Eagles named All-District

Salado High School had 21 football players named to the All-District Team and Honorable Mention, including the Offensive Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year.

Jason Hosch was named Offensive Player of the Year by district 26AA coaches this week. Hosch carried the ball 221 times for 1,202 yards, to average 5.43 yards per carry.

Twin brother Jereme Hosch joined him on the first team offense as the other runningback. He carried 71 times for 457 yards, an average of 6.44 yards per carry.

Jerome Peoples caught 17 passes for 233 yards, for 13.7 yards per catch average.

Offensive linemen Marshall Adams and Jerry Soto were named to the First Team Offense.

Behind the offensive line, the Eagles rushed for 2,957 yards and passed for 603 yards.

Michael Sierra led the Eagle defense and was named the 26AA Defensive Player of the Year. He average 12 tackles per game and had 16 quarterback sacks and 28 tackles behind the line.

Senior Brian Hill earned the First Team Defensive Lineman position, averaging 10 tackles per game.

Joining him was Marshall Adams, defensive lineman, with 10 tackles per game; and Jerry Ratliff, defensive end, also averag-

ing 10 tackles per game.

Len Gillespie was named to the First Team Secondary with 4 interceptions for the year. Jereme Hosch rounded out the defensive team as the placekicker.

Rusty Wasik was named to First Team Defense at his linebacker position, where he tallied 11 tackles per game.

Jesse Finger was named to the second team offense as tight end, joined by Shane Johnston, as quarterback.

Finger was also named to the second team for his play at defensive lineman.

David Berumen was named to the Second Team Defense as linebacker and William Culp as safety.

Named to the honorable mention team were the following offensive players: Gabe Soto, tackle, David Dunlap, guard, and Kurt Salisbury, end.

Honorable mention defensive players were Shawn Easley, cornerback, and Ryan Cooley, lineman.

Salado Eagles were district runners-up.

In the first round, the Lady Eagles spanked Chilton, 77-26.

The Lady Eagles led throughout: 17-6 at the end of the first; 34-13 at the half, 56-22 at the end of the third quarter.

Kayce Moore led the scoring for the lady Eagles with 21 points. She also had 8 rebounds and 6 steals.

Laurelyn Hunter had 16 points and 7 rebounds for the game. Amy Jackson scored 11 points, with 4 rebounds.

Also scoring were Annie

Ray, 8 points; Michelle Martinez, 8 points; Marie Grigsby, 7 points and Elizabeth Boyd, 6 points.

The Lady Eagles faced their toughest opponent in the second round, defeating Lorena Lady Leopards, 57-46.

The Lady Eagles led by 16-10 at the end of the first, 25-20 at the half, 38-30 at the end of three periods.

Grigsby had a double-double with 23 points and 12 rebounds.

Ray contributed 11 points and 7 rebounds.

Also scoring were Hunter, 8 points and 17 rebounds; Martinez and Moore, 4 points each, and Jackson, 3 points.

In the championship game, the Lady Eagles routed Cameron, 64-26. The Lady Eagles led 18-6 after one period, 32-8 at the half and 50-12 at the end of three.

Four Lady Eagles managed double figures. Grigsby again led the scoring with 20 points, 6 rebounds. She was followed by Martinez, 12 points, 2 steals and Hunter and Boyd, 10 points each.

Also scoring were Ray, 4 points and Moore, 2 points.

Grigsby was named the Most Valuable Player of the Tournament. This is the second year in a row that Salado has won the Academy Tournament.

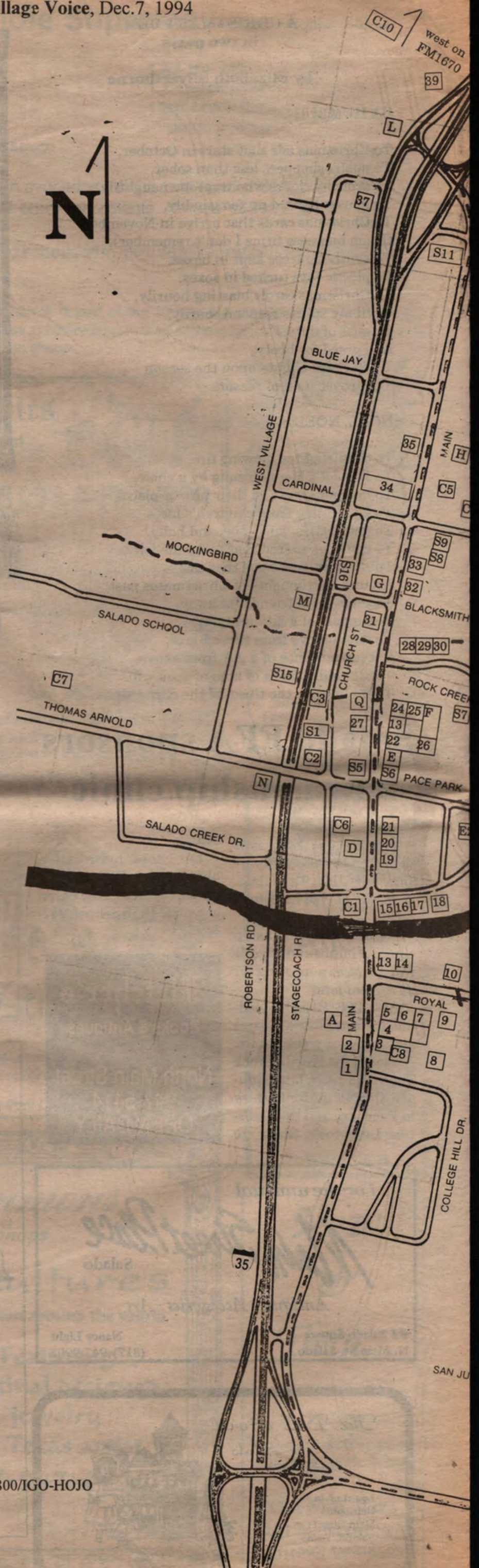

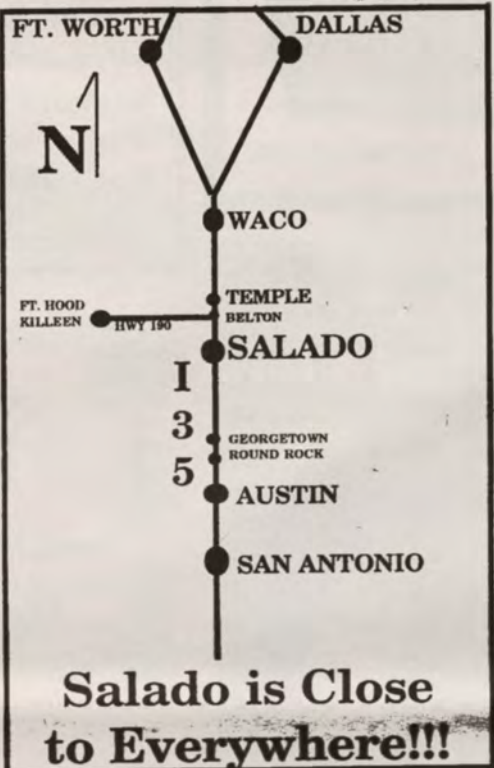
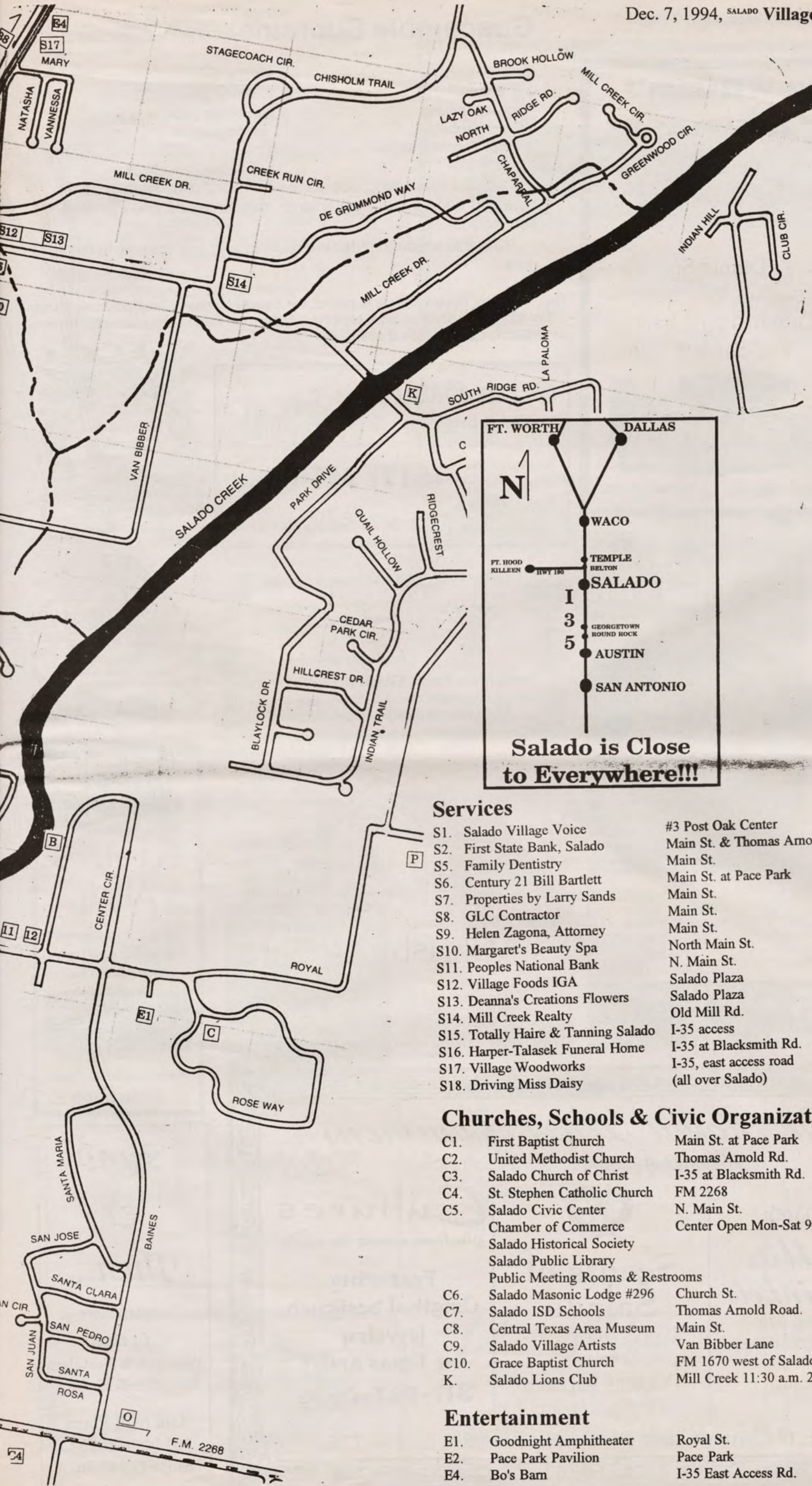

Watercress Butter

- 1/4 lb. (stick) unsalted butter
- 1/2 bunch watercress, leaves only, minced
- 1 T. lemon juice
- 1 tsp. salt
- Freshly ground black pepper to taste

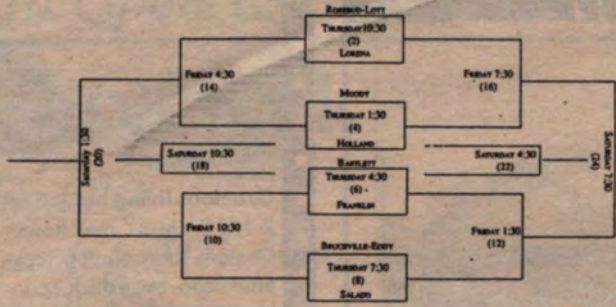

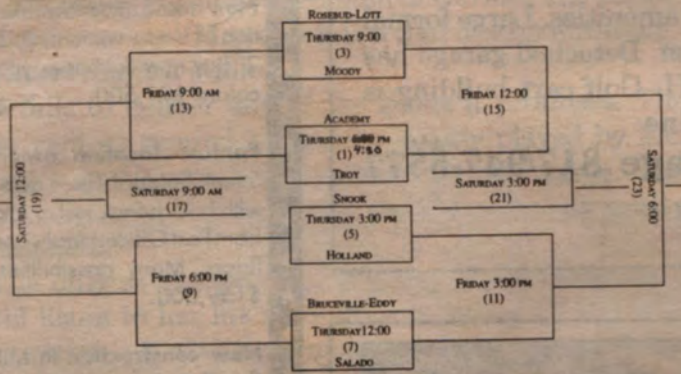


In 1990-91 he was named the Texas State Sculptor-Selected by the 71st Legislature in Austin.
