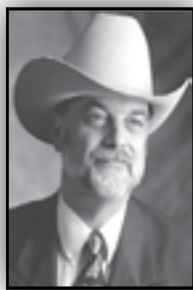

## Meeting planned to address Human Trafficking in Bell County

For several years United Methodist Women (UMW) have focused on Human Trafficking in the United States. This is the second most lucrative illegal business (\$10 billion annually) in the United States.

The average age of these children (primarily girls) is 15 years, which means about 50 percent are between 12 and 14.

Last year more than 85 children came under Bell County Juvenile Services

jurisdiction. Salado UMW has taken the initiative to provide Bell County constituents more information on how individuals, service clubs, Sunday School classes, UMW members, and any other inspired citizens can assist in the rehabilitation of juvenile girls and boys.

SUMW members have been in contact with Dawn Owens, Assistant Director of Juvenile Services and a member of the Bell County

Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking Roundtable, which is composed of county officials and support groups engaged in detection, rescue, and rehabilitation.

“SUMW is initiating, along with other Bell County UMW women, opportunities to assist in the rehabilitation of the juvenile victims,” said Margaret Blanton, one of the UMW volunteers. “UMW recognizes these victims will be citizens and parents along with our own grandchildren and great grandchildren. Hopefully, prayerfully, we all can make a difference.”

The UMW in Bell County will hold an informational session for groups and individuals at 5:15 p.m. June 3 at First United Methodist Church Family Life Center at 205 E. Third Ave. in Belton, Texas.

## Eagles to face Lorena

### Salado crushes China Spring in 2-of-3 series

Salado Eagles will face the 21-7 Lorena Leopards in a best-of-three series in the 4A Region III Quarterfinals baseball playoffs with all games set for the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor.

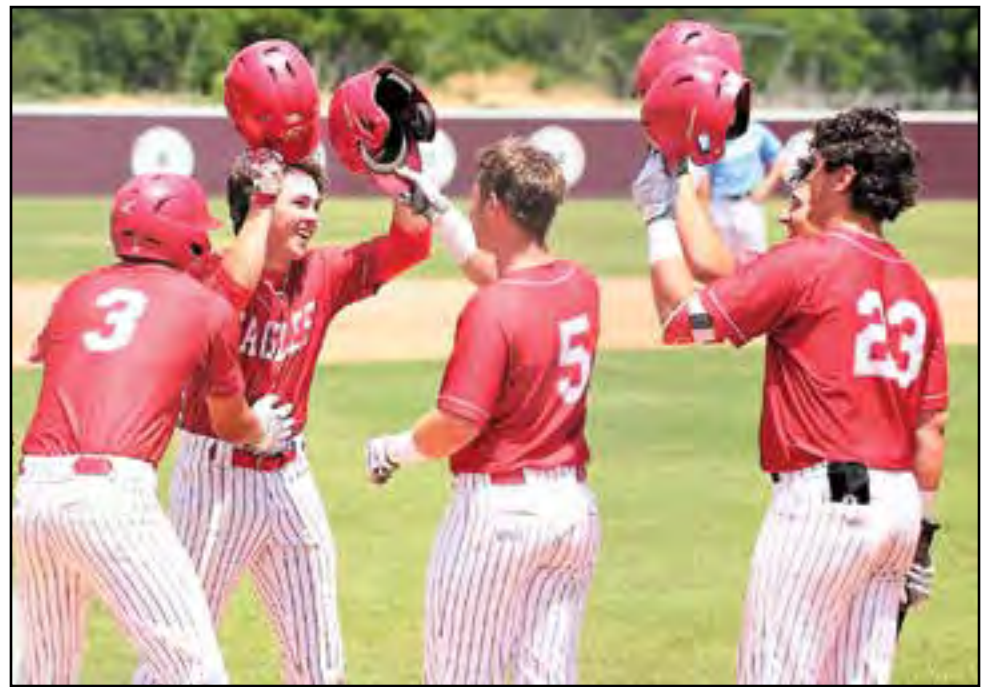
Game one will be 7 p.m. May 18. Game two will be 11 a.m. May 19 with game three, if necessary, to follow game two.

The Eagles crushed China Spring in a three-game series to reach the Region Quarterfinals. Salado dinged China Spring for 12 hits and 19 runs in the decisive third game May 12, winning 19-1. In game two, China Spring won 2-0. Salado won game one 11-4.

Salado Eagles scored 13 runs in the fourth inning, including a bases-clearing homerun by Dalton Hawes, to crush China Spring 19-1 in the third game of their series on May 12.

Salado led 6-1 going into the bottom frame of the fourth. Ryan Oakes led off with a triple, scoring on a single by Hawes. Jacob Wilk knocked a ball over the left field fence to give

Salado a 9-1 lead. Rustin Hale doubled and went to third on a passed ball. Mac Miller and Kade Maedgen both walked and Max Marin hit a two-run double.

Belton Farr reached second, advancing Marin and scoring Maedgen on an error. Oakes walked to load the bases before Hawes slammed the ball over centerfield for a grand slam.

Wilk and Hale singled, advancing on a passed ball. Maedgen walked and Caleb Self was hit by the pitcher to load the bases. Miller struck out, but the catcher let the ball get past him. Miller reached first and courtesy runner E Scott (in for Hale) scored on the passed ball. The other runners advanced to keep the bases loaded. Farr walked, pushing Maedgen across for the final run of the game.

Salado took an early lead in the game on a three-run first inning. Oakes walked to lead off the frame, Hawes followed with a walk. Wilk singled to score Oakes and put Hawes at second. With two outs, Maedgen double to deep left to score two

runs before being stranded on second. Salado led 3-0.

The Eagles put three more on the board in the second. Marin and Farr walked. Oakes grounded into a fielder's choice that got Marin at third, Hawes singled, loading the bases. Wilk singled to deep left to put runners at the corners and scoring Farr and Oakes. Hale walked to load the bases. Miller hit into a fielder's choice that caught Hale at second. Hawes scored on the fielder's choice for a 6-0 lead.

Konnor Baird got the win on the mound, pitching four innings. He allowed two hits and one run. He

# District pays teachers above state minimum SISD trustees approve pay scale, teaching contracts

Salado school trustees set the compensation plan for the district at their May 14 meeting.

According to the SISD compensation plan, a teacher with no experience and a bachelor's degree is paid \$41,000. The local annual pay increases by about \$482 per year until year 20. The

district pay then increases by about \$334 per year through year 38.

The state minimum is \$28,080. It increases by \$600 or more each year through year 20 when there are no more step increases.

A Salado ISD teacher with a bachelor's degree and 20 years of experi-

ence is paid \$52,787. The state minimum pay for the same teacher experience is \$45,510.

A Salado ISD teacher with a bachelor's degree and 30 years of experience is paid \$56,128. The state minimum for the same experience is \$45,510.

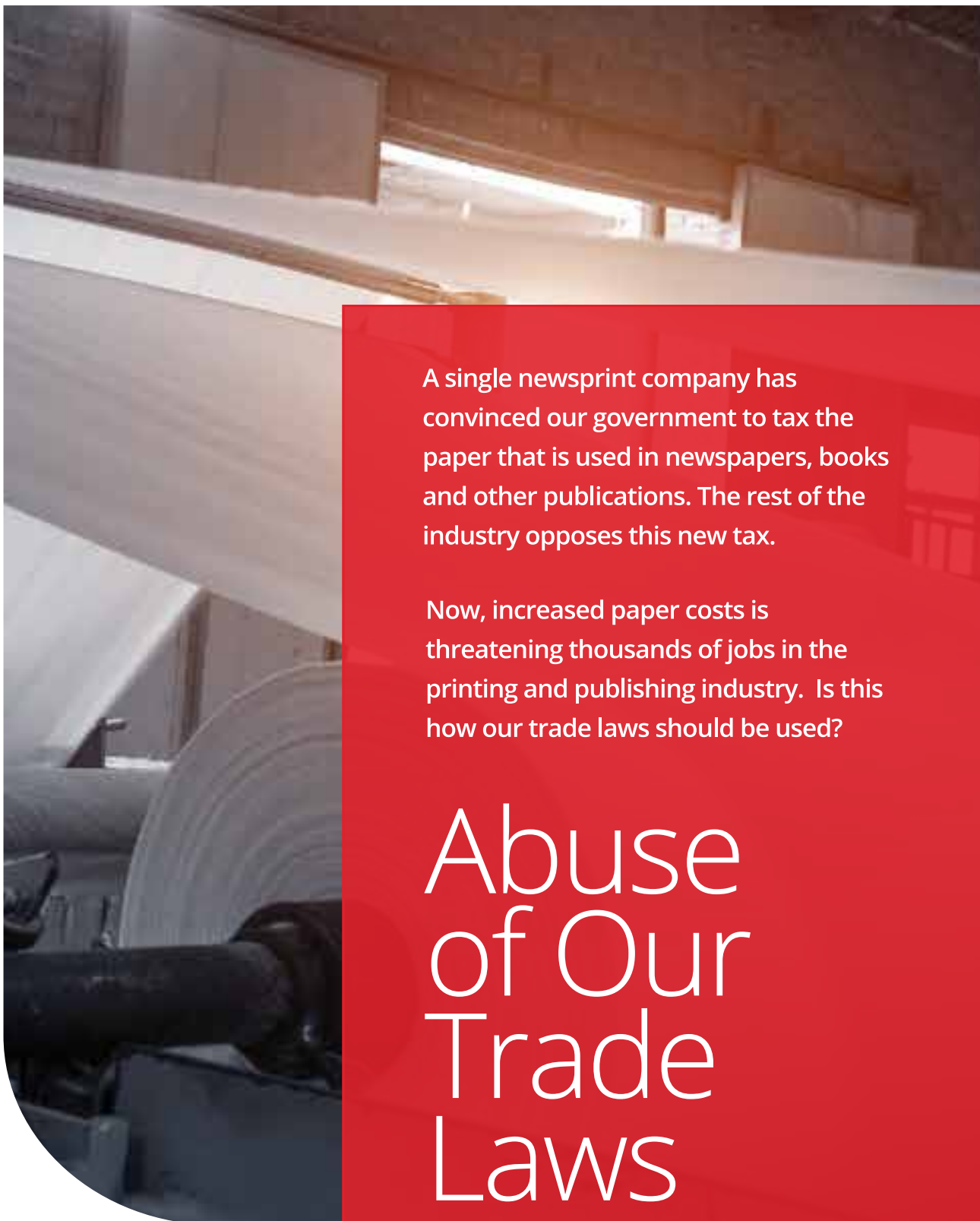

## CTAS Public Star Parties

THE CENTRAL TEXAS Astronomical Society (CTAS) will host public star parties on Saturday, May 19, from 8:15 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. These free events will be held at Overlook Park near the Stillhouse Hollow Lake dam outside Belton, and at the Hubbard City Lakes Park in Hubbard. CTAS members will provide telescopes for public viewing. Guests are also welcome to bring their own telescopes or binoculars.

In May, we are still able to look out of the plane of the galaxy during the evening. This makes other galaxies available for observation. Look for the two trios in Leo (M95/M96/M105 and M65/M66/NGC 3628). Also easily visible is M81 (Bode's Galaxy) and M82 (Cigar Galaxy) in Ursa Major.

Also visible in May are several globular clusters. M3 in Canes Venatici, one

of the largest, brightest clusters in the sky, was discovered in 1764 and the first object in the Messier catalog discovered by Charles Messier himself. In the constellation Hercules is M92 and the larger, brighter M13 (Great Hercules Cluster).

Venus is the evening star and is easily visible in the west even before the sun sets. Jupiter will rise in the east in the evening. Jupiter was at opposition on the night of May 8-9 so it should still be quite bright and large to view. Unfortunately Mars, Saturn, and Mercury are all visible in the morning for now. The moon will be a thin crescent in the western sky this weekend.

We will look at these and various other celestial objects this month. Please check our website, <http://www.centexastronomy.org>, for directions to the site close to you and for more information. If this event is cancelled due to weather,

a cancellation notice will be posted by 5 p.m. on the CTAS website. You may register online for this event and receive monthly notices of our future events.

Participants may want to bring a small flashlight (preferably with a red filter) to get around the parking lot and viewing area and a lawn chair to make viewing more comfortable. You will most likely want a light jacket/hoodie or even a heavy coat. With the possibility of wind coming off the lake, always dress for colder weather than you expect it to be.

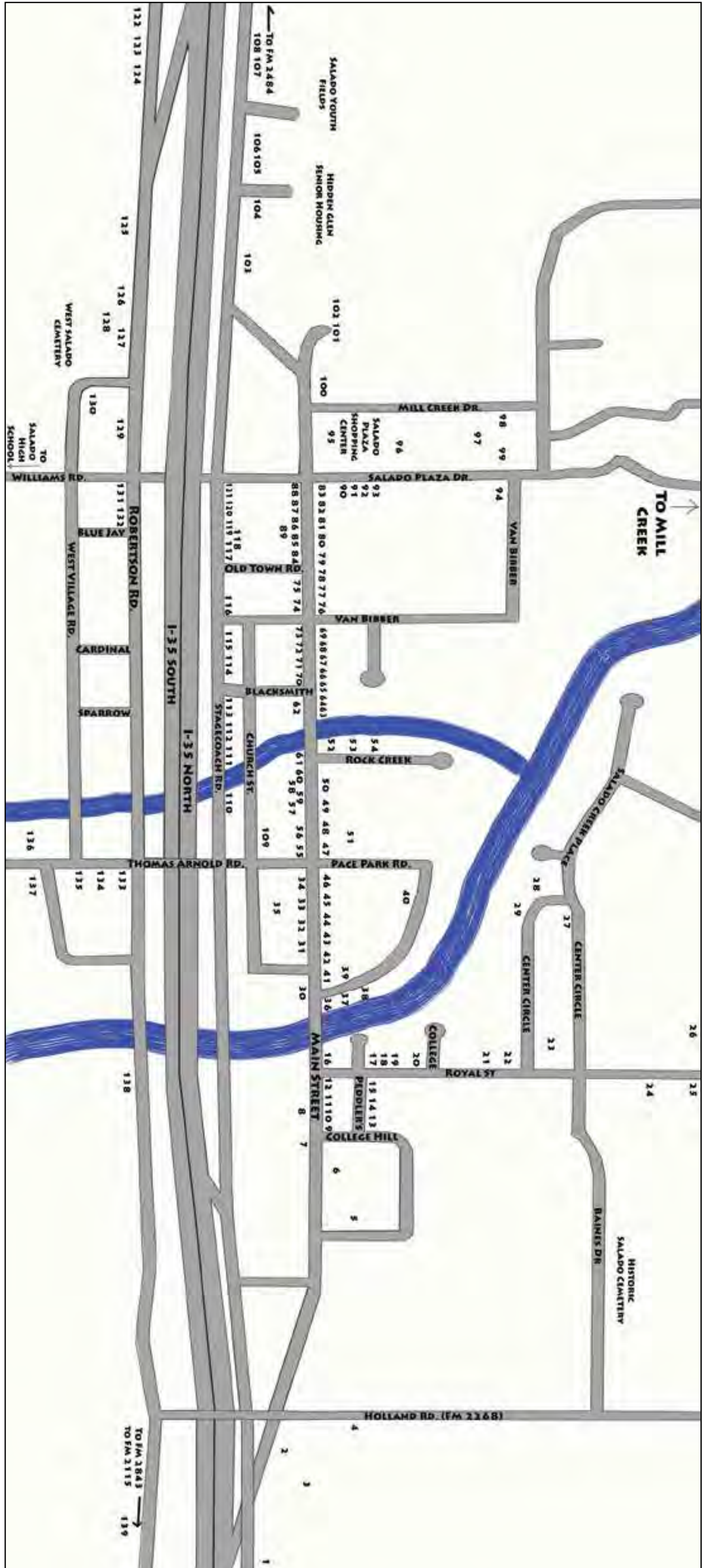

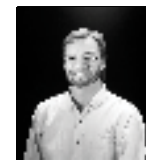


Cliff Chirping Frog

## This frog lays eggs on land skips tadpole phase

As a rule, frogs are thought to be differentiated from toads (among other things) by the fact that frogs typically live in permanent bodies of water while the habitats that toads select is less restrictive. However, even in the natural world, there are exceptions to the rules, and one such case of rebellion is a small frog that has adapted quite well to life away from bodies of water.

The Cliff Chirping Frog (*Eleutherodactylus marinoeki*) belongs to a frog genus that has three representatives here in Texas, and it has the largest distribution of the group by a considerable amount. This particular variety occurs throughout most of the Edwards Plateau westward to the eastern edges of the Chihuahuan Desert. It is in these eco-regions that it resides almost exclusively within the humid cracks and crevices of limestone canyon walls and hillsides. It can occasionally be observed underneath fallen trees and rocks, as well as

trash and other human debris. Outside of Texas it can be observed in the border states of northern Mexico.

This small species of anuran can be quite variable in appearance with a ground color that varies from tan to gray to even greenish. Along the backside there are small, dark markings that are spaced randomly, forming reticulate lines and patterns. The head is similarly colored to the back and ends in a sharply pointed snout. The tympanum, or ear, is quite large, almost the same size as the dark eyes. The back legs are long and spindly and are patterned with faint bars. The front legs are also scrawny, and are used extensively as this frog prefers to crawl rather than hop. The toes are unwebbed and have tiny toepads. The skin is mostly smooth and slimy and the hip bones protrude

along the backside, giving this frog the appearance of being in the throes of starvation.

As stated already, this species is rather minute with mature individuals seldom approaching one and one half inches in body length. There is virtually no difference in size between the sexes.

Breeding activities take place in the late winter months and can continue through the spring if the weather conditions are optimal. Males call the females with a series of trills and chirps (hence the common name) that sound akin to a deeper serenade of a cricket. Once mating occurs, females will lay a small (particularly by amphibian standards) clutch of eggs. Unlike most other species of amphibians that occur in Texas, Cliff Chirping Frogs do not undergo a typical amphibian metamorphosis. Rather than adults laying eggs in a body of semi-permanent or permanent body of water, females will deposit the eggs in the most humid areas of its subterranean habitat. It is in these moist egg casings that the young develop into tiny froglets – they skip the entire swimming tadpole stage. Once they hatch, the diminutive froglets will be replicas of the adults, save a small tailbud.

Cliff Chirping Frogs are alert and shy, and are rarely seen unless a concentrated effort is made to locate them. Unlike most frogs which will rely on their leaping prowess to evade predators, this species prefers to walk or crawl quickly into the safety that their limestone crevices provide. They are heard far more frequently than they are seen. Although rarely observed, at least visually, they are not rare, and population dynamics appear to be quite stable.
