Salado Cemetery sets Memorial Day service

The Salado Cemetery Association will host the annual Memorial Day Service at 9:30 a.m. May 29 at the Historic Salado Cemetery on Baines Street. Everyone is invited to honor the veterans on this special day and pay tribute to their service to our country.

The purpose of the Memorial Day ceremony is to remember the veterans buried not just in Salado Cemetery but in all of the Salado-area cemeteries, including family and church cemeteries, by a roll call of their names. All Veteran's grave sites will have flags placed on them.

The Veterans are from the Texas Revolutionary War, Early Day Rangers, Home Guard, Indian Wars, Mexican War, Confederate and Union Armies, Spanish American War, WWI and II, Korean War, Vietnam War, and from peace time service.

The Memorial Day ceremony will consist of: the Bell County Sheriff's Posse presenting the colors; honors to each of the armed services; a Commemorative Air Force fly-over; and a brass ensemble lead by Clayton Capps playing music for the program. The invocation will be given by Joe Keys, Min-

ister, Church of Christ. Our speaker COL (Ret) Ben Danner, USA, will present brief remarks honoring veterans. Col. Danner reports on Military Matters for KCEN-TV. Board member LTC (Ret) Stephen Peters will read the roll call of veterans' names. Taps will be played at the

conclusion of the ceremony. Light refreshments will be served following the closing of the Memorial Day ceremony. Seating will be provided by the Village of Salado.

If it is raining at 9 a.m., the Memorial Day service will be moved to the Pace Park pavilion.

Solana Ranch named TPW Lone Star Land Steward

AUSTIN – They restore vital woods and waters, help bring back diverse wildlife ranging from rare species to popular game animals, share their knowledge with neighbors, and open their gates to youth groups and researchers. They are recipients of the 2017 Lone Star Land Steward Awards, bestowed each year by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and the nonprofit Texas Parks and Wildlife Foundation.

On May 18 at the Four Seasons hotel in Austin, award recipients representing six ecologically diverse regions of the state will be recognized. Also during the annual banquet, the prestigious Leopold Conservation Award, the highest honor awarded in the program, will also be presented by the Sand County Foundation.

Solana Ranch in southern Bell and northern Williamson Counties received the Land Steward award for the Cross Timbers & Prairies region. The ranch is owned by the Kirk Michaux Family.

Property acquired in 1950 by Frank Michaux has been managed by the Michaux family for close to 67 years.

Through the years, the ranch has selectively cleared ashe juniper and applied prescribed fire to restore productive grassland habitats and protect valuable springs and water resources.

The Solana's unique hunting operation provides fantastic dove hunting access for many local hunters, which in turn allows the family to derive sustainable income to manage other aspects of ranch operations.

The family partnered with The Nature Conservancy to place a conservation easement on 250 acres of important habitat to protect the Salado salamander.

The ranch serves as a trap site for TPWD's statewide turkey and dove banding studies.

Through their innovative cattle and hunting operations they have found a way to hold a special piece of property together in the face of develop-

ment pressure.

private landowners play in the future of Texas' natural resources by honoring them for their accomplishments in habitat management and wildlife conservation. Because more than 94 percent of Texas lands are privately owned or operated, private landowners are the key to effective habitat management across the state. Since the program's inception 21 years

ago, over 200 landowners have been honored for conserving more than three million acres of fish and wildlife habitat.

"This year we recognize properties around the state ranging in size from over 26,000 acres down to 50," said Justin Dreibelbis, director of TPWD's Private Lands and Public Hunting program. "These landowners and man-

agers come from different backgrounds but what they all have in common is a love for the land and a desire to make it the best functioning system that it can be. The clean air, water, food and fiber that come from these properties is important to all Texans and we are honored to be able to recognize this group of land stewards for their efforts."

Robinson Rockets, one of the top teams in state, held the Salado Eagles to just two runs in their two-game sweep last week in the 4A Regional Quarter Finals of the baseball playoffs.

The Rockets scored two runs in the sixth inning for a 12-2 Mercy Rule shortened game on May 18 at University of Mary Hardin Baylor baseball field.

The Rockets beat Salado 8-0 the following night to end Salado's first season under head coach Kreece Cooper.

In the first contest, Salado scored two runs in the second to trail 4-2, but Robinson scored six runs in the third to put the game out of reach.

Tate Harvey was hit by the pitcher to reach first base to lead off the frame. He went to second when Jacob Wilk grounded out to second. He scored on a single to center by Cullen McKinney, who advanced to second on the throw. McKinney scored

on a deep shot for two bases by Kade Maedgen. Maedgen was left stranded as Robinson got the next two batters out.

In the third, Ryan Oakes reached on a single and advanced on groundouts by Drew Dobbins and Belton Farr, but was left stranded on a fly out by Harvey.

Parker Seaton double with no outs in the fifth. Two walks loaded the bases with just one out, but the Robinson pitcher struck out the next two batters to end the inning.

Maedgen got his second hit of the night in the sixth, but was left on base, ending the game.

Dru Dzedzic pitched five innings for Robinson, striking out six batters. He gave up four hits. Andrew Nering closed the game, striking out two and allowing one hit in the sixth.

Drew Dobbins and Ryan Oakes split duties on the mound for Salado. Each struck out two and allowed

if siblings are involved, they are often split up because of the lack of space. Wilfredo and his wife, Dimarie, served as foster parents for 11 years. During that time, they served 90 children, adopting 11 of them into their family.

Aaron Watson Vaquero tour makes stop at Johnny's Outback June 2

Country music's independent force Aaron Watson has announced new tour dates for 2017 in support of his acclaimed album Vaquero.

Watson will perform at Johnny's Outback in Salado on June 2 with gates opening at 6 p.m. Purchase tickets online at johnnyssteaksandbbq.com. Advance tickets are \$20. Tickets at the gate are \$25.

Watson's tour includes U.S. and international stops, with five marquee shows that were announced in five days across his social media last week. Watson will perform at the CMA Music Festival Chevrolet Riverfront Stage on June 10 and will headline the PBR World Finals at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas on Nov. 2. The trek also includes stops at Calgary Stampede, Globe Life Park in Arlington and Cimore Energy Pavilion in Midland.

For the first time, Watson will headline the historic Ry-

man Auditorium in Nashville with "A Night Of Texas At The Ryman" on Oct. 4. Featured artists on the bill include Texas natives Jon Wolfe, Mickey Guyton, Jim Collins and Leslie Satcher. (See full list of tour dates below.)

Vaquero debuted at #2 on the Billboard Top Country Albums chart, outselling his smash predecessor The Underdog, which debuted at #1 in 2015, making him the first-ever independent artist to debut in the coveted top spot. At the helm of his own record label, Watson continues to add to his increasing profile. Lead single "Outta Style" is currently Top 40-and-climbing on the Billboard Country Airplay charts. Radio stations in markets including Austin, Buffalo, Charlotte, Chicago, Dallas, Houston, Phoenix, Providence, San Antonio, San Jose and more are spinning the infectious song as

Watson's sound continues to turn heads across the country. Watson recently performed "Outta Style" during his national TV debut on Fox & Friends.

Eighteen years later, more than a dozen recorded albums and more than 2,500 shows in the U.S. and Europe, the Texas native continues to perform as a true independent in the country music arena.

CTAS Star party will view the Hercules Cluster May 27

The Central Texas Astronomical Society will host a free public star party 8:30 to 11:30 p.m. on May 27, at Overlook Park near Salado. Sunset is at 8:25 p.m. CTAS members will provide telescopes to view the visible planets and a selection of star clusters, nebulae, and galaxies.

The Hercules Cluster (M13) is considered the best globular cluster in the northern celestial sky. M13 is 145 light years in diameter, con-

tains about 300,000 stars, and is 25,000 years distant. Messier 5 or M5 is a globular cluster in the Constellation Serpens. Spanning 165 light years in diameter, M5 is one of the largest known globular clusters.

The planet Jupiter is high in the sky in the constellation Virgo, providing spectacular views. Saturn returns to our star party this month, appearing low in the east near the end of the evening. And just in time, since Saturn is currently in the headlines. NASA's Cassini spacecraft is returning the best ever close-up pictures of Saturn. After 20 years in space, Cassini has begun its Grand Finale,

a series of 22 weekly dives between the planet and its rings. On the final orbit in September, Cassini will dive directly into Saturn, but not before sampling the planet's atmosphere and sending back detailed scientific data. The Cassini spacecraft is running out of fuel, and this seemed the best way to end the mission.

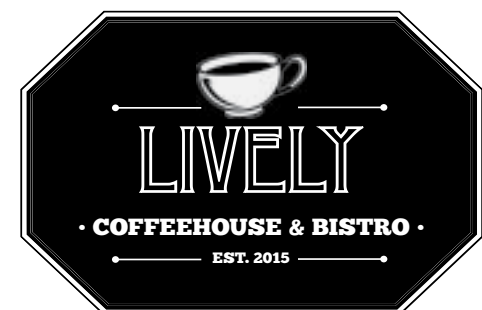

The Great Plains Skink

The Great Plains Skink (Plestiodon [Eumeces] obsoletus) is one of eight species of skinks that live in Texas, and it has the largest area of distribution. It occurs throughout the western ¾ of the state; roughly defined occurring west of an imaginary line drawn from the DFW region southward. Outside of Texas, it occurs northward to southern Nebraska, westward to central Arizona, and southward to the central plateau regions of Mexico.

The habitats that this sleek lizard prefers are the grasslands and prairies of the Panhandle that have small rocky areas and other surface debris under which it can hide. It can also be observed in rocky areas in the arid to semi-arid sandy regions of the Trans-Pecos and Edwards Plateau ecoregions.

The Great Plains Skink is an elongate lizard with tiny legs and a long tail. This species is the largest skink that inhabits this state (as well as the United States) with adults reaching a total length of almost fourteen inches, although the average is

between six and nine inches. As with all species of this genus, the scales are so slick and shiny that the lizard at first glance appears to be wet. However, like other reptiles, the skin is completely dry and not slimy at all.

The background coloration on the body and tail of

adults can be various shades of tan, brown, or even yellow with dark flecks on the outside edges of each scale. The belly is patternless and is buff in coloration. Juveniles look contrastingly different from the adults, with black bodies and bright blue tails. Many youngsters will also

have random amounts of white or orange on the black head. As the young animal matures, it begins to change from its juvenile coloration to the one that it will have as an adult - this process is known as an ontogenetic change.

Like other reptile species, the Great Plains Skink is cold-blooded, or ectothermic. This means that they do not generate heat from the inside of their body, as mammals and birds do, but rather are dependent on outside sources for heating and cooling. They are active throughout the day in the spring and fall, adjusting their schedules to the morning and afternoon hours during the heat of the summer.

This species of lizard has a much generalized diet. Its preferred choice of food is small beetles, although it will also feed on other small invertebrates such as crickets, grasshoppers, and ants. In captivity it has been known to feed on small mice.

The Great Plains Skink is oviparous, which is a fancy way of saying that it lays eggs. After emerging from the winter-long brumation period (reptiles do not hibernate in the true sense of the word), males will search out females to mate. After mating, the female will lay anywhere from five to twenty-five eggs in moisture retaining soil. The female will remain in the nest area for the entire incubation period, warding off any small predators that would utilize her eggs to fill their appetite. After approximately two months of incubation, the brightly colored 2 inch long young emerge prepared to fend for and care for themselves.

Despite living in these relatively dry areas, this skink must have moist conditions in its microhabitat to thrive, and the way it retains this moisture is by spending vast amounts of time either underground or under debris. For this reason, many people have never had the opportunity to encounter this relatively common lizard in the wild.

When threatened, the tail of this species can be discarded from the body rather easily, spasming enough to distract a would-be predator while the animal itself escapes to safety. This process is known as autotomy. It is also a difficult animal to grasp, utilizing its smooth scales to writhe and twist away from its captor.
