## Salado Art Fair Aug. 7-8 will feature 190 artists

Aug 7-8, 190 artists and craftsmen will be under the shade trees and tents in beautiful Pace Park for the 27th Annual Salado Art Fair.

The Salado Chamber of Commerce sponsors the Art Fair which draws over 10,000 visitors to Salado in August each year. For the convenience of visitors, **free parking** and bus trips to the grounds area are provided. **Handicapped parking** is provided on the fair grounds. A **hospitality tent** is set up for visitors to relax, have a refreshing drink and try some of the **variety of foods** that will be supplied by 15 Salado organizations.

Along with **t-shirts** that will be for sale, there will be chances to **win a hand-stitched quilt**, and the opportunity to **pick up a good book** from the friends of the library.

In addition to a day of shopping and viewing the works of master craftsmen and artisans, take time to **visit the Texas Volunteer Militia Civil War Reenactment group** that will conduct tours of their

encampment during the fair. Men, women and children will appear in period costume with their surroundings as historically correct as possible.

In the evening you don't have time to wind down, a dinner-theater presentation of **Salado Legends** begins at 7:30 p.m. at Tablerock Amphitheater. This is an chance to mingle with the artists, enjoy the play and feast on an **all-you-can-eat fajita buffet** all for the cost of \$15 adults and \$5 for children.

Proceeds from the Art Fair will help fund restoration of Salado's Old Red Schoolhouse, provide for up keep for Pace Park, pay for street lights, support various community projects and scholarships. The Salado Village Artist and the Salado Chamber of Commerce Auxiliary will serve as official hosts for the 27th annual Salado Art Fair.

Admission tickets are \$3 for adults and free to children 12 and under.

Hours the fair grounds will be open Aug. 7 is 9 a.m.-5 p.m. and Aug. 8 the hours will be 10 a.m.-5 p.m.



Salado Art Fair will feature stained glass artists as well as artists in many other media including oils, watercolors, clothing art, sculpture, wood art, to name a few. The Art Fair is in Pace Park Aug. 7-8.

## SISD Board meets, to begin budget process

*Salado schools face \$116K shortfall in funding from state,*

Salado I.S.D. trustees will be looking for ways this summer to cut costs in the 1993-94 school budget, facing a \$116,000 shortfall in next year's state funding.

Trustees will also consider an increase in local property tax rates. "Eighty percent of Texas school districts will raise taxes this year," said Salado I.S.D. Superintendent Steven Ervin. "We will have to be one of those 80 percent, but we hope to keep taxes as low as possible and continue to provide a quality education to Salado students."

Trustees are in limbo on

adopting a tax rate because the property values will not be released by the Bell County Tax Appraisal District until after July 25.

"When the Tax District tells us how much taxable property we have, then we will be able to set our tax rates for 1993-94," Ervin said.

Present taxable property in Salado I.S.D. is \$120 million, which generates \$1.5 million in revenues, approximately half of the districts revenues.

With the state reducing Salado's revenues by over \$100,000 next year, the difference will be made up

through expenditure reductions and increased taxes.

The board will begin the budget process during its next regular meeting July 13th.

During its last regular meeting, Salado trustees authorized the administration to put out bids for portable classrooms. Supt. Ervin said that bids have gone out for new and refurbished used portable buildings for use as classrooms. Presently, the district is considering use of one portable building with two classrooms as Thomas Arnold Elementary School

In other business, the board voted unanimously

to eliminate the Senior Trip. Motion was made by Grant Critchfield and seconded by Cindy Fisher.

The board also adopted a no-smoking policy for Salado I.S.D. campuses and entered into a lease/purchase agreement with Buzze Music Company, of Waco, for 51 new instruments over three years.

After a 30 minute executive session, the board voted to employ Marilyn Salsbury as a reading and bi-lingual education teacher. Her husband, Larry Salsbury, was employed by Salado I.S.D. in May to head the girls athletic department and to teach math.

#### School Dedication

It may not look like it right now - but the renovation of the old red school house on Main Street is moving along almost on schedule. Fact is, there are some definite completion dates being bandied about. Strong enough to give the Salado Chamber of Commerce and the Old Salado School Foundation a time frame to begin planning for the formal dedication of the structure. If work proceeds according to plan, the building will be ready for partial use in late August and full occupancy a month or so later. vided the principal participants can be scheduled properly.

Jap Barrett, Chamber board member, was named by Denver Mills, to head up the dedication proceedings.

Honored guests will include Congressman Chet Edwards, Meadows Foundation representative Anne Herrscher along with Morris Foster and Paul Meyer, the two largest individual contributors to the massive project. More details on the special day will be forthcoming but villagers can be assured that we are talking about "putting the big pot in the little one" as old timers like to say. Speeches, bands music, eats and more speeches will fill the program plus tours of the building and other exciting events still on the drawing board.

#### Antique

##### Show and Parade

The June meeting of the Salado Chamber Board of Directors was a busy one including some sweeping changes made in the annual Antique Show and Bluebonnet Parade. First and foremost is the site change for the Antique

Show. Next year it will be held in the school cafeteria in order to avoid sudden weather changes as seen this year as well as to provide greater security for the exhibitors and a cooler environment for visitors. Tentative date for the 1994 show is April 30 and May 1.

This change was approved by a unanimous board vote after being suggested by this year's show leader, Dave Gardner.

It was also decided to have the Bluebonnet Parade at a time different from the Antique Show, possibly earlier in the Spring so the two events do not compete and hopefully both will draw visitors to the village on two different weekends during the Spring.

#### Unique Feature

The school project, when completed, will have a unique walkway area in front of the main entrance made up of hundreds of special bricks, each with the name of a former student, current villager, interested contributor or memorial. The engraved bricks will cost \$100 each and will be set permanently in concrete. The Foundation and Chamber hope to sell at least 1,000 of these bricks in order to raise enough

## Historical Society to begin furnishing Cabin

The Salado Historical Society's Log Cabin Committee has announced its plans for the furnishing of its Boles-Aiken Cabin on Van Bibber Lane. The concept is based on the first uses of the cabin in the 1850's. One of the two rooms is to be furnished as a mail and stage station. The second room is to be furnished as an elementary school of that day.

The Committee, of Charlie and Ann Abbitt, Robert and Doris Denman and Pat Barton, has researched records and literature to identify articles used for a rural school and a mail/stage station.

Some significant items already donated are split log benches, coal oil lamps and stands, early school

books, chair chamber pot, tables, gourd dipper and a trunk.

The Historical Society is depending on donations from its members and friends. If you are willing to donate items of the period to the cabin please contact a committee member.

Critical items which are needed immediately are: pigeon-holer desk, teacher's chair and table, bunk or cot, with bedding of flour sacks, burlap or other coarse material, wash stand with pitcher and bowl, wooden bucket, metal coffee pot, cast iron cooking utensil, McGuffey's Reader.

All donations will be duly recognized with the donors name attached to the gift.



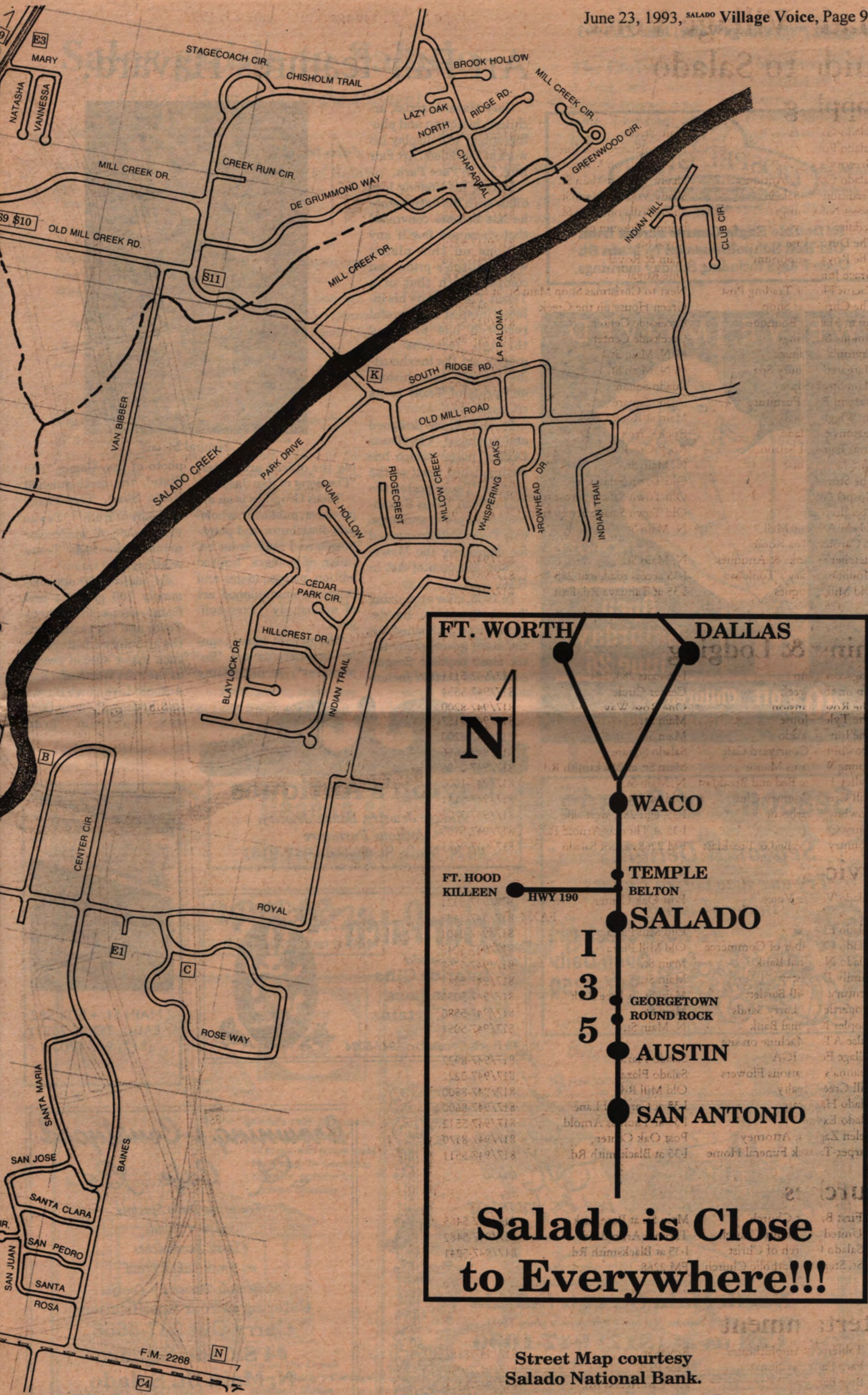

## Summertime snacking for kids

Summer time means more play time for children and an increased need for high-energy snacks, says a nutritionist at the USDA's Children's Nutrition Research Center.

"Parents can reinforce good eating habits this summer by providing their children with plenty of healthy treats," says Dr. Corinne Montandon, an assistant professor of nutrition at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

By giving some thought to snack selection, Montandon believes parents can meet their children's dietary needs while sending a positive nutritional message.

Instead of stocking the kitchen with chips, cakes, sodas and other high-fat convenience foods, she recommends the following summer snacks:

- \* frozen low-fat yogurt
- \* fresh fruits and fruit juices

\*frozen orange wedges, banana slices or grapes. (Grapes and other small snack foods should not be offered to children younger than 5 because they could choke.)

\*Milk shakes made with low-fat milk or fruit juice

\*finger-size servings of crisp, raw vegetables

\*peanut butter stuffed celery pieces

\*low fat sandwich meat rolled around pieces of fruit or low-fat cheese.

\*natural frozen fruit pops

\*whole-grain crackers, graham or animal crackers

\*unsweetened or lightly sweetened cereal

Montandon suggests posting a list of snack choices on the refrigerator door or designating a special area in the refrigerator or counter where snacks may be found.

For easy access, she recommends placing snacks on

easy-to-reach shelves, providing drinks in single-serving cartons and storing food stuffs in easy-to-open plastic containers.

Montandon also encourages parents to discuss appropriate snack times.

"To keep from interfering with regularly planned meals, snacks should be served one to two hours before or after a meal," she said.

Most children need three meals and possibly two snacks to meet their daily nutritional requirements, she said.
