## Saladoans invited to 75th Anniversary at Old School

Saladoans are invited to a unique program at the Civic Center on Saturday, October 23, to celebrate the former red brick school's 75th anniversary. To further highlight the special event will be the dedication of a life size sculpture of a young boy and his dog on the way to school - entitled "Late Again", created by Salado artist Troy Kelley.

All of this to begin with a band concert starting at 9:30 a.m. to be presented by members of the famed Fourth Infantry Division band under the baton of Salado's favorite band leader - Chief Warrant Officer Fred Catchings.

The concert and program will be held on the shaded west side of the civic center, according to Bob Cottle, President of the Civic Center Foundation and master of ceremonies for the morning program.

Former students and graduates of the old high school on Main Street will also be honored during the hour long program which will conclude with a catered meal to be served next to the bandstand on the south side of the civic center complex.

The featured speaker will be Morris Foster, President of Exxon Upstream Development Company,

and a graduate of the former high school. He will dedicate the sculpture, that he has donated to the civic center, in honor of his parents Wilbur and Jessie Foster, longtime Salado residents.

**FORMER STUDENTS BEING CONTACTED**

Patsy Sanford, a member of the board of directors of the Civic Center Foundation, is in charge of contacting former students and graduates of the Main Street High School. A committee headed by Sanford is working diligently to send word to as many former students as possible in hopes that a large number will be able to attend the program honoring the old school and have an opportunity to tour the renovated building that now houses the Salado Civic Center.

Following the program, a buffet type barbecue meal prepared by Lucye's Place will be offered to those in attendance. Cost per meal ticket will be \$5.00. Tickets are on sale starting today at the Civic Center business office or they may be purchased from members of the Board of Directors of the Civic Center.

**BUILDING SAVED BY SALADOANS**

The former school building that is being honored at the October 23, event was built in 1924 and opened its doors in September of that year. All grades were taught in the one building until it became a secondary school after the opening of the Thomas Arnold Elementary School.

The last class to graduate from the old school received their diplomas in May 1979. Students were then moved to the present high school in the fall of that year with the class of 1980 being the first to graduate from the present high school.

After the building was closed a number of ideas were considered for its use by the school board. Nothing was decided and in time and with massive roof leaks the boarded up building began to show its deteriorating age.

The school board considered selling the property but held off until finally in late 1991 a movement was started under the direction of the Salado Chamber of Commerce to try to renovate the old building and turn it into a civic center.

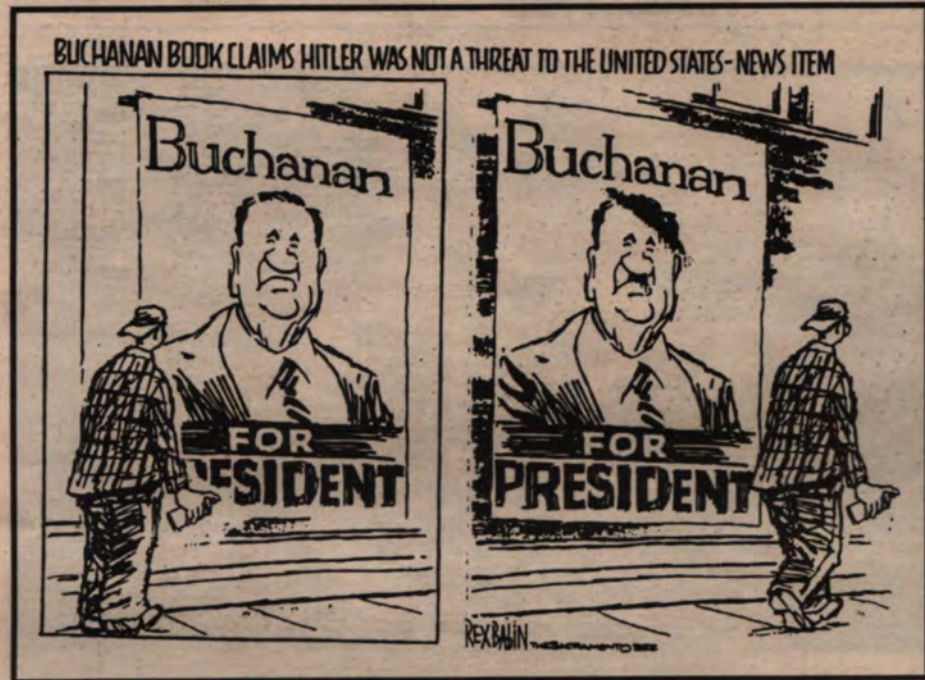

## Amendments to grant more power to Governor are discussed this week

**W**riter's Note: This is the third in a series of five articles describing the proposed Texas Constitutional Amendments that will be voted on Tuesday, November 2, 1999. This week we look at Amendments Eight through Eleven which take in the expansion of gubernatorial powers; creation of a judicial compensation commission plus permission to purchase insurance from mutual companies by the State.

### AMENDMENT 8: ADJUTANT GENERAL

Amendment Eight, should it pass, would increase the Governor's authority to appoint and/or remove the State's Adjutant General at the Governor's pleasure.

Currently, the Adjutant General in Texas commands the Air And Army National Guard Units under the jurisdiction of the Fifth Army Headquarters in San Antonio. This officer is appointed by the Governor for a two year term of office and has two assistants - one for air and one for the army.

To allow any Governor to have the authority to remove the top military officer in the State at any time there is a political or personal disagreement would harm the command structure of the guard as well as cause untold morale problems.

Texas Governors now serve four year terms which means that during a normal term the chief executive has two chances to name a new Adjutant General. Surely sufficient time to make changes without disrupting the military within the state.

Additionally, the Adjutant General must have sufficient independence to carry out the duties of the office without fear of immediate reprisal if a politically unpopular decision is made.

**It is recommended without reservation that Amendment Eight be defeated on November 2, 1999!**

### AMENDMENT 9: JUDICIAL PAY

Amendment Nine, if passed, would set up a new state commission designed to recommend to the Legislature a salary schedule for all State judges and justices of the Supreme Court, the Court of Criminal Appeals, other courts of appeals and the district courts.

At first blush it would appear that a commission of this type takes the power to appropriate funds away from the legislature and as such would not be a good idea.

However, since there is an appearance of a conflict of interest whenever lawmakers increase judge's salaries, due to the fact that legislator's retirement benefits are tied to judicial pay levels - it would appear a good idea to have an independent commission recommending these salaries.

Several additional facts need to be recognized at this point. First, and foremost, is the level of judicial salaries in Texas. Way below that of other states thus causing retention problems particularly for district level jurists.

Second and even more on point is that lawmakers hate to increase judicial salaries since there are always immediate repercussions from the media and the public about "feathering their own nests" which in this case would be the lawmaker's retirement benefits.

The Judicial Compensation Commission would include a majority of non legal persons and their recommendations would be just that - a recommendation to the legislature. Lawmakers could say "no" if they felt the pay hikes out of line and this would eliminate the appearance of a self serving conflict of interest.

On the basis of this background, the

amendment makes sense and helps solve a legislative-judicial financial and political problem and should be considered favorably.

**Recommend passage of Amendment Nine.**

### AMENDMENT 10: POWER GRAB

Amendment Ten, if approved, would give the Governor of the State of Texas the power to remove at his pleasure, the Commissioner of Health and Human Services.

Another example - exactly like the plan to have the Adjutant General serve at a governor's whim - of giving the Governor increased authority over the operation of a state agency.

Health and Human Services - second largest state agency in size and scope after education - handles billions of dollars and serves tens of thousands of Texans each year. The commissioner of this far flung agency serves a two year term - appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. Again, it gives a governor two chances during a single term to appoint a person of his liking without disrupting a huge agency by arbitrarily removing the top executive at will.

Like the Adjutant General, the commissioner of Health and Human Services has to have enough independence to handle his job without fear of immediate reprisal for politically unpopular decisions.

Two years is a short enough term for the commissioner and should satisfy even the most power hungry of Governors. We strongly recommend that this power grab, that the originators of the Texas Constitution feared, be turned down.

**Recommend defeat of Amendment Ten!**

### AMENDMENT 11: INSURANCE

Under current law, it is not permissible for the State of Texas to purchase property and casualty insurance from a mutual insurance company since this violates the constitutional prohibition that keeps the state from becoming a stockholder in a corporation or association.

Insurance for health, life and accident protection is permitted to be purchased from mutual companies by the State provided there is a "nonassessable" clause in the policy. This was approved in an amendment passed in 1986. All amendment eleven does is to extend this permission to the purchase of property and casualty policies.

Mutual insurance companies are some of the largest property and casualty companies in Texas so permission to buy from them allows the state to have a wider range to select from thus hopefully lowering the cost of insurance.

Arguments against this amendment declare that no matter how the insurance policy is worded - that purchase of a mutual company insurance plan makes the State a stockholder.

Those who disagree note that "nonassessability" prevents the State or any governmental subdivision of the state from being involved liability-wise in the operation of a mutual company.

**Recommend passage of Amendment Eleven.**

## History of Dominoes through the ages

A religious loophole helped create the domino game of 42. The game started in 1887 in a tiny place called Trappe Spring, between Weatherford and Mineral Wells. That little hamlet is now called Garner, named\* for Ab Bumgarner, a gin operator.

In those days, strong religious beliefs controlled the moral climate of such communities. Baptists were the law and card-playing was the devil's work. But if you want someone to do something, especially kids, tell them it's against the rules.

Two young boys in Trappe Spring, 12 year old William Thomas and 14 year old Walter Earl liked to play cards. They found the game of dominoes (legal in Baptist circles) boring. The two boys often hid in the hayloft and played cards. One day they were caught by one of their parents. The other three parents were summoned, the cards were burned and the boys were spanked.

But William and Walker, being the clever boys they were, set out to change things. They didn't try to rewrite the Baptist rules. They simply reached a creative solution. If dominoes were okay, why not play cards with dominoes?

For about four months, they revised and fine-tuned the rules for a card game with dominoes. It was

called 42. For the boys, it meant they could play unmolested. No more haylofts. No more whippings.

They taught the game to their families, friends and neighbors and before long 42 became a popular game around Trappe Spring. William delivered fruit from his father's orchard to nearby Mineral Wells and he taught the people there how to play 42. Later the Thomases and Earls moved to Fannin County in northeast Texas and introduced the game there. The game spread like wildfire. During World War II, Texas military men taught the game to their fellow troops and the game went world wide.

The oldest domino sets date from 1120 AD. They appear to be a Chinese invention. They were apparently derived from dice, which was introduced into China from India. Each domino originally represented one of the 21 results of throwing two dice. One half of the tile is set with the dots from one die and the

other half contains dots from the second die. Chinese domino tiles are made of wood, ivory or bone. They are called "bone tablets" in China. Over time, Chinese dominoes evolved into the tile set used to play Mah Jong.

Dominoes made their way to Europe in the early 18th century, making their first appearance in Italy. In doing so, the game changed. Seven additional dominoes were added. One is completely blank. Six of those are half blank with the resulting numbers from throwing a single die on the other half. Perhaps this was done for symmetry's sake so each of the resulting suits would contain seven tiles.

The word domino derives from the Latin dominus (lord). In the 16th century the word was used to denote a priest's black and white cloak. The name came to be applied to the game through the custom of calling "faire domino" when winning with the last piece.

In times like these, when we so often only hear of the bad in mankind, it is so very refreshing and heartwarming to see truly caring people share their time, their money and their goodwill for the children of their community. 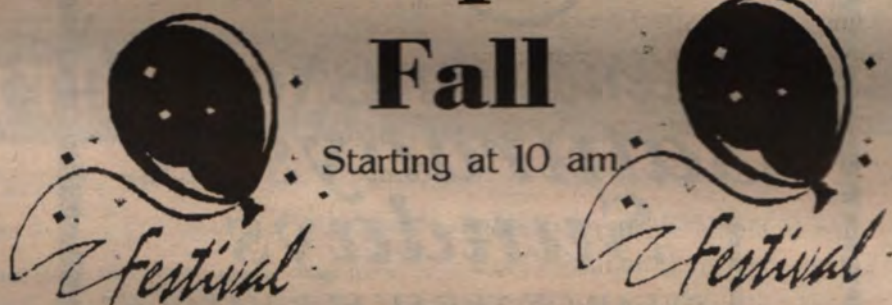

# Youths burglarize concession stand

Bell County Sheriff's Deputies arrested three suspects for burglarizing the concession stand at the Salado High School football field 1:30 a.m. Oct. 8.

Two adult males and one juvenile male were arrested at the scene and transported to the Bell County Jail. The juvenile was transported to the Juvenile Detention Center in Killeen.

The suspects arrested for burglary of a building were these: a 16-year-old Hispanic juvenile who resides in Salado; Juan Jimenez, an 18-year-old Hispanic male who resides in Salado; and Benjamin O'Neill, a 17-year-old White male who resides in Salado.

As of presstime, two of the suspects remain in the Bell County Jail, pending arraignment by the Justice of the Peace. The juvenile suspect remains in the Juvenile Detention Center

in Killeen pending juvenile procedure.

While on routine patrol in the Salado area, a sheriff's deputy observed a van parked behind the High School stadium. As the patrol car approached the van, a white male who was standing near the stadium

seats began running across the football field.

The deputy discovered another (juvenile) inside the van and, upon further investigation, determined that the concession stand had been burglarized.

Several items taken from inside the concession stand

were recovered from the suspect's van.

The offense of Burglary of a Building is classified as a State Felony, punishable by confinement in a state jail for a term of six months to two years. A fine of not more than \$10,000 may also be assessed.

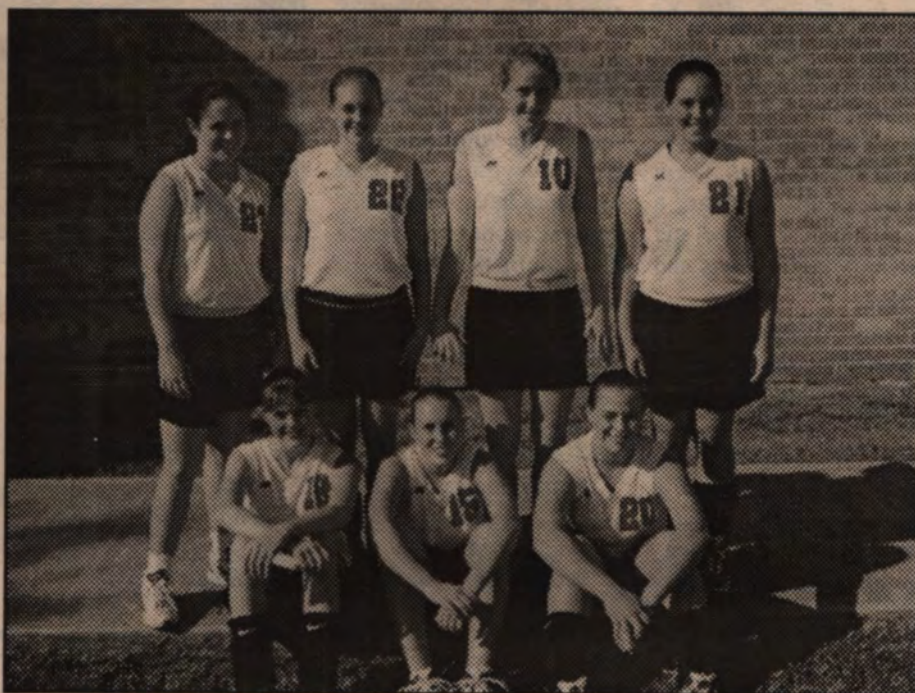

Academy broke the ice on the second play of the second quarter. After a 28 yard gain off a pass from Michael Schoepf to Paul Lucas, Schoepf dropped back and fired it over the middle only for it to be picked off by defensive end, Jeremy Lanig who returned it 44 yards for the touchdown. Garrett Reddehase, Academy's quarterback, ran a keeper up the middle for the 2 point conversion to make the score 0-8 in favor of Academy.

Salado started with great field position after Chris Ray's kickoff return to the 41 yard line. Salado drove the ball 44 yards to get inside the redzone. Salado came up empty handed and once again turned the ball over on downs.

After Academy's 11 yard drive, they punted to start the Eagles at their own 46. Here, Schoepf showed the value of his right arm.

With 3:22 left in the half, Schoepf dropped back, curled to his right and let go a throw that hit Rory

Oldham in the numbers to pick up 54 yards, as well as Salado's first score. Schoepf was sacked on the 2 point conversion try. The score was now 6-8, Academy.

Academy went three and out on their drive to give Salado the ball with 1:10 left in the half. Salado began on their own 27 and progressed to their 44.

With 20 ticks left on the clock, the Salado Eagles pulled an early trick out of their Halloween trick-or-treat bag.

Schoepf first received the snap out of the shotgun formation, then passed it laterally to Chris Ray, who then found the wide open Paul Lucas for the 56 yard touchdown. The 2 point conversion failed. Salado went into intermission up by 4, 12-8.

Academy opened the second half with a 77 yard scoring drive. The drive which lasted 4 minutes and 43 seconds ended on a 5 yard touchdown run by Aaron Presley around the right side. Erick Rodriques tacked on the extra point to put Academy ahead 12-15.

The rest of the third

quarter was a defensive battle with each team holding the other team on their own side of the field.

Salado received the ball for the first time in the fourth with 11:06 left in the game. They began on Academy's 41 and moved the ball 21 yards before being held on 4th down with 5 to go. Salado's defense again held Academy to 3 plays before having to punt to give Salado the ball back on Salado's own 40 yard line with 5:51 left.

On the first play of the drive, the snap was long on what seemed to be team miscommunication. Academy recovered the errant snap with only 37 yards between them and the endzone, converting on the flea flicker.

Academy ran out the clock on their last possession making 3 first downs and gaining 57 yards, enough to seal the win and give Salado a district loss.

Salado's overall record falls to 3-3 and their District record starts out at 0-1.

Salado travels to Holland Oct. 15 for the second District game. Kick off is 7:30 p.m.

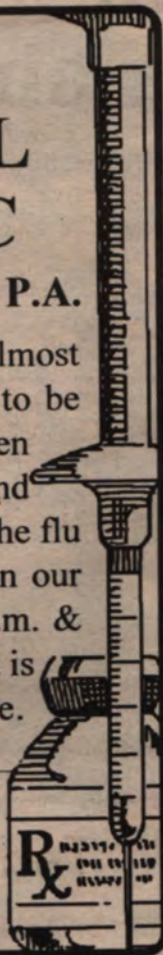

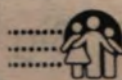

# Tips given for making Halloween trick or treating more about treats, less about tricks

Many parents get spooked when pint-sized ghosts and goblins begin their Halloween trick-or-treating expeditions. Make your home ghost-friendly for all those trick-or-treaters for Halloween this Oct. 31. Otherwise, the evening can pose special hazards for young tricksters and scare the daylight out of parents.

"Halloween is a fun holiday for children, but it can be a devilish experience when accidents happen. A little planning will go a long way in preventing holiday hardships," said Michael C. Smith, M.D., pediatrician at the Scott & White Clinic, Waco, and assistant professor with The Texas A&M University System Health Science Center College of Medicine.

If you expect a gaggle of space aliens and princesses to haunt your neighborhood on Halloween night, make sure your yard is free of hazards, he suggested. "With a little foresight, Halloween can be a safe and enjoyable holiday for both children and parents alike," Dr. Smith said.

\* Remove obstacles in the yard, such as hoses, sprinklers, lawn furniture and potted plants. Turn your porch light on to let children know they're welcome.

\* Keep lighted jack-o'-lanterns or candles away from the steps of the front door. A child's costume could possibly brush

against the open flame and catch fire.

\* Pets, especially dogs, may become agitated with so many visitors. Keep your pets indoors or out of harm's way for a few hours.

\* Treats don't have to be full of sugar and fat. Consider giving healthy treats such as boxes of raisins, prepackaged granola bars and sugar-free bubble gum. Some families give away pencils and colorful erasers for school instead of candy.

### Obey traffic rules

Parents should emphasize traffic safety rules before their children's nighttime trek. "In the excitement of Halloween, some children forget the rules they have learned about crossing streets. Encourage youngsters to remember the traffic rules. Stress that they must obey the traffic lights - even on Halloween," Dr. Smith said. These rules include:

\* Travel with a group and walk on sidewalks or close to the curb.

\* Start trick-or-treating early while it's still light. Give each child a flashlight to carry no matter what the lighting.

\* Use seat belts and child safety seats while driving. In their excitement to go trick-or-treating, children may forget to buckle up. Parents should not let their children hang on the back of pick-up trucks and ride on bumpers.

\* Parents should accompany children on their haunting journeys or enlist the aid of a responsible older sibling who can serve as an escort.

\* Instruct children to go to only lighted homes and to avoid houses where lights are turned off.

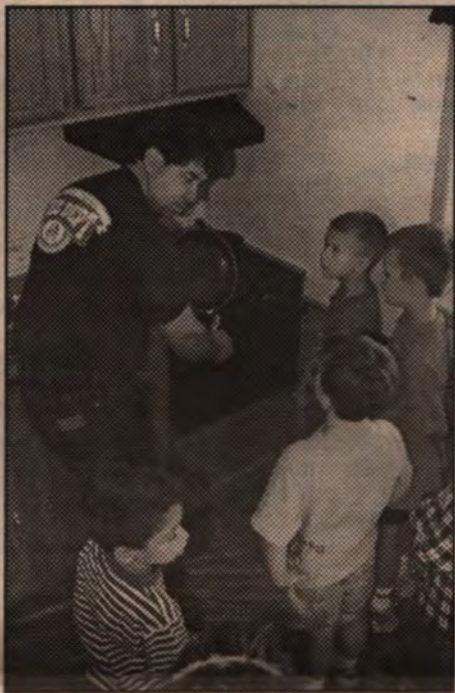

## Silence behind gunfire in our inner cities

Alex Kotlowitz discussed the silence behind the nightly gunfire in our country's inner cities during his lecture before the Institute for the Humanities at Salado Oct. 10.

He said two types of silence lie behind the every day violence and poverty of inner city America: institutional silence and the silence of self-preservation.

Kotlowitz is the award-winning author whose book *There Are No Children Here: The Story of Growing Up in the Other America*, has been hailed to be one of the most important social statements in recent memory.

Kotlowitz lived with two boys and their mother in Henry Horner in the projects of Chicago. The two young boys experience during those two years is a compelling call-to-action for the inner cities, where one of every two black families lives in poverty.

Kotlowitz' book opens on a summer afternoon in

1987 when Pharoah and Lafayette decide to go hunting for snakes with four other boys.

A suburban commuter train passes by and the boys dive for the closest cover, "because they have heard that the commuters shoot at city people from the windows of the train," Kotlowitz said.

Ironically, the suburban commuter train's windows are silhouetted because of fear of the inner city residents shooting at the train.

"That chasm is indeed wide and deep," he said of the fear running between inner city and suburban residents. "So wide and so deep that suburban commuters and urban children are fearful of any contact at all."

"The state of our urban children is the most pressing issue today," he said. "They are our future. Walk through streets of inner cities and you can see our future: a young black male has more chance of being killed in the inner city than a young soldier did on a tour of duty in Vietnam."

Recalling Mother Theresa's words, Kotlowitz discussed the "poverty of the pocketbook and the poverty of the spirit" prevalent in the inner city.

In places like Henry Horner you see the "breakdown and unraveling of a community. You see a community in which neighbors not only distrusted outsiders like myself, but a community in which neighbors distrusted neighbors."

A fundamental reason for the breakdown of the community in inner cities, Kotlowitz said, is the disappearance of work. "Eighty-eight percent of all poor families do not have a family member who works," he said.

Work builds a community in two ways: first, by bringing money into it; second, and perhaps more importantly, by bringing order and meaning into it.

"Work is the thread holds family and community together," he said. "Work gives us a sense of order, a sense of purpose, a sense of belonging, a sense of identity. Without work,

you begin to lose all that."

The absence of work in the inner cities leads to the absence of institutions most Americans take for granted.

"At Henry Horner, there were no banks, only currency exchanges," he said, adding that "these neighborhoods are void of the very type of institutions which help build community."

Inner cities not only suffer from economic isolation, but spiritual and geographic isolation.

Public housing, which was intended to provide adequate housing at affordable rates, has instead become "a barrier between black and white communities."

The inner city also suffers from the silence in reaction to the poverty and violence.

"Institutional silence surrounds children like Lafayette and Pharoah," he said. "It is the inability of institutions to serve these children's needs."

Kotlowitz contrasted the

Slice tomatoes about 1 1/4-inch thick, season with salt and pepper; coat each side with cornmeal. In a large skillet, heat enough bacon drippings to coat the bottom of the pan, and fry tomatoes until lightly browned on both sides.

As served at the Whistle Stop Cafe. You'll think you died and went to heaven!

**Antiques...Antiques... & More Antiques**

**Q:** I recently bought a dovetailed blanket chest made of black walnut. Mounted on the inside of the chest, on the right side, is a small box with a lid. What was the box used for?

**A:** The small built-in container in your chest is called a till. It was a common feature in blanket chests that were made here and in Europe. The till was usually mounted on the left side of the chest. The lid of the till was held with two dowels. When the lid was opened, it swung up and could prop open the larger chest lid. Tills were intended to store jewelry, money and other small items.

**Q:** I found a Hindenburg postcard in my parents' attic. There's a black-and-white drawing of the famous zeppelin and a paragraph about its first flight. One sentence says, "This card was carried on the Hindenburg on its initial flight from Friedrichshafen to

Lakehurst, N.J." Is the postcard worth anything?

**A:** Old postcards are collectibles. Yours pictures the German dirigible that made 10 successful round trips across the Atlantic Ocean in 1936. On May 6, 1937, while landing at Lakehurst Naval Air Station in New Jersey on the first of its scheduled trips that year, the hydrogen-inflated Hindenburg burst into flames. Thirty-six of the 97 people aboard died.

**Q:** What is a "ribbon doll?"

**A:** Ribbon dolls were sold as household craft kits during the 1940s and '50s. The kits usually included a paper doll on a black background, with yards of ribbon to be sewn as the doll's clothes. The kits were made by two companies, Bucilla Corp. of Hazleton, PA and Dol-Lee Dolls of Wollaston, Mass. Collectors like to buy unopened kits, which sell for only a few dollars, or finished and framed dolls, which are priced from \$25 to \$60

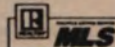

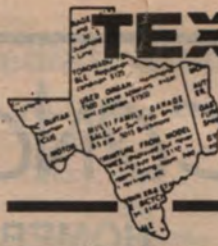

different ways communities react to outbreaks of violence. In middle class communities, children who have been exposed to explosive violence receive counseling immediately.

"But there are no counselors for the children who live with violence every day," he said.

"This is the kind of institutional silence in the inner cities," he said.

Another kind of silence in the inner cities is of those who live there, a type of silence that reinforces the belief that "If I don't talk about it, it never happened."

This is the kind of silence which causes nine and 10 year olds to suffer from post traumatic stress.

"Part of the reason for their silence is the thought that who would believe them?" he said.

To make any progress toward order in the inner

city, "We have to start listening again," Kotlowitz said. "We have to start hearing. We have to start telling their stories."

"Stories agitate. They provoke. They force us to look at ourselves in the world a little differently," he said.

We not only have to start listening to their stories, but we have to start taking action. "In the absence of private investing. In the absence of private employment, we need to provide a type of public works program," he said, adding that it will help to rebuild not only the infrastructure of the communities but help to build the skills necessary in the marketplace of labor.

America will also have to look hard at the issue of race if it wants to address the problems in inner cities.

"Until we deal with race," he said, "we cannot deal with poverty."

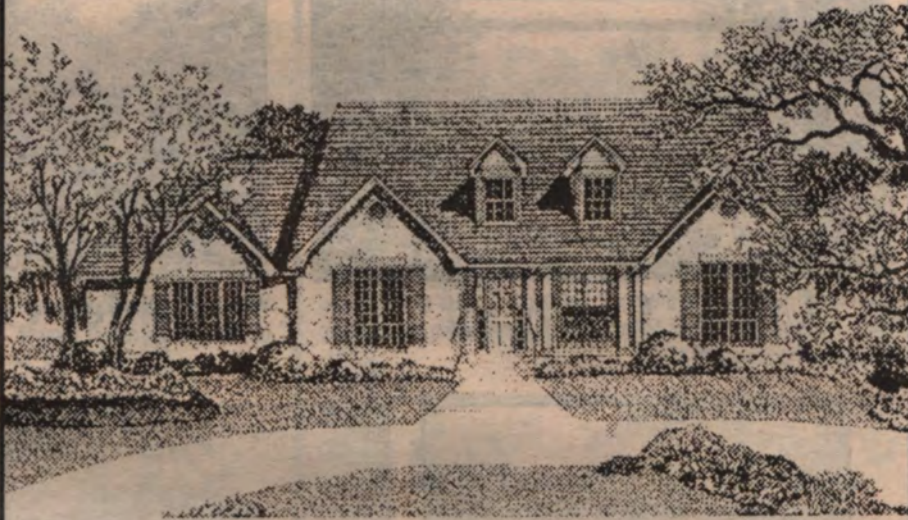

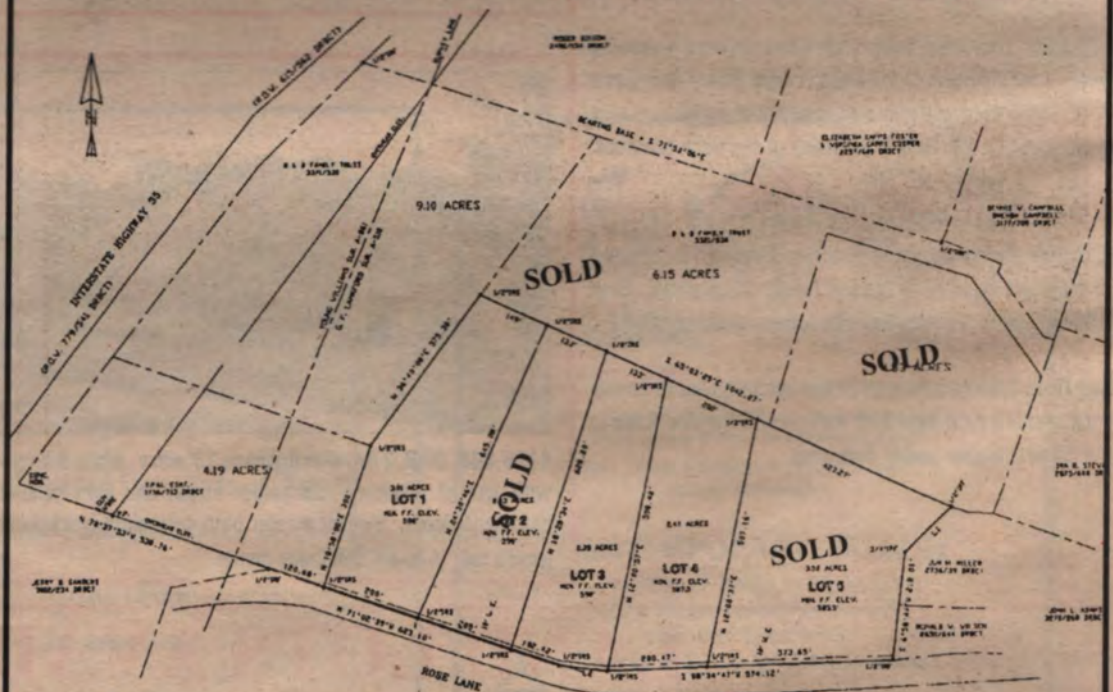
