Thomas Arnold bridge will come down by Thanksgiving

The Thomas Arnold Road bridge over I-35 will come down before Thanksgiving.

Project officials speaking at a town hall meeting at the Salado Intermediate School cafeteria on Oct. 22 were specific about that deadline.

James Construction Group Project Manager Glen Dunlap told a sparse audience at the Intermediate School that the bridge would be demolished before Thanksgiving so that work crews could begin building a new, wider bridge over the interstate.

Other deadlines?

Not so much.

While officials from Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) and James Construction told the audience when the bridge would come down, they had no estimation of when it would reopen.

"We have that information," Mark Jones, project engineer told Dave Hermann who asked a timeline for the construction of the Thomas Arnold bridge, "just not with us. If you'll give us your contact information, we will get back with you."

The bridge at Thomas Arnold Road is the only overpass bridge in the three mile expansion project that will have to be demolished without its replacement having been constructed.

Currently, James Construction is working on the bridge at FM 2268 on the south side of Salado and the bridge at FM 2484 on the north side of Salado.

Neither of those two bridges are expected to be completed before demolition of the Thomas Arnold bridge.

TxDOT information specialist Jodi Wheatley did present a slide show of general information about the expansion project for Central Texas. Of the 80 miles between Abbott and Williamson County, 66 miles are now -- or soon will be -- under construction with the 3.4 miles through Salado anticipated to be completed in the Fall 2015 at a cost of \$70.4 million. In Jan. 2012 the estimated completion date was Spring 2015.

"We get asked 'Why so much construction at one time?'" Wheatley said, adding that, "if we did this one section at a time, it would be 2037 before the project is complete." Doing 66 miles of construction at once will end up with the expanded lanes being opened and ready for traffic, she added.

Most Salado residents at the meeting weren't as concerned with the other 63 miles of construction as they were with the three miles running through Salado. Unfortunately, many said that they left the meeting without much more information than when they arrived.

They were told that the underpass at the end of Main Street will move south to create a new underpass of Salado Plaza Dr. and Williams Rd. But the details about timelines and traffic flow for that portion of the project were as slim as the details for the completion of the Thomas Arnold Bridge.

Aldermen get good news on finances

Village of Salado ended the year with \$109,000 more in income than expenses, to increase the fund balance to about \$1 million, Investment Officer Stephen Peters reported to Aldermen Oct. 17, but warned that this year's proposed budget would "eat that up."

Peters reported that revenue to the Village was approximately \$81,500 more than budgeted for the 2012-13 fiscal year, which ended Sept. 30. He said that sales tax revenues were about \$7,000 more than budgeted, franchise fees were \$17,000 more than budgeted and municipal court fees were \$16,000 more than budgeted.

Some expenses were also more than budgeted

and other expenses were not in the original adopted budget. Legal fees were 30 percent more than the \$12,000 budget. The Village also bought a trolley and a vehicle for the police department, two expenditures that were not part of the adopted budget.

However, the Village was under budget on the Special Projects expenses of \$80,000. The Village spent just \$21,500 on that area and spent \$27,000 less on roads and maintenance than the adopted budget.

The hotel motel budget was also a surplus budget in 2012-13, Peters reported. The Tourism department took in \$10,000 more than anticipated in the fiscal year and spent \$25,000 less than budgeted for a surplus of \$35,000. This gives the Village \$150,000

in unencumbered assets in the Tourism department.

"You can't spend more than you budget," Peters said.

Shortly after the rosy financial report, aldermen approved an "unbudgeted" expenditure of \$22,500 to pay for the completion of a Village gateway sign on the south side of the Village.

Aldermen Bryan Fritch reported that the Salado Community Foundation had raised more than \$16,000 toward the \$38,500 cost to add illuminated glass blocks and sculpted metal and glass century plant to the gateway sign.

"The cost of the enhancement is relatively modest in that TxDOT is willing to perform the labor as long as we have the material to complete the

project within the time frame of the basic construction," Fritch stated.

The enhanced gateway sign will be the property of the Village of Salado.

The motion by Fritch received a second from Michael McDougal to provide up to \$22,500 to compete the south gateway sign projects. The funds will be taken from the road and maintenance budget.

Aldermen also approved a monthly contract with Fire at Will to provide tree trimming services to clear roadways of low-hanging trees. The Village will seek reimbursement from property owners for costs associated with trimming trees to meet the local code. Fire at Will will provide tree trimming service for \$40 per month, according to the contract

approved unanimously by Aldermen.

The board also approved \$3,700 in engineering expense to adapt a wastewater study to consider conveyance to a different location. The study conducted by the Village engineering firm considered conveying of wastewater to a future plant on the south side of the Village. The new study will examine costs for conveyance to the north side of the Village.

Aldermen also approved a \$3,350 bid from Lone Star Grading to replace a culvert and repair a section of road at Baines and Santa Rosa.

The board approved \$454 for the placement of crosswalk and signage for Thomas Arnold Road and Church Street, where the First Baptist Church has

recently opened a youth activity center. Hans Fields was the single vote against the motion, afterward saying that he thought it was "a waste of time and money because it's not going to slow any traffic down anyway." Aldermen Fritch recommended that the church fence the property for safety.

Aldermen tabled discussion of annexing Mill Creek Golf Course property until the board can have the proposal review by legal counsel.

By the proposal, Mill Creek Country Club would voluntarily annex the property that is not already within the Village limits in return for a 10 year abatement of property taxes. The board will consider the proposal at a later meeting.



The future of water in Texas

Clearwater Under-ground Water Conservation District is hosting its 13th annual Bell County Water Symposium Nov. 14 at the Central Texas Council of Governments Building at 2180 N. Main Street, Belton.

Keynote presentation by Dr. John Nielsen-Gammon, Texas State Climatologist and Regents Professor at Texas A&M University, will highlight the day's activities. Dr. Nielsen-Gammon's weather-related work involves jet streams, extreme rainfall events, and land and sea breezes. His air quality research includes field forecasting support, numerical simulation, and diagnostic analysis of ozone events in Houston and Dallas for the Texas Air Quality Studies in 2000 and 2005-6. Dr. Nielsen-Gammon has also worked on drought monitoring and forecasting, air pollution climatology, and improvements to the climate data record. He teaches courses in weather analysis, weather forecasting, climatology, and atmospheric dynamics.

Dr. Nielsen-Gammon

received a Presidential Faculty Fellow award (now known as PECASE) from the National Science Foundation and the White House in 1996, a Distinguished Achievement Award in Teaching at Texas A&M University from the Association of Former Students in 1996, and was named a Fellow of the American Meteorological Society (AMS) in 2011. He is Past President of the International Commission for Dynamical Meteorology and is past chair of the AMS Board on Higher Education.

In addition, the symposium will have speakers from Brazos River Authority, United States Geological Survey Water Science Team, Texas Water Development Board, and Baylor University Hydrogeology Department. The topics and discussions will provide attendees insight into the challenges that local leadership is faced with due to growing population, cost of infrastructure, and demand on current water resources.

Texas AgriLife Extension Service will provide local farmers and ranchers

who have private applicator licenses with three hours of continuing education units. These units will be fee based and can be purchased at the meeting from County Extension Agent, Lyle Zoeller.

Eagles fall short against Troy, 42-32

It was a battle of wills between Salado's air-it-out style of offense and Troy's pounding run game, as the Eagles hosted the Trojans Oct. 18. Troy ultimately won the battle 42-32.

Defensively, the Eagles had a hard time slowing down the Trojans on the ground, as Troy racked up 383 yards on the ground. The Trojan offense was led by junior running back Coby Herring and senior quarterback Kyle Whitley, as they produced 174 and 152 rushing yards, respectively.

"They were physically prepared to win the battle in the trenches. They were stronger than us tonight. They ran through our tackles and did a tremendous job on the ground," Salado head coach Brent Graham said.

Collectively, the Eagles struggled on defense, but significant performances were produced by senior James Collins and junior Jace Habiger. For the night, these two defenders accounted for 16 tackles, which was notable, considering that both defenders were playing new positions. "We switched Habiger to linebacker two weeks ago. Basically, he has had six practices at that position and he has evolved tremendously," Graham said. "The same goes for James Collins. This is his first game at defensive end and he did some incredible things."

Offensively, the Eagles were able to spread the Trojan defense with the passing game, and left the Trojans vulnerable on the ground. McLane Carter had 20 completions for 215 yards, two touchdowns and an interception.

Carter linked up with his favorite target, senior receiver Kase Spears, for 10 receptions and 105 yards and a touchdown.

Running back Ryan Simmons had his second consecutive game with over 100 yards rushing: 123 yards on 18 carries and two touchdowns.

Chase Crenwelge had a productive night with six receptions for 51 yards and a touchdown.

The Trojans drew first blood as Whitley powered into the end zone from the Salado 15 yard line and

when James Robison stopped Mayo short of the first-down marker.

With less than five minutes left in the game, Salado moved the ball down the field with an 18 yard run from Simmons, scoring on a 9 yard pass to Spears.

As the Eagles were down 42-32, Salado tried for one more outside kick. The kick was far enough, and Salado was able to cause a fumble; but, Troy retained possession of the ball, running out the clock.

The Eagles look forward to next week as they face the Bumblebees in Academy Oct. 26.

then again on a 23 yard run from junior Coby Herring.

Jack Riley sparked Salado with a 65-yard kick off return. Simmons would convert the return into points on a 4 yard touchdown run with 5 minutes left in the first.

On the ensuing drive, Troy brought the first quarter score to 21-7 with a 3 yard touchdown run by Colton Mayo.

Salado answered on the next drive, beginning the second quarter with two completions by Carter to Spear. A 13 yard run by Simmons set up a 5 yard shovel pass from Carter to Crenwelge for the touchdown. With 10 minutes left in the first half, Salado found themselves down by a touchdown, 21-14.

Troy quarterback Whitley attempted the Trojans' first pass of the game with just four minutes left in the first half. At the four minute mark, Whitley attempted Troy's first pass of the game. Under pressure by Simmons, Whitley hit Herring for 14 yards to keep the drive alive. After a few more rushes, the Trojans found themselves on the Salado 2 yard line.

Then, the Salado defense looked as though they would have a momentum-changing goal line stand, allowing only one yard in the first three downs. After a Troy time out, it was fourth-and-goal with only a minute and a half left in the sec-

ond quarter. At the quietest moment of the game, Whitley was able to lead over the line into the end-zone. The Salado defense was able to block the PAT, leading to a 27-14 Troy lead.

The Eagles closed the gap before the end of the half, driving from their own 25 yard line before settling for a 30 yard field goal, leading to a 27-17 Trojan lead going into halftime.

In the second half, Troy doubled Salado's time-of-possession. Whitley and the Trojan offense were able to keep the ball in-bounds consistently and were able to drain as much of the clock as possible. This caused a sense of urgency by the Eagles' offense whenever it got on the field.

In the third quarter, Troy took advantage of an interception by Whitley, who converted his pick into points by capping the drive with a 4 yard touchdown run. A two-point conversion gave Troy a 35-17 lead with seven minutes left in the third.

The Trojans turned another turnover into points, after Carter fumbled as he was taken down in the backfield. The Trojans scored two minutes later on a 4 yard run by Seth Solis, increasing their lead to 42-17.

Troy looked as if it would run away with the game, but on Salado's next drive, Carter again had nearly 40 yards of passing while consistently connecting with Crenwelge and Spears, setting up a 2 yard touchdown run by Simmons with just over seven minutes left to play.

Many years ago, the late Marty Cohn was playing in a national team-of-four championship and held the South hand. Cohn was well-known for his psychic bids. On top of that, he was the foremost advocate of opening the bidding with a three-card major suit, even with good hands.

His partners were barred from raising his opening major-suit bids -- unless they were willing to incur his considerable wrath -- with less than four or, preferably, five-card or better support.

When it was Cohn's turn to bid on this deal -- after two passes -- he asked his left-hand opponent, Mike Moss, which of his teammates would be holding the South hand at the other table.

This was more than a casual question, since Cohn -- faced with a wide choice of actions -- was hoping to gain a psychological advantage by knowing who his opposite number at the other table would be.

But Moss didn't know, or pretended not to know, who was sitting South at the other table. Furthermore, he contended that Cohn was not entitled to this information, and that Cohn could call the tournament director if he wanted to settle the issue. But Cohn, unwilling to pursue the matter further, instead replied, "In that case, I'll open the bidding with seven hearts."

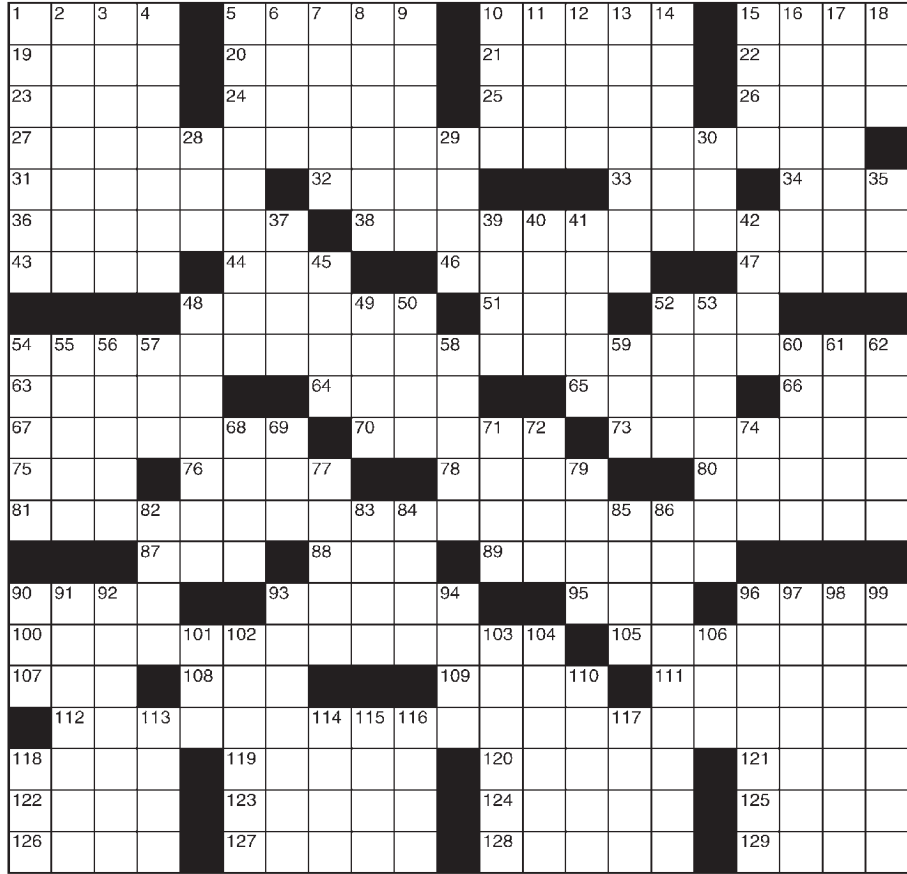
Everyone passed, and Moss led the ace of spades. Cohn ruffed, drew a round of trumps, cashed four club tricks, discarding a diamond from dummy, and so made the grand slam.

Said Cohn when the hand was over, "The next time I ask a civil question, I'll expect a civil answer!"
