Historical Society backs incorporation of village as a whole

The Salado Historical Society Board of Directors voted unanimously to support any effort to incorporate as much of the village as possible (two square miles. If an incorporation election should fail, the board voted further to support incorporation of the historic district.

"The Salado Historical Society Board has only taken the position that it supports incorporation," said President Larry Sands. "Until now, we have not taken a position as to whether we support incorporation of the historic district or of as much of the village as possible."

The Salado Historical Society Historic District Committee brought the incorporation issue to the forefront of discussion earlier this year.

"We didn't bring up incorporation of the historic district to be controversial or cause division," said Historic District committee chair Jack Herrington. "We brought up discussion of incorporation as a means

of protecting the historic district. We wanted to find some means to give some legal teeth to the historic district guidelines."

At present, property owners within the historic district are asked to present plans for development of property to the Historic District Committee for discussion and possible recommendations.

The Historic District Committee has no authority by which to enforce its guidelines, only voluntary compliance from those owning property within the district.

The vote to support incorporation of as much of the village as possible follows a report by Jim Reed with the Central Texas Council of Governments.

In the report, which was presented earlier this month to the Salado Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors recommended the village seek incorporation of as much of the village as possible.

Should that effort fail, Reed recommends the village back incorporation of the historic district.

Will Powell's American Journey include Prez?

All of us who enjoy watching even a smidgen of political news and activities will get to know retired General Colin Powell during the next few weeks as he appears on TV, radio and in person during his 25-city book tour.

The book "My American Journey" reportedly was written to spread the seeds for a possible presidential run - if Powell gets a "calling" which he says he needs in order to mentally gear up for the race.

Powell is an unknown quantity to most Americans. Well spoken and no doubt brave and knowledgeable, he talks like a moderate Republican or even one of the breed of rapidly disappearing moderate Democrats.

He could even be a moderate third party candidate - which many fans of the popular black general hope will be the case.

Thus far it would appear that the GOP has the edge when it comes to appealing to this "above the fray" general and should it come down to a convention battle next year we would finally find out for certain how the Grand Old Party is divided between the far right and middle-of-the-

road moderate loyalists.

When Powell reported his views on abortion which indicated he had no problem with the "choice" side of the argument, he lost a lot of ground among the far end of the righteous right who are currently being romanced by Pat Buchanan and Phil Gramm.

Affirmative action - which helped get Powell the prominent role he held at the White House and later the Pentagon - is another sticking point not favored by the ultra conservative far righters.

If it is true that the zealotites in the Republican Party are in the majority, as most observers and pundits think is the case then congressional control will eventually slip from the GOP over the long haul, just as surely as will moderate Bob Dole's immediate chances fail to win the nod at the 1996 mid-summer convention.

It should be remembered that extremism on the part of any political group is not tolerated very long in

American politics regardless of the source. Something for not only ultra-zany GOPers to think about but also the Demos on the other side of the aisle whose policies are just as weird on the far left as their counterparts are on the extreme right.

Hungry-for-power Democrats should note that all this does not indicate that it is time to start drooling-with-joy at the possibility of taking back the Congress since they have not yet learned the lessons taught last year by an electorate tired of giveaways and liberalism. They are also backing a candidate who is behind in all the polls - even in head-to-head match-ups that pit President Clinton against Powell.

President Powell?

Now, back to Colin Powell's teasing look at the top job for a moment. Once we get to know this man a bit better and learn of his background and ideas we may as a nation, regardless of affiliation, decide he is the right horse to ride into the next century. Or not!

On the other hand Powell may decide that

Turnovers fatal to Eagles in loss to Moody

The Salado Eagles turned over the ball five times in their 46-26 loss to the Moody Bearcats Sept. 15. The loss dropped the Eagles to 0-2 in the season.

Moody scored first on an interception returned 45 yards into the endzone. The PAT gave Moody a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter.

The Eagles scored with 52 seconds left in the first after Jerry Ratliff recovered a Moody fumble at the Bearcat 21 yard line.

After throwing to David Berumen, Joshua Goodnight followed Berumen's and Scott Arnold's blocks for a 19 yard touchdown. The PAT tied the game at 7-7.

Moody returned the ensuing kickoff to their 46 yard line and drove into the endzone on 8 plays covering 3 minutes. Tyrone Johnson dove in from the 1 yard line. The PAT failed.

Salado returned the favor, scoring in just three minutes, covering 61 yards on 7 plays. The key play of the drive was Cody Hall's 40-yard scamper to bring the ball to Moody's 21 yard line. Goodnight would dive in from the 5 yard line six plays later. The PAT gave Salado a 14-13 lead, which would last less than half a minute.

The Bearcats returned the kickoff to Salado 42 yard line. Johnson took a

pitch into the endzone on second down. Jerry Echols connected with Gilbert Martinez for the two point conversion to give Moody a 21-14 lead, which it would not relinquish.

Salado scored on its first possession of the second half on a 41 yard Goodnight pass to Tim Powers. The PAT failed, leaving Moody ahead 20-21.

Moody scored on its next possession on a three yard dive by Lee Sykes. The conversion gave Moody a 20-28 lead.

Echols intercepted a Goodnight pass, which led to the Bearcats next score, a 5 yard run by Sykes with 4:58 left in the third quarter. The PAT failed to give Moody a 20-34 lead.

Salado turned the ball

over on its next two possessions, but Moody could not convert, leaving the game at 20-34 at the end of the third quarter.

Salado scored on a 52 yard drive in less than two minutes in the fourth quarter. The drive was marked by passes from Goodnight to William Culp for 14 yards and the touchdown pass of 21 yards to Berumen. The PAT failed, bringing Salado to 26-34 with 10:41 left in the game.

The Bearcats scored two quick touchdowns in the last three minutes of the game. The first capped a 67 yard drive, which took four minutes.

Berumen led the defense with 12 tackles.

At this time, Centel is proposing no offering of ExpressTouch Service in the remaining exchanges listed below due to the economic characteristics and the absence of the technical capability to provide the service.

Because the communities above currently do not have the economic characteristics or technical capability for the service, Centel has no immediate plans to equip these central offices with the software needed to provide ExpressTouch Service. The service will be made available to an exchange when there is a bona fide request for 895 ExpressTouch Caller ID features in the exchange.

ExpressTouch Service has new features that allow customers to turn their telephones into Personal Call Management Systems. ExpressTouch is a family of advanced call management features that provide customers with the ability to screen and record incoming calls. ExpressTouch Service consists of the following optional features:

Caller ID with Name allows customers to view the phone number and name of incoming callers before they answer, through the use of a display phone or adjunct display device. Initially, this feature will display both the name and number of callers located in exchanges where the service is available. Display phones are available for lease or purchase through Centel and retail stores.

Caller ID functions in the same manner as Caller ID with Name, but only displays the phone number and not the name of incoming callers.

Anonymous Call Rejection is a feature that prevents the completion of calls with blocked numbers. Customers can activate the feature by dialing a code which routes incoming calls with a blocked number to an announcement. The feature can be deactivated by dialing a code.

Anonymous Call Rejection works with both Caller ID with Name and Caller ID or as a separate feature on customers' telephone lines.

Two free blocking features will be available to customers who do not want their name and phone numbers delivered over the telephone network.

Per Call Blocking will block the delivery of a customer's name and number one call at a time. To activate Per Call Blocking, customers should dial the activation code (*67 or 1167 for rotary phones) before dialing an outgoing call.

Per Line Blocking automatically will block delivery of a customer's name and number on all calls. This feature is available at no charge to all customers who have a compelling need for it. Initially, Centel will send each customer a postage-paid reply card that will allow them to request Per Line Blocking. The service can be turned off free of charge on a per call basis by dialing the deactivation code (* 82 or 11 82 for rotary phones) before dialing an outgoing call. Upon completing the call, Per Line Blocking is restored. Per Line Blocking is not automatically placed on customers' telephone lines; it must be requested by the customer.

Return Call allows customers to place a call to the number of the last incoming call, even if the call wasn't answered and they don't know the telephone number. If the called line is available, the call is placed immediately. Otherwise, the customer's telephone will keep dialing for up to 30 minutes. When the called line becomes available, customers will be notified by a distinctive ring. When customers pick up the telephone, the call automatically is placed. Customers may have the feature activated to return several calls at the same time. Those who have Caller ID can see the name and/or number they are dialing on their display unit. Return Call will not return calls that are blocked by the calling party.

Repeat Dialing automatically redials the last number dialed from the customer's telephone, whether the call was answered or not. When customers receive a busy signal, they can activate Repeat Dialing and the phone will keep dialing that number without requiring customers to stay on the line. A distinctive ring will let customers know to pick up the phone for the call to be placed. Customers may have the feature activated to redial several numbers at the same time. Those who have Caller ID can see the name and/or number they are redialing on their display unit.

Call Trace enables customers to automatically trace the last incoming call, regardless of the time lapse since receiving the call. To initiate the trace, hang up, then lift the receiver for new dial tone and activate the feature for additional instructions. The number automatically is sent to the telephone company. The traced number will be provided only to the law enforcement agency you have contacted to receive trace information. If customers receive another call before activating the trace or the Call Waiting feature is used prior to activating the trace, the Call Trace feature will not record the desired number. Call Trace also will trace blocked calls. A fee will be charged for each successful call trace activated.

the manner in which our leaders and wannabees are examined by the media and the opposition parties, is more than he wants or needs to put up with - especially now that he is a multi-millionaire author who gets fifty grand a pop just for spending a half hour talking to loaded business and professional groups.

We have said, in this column, many times - the 1996 campaign is going to be a "tail twister" and worth every minute of time we can spend observing it from start to finish.

We also continue to maintain as well, that any knuckle-dragger who dares predict the outcome of the long and contentious campaign battles due to end November 5, 1996, needs immediate as well as long lasting help.

Parental Rights

The September 1995, issue of the University Interscholastic League's official publication - "Leaguer" contains some interesting highlights of the recent changes in the education code passed by the 74th Texas Legislature, particularly those giving parents a great deal more control over their children's attendance and non-school extra-curricular activities.

Parents will be making the important decisions

concerning how much time their children will be allowed to miss in non-school related activities as well as how many extra curricular events will be included in a youngster's after school schedule.

"In short, state legislators voted to give parents the choice to determine what activities their children would participate in and when they would participate in them," according to the UIL "Leaguer".

An example of this are the statutes that now allow students to take part in unlimited sports activities over and above the approved and sanctioned athletic events supervised by school personnel.

School officials across the State hope that parents will take a firm hand in determining how much time youngsters will be allowed to take part in non-school competitive sports as well as how many days they may miss school, since, according to the UIL, "the pressure will now be on parents to make (these) sound educational decisions for their children".

An important reason for control would be that over exposure in certain high impact athletic competitions, for young boys and girls, often gives rise to injuries that can last a lifetime, according to UIL officials.

Parents, under the new law, have the major responsibility to see that students do not lose a significant amount of class time which means they will have to exert control and discipline as well as staying in close contact with school personnel when it comes to missing classes even with permission.

Loss of school time and over-participation by students are the dangers and challenges faced by all who now make up the education team - parents, kids and school personnel.

This move to more parental control came as a result of a general feeling among lawmakers that mothers and fathers were being left out of the education phase of student's lives and the need to involve parents in a partnership with school officials with the aim being to provide better prepared high school graduates.

Also on the minds of state leaders was a desire to return to local control as many activities as possible relating to the education of our young people.

It remains to be seen if this new laissez-faire athletic and attendance regulations now on the law books will result in a better education for our future leaders or complete chaos.

Those attending from Salado were Deborah Van Dormolen, president of Chisholm Trail RW, Charlotte Fox and MaryBelle Brown. Others attending were Mary Gauer of Harker Heights, Pat Wilson of Belton, and Nancy Boston, Wilma Butler, and Anna Patton of Temple.

The theme of the convention was "Women in the Majority Party" and was a tribute to the 75th Anniversary of Women's Right to Vote.

There were 2,308 delegates, alternates and guests registered from all 50 states, Washington, D. C. and Puerto Rico. A large number of Republican elected officials from across the United States spoke to the convention. Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison was one of the keynote speakers.

Republican presidential candidates for '96 who addressed the convention were Gramm, Alexander, Wilson, Keyes, and Lugar.

In a straw poll conducted after the program, in which eleven hundred ninety-eight participants voted, the first place winner was Senator Gramm, followed by Alexander, second., Dole, third., Wilson, fourth., Keyes, fifth., Lugar, sixth., Buchanan, Seventh., Spector, eighth., and Dornan, ninth.

The results of this poll are highly significant because of the representation from all 52 political subdivisions in the United States. The National Republican Committee had requested that the convention refrain from conducting a straw poll. Members of NFRW feel history was made as they rebelled and proceeded with the poll. This report is a "scoop" for the *Salado Village Voice*.

Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) received a first-place Award of Excellence for overall achievement, as well as first-place awards for outstanding newsletter and most contributions to Republican candidates. All of the Bell Co. women attending are members of both TFRW and NFRW.

Both Chisholm Trail RW and Central Texas RW re-

ceived Diamond Awards. The Diamond Award is the highest honor bestowed upon a unit club and is based on excellence in quality of programs, membership enrollment, public relations, community education and service, participation in political campaigns, and volunteerism in both political campaigns and community service by individual members.

MaryBelle Brown received a first-place award for designing and presenting a program on Free Enterprise. This program honored all local Republican women who own and operate their own businesses in Salado. Special attention was given to the late Thelma Fletcher, who at age 90 was still operating her own business and who was cited as an outstanding example of Free Enterprise.
