Malice is a twisted tale of deception, deceit and treachery. It even has a secondary story of a police hunt for a serial rapist thrown in for good measure. But don't let that throw you off the track.

Alec Baldwin is slick, conceited and brilliant in his role as a top-notch surgeon who moves to a small New England town from Boston.

He meets a former high school classmate (Bill Pullman) and ends up moving in to their Victorian home. Sounds a lot like **Pacific Heights**, right?

Malice is also a great deal like **Consenting Adults**. In fact, this is the problem with **Malice**: it is too reminiscent of other psychological thrillers to be original.

Baldwin, Pullman and Kidman turn in adequate roles in the movie, but Bebe Neuwirth steals the show. As the tough talking small town cop, Neuwirth breaks her mold of Elaine Crane from **Cheers**. She really outshines the others in her minor appearance.

You will also see cameo roles by George C. Scott and Peter Gallagher.

Unfortunately, you will also see through the plot early in the film, which is available on videocassette from IGA Village Foods Videos.

The eighth ranked Salado Eagles baseball team used good pitching by Josh Goodnight, good defense and timely hitting to defeat the Hutto Hippos by an 8-3 score.

Jason Hosch started the scoring in the first inning. He walked and stole second and third base before scoring on Richard Berumen's sacrifice fly.

Salado added three more runs in the second. The Eagles received three walks and a Chris Jackson double and Jereme Hosch single drove in the runs.

A Chris Jackson single and a Jereme Hosch triple produced two more runs for Salado. This gave the Eagles a 6-0 lead after four innings.

The Eagles allowed Hutto to slip back into the game in the sixth inning. Three walks, a fielders choice and a Salado error accounted for the three Hippo runs. Only one of the runs were earned.

In the bottom half of the sixth Salado came right back with two runs of their own. Mark Tubbs was hit with a pitch and Anthony Sniggs drew a walk. Tubbs scored on a Hutto error and Sniggs on a Richard Jackson double.

Chris Jackson and Jereme Hosch both collected two hits on the night. Goodnight received credit for the win for Salado. He pitched four innings and allowed only one hit.

The Eagles dropped into second place when the Thorndale Bulldogs de-

feated Salado by a 9-1 margin. The loss gives the Eagles a 6-2 district record while Thorndale is 5-1.

Thorndale started things quickly. In the bottom of the first they recorded 4 of their 7 hits for the game and jumped out to a 4-0 lead.

The Bulldogs doubled their lead in the fourth inning. The 4 runs came on only two hits. They were aided by three Salado errors in the inning.

Salado made decent contact on the night. They struck out six times on a pitcher that threw around 80 mph., but could not find a place where there wasn't a Bulldog player. Thorndale made only one error on the night.

Salado's lone run came in the fifth inning Andrew Voelter walked and moved to second on a base on balls to Chris Jackson. Voelter scored on a single to Richard Berumen.

Thorndale added a run in the bottom of the sixth for the final score.

Berumen and Brandon McGregor collected the only base hits for Salado.

Jereme Hosch was tagged with his first loss of the season on the mound for Salado. He pitched into the fourth inning. Hosch allowed all seven of Thorndale's hits. He struck out 5 and walked two. Josh Goodnight pitched two innings striking out four and Chris Frazier pitched a perfect last inning. The Eagles will close out their regular season in Lexington 6 p.m. May 13.

The Postal Service delivers to nearly 50 percent more addresses today than it did just 20 years ago.

Nearly 90 percent of all U.S. mail is related to business and commerce.

Fifty million U.S. families move each year and their First-class mail follows them without extra charge.

By-law, the Postal Service may not set rates to make a profit. It must aim to break even.

The Postal Service receives no tax dollars for operating purposes. The Postal Service operates solely on revenues gener-

ated from the sale of postage and postal products - not tax money.

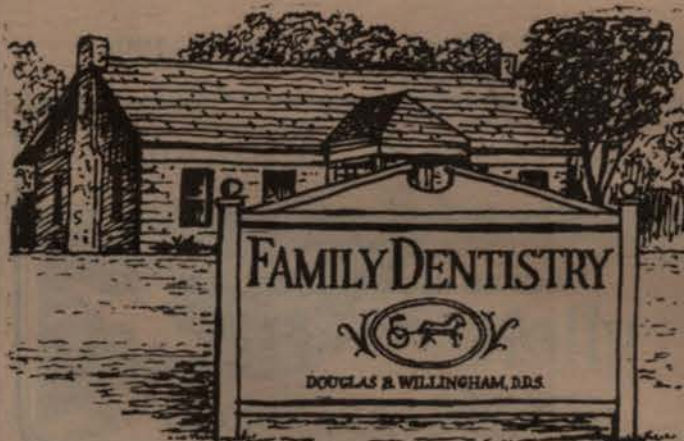
The cost of First-Class stamp today virtually matches that of the 1971 eight-cent stamp in terms of buying power.

To hold down costs, barcodes are used to guide mail through an automated postal system.

Complete and legible addresses help hold down postal rates by reducing processing and delivery costs.

Postage rates in the United States are the lowest in the industrialized world. Compared to the increased costs of most goods, products and services, here and abroad postal service in America remains a bargain.

In 1983, the U.S. Post Office Department processed and delivered nine-billion pieces of mail. In 1993, the U.S. Postal Service processed and delivered 171 billions pieces of mail - an increase of nearly 1,800 percent.

The time is "right" for dollar cost averaging

Many people are reluctant to begin investing because they are waiting for the "right" time to buy. However, what often happens with this investment strategy is that people continue to put off investing because the time never seemed "right" enough. Now is the time to consider taking advantage of a sound financial strategy known as dollar cost averaging.

Dollar cost averaging is one way to smooth out the usual ups and downs of the stock market and lower the average cost of your shares. In addition, this strategy provides a disciplined approach to investing. Dollar cost averaging helps you focus on long-term results and lets you buy more shares when prices are low and fewer shares when prices are high.

Here is how it works:
Instead of buying a large block of shares at once, you consistently invest a fixed dollar amount at regular intervals, such as monthly or quarterly. When prices go up, your money buys fewer shares, and when prices go

down, it buys more. As a result, the average cost of the shares you buy is lower than the average price of the stock during the period you make the investment.

For example, suppose you decide to invest \$100 each month in a particular stock. The first month you buy 10 shares at \$10 each. The second month you're able to buy 12 shares because the price of each share dropped to \$8. The third month you buy 16 shares at a price of \$6 per share. The fourth month, you purchase 20 shares at \$5 each. Over the four-month period, you have invested \$400 and have purchased a total of 58 shares. Commission costs are not factored in here.

The average price per share over the period in which you made your investments is \$7.25 $(\$10 + \$8 + \$6 + \$5)/4$. However, your average cost was \$6.90 $(\$400/58)$, because you bought fewer shares when the price of the stock was high and more shares when it was low. In addition, if you reinvest any dividends your investment produces, you can increase the benefits of dollar cost averaging.

You may be tempted to discontinue your purchases through periods of lower prices, but keep in mind that it's normal for the price of an investment to experience some fluctuation. Dollar cost averaging is best implemented with a long-term view of investing that requires patience and persistence. Like any investment strategy, dollar cost averaging doesn't ensure a profit or protect against loss, so consider both your financial and emotional ability to continue dollar cost averaging through both up and down markets.

Dollar cost averaging works well with stocks, mutual funds and bonds. If you can afford only to invest small amounts, you may want to sue this strategy with mutual funds. So, if you're waiting for the "right" moment to invest, consider using dollar cost averaging as a convenient and efficient strategy for saving for your future financial goals.
