## Texas Masons relevel cornerstone

Masons from the Grand Lodge of Texas, as well as Salado masons and many others, were present May 15 for the re-leveling of the cornerstone at the old red brick schoolhouse.

Salado Chamber of Commerce President Denver Mills recognized the work of Bob Cottle, Suzi Epps and Ken Clapp on this project.

"Without the support of the community, though," Mills said, "we could not have done any of this."

Mills told of donations from former students, teachers and villagers "from \$5 to \$40,000."

He also thanked the Meadows Foundation, which gave \$118,000, enough to make it possible

to finish the whole project, rather than completing it in phases.

Mills said that construction is going well and the building should be ready for use in late summer.

SISD Superintendent Steven Ervin gave a brief history of the old school, which was erected in 1924 and last used as a school in 1979.

The last graduating class from the old red school has 23 members, four of which attended schools all 12 years in Salado: John Brown, Dee Ann Dunnahoo, Kenneth Frazier, and T.R. McLaughlin.

Four teachers remain in Salado schools from the days of the old school-

house: Dennis Cabaniss, Donna Driggers, Delphene VanDyke, and Penny Currv.

Bob Scott, past Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Texas, led the Masonic ceremony of re-leveling the cornerstone.

The leveling of cornerstones dates back to Europe "when the stone masons of Europe built the great cathedrals that stand today," Scott said.

The ceremony included many members of the Grand Lodge of Texas as well as members of the Salado Masonic Lodge.

**Consenting Adults** is a thriller along the lines of **Fatal Attraction** and **Pacific Heights**. While it is a good thriller, it is nowhere near as good as **Fatal Attraction**. But of course, **Fatal Attraction** broke the mold.

Kevin Kline stars as Richard Parker, as successful advertising writer, who begins to fall in lust with his neighbor's wife, Kay Otis (Rebecca Miller).

Halfway through, Kay is murdered and all fingers point to the unfaithful Parker, who must prove his innocence not to lose his wife (Mary Elizabeth Mastrantonio) and daughter.

Kevin Spacey carries the show as Eddy Otis, who flies through life on the seat of his pants. He quickly befriends Richard and Priscilla, who become indebted to him and caught in his web.

While **Consenting Adults** is entertaining, it is quickly predictable, and violent, as are most movies from this genre.

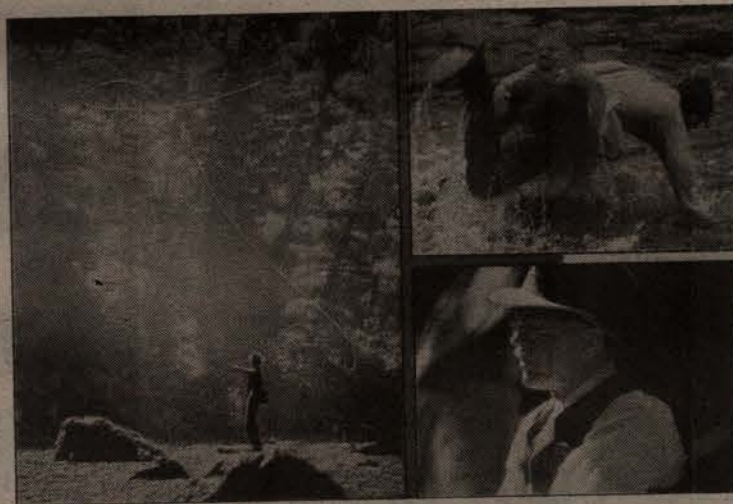

### Off the Record

A most interesting and far reaching event took place at a recent meeting of the Board of Directors of the Salado Chamber of Commerce when president Denver Mills appointed board member Jap Barrett to chair a study group that is charged with taking a look at the needs of the village 10 to 20 years down the line. And folks, that is well into the next century-just around the corner.

This long range study and planning group will work together for at least 3 years so as to avoid the problem of changing horses and direction every year as is common with chamber committees.

Barrett will be joined by other board members Wylene Williams, Bill Heath and Dr. Wayne Baden for starters and will later include a wide variety of the talent residing in Salado.

No question that the community is growing and changing. School population continues to climb each year. Number of water meters increases as does the volume of mail at the local Post Office - all sure signs of progress. Business-wise, there is no doubt as to growth in that area. A simple drive up and down Main Street will convince even a doubter that commerce is alive and kicking.

Couple all this with the large number of new home currently under construction and you have a fairly good idea of a village on the move.

This matter of growth - both from a people and commercial standpoint - and what the needs of these two factors will be in the year to come, is the difficult assignment for the new long range planning and study group.

Subjects to be addressed will probably include future water needs; sewer systems; traffic control; police protection; educational needs including personnel and facilities; the protection of Salado creek and Pace Park; the attraction of light industries and even the oft discussed incorporation. These and many more subjects will be explored. Villagers with special expertise will be asked to help formulate guidelines for study. Informa-

tion from county, state and national sources will be sought. And the list goes on and on.

Those men and women who accept these challenging assignments may well hold, in their hands and minds, the very future of the village.

One fact stood out clear from the outset - the initial group has no preconceived notions about what Salado will, or should, be like in the next two decades. Only a desire to lay out the possibilities so citizens may chart a clear course of action rather than let "nature take its course" and wind up either with a joke for a town or be a quickly annexed "part" of a larger community. Salado's future deserves the very best thinking available. The newly formed chamber committee is the first step in that wise direction.

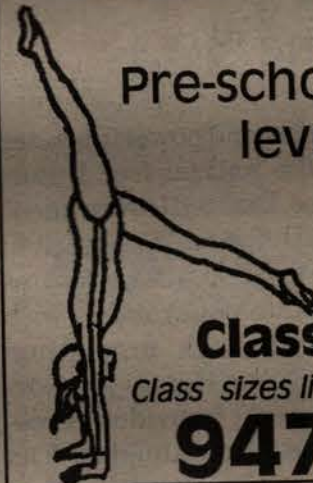

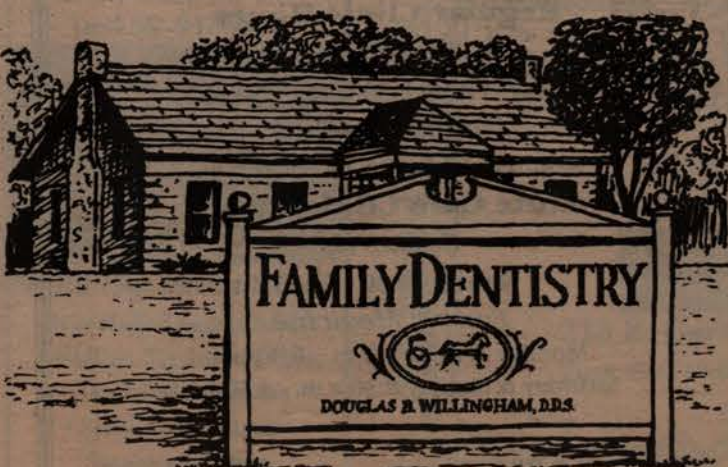

**Making the most of your retirement income**

**Mutual Funds**

If you want to rely on the expertise of professional money managers (as well as diversifying your investment dollars), you could invest in a mutual fund. Your shares in mutual fund represent an investment in a diversified portfolio of securities. And, you can invest in a mutual fund for a low minimum amount.

During retirement, you may find that either an income fund (one that invest only in bonds) or a balanced fund (one that invests in both stocks and bonds) can help to meet your goals. You should keep in mind that, like stocks, the value of your mutual fund will fluctuate.

**Bonds**

Another alternative to consider is bonds. Municipal bonds especially offer a number of attractive features. Bonds offer safety and liquidity, and municipal bonds are available with maturities from one to 40 years. In addition, the interest income from certain issues may be subject to the alternative minimum taxes (interest from certain issues may be subject to the alternative minimum tax for some investors). In some cases, the interest

from municipal bonds is also exempt from state and local tax (depending on where you live and what bonds you buy) Most bonds pay interest every six months.

Other attractive bonds include treasury bonds and bills, which offer timely payment of principal and interest guaranteed by the U.S. Government. Retirees looking for monthly income often turn to mortgage-backed securities such as ginnie maes and CMOs. These bonds allow investors to share in a pool of mortgages backed by the government-sponsored agencies or conventional mortgages.

**Annuities**

Annuities offer several features that make them an attractive addition to a retiree's portfolio. Annuities are bought from, and issued by, insurance companies. You deposit a sum of money and the insurance company pays you either a fixed interest rate or a variable rate tied to a stock, bond or money market account. The earnings from your money are tax-deferred until you withdraw them. Withdrawals before age 59-1/2 may be subject to a 10% IRS penalty.

One or a combination of many of these investment vehicles can help you manage your retirement finances. But before you buy, make sure you've defined your investment objectives and have evaluated whether the investment is consistent with these goals.

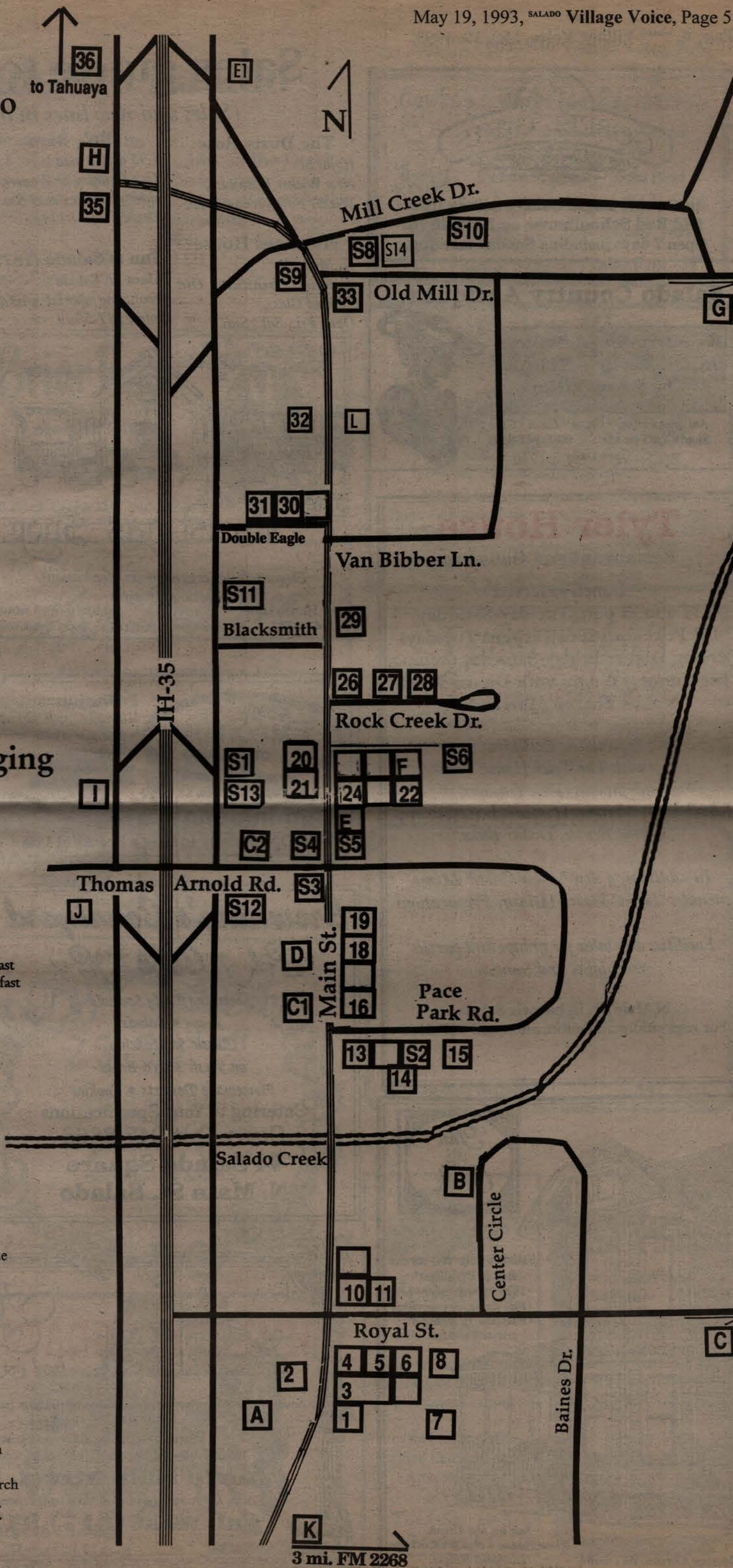

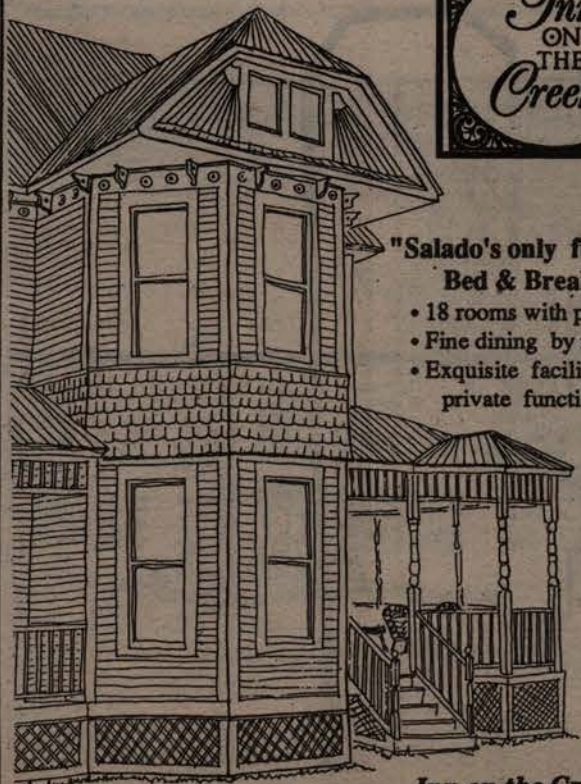

# Beginning a self-concept program

There is no hard fast rules as to what the essential components of a self concept program should be. However there is a general consensus that the following concepts should be reflected in a classroom self concept program.

**1. Self Concept**

a. Make students and parents familiar with the components of self concept and the importance of fostering a positive self concept.

b. Model behaviors which foster the development of strong self perceptions.

c. Treat all students as valuable individuals

d. Foster the development of student interests

e. Allow time for discussion of student feelings, needs, concerns, likes dislikes, opinions.

**2. Goal setting**

Give students an opportunity to:

a. Access personal capabilities

b. Set reasonable individual and class goals

c. Identify steps to attainment of goals

d. Record progress towards goals

e. Realize success

f. Help students learn from mistakes.

3. Values as the guidelines of like.

a. Encourage students to make personal judgments while respecting opinions of others.

b. Have students exercise and evaluate their own values reinforcing those which are most desirable.

4. Group dynamic

Students will be involved in opportunities for healthy

group situations which emphasize:

a. Group interaction

b. The consequences of poor group reaction

c. The value of friends and characteristics of true friendship

5. Problem solving

a. Allowing students input in problem solving activities

b. Encourage students to solve problems in a healthy manner as opposed to ignoring them

c. Teach problem solving techniques.
