## Rep. Black to address Lions, Carter shares war stories

District 54 State Representative Layton Black will be the guest speaker at the Salado Lions Club, Aug. 25. Rep. Black will discuss Texas State government and its effect on our district.

It was happily announced at the last meeting that the Salado Lions Club Bar-B-Q served at the annual Salado Art Fair was counted as successful with The Lions raising approximately \$3,200.

The Salado Lions Club meet the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 11:30 at the Mill Creek Country Club.

Salado Lion Jerry Carter recalled his days aboard the USS Conyngham, USS Miller and USS Stevens in World War II at the Aug. 11 meeting of the Lions.

Carter saw the beginning and end of WWII in the Pacific Ocean. He was aboard the USS Conyngham Dec. 7, 1941 when the Japanese began their air raid.

Between raids, he and other crewmen went in search of parts to repair

the ship to pull out of the harbor.

"We were in the shop, when the second attack began. There were eight of us hiding under a V-8 Ford next to shop, when the strafing runs began," Carter said.

Carter saw action at the Battle of Midway. "We were there to protect the carriers," Carter said. "I spent the entire three days in the engine rooms."

From Midway, Carter went to Guadalcanal for the initial invasion.

Carter said he served four years aboard Naval ships during World War II, "With fifteen days of shore leave."

During his tenure, Carter went to Borneo, Philippines, Tokyo, Australia and many other ports-of-call.

Among Carter's display of memorabilia was a letter he wrote to his parents Dec. 7, 1941, immediately after the attack on Pearl Harbor. He did not know which country attacked Pearl Harbor at the time, but his letter said he hoped it was the Japs, so we could fight them.

**Swing Kids** is a surprisingly good film about young men growing up during the Nazi years of Germany. Set in Hamburg in the late 1930s, **Swing Kids** follow the friendship of three swing kids, teens who rebel against the Nazi Youth by devoting themselves to American fashion and music.

**Swing Kids** is more than a dance movie as Peter (Robert Sean Leonard) and Thomas (Christian Bale) are coerced into joining the Nazi Youth after stealing a radio.

As one of the **Swing Kids** begins to embrace the Nazi beliefs, the other is torn by the hypocrisy of his actions.

**Swing Kids** is a very moving drama of ideologies, consequences and friendships and one that I recommend wholeheartedly.

If you liked **Dead Poets Society**, which featured Leonard in his first role, you will enjoy this film which reminds us all to **Swing Heil**.

## Junkyard dog politics on the way again

Today's Texas politics may not be as earthy as in the days of George Parr and his South Texas fiefdom when Lyndon Johnson with John Connally's help defeated Coke Stevenson by a whisker in a vote as scandalous then as it is fun to read and talk about today.

Still and all - the hustings are a-rustling during these last days of summer and as predicted some weeks ago, there is movement among the "big four" politicians who control the main elected offices, with a Democratic death grip, down Austin way. All this merits a few lines of attention even if we are a fortnight away from the Labor Day pronouncing time.

Governor Richards has done everything she can think of to prepare herself for another four years in office up to and including changing her hairstyle; learning to ride a motorcycle and appointing to high public office, every minority, female and major contributor she could find while at the same time pointing to a legislative record that includes "no new taxes". Failing of course to mention the no-tax theme came at the expense of underfunding education, welfare, childcare and a variety of other social

programs. Chances are strong she will cop the Demo nomination and probably go on to win another term as Governor.

Right behind our flamboyant top gal in Texas is Lt. Governor Bob Bullock who has his campaign

wheels greased and moving as we speak, or rather, as we write. He longs to be the top dog but knows he must wait four more years and will do so as a party faithful must. John Sharp, the brightest of the young firebrands, will be forced to stay put as Comptroller for another four years even though he longs to be Governor right now. He has to move up the chairs behind Bullock and Richards. He will no doubt, try for the Lt. Governor slot in 1998 and remain there for 8 years while Bob rattles around in the mansion. That puts Sharp in line in 2006 (that sounds strange - a year starting with a twenty) for Governor unless he tires of waiting and strikes out for Phil Gramm's Senate seat in 1996.

Speaker of the House Pete Laney will remain locked in place for another term and then try for a

state senatorship or go for Congress since he cannot break into the closed communion among the current big three he associates with - Richards, Bullock and Sharp.

Last - and sadly for him - least, is the current Attorney General, Dan Morales. Most times the AG likes to put in two terms and then go for the Governor's chair. John Hill and Mark White did this in 1978 and 1982 respectively. In Dan's case there are two many ahead of him - each of whom has far more impressive credentials. Best bet for the young AG is to try for the Supreme Court or move to Congress after a second term in office. Always room for a well spoken Mexican-American in today's political waters.

So much for the demos. Now what about the GOPers who are primed and ready to make a run for all the top positions in the State due in large part to President Clinton's less than promising first year in office plus Kay Hutchison's romp over the hapless Bob Krueger that gave Texas two Republican senators for the first time since post reconstruction days.

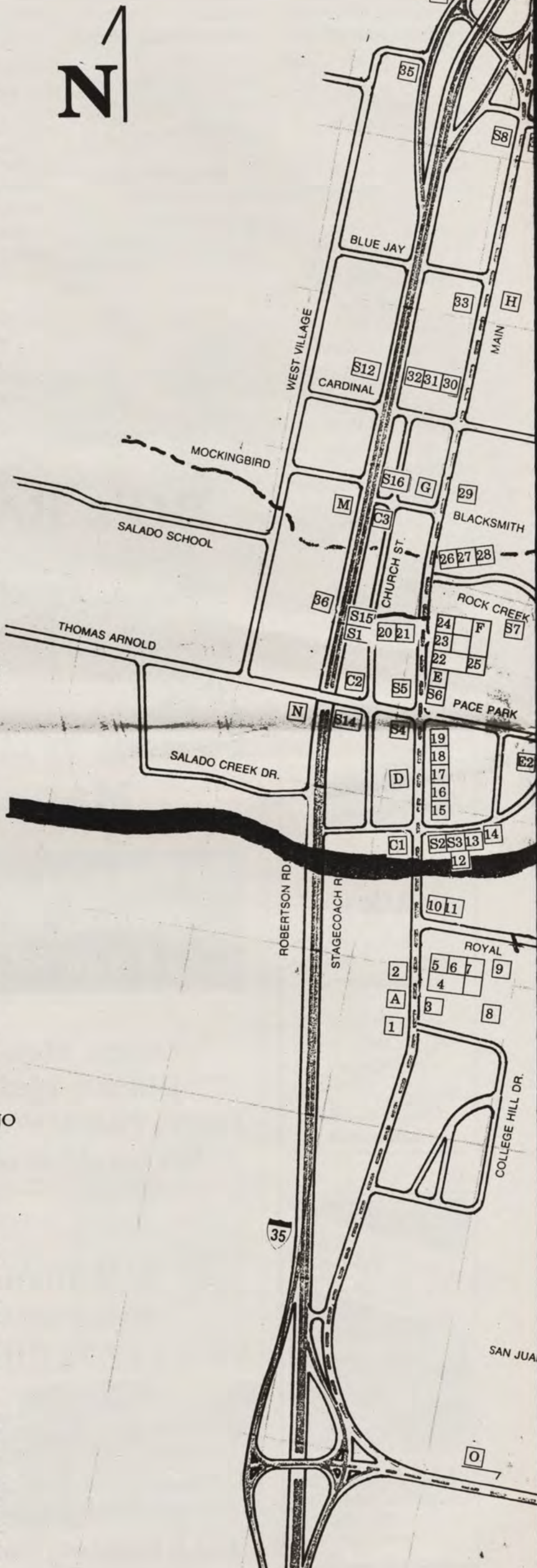

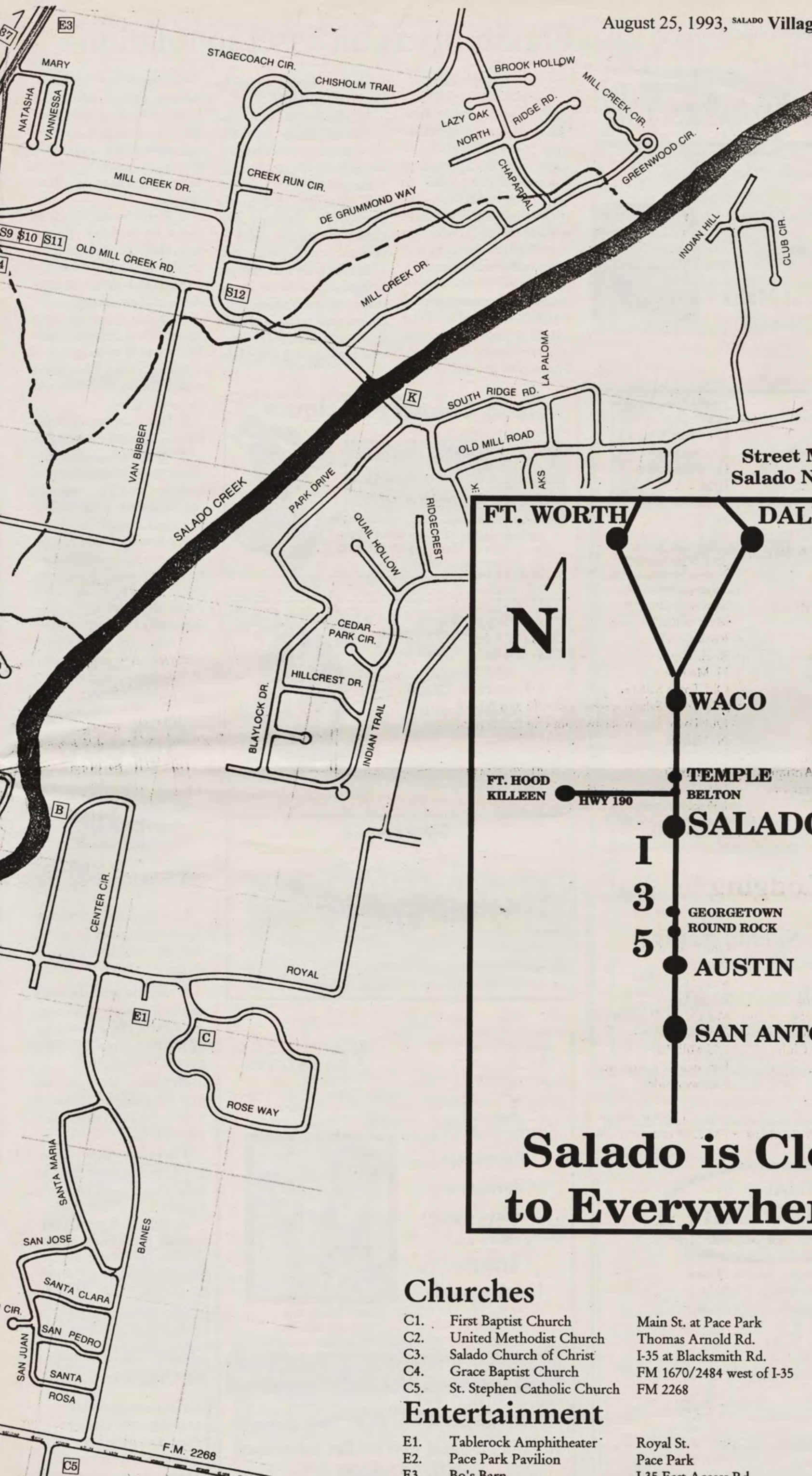

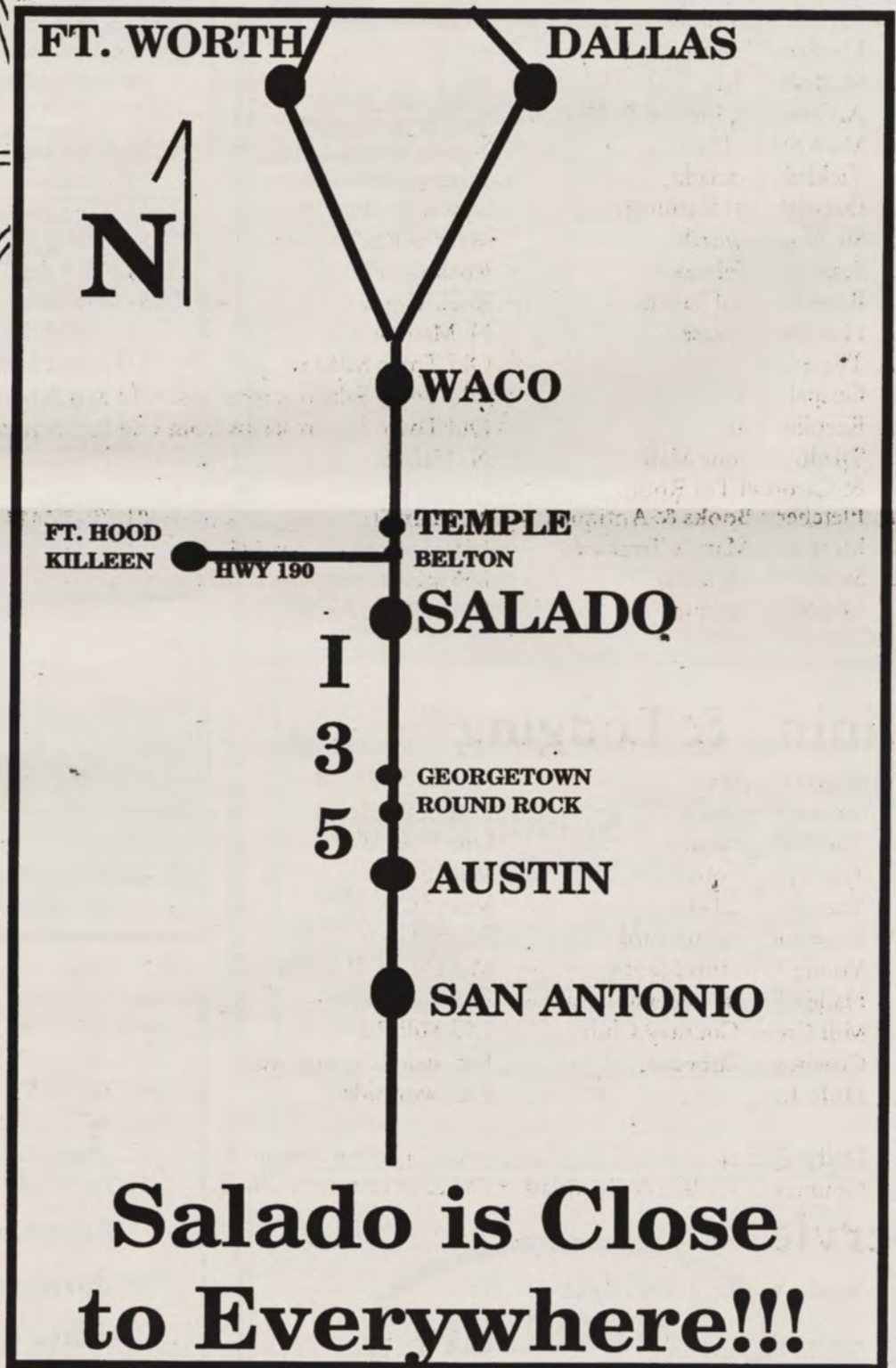

## Flexibility is an asset in relations

8. Allow for compromise. While we all would like to have "our way", it is sometimes in the best interest to meet halfway and create win-win situations.

9. Allow for the errors of others. Forgive and be prepared and willing to move beyond and ahead.

# Salado board will adopt budget Aug. 31

The Salado ISD Board of Trustees will meet in Special Session 7 p.m. Aug. 31 to approve the 1993-94 budget, hold a hearing on school taxes and set a date to vote on the tax rate.

Regardless of what you may read in upcoming newspapers, Salado I.S.D. is not considering a 268% increase in taxes.

In fact, Salado I.S.D. is not considering a tax rate increase at all, according to Supt. Steven Ervin.

Salado property owners paid a tax rate of \$1.44 per \$100 evaluation, according to Supt. Ervin. The tax rate Salado trustees will consider in September will remain the same.

The board will consider a \$3 million budget for 1993-94, almost \$250,000 more than 1992-93.

Some of the increase of the budget can be attributed to state mandates such as SB 351, a \$1,140 increase in teacher salaries, as well as new local expenditures, such as a \$600 per employee per year expenditure for health insurance.

Existing property values in Salado increased over \$1 million to \$97 million. Salado ISD also has over \$5 million of new taxable property. This will allow trustees to pay for state and local mandates and recover from a drop in funding of \$100 per student in Salado school.

Local taxes will generate over \$1.5 million, approximately 48 percent of the total budget. State revenues will account for 50 percent of the budget and federal revenues will ac-

count for 2 percent of the total money.

Salado I.S.D. will spend approximately 74 percent, \$2.3 million, on payrolls costs; 10 percent, \$303,330 on supplies and materials; 7 percent, \$218,870 on contracted services.

Other expenses will include 3 percent, \$93,480, for capital outlay and 2.7 percent, \$83,400 on lease/purchase debt service. An approximate 3.3 percent, \$106,221, will be used for other expenses.

What this all comes down to is this for property owners: an average house of \$70,000 last year paid \$982.00 for school taxes. An average house this year is \$72,000, but will pay \$966.14 if the school board adopts the tax rate it is considering.
