Since the 1850s, Central Texans have celebrated America with Belton's Independence Day Celebration and PRCA Rodeo.

The Family Fun Carnival in Confederate Park began June 28 and continues 6 p.m.-midnight through July 4. It features concession stands and games operated by local civic, youth, and religious organizations plus great midway rides.

The Old West comes to life July 1st with the Annual PRCA Rodeo in the Bell County Expo Center. This year's rodeo will include an exciting Steer Saddling Contest between lo-

cal high school agriculture and rodeo clubs. A Stickhorse Grand Entry July 3 is scheduled for youngsters under 12 years.

Tickets are \$8 for upper level seats and \$10 for lower level seats each night of the rodeo. The rodeo will begin 8 p.m. nightly July 1-4.

A Patriotic Program is set to begin 9 a.m. July 3 on the courthouse lawn, followed by the annual parade down Central and Main of Belton at 10 a.m.

The Yettie Polk Park Festival 10 a.m.-5 p.m. July 3 will include arts and crafts, live entertainment, food and an Old Time Fiddler's Contest at 1:15

p.m.

The annual God and Country Concert in the Bell County Expo Center will begin 3 p.m. July 4.

The last event of the celebration will be the Wild West Celebrity Golf Classic with proceeds benefiting the Belton Area Chamber of Commerce Scholarship Fund.

The Celebrity and Five Person Scramble will begin with a shotgun start at 9 a.m. July 5 at Wildflower Country Club in Temple.

An entry fee of \$100 per player will include the green cart fee, range balls, fajita buffet, refreshments and prizes including a

chance to win a 1993 Buick Skylark from Trnum Buick.

Two golfers will win airline tickets to anywhere in the continental U.S. from American Airlines.

Among the celebrities expected to play are Grant Teaff, Bill Bates, Toby Metcalf, from Pure Country, Benny McArthur of the Ace in the Hole band, Alan Ashby of the Houston Astros and Brett Gideon of the Pittsburgh Pirates.

## Bell Museum to feature UMHB art students

The Bell County Museum will host an art exhibit from the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor art students through July 31. The show will consist of paintings, drawings, prints, photographs, jewelry, computer art, fiber art and ceramics.

Art works in the exhibit were chosen from the Spring student art show by Museum personnel Alice Burbank and Krista

Hartsell. "I was particularly impressed by the creativity and sophistication of the art work," stated Burbank, "The pieces on display represent the broad range of work being done by students."

Art Professor Hershall Seals remarked that "We are increasing in our Art Major enrollment and the quality of incoming stu-

dents gets noticeably better each year." Of the two dozen works in the display Seals said, "It shows that our students are willing to experiment with all sorts of ideas, media, and new technology including some computer, generated images."

UMHB offers the Bachelors of Fine Arts Degree in art and also Art certifica-

tion for public school teachers. Currently the Art faculty consist of Phil Dunham, Seals, Denny Pickett, John Hancock and Helen Kwitkowski. All hold the Master of Fine Arts Degree in Art.

### Shadow of the Wolf

**Shadow of the Wolf** tries hard to be of epic proportions, like *Call of the Wild*, *Last of the Mohicans* and of course, *Dances with Wolves*.

It falls short of the mark.

What would have been a good novel is a not-so-good movie. For one thing, suspension of belief is a much easier thing to achieve in a novel, which is mostly interpretative imagination, than in a movie, which is mostly visual and very literal.

Lou Diamond Phillips stars as Agaguk, an Inuit in Alaska cast out of his tribe by his father the shaman. He carries with him the curse of being hunted by the White Wolf.

Agaguk and his wife Igiyook face the Alaskan wilderness alone, hunt whales with northern tribes and eventually fight the White Wolf.

Meanwhile his tribe of people confront the White Man when Henderson (Sutherland) is sent to investigate the death of a white trader in the camp.

*Shadow of the Wolf* is very much a story of consequences and challenges. While it is beautifully filmed, it is much too fantastic to be captured on film. Instead, it should be captured in the imagination.

If the current brawl in Congress over the budget is not enough to convince citizens of the need for term limits, then - we just don't understand the problem. Both parties are to blame as each goes about merrily espousing foolishness - from the "tax first and cut spending second - maybe" Democrats to the Republicans who prefer "no taxes, no government, no spending, and protect the richest among us" sort of gridlock.

The political Class, as the members of Congress are called by Washington Post columnist George Will works hard at only one basic subject - fighting term limitation legislation. Not solving our debt problems or balancing the budget or even shutting down some of the more obvious pork projects like the space station and the super collider - no sir, time must be spent on staving off any plan to drive these maniacs from office before their retirement of choice as well as raising PAC money to stay in office.

Case in point - Speaker Tom Foley, whose Washington state voters approved term limitations recently, has gone to the bar seeking eventual supreme court comment on

such effrontery. A number of states - whenever voters got a chance at the ballot, have approved some sort of limit on the years folks can remain on the public dole as lawmakers.

If the Supremes finally get around to studying term limits and find they are within the purview of voters - we will see state after state put limits in place. There is no chance in getting all this in the constitution of the United States. That amendment has been bottled up in the House of Representatives for over a decade.

Can you imagine the fun voters will have in Texas when they watch their elected officials vote up or down the matter of term limits? Each member of the House and Senate will have home folks peering over their shoulder when that great day comes with 70 percent of all voters, according to one poll, in favor of limits.

This column has been "tub thumping" for limits for at least nine years. The return to "citizen legisla-

tors" will bring fresh air into State Legislature and more importantly into Washington. Next thing will be to cut back on the number of unelected federalists who take what their masters vote into law and twist it around for public consumption. These regulators are as bad or worse than the elected class, since they are responsible to no one. They are faceless but dangerous.

#### One Term Presidents

The mauling of President Clinton currently in progress by press, loyal oppositions and disenchanted Democrats is not totally self-inflicted although most of us feel he could do better. It is, rather, a signal that candidates who rail against incumbents and promise the moon to get elected - are going to be held to a high standard once in office. No human can deliver campaign promises that will satisfy the press, the congress or the voter. So the candidate says it like it isn't and the candidate becomes president. Stays in office for four years, fails to deliver and is ousted by the opposite party who in turn promises everything, fails

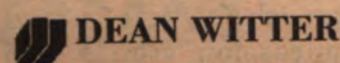

## Marble etchings, bronze sculpture artists to show at 27th annual Art Fair

The 27th Annual Salado Art Fair, Aug. 7-8, offers only the most talented artists and craftsmen carefully chosen from over 900 applicants.

Saturday the Pace Park will have the gates open 9 a.m.-5 p.m. to reopen Sunday at 10 a.m.-5 p.m.

### Marble Etchings

Norris Misemer, a graduate of the University of Kansas Business School, has been a Denton, Texas resident since 1981.

His love for black and white art and his background in marketing unique products led him to develop the etchings in marble, which his firm now distributes. With his innovations in technique, he has been able to take the old photo-chemical process to

reproduce engravings in marble reproductions of various artist work.

He is now busily engaged in a collectors editions of 18 of Frederic Remington's pen and ink etchings, transforming them with exact detail to etchings in marble. He compares the detail of the work to fine scrimshaw, but is quick to point out that acid etchings, not hand tooling is involved in the reproduction.

He has trained two full time employees to duplicate his expertise, but feels he must be involved in every step. Usually he can be found inking, sanding, polishing the marble or assembling the frames.

### Bronze

High Intensity action is the name of the game for

McKinney, Texas artist, Scott Rogers. The desire to make motionless bronze appear to be moving has become his obsession. His flare for action may stem from his years as a bullrider throughout Texas and Oklahoma. Coming from a ranching history, his love of the Old West comes naturally. The "Old West" theme dominates the story line of his work.

"The 'Old West' was mostly quiet and peaceful; but the right mixture of wild horses, guns and tough men made for moments to remember. As an artist, it is in capturing a few of these moments at their climatic peaks of action (that point which takes your breath away) which gives me the



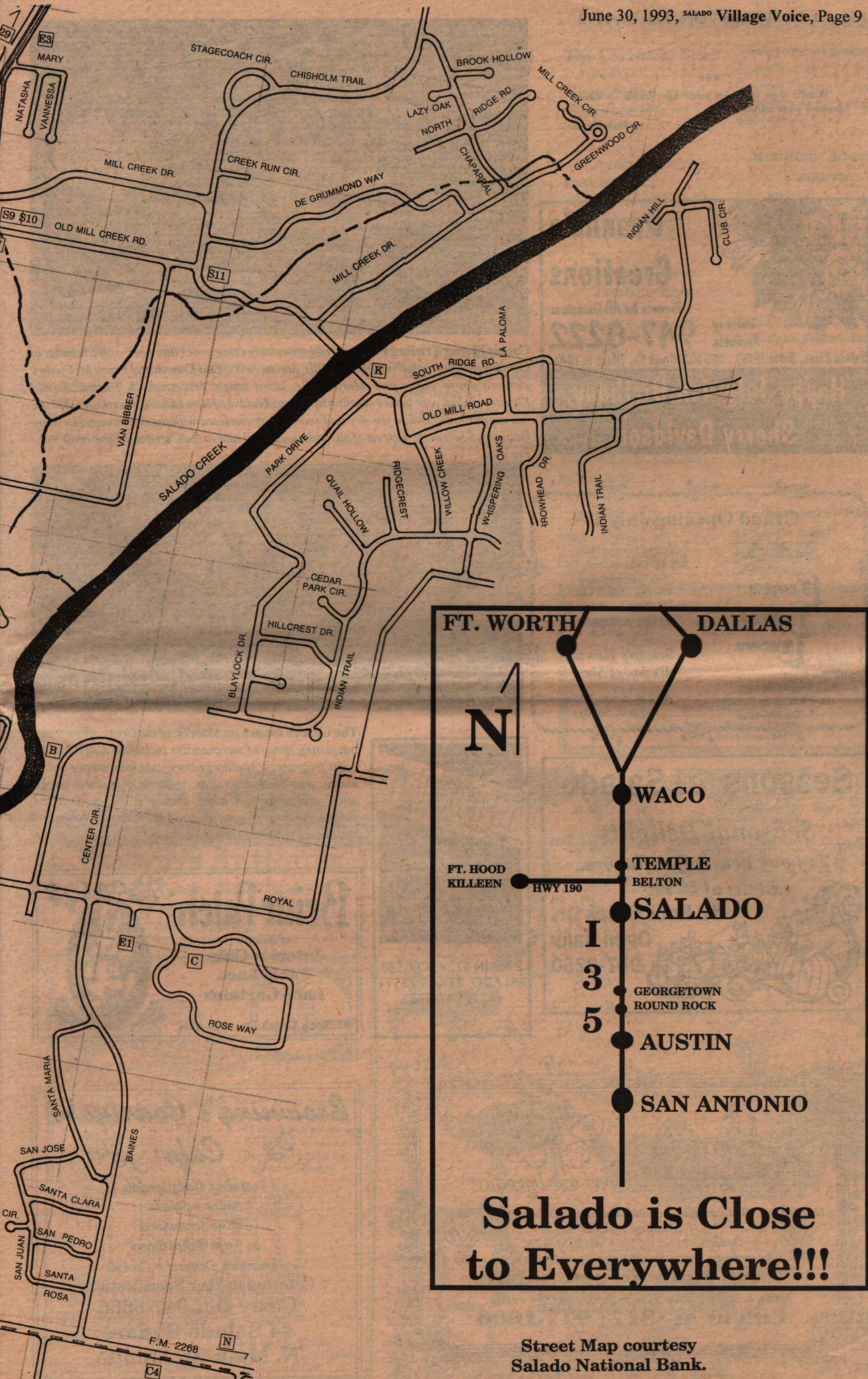

Returning to Belton in 1971 he entered into legal practice; 1975-1978 he served as City Attorney for the City of Belton; 1977-78 he served as president of the Bell, Mills and Lampasas Counties Bar Association.

Positions he has previously held include: Mayor of Belton; director, Peoples National Bank; president of Belton Area Chamber of Commerce; chair, Bell County Child Welfare Board; and secretary Belton Development Corporation and Belton Economic Development Council.
