Memorial day service held at Salado Cemetery

Over 100 area citizens gathered for Memorial Day services under the oaks of Salado Cemetery May 29 during which Citizen of Texas Medallions were placed at the grave sites of John Paine and Charles Schoepf, who served in the Army of the Republic of Texas.

Daughters of the Republic of Texas Museum Director Carl R. McQueary dedicated the two markers, saying "to have served in the Army of the Republic of Texas was to face the hardships of Indian raids, poor food, obsolete weapons and staggering odds. These two veterans...and hundreds others like them loyally served their country in order that Texas might be free."

John Paine was born in North Carolina May 21, 1804 and died in Bell County February 17, 1873. He served in numerous companies during the Texas revolution, includ-

ing Captain York's Company of Volunteers, prior to the Siege of Bexar in 1835. He also participated in the Siege itself as a member of the New Orleans Grays, under Captain William Cooke. Paine was also an Indian fighter and a member of the Home Guard. Records survive

that indicate that John Paine was also a preacher in the Church of Christ prior to his death.

Charles Schoepf was born in Germany in 1806. In 1819 he stowed away on a ship bound for the United States. His stow-away sta-

Better editing would have turned a good film into a great film. But for someone with the attention span of a gnat (me), **Legends of the Fall** is about half an hour too long.

The two hour and 14 minute epic story of three brothers and their love of one woman is beautifully filmed and wonderfully acted. Anthony Hopkins is terrific as the patriarch of this rough, ranching family.

His three sons go off to Europe to fight in World War I, but only the two eldest return. Brad Pitt and Aidan Quinn stars as the brothers who battle for the heart of their dead younger brother's fiancée.

With further performances like this, Brad Pitt will continue to be one of the fastest rising stars in Hollywood. Julia Ormond is a sexy, sultry newcomer who does well among the likes of Pitt, Hopkins and Quinn.

Legends of the Fall is a heartbreaking story, full of passion and pathos, but it drags some in the middle. Otherwise, I think it could have been one of the best films of the year.

I-35 named a high priority corridor

Interstate Highway 35, is again making news that could impact those of us who live in and around Salado. Readers will recall the formation some months back of the **IH 35 Corridor Coalition** - composed of County Judges from the counties and cities that touch the super highway all the way from Laredo to the Oklahoma border. Later this group expanded to include officials from Oklahoma, Kansas, Missouri, Iowa and ending in Duluth, Minnesota.

Purpose of the coalition is to lobby Congress for the all-important designation of "**High Priority Corridor**" and the federal highway construction dollars that goes with this honor. All this is part of the 1991 Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act which calls for the Secretary of Transportation to present a National Highway System program to construct as well as upgrade some 45,000 miles of the interstate highway system plus another 159,000 miles of feeder highways.

Coupled to this activity was the passage of the North American Free Trade Act that allows goods to move from Canada to Mexico without tariff and little if any inspection hindrances.

Texas' stake in all this is some \$436 million for the next fiscal year - most of which will go towards work on the priority corridors.

So much for the historical background. Now the current news. The Senate Environment and Public Works Committee in Washington voted to send the NHS bill to the full Senate for debate and vote. Included in the proposed law was some \$6 billion in highway construction and **an amendment that classifies Interstate 35, from Laredo, Texas to Duluth, Minnesota as a "High Priority Corridor!"**

This all means that if the committee recommendation passes muster in the House and Senate and is signed by the President - then these priority roadways will get first crack at the funds. Exactly what the Texas corridor group has been after!

I-35 Bypass

While all this work by the corridor folks was being done, another group has been busily working on re-routing Interstate 35, around Austin, Georgetown, Round Rock, Salado, Belton and most of Temple.

Seems the Taylor Chamber of Commerce has been studying a plan that would take IH 35 on a by-pass route starting at San Marcos and running in an easterly direction past Elgin and Taylor - rejoining the main interstate north of Temple.

The plan would use mostly state Highway 95 right of way.

The new Interstate 35 (alternate) would divert through traffic around the most crowded part of the highway - that is - through Austin.

Cost of this modification has been estimated to be about a billion bucks but those in the know say that figure could double and perhaps even triple before the work would be finished sometime around the year 2010.

Austin is fully in favor of such a by-pass plan. IH 35 through the capitol city is clogged day and night so any relief would be welcomed.

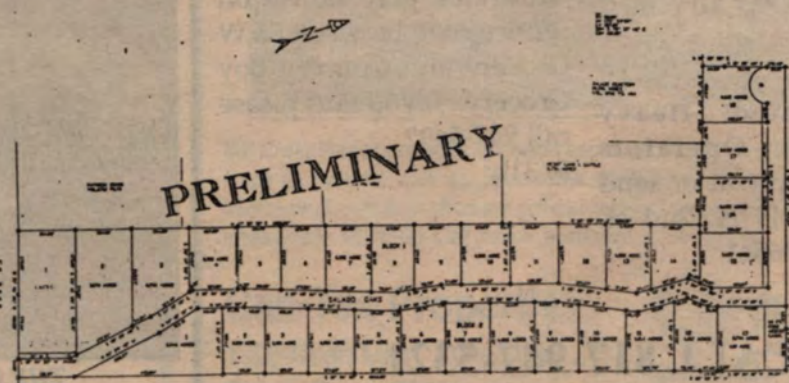

As noted, the idea behind all this is to reduce through traffic - particularly trucks - along the current I-35 roadway.

What this would do to the tourist trade that helps Salado is not known but it would potentially keep the highway planners from having to expand the width of I-35 through the village for some time to come in order to handle the NAFTA traffic that will continue to grow - especially after Mexico solves her money problems.

A news report in the Temple Daily Telegram indicated the Temple Chamber of Commerce's Infrastructure Committee was all in favor of the highway diversion plan.

Adding to all this is the problem Austin will have of getting people from cities north and south of it into the new Austin-Bergstrom International Airport when it comes on line.

Right now the roads in and around the airfield are crowded and not a single plane has taken off or landed.

When passengers from Austin and central Texas start using the airport - some sort of direct highway access off IH-35 will become mandatory.

Salado Growth

Part of the amazing growth patterns in and around Salado have come as a result of the interstate - which is known by many as our "Highway to Everywhere"!

What impact might be felt if the corridor funds become available at the same time there is a demand for a by-pass - is anyone's guess.

Both projects - that of upgrading I-35 to handle the increased traffic that is expected to double by the year 2000 and double again by 2010 as well as the by-pass proposal that would take many of the cars and trucks away from the current highway and race them along a new freeway just east of us on Highway 95 right of ways - will compete for highway dollars hence the rush to draw up plans which the state highway department, no doubt, is feverishly doing as we speak.

Which plan will gain the ultimate approval - and as mentioned - what impact all this will have on Salado, remains to be seen. We do need to watch what the

highway planners come up with and try to have some input - perhaps through the good offices of the County Judge - before a final decision is made.

There could be a real financial impact on Salado related closely to the future of Interstate 35 - hence the need to monitor all this carefully and constantly.

Strange Goings-On

We are living through a strange time in our history. You may have noticed a recent news report about a former convict receiving an award for his talk-show prowess.

The award given to G. Gordon Liddy was the "Freedom of speech" honor granted by the association of radio talk show hosts for Liddy's First Amendment work that included such things as how to effectively gun down federal agents: "shoot them in the head if they are wearing protective vests"!

Liddy was a White House aide during Nixon's reign and the man given credit for setting up the Watergate screwup that ended with the President having to resign in disgrace. See Growth, Page 12

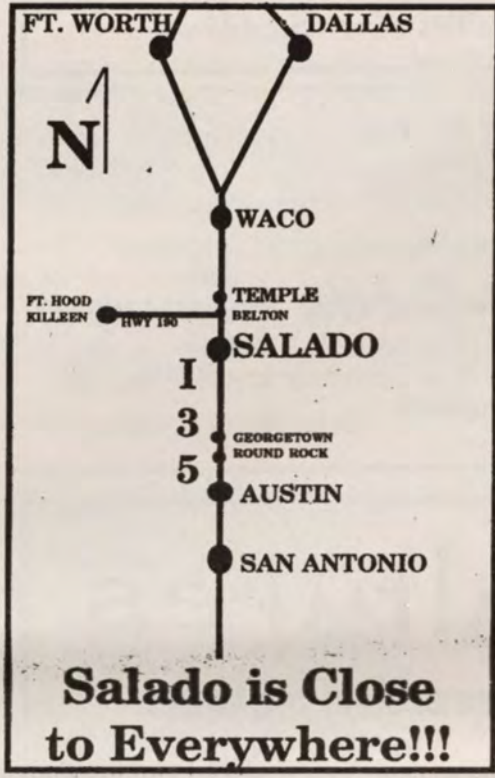
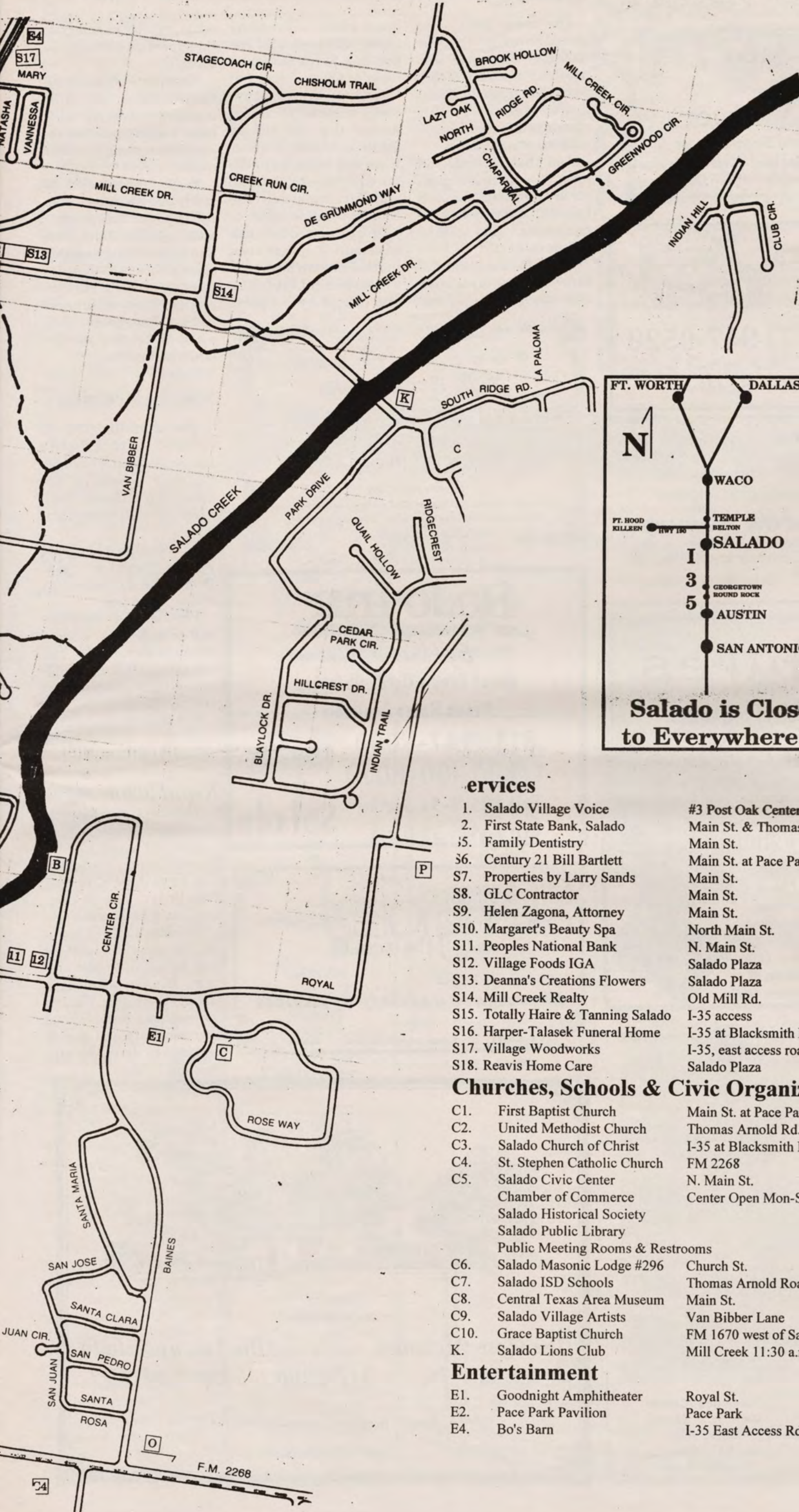

As noted, the idea behind all this is to reduce through traffic - particularly trucks - along the current I-35 roadway.

What this would do to the tourist trade that helps Salado is not known but it would potentially keep the highway planners from having to expand the width of I-35 through the village for some time to come in order to handle the NAFTA traffic that will continue to grow - especially after Mexico solves her money problems.

A news report in the Temple Daily Telegram indicated the Temple Chamber of Commerce's Infrastructure Committee was all in favor of the highway diversion plan.

Adding to all this is the problem Austin will have of getting people from cities north and south of it into the new Austin-Bergstrom International Airport when it comes on line.

Right now the roads in and around the airfield are crowded and not a single plane has taken off or landed.

When passengers from Austin and central Texas start using the airport - some sort of direct highway access off IH-35 will become mandatory.

Salado Growth

Part of the amazing growth patterns in and around Salado have come as a result of the interstate - which is known by many as our "Highway to Everywhere"!

What impact might be felt if the corridor funds become available at the same time there is a demand for a by-pass - is anyone's guess.

Both projects - that of upgrading I-35 to handle the increased traffic that is expected to double by the year 2000 and double again by 2010 as well as the by-pass proposal that would take many of the cars and trucks away from the current highway and race them along a new freeway just east of us on Highway 95 right of ways - will compete for highway dollars hence the rush to draw up plans which the state highway department, no doubt, is feverishly doing as we speak.

Which plan will gain the ultimate approval - and as mentioned - what impact all this will have on Salado, remains to be seen. We do need to watch what the

highway planners come up with and try to have some input - perhaps through the good offices of the County Judge - before a final decision is made.

There could be a real financial impact on Salado related closely to the future of Interstate 35 - hence the need to monitor all this carefully and constantly.

To start with, both the OSSF and the Historical Society are Tax Free Non Profit organizations under the Internal Revenue Code, therefor according to Mr Kolb's logic, then neither organization should be involved in politics. I do not agree that at this stage, the discussions going on about incorporation are political. They do become political only when it's decided to take the issue to a vote by the people.

We are all aware of the contributions made to the OSSF by the Historical Society which was very appreciated, but the Society must remember that there are people in our community that contributed as much or more, took part in all the fund raising activities and do not find it necessary to remind the OSSF how much they contributed!

Last but certainly not least, as a long time friend (over 20 years) of Thelma Fletchers, I was very distressed to have Mr. Kolb use that wonderful lady's name to advance his own agenda.. Thelma loved all the people of Salado, not just the people living in the proposed historic district. I am certain that she would

have wanted what is best for all of Salado, not just a chosen few. I'm also sure his comments were very distressing to Tyler Fletcher and the rest of the family.

The town meeting that was held to discuss the Historic District was structured to present information on the district and to present options to protect it through regulatory powers such as incorporating the district. It was not structured to invite comment that did not agree with the position being presented. In as much as the Historical Society has ordered a survey of the district to determine if it complies with the required two square miles needed to go ahead with the plan for incorporation, it looks like "Full speed ahead to me."

It is time for the Historical Society to realize that the Village of Salado belongs to everyone living in Salado, not just those in the Historic District.

It is also time for the entire Village of Salado, along with the Historical Society to get together and study this issue in depth and to bring their findings to all of the residents Salado for their consideration. Only through a unified effort can we expect to retain the loving community spirit that has always abounded in Salado.

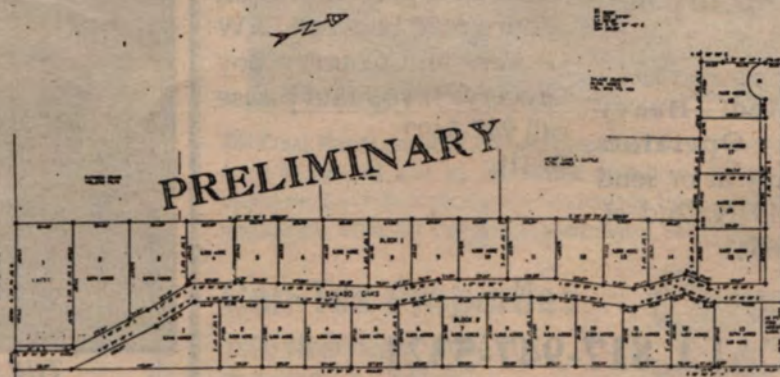

Moore. For his participation in these battles he received two month's salary. "Records indicate that he was paid promptly approximately 13 years after the battle," McQueary said.

Schoepf married Elizabeth Deitz and the 1850 Census lists them as having three children. Following the War Between the States, Charles, then a widowed, came to Bell County with his children. He remarried and lived with his wife near Salado in an area known as Crow Ranch. He passed away in 1894.

MaryBelleBrown, President of the Salado Cemetery Association, was the Master of Ceremonies for the service.

The Special Troops Battalion, II Corps Support Command (COSCOM) under the command of Lt. Col. Borah VanDormolen, posted colors and gave a 21 gun salute to the veterans buried in Salado Cemetery.
