## SISD to name finalists for sup't this week

After interviewing semi-finalists for Salado ISD Superintendent, the Board of Trustees will announce the list of finalists this week.

According to Paul Fleming, educational consultant directing the search for a new superintendent, the list of finalists should be announced March 5, following a board meeting 7 p.m. March 4.

During the executive session board meeting, trustees will narrow the list to a handful or less of candidates for a second round of interviews.

Trustees interviewed about eight semi-finalists during the past two weeks, with interviews

lasting almost two hours.

The second round of interviews is scheduled to follow Spring Break. It will be more intensive, according to Dr. Fleming, who said that finalists will likely "visit the campus and meet faculty before meeting again with the board that night."

When the list is narrowed to one, a committee of the board will visit that candidate's school district as part of a thorough background search, according to Dr. Fleming.

After naming the finalists March 5, the earliest the board can name its choice for superintendent is March 26.

## Half-dozen models on auction block

The handmade and highly prized collectibles are being donated to the Fifth Annual Civic Center Auction slated for March 7, with the pre-auction meal set for 6 p.m. and the bidding to begin promptly at 7 p.m., at the elementary school cafeteria.

Mrs. Foster was a member of the first Board of Directors of the Civic Center Foundation that operates the renovated school building that is now the center of the village's activities. She and Wilbur have contributed a wide variety of collectible wagons, stagecoaches, surreys and buggies to the auction in past years.

This year will be the first time that a new item will be added to the line of transportation models - an early 1900 model automobile.

Shown above are the six recently completed Foster "specials" that will go under the auctioneer's gavel this Saturday (from left): cross-country stagecoach, heavy duty wagon, doctor's surrey, a conestoga wagon that Wilbur noted was the forerunner of today's recreational vehicles (only without the recreation part insofar as the early settlers were concerned) and at the far right, a wagon filled with watermelons on the way to market.

The hand carved Model T Ford truck held by the Fosters in the picture above is one of the new line of turn-of-the-century autos that have been added to the Foster's list of collectible models that have been sold across the state and nation and can be found in the offices of a number of chief executives of Fortune 500 companies.

A grand total of 25 hand crafted models, highlighting early days of our transportation history, have been contributed by Jessie and Wilbur Foster, over the past five years to the civic center's auction.

## Civic Center auction gavels March 7

The 1998 Annual Civic Center Auction is a scant three days away and from the number of donations of auctionable items arriving hourly at the center, this year's fund raising auction should rank among the very best, according to a report from auction chairman Patsy Sanford.

The March 7 auction begins with a pre-auction meal starting at 6 p.m., with the sale scheduled for a prompt 7 p.m. kickoff that will have one of the state's premier auctioneers in charge - Salado's own Bill Hall.

The meal and auction will be held in the Thomas Arnold Elementary School cafeteria.

Tickets for the pre-auction feast, being prepared by the Clem Mikeska restaurant are being sold at a rapid clip according to Lloyd Parks, chairman of that phase of the annual event.

"We are holding back a limited number of tickets for sale at the door, but buying the meal ticket in advance is the best plan," noted chairman Parks.

Tickets are on sale for \$7.50 each at the Civic Center Business Office, Compass Bank, Salado and the Salado First State Bank.

The meal will consist of three types of meat including sirloin beef, chicken and sau-

sage. The supper will feature cole slaw, potato salad, beans onions, pickles, homemade bread, ice tea with the meal topped off with a dessert of the famous brownies created at Cathy's Boardwalk Cafe.

### PROCEEDS TO GO TOWARDS NEW ROOF

All proceeds from this year's auction will go towards replacing the roof at the Civic Center, according to Ken Clapp, chairman of the board of directors of the foundation that operates and maintains the renovated school building.

"It is regrettable that this work was not done properly

## World champion hog caller

You really ought to meet Roxanne Ward. She calls hogs. She can make the most god-awful grunts and snorts and yells that can be heard for miles. She has called hogs from the moon roof of a limousine on 5th Avenue in New York City for a late night television show. She gets calls in the middle of the night from radio stations halfway around the world wanting her to call hogs on the air live. She does it gladly. Roxanne loves show biz.

She is the world champion hog caller and will sell you a video that teaches you how to call hogs.

She repeats the call a couple of times. If you're on a farm with pigs running wild, watch out. They're going to come to Roxanne. She thinks that's pretty amazing.

Roxanne, who lives near Littlefield, says there's a story behind her hog calling. "I was raised on hog farms," she says. "I'm the oldest of four girls and pigs listen to me better than my sisters, so I spent a lot of time in the hog pen."

She owns a pot bellied pig. "His name is Oscar Mayer," says Roxanne. "No, that's not what you think. He has a future. He's not going to grow up to be a weenie."

She has perfected her art to an extremely high level. The

World Championship Hog Calling contest is held at Weatherford, Oklahoma and she has won it twice. "I've entered other hog calling contests, too, and have won every single one I've entered," says Roxanne.

She practices every day. "It's a good thing I live in the country, 'cause I call every morning and every night. I've spent a lot of time in pig pens in my life. My parents never did have to worry about where I was. They knew I was out with the pigs."

These days she's bringing home some bacon with her hog calling. In addition to her videos that she sells, she is getting paid to make appearances all over the country.

Since she turned pro, she has flown in her first airplane, ridden in her first limousine, had her first cappuccino (she didn't like it), got her first glimpse of an ocean, and has become a celebrity. She is recognized in airports and people ask for her autograph.

Roxanne has never met a stranger and likes to make people laugh. She loves to visit and will sit down and talk to anybody.

Her bank in Littlefield has recognized her celebrity status. The bank supplied her with checks that have the phrase "World Champion Hog Caller" printed beneath her name.

"I really don't care what people think," says Roxanne. "But you know what? A lot of people like hog calling."

Maybe they just like the person doing the calling.

## Where in this Land of Democracy does theory of majority rule not apply?

**QUESTION:** Where in this great land of Democracy does the theory of majority-rule not function properly?

**ANSWER:** In the United States Senate!

**CASE IN POINT:** On Thursday, February 26, 1998, a majority of 51 U. S. Senators (out of a total of 100 such worthies) voted in favor of shutting down a Republican filibuster in order to vote for the first honest campaign finance reform bill in recent memory. The group voting "aye" included 45 Democrats and six Republicans.

The majority failed to close the filibuster thus keeping them from voting on the bill, which in turn killed a needed piece of legislation for this session.

The proposed law, that was causing the filibuster, was the McCain-Feingold bill that would, in large measure, have placed solid restrictions on "soft" money contributions from corporations and unions in all federal elections.

John McCain (R-Arizona) and Russell Feingold (D-Wisconsin) had put together the finance reform plan and secured the first Senate bi-partisan majority in months which included all of the Democrats in the Senate plus enough Republicans to create what should have been enough to pass the measure - 51 out of 100 votes.

This bill (Feingold-McCain) was the first swipe at trying to control the scandalous behavior and obscene amounts of money grubbing involving both parties during 1996 that eventually led to the multi-million dollar Senate investigation, chaired by the hapless GOPman, Fred Thompson, who along with his rag-tag committee crew, uncovered just how many ways there are of getting around current campaign finance rules and

regulations.

**Back to the vote last Thursday** - it was necessary for the working majority of 51 Senators, in order to get to vote on the proposed finance reforms, to overcome the ancient three-fifths senate rule needed to shut off the GOP filibuster. In this case, 48 Republicans - a minority of Senators, voted against the majority's plot to close down the blabbering and the bill died.

**Texas' senators Kay Bailey Hutchison and Phil Gramm voted with senate majority leader Trent Lott to kill the planned reform measure, based on some sort of strange GOPthink that ties free speech to unfettered donations given to secure special treatment, privileges and protection.**

All of this flummoxing by Republicans in the upper house has denied what the American public has been hollering for the past two decades - namely a handle placed on the huge amounts of money handed around to both parties in order to secure, from Congress and the White House, favors the rest of us are denied.

The discouraging part of this **scruffy chronicle**, played out by our elected officials, is that **the American public is not even surprised** to see this, or any other needed reform, fail.

We have little or no confidence in our representatives in Congress and only a bit more for our pooh-bahs in Austin - so it comes as no shock when these men and women sent to represent us, fail to produce even the simplest piece of legislation that would be but a first step on the long campaign fi-

nance reform trail.

In reality, most of our lawmakers have one overriding aim - to be reelected to their cushy sinecures - so why rock the boat, even when it springs a leak and needs reform.

What a sad commentary on our representative form of government. And even sadder to try to explain to young people that a majority does not always rule, even in a great Democracy such as ours.

Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich recently sent this writer a personal letter asking for opinions on how well the GOPers were doing thus far in the congressional session.

**First question was: "How much can you contribute to the GOP so we can process your answers?"**

This plethora of nationwide instant millionaire announcements reached a true plateau of nonsense when newspapers reported that several older folks took their notification letters, from a magazine peddling scheme that had declared them winners (complete with usual fine print provisos), boarded a plane and proudly presented themselves to a company in Florida that had mailed out the good/bad-news letters.

End result was a lot of snickering but later, several consumer rights groups banded together and apparently sued some of these big "contest" jokers in federal court under laws that presumably prohibit this sort of scamming.

Some say the rule of "caveat emptor" should apply. Others think that the method of "tease" announcements with fine-print exclusions, designed to hawk magazines or knick-knacks, is so shamefully misleading that it needs to either be stopped or at the very least, presented in a way that gullible hopes are not raised and truth in advertising takes the place of the "buyer beware" theory so prevalent in these mass mailings.

**Pastor, civic activist to lecture on church role in crisis of civil society**

Jim Wallis, founder of Sojourners Community in inner-city Washington, D.C., and editor-in-chief of "Sojourners" magazine, will make presentations in Salado, March 7-8.

Wallis will launch the spring series on "Civility" of the Institute for the Humanities at Salado. Subsequent speakers will be University of Texas Professor Betty Sue Flowers (March 21-22), Smith College President Ruth J. Simmons (April 4-5), and Dean of Grace Cathedral, San Francisco, Alan Jones (April 18-19).

On March 7, Wallis will lead a seminar in the Gathering Room at Halley House on Main Street, 10 a.m.-3:30 p.m., on "Doing Justice and Healing Your Soul." On March 8, he will speak at 4 p.m. at the Mill Creek on "The Role of the Church in the Crisis of Civil Society." His lecture will be followed by discussion and a buffet dinner.

Jim Wallis' books include "The Soul of Politics" and "Who Speaks for God? An Alternative to the Religious Right." As a pastor, civic activist and peacemaker, his

work has taken him to South Africa, Nicaragua, the Persian Gulf, and gang peace summits across the United States. Based in Washington, D.C., Sojourners Community is actively involved in community development. Sojourners Neighborhood Center sponsors tutoring and mentoring programs, a summer Freedom School, and parental support activities.

"In his writings and in his work, Jim Wallis is making very important connections between religious faith and social engagement, between

theology and civic action, and between spirituality and politics," said Jim Veninga, president of the Institute.

Veninga noted that the "Civility" series responded to growing public concern about the state of morality and ethics. "The public is concerned about a declining sense of community in our nation, a withering away of healthy bonds that fortify ethical be-

havior, that bring people together, that enhance our ability to act on the basis of commonly shared values and

goals."

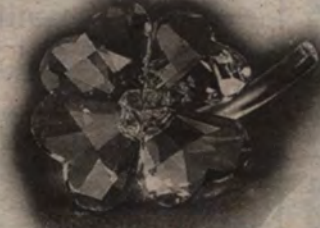

## Dr. McConnell discusses Library District election slated for May 2 with Salado Lions

The president of the Salado Library Board told the Salado Lions Club about a special election that could have a major impact on the library's growth.

Dr. Bob McConnell talked about the library in general and the May 2 election in particular, during the Lions' Feb. 25 luncheon at Mill Creek Country Club.

He followed up his talk with a question-and-answer session in which some Lions voiced concern over the future funding of the library, particularly if Salado incorporates.

As things stand now, McConnell said, the library is funded through donations and contributions. No tax money is involved.

That will change if voters on May 2 approve a plan to allow a half-cent sales tax to help fund the library.

"Let me put it into perspective," McConnell said. "If you bought a meal (at a local restaurant) for \$6, that meal would cost you three cents more."

And, McConnell explained, if you spend a thousand dollars a year in Salado on taxable

items, it would cost you five dollars over and above your present taxes, from \$67.50 to \$72.50.

One hundred percent of the taxes would go toward the library. McConnell said the State Comptroller's Office estimates that the one-half cent tax would generate approximately \$75,000. It's also his understanding, from talking with merchants, that approximately 75 percent of the local sales tax is generated from tourists and not local residents.

Items not taxed are grocer-

ies, gas, prescription drugs, professional services and lodging.

Should the tax be approved, money would not be collected until October and not dispersed until January 1999.

The sales tax is currently 6 3/4. The half-cent addition would increase it to 7 1/4. The maximum allowable is 8 1/4.

McConnell estimates that two-thirds of the expected \$75,000 generated from taxes (\$50,000-\$60,000) would go toward librarian salaries. Current library director Patty Campbell would be hired as one of three part-time librarians, Jean Teal and Pat Milford being the others.

McConnell estimates that, with salaries, the library's operating budget would increase from \$25,000-\$30,000 to \$80,000-\$90,000.

"Friends of the Library" benefits such as the April dinner dance and the August book fair would continue to be held to help with the difference.

McConnell said the library, located on the first floor of the Civic Center on Main Street,

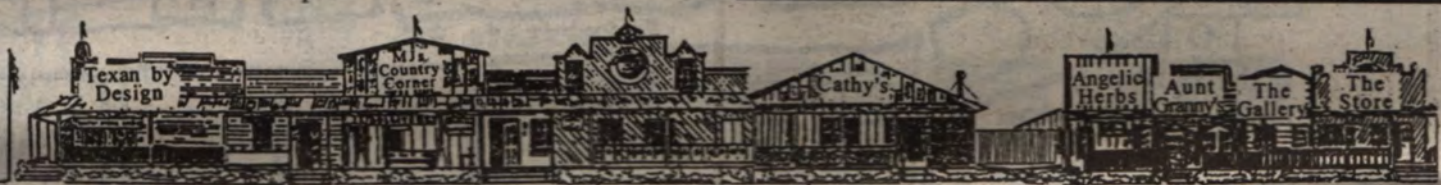

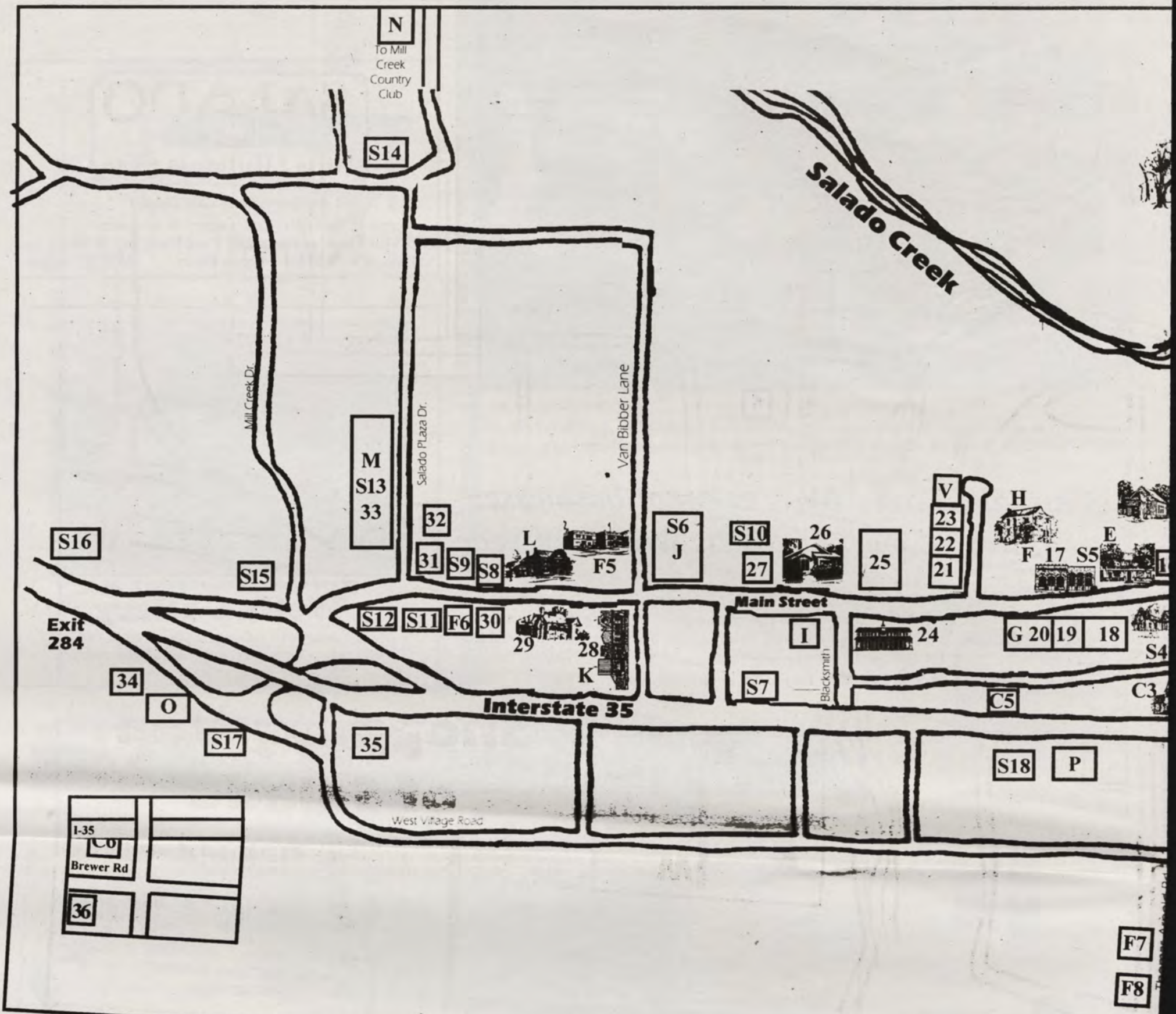

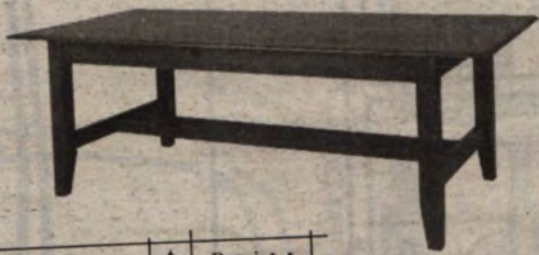

## Salado teachers present seminar at Space Station Conference

Salado teachers Betty Gregurek and Terry Summers joined 320 educators throughout the world who attended the Fourth Annual International Space Station Educators Conference last month in Houston. Not only did the two attend the seminar, but they presented a session on "Technology, TEKS and SPACE."

Gregurek is the Technology Coordinator and GT Teacher for grades K-6.

Summers is the sixth grade Science and Social Studies teacher.

The conference provides educators with the latest, accurate knowledge about the International Space Station," said Patricia Tribe, Director of Education, Space Center Houston. "It also is a forum for the participants to learn how to use space as a theme in teaching concepts with existing classroom curriculum."

The conference included a tour of the full-scale ISS mock-ups on site NASA's Johnson Space Center; a trip to the Neutral Buoyancy Laboratory, where astronauts train and practice for ISS missions; and a tour of the Boeing Flight Equipment Processing Laboratory, where personnel test, clean, repair, package and ship astronaut equipment for use during each mission.

Teachers also were introduced to the new Educator Resource Center, where teachers throughout the world can obtain a wide variety of curricula for all grade levels and subjects, as well as access outside resources to help instructors in the classroom.

Guest speakers included Randy Brinkley, NASA Program Manager for the International Space Station; Ginger Barnes, ISS Program Manager, Boeing; Astronaut Kevin Chilton, who served as the commander of STS-76, the third docking mission to the Russian space station Mir; and Astronaut William Shepherd, who is scheduled to be the first astronaut to work aboard the ISS.

Teachers from 30 states, as well as educators from British Columbia, Japan and Canada, participated in numerous hands-on, interactive sessions, such as constructing their own space suit, building a space station model and preparing astronaut food.

The International Space Station Educators Conference was sponsored by NASA/Johnson Space Center, Southwest Airlines, Space Center Houston, and Boeing.

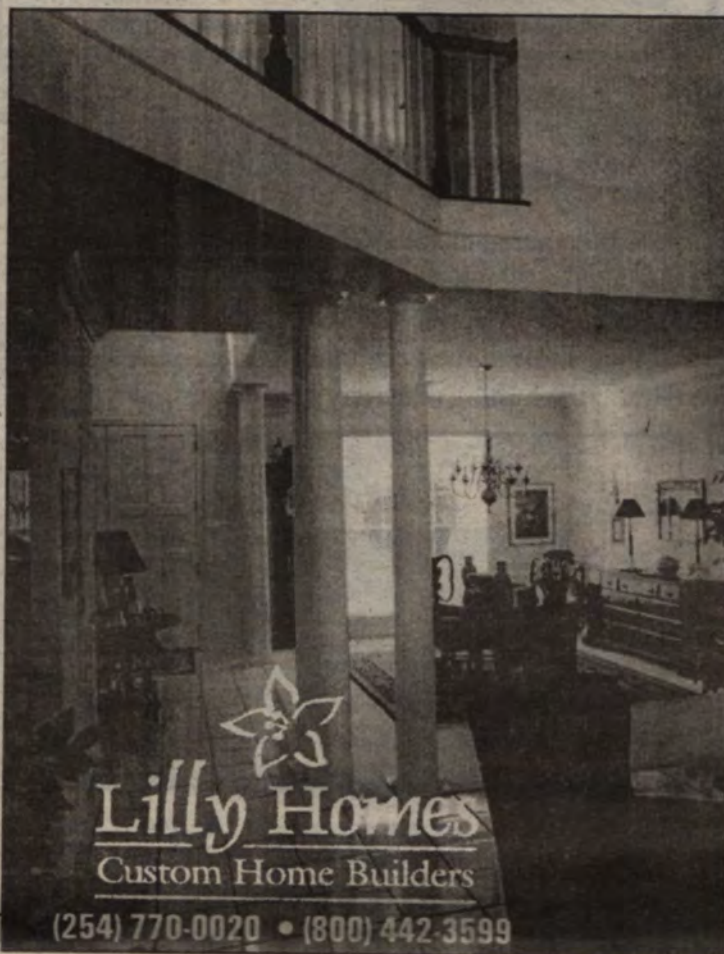

has less book space, staff and circulation than libraries in similar-sized communities.

"We're putting books horizontally on the shelves instead of vertically, and also on the top and bottom shelves, which probably does not comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act," McConnell said.

The library was previously housed in a portion of Old Town Salado along Stagecoach Road. When it moved to its current site, space increased from 900 square feet to 1,650 square feet and rent doubled to \$605 monthly, McConnell said.

For a new library building to be built, Salado would have to qualify for a matching grant.

As for the aforementioned subject of future funding of the library if Salado becomes incorporated, McConnell attempted to explain that the library district and a city government (should incorporation occur) would be separate entities.

After the meeting, he said that voters could vote -- if they wish -- to abolish the library district if incorporation occurred. The city government could then decide to fund the library, if it wanted.

He stressed, however, that in either case, "If the library is not

supported by the community, then you shouldn't have one."

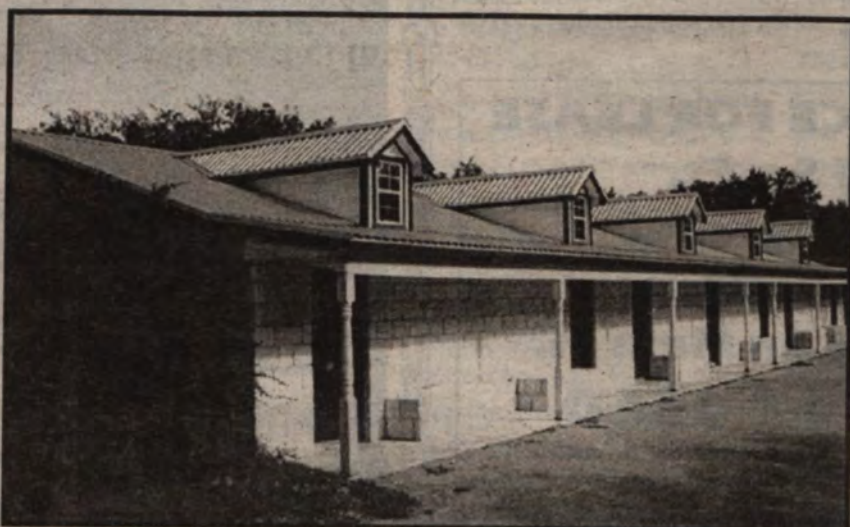

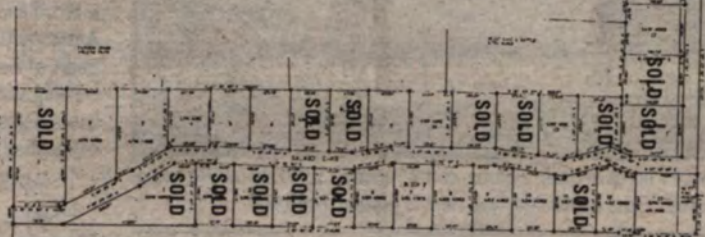
