The growing of herbal plants is a rich and varied pastime. They can be grown in pots that are small enough for a windowsill or a small bed of herbs within easy reach of the kitchen.

At the Fest, guest speakers will share their expertise of organic gardening, cooking with herbs, medicinal herbs and landscaping with perenni-

# 'CajunFest -- Deep in the swamps of Texas' April 26

Formerly known as "Mardi Gras with a Texas Twist", the new festive event designed to

and Convention Center in Temple.

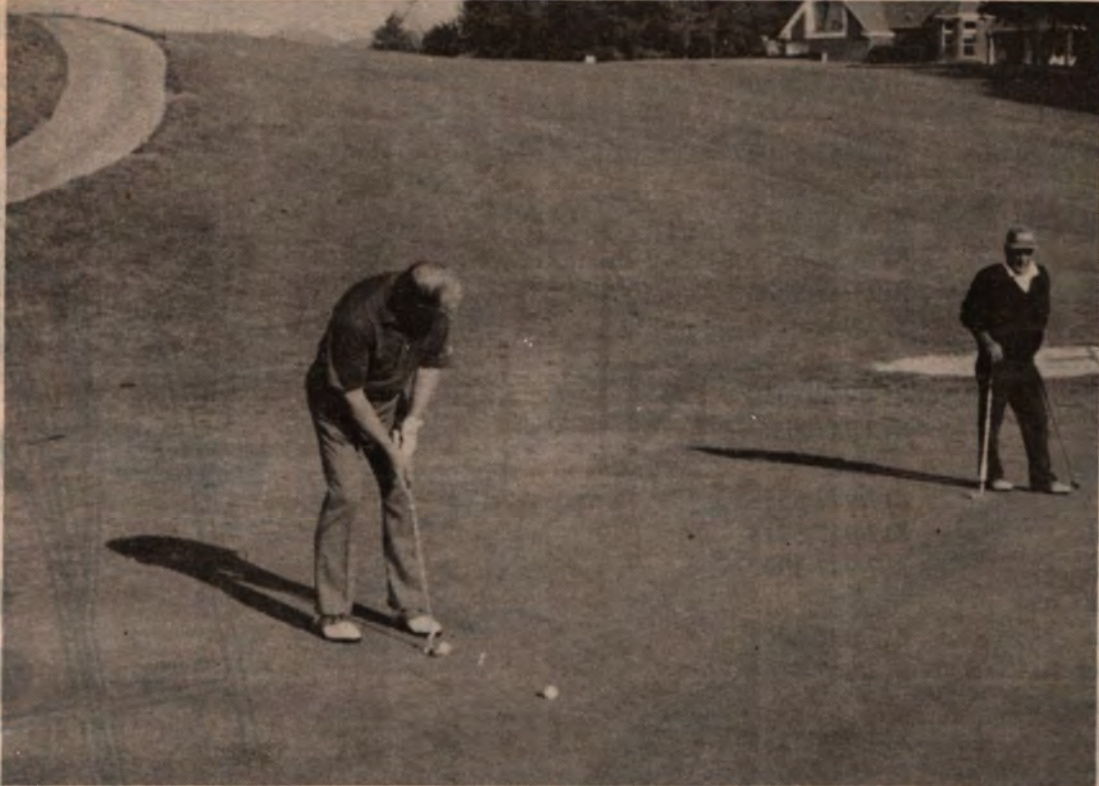

## Texans deserve quick, easy access to public information, a valuable economic commodity

Texans deserve quick, easy, reliable access to public information. Not just because open government is at the heart of our democratic system -- which it is, of course -- but because information in today's world has become a valuable economic commodity.

The demographic trends, financial patterns, and other data state government identifies and analyzes during the daily course of its constitutional duties can be of great use to businesses, schools, and ordinary citizens.

Besides, taxpayers have already paid for this information, and they have a right to put it to use creating jobs and strengthening their local communities.

That's why I created *Window on State Government* nearly five years ago, Texas' first electronic bulletin board -- and among the first in the nation -- available free of charge to anyone with access to a computer and a modem. In the years since, my staff and I have pioneered state government efforts to take advantage of the growing opportunities offered by the Internet.

All of this technology provides Texans with new options for getting the information they need and new forums for the free exchange of ideas. And that's why I've proposed new ways to make the information we gather easier to find.

House Bill 3475, sponsored by State Representative Leo Alvarado of San Antonio, and its companion legislation, Senate Bill 897 by State Senator

Eliot Shapleigh of El Paso, would require the state to create clear and cost-effective categories, as well as a subject matter index, to help Texans wind their way through the maze of information compiled in their name. If enacted, it will also institute a strict policy covering electronic recordkeeping systems to ensure that public information is just the click of a computer key, a tollfree telephone call, or a quick and friendly personal visit away.

Let me give you the latest example. Since 1967, the Minnie Stevens Piper Foundation, based in San Antonio, has published an updated annual compendium of information on Texas colleges and universities, including admission requirements, test dates, and more than 100 scholarships offered to qualified applicants. For three decades, this book has been the "bible" of students, parents, and high school counselors.

Now, the whole publication is available on-line, thanks to a joint effort by the Minnie Stevens Piper Foundation, the Texas Guaranteed Student Loan Corporation, and *Window on State Government*. By visiting our Internet site at <http://www.window.state.tx.us/> Texans can now find the answers to their college questions, as well as links to individual university home pages for even more information.

We hear a lot about "customer service" these days. This is my idea of what that phrase really means.

As the first state official to establish a personal Internet

email address -- [john.sharp@cpa.state.tx.us](mailto:john.sharp@cpa.state.tx.us) -- I've found that direct access from Texas taxpayers and citizens pays huge dividends. Not only do I get to read great suggestions or opinions about the major dues facing the state, but I receive innovative ideas from a broad cross-section of concerned citizens for improving state government.

Using the latest technology to open up state government is all well and good. In fact, it's saving taxpayers money and bringing the public business further into the clear light of day.

But for those who haven't yet logged onto the Internet or sent an email to someone clear across the land, access to public information is just as important. That's why I still have another way for folks to contact me. Just call 1-800-BEATWASTE toll-free to report any opportunity you see to cut the state bureaucracy, to improve the programs you depend on, or to pass along your best ideas for making the government you pay for more effective and efficient.

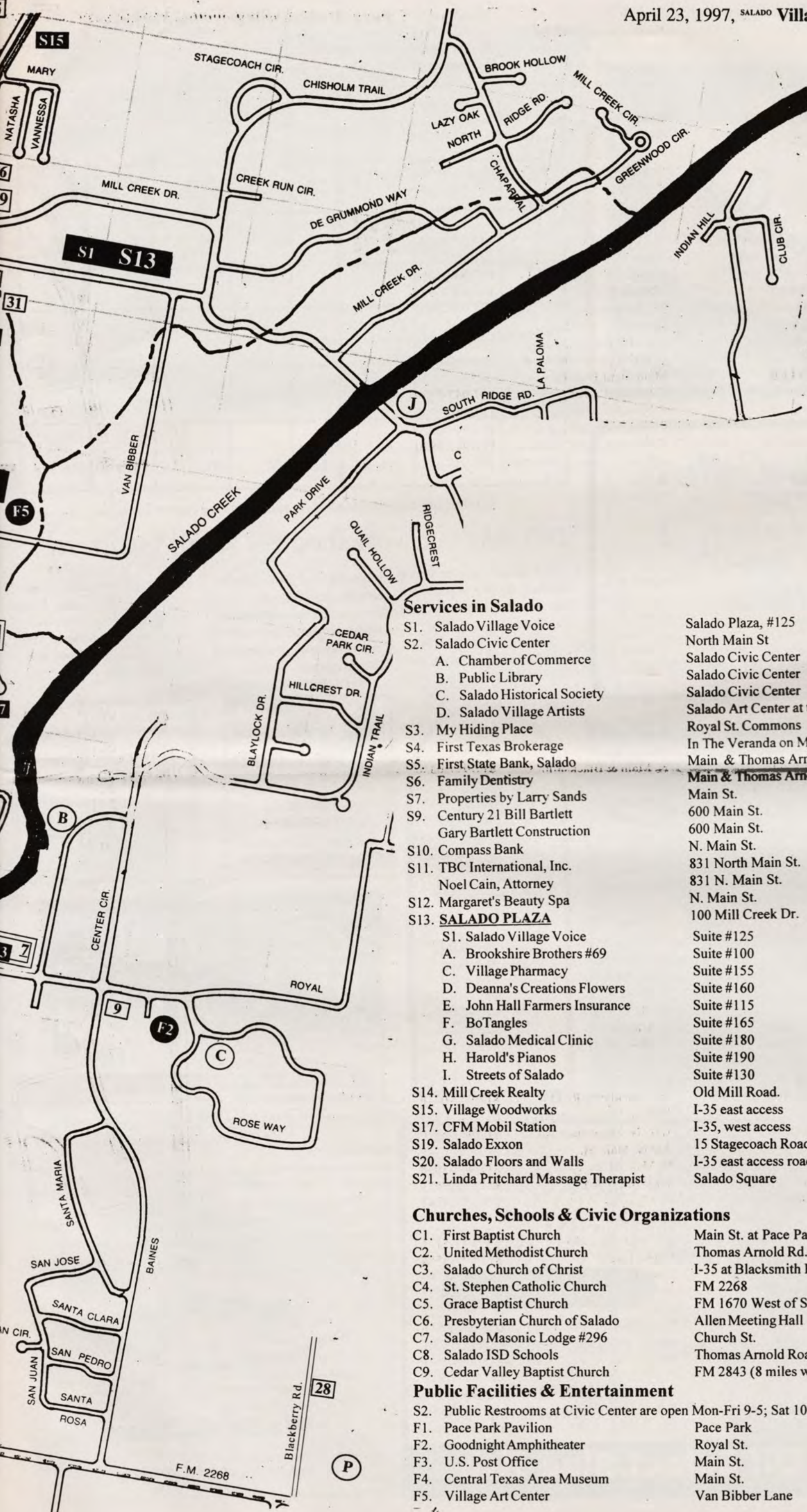

## Immunization of infants in Texas is steadily improving

In Texas, the need to improve infant immunization rates is still an unfinished story, but thanks to hundreds of public health professionals and volunteers statewide, it's heading toward a happy ending.

According to a survey conducted by the National Immunization Program of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the immunization level of Texas 2-year-olds has increased from 71 to 76 percent. Texas leaped from 42nd place to 28th among the 50 states.

As National Infant Immunization Week kicks off on April 20, Dr. Patti J. Patterson, Texas Commissioner of Health, warned that despite the positive trend statewide, the need to raise immunization rates for infants ages 2 and younger is far from over.

"Encouraging as the latest news is, Texas still has a long way to go to reach the goal of immunizing 90 percent of our little Texans by the year 2000," Dr. Patterson said. "It's critical that we don't even slow down now. We must keep working until we finish the job."

To help raise awareness of the need for age-appropriate immunizations, the Texas Department of Health (TDH) has published two free, easy-to-read booklets about the serious role immunizations play in a child's health — "The Story of Shots" and "My Child's Health Record."

"The Story of Shots" is a 20-page whimsically illustrated pamphlet that, although easy-to-read, contains an immunization schedule along with serious information about vaccine-

preventable diseases. "My Child's Health Record" is an infant wellness diary providing a place for parents to record vital statistics on their infant, including immunizations. Along with health-related information, the booklet includes space to record the dates of important childhood milestones, such as the baby's first smile, first steps and first tooth.

TDH is offering the booklets as part of Shots Across Texas, a statewide public health program aimed at increasing the immunization rate of Texas children age 2 and younger. Sponsored by TDH and volunteers and coalitions throughout the state, Shots Across Texas strives to educate parents and other care givers about the importance of childhood immunization.

To find out more about Shots Across Texas, or to receive a copy of the booklets, parents, grandparents, health care providers and other concerned Texans can contact their local Shots Across Texas coalition or health department or the TDH Immunization Division at 1-800-252-9152. If the child has Medicaid coverage, booklets may be ordered from the Texas Health Steps Program at 1-800-2528263.

# Citizen comment on state highways' speed limit set May 7 in Bellmead

Citizens who want to comment on the speed limits on state highways are invited to a town meeting at 6:30 p.m. May 7 at the Bellmead Civic Center in Bellmead.

The meeting is being held by the Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) and the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS). It is one of 25 meetings being held statewide to get public input on the procedures used to set speed limits, as well as input on specific locations where problems may exist.

In November 1995, Congress repealed the federal law which mandated a national maximum speed limit and re-

turned the authority of setting speed limits to the states.

As a result, speed limits on Texas roads reverted to existing state law, which set the maximum limit to 70 mph day, 65 mph night for passenger cars and 60 mph day, 55 mph night for trucks.

Texas law allows TXDOT, through the Texas Transportation Commission, to set speed limits on roadways on the state highway system lower than 70 mph only if justified by engineering and traffic studies.

Beginning in late summer of 1995 and continuing through mid-June 1996, TXDOT conducted studies to identify those road segments that should be

posted at speed limits below the maximum limit. As a result of those studies and action by the transportation commission, approximately 30,000 miles or 38 percent of the state system highway mileage now has speed limits lower than 70 mph.

The installation of new speed limit signs was phased in over a nine-month period from December 1995 through August 1996.

"Moving motorists safely along Texas highways is a job we take very seriously," said David Laney, Texas Transportation Commissioner. "We need to hear from the people who drive the roads, know where problems may exist, and have an opinion on whether the posted speed is too slow or too fast, or just right."

The public input, along with detailed crash studies, will provide comprehensive information for decision makers to help enhance the safety of Texas highways, Laney said.

# School board deals with a full agenda

The Salado ISD Board of Trustees met in regular session April 15 with a full agenda.

After addressing monthly items, the board turned its attention to business items, adopting Texas Association of School Board Updates.

It also adopted a local policy on Purchasing and Acquisition on a motion by Sarah Mackie, and a second by Donnie Jackson.

The board tabled adoption of local policies dealing with communication of board members and employee complaints.

After discussion with parents, the board reduced the number of Varsity cheerleaders for the 1997-98 school year from 12 to 10. The vote of 6-0 came on a motion by Mackie and a second by Rita Brown. The board upheld its earlier decision for inclusion at the junior high level.

The board also accepted

Superintendent Steven Ervin's recommendation to send a proposed high school grading policy to the District Site-Based Decision Making Committee for further review. The motion by Jackson received a second from Juana Preston and was unanimous.

The board also voted unanimously to support the efforts of Rep. Suzanna Gratia Hupp and Sen. Troy Fraser concerning a university in Killeen.

The board tabled selection of an architect until its May meeting.

The board entered executive session at approximately 8:30 p.m. to discuss FD (Local) letter from attorney, employment of para-professionals, consider purchase of land, and review superintendent goals, evaluation and consider contract.

The board adjourned at approximately 10:30 p.m.

# Are you using too much credit?

Would you say that you control credit, or that credit controls you? To decide if you are using too much credit, ask yourself these questions and find out.

- Do you really need to buy the item now with credit? Is it necessary for you to function at home, in your job or in social affairs?
- Is it worth the extra credit cost to have it now?
- Is it worth the risk of losing the money you have put into it if you don't meet the payments?
- Will the purchase help achieve a family or a personal goal?
- Is the interest cost reasonable?
- Will you still be using the purchase when payments are ended?

- Will the purchase meet with family approval?
- Are you buying from a fair and honest person or firm?
- Can you buy it without committing income you may not have (such as expected overtime)?
- Do you make payments on time?
- Can you make credit payments without skimping on necessities and dipping into savings?
- Do you have an emergency fund to take care of unforeseen expenses?
- Is your credit good enough so that you can borrow in case of illness or emergency?
- Are your job and health prospects good?
- Are you always honest with your spouse or yourself, if single, about your expenses?
- Do you avoid borrowing to pay off other credit cards or debts?

- Are you always current in rent and utility payments?
- Are your assets greater than your debts?

Add up your "YES" answers with one point given for each "YES" answer. If your score is 9 or lower, STOP and wait to make a decision. Any "NO" answer could cause you trouble, but the more "NO" answers, the more questionable it is that you would be safe using more credit.

If your score is between 10 and 15, proceed with caution. If your score is over 16, you seem in control of your credit use, and would likely make a wise choice in this credit decision, too.
