## Local issues top of mind in November election; Early voting starts Oct. 20

While they may be at the bottom of the ballot, two local option elections have the piqued interest of Salado voters as Early Voting begins on Oct. 20: one concerning the Village of Salado issuing up to \$10.55 million in bonds for construction of a sewer system and another concerning the legal sale of beer and wine.

The final town hall meeting on the proposed \$10.55 million bond election to build a sewer system for parts of Salado will be held at 6:30 p.m. Oct. 23 at the Salado Intermediate School.

Early voting begins on Oct. 20 with several locations at which Bell County voters can cast their ballots: Salado Civic Center, 601 North Main, Salado; Bell County Courthouse Annex, 550 East 2nd Ave, Belton; Bell County Annex, 301 Priest Drive, Killeen; Killeen Community Center, 2201 East Veterans Memorial Blvd, Killeen; Bell County Annex, 205 East Central Ave, Temple and the Parks & Recreation Center, 307 Millers Crossing, Harker Heights.

Early voting hours will be 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Oct. 20-24; noon-5 p.m. Oct. 26 and 7 a.m.-7 p.m. Oct. 25 and Oct. 27-31.

Election day, voters will go to their respective precinct polling location. Precinct 203 voters will cast their ballots 7 a.m.-7 p.m. Nov. 4 at the Salado

Church of Christ Activity Center, 225 North Church St.

Also on the ballot this fall are these: Proposition: "The constitutional amendment providing for the use and dedication of certain money transferred to state highway fund to assist in the completion of transportation construction, maintenance and rehabilitation projects, not to include toll roads."

## The Sanctuary developers want to meet with local citizens Oct. 20

Saladoans are invited to an informal meeting with the developers of The Sanctuary, a 300-acre mixed use development proposed to be built on property along FM 2268 and at I-35 in the Village extra territorial jurisdiction.

Robert Sulaski, a participating partner and builder, will meet with interested Saladoans at a gathering slated for 6:30 p.m. Oct. 20 at Stonecreek Settlements on College Hill Rd. He asks for RSVPs to be sent to him at robert@sanctuarytx.com so he can plan for refreshments to serve.

He wants to meet with locals to talk about the mixed use development that will include restaurant spaces, an entertainment district that could have an 1,800 seat indoor music performance center, shopping locations and a variety of residential units.

Sulaski told *Salado Village Voice* that The Sanctuary could have up to 450 homes in it, including some that will be assisted living. The Sanctuary will have strict design guidelines featuring four or five architectural styles, including Old World European and the Texas vernacular.

There will be cottage homes as well as stand-alone homes. The Sanctuary Development Corporation has been in closed door discussions with the Village of Salado concerning a potential partnership on the proposed sewer system for Salado.

## Meet the City Manager Oct. 21

The community is invited to meet Kim Foutz, the new city manager of the Village of Salado, during a reception 5:30-7:30 p.m. Oct. 21 at Inn on the Creek.

Foutz began her job in Salado on Oct. 1 and was hired by the board of aldermen as a full-time employee.

Foutz comes to Salado after serving as the assistant city manager of Temple, where she worked from March 2006 to February 2014.

Prior to coming to Temple, she was Director of Economic Development for College Station (1999-2006), where she recruited one million square feet of

office, retail and technology development representing more than \$150 million in investment. She oversaw the planning, engineering and construction of three technology business parks on 768 acres.

Foutz was City Manager of Midlothian (1997-1999) where she updated the comprehensive plan, improved standards and procedures for subdivision and zoning ordinance, implemented 3,500 acre annexation and brought a wastewater plant from non-compliance into compliance.

Foutz was City Manager of Lampsas (1992-1996) where she secured \$6.3

million in grants and loans for water and wastewater improvements, represented the city in environmental hearings before state agencies, re-prioritized the budget to quadruple resources allocated to water, sewer and streets and developed a Historic Downtown Enhancement Plan.

## Sean Clement named National Merit Semifinalist

Salado senior Sean Clement was announced as a National Merit Scholarship Semifinalist recently, the lone Semi-Finalist from Salado High School.

Clements, the son of Lisa Clement and Ben Clement, is also the grandson of Tempe and Lois Cabaniss, of Salado.

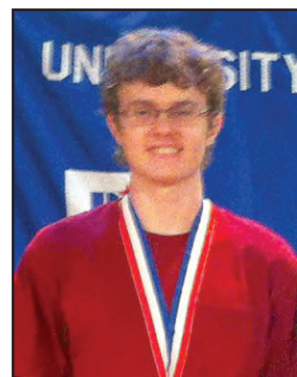
He has attended Salado schools since kindergarten.

He is one of the approximately 16,000 Semifinalists in the 60th annual National Merit Scholarship Program. These academically talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition for some 7,600 National Merit Scholarships worth about \$33 million that will be offered next spring. To be considered for a Merit Scholarship® award,

Semifinalists must fulfill several requirements to advance to the Finalist level of the competition.

About 90 percent of the Semifinalists are expected to attain Finalist standing, and more than half of the Finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship, earning the Merit Scholar® title.

Clement is active in many school organizations, including the Robotics club, UIL Calculator and Math competition, Theater, tennis, National

Honor Society, Boy Scouts and Band. He has played piano for 12 years.

Sean was not raised in a home in which video games, sports and television played major roles," said his math teacher Dennis Cabaniss. "He came to love books and learning at an early age. He has participated in thousands of stimulating conversations with his older brother and other family members about science, history, the arts, etc. These experiences have helped him to be intellectually mature, to have a broad range of knowledge, and to have an extensive vocabulary. These assets are invaluable on the PSAT and SAT and no doubt played a huge role in his high level of success."

## Possible impact of sewer on SISD

I am writing my column for October regarding the Village of Salado’s proposed sewer system. However, this is not to advocate for or against the bond proposal. The purpose of this column is to provide you with information regarding the possible impact the proposed sewer system would have on the school district.

Our three schools on Thomas Arnold Road would be able to connect to the proposed sewer system. However, the high school would only be able to connect to the proposed sewer system if the school district and/or the two hotels pay for an additional sewer line to connect to the main lines that would be paid for by the bond. The projected cost for this additional sewer line

is \$400,000. Thus, if the school district and the two hotels evenly split this cost three ways, each entity would pay approximately \$133,000.

The school district spends approximately \$45,000 per year operating a wastewater treatment system at the high school. While the Village of Salado hasn’t yet finalized the fee structure for the proposed sewer system, a possible fee that was discussed for businesses was \$6,000 per year. Thus, having the high school connected to

a sewer system could save the school district approximately \$39,000 per year. This would enable the school district to recoup the \$133,000 share of the cost for the additional sewer line within about three and a half years. The savings could then be used for classroom expenditures, such as teacher salaries or instructional technology.

The school board has discussed this topic in open meetings on October 1 and October 13. On Oc-

The Village of Salado Aldermen have proposed to increase property taxes by 50 percent. The registered voters in Salado have a right to require a vote for this increase, but they must sign their name on a petition for a roll back election. It appears many people over 65 are not that concerned because it doesn’t directly affect them if their taxes are frozen. That doesn’t really surprise me. However, they should have a little empathy for the younger citizens in town who will be shouldering this responsibility. What does surprise me is why I do not see many home owners under 65 at Aldermen and Town Hall Meetings voicing their concerns, or at least asking questions? Maybe they are busy with their families and don’t pay much attention to what is going on in their town. Maybe they don’t know that if the property tax increases by 50 percent and the sewer bond proposal passes in November, they will be paying \$.65 per \$100 on your home. However, it does not have to be a “done deal.” Steve Peters, former financial officer for the village, has started a petition to allow citizens to vote on the tax increase. It requires about 180 signatures to hold this property tax rollback election. Don’t you think citizens have a right to vote when asked to increase their taxes by 50 percent? This is part of the democratic process. If you are a registered voter of any age and would like to sign this petition, please call Steve at 254-947-0115. He can not do this by himself and should not have to. Help spread the word and get signatures from your friends and neighbors who are registered voters. You have a right to ask for an election. This is your opportunity to act and get involved in your community.

### To the Editor:

One idea that was presented in some newspapers has been the use of grants to fund the sewer project. It is a good thought and that is exactly what the Village is doing to reduce the need to borrow the entire amount of the bond request. To clarify grant requests, Jim Reed, a veteran of 20 plus years in municipal funding has indicated the following: “A municipality can apply for state and federal grants at anytime. Grants are evaluated on many criteria, the most recent trend is to base a large amount on local match and effort. The passing of a bond shows the community effort supports the project and that sufficient funds exist to complete the project. Granting agencies don’t like to find projects that don’t have the funds to complete.” Note: the key criteria is the ability of the community to match the grant funds. If the community cannot match the funds, then the funds will not be granted.

Jim Reed has indicated that the submission for grant requests are being prepared and the immediate potential is the reduction in the borrowed funds by 10 percent. He has said this at the Town Hall meetings and I would encourage anyone who has an opinion on this subject go to the meetings and discuss in the open forum.

Ten years ago, 40 percent of the income to the golf course came from out of town players who came to Salado, spent the night, played golf, shopped downtown and ate at the local restaurants. That is one major concern of our village that is currently being worked on, but as they bring that figure back to 40 percent, we are still faced with concerns of our tourists. We have personally witnessed our tourists addressing two concerns: no restrooms and not enough choices of restaurants downtown. In our peaks, the sales tax from downtown financed our village, but as that revenue declined, we have had to increase property taxes to offset that revenue.

Our solution to the revenue situation is a thriving downtown that depends on tourists coming to shop, not solely on the residents. We have had an increase

in rooftops during this time, but the decline came despite an increase in rooftops. The sewer will solve that problem as well as bringing in additional revenue west of I-35. The possibilities west of I-35 are unlimited. Businesses are not currently coming to Salado because they do not have access to sewer service. They must purchase an additional lot, if it is available, for a septic system and it is very expensive.

The taxes that voters authorize by approving a bond can only be used to retire the debt incurred for that project. Once that debt is retired, the taxes levies for that project are no longer available to the village and must be lowered for the voters.

As a resident of Salado, the main thing you will receive is maintaining your property values. The more revenue we receive from downtown and west of I-35, the lower your property taxes will be and the value of our homes will be maintained. In addition, you will live in a town that is on the incline rather than on the decline.

We have our golf course on track to improve and we have the highest ranked school system in this area. There is only one more thing we need for the success of our village. A sewer system will bring our downtown back to where

it was 10 years ago and at the same time bring in additional revenue from west of I-35.

We have the privilege of living in the most beautiful place in the state of Texas. Let's do something for the future of Salado. Vote yes on the upcoming sewer bond election.

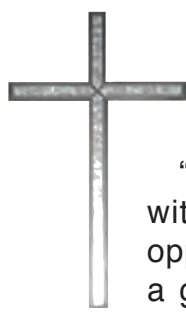

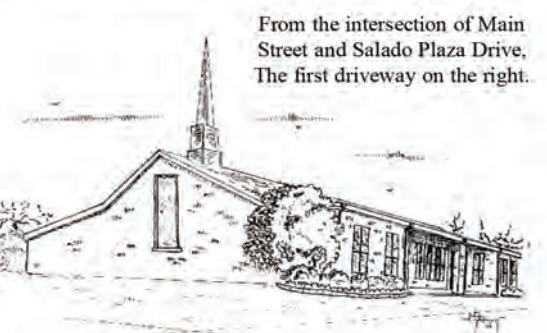

Fort Hood officials have released the name of a Soldier who was found unresponsive in a vehicle at an off-post establishment Oct. 4 in Killeen, Texas.

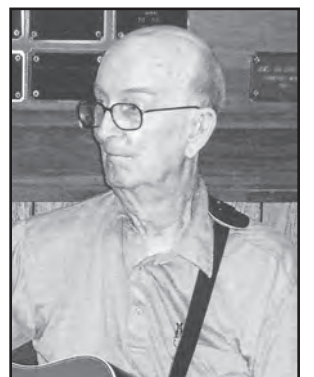

## California-style contemporary home will be on Christmas Tour in Dec.

Secluded within a forest of great trees and circled by native stone walls, Jack Husung's contemporary California-style house of redwood and stone at 609 Willow Creek, is one of seven homes to be opened on the annual Tour of Homes sponsored by the Salado Historical Society.

The master suite features a king-sized bed luxuriously dressed and a fireplace-centered seating area where leather chairs and ottoman create an inviting ambiance. A slender tree standing against a backdrop of tall windows opening onto the patio and pool, sparkles with its trove of Waterford crystal ornaments. A chest

displays multiple Santas, trees and seasonal figurines, also of gleaming Waterford crystal.

Upstairs are two bedrooms, decorated especially for the two children. For his daughter, Maria, richly trimmed linens of shocking pink, yellow and gold on a white wrought iron bed are complemented with a tree of white adorned with a ballet theme in a mix of pink hues. Jackson, his son, enjoys traditional colors, numerous toys and a miniature Santa dressed in white tie and tails. Jackson's Christmas décor features the addition of a Texas A&M themed Christmas tree. A cozy sitting room on this upper level displays a tree with a collection of

more than 100 Radko ornaments.

The great room is warmed by a copper wood-burning chamber flued through the 25 foot stone firewall. The room's rustic pine trees are ablaze with sparkling white lights, and Santa figures strut about the books and lamps.

French doors in the lower floor rooms lead to the pool at the back of expansive property. Stone walls, wrought iron, water features and statuary complement the overhanging trees and climbing ivy festooned with an abundance of twinkle lights.



## Smoke rings in the dark

The Ring Nebula (M57) is a planetary nebula very near the bright star Vega in the constellation Lyra, located 2300 light years from the earth. Planetary nebulæ are formed when a shell of ionized gas is ejected by a dying star as it evolves from a red giant

into a white dwarf. M57 is illuminated by a central white dwarf star and looks like a ghostly blue-white smoke ring through the eyepiece of a telescope.

The Central Texas Astronomical Society (CTAS) will host a free public star party 7-10 p.m.

Oct. 18 at Overlook Park near Belton to view the Ring Nebula and other celestial bodies. CTAS members will provide telescopes to view the visible planets and a selection of star clusters, nebulas, and galaxies.

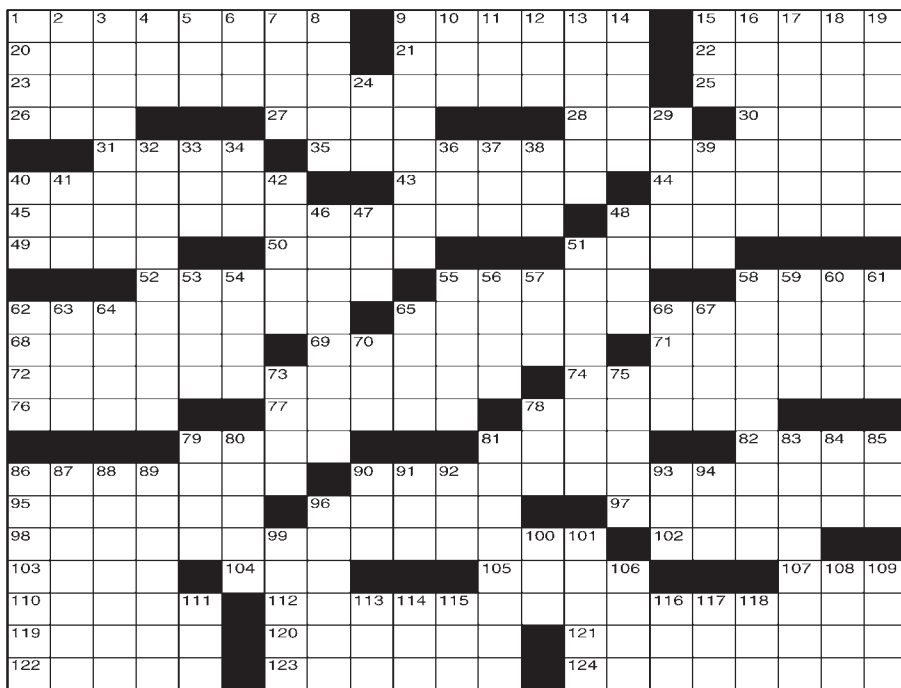

## The two-way view

In the majority of deals, the most important period of the play comes early in the hand. That's when declarer takes the time to assess his prospects and formulates a plan that will give him the best chance for the contract.

To this end, he tries to organize the play so as to make the contract if the opposing cards are normally divided, while at the same time, he tries to cater to the possibility that the cards are abnormally divided.

Consider this deal where, after the opening diamond lead, South has eight sure tricks, and his best chance for developing a ninth trick lies in clubs. If, after taking East's king with the ace at trick one, declarer next cashes the A-K of clubs, hoping for a normal 3-2 division, he winds up scoring only the eight tricks he started with.

Instead, he should lead a club to the ace at trick two and return the club three toward his J-6. This guarantees the contract against any lie of the opposing clubs. Let's take the actual case first.

If East goes up with the queen of clubs, South scores four club tricks instead of only two. If East follows low on the three, South's jack wins, and again he makes four clubs by continuing the suit.

If West holds the Q-10-x-x of clubs, the outcome is the same. West's club holding is exposed when East shows out at trick three, and after losing the jack to the queen, declarer has no trouble making four notrump with the aid of a subsequent club finesse.

So, no matter how you slice it, South can assure the contract by employing a safety play at trick three. At the same time, the recommended approach yields at least 10 tricks even if the clubs turn out to be divided 3-2.

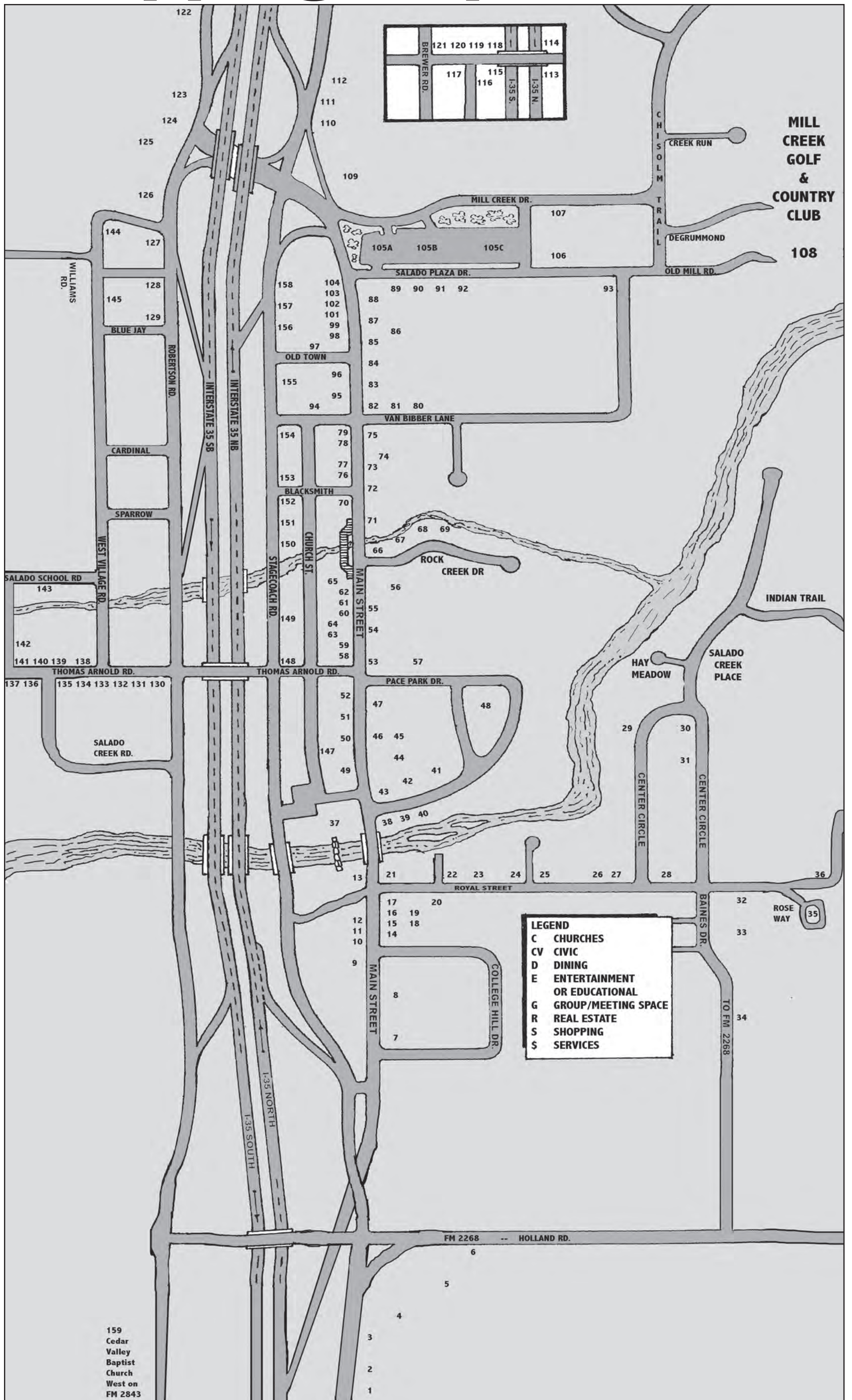



**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that an election will be held within and throughout the VILLAGE OF SALADO (the "City") on November 4, 2014 ("Election Day"), pursuant to and in accordance with the following excerpts from an ordinance (the "Ordinance") calling a bond election to be held in the City; passed and approved by the Board of Aldermen (the "Board") of the Village of Salado on August 12, 2014;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS:**

**SECTION 1:** An election (the "Election") shall be held on the 4th day of November, 2014, in the City, which date is not less than seventy-eight (78) nor more than ninety (90) days from the date of the adoption hereof and is a uniform election date pursuant to Section 41.001, Texas Election Code, for the purpose of submitting the following measure:

**PROPOSITION**

"Shall the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Salado be authorized to issue one or more series of bonds of the Village of Salado in the amount of not to exceed \$10,550,000 for the purpose of making permanent public improvements as follows: purchasing, acquiring, enlarging, extending, equipping and constructing sewer system facilities and improvements, including acquiring lands and rights-of-way for any of such purposes, and all matters incident or necessary thereto, such bonds to mature serially or otherwise and bearing interest at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise), not to exceed the respective limits prescribed by law at the time of issuance, as shall be determined within the discretion of the Board of Aldermen at the time of issuance, and to levy a tax upon all taxable property in the Village of Salado sufficient to pay the interest on the bonds, and to provide a sinking fund for the payment of bonds as they mature?"

**SECTION 2:** Ballots shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code and permit electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid measure which shall appear on the ballot substantially as follows:

**PROPOSITION**

[ ] FOR "THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$10,550,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR SEWER FACILITIES, PROPERTY AND IMPROVEMENTS, AND THE LEVY OF A TAX SUFFICIENT TO PAY FOR THE BONDS"  
 [ ] AGAINST

**SECTION 3:** Electronic voting machines may be used to hold and conduct the Election on Election Day; provided, however, in the event that the use of such electronic voting machines is not practicable, the Election may be conducted on Election Day by the use of paper ballots (except as otherwise provided herein). Electronic voting machines or paper ballots may be used for early voting by personal appearance (except as otherwise provided herein). Pursuant to Section 61.012, Texas Election Code, the City shall provide at least one accessible voting system in each polling place used in the Election. Such voting system shall comply with state and federal laws establishing requirements for the accessibility of voting systems.

**SECTION 4:** The election precincts hereby established and the polling places hereby designated for the purpose of holding the Election are identified in **Exhibit A** hereto. The election officers for each polling place shall be appointed in accordance with the Texas Election Code and the provisions of an election agreement with the County Election Officer for the conducting of the Election; and, the Mayor, or his designee, is hereby authorized and directed to (i) negotiate and enter into one or more election agreements with the County (and such other political subdivisions as the Mayor, or his designee, and the County Election Officer determine to be necessary or appropriate) for conducting the Election for and on behalf of the City and (ii) make any technical modifications to this Ordinance as are necessary to comply with applicable state or federal laws or to carry out the intent of the Board, as evidenced herein.

On election day, the polls shall be open from 7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.

**SECTION 5:** The Board hereby appoints Shawn Snyder as the early voting clerk to conduct early voting in the Election.

Early voting by personal appearance shall be conducted in accordance with applicable provisions of the Texas Election Code. The locations, dates and hours of operation of the main early voting polling place and the permanent branch polling places are set forth in **Exhibit B** hereto. Registered voters of the City may vote early at any designated County early voting location.

Early voting by mail shall be conducted in accordance with applicable provisions of the Texas Election Code. The early voting clerk shall receive applications for ballots to be voted by mail. The mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent is set forth in **Exhibit B** hereto.

An early voting ballot board is hereby established for the purposes of processing ballots cast in early voting. The presiding judge of the early voting ballot board is designated in **Exhibit B** hereto. The presiding judge of the early voting ballot board shall appoint not less than two (2) resident qualified voters to serve as members of the early voting ballot board.

**SECTION 6:** All resident qualified electors of the City shall be permitted to vote at said Election, and on the day of the Election, such electors shall vote at the polling place designated for the election precinct in which they reside. This Election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code and the Texas Government Code, Chapter 1251; and, as may be required by law, all election materials and proceedings shall be printed in both English and Spanish.

**SECTION 7:**

(a) Pursuant to Section 3.009, Texas Election Code: (i) the proposition language that will appear on the ballot is set forth in Section 2 of this Election Order, (ii) the purposes for which the bonds are to be authorized are set forth in Section 1 of this Election Order, (iii) the principal amount of bonds to be authorized is set forth in Section 1 of this Election Order, (iv) if the issuance of bonds is authorized by voters, taxes sufficient, within the limits prescribed by law, to pay the annual principal of and interest on the bonds and to provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds may be imposed, as set forth in Section 1 of this Election Order, (v) bonds authorized pursuant to this Election Order may be issued to mature over not to exceed 40 years from their date of issuance and bearing interest at the rate or rates (not to exceed 15%), as authorized by law and determined by the Board, and (vi) as of the beginning of the City's current fiscal year, the aggregate amount of outstanding principal of the City's debt obligations was \$0.00 and the aggregate amount of outstanding interest on the City's debt obligations was \$0.00, and (vii) the City's ad valorem debt service tax rate as of the date of adoption of this ordinance is \$0.00 per \$100 of taxable property.

(b) Based upon market conditions as of the date of this Election Order, if the bonds are authorized, the estimated total tax rate of the City is expected to be approximately \$0.6538 per \$100 of taxable assessed value, based on current State law, which is equal to the estimated tax rate for voted debt obligations of the City and is subject to change.

If approved by voters, the bonds will be secured by an ad valorem tax that is sufficient, within the limits prescribed by law, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the costs of any credit agreements. Actual tax rates, interest rates, maturity dates, aggregate outstanding indebtedness and interest on such debt, will only be established and known at the time that bonds are issued. In addition, actual tax rates will depend upon, among other factors, the assessed valuation of taxable property, prevailing interest rates, the market for the City's bonds and general market conditions at the time that bonds are issued.

The estimated tax rates and other statements contained in this subsection (b) are (i) based on certain assumptions (including assumptions concerning prevailing market and economic

conditions at the time(s) of issuance of the bonds) and derived from projections obtained from the City's financial advisor, (ii) subject to change to the extent that actual facts, circumstances and conditions prevailing at the time that the bonds are issued differ from such assumptions and projections, (iii) provided solely in satisfaction of the requirements of Section 3.009, Texas Election Code, and for no other purpose, without any assurance that such projections will be realized, and (iv) not intended to give rise to a contract with voters or limit the authority of the Board to issue bonds in accordance with the Proposition submitted by this Election Order.

**SECTION 8:**

(a) A substantial copy of this Ordinance, including a Spanish translation thereof, shall be posted at three (3) public places within the City and at the City Hall not less than twenty-one (21) full days prior to the date on which the Election is to be held. Notice of the Election as required by the Texas Election Code and Chapter 1251, Texas Government Code, shall also be published on the same day in each of two (2) successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the City, the first of said publications to appear in said newspaper not more than thirty (30) days and not less than fourteen (14) full days prior to the day of the Election.

(b) A substantial copy of this Ordinance, including a Spanish translation thereof, shall be posted, on Election Day and during early voting by personal appearance, in a prominent location at each polling place.

(c) A substantial copy of this Ordinance, together with the notice of election and the contents of the Proposition, including a Spanish translation thereof, shall be posted on the City's website during the twenty-one (21) days before the Election.
