Interview with the Vampire rated R

starring Tom Cruise, Brad Pitt, Kirsten Dunst, Antonio Banderas, Christian Slater

Interview with the Vampire is a great adaptation of Anne Rice's novel of the same name. Visually stunning, Interview captures the feel of 18th Century New Orleans and Paris as Louis (Pitt) and his newly made daughter try to escape the grasps of the cruel Lestat (Cruise).

Lestat is the best role Cruise has performed since Born on the Fourth of July. No all-American boy here. It is easy to see that Cruise relished to opportunity to play the fiendish Lestat, who ridicules Louis for not being able to devour humans, drinking instead from rats, pigeons and poodles.

The thinly veiled homosexuality made me more queasy than the blood, but I kept telling myself that the vampires are dead and sex doesn't really matter to them. Right? At least, that's how the novel dealt with the issue. The movie fails to explain this and viewers who have not read the novel will probably feel very uneasy by the femininity of Lestat, Louis and Armand (Banderas).

Regardless, **Interview** is a richly told story of deception, revenge and love.

Safe at last, legislature is over!!

The 74th Texas Legislative session ended May 29, with a flurry of lawmaking and general thrashing about that defies description, but hardly unusual for this notable body of elected representatives.

According to the record book, these worthies of ours filed some 4957 bills and ended up passing (thankfully) only 1,088. The Governor will probably sign all but a handful into law thus presenting us with a new list of "do's" and "don'ts" including some that challenge logic while others scream of special interest tinkering.

Examples forthwith: Solons **passed**, with a flourish of bells and whistles, the concealed handgun plan that will allow citizens, after a modest bit of schooling, to carry a gun on their person. At the same time, these manufacturers of law, **turned down** a measure that would have outlawed the practice of allowing young children to ride in the back of a pickup!

Try explaining or even understanding the juxtaposition of these two alien public safety measures.

It was an up-and-down session for the all powerful Texas insurance lobby. It took nearly the full 140

days of the biennial-meeting to garner votes and pass tort reform thus allowing these underwriters of loss and other giants of industry to now spend less on legal fees and judgements.

What the insurers did not suspect was a neatly hidden legal plan that forces these money-makers to pass on some of the savings from tort reform to their policy holders - not something they like to do as a general rule.

Governor Bush got what he wanted - namely decontrol of education; some, but not much - welfare changes; tort reform and an upgrading of the criminal justice code with special emphasis on juvenile crime and punishment.

This was a good session for the fledgling Chief of State although Lt. Governor Bob Bullock and House Speaker Pete Laney did most of the work.

Main thing these leaders wanted, and received, was a two year budget without new or additional taxes.

Teachers will get a pay hike - not much, but at least more than they thought was in the cards

when the session started.

Term limits for in-State officials was buried again in the committee graveyard as did several stabs at killing the Texas affirmative action programs. Also dead on arrival was the last minute murder of the bill to send Bell County's Central Texas University into the warm and cuddly arms of the A&M money factory.

Senator David Sibley (R-Waco) had a hand in both these endeavors. He won the school battle and lost on minority action. Killeen and Fort flood will long remember Sibley's last minute "tagging" and "amending" that sent UCT-A&M into a two year hiatus in "never-never-happen" land!

Land speculators and other members of the landed gentry in our State hit paydirt thanks to several new laws approved by the late unlamented session.

First is the Property Rights Act which slows down the environmental regulators to a crawl. These good folks who worry about the declining population of certain birds and bugs will not be able to close down the business

The four team members, Kyle Anderson, Vinny Michna, Brent Cabaniss and Ricky Engleking along with Dr. Steven Ervin, Ed Thomas, various faculty members, parents and friends attended the afternoon session as guests of Mr. Black. The group was given a tour of the Capitol and the students were presented a Texas flag for the school. The students, their coaches and the school will also receive a copy of the resolution.

The Dean's Honor Roll recognizes students who have maintained at least a 3.75 grade point ratio (GPR) out of a possible 4.0 during the most recent grading period.



Thanks also to the EMS crew of 911, for its rapid response and help in a time of great need.

I shall never cease to remember, and to be grateful, that we in Salado, have these caring groups available right here in our little village.

Obviously, during this emergency, I was unable to get individual names, etc., so I am hoping you will publish this letter in order for these fine volunteers to know that my husband and I appreciate their help, and wish all good things for them in the coming years.

Low-maintenance landscaping

Educational programs conducted by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service serve

people of all ages regardless of socioeconomic level, race, color, sex, religion, national origin or disability.

The trend toward low maintenance landscaping has increased the popularity of some of our compact, low-growing evergreen shrubs. These plants are ideal for use near your home since they normally do not reach more than 3 to 4 feet in height. With just occasional pruning, most can be kept under 3 feet.

Four plants widely used as dwarf evergreens are dwarf nandina, dwarf yaupon, dwarf Chinese holly, and dwarf Indian hawthorn.

- **Dwarf Nandina** - Dwarf nandinas are currently available in a number of varieties. The three most commonly available selections are: 'Compacts,' which grows 2 to 3 feet tall; 'Nana,' which is normally 12 to 18 inches tall; and 'Harbour Dwarf,' which is dense and low, usually 12 to 15 inches tall. The dwarf types do not normally set fruit, but the foliage is often a dark, reddish-purple during winter.

- **Dwarf Yaupon** - Dwarf yaupon is an old favorite for border and mass planting. It is commonly available and grows well under a wide variety of conditions. If trimmed, dwarf yaupon can be kept 18 inches or less. If allowed to grow naturally, it may reach 3 to 4 feet in height and width.

- **Dwarf Chinese Holly** - Dwarf Chinese Holly has large, glossy, prickly leaves which discourage pedestrian traffic. It is not recommended for areas where the sticky leaves will be a nuisance, such as along walkways, but otherwise is an attractive and useful plant.

- **Dwarf Indian Hawthorn** - Dwarf Indian Hawthorn comes in varieties such as 'Emchangress.' Showy pink flowers in the spring make it a real stand-out. Well-drained, sunny planting areas are recommended.

Each of these plants is not only good for use close to your house, but also works well in large masses and as container specimens. All are available in nursery containers for easy and almost shockless transplanting year-round.

If an impact is determined and certain lands put off limits for commercial use - then the government will have to shell out for the lost-revenue or simply buy the land at a fair price.

Lot more to it including the difficulty of collecting the money from the state but the basic thrust being to keep the tree huggers from shutting down legitimate enterprises.

Overall


