Weekend features Tour Dec. 3-5

Salado's Country Christmas weekend Dec. 3-5, is a memorable time for everyone.

The dramatic effect of luminaries lining the Village streets, lighted Christmas trees at every establishment and costumed carolers is the creation of a living Rockwell painting.

A live Nativity Scene rejuvenates the true Christmas spirit while Mr. and Mrs. Santa Claus add a little of the fun of Christmas.

The many distinctive shops, galleries and restaurants offer the finest fare of holiday selections making your holiday shopping and dining a pleasant memory.

The Historic Homes Tour and Quilt Show which is held in conjunction with the Christmas Stroll will open seven homes for the weekend visitors.

Included in the Historic Tour will be:

The Old Red School

House, (recently dedicated as the Salado Civic Center located on Main St.), was built in the 1920s and recently was renovated through the generosity of magnanimous patrons, volunteer efforts and a caring community. The Quilt Show will display inside the Civic Center.

The Boles-Aiken Log Cabin-built in the 1860s is thought to be the first school house in Salado. The cabin was relocated to Van Bibber Lane when threat of destruction was imminent.

Halley House Bed & Breakfast Inn- A Greek revival home built in the 1860s by Captain Robert Bonner Halley has been utilized as a home and early boarding house and now serves as a bed and breakfast as well as a local gathering place.

The Gardner's Home located on Rock Creek is by design of early Texas style built by Salado craftsman Darwin Britt. Britt's technique and use of antique wood from Texas structures

gives the home a classic warmth.

Salado Creek Log Cabins-Two 19th Century Log Cabins on Pace Park Rd. The smaller one was built in 1859 and the larger one's believed to be the original Bell County Court house built in 1853.

Twelve Oaks, located on Center Circle is the home of Bob and Sue Whistler. The house, which was built in 1867, is a grand, limestone Greek Revival mansion.

R.S. Farr House which was built in 1875 was the home of Dr. R.S. Farr family for 111 years in Belton. The home was relocated to Roseway in Victorian Oaks in 1992 for complete restoration by owner George Kolb.

Advanced tickets for the tour can be obtained by calling 817-947-5718 through Dec. 1.

Dec. 3 the tour will be held 3 p.m.-7 p.m.; Dec. 4 10 a.m.-6 p.m. and Dec. 5, 1 p.m.-5 p.m. Tickets in advanced cost \$7 and \$8 at the door.

Membership dues for 1994 are going to be \$15 for individuals and \$30 for businesses.

Those interested in preserving the history of Salado are invited to attend.

Auction Nov. 20 benefits Salado Civic Center

Three days remain before the 1993 edition of the annual Old Salado School Foundation auction with a reported 125+ items slated to go under the auctioneer's gavel at 7 p.m. Nov. 20 in the school cafeteria on Thomas Arnold Road.

Patsy Sanford, chairman of this year's fund raiser, noted that the eating part of the program starts at 6 p.m. with an "all-you-can-eat" fajita supper followed by the sale. Price of the meal is \$5.50 for adults and \$3.00 for the 12 and unders.

Chairman Sanford further reported: "We have well over 125 outstanding sale items this year including some 65 donations from artists who took part in this year's Art Fair and who donated some of their paintings, decorated jewelry, dolls, bird houses and dried floral arrangements plus a large number of gift items from Salado merchants that will make Christmas shopping a breeze for those wanting to put away the just right present for family members."

Donations have come from the Mill Creek golf club and include a round of golf for four. Also donated is a stay at the Halley House and services including such things as a catered party, toys, quilts, jams, jellies, hand crafted items, Christmas decorations for the tree and home. Services from electricians, plumbers, carpenters and other home improvement help are all expected to be part of the auctionable inventory.

All funds from the auction go directly towards paying down the \$100,000 bank note that was taken out to complete the renovation of the old red school house on Main Street, now Salado's brand-new Civic Center.

All donations are to be brought to the school cafeteria 10 a.m.-3 p.m. Nov. 20. If there are items that need to be picked up at a donor's home - a call to Cathy Sands at 947-1000 or Patsy Sanford will result in a fast pickup service. Items may also be left at the Civic Center through Nov. 19.

Cliffhanger is the best movie in a long, long time to come from the man who starred opposite Estelle Getty in **Stop or My Mom Will Shoot!** In fact, with the exception of **Rocky**, **Cliffhanger** is perhaps the best movie in which Stallone has ever starred.

Cliffhanger grabs the viewer in the first five minutes and hangs on throughout the two hours of non-stop action.

Set in the Rocky Mountains, **Cliffhanger** is about Mountain Rescue Ranger Gabe Walker (Stallone), who gets dragged into a search for stolen treasury money along with his partner (played by Michael Rooker).

John Lithgow is sinister and sarcastic as the leader of a pack of hijackers who steal suitcases of treasury bills from a U.S. transport plane above the Rocky Mountains.

The suitcases are dropped when the two planes wreck causing the money to be lost in the high mountains.

From this premise, **Cliffhanger** blasts off for a fantastic roller coaster ride with terrific camera effects and cinematography.

Fans of Stallone and fans of **Die Hard** will love **Cliffhanger**.

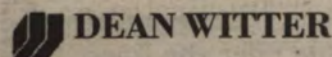

Institute hosts final speaker Nov. 21

The final speaker in the Institute for the Humanities' fall series on **Life's Continuum: Ethics and Morals** will be Lori Andrews. Andrews, who is a research fellow at the American Bar Foundation in Chicago, will speak on Nov. 20-21.

Andrews received her Doctor of Law degree from Harvard Law School in 1978. She is currently a visiting professor of law at Chicago-Kent College of Law. Her areas of study and involvement include biomedical advances, health care, and reproductive technology.

Andrews has written articles on these topics for a variety of newspapers and magazines including the Chicago Sun Times, New York, and Psychology Today. She is also the author of several books, including Between Strangers: Surrogate Mothers, Expectant Fathers, and Brave New Babies (1989) and Medical Genetics: Legal Frontier (1987).

In addition to writing books and articles on medical and legal issues, Andrews has testified before state legislatures and in the U.S. Congress. She has also appeared on such nationally televised programs as the MacNeil/Lehrer NewsHour, the Phil Donahue Show, CBS News and Today.

The topic of Andrews' seminar Nov. 20 will be "Medical Crystal Ball: What the New Genetics Means To You." It will take place 10 a.m.-3:30 p.m. at the Inn on the Creek.

Andrews will give a lecture on "Policy and Procreation: The Legal Regulations of Reproductive Technologies" at the Mill Creek dining room 4-5 p.m. Nov. 21. The lecture will be followed by a discussion session and buffet dinner.

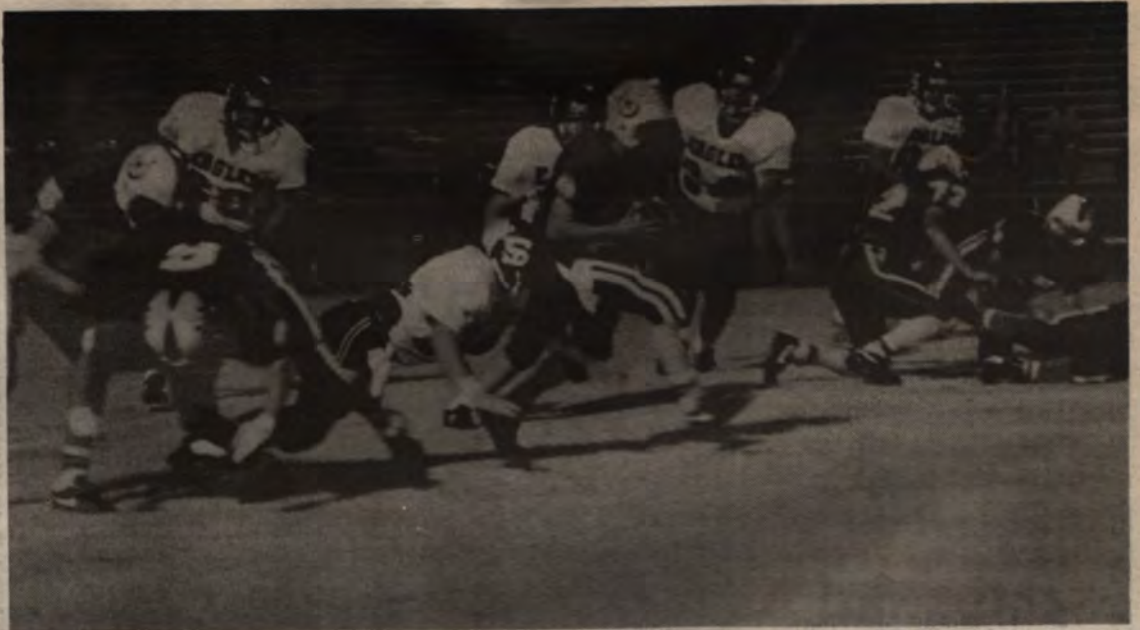

Turnover-itis fatal to Eagles against Mason

Turnover-itis killed the Salado Eagles in the first round of the AA playoffs as the Mason Punchers won,

21-16 in Burnet Nov. 12.

Salado turned over the ball a half-dozen times. Half of the turnovers were in Eagle territory. The Punchers were able to score on two of the turnovers, while

Salado denied Puncher scores four times within the Eagle 30 yard line.

After scoring on the opening drive, Salado trailed the rest of the game. Jason Hosch returned the opening kickoff 75 yards to set up the first score by Richard Berumen.

The Punchers responded with a touchdown on the ensuing kick-off on an 80-yard reverse.

A fumble in Eagle territory led to the second Mason touchdown, which gave the Punchers the lead, 14-7 in the first quarter.

Billy Wilson returned the kick-off to Mason's 38 yard line. Salado had to settle for a 40 yard field goal by Andrew Voelter to bring Salado within a touchdown, 14-10, by the end of the first period.

Mason punched the ball into the endzone again before halftime on a 9 yard pass to give the Punchers a 21-10 lead with 1:20 left.

It looked as if the Punchers would score again when they picked up a turnover at the Eagle 38 yard line and drove to the 7 yard line.

Shane Johnston intercepted a Mason pass in the

Registry will help American Veterans to find old buddies

If you're a veteran of American military service, or currently on active duty, an old buddy may be looking for you. A new organization called Registry of American Veterans (ROAV) will be able to help you locate friends you served with in the Armed Forces.

ROAV is designed to be the largest private database of American veterans and military personnel in the United States. Its purpose is to alleviate the problems veterans encounter in searching for one another and putting former military friends back in touch with each other.

ROAV gathers information from veterans and computerizes their name, current residence, military units they served in and the time periods served in each outfit. Persons who join ROAV will receive an initial and annual printout of the database information of all veterans who served in the same unit during the same time frame

as the joining member. The printout will show the current address and phone number of surviving unit veterans.

The service can assist in finding veterans for military associations that are planning to hold reunions. However, it is expected to primarily aid long-lost buddies in locating each other. The user will be someone who thinks back on times of strong friendship in the military and wants to know what happened after military service. Maybe the friends shared hopes and dreams while passing long hours together on duty, or on stations far away from home.

Veterans are encouraged to write to ROAV for information on how to get themselves registered. ROAV will then send them the proper form to complete and become part of the database. The address is Registry of American Veterans, P.O. Box 51148, Riverside, California 92517.

Local dentists awarded fellowship

Dr. Douglas B. Willingham and Dr. Michele J. Saunders of Salado and San Antonio were awarded Fellowship in the American College of Dentists on November 5, 1993, at the College's annual meeting in San Francisco.

Dr. Willingham, who practices general dentistry in Salado, is the former editor of the Texas Dental Journal and currently serves as historian of the Texas Dental Association, among other positions. He was one of three dental editors to be recognized for editorial writing in the William J. Gies Editorial Award Competition for his editorial in the September 1992 issue of the Texas Dental Journal entitled, "Is Ethics Becoming a Luxury?" The award was presented to Dr. Willingham during the annual meeting of the American Association of Dental Editors held November 4, also in San Francisco.

Dr. Saunders, who is married to Dr. Willingham, is director of the South Texas Geriatric Education Center, associate professor and head of the division of geriatrics and gerontology at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio Dental School and associate director of the

Geriatric Research, Education and Clinical Center at the Audie Murphy Memorial V.A. Hospital in San Antonio. She is also newly named study director of the Research Center on Oral Health in Aging - "Oral Health: San Antonio Longitudinal Study of Aging", recently funded by a \$3.7 million grant from the National Institutes of Health/National Institute of Dental Research. During the San Francisco meetings she was also named a co-recipient of the 1993 Geriatric Dental Health Care Award,

sponsored by the American Dental Association and the Warner-Lambert Consumer Health Products Group.

The American College of Dentists was established in 1920 and recognizes dentists who have made significant contributions to advancing dentistry, oral care and humanity. The College is actively involved in professional education, research, health care ethics and policy. Fellowship in the College is by invitation and is based on nomination and peer review.

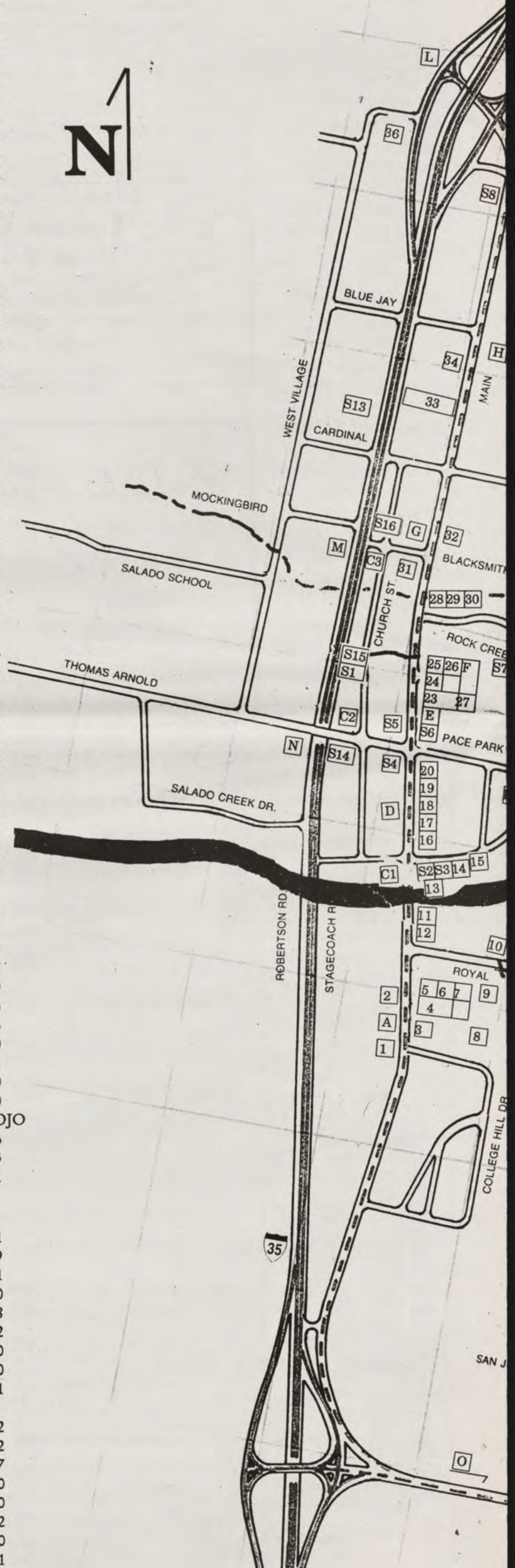

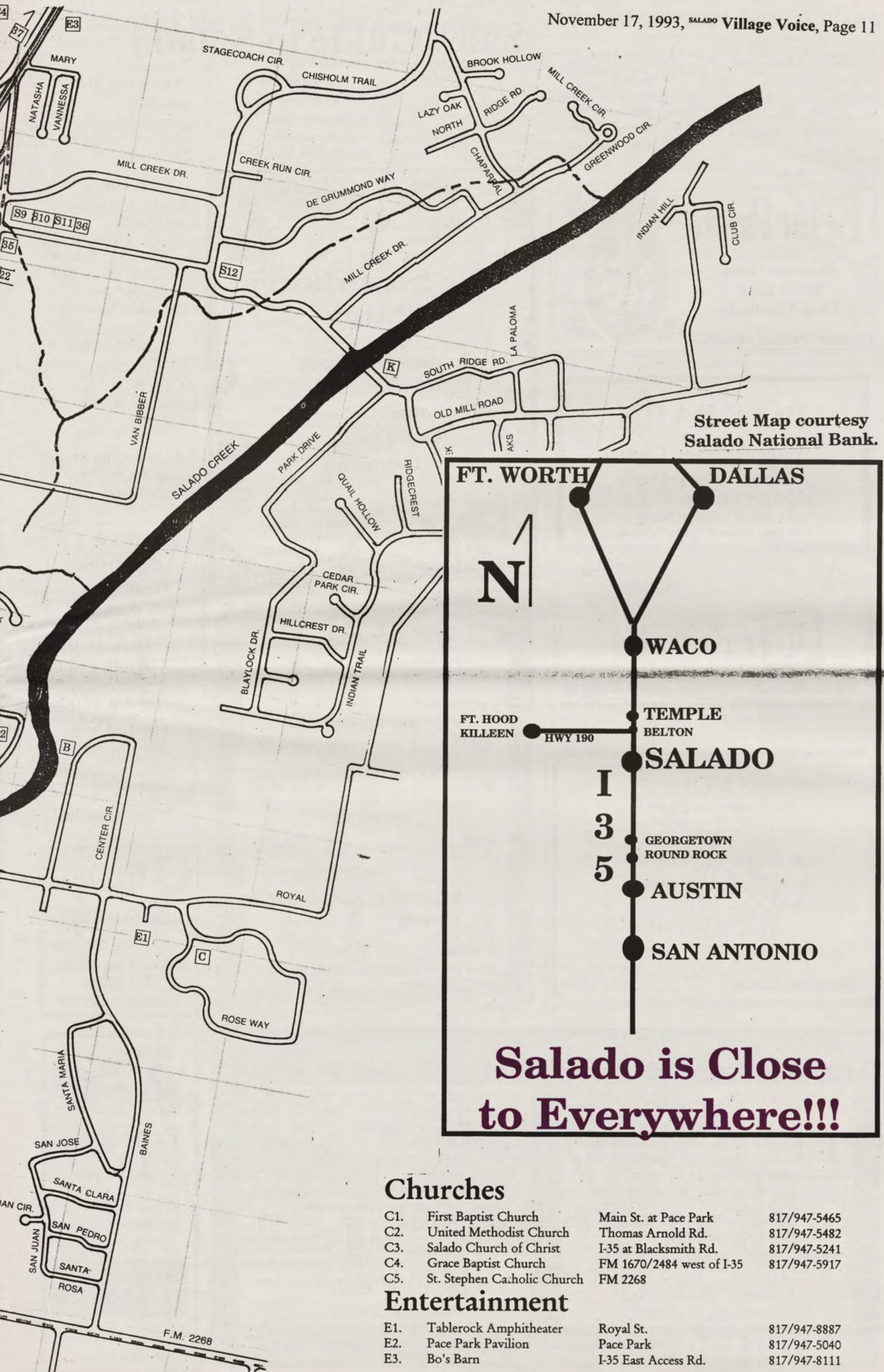

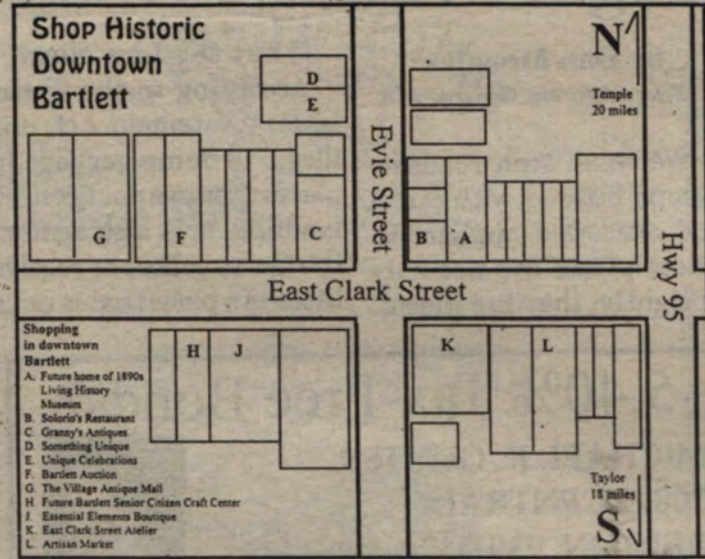

Legal Matters: *Don't Dump on Texas; littering is illegal*

We've all seen roadside dumps littered with trash and discarded appliances. These places are not only unsightly; they are illegal.

What the Law Says
According to the Texas Litter Abatement Act, it is illegal to dump garbage in places that are not licensed landfills. It is also against the law to collect or receive litter in a place that is not a

legal landfill, even if that place is on private property. For examples you could be subject to prosecution if you allow a friend or relative to abandon a car or discard old appliances on your land. Other common violations include throwing litter or allowing it to fly out of a vehicle, letting someone dump tires or trash on your property, improperly disposing of motor oil, and junking old cars in rivers or lakes.

The Role of the OAG

The Texas Legislature recently gave the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) greater responsibility in enforcing laws against illegal dumping. In the past, the OAG could only intervene at the request of the Texas Health Department. Under a new law, local officials can contact my office directly to request assistance with enforcement efforts. Penalties have been increased and the worst offenders now face felony charges.

The OAG is working closely with both local law enforcement officials and citizen groups in the effort to halt illegal dumping. In

cooperation with Keep Texas Beautiful, a non-profit environmental organization, the OAG will present a series of regional conferences designed to educate local governments, law enforcement agencies, and citizens about the law and strategies for enforcement. Conferences are slated for Beaumont, Abilene, Tyler, Odessa, and Amarillo. For further information, please call (512)475-4413.

You Can Make a Difference

You can make a real difference by reporting illegal dump sites to local authorities. If a problem is severe enough, form local groups and publicize the situation. Enlist television, radio, and newspapers to spread the word about illicit dump sites and to highlight the efforts made by local residents. Involve high schools, business organizations, and neighborhood groups in the fight against littering.

One person can make a difference:

Dispose of your own waste properly. Always place trash in bags and secure with twist ties or tie off the top before putting it

out or placing it in a dumpster.


Report license plate numbers of any vehicle you see dumping trash by the roadside.

If transporting trash in the back of a truck, be sure to cover it with a tarpaulin. If the contents fly out, it becomes litter and you've broken the law.

Write or-call your local, county or state officials and let them know that you are concerned about illegal dumping.

In addition to the steps listed above, you may invite local officials to speak to your neighborhood association about current litter law and illegal dumping problems in your area. You can also take direct action by organizing volunteers to clean up river banks, dumping grounds, and roadsides. Clean sites are less likely to become dump sites.

Car owners can protect environment

Every 10 days, motorists who drive with poorly maintained engines and under inflated tires waste 70 million gallons of gasoline, almost 2.6 billion gallons a year.

Car and truck owners can

help save their vehicles and help the environment by getting an "environmental tune-up."

Basic care and maintenance can help a vehicle run more efficiently and last up to 50 percent longer,

while careless and improper care can severely damage the vehicle as well as the environment. Each year do-it-yourselfers improperly dump 20 times the amount of oil spilled by the Exxon Valdez into the American environment.

To deter such waste, the Texas Automobile Dealers Association suggests that car and truck owners follow basic maintenance guidelines developed by the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence:

* Keep tires properly inflated. Under-inflation wastes fuel because the engine has to work harder to push the vehicle.

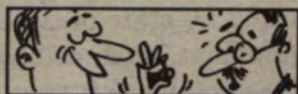

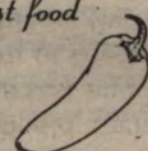
