## SISD settles with Dr. Kinsey Salado Library offers videos for checkout much like books

The Salado I.S.D. Board voted unanimously to reach an agreement with former superintendent Nolan Kinsey during its regular meeting Feb. 15.

The agreement called for paying Dr. Kinsey \$35,000. The board voted on the motion by Tom Berrier and second to the motion by Jerry Adams.

Following is the wording of the agreement:

"The Salado I.S.D. has reached agreement with Dr. Nolan Kinsey regarding his ongoing dispute and controversies with the district. The purpose of the compromise settlement agreement was to compromise doubtful and disputed claims, avoid litigation, and buy peace. No payment to Dr. Kinsey is to be construed as an admission of liability, all liability being expressly denied. Consolidated administrative appeals before the State Commissioner of Education have been dropped. The settlement amount of \$35,000 includes payment

to Dr. Kinsey of retirement monies previously taxed to him and refunded from the Texas Teacher Retirement System."

The board of trustees also entered into an agreement with BGLY Architects. BGLY Architects will commit to meet with the board and teachers for input on a possible new school, Superintendent Steven Ervin said.

Ervin further explained that "no money is due and payable until the district passes a bond issue. If, after several possible bond issues fail, the district will pay \$20,000 to the firm for drawing the plans."

The agreement states that the district will hire BGLY Architect for work on the project should a bond issue pass.

After a short executive session, the board extended the contracts of the district's athletic directors and principals.

The board voted 5-1 to extend the contracts of Boys' Athletic Director Dan Wasik and Girls' Athletic Director Larry Salisbury for two years. Grant Critchfield cast the dissent-

ing vote.

The board voted unanimously to a one-year extension of elementary principal Rod Stockstill's contract, with a two-percent pay raise. It also voted unanimously to a one-year extension of Richard Brown's contract as high school principal.

The board further defined its policy for use of the "ag pickup," purchased with federal monies earmarked for vocational programs.

By a 5-1 vote, the board decided not to charge vocational agriculture instructor Brit Owen for driving the truck to and from school. Any other personal use of the truck will be charged to Owen at 27-1/2¢ per mile. Voting against the policy amendment was Critchfield.

Sup. Ervin reported to the board that the district is owed approximately \$177,435 in delinquent property taxes, "which is normal for this time of year."

The board also voted to pay \$131,431 in monthly bills.

For library patrons the library can obtain PBS Documentary Series videotapes such as *The Brain*, *Mystery*, *Nova*, *Civilization*, *Symphony* and *Opera* by borrowing each from the Central Texas Library system. Simply, fill out a loan application at the Salado Public Library circulation desk. You will be notified by telephone when your order arrives at the library. All you pay is return postage. It's as easy as that.

## Demolition Man

Boy, Warner Brothers spent an awful lot of money to make an awful movie: **Demolition Man**, a futuristic story of violence in a non-violent society.

Sylvester Stallone stars as a brutish 20th century cop cryogenically frozen for 40 years for crimes he did not commit. He is thawed by the LA police force which to apprehend a ruthless killer. Wesley Snipes co-stars as the killer from the 20th century who escapes his icy prison to wreak havoc on 21st Century LA.

**Demolition Man** is very reminiscent of **The Running Man**, which starred Hollywood's other beefcake, Arnold Schwarzenegger. Both are about truly frightening Orwellian societies in which freedom (and all the troubles that go with this American ideal) is void. But lacking Orwell's ability to turn the future into a cold, dark place, Warner Brothers turns it into a circus.

Warner Brothers should stick to making cartoons, because it evidently cannot make a decent movie. Regardless, Warner Brothers will release **Demolition Man** to video March 2. It will be available at IGA Village Foods Videos.

You can nearly always tell when it is time for our top State elected officials to run for reelection. They begin spouting familiar words they imagine will secure our attention and votes including such homilies as: "No New Taxes" and "No State Income Tax." Added to this list of "guaranteed" pitches is the newly popularized holy grail of the political world insofar as for those who are running for the first time: "Term Limits".

All of this foolishness may boomerang this year despite Governor Ann Richards and Lt. Governor Bob Bullock's pontificating on the evils of new taxes. The last time they did this taxes went up rapidly at the local level for such needs as education, local government expenses, welfare and health. Actually this no-new-taxes bit is wearing a little thin as our property taxes take hit after hit as governmental costs are driven downward by those who want to remain in office without facing the fact that some new taxes are needed at the state level. Some state needs, such as education, should have a broader base than the homestead and other ad valorem entities. The sales tax comes close but the day will come when we will have to turn to the income tax at

the state level to take the pressure off the land and home owner.

Actually the State income tax is sort of like the incorporation dirge played periodically in Salado - words that are to be avoided but headed our way sooner or later. Just a matter of time. Our only hope is that the income tax replaces permanently the ad valorem levy and that incorporation does not bring out the petty tyrants among us to run city hall and tax our merchants and home owners out of town!

### Final Figures

The Civic Center's board of director's received, a few days back, the final word on the total cost of the village's renovation project of the high school building on Main Street. The original cost estimate of \$401,654 was overrun by a respectable 4.6 percent bringing the total to \$420,149.72.

The board approved payment of the final bills that drew to a close perhaps the largest and most significant project in the current village history.

With the payment of the final renovation costs it must be remembered that work is not complete. Landscape planning is under-

way and needing funds. Work on the storage barn area is being studied. The civic center itself needs a number of further work projects including some painting, window shading and the purchase of furniture and equipment. Paving needs completing for parking and the list goes on - all awaiting funding that will come in due course. The building itself is functional and in use daily and is a living monument to the spirit of this community - a village dedicated to the proposition that through volunteers no project is too large. Can you imagine how long all this would have taken had it been a governmental project.

### Upcoming Meeting

A meeting of importance that is scheduled for the civic center auditorium to take place 7 p.m., March 17, will feature an update on the battle to stop the proposed rock crushing plant scheduled for the area next to the Boy Scout Camp Tahuaya and near the Stillhouse Hollow Dam. Using a town hall meeting plan, local citizens will be brought up to date on legal and environmental levels being pursued to stop the quarry. Villagers would be well advised to attend due in large measure to the impact all this will have on our air and water, not to mention the assault on our ears due to the noise factor of dynamiting in the quarry pits.

recognized. One of these people is Dale Kehn, the manager of IGA Village Foods.




No bad foods, just  
bad eating habits,  
says nutritionist

Children should learn there are no "bad" foods, only bad eating habits, says a nutritionist at the USDA's Children's Nutrition Research Center.

Instead of banning certain foods, parents can teach their children to make wise food choices by including them in menu planning, grocery shopping and meal preparation.

"It involves more effort but parents should think of it as an investment in their children's health," said Dr. Corinne Montandon, an assistant professor of pediatrics at Baylor College of Medicine.

Montandon said meal planning does not have to be an elaborate undertaking. "Begin by offering your children healthy choices: 'Do you want chicken or fish, broccoli or green beans, custard or fruit?'" she said.

"Challenge them to come up with their own suggestions and try to honor as many as possible," she

added.

Montandon encourages parents to use the new USDA Food Guide Pyramid when menu planning.

"The food pyramid outlines what to eat each day and helps children visualize the food groups," she said. Eventually, children will become more involved in planning their snacks, many family meals and even weekly menus.

Once the menu has been planned and a shopping list completed, children are ready for a trip to the grocery store, where they can help pick out vegetables and fruits, whole-grain breads and cereals and their favorite yogurts. Choosing groceries with your children is a good way to discuss which foods are healthy and why, Montandon said.

When selecting prepackaged or canned products, parents can set an example by reading labels.

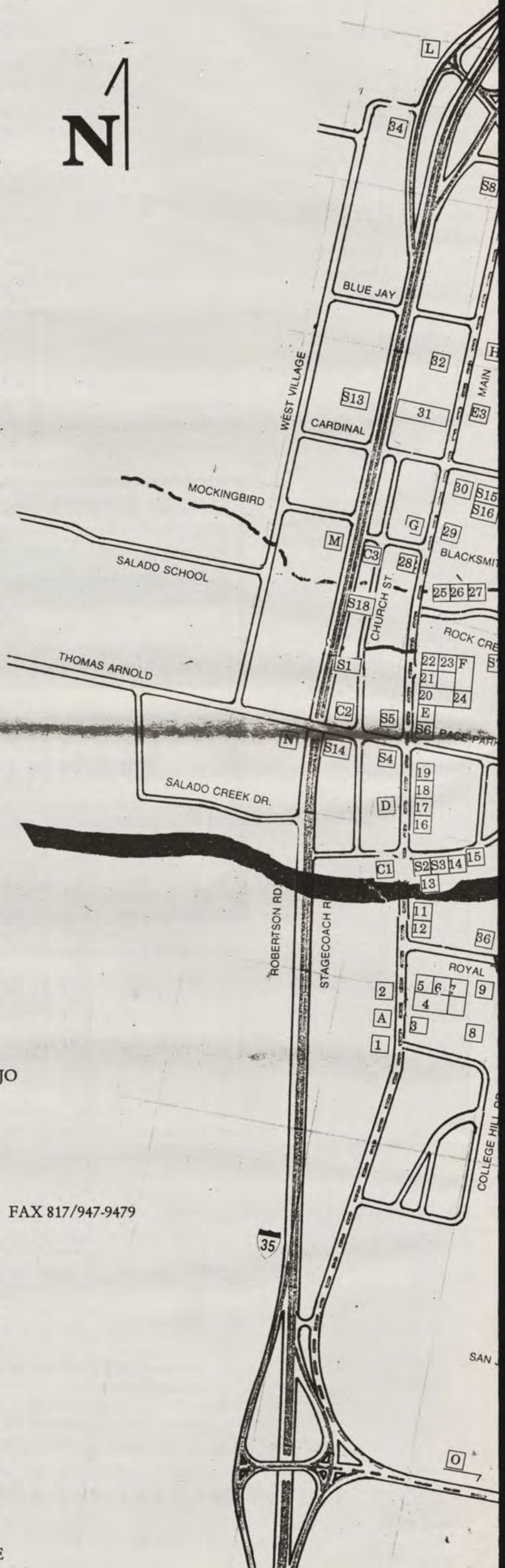

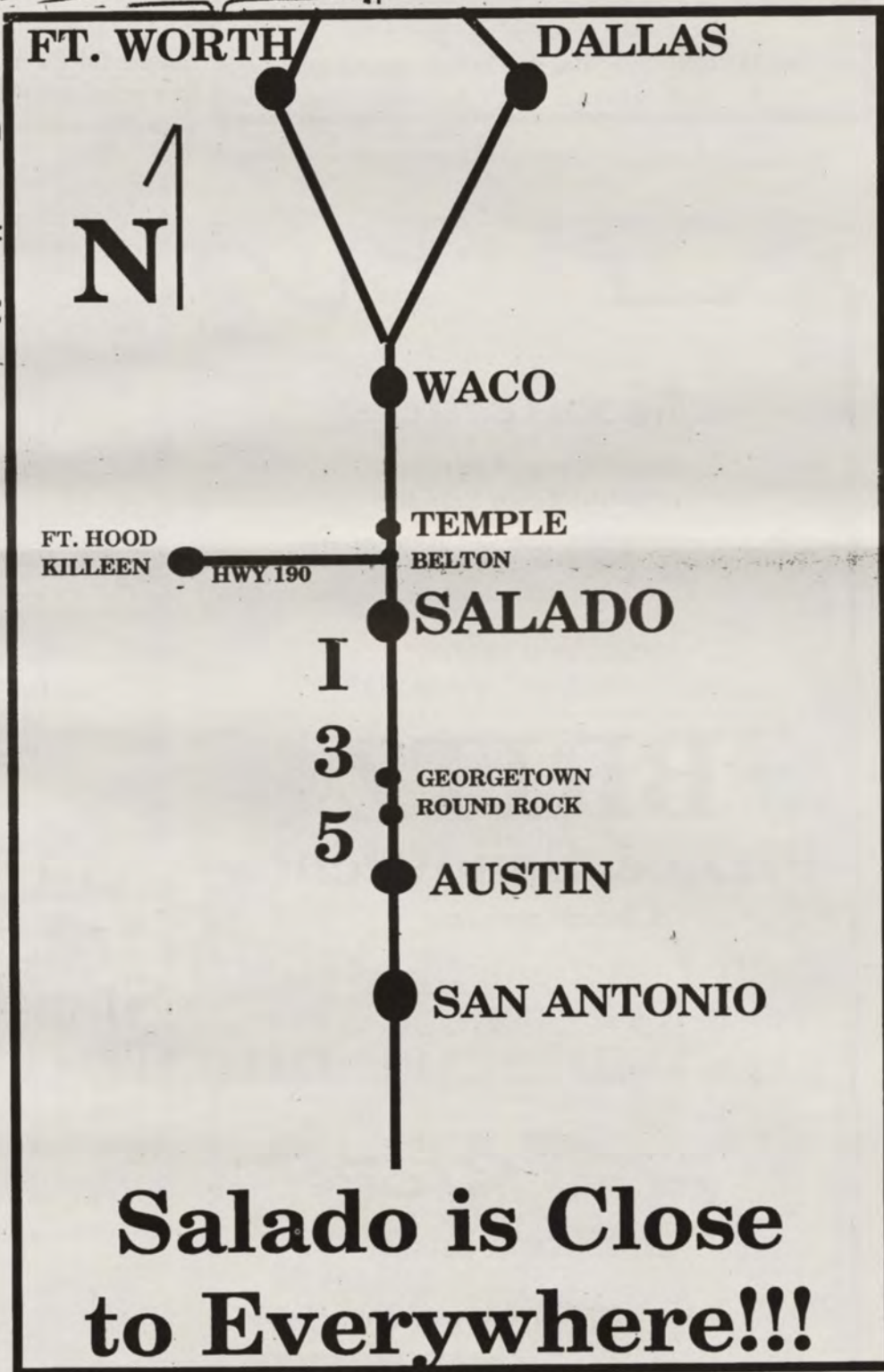

"Children will soon learn that labels provide information that can help them make healthy choices. Labels will tell them the amount of fat, salt and sugar in a product as well as serving size and number of calories," she said.

Montandon believes children are more likely to try

new foods if they have had a hand in preparing them.

It is important to match a child's ability to the task, she said. Toddlers can pour pre-measured ingredients into a bowl and wash vegetables, while preschoolers can stir ingredients, toss salads and snap beans.

Older children can peel vegetables and prepare many easy-to-follow recipes.

"Eating patterns are established early in life. If we teach our children to value good nutrition and make wise food choices, they will enjoy a lifetime of healthy eating," Montandon said.

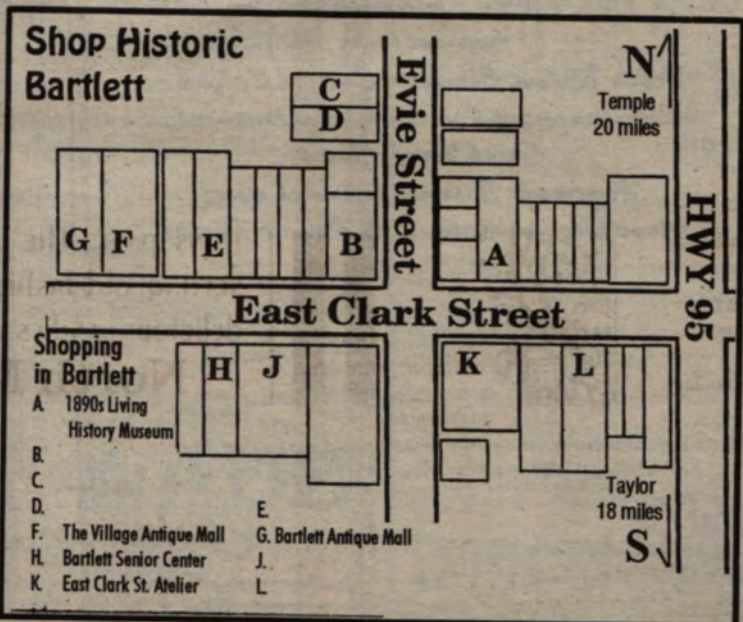
