## Chamber members to choose 4 directors from slate of 9

Salado Chamber of Commerce members will elect four directors to serve three year terms. Ballots with nine candidates for the four spots have been mailed to every member. Members will have two weeks to return the ballots to the Chamber of Commerce.

The following were nominated to the board by the nominating committee, chaired by Jap Barrett: Eldon Miller, Bea Stewart, Don Mackie, Darrell Street, Sue Carter and Vernon Holt.

The following were nominated from the floor of the general membership meeting Oct. 9: Ken Norman, Robert Denman and Virginia Cospier.

Brief background on each candidate follows. Each candidate was also asked the following question: "If Salado incorporates in January 1996, how do you think this will affect the role of the Chamber of Commerce?"

### Eldon Miller

Eldon moved to Salado in 1992 following retirement from Nationsbank-Texas in Dallas.

He and his wife LaNora are active members of the Belton First Baptist Church. As a Certified Public Ac-

countant, Eldon currently serves as a consultant to several area banks, including First State Bank, Temple.

Eldon is Treasurer of the Salado Lions Club and has been active in the Chamber's Long Range Planning Group.

"If we incorporate, the assumption is that we will have a city council form of government. I think the

Chamber of Commerce will assist in the transition to this form of government. The Chamber will then assume the more traditional roles of a Chamber of Commerce of promoting business within the community."

### Bea Stewart

Bea and her husband Bob have lived in Salado since 1968. They have four daughters and nine grandchildren.

The Stewarts are active members of the Salado United Methodist Church.

Bea is currently serving as President of the Ladies Auxiliary and in that capacity has also served on the Board of Directors of the Salado Chamber.

Bea is past president of the Monday Club and SPAT.

She also serves as Secretary of the Chamber's Long

Range Planning Group.

She is owner of B's Designs, an Earthware Company.

"I believe that the Chamber of Commerce will continue to bring about unity of the community. I don't believe it will be disbanded. We will have a different role, but we will continue," she said.

### Don Mackie

Don is General Manager of the Mill Creek Golf and Country Club.

He and his wife Sara and their two children moved to Salado in 1985. Sara is an independent video producer and serves on the Salado school board.

Don has been active in the Salado area since 1979 and is the general manager of Mill Creek Properties. He also serves on the board of directors of the Salado Water Corporation.

"The charter and by-laws of the Chamber are broad and provide for the greater good of the community in all its interests. I think the role of the Chamber will be the same whether or not Salado incorporates. The Chamber is a public interest group for Salado."

### Darrell Street

Darrell first moved to Salado in 1977 when he built and operated the S & W Grocery Store. Later he sold that business and moved to Boerne. While in Boerne he served on the City Council.

He returned to Salado in 1994 and is currently a manufacturer's representative for General Mills.

He and his wife Maudie are active in the operation of La Mansion de Salado.

They are members of the First Baptist Church of Salado. They have two grown sons, Shane, who resides in Phoenix, and Chip, in Las Vegas.

"I think it would have a drastic affect on the Chamber. It could become a true Chamber of Commerce, rather than the multi-faceted board it is today, trying to address many issues with no regulatory powers. If the whole village incorporates, as opposed to just the historic district, I think the role of the Chamber of Commerce as a sounding board for the people of the village would be greatly diminished."

### Sue Carter

Sue Carter and her husband Jerry, moved to Salado from Dallas in 1992. Since

that time, Sue has been active in community work including Project Chairman for the past two years of the Christmas in October and the Art Fair Quilt Sale.

Sue has served as a member of the board of directors of the Mill Creek Community Association throughout 1994 and 1995.

She is a member of the First Baptist Church of Salado.

Sue is employed by the International Evangelism Association, headquartered in Salado.

"The Village Council responsibilities of the Chamber would be taken over by the new town council and the Chamber would be left to function as a true Chamber of Commerce."

### Vernon Holt

Vernon Holt retired in 1990 following a career in the AA Energy Corporation. He moved that year to Salado. His wife Ann also

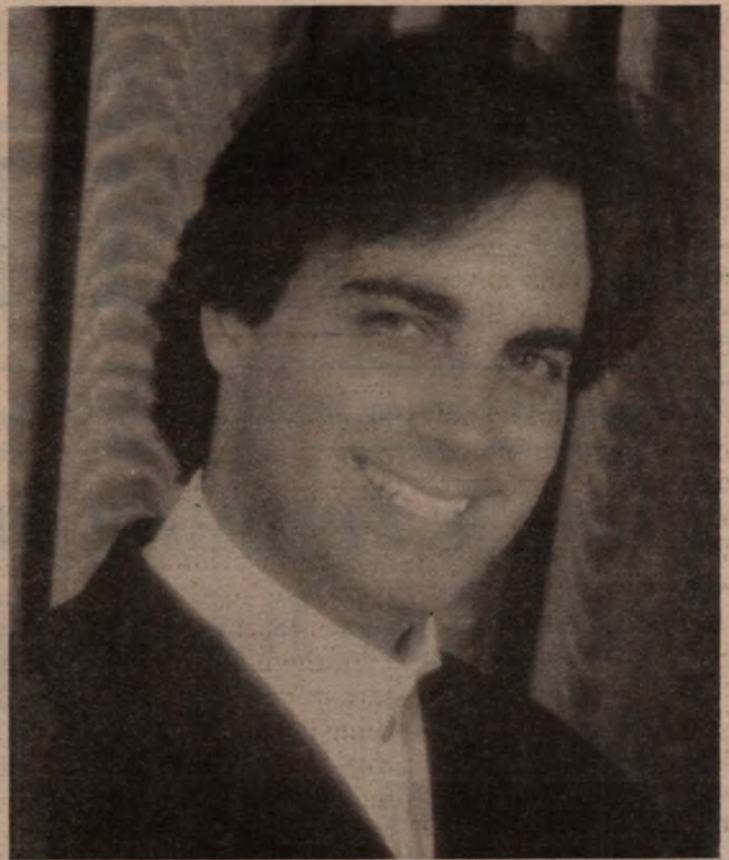

# Congress continues power broking

## Bad Changes Pending

Congress is about to repeal a number of nursing home regulations on the pretense that the States should be making these rules.

All in the not-so-holy name of saving tax dollars and returning control to the States.

What is being forgotten is what caused these rules to be put on the federal books in the first place in the late 1970's and 80's.

Can anyone ever forget the media exposure, not that long ago, picturing hundreds of shocking examples of mistreatment of older nursing home residents all the way from pure neglect to outright murder?

Nearly every state in our union was found guilty of gross maltreatment of seniors in nursing facilities.

On a personal note, I recall vividly the weeks spent with Governor Dolph Briscoe making unannounced visits to nursing homes throughout Texas - at all hours of the day and night.

Many of these homes left the top staff members, and the Governor, physically ill and emotionally drained. The stench, abuse of patients, and "sanitary" conditions that would not even come up to third world standards.

Following these trips, Briscoe pushed measures through the legislature that made a number of positive changes but it took the feds with their regulatory power and control of funds to make things work.

Unless someone is watching those who provide for our citizens and this goes beyond nursing homes and hospitals but must include everyone along the food chain from growers to retailers; the manufacturers of our medications; those in the food service businesses and on and on - unless there is rigid control at each step, from start to finish, in the delivery of life supporting foods, medicines and goods to our nation - we will all be the losers.

We need to be careful what we do in Washington in the name of saving tax dollars and returning control to States. Especially to states that are having to cut back on certain services to keep from raising new taxes - as in Texas for an example.

Fact of the matter is that

most States do not have a very good record of watchdogging anything, particularly when business profits are part of the equation.

State Legislators are far too close to the lobby's golden touch.

In the main, special interest groups have one thing in common - protecting their company or industry's interests, which translated, very often means profits must come before consumer protection or safety.

Some cases on point: the tobacco industry; meat processing industry and the trucking industry to name but a few. All three are currently seeking relaxed regulations from the federal government so as to improve the "bottom line" regardless of the consequences to the public.

And all three are potentially dangerous if left unchecked or unregulated.

Moving great powers to the States may not always be the best public policy - no matter how alluring it may sound when our leaders begin pontificating with such pious thoughts concerning our bad old liberal past and the grand new conservative future awaiting us just down the road a bit.

### Power Brokers

Very little news coverage on the "deal" cut between the American Medical Association and House Speaker Newt Gingrich over the massive medicare renovation plan that is on the verge of passing.

In order to get the AMA's blessing, old eye-of-the-Newt promised to let doctors alone to continue charging fees at the current rate schedule, to Medicare patients.

Prior to this bit of skull-duggery, medics were on the table for a bit of fee-cut-back surgery.

Now that their government paychecks are secure, AMAers are in full cry for passage of legislation that proposes to **whack \$270 billion off the Medicare bill** by the year 2002.

This smacks of the old time Democratic Party's high handed power brokering so decried in the past by GOPers. Now we

must think in more glowing terms such as panache and style - but aside from all that blatherskite, it must be pointed out that it will be these same doctors, whose fees have been preserved, who will greatly benefit from the **income tax reduction that is also in the wings - to the tune of about \$245 billion!**

Not wanting to defy the powers that be who yell "foul" when medicare slashes and tax cuts are discussed in the same sentence - we would dare to point out that the medicare savings will not be going into the medicare trust fund that will need a transfusion soon-and-often as we enter the new century.

No sir, it goes smack-dab into the general revenue fund whence will come the tax break - when that ill-timed nonsense sees the light of day.

Coincidence or bad timing - either way it looks like a power-deal has been struck.

## Friday 13th lucky for Eagles in 32-12 win

Friday the 13th was lucky enough for the Salado Eagles as they trounced the Hutto Hippos 32-12 at Eagle Field Oct. 13.

The Eagles jumped out to a 13-0 lead in the first quarter.

Tim Powers caught a 34-yard pass to score with 8:45 left in the first. Chris Frazier kicked the extra point.

Shawn Easley ran for a 40 yard touchdown with 5 minutes left in the first. The PAT failed to leave Salado with a 13-0 lead.

Frazier added a 42-yard field goal with 1:25 left in the half to give Salado a 16-0 lead at half-time.

Salado would double that score in the second half.

Shawn Reichert dove in from the 1 yard line with 11:51 left in the fourth quarter to top a 60 yard drive. Frazier kicked the extra point to give Salado a 23-0 lead.

The Hippos were able to score with 8:30 left in the game on a 7 yard run by Trinidad Rodriguez.

The extra point was blocked and Shawn Easley picked the ball up and returned it 99 yards for 2-points for the Eagles.

Reichert scored again with 5 minutes left in the game on a 22 yard run. Frazier added the extra point.

Cort Laurence scored on a 22 yard run to give Hutto the final touchdown with 1:02 left in the game. The extra point failed, leaving Salado with a 32-12 victory for the first district game.

Easley led the offense with 106 yards on just 5 carries, a 20.1 average per carry. Reichert followed with 76 yards on 121 carries and Berumen had 75 yards on 9 carries.

The Eagles totalled 312 yards rushing and 131

yards passing. They turned the ball over only once.

Salado was called 11 times for 115 yards in penalties.

The Hippos had just 24 yards rushing and 206 yards passing. They turned the ball over four times.

The defense was led by William Culp with 15 tackles, Berumen and Rusty Wasik with a dozen tackles and Jerry Ratliff with 10 tackles.

Easley had an interception as did Berumen, Culp and Wesley Glaeser.

The travel to face Somerville 7:30 p.m. Oct. 20. The Yeguas lost to Rogers in the district opener.

The Salado Junior Varsity Eagles continued their

winning ways beating the Hutto Hippos 28-0 last week.

John McLaughlin scored the first two touchdowns in the first quarter.

I want to thank the Salado general membership and the Chamber Board for the opportunity to appear and speak on behalf of those concerned Chamber members who proposed the equal voting rights and open meetings by-law amendments to the Chamber membership. Although we are disappointed that a greater number of those Chamber members present and voting did not vote to adopt both proposed amendments, we are all deeply grateful for the many Chamber members who took the time to attend the annual membership meeting and vote to restore the pre-1993 equal voting rights and to preserve the open meetings requirement of our by-laws.

Since the by-laws reserve the power to amend the by-laws exclusively to the general membership at its annual meeting, it is too late to amend the by-laws with respect to open meetings before the next time the general membership convenes. It is not too late, however, for the Board to act through the 1995 dues structure process to eliminate an inequity to more than 200 single-vote members and restore the pre-

1993 equal voting rights to all Chamber membership categories. I sincerely hope that the Board promptly takes advantage of that opportunity.

**Dear Editor:**

I write regarding the annual Chamber of Commerce meeting of October 9. From my perspective as a resident of Salado of over 25 years and as director of the Institute for the Humanities at Salado for 15 years, I have grown to love our village, cherish its civility and its remarkable volunteer spirit. The Institute brings speakers to Salado from throughout Texas, the United States and Europe, and our audience comes principally from Salado, Temple, Waco, Austin, San Antonio and Dallas but other parts of Texas as well and from other states. Our speakers almost without exception have been deeply moved by our civil society and sense of uniqueness of Salado. We have many letters on our files from people, who speak worldwide, of the highest respect and affection for their experience in our village and

admiration of the people who come to hear and dialogue with them. I who travel widely, know that there is a special ambience in Salado which cherishes the values which are, unhappily, fast disappearing from America. It is all the more important that we maintain our special qualities here because they could quickly erode.

Several of our supporting foundations have told me that America desperately needs such islands or oases to balance the increasing materialism, technocracy, callousness, meanness and violence that is beginning to mar our country and it is in villages such as Salado from which basic values can take root and spread. Proposition One last night was unwittingly aimed at the heart of family values.

The Chamber of Commerce meeting was not a good example of the spirit of Salado. The outcome of the vote was a triumph of democracy by an angry and bitterly divided audience. Having decided the issues, we must all have the grace to accept them and go on

Grace Jones has been a merchant in Salado for over 30 years and certainly has the respect of her fellow merchants. Virginia Matthews has been a merchant for many years. Geneva Aiken who has served so faithfully the Stagecoach Properties is an active member of our Merchants Committee.

Some have come to Salado as merchants while others have become merchants and most love the village and try diligently to meet the highest standards in our businesses. Many will want to retire here and no longer be merchants just as many other folks have retired and live here.

The merchants have been aware of the lack of a voice to be heard about our concerns and also the lack of permission to speak those concerns at Chamber board meetings for the past year or so. We felt a need to equalize our chances to speak by doing it the American way of having an equal vote. Merchant dues to the Chamber

of Commerce range from \$75.00 to \$160.00 per year. I now regret that I did not stand and inform the audience that our spokesman, Mr. Ken Norman, who was on the agenda was not hired by the merchants and has not been paid one dime. He is a merchant with a bed and breakfast who asked some questions at the merchants meetings that no one had an answer for. We asked him to read the legaleze in the by-laws and tell us exactly what they say and do not say. The only money spent for legal fees has been paid by the board of the Chamber of Commerce in the past several months.

Our reason for more open meetings of the board is so that everyone may have an opportunity to know what is decided that concerns the whole Community and be discussed to avoid conflicts.

The merchants of Salado are always the first to be approached for every fund raiser for our village. We respond and do it because we want our community to be special. We support the *Salado Village Voice* and we support each other. Because of our business location, The Royal Emporium, we have an opportunity to direct people to other businesses as well as give directions to delivery people looking for businesses and homes in Mill Creek as well as other areas, and we do it

willingly and with a smile.


I feel that I have a right to speak after 18 years of volunteerism and giving, having served as the Chamber of Commerce Auxiliary president and more committees than I can remember. Robert has served three years on the Chamber Board and one year as president of that board, when there was no secretary and no telephone listed for the Chamber. The Salado National Bank and Stagecoach switchboards received most calls and referred many to Robert in his office -- yes, *night calls* as well -- and some from very disturbed people.

Many things have been accomplished through hard work and cooperation in the past and it can be the same again. We cannot afford to have our community divided into "us" and "them" because we are all an equal part of this community.

It is your duty as members of the Chamber of Commerce to attend the meetings so you can be informed first hand. You are also invited to attend the merchants meetings, first Thursday each month, 9 a.m. at the Civic Center. Everyone is welcome.

Keep in mind the merchants are not bad guys. We are all good guys who work hard and diligently,

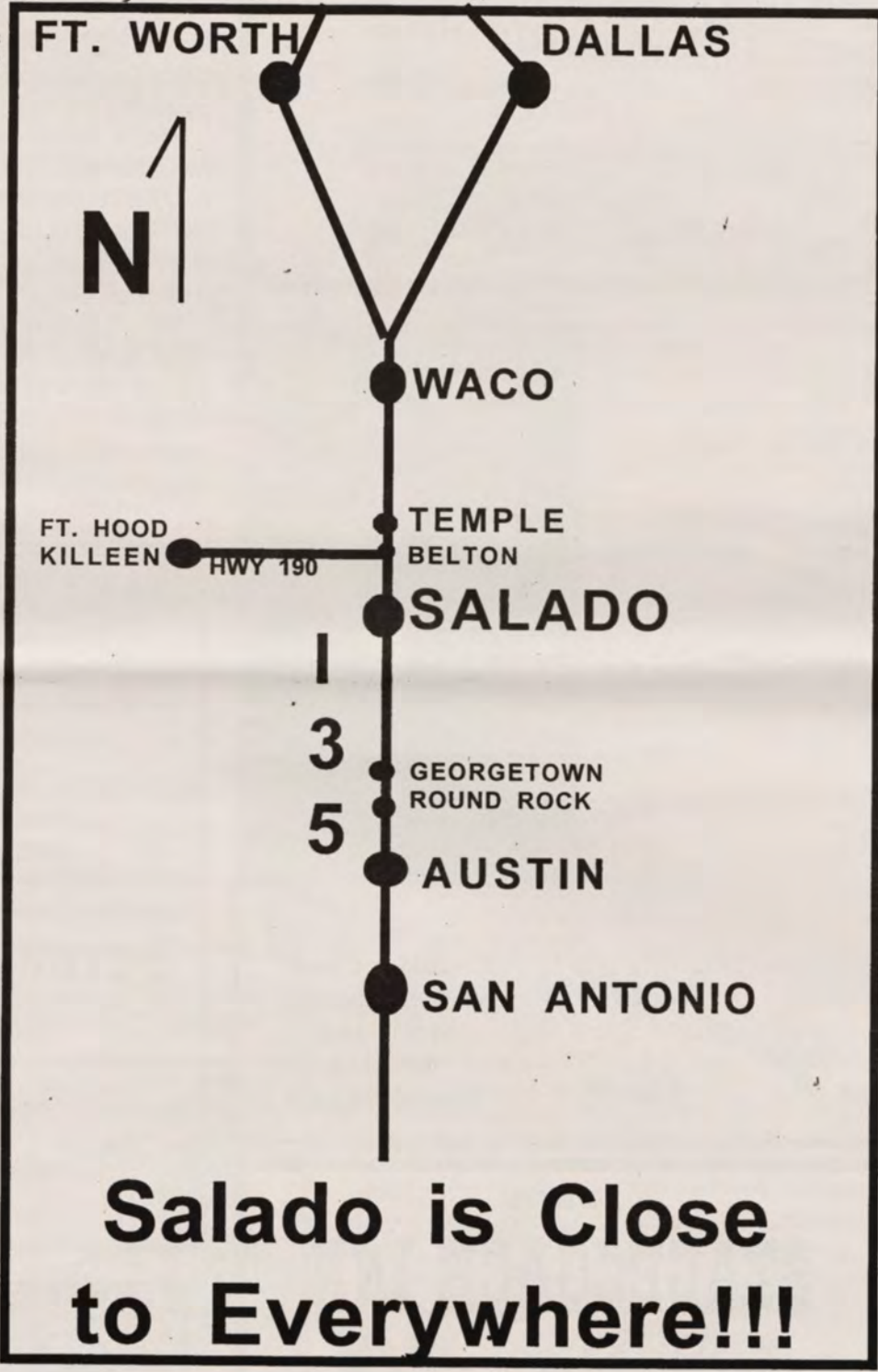

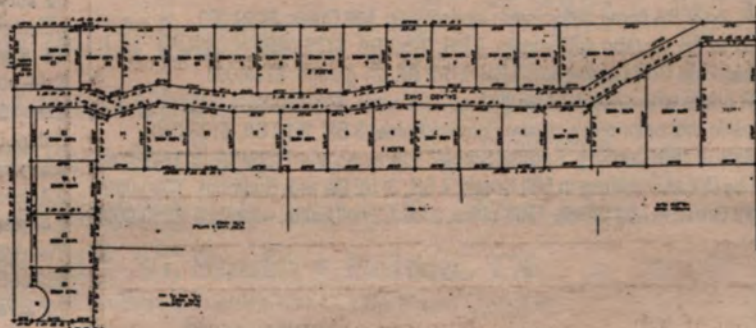

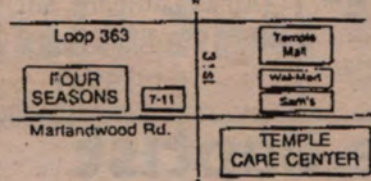
