## Warning sign to be posted about water quality of Salado Creek

Warning signs will be placed along popular swimming areas on Salado Creek within two weeks warning swimmers of possible exposure to high amounts of fecal coliform. In addition, the Texas Natural Resources Conservation Commission began extensive testing of the water quality of Salado Creek this week. The tests are expected to continue for a month.

Six signs will be placed in three different locations on both banks of Salado Creek. The signs will be located between the east access road of I-35 bridge and the Main St. bridge. The Bell County Public Health District is placing the signs at the request of

the Texas Natural Resources Conservation Commission, Brazos River Authority and the Salado Historical Society Creek Watch Committee.

The signs will read: "Water Recreation Should Be Avoided Due to Poor Water Quality."

"No one is ill. No one has been reported sick," said Wayne Farrell, Director of the Bell County Public Health District. "Because the counts of fecal coliform exceed the water quality criteria established by the TNRCC, the signs will be posted to inform the public of possible exposure."

TNRCC has established water quality criteria based on different uses of the water, according to Larry Fergusson, Water Program Manager of TNRCC, Re-

gion 9. An acceptable level of fecal coliform in bodies of water used for recreational purposes is 200 cfu/ per 100mL of water.

Tests by The Salado Creek Watch Committee and the Brazos River Authority have shown fecal coliform counts as high as 2,745.5 in Salado Creek.

The Salado Creek Watch Committee, chaired by Pat Merrill, alerted the TNRCC and Brazos River Authority to high amounts of fecal coliform in April. The counts continued to rise in May and June.

The BRA tested the water in several areas of Salado Creek June 29. The results are published here.

The TNRCC began this week extensive tests of

## Anticipation growing about Salado Art Fair

Anticipation, of the 28th Annual Salado Art Fair Aug. 6-7, increases as it nears time to set up the shade tents, mark off the booth spaces and issue the final marching orders for the myriad of volunteers.

The Salado Art Fair is set in Pace Park. Admission is \$3 per person, free to children age 12 and under. The gates will open 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. Saturday Aug. 6 and 10-5 Sunday Aug. 7. A free booklet containing the map of each artists' booth location is available when you purchase your ticket.

In addition to the many artists that show all styles of painting, sculpture, wood crafts, clothing and handmade toys, Southwest art and a variety of basketry will abound.

Revival of the natural, reproductions of an ancient art, and depictions of ancient civilizations will be presented by several of the artists.

Mona Eagle said, "The past is always reflected in the present and I seek to

convey through art that connection which links us to our heritage." Mona will bring Southwest art in the form of serigraphs (silkscreens) in small limited editions that are hand-printed by the artist.

Fascinated by the poetry and wisdom of ancient peoples, Mona Eagle combines word with image to depict their myths and symbols. Her work springs from many unexpected sources such as Native American petroglyphs, Greek pottery, Egyptian hieroglyphics as well as classical and modern art and poetry. Her interpretations and arrangements of these basic elements are uniquely her own. From the haunting hunchback flute player of the Plains Indians to the soaring tales of Ulysses, her work speaks about a past that is ever present.

Mona Eagle holds degrees in English and Art and has pursued further

## Trustees hire teachers at meeting

The Salado I.S.D. Board of Trustees met in regular session July 19 at the High School Computer Room.

Among the items on the agenda were bookkeepers and tax collectors reports, amending the budget and paying bills.

In other business, the board considered a local sick leave policy and a plan for Worker's Compensation, Self-Insurance Joint Fun.

The board also swore in new board member Gary Bartlett, who was appointed to fill the position vacated by Grant Critchfield's resignation at the last board meeting.

During a July 13 special session, the board accepted the resignation of teacher Betty Anderson. The board also hired teacher aides Dana Thomas, Linda Farr, Liz Wolff and Kim Wilson. Pattie Cambell was hired as librarian. Melany Parmer Cearley was hired as counselor.

The district continues preliminary work on a 1994-95 school budget. Superintendent Steven Ervin learned this week that taxable property values have increased in the district by 9 percent.

The Bell County Tax Appraisal District valued taxable properties within the school district at \$129,619,846 for 1994. In 1993, taxable values were \$119,197,174. The \$10,422,672 increase is 9.2 percent.

In August, the SISD Board will have hearing to adopt the budget and establish a tax rate.

"These will be public hearings and will be advertised in the local paper," said Supt. Ervin.

"The SISD Board of Trustees will take the month of August to study the budget and eliminate waste," Ervin added. "It is projected the rate will remain the same for the third year."

## SISD Supt. has new address

*Your Golf Swing: Consistent?*

(NAPS)—Without a consistent swing, the only time you will hit a long, straight ball is by accident. To hit good shots consistently, the downswing must be what is commonly known as "inside out." That means the club head approaches the ball from inside the line of flight. When this happens, the ball is sent along straight and true. When the club head approaches the ball from the outside, a crooked shot is certain to follow.

a scant six years away! This year alone an expected all time high of 750 students will register during the first days of school next month.

The board is looking at two possible scenarios to make room for the increased student population. Both will require the sale of bonds hence will need voter approval. The first plan would be to build a new middle school on the present Thomas Arnold Road campus plus additions to the elementary and high school buildings.

Plan number two would be to build a brand new high school facility on a new campus. Both construction plans include an administrative annex for the superintendent and business office.

The trustees are working with school architects to nail down design and costs related to each plan and once this is completed, according to Superintendent Ervin, the several plans plus school board recommendations will be presented at a town hall type meeting. This is expected to take place early this fall.

**Bond Issue**

Following the community gathering, the board is expected to call for a bond issue vote. The total amount of the bond requirement as well as the impact on each home and business owner will be made public and fully explained to every citizen. The time line following approval of the bond issue that will finance the construction indicates site work beginning late this year. Completion by summer of 1996, with student use by the first day of school that same year.

One of the good things about being a veteran citizen in the Salado ISD is that after age 65, the tax on one's homestead freezes, so if a bond issue is approved and a natural increase in the tax rate follows - all of us old codgers (and codgerettes) will not see a hike in our tax bill. Fact is, the addition of new schools always increases the value of homes and businesses so it is one of those "win-win" deals for the mature taxpayer as well as the same "win-win" plans for the younger generation with kids in school who will benefit from less crowded and newer facilities.

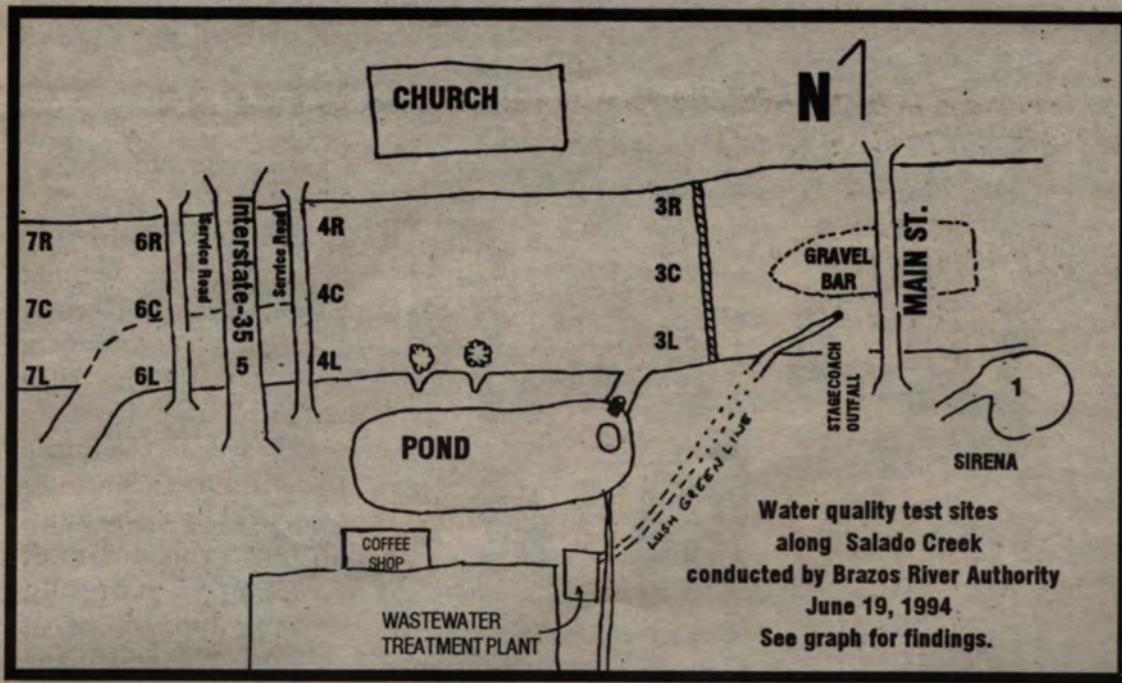

water from Salado Creek to determine possible causes for the fecal coliform in the creek.

Indicator tests will be done to determine if the fecal coliform is from animal waste or human waste, according to Ferguson.

Dye tests will also be done to identify a potential source of sewage into the creek, if the fecal coliform is determined to be human waste.

Bill Bratton, owner of The Stagecoach Inn, wanted to be sure that his business has not contributed to the contamination in Salado Creek.

Bratton contracted a bacterial investigation of the

creek and The Stagecoach Inn Pond and the Inn's waste water treatment plant. Applied Microbial Technology, Inc., from Georgetown reached many conclusions.

The first conclusion: "Sampling clearly indicates that the Stagecoach Inn effluent is not a contaminating source of water, but actually a diluent to the stream bacterial counts." Kenneth L. Richardson's report said.

"The date which we properly collected does demonstrate that the creek flowing from under the Interstate and frontage road is polluted slightly above recreational quality (fecal col-

iform count 430 CFU/dL). This water becomes cleaner as it travels downstream (fecal coliform average 282 CFU/dL) from the frontage road to the dam," Richardson states in his report for Applied Microbial Technology.

"The introduction of the waste water treatment plant effluent significantly improves the water quality. The stream samples at the Sirena are only slightly cleaner than the samples from the stream adjacent to the pond upstream from the dam and downstream from the Interstate," Richardson stated further.

study in Commercial Art. She is a member of the Austin Graphic Arts Society and Austin Calligraphy Guild. She does free-lance illustration, design and calligraphy. Her main interest is in serigraph, but she also utilizes airbrush, pen and ink, watercolor and pastels. As a native Texan, she strives to imbue her work with the vibrancy of the Southwest and its timeless splendor. She currently lives in Cedar Creek, Texas.

**Charles and Gerry Nickells** booth will display with some unique and unusual, totally natural baskets at the exhibit. The elements used in their creations range from palm leaves covered with coco bark from coconut trees to coyote hides, rabbit furs and pheasant feathers. The handles are usually created with deer antlers or some type of animal horn.

The authenticity of their artistry has drawn much attention from two Indian nations. So much attention that the Indians purchased baskets for their tribal museums located in Arkansas.

The couple present their skills at a limited number of shows a year in Hous-

ton, Kerrville, New Orleans and Lafayette Louisiana. This will be the fourth year that Charles and Gerry will return to the Salado Art Fair.

Another variety of basketry will be presented by **Baskets by Bill** whose owner and creator is a retired corporate attorney William C. Phelps.

Phelps accents the natural weave with a variety of earthy colors offering a variety of baskets, including Appalachian styles, Nantucket Light Ship baskets and the unique double-walled baskets using techniques developed by the Cherokee Indians.

Observing techniques from other basket makers, studying books and trial by error, Phelps is a self taught basket maker who has been exhibiting since 1982 and sharing his talent with others in workshops.

He exhibits in many juried shows including the Texas Arts and Crafts Fair in Kerrville, Texas for 7 years, where he was elected and served as an Artist Representative for two years.

Other juried shows include Central Pennsylv-

nia at Penn State University, the Three Rivers Festival in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and shows in Oklahoma City and Tulsa.

Join these fine craftsmen and artists at the Salado Art Fair Aug. 6-7.

Richardson further asserts in his report that "Ratios of fecal coliform to fecal streptococcus of greater than 4.0 typically indicate domestic waste, while ratios of 0.6 or lower are common to discharges from farm animals and stormwater runoff. Obviously, the water upstream indicates domestic waste is already significantly tainting the recreational quality of this creek."

After reviewing the report from Microbial Applied Technology and the results

of the Brazos River Authority tests, Bill Bratton came to conclusions of his own.

Bratton told the *Salado Village Voice* that Stagecoach Inn would post signs along both banks of Salado Creek on Inn property which state: Posted: Access to stream prohibited from this property."

The Health District, TNRCC and Stagecoach Inn all admit that there will be no formal enforcement of the signs, but that the signs give fair warning

to those swimming in the creek.

"I think we will see signs like this going up near bodies of water across the state," Fergusson said.

Fergusson drew a comparison of the fecal coliform counts in Salado Creek to an ink spot on a king-size white sheet.

"Regardless of how clean and white the rest of the sheet is," Fergusson said, "all you can see is the ink spot."

## Rural Health Care Group established

The Texas Rural Health Care Reform Group announced that it will work to insure the special needs of rural Texans and small communities are not ignored in the upcoming health care debate in Washington, D.C.

The initiative is part of a non-partisan coalition of farmers, ranchers, businesses, labor, health care providers, older residents, consumers and other rural Texans. The group wants to improve health care coverage and benefits for the more than three million residents of rural Texas.

Rural Texans face many dilemmas and thousands have literally gone without adequate health care for no other reason except that they live in areas not served by medical professionals or facilities. Rural Texans generally are not as healthy as residents of urban areas and are more likely to be affected by chronic health problems and experience injuries. These conditions are worse for low-income and elderly rural residents.

Even with these great needs, rural Texans use fewer health care services than their urban counterparts. Higher rates of chronic or serious illness often make insurance unavailable because of pre-existing conditions. Many who have insurance worry that their coverage will be canceled if they use health care services. Texas has 205 rural counties and ninety percent of these are classified as Medically Underserved Areas.

The Texas Rural Health Care Reform Group called for legislation to address the following problems plaguing this area of the state and similar areas around the nation: . Lack of doctors, medical professionals and health care facilities in rural areas;

Insurance which is too costly and often higher than urban areas because it must be purchased individually or through a small business;

Poor public transportation and accessibility to health care and emergency facilities;

Closure of rural hospitals and clinics which increase pressures and costs on urban medical centers, and

Elderly Texans, who represent a large portion of rural residents, are especially vulnerable due to the increasing problems of transportation, cost and quality of health care.

The Texas Rural Health Care Reform Group called for national health care legislation which will address these special concerns and provide for universal coverage, comprehensive benefits and protection from spiraling costs. Also, the group called for a fair and equitable financing plan to meet the health care needs of all Americans, whether they reside in rural or urban areas of the nation.

The Texas Rural Health Care Reform Group participates with the National and Texas Health Care Reform Project to advocate for comprehensive reform of the United States' health care system through enactment of national legislation.

## YOUR GARDEN

### Tips For Gardening With Allergies

(NAPS)—There are ways to minimize discomfort if you have a green thumb and a red nose from allergies:

- Showier plants pollinated by insects are better choices because these flowers' pollen grains are larger and do not bother most people. Less "attractive" plants rely on the wind for pollination and thus have smaller pollen grains that can cause allergies through inhalation.

- In most areas of the country, the worst pollen-allergy causers are: *Trees*—including oak, olive, western red cedar, elms, birch, ash, hickory, pecan, poplar, sycamore, maple, cypress and walnut in the early spring, and then pollinating grasses such as timothy, Bermuda, orchard, sweet vernal and red top. *Weeds*—such as ragweed, sagebrush, pigweed, tumbleweed, nettle, dock, lamb-quarters and cockleweed become a problem in the late spring and summer.

- Some believe you should select "nonallergic" plants for your garden which are less likely to cause allergy symptoms.

*Trees:* pine, pear, dogwood, plum, red bud, ginkgo, magnolia

*Shrubs:* Hibiscus, Yucca, Pyracantha, Viburnum, boxwood

*Lawns:* Dichondra, Irish moss and bunch grasses

*Flowers:* poppy, peony, azalea, pansy, *Bulbs*—tulip, iris, Ranunculus, daffodil

- Some gardeners with allergies use black plastic mulch instead of straw to keep down pollinating weeds, dust and mold growth. (This also has the added benefit of warming the soil and helping crops such as tomatoes and melons mature faster.)

- Have someone else mow the lawn and hoe the weeds along the edges of the garden regularly.

- Choose the time you garden carefully. Evenings are best, as plants have stopped pollinating. Right after a thunderstorm is a good time to garden for those with pollen allergies—the rain washes the pollen out of the air—but a bad time if you have mold allergies. Take an antihistamine 30 minutes before gardening.

- Few people find they need a particle mask (available at the pharmacy) for gardening. Watering the soil regularly and thoroughly with a sprinkler will keep dust and mold from rising.

- Wear gardening gloves and don't wipe your eyes while working outside.
