## Salado Legends

*Original historical-musical-drama will have first performance July 24 at Tablerock*

The premiere performance of **Salado Legends** is set for July 24 at Tablerock Amphitheater off Royal St. in Salado. Tickets are still available for the opening show by making reservations, calling Fletcher's Books & Antiques at 947-5414.

The play will follow a 7:30 p.m. all-you-can-eat fajita dinner at 8:30 p.m.

The historical-musical-drama was written by Jackie Mills with original music and words written by Greg Berry, Wayne Garner, Richard Paul Thomas and Theron Palmer, all of

Salado, and M.L. Bolton of Belton and Rick Ford of Ft. Worth.

Melinda Danford and Brenda Francis choreographed the play, which will feature the Salado Creekside Cloggers and other dancers.

The Texas Volunteer Militia is scheduled to perform a Civil War battle scene for Salado Legends.

Salado Legends is the prehistory and history of the founding of Salado portraying the celebration of life on the frontier and the hard times of the Civil War.

Dave Jackson, a Native American from Yukon,

Oklahoma, will dance the Origin of the Tonkawa in the first scene of the play. Jackson played in the **Last of the Mohicans**.

Other scenes will include Scottish settlers arrive in Salado in the 1850s, Tablerock by the creek in the 1850s, Salado College, Shady Villa Inn, volunteers leaving for the Civil War, a sewing bee the Salado Saloon, and soldiers coming home from the War.

Tickets are available for \$15 per person, \$5 per child and includes the meal. Performances are scheduled for July 24, July 31 and Aug. 7.

Leaders within the Texas Legislature are very quietly going about some rather nefarious business these days that could spell trouble and increased taxes for the average Texan -- if we are not alert enough to nip things in the bud.

Add to this, the staff costs that would include typewriters, computers, desks, telephone lines and transportation and you are soon talking hundreds of millions for this misadventure into madness. All for having more people doing more un-needed things to each of us and making us pay for it to-boot!

## NFIB supports Edwards on budget vote

U.S. Rep. Chet Edwards (D-Tex) is receiving high marks from the nation's largest small-business advocacy organization, the National Federation of Independent Business, for his opposition to President Clinton's economic plan which was passed by the U.S. House of Representatives recently.

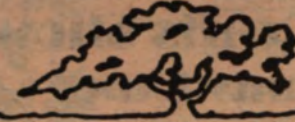
NFIB represents more than 600,000 small and independent firms in all 50 states, including 39,000 in Texas.

## Artists have similar theme, nostalgia, different media

Two artists displaying and selling their works at the Salado Art Fair, Aug. 7-8, find a common theme for the basis of their creations.

### "Nostalgia"

Larry Bridges has become well known as an authentic artist of nostalgic subjects. His renditions range from old court houses to antique steam engines and depots.

He is a member of an elite group of Texas artists known as the "Texas Wild Bunch". Bridges has shown extensively in Texas and New Mexico and in other states as well. His drawings have been purchased by collectors from as far away as California, Maryland and Japan.

His meticulously detailed

pen and ink drawings state that this is a nostalgic medium mastered by few and is as individual as a signature. No two artists' concepts are ever the same. Pen and ink is a versatile medium.

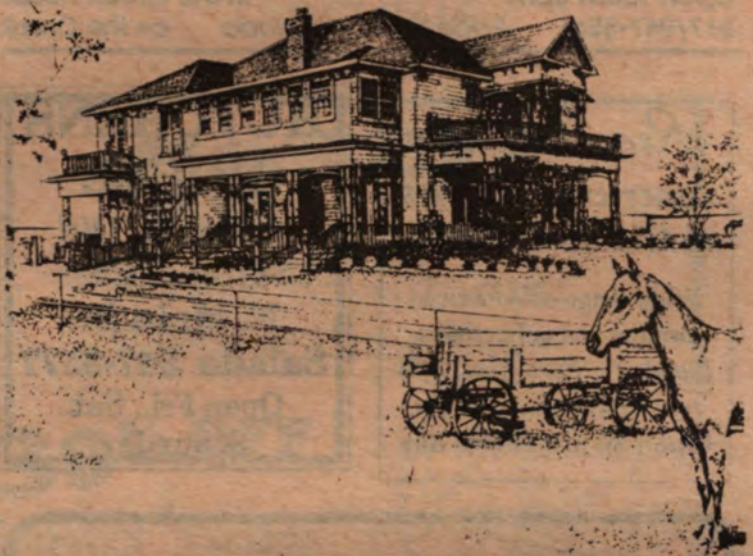
Bridges attended Texas Tech University where he studied advertising art and design. He has experienced owning his own advertising agency, producing fashion and commercial art and spent 20 years in advertising at the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal.

His accomplishments include: Best of Show and First place in several competitions. He and his wife, Sharon live in Lubbock, Texas.

James L. Stevenson, a sixth generation, Texan

was born in 1949 in the Texas Hill Country town of Fredricksburg. Although he grew up in Harlingen where he now lives, he often recalls many fond memories of the summers he spent on the family ranch near Harper.

Stevenson's mastery of the brush began at the age of 8 when he first began to paint with oils. He would spend long hours experimenting with color and technique in an effort to capture certain moods and effects on canvas. As James reached adulthood, he developed a strong sense of color, thorough understanding of perspective and an uncanny use of light, all of which combine to give his paintings a unique quality of brightness and clarity almost photographic in appearance. It is no sur-

prise that his paintings have won numerous honors including several Best of Show awards.

Wooden windmills and old gas stations like those depicted in Stevenson's paintings, are reminiscent of those once found along

many of the well-traveled thoroughfares of this country. Today the only place a person might still find one of these relics of a by-gone

era is along some seldom traveled, out-of-the-way backroad.

Wildlife, landscapes and still life are among the subject often painted by the artist. One theme he considers a favorite is that of the once common "Mom and Pop" grocery stores. Unlike the drive-in grocery and chain stores of today, those of yesterday each had character and an individuality of their own. In his work,

some are found with a kerosene dispenser turned over by the front door while others stand in silence, accompanied only by a gas pump just around the corner.

He frequently travels the country roads in search of places to paint. Once he has found an ideal subject, he will familiarize himself with the area, looking for someone who can provide additional information about the locations. Because of his tenacious de-

sire for authenticity, he will often photograph and sketch diverse items of interest which he might use in future paintings.

A perfectionist, James concerns himself more with the quality of work than it's quantity. His work must be as accurate as possible before they are released for sale.

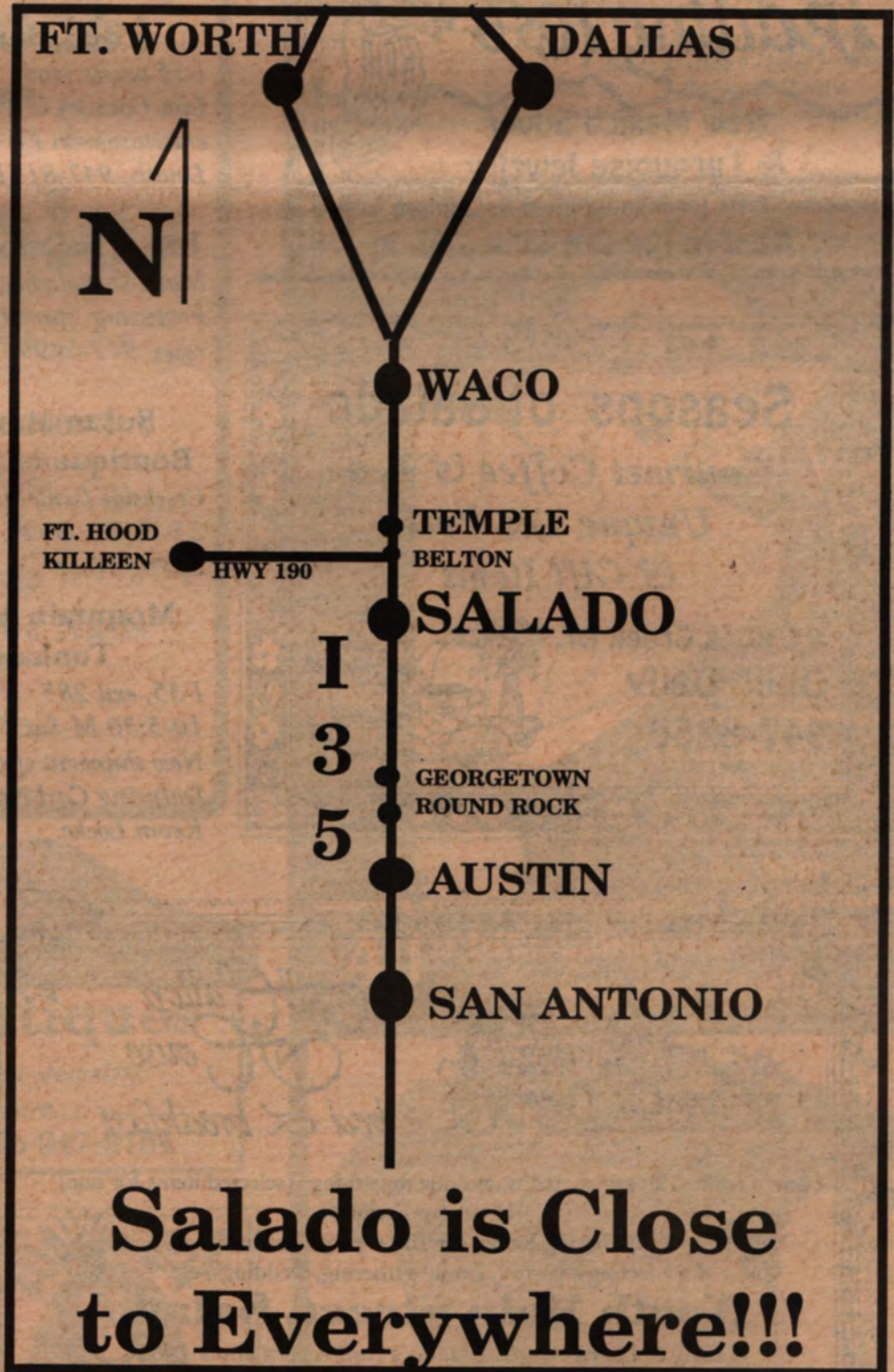
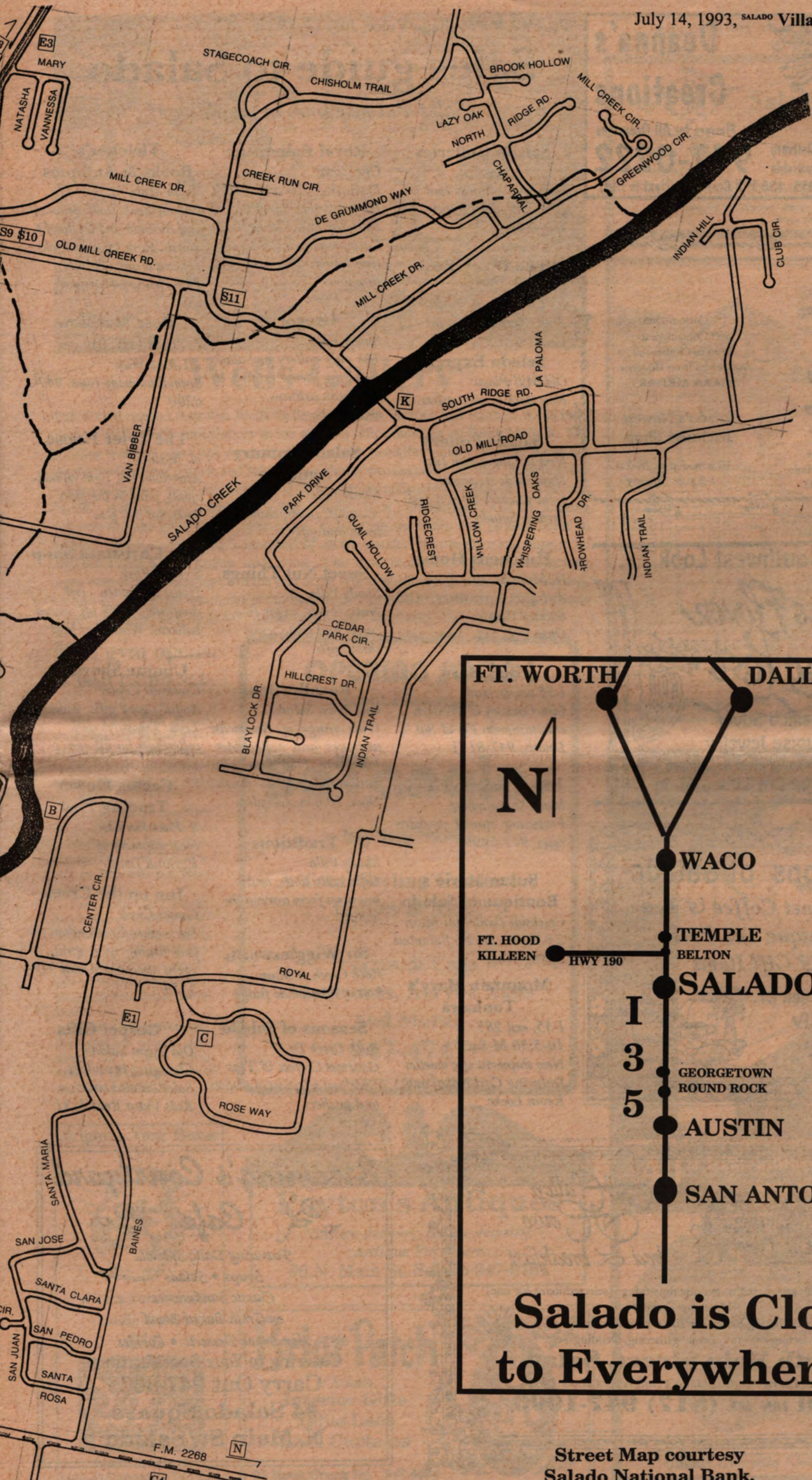

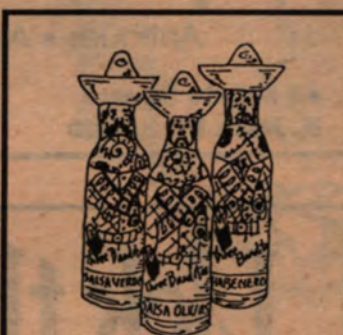
