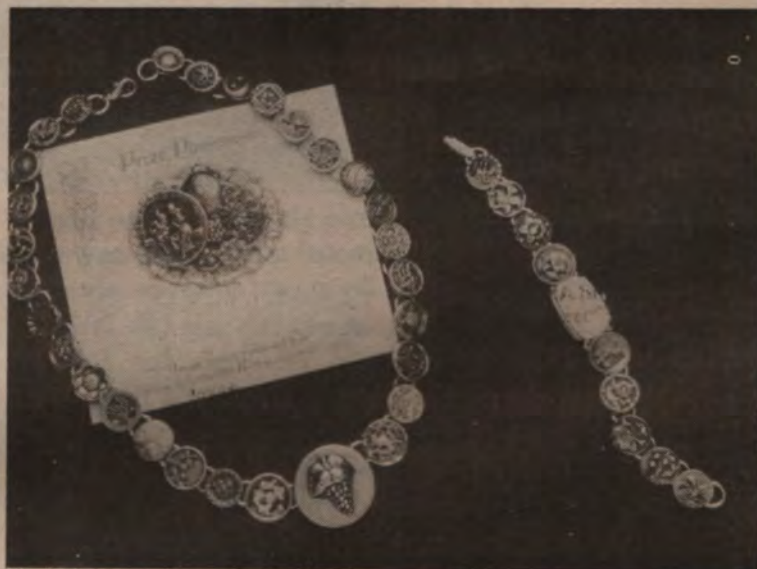
Making most with what you have...

but no increase in taxes

Trustees consider budget increase

Salado ISD Trustees are considering a \$3.4 million budget for 1994-95 with no foreseen tax increases, according to Superintendent Steven Ervin.

The board has discussed the budget in three meetings to date and will discuss it further in August before adopting the final budget.

Even though expenditures will increase over 3 percent, Supt. Ervin said the board expects to do this with no increase in local property taxes because of recent growth in the district tax base. (See story and graphic, July 20 Salado Village Voice)

The greatest expenditure for the district is instruction. The board expects an increase of 7.8 percent, or \$140,000, in this

area due to three factors.

The board voted earlier this year to increase the stipend for health insurance for employees from \$600 per year to \$1,700 per year. The board also voted this year to increase the local pay scale from \$1,000 above state base to \$2,000 above state based in an effort to retain and attract teachers. Finally, a state mandated increase of \$1,140 in teacher pay takes effect in 1994-95.

A second budgetary increase is for counselors. In addition to the increases in base pay, state mandated increases and health insurance increases for the present counselors, the board hired a new counselor for the high school. The district now has three counselors for elementary, junior high and high school. These factors contributed to a 42.7 percent increase

of \$32,000 in the preliminary budget.

The cost of maintenance and operation of the plant may increase almost \$62,000, or 15.6 percent. "We will purchase a portable building this year at a cost of \$31,000," Supt. Ervin said. "We will also have higher utility rates next year."

The 1994-95 preliminary budget includes decreased spending for general administration, library and transportation.

The board is considering a \$53,000 reduction in general administration costs because of the settlement this year of the Kinsey case,

Over the years when the subject of incorporation of the village of Salado came up there was always the question of paying for the various services demanded of a full blown city government. Taxes - that hateful "T" word - chilled any positive conversation and together with the personalities of who would be mayor, city council member and so forth, deep-sixed the matter for another two to three years.

Once the state began sharing their sales tax revenues with cities, many locals felt this bonanza would be enough to support Salado without other forms of taxation. Or at least keep the ad valorem levy within reasonable levels. Lot of speculation as to how much the sales tax would bring to Salado. Most of it incorrect. This column turned to the comptroller's office for the facts which proved interesting.

Last year the total sales subject to tax for the village amounted to some \$15,092,442.00. Had Salado been incorporated one percent of the total sales revenue would have come home and amounted to \$150,924.42 If the "city" added the normal half percent specific use tax - which most communities do - the

total take would increase to \$226,386. in 1993. Hardly enough to operate a city but sufficient to hold property taxes down a little.

If the "city" then followed the lead of other governmental municipal entities and slapped on the hotel-motel tax - which can run from one to seven percent above the sale tax - the total revenue for Salado might reach as high as a healthy four hundred thousand bucks a year. The occupancy tax, by the by, can only be used to promote tourism but what it does in most cities releases other tax dollars normally spent on museums, historical and park development for use as general revenue.

Positive-side light from the comptrollers information: Salado has shown a steady million dollar a year growth since 1990 and averaged about \$800,000 a year in sales since 1984 when it stood at nearly \$7 million. An excellent growth pattern of business opportunities for now and the future.

Word of caution - we should not let these high dollar figures spook folks

into a pell-mell rush to incorporate. There is a lot more to all this than a so called "free" sales tax revenue enhancer. The above numbers are merely bits of factual information that are meant to displace emotional fiction that usually surfaces when we talk about Salado's future. They do however, point to one thing of importance - when and if folks start looking at incorporation again there is a real need to deal with fact such as these and not personalities and folk-lore type opinions.

There is room in this village for two sides of any question without getting into personalities. In fact - to avoid this particular bogey-bear - it would be a fine idea to insist that all those working on any future incorporation issue resolve in public not to run for city office should the matter pass muster - for at least ten years!

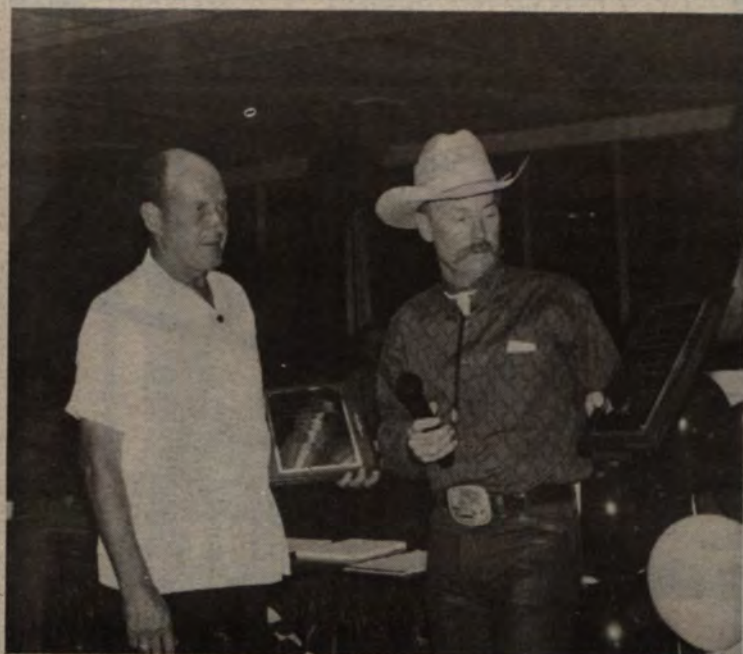

according to Supt. Ervin. "We settled with Kinsey for \$35,000, which is a final payment. We have no more legal fees for these cases. Our legal liability insurance

is cheaper next year because we do not have this legal case pending," Supt. Ervin said.

The preliminary budget cuts \$14,000 from the library, for a 14 percent reduction.

"We upgraded our library facilities last year," Supt. Ervin said. "We do not see a great deal of reason to upgrade present facilities when the upcoming bond issue will most likely in-

clude a new library facility of some sort. There is just not much more we can do with the present library facility."

Ervin attributes much of the reduction in transportation costs to a diesel fleet of trucks. Transportation costs may be cut 10 percent, or \$17,000.

Budget hearings will be held in August before the board adopts the final budget for 1994-95.

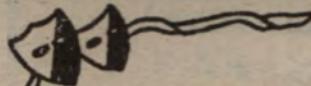

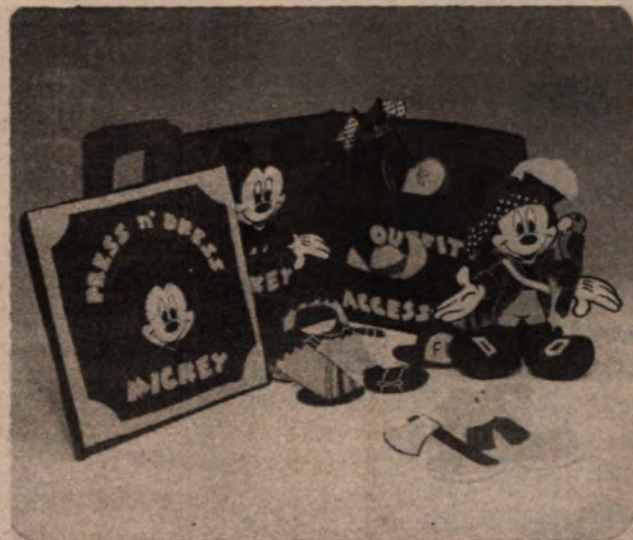

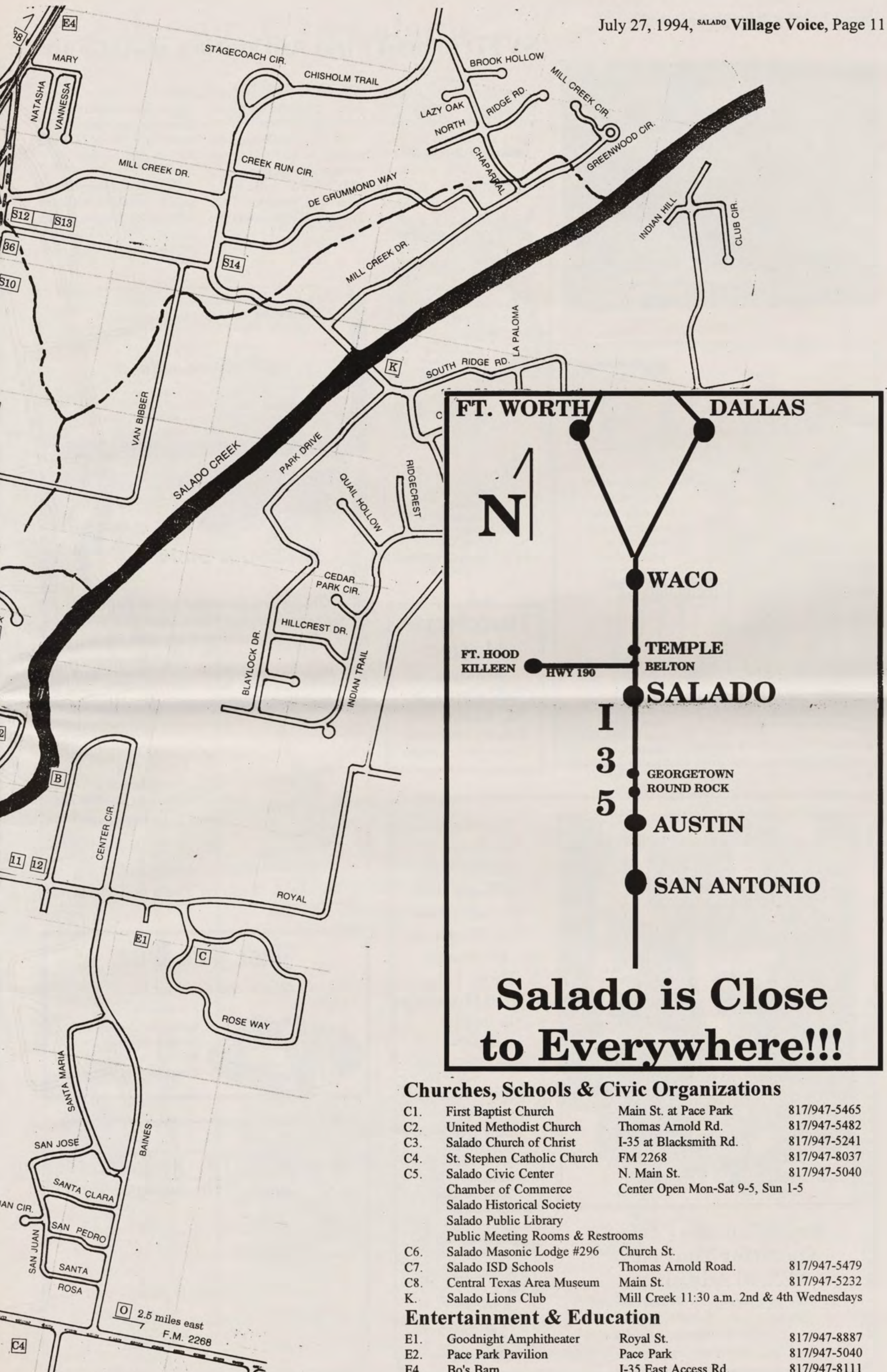

If not, we will be at the mercy of the legion of the liberal type environmental loonies who

inhabit our bureaucracies. Given their track record we may join the ranks of Austin and their futile battle with the one eyed salamander that keeps things stirred up in the capital city.

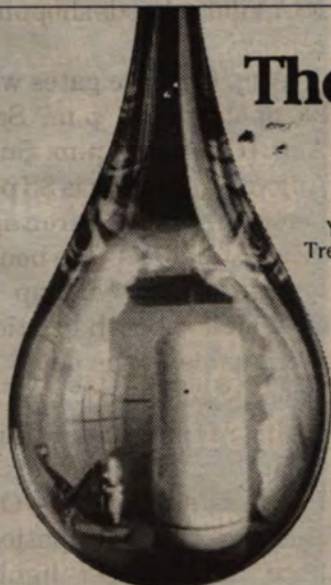



To the folks of Salado.

You've probably noticed all the commotion over at the TYLER HOUSE. Well, I'm the cause of it.

My name is Gene Street. If you've been around here a while, you might remember me as Ernest Gene, the son of Snookie and Billye Street, and the grandson of Ernest and Beulah Williams. I was born over in Prairie Dell. Not long after, we moved to Brownwood but there was always a lot of visiting back and forth. A lot of my relatives still live in Salado, Austin, Bartlett, Temple and Belton. You might remember some of them: Bunk, Pete and Buck Street, Truett and Guinn Williams, Granger Killingsworth, Robert Hodge and J.D. Hinsley. Anyway, I'm 53 now and I've been around a little bit, but in all that time, I've never found any place I liked better than Salado.

I live in Dallas. I moved up here after I graduated from Howard Payne University in Brownwood and got out of the Air Force, where I earned the rank of Captain and served in Southeast Asia, the Pacific and the U.S. I also got a master's degree in liberal arts from SMU. In 1972, a partner and I started a restaurant called the Black-eyed Pea, which grew to 47 locations. We sold them to a British company in 1986.

Since then, I've been working on a restaurant called Good Eats. Today we have 14 locations including three licensees in Austin and 11 locations in Dallas and Oklahoma City. I've also opened a restaurant in Acapulco and this September my Texas Embassy Cantina will open in London, England.

I'm known in Dallas for serving a great chicken-fried steak, but I've also operated several Mexican food restaurants including Mother Mesquite's and Tamales. Ever since I bought the Van Bibber place on Salado Creek (where I hope to retire some day), I've been thinking about how nice it would be to open a restaurant in Salado. When I heard the TYLER HOUSE was available, I couldn't pass it up. I'm excited to tell you that soon we'll be opening a restaurant in the TYLER HOUSE called *La Mansion de Salado*.

Whenever a newcomer shows up, even when he's a local boy, there's concern, so I'd like to say a few things up front:

FIRST, my biggest concern is preserving the historic character of Salado and the charm of the TYLER HOUSE. I wouldn't dare think about changing the architecture of that wonderful old house. I'm biased but I think it's already the most attractive structure in town.


