrels, bird-baths, pet dishes, livestock watering troughs, etc. at least once a week.

Empty your plastic wading pool weekly and store it indoors when not in use.

Fill holes or depressions in trees with sand or mortar, or drain them after each rain by drilling holes into the tree.

Repair leaky pipes and outside faucets.

Reduce mosquito populations

Mow tall grass or reduce the amount of brush and other foliage in your area to reduce the resting sites for adult mosquitoes.

For temporary relief in yards or high traffic areas, use fog treatments or surface treatments of insecticides that are labeled for that use and apply them following directions on the product label.

Treat larval breeding sites

Use mosquito fish or other fish species in permanent bodies of water whenever the water will support them. Mosquito fish can be found in other ponds, pet shops or bait stores.

Use Bacillus thuringiensis israeliensis products such as Mosquito Dunks® to treat permanent water bodies to eliminate larvae. You can use oil treatments on the surface of standing water to kill larvae. Use commercial products according to the instructions on the product label. Be aware that other organisms in the water body may be affected by the treatment.

Long-term control

To achieve effective long-term mosquito control, you need to use several management techniques

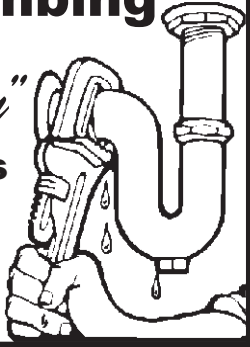

BBB offers advice for safe shopping online

Online shopping has become an easy way for consumers to purchase products from the convenience of your computer or portable device. While online shopping allows you to avoid crowds and lines, there are certain risks involved when spending at online retailers. Last year, BBB received over 2,000 complaints against online retailers nationally. Complaints cover a wide range of issues. Some allege the product did not match its description, others state delivery issues, and problems receiving a refund.

While many online

shopping sites are legitimate, there are fraudulent online retailers trying to scam shoppers. These con artists set up fake or fraudulent sites to get a hold of personal information or steal your money. Better Business Bureau (BBB) serving Central, Coastal, Southwest Texas and the Permian Basin reminds shoppers it's important to research a business before making any purchase online.

When shopping online, BBB offers this advice:

Check for basic information. If you're interested in trying a new online merchant who you're not familiar with, be sure

and locate the company's physical location (address and phone number). If this information is not listed on their website, contact them directly to find out the information first before purchasing anything.

Keep personal information safe. Check the URL link to make sure it starts with "https://" before entering financial information. The 's' means it is a secure site. Check the privacy policy to see how the business is using the information they have requested. Never email any personal information such as credit card and banking numbers or social security numbers.

Read and compare. When buying a product, read the whole description including the fine print. It is important to understand the details of the product being purchased so there are no surprises when it's delivered. Also, be wary if products listed are significantly lower than typical retail prices. This may be an indication of a fraudulent site.

Check the return policy. Read the return policy to see if the business allows a full refund if the customer is not happy with the product. Review the policy to

see who pays for the cost of shipping and handling for the return.

Choose the correct payment method. Always pay with a credit card when shopping online. A purchase with a credit card is protected under the Fair Credit Billing Act (FCBA). This allows customers to briefly hold payment while a problem is reviewed and resolved. This act also protects customers in the event that credit card information is stolen and used without their permission.

Document your purchase. Make sure to print the receipts and product information of any online purchases to prevent incorrect charges. Print all important documents, including shipping information, receipts, customer service information and the return policy. This will come in handy if you need to dispute any problems or product issues.

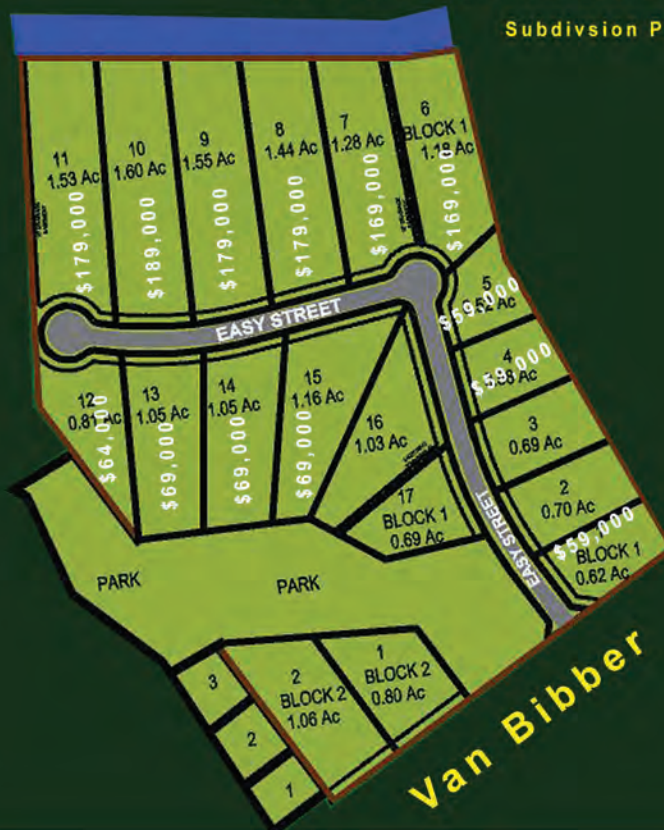
