## Salado salamander will most likely be listed as endangered

The Salado salamander is likely to be listed as Endangered by the US Fish and Wildlife Service in February, according to attorney Mike Gershon.

But that listing may not be as bad as many people have been building it up to be. For one thing, it may give Salado and Bell County entities some certainty in dealing with the two-inch aquatic salamander.

The probable listing of the Salado salamander has been a longtime coming, Gershon told an audience gathered for the annual Water Symposium, sponsored by the Clearwater Underground Water Conservation District (CU-WCD).

In adopting the Endangered Species Act, Gershon said, "Congress has spoken in the plainest of words making it abundantly clear that the balance has been struck in favor of affording endangered species the highest of priorities. The plain intent of Congress in enacting this statute was to halt and reverse the trend toward species extinction, whatever the cost."

But since its adoption, the Act became politicized and for many years went almost unenforced.

The USFWS had not listed a single species as endangered for about two decades, Gershon said. "That process had been dead in the water for political reasons."

There were nearly 1,000 species pending consideration by the USFWS, 100 of those species in Texas.

"The Salado salamander was petitioned to be listed in 2004," Gershon said. That petition sat in D.C. and in the regional office in Albuquerque."

Well, because of a lawsuit settlement, that petition, along with hundreds others is no longer sitting there, he said.

USFWS proposed the Salado salamander and three other central Texas salamander species for listing. As a result, a group of Bell County stakeholders came together to gather "as much science as possible about the salamander and the health of its habitat," Gershon said.

The decision of USFWS is based upon the "best science available," Gershon said, adding that the science on the Salado salamander was not very extensive until the efforts of the Bell County stakeholder group, which is continuing its study of the Salado creek watershed and the springs in which the Salado salamander

lives sometimes.

"During drought, it is known to go into the aquifer," Gershon said, "which is one reason no one ever seems to see the little creature."

But, when it is in the rocky bottoms of the spring openings, it can be susceptible to predation by larger species, as well as manmade impacts to the quality and quantity of the water in those springs.

Concerns of the USFWS include manmade disturbances of the spring openings and surrounding habitat, water degradation due to run-off and septic systems and spills of hazardous materials near springs and recharge areas. Groundwater pumping can impact the habitat by lowering the aquifer level and reducing spring flow.

"Whether or not the species is listed," Gershon said, "we can still manage our resources locally."

The goal of property owners, ranchers, businesses, government agencies and other entities that could feel the impact of the probable listing of the Salado salamander should be to get some certainty about "what you can and can't do with your property."

"Certainty," he said, "allows for creative solutions."

## Thanksgiving will cost Texas families more

A traditional, Texas-style Thanksgiving dinner for 10 will cost \$48.08 this year, up a little more than 4 percent from last year, according to the special Texas Farm Bureau (TFB) 2013 Thanksgiving Meal Report.

The 2013 report shows an increase of \$2, or 4.34 percent, from the 2012 TFB Thanksgiving Meal Report. The survey records the cost of 10 holiday staples—including turkey, stuffing, sweet potatoes, cranberry sauce and pecan pie—to feed a family of 10 people.

"The price of a traditional Thanksgiving meal has increased a bit, but it's still possible to feed a well-balanced meal to a family of 10 for less than \$5 per person," said TFB President Kenneth Dierschke.

Much of the increase was driven by turkey prices that registered 12.93 percent higher than last

year. With Thanksgiving coming later this year, many of the Grocery Price Watch shoppers missed featured pricing on turkey when the survey was taken.

"Turkey supplies are similar to last year," Dierschke said. "Shoppers should take advantage of in-store specials currently being offered on turkey to save even more money."

Texans will pay more for six of the Thanksgiving staples this year: young tom turkey, frozen (up 12.93 percent); sweet potatoes, fresh (up 11.11 percent); cranberry sauce, canned (up 6.30 percent); cubed stuffing (up 1.87 percent); rolls (up 28.09 percent); and 9-inch pie shells, frozen (up 12.62 percent).

For the first time in three years, pecan prices have decreased, as shelled and halved nuts were down 12.24 percent, or \$1.25, from 2012 to 2013.

In addition to pecans, three other survey items decreased in price: green beans, frozen (down 1.33 percent); whipping cream (down 15.06 percent); and whole milk (down 1.30 percent).

TFB's fourth quarter Grocery Price Watch survey, taken in conjunction with the 2013 Thanksgiving Meal Report, indicated a decrease of 23 cents, or .5 percent, in grocery prices for household staples from the third quarter. Results from the quarterly survey of 16 common food products decreased from \$46.08 to \$45.85 in the fourth quarter of this year.

TFB's Thanksgiving Meal Report and Grocery Price Watch prices were reported by 41 volunteer shoppers at grocery stores statewide from Oct. 31-Nov. 6. TFB has released its Grocery Price Watch survey quarterly since March 2009.



## Is Christie GOP's Clinton?

Chris Christie couldn't have been any more obvious about his 2016 intentions if he had begun his victory speech earlier this month with the words "My fellow Americans" and ended it with a balloon drop.

He offered New Jersey as an example for national healing. "Tonight," he said, "a dispirited America, angry with their dysfunctional government in Washington, looks to New Jersey to say 'Is what I think's happening really happening? Are people really coming together?'"

Trenton, a nation turns its lonely eyes to you.

None of this was subtle, but Christie had certainly earned it. Almost every decision he's made -- sometimes shamelessly so -- has been geared to making the rubble bounce in his re-election and then using his crushing victory as a credential in an incipient national campaign. He succeeded brilliantly on his own terms.

In a state President Barack Obama won by 17 points in 2012, Christie won 60 percent overall. He won Latinos outright and took 21 percent of the black vote. He won women and men. He won high-school graduates and people with advanced degrees. He won people making more than \$200,000 and people making less than

\$50,000.

These numbers are eye-popping. But as Henry Olsen of the Ethics and Public Policy Center points out, essentially uncontested races against badly overmatched opponents aren't a predictor of anything. William Weld won 70 percent of the vote and every county in Massachusetts in his 1994 re-election as governor, then lost by 7 points to John Kerry in a 1996 Senate race in which the map of Massachusetts snapped back to its natural state.

Christie's implicit pitch to the national GOP will probably be that he's to Republicans in the 2010s what Bill Clinton was to the Democrats in the 1990s. In other words, he offers a different kind of politics that can potentially unlock the presidency after a period of national futility for his party.

Like Clinton when he was governor of Arkansas in the 1980s, Christie is operating on hostile partisan and cultural territory, and managing to thrive by co-opting or neutralizing natural enemies.

Like the "explainer-in-chief," Christie has a

knack for public persuasion. The New Jersey governor's relentless town halls during the fight for his public-sector reforms were model examples of making an argument fearlessly and effectively.

Like Clinton, who so famously felt people's pain, Christie connects. His response to Hurricane Sandy was, in part, a great act of empathy.

What Clinton had that Christie evidently lacks is a well-thought-out approach to his party's predicament. As a "New Democrat," Clinton had a different governing philosophy, expressed in a raft of new policy proposals. Chris Christie has an affect and a style of governance.

For Christie truly to capitalize on his opportunity, he will need a conservative reform agenda, geared to the bread-and-butter concerns of ordinary voters. As Henry Olsen writes, Christie's potential is in matching that Everyman appeal with substance. He could set out to make himself a Republican by and for the middle class in a departure for the contemporary party.

Congratulations on the big win, governor. Now show us what's next.

## Paying for corporate crime on taxpayer's dime

By letting bank deduct \$4B from its taxes to pay \$13B in penalties feds put 'con' in unconscionable

Sometimes, a news story can be so crammed with irony that it boggles the mind. Consider just the headline on one such story that ran recently in my town's daily paper: "Man gets 10 years for defrauding banks."

That just screams for a rewrite, doesn't it? I yearn for a story with a headline in boldface type that, at long last, would trumpet this joyous news: "Banker get 10 years for defrauding man."

Alas, while the FBI, IRS, and the judicial establishment went all out to nail the bank defrauder, they allow big-time Wall Street crooks who defraud us to escape prosecution, much less jail. High-flying bankers systematically commit serial acts of blatant fraud, bilking millions of people out of billions of dollars, but they keep their positions, pay-

checks, perks, and prestige -- free to bilk again.

The latest Wall Street tycoon to admit to grand scale larceny, yet pay no personal penalty, is Jamie Dimon, the head honcho of JPMorgan Chase. Shareholders in Dimon's felonious operation have been socked with a record \$13 billion in penalties, but not a penny comes from Jamie's pocket.

Still, popping the bank for 13 big ones shows that the Justice Department is finally getting tough on corporate crime, right? Not exactly.

JPMorgan's punish-

ment will be softened significantly by this unannounced outrage: A corporation -- unlike a person -- can deduct criminal fines from its income taxes. That means we taxpayers will, in effect, cough up some \$4 billion to help America's richest bank pay for its wrongdoing.

This corporate tax scam puts the "con" in unconscionable.

## A farm bill in name only

To paraphrase a famous Mark Twain quote, suppose you passed a farm bill. And suppose you passed a food stamp bill. But I repeat myself.

Hard as it may be to believe, 80 percent of the farm bill being hammered out by the Senate and the House of Representatives is made up not of agriculture programs, but of food stamps. And if that sounds upside down to you, you clearly don't live "inside the Beltway," where Orwellian logic is the order of the day.

Why are food stamps rolled into the legislation? They're included "purely from a political perspective," Sen. Thad Cochran (R-Miss.), ranking member of the Senate Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry Committee, said earlier this year. "It helps get the farm bill passed."

At least it used to. House members who had tired of this business-as-usual practice rebelled this year, and managed to pass a version of the farm bill that (unlike its Senate counterpart) took food stamps out. When The Washington Post editorialized about the House bill, it listed this among the legislation's "good points," adding:

"[F]or the first time in many years, representatives passed agriculture-support programs separately from food stamps, ending the old log-rolling arrangement between urban and rural delegations that insulated both programs from scrutiny on the merits."

Unfortunately, this is Washington, where most politicians do their hardest work insulating programs from scrutiny on the merits.

Most Americans, however, favor the House's action. In a "Food Demand Survey" conducted by Oklahoma State University, people asked whether they supported or opposed the following statement: "Separate the food stamp program from the farm bill and debate its merit separately from farm supports and subsidies." Support came in at 73 percent.

Separation isn't the only issue though. The entire purpose of separating food stamps from agriculture programs is to achieve real reform. While there's a lively debate going on regarding food stamp reform, that's not the case when it comes to other troubling provisions of the farm bill. As has been the case since FDR was president, agriculture policy is a government-run behemoth that would make a Soviet central planner blush.

The most expensive single farm program subsidizes about 62 percent of the premiums that farms pay for crop insurance. Yet instead of finding ways to reduce the load on taxpayers, the House and Senate versions would expand

this program.

Or take the sugar program. Sugar prices have generally been double the world price for decades. It's largely due to the government dictating how much sugar can be sold, and imposing quotas on imports -- quotas designed solely to protect the market share of domestic producers. Every sugar-sweetened product costs more to make, adding to everyone's grocery bills. Both the House and Senate versions of the farm bill keep the sugar program intact.

Meanwhile, as I've detailed in previous columns, the bulk of agriculture subsidies go not to the small, struggling farmers that most Americans envision, but to huge "agribusinesses" with annual incomes well in excess of \$1 million.

Yes, the House and Senate are finally dropping the direct payments made for years to farmer of certain commodities, such as corn, cotton, wheat and rice -- subsidies so indefensible, the American Farm Bureau Federation

has called for their repeal. But they're adding new programs that could prove even costlier, such as one that would force taxpayers to cover even minor losses suffered by farmers.

"A farm bill should serve the interests of the American people," writes Heritage Foundation farm-bill expert Daren Bakst. "This first starts with taking politics out of the bill." That means considering food stamps separately and making other needed reforms. Raising another bumper crop of subsidies and bad policy is simply unacceptable.



## Astronomical Society holds December Star Parties

The Andromeda Galaxy (M31) is the nearest spiral galaxy to our own Milky Way, only 2.5 million light years away. M31 is the most distant object visible to the naked eye. Approximately equal in size, these two galaxies are expected to collide in a mere 3.75 billion years. M92, a bright globular cluster in Hercules, is 26,000 light years from the earth. M39 is an open cluster in the Cygnus constellation. The brightest star in Cygnus is Deneb, a blue-white supergiant.

The Central Texas Astronomical Society (CTAS) will hold free public star parties on Saturday, November 23, from 5:30 p.m. until 9 p.m. at Overlook Park outside Belton, the Waco Wetlands outside Waco, and at the Hubbard City Lakes Park in Hubbard. This is an opportunity for the entire family to enjoy an evening under the stars.

CTAS members will provide telescopes to view the visible planets and a selection of star clusters,

nebulae, and galaxies. Guests are welcome to bring their own telescopes or binoculars. A small flashlight and a lawn chair are optional, but recommended.

The planet Venus appears low in the west in Sagittarius, right after sunset. Venus shows phases, like our moon, and will be only 36 percent lit. Uranus looks blue-green because of methane in its atmosphere. Neptune, located in Aquarius this month, also gets its blue color from methane, but appears darker because it is farther from the sun and therefore less illuminated.

These and many other celestial objects will be viewed this month. Check their web site, <http://www.centexastronomy.org>, for directions to the site close to you and for more information. If this event is cancelled due to weather, a cancellation notice will be posted by 5 p.m. on the CTAS website. You may register online for this event and receive monthly notices of future events.

# Aviator Jack Jones passes away

## Active volunteer helped to establish Salado Chamber, Salado Art Fair

Lt. Col. (Ret.) Curran L. "Jack" Jones passed away November 17, 2013. Services were held 10 a.m. Nov. 20 at Salado Church of Christ with Bill Bunting officiating. Burial with military honors followed in Salado Cemetery.

Jack Jones was born on October 4, 1919 in Columbia, South Carolina to Curran L. Jones and Marie Munckton Jones. He entered Clemson University where he participated in the ROTC and then enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corp as a fighter pilot. He returned after the war to complete his degree in history.

One of the first to arrive in the Pacific at the beginning of WWII with the 39th Fighter Squadron, Jack flew P-39 Aerocobras and P-38 Lightnings out of Port Moresby in New Guinea where his many victories distinguished him as an American Ace. He participated in the Battle of the Bismarck Sea and had the unusual

opportunity to meet his former foe, the foremost Japanese Ace, Saburo Saitai, years later at the Nimitz Museum in Fredericksburg, Texas.

Following the war, he was transferred to Europe and had a command in the Berlin Air Lift. He retired in Salado to raise thoroughbred horses and,

with his wife Grace Jones, launch the Grace Jones dress shop.

Jack initiated the Salado Chamber of Commerce, the Salado Art Fair, the first Republican precinct in Salado, the Holland Chamber of Commerce, and the first Republican precinct in Holland. He was a founding member of the Bell County Sheriff's Posse, active member of the Salado Lions Club, and past president of the Heart of Texas Sons of the American Revolution. He enjoyed tennis, golf, and English riding.

For over 20 years Jack authored Aviation by C.L. "Jack" Jones, a column in the Killeen Daily Herald and other local papers focusing on men and women pilots in Texas. He also produced a monthly PBS television program, Skies Over Texas, in which he interviewed pilots throughout the state.

He is survived by his wife of 32 years, Joyce Bateman Jones, his daughter, Marie Catherine Jones, stepson, Aaron Austin Mullen and wife Jennifer, and grandsons Isaiah and Wyatt.

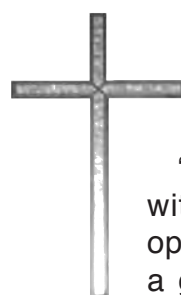

out the support of local churches, civic groups, school groups and individuals who give of their time and money each year.

The annual Christmas drive began in the mid 90s. "I heard of a couple of school teachers and volunteers who were gathering things for kids in the schools. Dana Britt and the late Mary Ribeiro were

doing this on their own for a long time without much help," founding president Marilyn Fleischer said of the beginnings of the Family Relief Fund.

The first year that the Fund began to take shape, collections of used toys and clothes were gathered at the fire station. "It was discouraging sifting for hours through used toys

that were broken or should have been thrown away," she said.

The Fund continued its work at Christmas, but changed gears when the tornado ripped through Jarrell, causing such devastation to that small community. "We solicited and took donations for relief

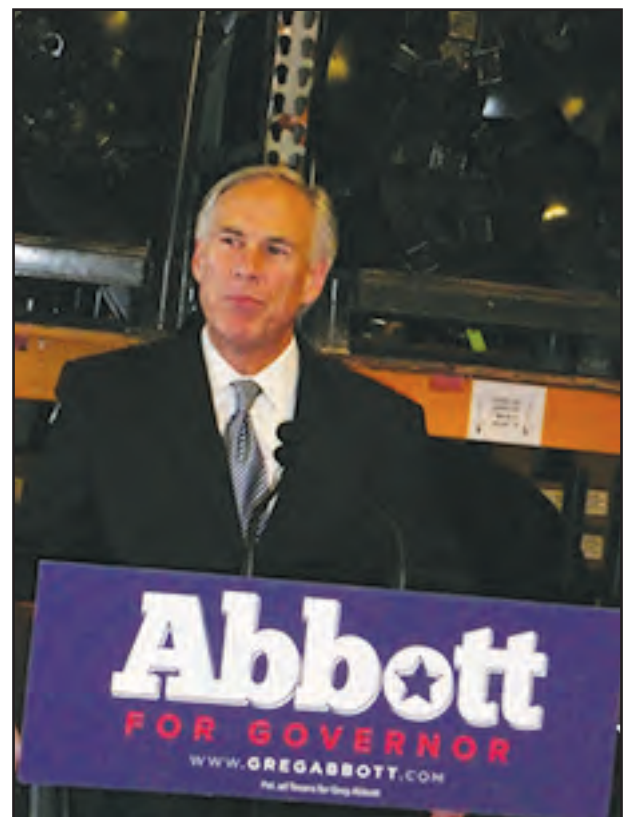
## Abbott stumps at Belltech Industries in Belton

Greg Abbott, Republican Candidate for governor, visited Belltech Industries in Belton on Nov. 14.

Abbott spoke of his accomplishments as the current attorney general.

He won the court case with the U.S. Supreme Court to allow the display of the Ten Commandments on the Capitol grounds of Texas. He also defended at the U.S. Supreme Court level the right of Texans to keep and bear arms, and defended the law and won the case supporting voter ID.

He further stated he has filed 30 lawsuits against the Obama Administration regarding the Affordable Care Act, better known as Obamacare, as well as several lawsuits against the Environmental Protection Agency.

His two overall goals if elected governor are to protect individual liberty and protect privacy.

If elected he stated he plans to protect citizens' privacy by prohibiting companies from selling personal information unless permission is granted by that person or persons.

He intends to further protect privacy by seeking a law to determine personal DNA as one's personal property. Additionally he plans to propose voter initiative to limit use of information from red light cameras.

His second goal is to increase transparency with state-elected officials. He will push for a law that

would require all state-elected officials report all the sources of their income prior to an election. He wants to limit candidates spending \$5,000 or more without notifying the public the source of the money in advance of an election. He also wants to eliminate loopholes that allow legislators to benefit personally from any bill and wants to eliminate the use lobbyists for public schools seeking more funds.

He supports passage of an open-carry law as well as campus-carry for firearms. He supports state healthcare exchanges and wants to prevent state funds from being used to promote Obamacare.

In closing he reported on a discussion he had recently with a businessman in the Dallas area who moved his company to Texas from California a year ago. "Texans has freedom that Californians do not have."

efforts in Jarrell, which was when we changed the name of the group to Salado Family Relief Fund," Fleischer said. "We collected several thousand dollars for those victims."

At that point, Fleischer said she realized it was time to organize the group formally. "We invited all of the churches and civic groups in Salado to join us in forming this organization," she said.

Since forming more than almost two decades ago, the Fund has helped families in the area in a variety of ways, including temporary assistance for medicines, rent, clothing, food and other necessities. "We never give out cash," said Mary Catherine Ervin, longtime board member

and President of the SFRF, "but we will always try to work to find a solution or a way we can help."

The Fund has established a school supply bank at the school, administered by the Communities in Schools. The Fund also ensures that children get a hot meal at school by working with cafeteria staff.

In addition to the annual Christmas drive, the SFRF also sponsors an annual Back-to-School drive in which families are given vouchers for clothing and school supplies only that are valid at a local Wal-Mart. The SFRF works with the participating retailer to ensure that only back-to-school clothing and supplies are purchased.



Salado Historical Society Tour of Homes and Sites includes Anderson House and Armstrong-Adams House.

Two Greek revival homes built in the 1860s will be part of the Salado Historical Society's Tour of Historic Homes and Sites, Dec. 6-8: the Anderson House and the Armstrong-Adams House.

History interpreters at 10 homes and sites will bring the history of Salado to life.

Gracing Main Street for over 150 years, the Anderson house is of Greek revival style in overall forms and facades with single, carved doors generally associated with Victorian architecture. Fronted by 200-year-old oak trees, one with a hitching ring still embedded in it by the front gate, this two-story yellow clapboard house rests on hand-hewn cedar uprights and attic beams, with a limestone foundation. The walls are three inches thick, the windows include hand-blown glass panes, and the floors are pine. Window frames and doors were handmade and put together by wooden pegs. Native rock chimneys flank the north and south sides of the house.

James Anderson received title to this property on June 8, 1860 (eight acres of which four remain with the house). He built Anderson House to board

students from Salado College, and it served this purpose for many years. Anderson died October 28, 1865.

Over the years, community leaders, lawyers, and doctors lived in Anderson House. James E. Ferguson, Governor of Texas 1915-1917 and husband of the first woman Texas Governor, boarded here in 1883 while a student at Salado College.

Paul and Virginia Kinnison purchased the home in 1962. The Kinnison's children now own the house.

Look for James Anderson greeting visitors to the house.

Salado physician David

Armstrong and his wife Julia built the Armstrong-Adams house between 1869 and 1872. The one-story structure of native hand cut limestone is an excellent example of early Greek revival architecture using local materials. The house was originally a three-room limestone structure, with a later addition of four rooms, including a kitchen and bath.

Medicine and education are intimately associated with the Armstrong-Adams house. The house takes its name from Dr. D. H. Armstrong, an early Salado physician who served as one of the first trustees of Salado's free public school system, and second owner Dr. D. G. Adams, a Bell County Commissioner, instrumental in the formation of Thomas Arnold High School that once occupied the Salado College building. Two of Dr. Adams' daughters taught music and art in Salado, and students from Salado College boarded at the house.

Dr. James Edwin Guthrie (1860-1950) attended Salado College and lived most of his life in Salado. Dr. and Mrs. Guthrie lived in the house from 1926-1946. He practiced medicine and operated a drug store in Salado on the corner of Royal Street and Main Street. Among other antiques in the house are a solid brass bed owned by Dr. Guthrie, and the lantern used by Dr. Guthrie to light his way between home and work.

Dr. William Ashe purchased the property in 1979 and performed some restoration to the structure in 1979-80. Dr. Douglas Willingham acquired the property from Dr. Ashe in 1983 and over the years

transformed the historic building into its present form.

In 2000, Dr. Willingham skillfully integrated a modern residential addition with the original nineteenth century structure without compromising the architectural integrity of the older building. Tim Brown designed and built the traditional Rumford fireplace using sandstone rock from the Willingham ranch house built in Fisher County, Texas, in 1892. The Willingham family placed a time capsule under the hearthstone with some items of Salado and a history of the house's family and its design.

Douglas and Carol Willingham's home is an excellent example of adaptive reuse transforming a residential structure of the old to the new, with family history, local history, and talent of Salado artists reflected throughout.

Anderson House and Armstrong-Adams House are on the National Registry of Historic Places, and Recorded Texas Historic Landmarks.

With the exception of Historic Salado College Park, all homes and sites will be open 5-8 p.m. Friday, December 6; 10-5 p.m. Saturday, December 7; 1-5 p.m. Sunday, December 8. Historic Salado College Park will be open on Saturday (10-5 p.m.) and Sunday (1-5 p.m.) only.

# The one and only chance Contract Bridge

By Steve Becker

Assume you get to five clubs on the bidding shown and West leads a heart. East wins with the ace, felling your king, and returns a heart. What is your best chance for the contract?

The outlook certainly is not promising. In addition to the heart already lost, it seems likely that you'll have to lose a spade and a diamond. True, you also might lose a trump trick, but you should discount that possibility because East is almost sure to have the king of clubs for his opening bid.

Despite this dim outlook, though, you should try to visualize a lie of the opposing cards that might give you a chance for the contract. It can't be right to just give up without a fight.

This brings you to the conclusion that while there is practically no chance of West holding the ace of diamonds, there is a chance of his holding the J-10 of that suit.

Accordingly, you discard a spade on the heart queen at trick two and lead the jack of clubs from dummy. When the jack wins, you continue with a trump to the ace and then lead a diamond toward the K-Q-9.

After West follows low, you insert the nine, hoping it will force East's ace. Luckily, this long shot comes through, and you later discard a spade on one of dummy's diamonds to make your game.

Note that even if dummy's nine loses to the ten or jack, you still go down only one. A second diamond lead later will force out the ace, allowing you to avoid a spade loser.

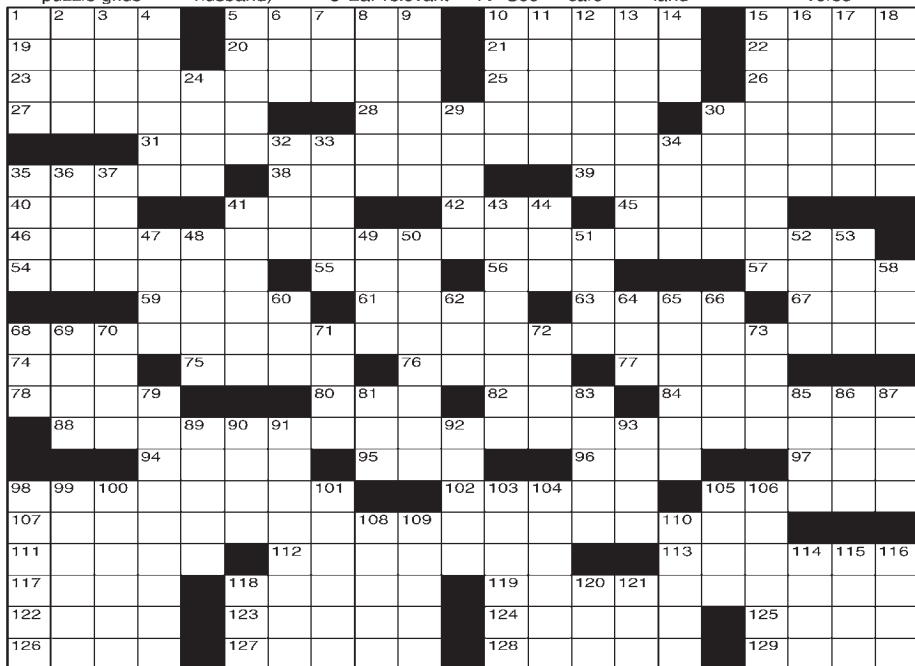

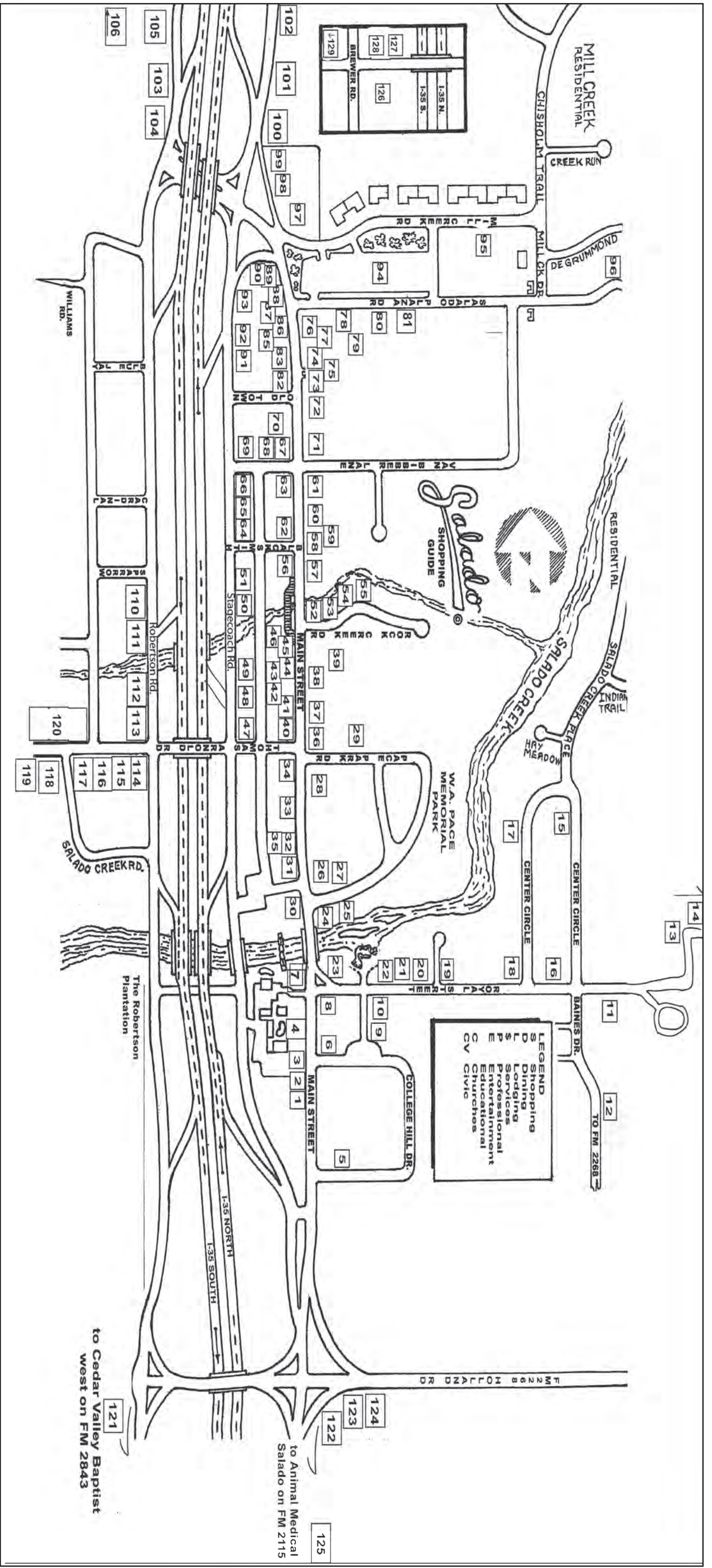


