Shops ready for another great Stroll weekend

Strolling holiday carolers will serenade the late evening shoppers along Main Street each Friday and Saturday. Many of the shops will host a variety of live entertainment at their shops all day and evening during the Stroll.

Children will be enchanted with the live nativity scene, sponsored by the First Baptist Church in the evenings on both weekends.

The Ferguson Charade

The White House response to Ferguson wouldn't be complete without a meeting with Al Sharpton, the infamous agitator who has become President Barack Obama's "go-to man on race," in the words of a Politico headline from last August.

So Sharpton is inevitably one of the civil-rights leaders at the White House. The president no doubt passed up the opportunity to direct Sharpton to the Treasury Department up the street, which would surely love to have him visit and make good on all the taxes he has avoided paying through the years. A New York Times report found that there are \$4.5 million in state and federal tax liens against him and his businesses. If the rest of the country had Sharpton's accountant, there would be no reason for anyone to call for tax cuts. Our complex and onerous tax code would be rendered irrelevant by simple nonpayment.

Sharpton has leveraged himself into respectability with the Democratic establishment by making himself central to any national racial controversy. By rights, he should have given up any pretense to criminal forensics after his defamatory role in the Tawana Brawley hoax in the 1980s, but there he was

at Ferguson, Mo., suggesting the worst despite what turned out to be strong evidence that Officer Darren Wilson acted lawfully.

When the grand jury found there was insufficient evidence to indict Wilson, Sharpton pronounced that the Ferguson protesters had lost the battle, but not the war. What are they going to do to win, go out and find another cop to falsely accuse of a racial assassination and attempt to railroad into an indictment and conviction?

The Ferguson story has progressed from the tragedy of the initial incident to the outrage of the violence of the protests to a new phase of charade. The federal government must pretend to do something because it must ... do something.

But what national initiative is going to stop police officers from defending themselves when they feel as if they are under mortal threat, as Officer Wilson says he did?

The president wants funding for more body-worn cameras for local police, a worthy-enough

experiment. But such a camera, assuming that what it captured was consistent with the most credible evidence, would have served to vindicate Wilson's version of events rather than the protestors' narrative of an extralegal killing.

The most needful reform in Ferguson and surrounding communities, per the excellent reporting of Radley Balko of The Washington Post, is the end of the obnoxious and parasitic practice of squeezing revenue out of residents with fines from traffic and other petty offenses. This creates an incentive for police to hassle motorists and is especially burdensome to poor residents. Since this issue is exceedingly local and dull, almost no one talks about it.

The facts have stopped mattering in Ferguson, if they ever did. It is probably destined to live on in the roll call of locales, like Selma and Birmingham, that are bywords for civil-rights abuses. Never mind that this distorts what happened in Ferguson and belittles the memory of past civil-rights battles. There are too many people too vested in the myth, with Al Sharpton leading the way.

Time to end tax extender laws

While the dust is still settling from the mid-term elections and the pundits are trying to figure out what it all means, the American people have made their collective voices heard and delivered a message that they do not like the country's direction.

Exit polling data from Election Day showed clear majorities against growing corporate influence on the political process and in favor of greater corporate accountability.

The message is clear: inversions must stop, corporate tax avoidance must end, and special corporate loopholes must close. The question that remains, of course, is whether Congress will hear that message.

As the post-election lame duck session gets underway, Congress has an excellent opportunity to show that they've heard the American people loud and clear by acting on tax extenders.

There are two extenders that exemplify the very worst of corporate tax avoidance and should be allowed to fade away.

The first is the Controlled Foreign Corporation (CFC) Look-Through rule. The CFC Look-Through rule allows multinationals to

create "stateless income," moving income to low or no-tax countries and avoid U.S. tax in the process. They do this by setting up a network of subsidiaries, one of which own copyrights and patents used by the other foreign subsidiary. The fees paid from the one subsidiary to another create vast profits for these entities and avoid any tax anywhere. Google has heavily utilized the CFC Look-Through rule in its tax avoidance efforts.

The second is the Active Financing Exception. This is an exception to the rule that passive income (interest, dividends, royalties, etc.) is treated as taxable income even if it is not brought back to the United States. Instead, if the income is used for financial operation like financing the sale of jet engines, there is no U.S. tax so long as the profits from the deal stay offshore.

However, what constitutes financial operations is so broadly defined as to enable virtually any multinational to take advantage of it.

The Active Financing Exception explains why G.E., through its G.E. Capital subsidiary, has paid a negative tax rate on billions in profits over the last five years.

Public sentiment is overwhelmingly against these and other tax avoidance tricks that continue to benefit corporations that are already seeing record high profits.

Those who doubt this need to look no further than Walgreen's, which halted a planned inversion of its own in the face of massive public outrage. These policies hurt all of us.

When multinational corporations are able to avoid taxes, it leaves individual citizens and domestic corporations picking up the tab in the form of higher taxes and more public debt. And it further places small businesses, which pay a higher tax rate with none of the loopholes, at a competitive disadvantage. The message to Congress is clear: it is time for corporations quit cashing out without chipping in.

Whereas, The Purple Heart Medal is one of the most renowned military awards and is the one military honor awarded to many, but wanted by few.

NOW THEREFORE, the Salado City Council does hereby honor the sacrifices made by the veterans and family members within this military community for their commitment and dedication to protect and defend our freedoms and the way of life by designating the City of Salado, Texas a PURPLE HEART CITY

And urge that all citizens of Salado, Texas show their appreciation to all those who have placed themselves in harm's way

Holiday household trash increases by 25 percent; Precycling helps decrease

The Christmas holidays aren't just a time filled with more cheer, but a time filled with more trash, although some simple tips can help keep that to a minimum.

The best way to cut down on the garbage generated over this time and year-round is through what Leslie Irlbeck, program-and-outreach manager with Metro Waste Authority, says is "pre-cycling."

"When you're at the store and you're looking for gifts or you're looking for things to wrap those gifts, it's nice to keep in mind what will you do with it once it's served its purpose," she says. "Can it be reused? Can it be recycled? Or will it end up going to the landfill?"

Irlbeck says between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day, the average household produces about 25 percent more waste

than normal.

When it comes to wrapping paper and greeting cards, Irlbeck says much of it can be recycled. "You want the generic, plain old paper when you're looking for cards and wrapping paper, because those are the items that can be recycled," Irlbeck says. "That means avoiding

some of those fun, sparkly, metallic, glittered papers that, unfortunately, cannot be recycled."

Irlbeck also notes, old garland should be donated or go into the trash, not the recycling bin, and the same is true for strands of Christmas lights.

"There are several mail-in programs or you can

do a quick Google search to see what charities or places you can drop those Christmas lights off to get recycled," she says. "But it's important they do not go in your recycling cart, because they get wrapped up in the equipment and do an enormous amount of damage."
