No room for Humbug! Stroll kicks into gear

There will be no room for bah or humbug in Salado as the Village kicks off its annual Christmas Stroll weekends with a parade 5 p.m. Dec. 5, followed by two weekends of activities and late night shopping.

Entries into the parade will line up on Center Circle and make their way east on Royal Street before turning north on Main Street. The parade will end at the Salado Civic Center parking lot on Main Street, where everyone is invited to join the parade entries for hot chocolate, photos with St. Nick and the lighting of the Christmas tree.

The Range will be offering a special \$20 gourmet dinner Dec. 5 for those attending the parade and the Community Chorus concert. The restaurant will begin serving at 5 p.m.

Following the Parade is the annual Salado Community Chorus Christmas Concert, which will be at 7:30 p.m. Dec. 5 at the First Baptist Church. The original time of 7 p.m. was moved back to 7:30 p.m. to allow people a chance to attend following the parade.

The parade kicks off the annual Christmas Stroll weekends, which will be Dec. 6-8 and Dec. 13-15. The Stroll weekends will include an Historic Homes and Sites Tour (Dec. 6-8), Live Nativity at the First Baptist Church (Dec. 6-8 and Dec. 13-15), late night shopping and live carolers both weekends, a Dec. 7 Christmas concert, a chance to make your own glass ornaments at Salado Glassworks and performances of Charles Dickens' Christmas classic "A Christmas Carol."

Shannon Ashe will direct Tablerock's 21st Annual performances of Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol at the Goodnight Amphitheater on Royal Street in Salado. Dates for the production are Dec. 6-7 and Dec. 13-14 with the curtain open-

ing at 7 p.m. each night.

Shannon is an Alderman for the Village of Salado and is married to Rick Ashe, the former Mayor of Salado. The Ashe's daughter, Addie, plays Ginger in this year's production.

A Christmas Carol has a cast and crew of 58. Some are newcomers and a handful who have been associated with the play since its inception, 21 years ago.

A Christmas Carol was adapted to the stage by Harry Sweet. Mr. Sweet, director of A Christmas Carol for 15 years and a retired Ethics Professor at Mary Hardin Baylor said, "No one can improve on Dickens' works," so the show remains pure Dickens, to the delight of all who come back year after year to enjoy the production.

SUMC volunteers feed over 450 traveling highway on Thanksgiving

Salado United Methodist Church served over 450 this year with the 4th Annual I-H 35 Thanksgiving feed.

"We did not know what to expect when the weather cooperated with us this Thanksgiving Day. We had all the fixings from turkey, dressing, yams, green bean casserole, cranberry sauce and of course a wide variety of desserts!" said Rolly Correa Outreach Director for Salado United Methodist Church (SUMC).

The church has an extended outreach program for local and foreign mission. The Thanksgiving mission is a unique outreach that doesn't necessarily touch the poor or destitute. Instead, it serves those in route to visit family or friends with a surprise meal, free of charge.

"By feeding the truck drivers who deliver goods to our stores and market places, we are serving those who serve us," Correa added. "For some long haul truckers it was their second and third time to eat with us. Several said they would be back next year if their route allows."

"The free meal was not advertised to the local community because the focus was on the travelers and workers on Thanksgiving Day," he added.

SUMC sponsors other local mission programs which focus on helping the local citizens throughout the year.

Correa also stated that many of SUMC Church members gave up their family Thanksgiving meal to visit with and serve the travelers and workers from all over the state and the country. In addition, there were volunteers and their

families from other local churches assisting SUMC. "We are extremely grateful for several local organizations that helped make the mission a success," he said. The James Construction Group allowed the use of their

electronic bill board displaying "Free Meal" at the Rest Stop Exit 282 Southbound. Two Salado businesses pitched in to help as well. Johnny's Steaks and Barbecue cooked the turkeys and Bush's Chicken supplied iced tea.

Salado makes the cut to play 4A in 2014-16

Salado will be playing in 4A for the 2014-16 biennium, but alignment of districts have not yet been released by University Interscholastic League. UIL released the cut-off numbers for the six divisions of athletic and extra-curricular competition on Dec. 2.

These numbers provide the range of enrollment for each of the six conferences, including the divisional cutoffs for football.

The 2014-16 alignments will be released on Feb. 3 for football and basketball. District alignments for other activities will be released in the order of their seasons.

The move to 4A is not quite as dramatic as it seems. Conference 4A is what has historically been labeled Conference 3A. UIL will realign conferences in such a way that

schools that compete in Six Man Football will be Conference 1A. The other schools in Conference 1A that played 11 Man Football will be in the new 2A Conference; 2A will be 3A, and so forth.

The cutoff for Conference 4A as announced this week is 465-1,059. For football, however, competition will be further split into 4A, Division I and 4A, Division II being smaller schools.

Salado will compete in 4A, Division II, which has cutoff numbers of 465-685 student enrollment based upon enrollment snapshots provided to UIL in October.

Salado turned in enrollment of 478 to UIL earlier this fall.

The Eagles are the only school from the District 13-2A, Div. 1 that

will make the leap to 4A competition. Academy, Cameron, Florence, Lago Vista, Marlin, McGregor and Troy all remain under the 465 cut for 4A. They will likely be the center of a 3A, Div. I district next year.

While it is not yet known who Salado will face in Con. 4A, Div. 1 football for the next two years, here are some schools that Salado might face in district play: Groesbeck (468 enrollment); Fairfield (480 enrollment); Llano (491 enrollment); Caldwell (512 enrollment); Lorena (522 enrollment); Madisonville (613 enrollment); and Waco Connally (615 enrollment). This could make for long drives for Eagle fans. Enrollment figures are from The Old Coach website www.theoldcoach.rivals.com.

Salado woman killed in Belton collision Rogers man charged with felony intoxicated manslaughter

A Rogers man remains in Bell County jail (as of 4:25 p.m. Dec. 3) and has been charged with intoxicated manslaughter with a vehicle after a Dodge pickup was involved in a fatal collision Dec. 1 in Belton.

A Salado woman was killed in the near head on collision that occurred at about 6:15 p.m. Dec. 1. Brianna Nicole Pratt, age 20 of Salado, died of injuries sustained in the collision. She was transported to Scott & White Hospital in Temple where she was pronounced dead.

According to Belton police, a Dodge pickup was southbound on FM 1670 near Highway 190 when it crossed into the northbound lane and collided with a Dodge Stratus. The pickup also hit a Mercury Grand Marquis that was behind the Stratus. Pratt was driving the Stra-

tus. She graduated from Salado High School

Her friend Melody Smith was driving the Grand Marquis.

Pratt and Smith were returning to Salado after attending a concert at the Bell County Expo Center that day and were traveling on FM 1670 to avoid highway congestion.

Michael Alexander Soto, 24 of Rogers, was the driver of the Dodge pickup. He was taken into custody on a charge of driving without a license. He was later charged with assault causing bodily injury to a family member and intoxicated manslaughter with a vehicle. Bond was set at \$250,000 for the intoxicated manslaughter with a vehicle charge, \$5,000 for the assault causing bodily injury to a family member and \$2,500 for the charge of driving without a license.

The New Climate Deniers

There are few things sadder than the “climate denier.” He ignores the data and neglects the latest science. His rhetoric and policy proposals are dangerously disconnected from reality. He can’t recalibrate to take account of the latest evidence because, well, he’s a denier.

The new climate deniers are the liberals who, despite their obsession with climate change, have managed to miss the biggest story in climate science, which is that there hasn’t been any global warming for about a decade and a half.

“Over the past 15 years air temperatures at the Earth’s surface have been flat while greenhouse-gas emissions have continued to soar,” The Economist magazine writes. “The world added roughly 100 billion tons of carbon to the atmosphere between 2000 and 2010. That is about a quarter of all the CO2 put there by humanity since 1750.” Yet, no more warming.

The Economist has been decidedly alarmist on global warming through the years, so it deserves credit for pausing to consider why the warming trend it expected to continue has mysteriously stalled out.

The deniers feel no such compunction. A de-

denier feels the same righteous sense of certitude now, when warming has stopped, as he did a decade ago. Washington Post columnist Eugene Robinson recently opined that “sensible people accept the fact of warming” -- but apparently not the fact of no-warming. He scorned those “who manipulate the data in transparently bogus ways to claim that warming has halted or even reversed course.” Does he include James Hansen, the famous NASA scientist, among these dastardly manipulators? No one this side of Al Gore has warned as persistently about global warming as Hansen. He nonetheless admits that “the five-year mean global temperature has been flat for a decade.” None of this means that the Earth didn’t get hotter in the 20th century, or that carbon emissions don’t tend to create a warmer planet, or that warming won’t necessarily begin again. It does mean that we know less about the fantastically complex global climate system than global-warming alarmists have been willing to ad-

mit. The Economist notes the work of Ed Hawkins of the University of Reading in Britain. He has found that if global temperatures stay the same for a few more years, they will fall below the range of 20 climate models. In other words, the scientific “consensus” will have been proven wrong.

Why the stall in warming? According to The Economist, maybe we’ve overestimated the warming impact of clouds. Or maybe some clouds cool instead of warm the planet. Or maybe the oceans are absorbing heat from the atmosphere. Although the surface temperature of the oceans hasn’t been rising, perhaps the warming is happening deep down. James Hansen thinks new coal-fired plants in China and India, releasing so-called aerosols into the atmosphere that act to suppress warming, may be partly responsible for the stasis in temperatures. Hey, but don’t worry. The science is all “settled.”

What is beginning to seem more likely is that the “sensitivity” of the global climate to carbon emissions has been overestimated. If so, the deniers will be the last to admit it.

Tiny Tim Time at Walmart

Who says Walmart isn’t big-hearted?

Just look at the chain’s outlet in Canton, Ohio, where management set up bins for food donations, asking people to give generously to the poor who otherwise would not have a Thanksgiving dinner. But the bins weren’t for customers — they were tucked back in the employees-only area.

Walmart’s Thanksgiving food drive was for its own employees, beseeching low-wage workers to donate to even lower-wage workers who can’t afford a family dinner on this national day of thanks.

Yes, this corporate colossus, with an annual income greater than 140 countries, wants its poorly paid employees to buy food for fellow employees whose paychecks leave them in deep pov-

erty. More astonishing is the corporation’s insipid, self-congratulatory insistence that the employee food drive demonstrates its deep ethical commitment to the welfare of all Walmart “associates” (as it grandiosely calls its beleaguered workers).

“This is part of the company’s culture to rally around associates and take care of them,” a spokesman for the big-box giant asserted.

But, of course, Walmart isn’t taking care of its

workers at all. It won’t pay a living wage, won’t provide decent health care or other needed benefits, won’t allow workers to organize so they can have their own voice — and then abandons them to beg for scraps if they want to share in Thanksgiving with other Americans.

This is obscene and a moral outrage. Three Waltons — Alice, Robson, and Jim — are heirs to the Walmart fortune and are sitting on more than \$33 billion apiece, thanks to decades of profiting on the low wages the corporation pays. Shouldn’t they at least pony up a pittance from their prodigious inheritance for a few turkey-and-sweet-potato dinners on Thanksgiving?

The race route begins at St. Joseph’s, follows Main Street, then winds around some of the Village’s Bed & Breakfasts. The race will be timed by Pro-Fit



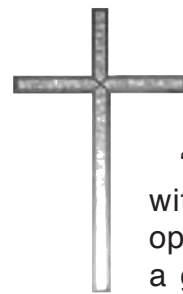

A Daughters of the Republic of Texas Defender of the Republic of Texas Medallion was placed at the gravesite of Jefferson Reed on Nov. 16.

Jefferson Reed was an original settler of Bell County. He came to Texas with his family in 1833 and received a land grant in the Robertson Colony on Nov. 3, 1834.

Reed was 15 years old when he received his land grant--the first single man to do so in the Robertson Colony.

He was a veteran of the Army of the Republic of Texas and was part of the detachment sent to bury the bones of Fannin's men who were killed at Goliad.

In 1901, Reed was interred in the Reed Family Cemetery in Rogers, Texas. His papers reside at the Brisco Center for American History on the University of Texas Campus. His correspondence highlights the difficulty of raising cotton and breeding livestock in early Texas.



Docents bring Salado history to life



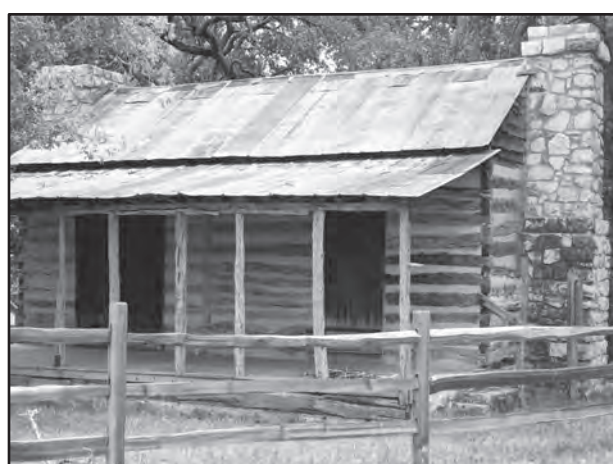
The Anderson House on Main Street will be on tour during the annual Salado Historical Society Tour of Historic Homes and Sites Dec. 6-8.

Stop #1: Historic Salado College Park (South Main Street at College Hill) Interpretive signs along a pathway through the park tell the history of

Robertson's Colony, Salado College, and the founding of Salado.

Stop #2: Central Texas Area Museum and Salado Historical Society (423 South Main Street) Permanent and special exhibits include artifacts associated with people and events in the history of Salado and Central Texas. Enjoy Celtic Christmas music and refreshments in the Wee Scots Shop.

Stop #3: Grace Jones Shop and First State Bank (2 Royal Street) Once the home of Salado's first bank and later Grace Jones of Salado, an upscale clothing shop that specialized in couture designs she acquired on her shopping trips around the

world. View this historic structure and clothing sold by Grace Jones.

Stop #4: Baines House (220 Royal) Built circa 1866 and once the home of Rev. George W. Baines, President of Baylor University at Independence, and the great-grandfather of United States President Lyndon Baines Johnson.

Stop #5: Anderson House (33 South Main Street) James Anderson, the builder, greets visitors to this house typical of early Salado homes built in the 1860s by families who moved to Salado so their children could attend Salado College.

Stop #6: Armstrong-Adams House (2 North Main Street) Owners

Doug and Carol Willingham's home is an excellent example of adaptive reuse transforming a residential structure of the old to the new, with family history, local history, and talent of Salado artists reflected throughout. History interpreters tell about the house, elaborately decorated for Christmas, and its owners.

Stop #7: Norwood House (231 North Main Street) Built in 1910 and occupied for many years by the Norwood family, the house is decorated for Christmas and descendants are baking cookies.

Stop #8: Vickrey House (402 North Main Street) Vickrey descendants tell family stories in this circa 1885 house.

Stop #9: Boles-Aiken and Denman Log Cabins (Main Street at Van Bibber Lane) Always a favorite on the tour, the cabins offer a unique look at homes of early Texans. History interpreters tell about Bell County pioneers, who lived in cabins like these.

Stop #10: Episcopal Church (945 North Main Street) A serene place to end the tour. History interpreters give architectural details of this unique church and furnishings.

With the exception of Historic Salado College Park, all homes and sites will be open 5-8 p.m. Dec. 6; 10 a.m.-5 p.m. Dec. 7 and 1-5 p.m. Dec. 8. Historic Salado College Park will be open 10 a.m.-5 p.m. Dec. 7 and 1-5 p.m. Dec. 8 only.

Tickets will be available for \$15 from any of the 10 stops on the tour.

Proceeds from the tour benefit Salado Historical Society as their only fundraiser.

Tickets are available for purchase at the Salado Visitor Center, which is located at 831 North Main Street or tourism@salado-events.com. The following businesses located on Main Street will also have tickets available: Charlotte's of Salado, Sofi's, Fletcher's Books, Taylors, and McCain's Bakery.

An anti-percentage play

Contract Bridge

Bridge is largely a game of percentages, but it is first and foremost a game of reasoning. Whenever possible, a player should try to improve on the cold mathematical percentages by putting to use any extraneous information he might gain as the play progresses. If he does this regularly, he will occasionally discover that the so-called percentage play is destined to lose, and that his only real chance is to adopt an anti-percentage play.

For example, take this deal where South lost the first two club tricks and ruffed the third club. Declarer had to lose a diamond trick, so the contract hinged on not losing a trick to the king of hearts.

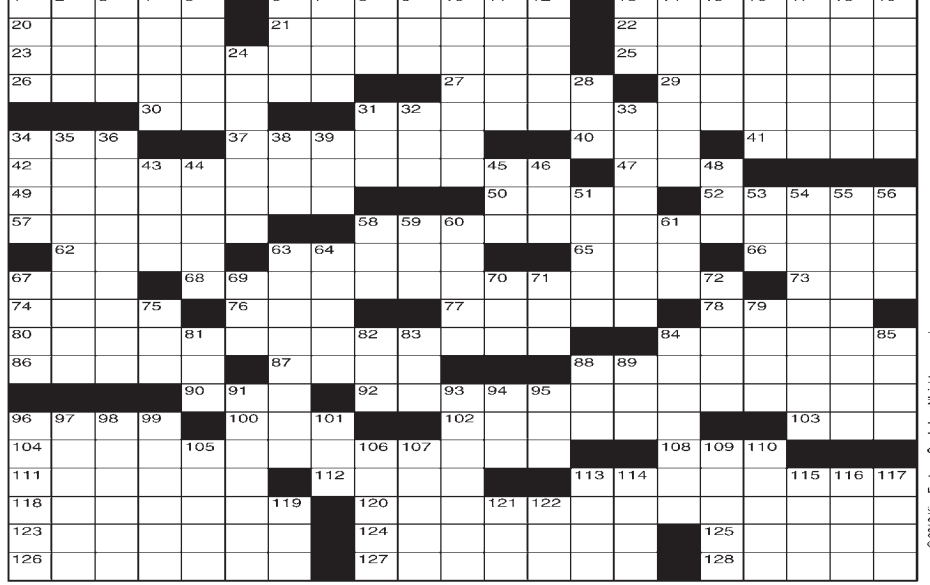
Declarer knew that the correct percentage play in hearts, missing three to the king, was to lead the jack from dummy and finesse. This would offer a much better chance of avoiding a heart loser than simply playing the ace in the hope of catching the singleton king.

But before committing himself to this line of play, South decided to collect a bit more information about the opposing hands. So at trick four, he led the diamond deuce to the queen, and when this lost to East's ace, he realized he would have to abandon the normal percentage play in trumps and instead pin his hopes on finding West with the singleton king. This was because East had passed at his first turn and had already shown up with the A-Q of clubs and ace of diamonds. Had he also held the king of hearts, he would surely have opened the bidding.

And so, after East re-

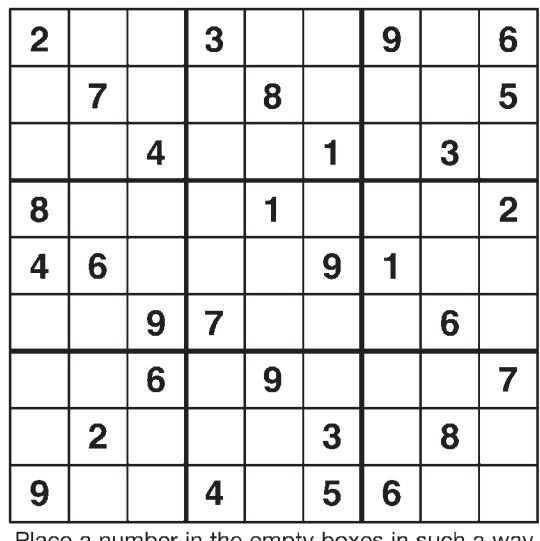

Safer Holiday Lighting

THIS IS A HAMMER

Q: Please remind your readers that when hanging up holiday lights outside, to be careful when setting up and working on ladders. They need to be aware of potential overhead hazards like power lines and make sure not to make contact with them. -- An Electrician in San Jose, Calif.

A: That's an important point to remember, and thank you for sending it. Setting up outdoor lights and displays can be hard work, and it's easy to forget a few basic safety steps while hurrying to get strings connected and secured in place. Here are some things to remember:

Always check overhead before setting up ladders,

using poles or other equipment, and make sure power lines, tree branches and other hazards are not in your path.

When planning outdoor displays, include the layout of extension cords and other electrical equipment in your design, so they are placed away from frequently traveled paths.

Use covered GFI (ground fault interrupter) outlets to reduce the risk of fire and shock, and be sure to not overload circuits.

Check all the light strings you plan to use, and

make sure they're rated for outdoor use, are not frayed and have no burnt bulbs.

Don't work alone: Have a helper to brace the ladder, help unravel light strings and so on.

If you plan to place decorations on the rooftop, make sure you secure yourself with a safety harness and rope.

HOME TIP: Consider replacing traditional Christmas lights with LED lights. They cost more, but last longer and save a lot of energy.
