## Residents meet Dec. 18 about rock crusher

Area citizens will meet with Bob Spiegel 9 a.m. Dec. 18 at the Salado Civic Center to discuss the proposed rock crushing plant and quarry operation to be located on the Old Cox Ranch between Belton and Salado. Spiegel will meet with the Texas Natural Resources Conservation Committee, to determine if the rock crusher will use enough water in washing the limestone to necessitate a water plan.

If a water plan is necessary, area citizens may request a hearing with the TNRCC on the matter.

The rock crusher which Spiegel proposes to be placed on the Old Cox Ranch, owned by Ed and Patsy Hinkle, is within a mile of the Stillhouse Hollow Lake, Camp Tahuaya Boy Scout Camp, the Army Corps of Engineers Outdoor Learning Center and 100 family homes.

TNRCC regulations state that portable rock crushers are exempt from Clean Air Act regulations

under the following conditions, which Shallow Ford Construction has met:

A production rate of 200 tons per hour or less with an operating schedule of 1,600 hours per year or less

The plant is located at least one-half mile from any recreational area or residence or other structure not occupied solely by the owner of the facility or the property on which the facility is located.

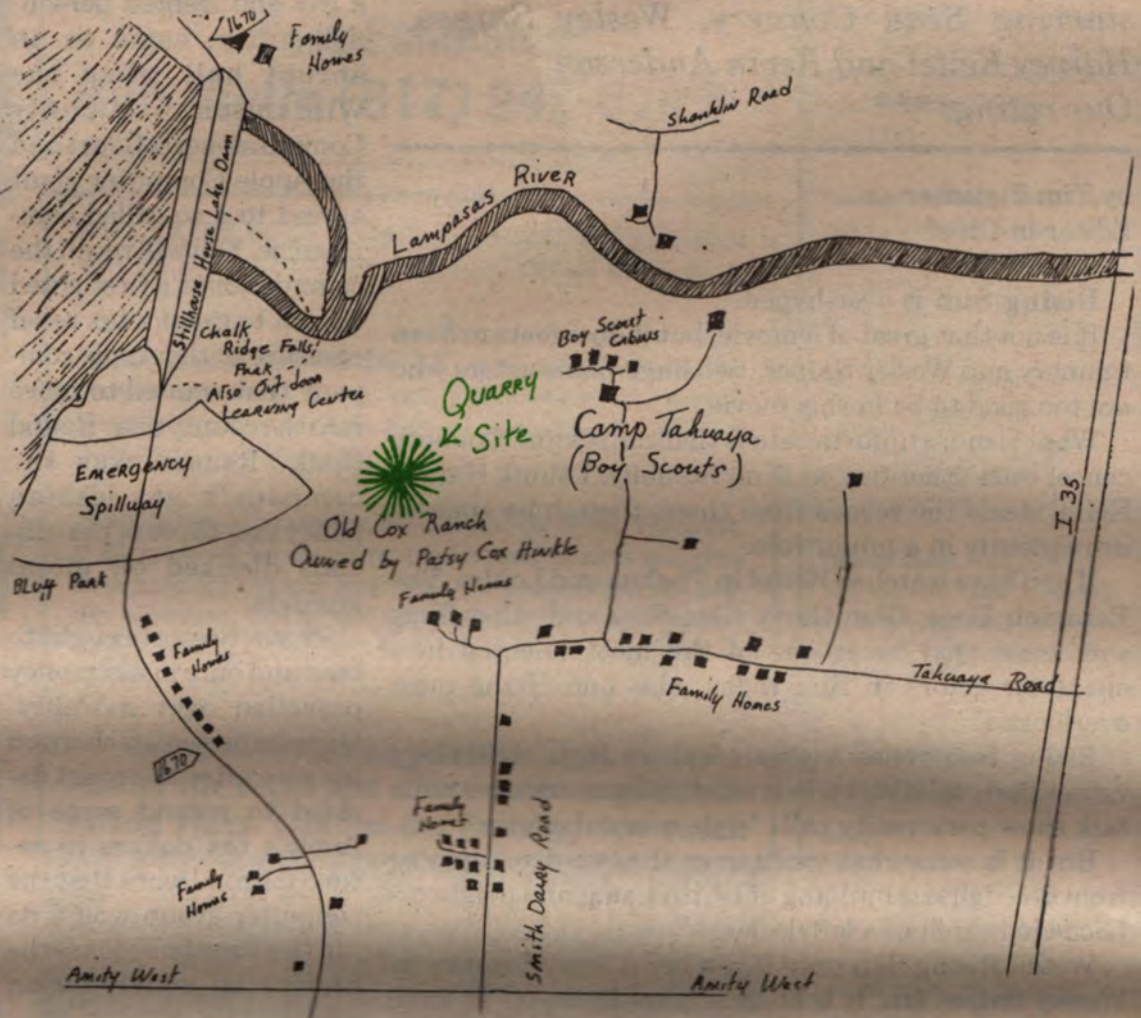
The plant must be located at least 1,000 feet from any state or federal highway not under construction.

In-plant haul roads and stockpiles must be sprinkled with water or other chemicals to control dust emissions.

Water sprays must be located and used to control dust emissions at all belt transfer points, shaker screens and inlet and outlet of all crushers.

A rock crusher which meets these conditions is legal and must be registered with the regional TNRCC office.

Geologists from Austin



met with Larry Ferguson, Water Program Manager of the TNRCC Waco Regional office, at the proposed site last week.

The results of that meeting and field research by the geologists was not available at press time.

Local members of SORE (Save Our Resources and Environment) began a letter-writing campaign to find help from federal, state and county officials to prevent the rock quarry and crusher from being placed so close

to homes, the Boy Scout camp, and the Outdoor Learning Center.

Some of the major concerns these citizens have with the rock crusher and quarry (proposed to be 90 acres by 50 feet deep) are these: immediate water supply, the safety of the Dam, pollution, safety of the county roads, property values, Camp Tahuaya and the Outdoor Learning Center in the Stillhouse Hollow spillway and potential harm to the Edwards Aquifer, an outcrop of which goes under the Stillhouse Dam and Spillway.

### Water Supply

"We are all enjoying spring water in our wells. With the blasting, we fear that the limestone cavern underneath us may cave in and we lose our water," said Larry Gumpert, President of SORE. "Even if we do not lose our water, the chemicals and debris coming into our water concerns us."

## College ruins open in Spring

Salado College ruins will soon be open to the public, but are closed now while work continues on College Hill.

The Salado College Foundation recently had a life-size bronze statue of Col. E.S.C. Robertson placed at the entrance to the College Hill ruins. Clay Dahlberg, of Kerrville, cast the statue in bronze under the direction of the Salado College Foundation.

Work was also done at the entrance of the ruins to make pathways to the top of the hill on which Salado College stood as an early frontier college.

The ruins will feature nature history trails and

will be accessible to handicapped people.

A dedication ceremony has been tentatively set for April, when work is complete and the grounds of Salado College will be open to the public.

Details of plans for College Hill will be made available as the dedication ceremony nears, Lucile Robertson said. Robertson is a member of the board of the Salado College Foundation as well as the Central Texas Area Museum.

Salado College was an integral part of early Salado history. In 1989 and 1990 the Salado Historical Society invested over \$40,000 to secure the ruins from

further disrepair. Since it closed for the final time in the 1920s, the fire-burned ruins fell into neglect and damage from vandals over the decades.

The Salado Historical Society, in cooperation with the Salado College Foundation did a great deal of work to save the ruins, excavate some of the foundation and clear the area within the walls of the original building.

Dr. Douglas Willingham chaired the committee responsible for the rescue of the ruins.

Salado Village Voice will have more details on plans for College Hill as the date for the dedication nears.

**Rising Sun** is over-hyped.

It is not that great of a movie, but it does feature Sean Connery and Wesley Snipes, two huge-name actors who are too good to be in this movie.

What is more unfortunate is that Snipes and Connery cancel each other out on film. Actually, I think Harvey Keitel steals the scenes from them, though he appears infrequently in a minor role.

If you have watched Keitel in *Thelma and Louise*, *The Reservoir Dogs*, *Glen Garry Glen Ross* and other films you know that he is one of the most talented new character actors in film today, also one of the most overlooked.

*Rising Sun* relies a great deal on high technology rather than solid story. It is what one conservative radio talk show personality calls "style over substance."



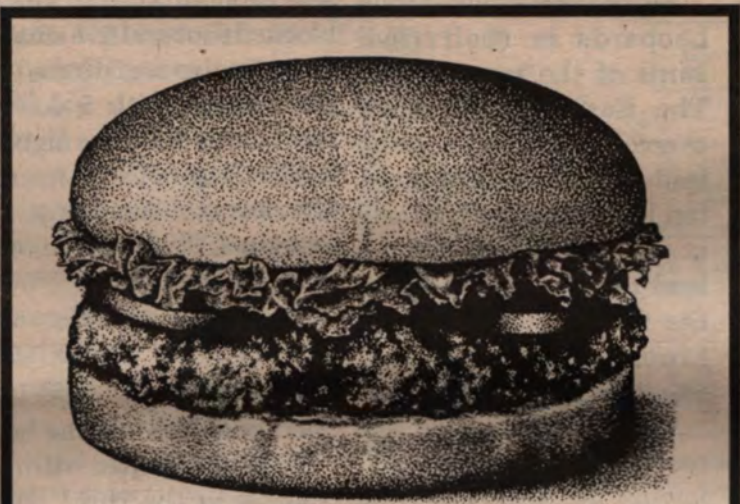

## Dam Safety

"We know that the Stillhouse Dam is stable, however, we also know that the Corps of Engineers are concerned with the leakage under the dam," said SORE member Carleen Carroll. "The knowledge that blasting could weaken the dam would certainly scare all the users of the reservoir and everyone downstream."

## Pollution

Area residents "dread the pollution that will come in with the rock crusher. The noise pollution from the blasting and the rock crusher will also affect our

area. We moved out here to have peace and quiet, not to have our homes shaken by dynamite blasts," Gumpert said.

## County Roads

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers denied easement to FM 1670 through the Stillhouse Hollow spillway last week, which may force trucks hauling rock from the plant to use county roads to reach I-35.

"If the rock crusher produces 200 tons of rock per hour for 1,600 hours per year, there will be over 15,000 trucks on our county roads in one year," according to Gumpert.

Bell County Commissioners voted Dec. 13 to hire two firms to study the impact of possible traffic on the county roads.

Henley Johnston and Associate of Dallas has been hired for a load testing study and Dynatech of San Antonio has been hired by the county for the safety study.

## Property values

"Our properties will devalue while the quarry is in operation due to the noise, pollution, blasting and constant traffic on our roads," Gumpert said.

## Outdoor

### Learning Center

A project of the Army Corps of Engineers, the Outdoor Learning Center is located near the spillway of the Stillhouse Hollow Dam and within a mile of the proposed rock quarry. "This learning center is used by all the Central Texas schools as an extension of our curriculum in the classroom," said Carroll, who has taken her Belton I.S.D. students to the learning center several times. "This center will get not only the noise, but also the pollution off the rock crusher."

"There are absolutely no state laws that would preclude the quarry and blasting from occurring immediately at the boundary of federal property. If the quarry is located too close to the Outdoor Learning Center, the Learning Center would require evacuation to assure that flying rock would not injure the children there," Carroll said.

## Camp Tahuaya

A spring generating one million gallons of water per day flows through the Boy Scout camp.

"We sell spring water and have just undergone a major upgrading (\$100,000) of our spring water facility to meet new Texas Department of Health Standards. During the dynamiting, when Stillhouse Dam was being built during the late 1960s, the spring at Camp Tahuaya stopped flowing for three days, until the spring water found its way through other fissures. According to old-timers, the spring had never ceased to flow before, even in times of severe drought. This could happen again and it could be a permanent stop-

# Eagles boys, girls roundballers play in Salado Merchants Tourney

The Salado Varsity Eagles and Lady Eagles competed in the Salado Merchants Invitational Basketball Tournament last week.

Both teams won one of the three games in which they played.

The Salado Varsity Eagles began their first round of the tournament with a big win over Bruceville-Eddy, 82-42.

The Eagles led throughout the game, opening up with a whopping 22-4 lead in the first quarter. Salado led by 22 at the half, 41-19. Salado held a 27 point lead, 60-37 at the end of the third quarter.

Leading the scoring was Ben Daniel, with 21 points, including two three-pointers.

Paul Gidley scored 19 points, including 12 of the 22 points in the final period of play. Jason Hosch also managed double figures with 10 points for Salado.

Also scoring in the win were these: Jerome Peoples, 9 points, William Culp, 6 points, Richard Jackson, 5 points, Brent Cabaniss and Jereme Hosch with 4 points each and Mike McKinney and

Billy Wilson with 2 points each.

The Eagles did not fare as well in the second round, as they were spanked by Franklin, 27-81. Franklin went on to win the tournament easily.

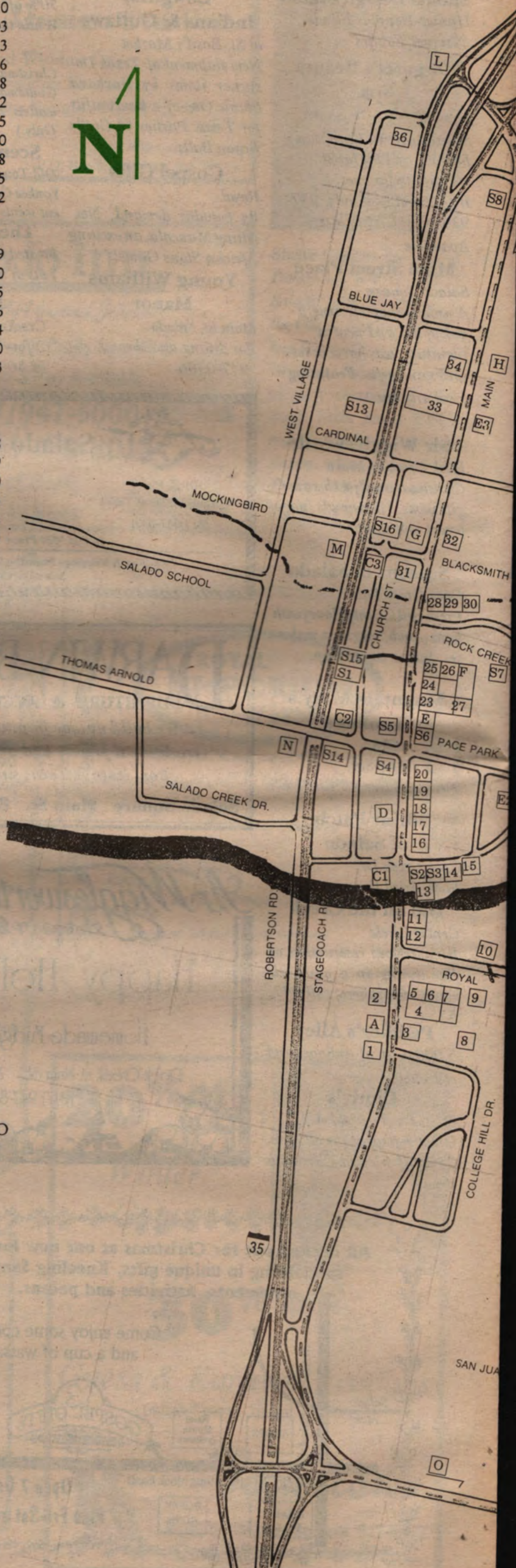

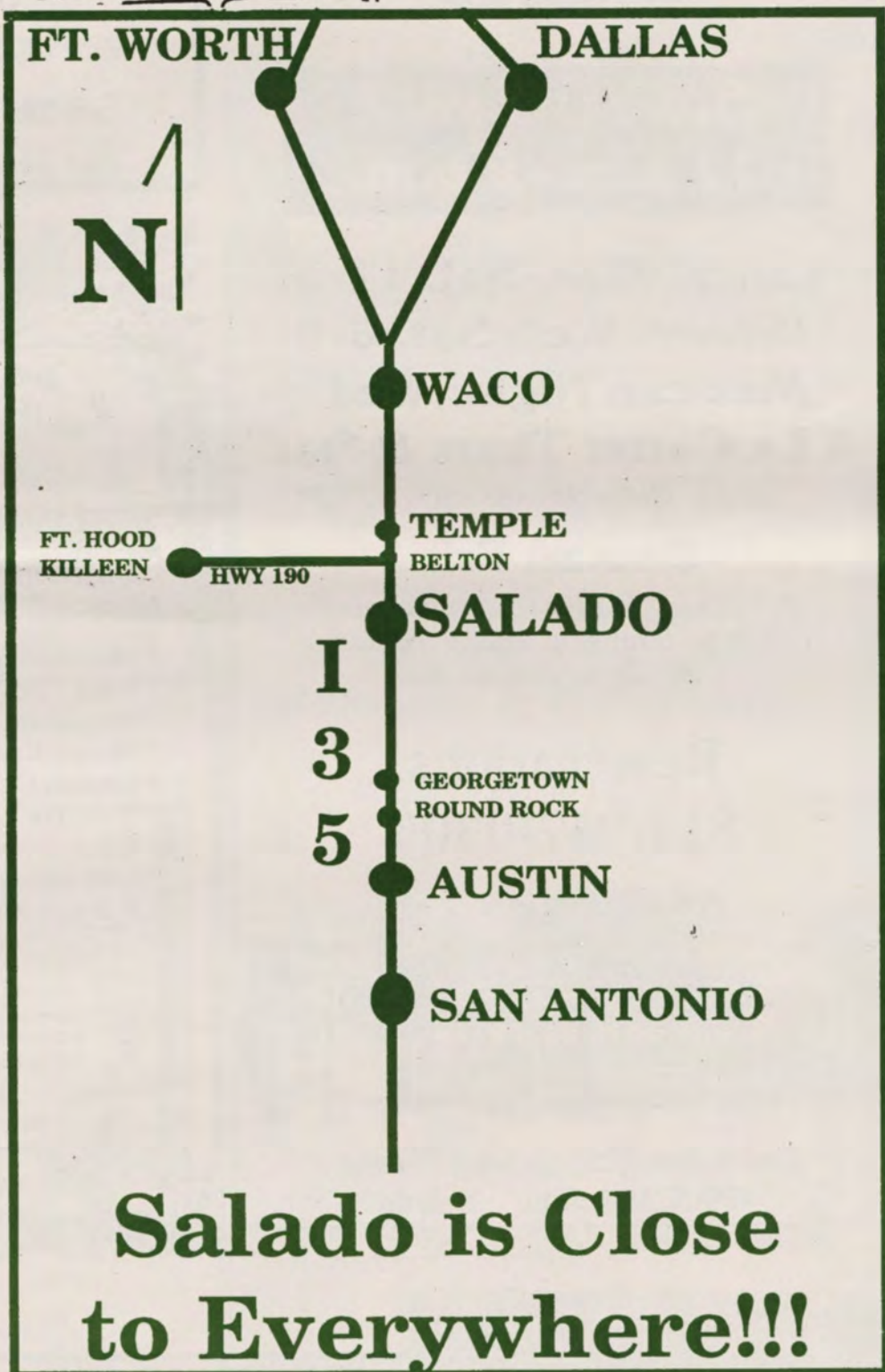

Remembering that "less is more" can help put the "merry" back in Christmas, says a Houston psychologist.

"There is so much pressure, especially on women, during the holiday season," said Dr. Nancy Warren, director of Baylor College of Medicine's Family Transition Program. "When added to the usual job and family responsibilities, Christmas can become a daunting task."

In the quest for a story book holiday, it is easy to become overwhelmed with a long "to do" list. Warren

encourages women to look at what they usually try to do and to see how it can be simplified.

"Start by finding out what Christmas traditions are most important to your family," Warren said. "That way you are not creating memories that are irrelevant."

It is important to be tough about priorities. Pick activities that are meaningful, not just things that "should" or "ought" to be done.

"Remember that less is more.. more relaxed, more enjoyable, more intimate,

more time with the family," she said.

Warren suggests the following ways to make Christmas less hectic.

\*Alternate years for favorite holiday projects; give a party one year, and do extra baking the next.

\*Be more relaxed about decorating, is it a home or a showpiece?

\*Involve the family in shopping, decorating and baking.

\*Shop by catalog, buy gift certificates and movie passes.

\*Stockpile gifts, and wrap at one time.

\*Designate a wrapping room, and wrap to Christmas music.

\*Cut corners. Buy frozen pies or slice-and-bake cookies.

Take the stress out of the holidays, Warren says, by focusing on strengths. "Give yourself credit for what you do well, and plan activities accordingly."

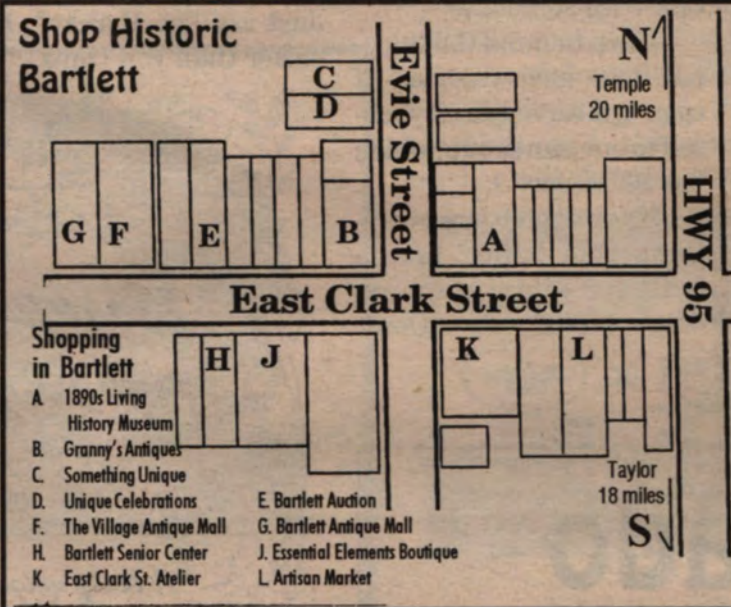

**Edwards Aquifer**

Members of SCORE state their fears that the rock crushing plant may affect the Edwards Aquifer. "It has scared us to know that the Edwards Aquifer is so shallow in this are and the fact that it can be so easily contaminated," Carroll said, pointing out reports from the Texas Water Commission which are "proof that the massive spring that are surfacing millions of gallons of water per day from the Hinkle property and the Boy Scout Camp are an outcropping of the Edwards along the Lampasas River. The area in south Bell County that shows the Edwards recharge does not have any operating quarries."

What is the greatest fear of the members of SCORE is potential plans of the rock crushing plant.

Shallow Ford Construction Co. Inc. can apply for another exemption from the TNRCC to bring in a second rock crusher to operate at the same site.

# Avoid stuffing yourself during Christmas time

Ah, the holidays: a time for family gatherings, Christmas shopping, parties and eating — enough to be 5 to 7 pounds heavier come Super Bowl Sunday in late January.

Many people gain about that much during the holiday season, according to Kay Schooler, registered dietitian and Director of Nutrition Services at Scott & White Memorial Hospital and Clinic.

"Seven pounds is easy to gain. If a person takes in an extra 500 calories a day, just in little extra treats, he or she will gain about a pound a week. That's not hard to do with all the cookies and sweets around work," said Ms. Schooler.

Many people get into trouble by letting the holidays linger on for several months, starting with Halloween and continuing through the Super Bowl.

It's normal for people to over-eat this time of the year. "The trap we get into during the holidays is that we feel we must partake completely. Then we blame ourselves when we over-indulge. It's better if we could limit over-eating to just a few days instead of a whole two months," she said.

But instead, people sit back and say, "Well, I've messed up my diet by eating this, so why should I try to keep up with my diet the rest of the year?"

The key to avoid having to loosen your belt buckle a couple of notches over the holidays is planning.

"You know you're going to Grandma's for a big holi-

day dinner," Ms. Schooler added. "Admit to yourself you might go overboard for just this one meal. Begin earlier in the week by watching your calorie intake and increase your activity level a week or two beforehand. When you plan on over-eating, the most important thing you can do is get additional exercise."

To burn off the extra 17,500 or so calories consumed over the holidays, you will have to walk 175 miles. Burning 100 calories per mile, it will take over 58 days of walking 3 miles a day to work off all those extra pounds.

Determination is also important. "If you don't want to gain weight, you won't if you plan ahead. Mind over

matter is pretty important," Ms. Schooler said.

So here are some tips to keep in mind to help you get through the holidays without gaining weight:

- Don't approach holiday meals after fasting all day. A light snack beforehand will keep you from gorging when you arrive at a party.

- Never stand at a buffet or hors d'oeuvres table. Take one or two items and move across the room and talk with someone.

- Keep in mind that alcohol does have calories. If eggnog is served, limit yourself to one punch cup, which has 335 calories.

- If you want to try everything at a buffet, take a fourth or a third of the average serving size. Don't

overeate or take seconds to please an insistent hostess.

Don't use holidays and vacations as an excuse for gaining weight. Don't neglect exercise or physical activity.

- Eat dessert two hours after the main meal. This will replace the 1,000-calorie snack usually eaten later.

- Concentrate on socializing and being with people. Don't make food the focus. Just say "no thanks"; it's easier than you think.

- Watch out for salty foods. They trigger your appetite for more. Also, salty dishes tend to make you more thirsty.

- Plan ahead and be specific about how to approach the holidays. Focus on the positive.

- Chew gum while preparing and cleaning up the meal so you won't be tempted to snack.

- Remember to eat slowly and savor every mouthful; you will be satisfied with less food.
