The Salado High School Academic Team of Vinny Michna, Kyle Anderson, Michelle Lenis and Marissa Lindley placed fourth overall in the UIL State Academic Meet recently. In the individual Number Sense competition Vinny placed first and Kyle placed third. The Number Sense Team consisting of Vinny, Kyle and Michelle Lenis won first place with a score of 750. In the individual Mathematics competition, Vinny placed second and Kyle placed fifth. The Mathematics Team consisting of Vinny, Kyle and Marissa Lindley also won the state championship with a score of 444. Vinny, Kyle and Marissa are seniors and Michelle is a sophomore. The marks of the mathematics and number sense teams were high enough to total 63 points for second place overall in the Academic Competition. Last year, the team won first place in the academic contest with a score of 68. This is the third consecutive year that a Salado student has won state in Number Sense and is the second consecutive time that Salado has won state in Team Number Sense and Team Mathematics. DUMB AND DUMBER

Our less than cogent Congress is at it again!

They are in the throes of battling President Clinton for the honor of telling the American voter how they are completely responsible for repealing a 4.3 cent tax on gasoline, when and if it happens.

All of this taking place thanks to the huge run-up of gas prices at the pump just as vacation days start down the pike.

Economists and petroleum experts, aided and

abetted by less than forthcoming oil company leaders, are trying to explain all this by blaming the cold winter in New England and subsequent late change-over from heating oil to gasoline plus a rather hazy story of a shortage of oil headed for the refineries.

SHS to implement new program in 96-97

Dear Parents, Students and Community Members,

As this year moves quickly forward, I am proud to announce that Salado High School will be participating as a pilot site for the Texas Education Agency in a new teacher appraisal program called "teacherspeak."

Recently two staff members and I attended a two-day training session, which is the first part of a total of 12 days of training which will also involve our assistant principal, Joe Palmer. We are excited about this new system because we feel that it offers teachers a genuine opportunity to reflect on the act of teaching and how it impacts student achievement. In our quest to become a student-centered campus, we have developed a Salado teacher profile which is based on the state's teaching proficiencies and will serve as a guide in making personnel decisions and guiding teachers in professional development decisions.

The new appraisal system is the result of Senate Bill I and will include the following attributes:

* Promote student growth as exemplified by multiple indicators of student performance and as specified by other campus improvement efforts:

* Promote professional growth and development of teachers:

* Provide multiple approaches to appraise teachers at various stages of their careers:

* Include teacher self-evaluation and reflection:

* Promote communication and collaboration among educators: *Include joint training of teachers and administrators.

This program gets at more than just what teachers do in classroom it helps them look at outcomes. Our current system is a structured look at instructional techniques and student responses. The teacherspeak program also reviews the teachers' pattern of actions and reasoning in the classroom. Teacherspeak offers teachers the opportunity to develop new insights into the learning needs of students and teachers' responses to those needs. It also provides teachers the opportunity to define their own needs and interests as they relate to continued professional development,

something our current system lacks. Teachers will work through three separate strands depending on where that teacher is in his/her own development and experience.

We believe this program

allows us an opportunity to develop the best teaching skills in order to meet the needs of our students.

Salado 4-H gather May 19 for 96-97

The Salado 4-H will meet 3:30 p.m. May 19 at the Thomas Arnold Elementary cafeteria. Enrollments for members and new members will be available at this meeting. All nine-year-olds (or eight-year-olds in the third grade) through 12 grade are eligible to participate in 4-H.

The definition of 4-H age, "A 4-H member must be 8 years old and in the third grade to be eligible for enrollment as a bonafide member." The official interpretation is that member will be bonafide as of the new 4-H year which is Sept. 1.

In other words, if a youth is promoted from second grade in May and he or she is 8 years old, they would be bonafide members and be eligible for participation on Sept. 1, that year. The concerns throughout the state have been with some counties allowing youths to participate in competitive events during the summer months and other counties not allowing such participation. This official ruling should standardize all counties throughout Texas.



Do your kids seem to live on "candy?" There's help!!

Do your children seem to "live" on candy, cookies, popsicles, sugared cereal and cola? Like many parents, you may be worried that too much sugar is leading to tooth decay and reducing the nutritional quality of your children's diets. National statistics tell us that the average man, woman or child eats 128 pounds of sugar each year.

You may be able to do something about the problem, especially if your children are still young, but it could require changing some of your habits and attitudes as well as theirs.

Children come by their desire for sweets honestly. Studies have shown that infants are born with a preference for sweetened liquids over plain liquids. This preference will continue, especially if children have continued positive experiences with sweets.

As parents we create many of these experiences by offering sweets to comfort or reward our child, to express affection and to celebrate special occasions. We sometimes use sweets to compensate when we're busy or tired, or to keep the children distracted or quiet. That doesn't mean we need to give up birthday cakes or stop eating cookies. In fact, giving children sweets in "positive contexts" is not the only reason for their attraction to sugared foods. How often children actually eat sweets is more important.

This is determined mostly by the parents own consumption of sweets, and how much television the family watches.

What and how parents eat has a powerful effect on children.

Children learn to be sweet eaters from their parents just as they learn other food preferences, such as liking meat or disliking vegetables. There is

also a connection between children's sugar intake and how much television they watch.

Children who watch more television tend to eat sweet foods more often because they are bombarded with commercials for highly sweetened foods, especially during Saturday morning cartoons. Because they watch at least some of the shows their children see, parents may become more familiar with the foods advertised and more receptive toward eating the foods themselves and serving them to their children.

If you really want to change your child's sweet eating habits, cut back yourself. Also, talk with them about the differences in the variety of foods we eat for good health in "real life" and what they see in the make-believe world of television.

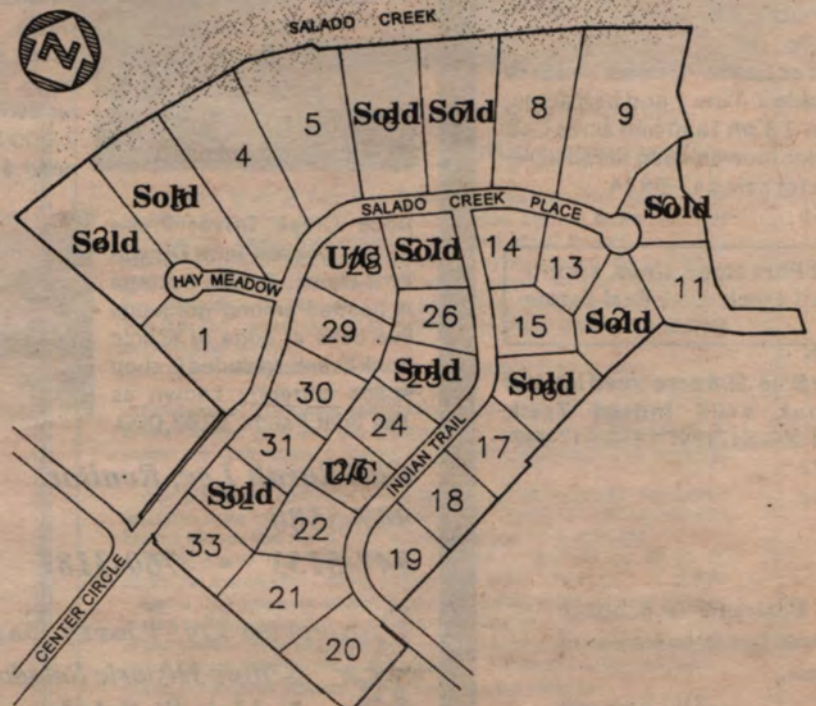

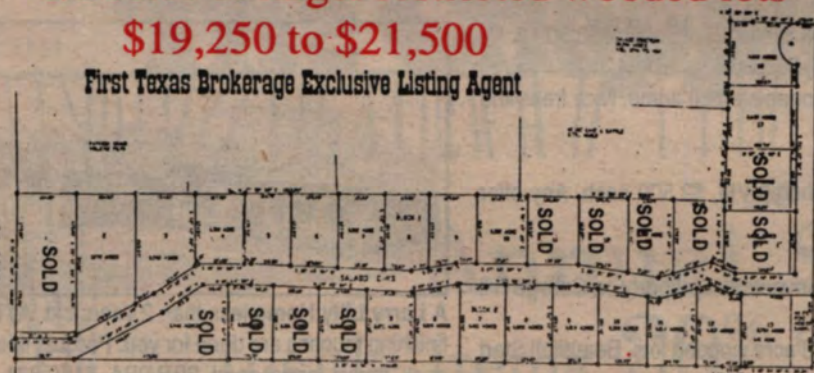

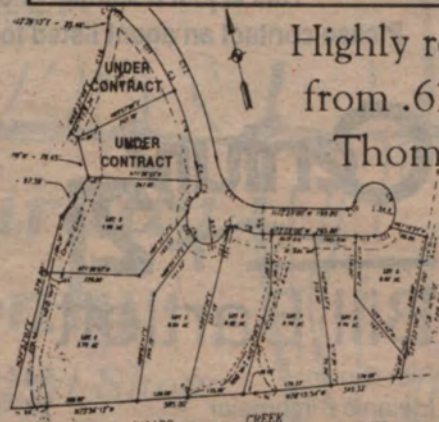

More Texans
die from guns
than cars

For the fifth year in a row, more Texans died from firearms than from motor vehicle accidents, according to an article published in the May issue of Texas Medicine.

A study conducted by the Texas Department of Health reveals that 3,396 Texans died from gunshot wounds in 1994 compared to 3,307 who died as the result of injuries involving motor vehicles.

Texas Medicine is the official news magazine of Texas Medical Association.

"Between 1993 and 1994, the number of Texans killed by bullets declined 2 percent (from 3,456 to 3,396), while fatalities related to motor vehicles increased 4 percent (from 3,184 to 3,307)," the authors write.
