## 28th Annual Salado Art Fair set Aug. 6-7 in Pace Park

This weekend Salado welcomes visitors to the **28th Annual Salado Art Fair**. Preparations are complete and the volunteers are ready. Food and refreshments offered by the civic and school organizations will be available on the grounds with a hospitality tents and tables nearby.

Tickets to win a handmade quilt will be available at the Salado Chamber of Commerce Auxiliary booth, while the Salado Public Library booth will be filled with books for sale.

The Salado Volunteer Fire Department First Aid Station will have Emergency Medical Services near the pavilion. Members of the SVFD will patrol the area and offer assistance when needed.

Handicap parking is located at the Pace Park grounds and free transportation to the fair grounds will be provided from the free parking area at the IGA Village Foods shopping center.

Aug. 6-7, the gates will

open 9-5 p.m. Sat. Aug. 6 and 10-5 p.m. Sun. Aug. 7. Admission is \$3 per person, free to children age 12 and under. A free booklet containing a map of each artists booth location is available at the gate.

The Salado Art Fair is sponsored by the Salado Chamber of Commerce. Proceeds support the Old Salado School Foundation, Pace Park, street lights, scholarships and many other community projects.

### For the First Time

Showing his work for the first time is artist Jon Birdsong. Although the Texas Panhandle was originally Birdsong's inspiration for most of his career, the beautiful landscape of Arkansas now consumes his interest.

His work reflects the beauty of many regions of the country. Paintings characterized by moody skies, nostalgic buildings, trees with character, weathered fences and barns, old "out to pasture" vehicles and farm implements and a smattering of wildlife have earned

Birdsong nation-wide appeal.

Preferring to work with watercolor, Birdsong's technique is basically wet-into wet with dry brushing the final stages. He utilizes a limited palette which he feels sets the mood of his subject matter.

He has won several prestigious awards, making his works, which are sold through major galleries in Texas and New Mexico, in great demand. He first received national prominence when President Gerald Ford accepted a bird song painting to hang in the White House. In addition his work was recently added to Governor Jim Guy Tucker's collection.

Birdsong prefers to do his painting in his home studio, but spends much of his time at his studio/gallery on North Street in Magnolia.

### Rock Cats

Linda Kimbrough is a native Texan who grew up in Fort Worth. She started painting rocks in 1979 and has had tremendous success with her product,

which is rocks with cats painted on them. Sometimes they are painted from photographs of someone's favorite cat which makes the "pet rock" especially unique.

Kimbrough has been showing at the Salado Art Fair for several years and always draws a crowd of

young and old to these life-like creatures.

Unlike ordinary cats, Linda's never twitch their tail or prowl at night, neither do they climb trees, but they are a great conversation piece and unique decorative item. These cats have been in Southern Liv-

## TEA shows improving TAAS scores

Texas Education Agency recently released Texas Assessment of Academic Skills test scores, showing dramatic gains on the TAAS by the state's 4th, 8th and 10th graders.

Salado ISD's averages for 1994 are shown beside the

state averages for comparison.

Superintendent Steven Ervin said a report card will be going to each home in November from TEA regarding these results.

Other items of interest in the report card to par-

ents will be the attendance rate of the district, which is 96.4 percent, a dropout rate for the district of less than 1 percent for all students and the percent of students taking the SAT/ACT tests, which is 70.8 percent in 1993.

**Shadowlands** may turn out to be a great bargaining chip for men across America. Guys, here's how to play it. Agree to sit through this ordeal of a tear-jerking drama with your wife or sweetheart. Afterward, when your sweetie is done drying her tear-filled eyes, mention casually that you would like to see a "real" movie.

Like **Tombstone**, **True Lies**, **Die Hard** (for the 20th time). Or any other testosterone-filled extravaganza. Unless you can trade in **Shadowlands** on a two-for-one basis, though, your wife will make out better than you.

Anthony Hopkins plays author C.S. Lewis, an inhibited Englishman who finds magic only in his children's stories. This is much the same character as Hopkins portrayed in **Howard's End** and **The Remains of the Day**. He comes alive when he meets Joy, a tough talking New York woman and her son.

Of course, Joy dies, as do most of the characters portrayed by doe-eyed Debra Winger. But before she passes, Jack (Hopkins) realizes his love for her (as do all male characters opposite Ms. Winger).

**Shadowlands** is terribly boring for those viewers who do not immediately connect with Jack and Joy (which I did not because of Hopkins' underacting and Winger's over-acting).

## The brick stops here...

Salado Civic Center places memorial bricks in patio

Next time you drive by the civic center on Main Street, wheel in and take a peek at the area on the northwest corner that is now home to nearly 250 personalized bricks. The concrete work is excellent and when the project is completed with shrubs and a bench it will be something else to be proud of in the renovated complex.

There are 19 newly engraved bricks waiting to be installed on Sept. 1. These were sold since the initial work was completed last week. If you want your name to be among this group to be installed in perpetuity - get your \$100 donation to the Chamber of Commerce office (conveniently located on the first floor of the community building) no later than Aug. 19. Orders from that point will be taken to Terrell Granite Works for imprinting and finally on the first of September, will be set in concrete.

From that time on - until all spaces are sold - orders will be taken for placement every four to six weeks. There is room for some 200 more bricks at this writing.

Funds from the sale of personalized bricks go directly toward the payment of the building's debt. Scheduled payoff of the one time \$100,000 loan - now

standing at a respectable \$50,000, is no later than Spring of 1995.

#### Salado Creek

Salado Creek and the village of Salado are getting a lot of attention since the County Judge's press conference that pointed out the pollution problem we are

having in a short stretch of the waterway from the I-35 overpass to just east of Main Street. The print and electronic media did their thing with statewide results. Phones jangled for a few days there there were some cancellations at Pace Park - money cheerfully refunded. Folks from as far away a Dallas called for info.

We now have three state groups investigating to see if they can discover the source of the impure water. Our special thanks to Pat Merrill and her Creek watchers for alerting us to the potential health danger associated with the polluted water. Pat reported last week that the bacteria count had dropped dramatically for some reason although the Texas Natural

Resources Commission could not, as of now, locate the source of the trouble. The TNRCC and the Brazos River Authority, that does the actual water diagnosing, along with the county health authorities are all working on the case. Some thought of dropping dyes in septic systems to see if they are percolating into the creek. On the other hand - it just may be the pigeons that roost under the bridge.

Once the problem is solved and the water pristine, it is hoped that County Judge John Garth will be as quick to call another press conference to announce the creek being clean - as he was to report the problem in the first place.

Signs alerting the public to the water problem went up late last week. Hope they come down soon even if the water aficionados don't spend much money in our shops as a general rule.

## Burning ban

Bell County Commissioners recently voted to ban outdoor burning in the county during the month of August. The "Declaration of a State of Local Disaster" prohibits all outdoor burning except that in containers, or appliances used for food preparation.

From Oct. 1, 1993 through June 30, 1994, County Fire Departments have responded to 116 fires related to outdoor burning. That figure amounts to 20 percent of all county fire calls.

At the Fire Chiefs meeting on July 19, County Fire Marshal Joe Bentley remarked, "Holland, Moffat and Southwest Bell County departments responded to a total of 15 fire calls during that part of the month. Nine of the fires related to outdoor burning."

"Lack of rain is the primary reason for the court's declaration," Judge Garth reported. "Our county's fire departments are tasked with enough hazardous duty as it is. If we can lessen or eliminate part of the risk of life and property by our disaster declaration, we are only doing our duty as elected officials."

The Declaration includes a provision that if "substantial" precipitation falls in one are of the county, the burn ban will be suspended for 24 hours in that area only.

grandmother made an agreement with a fabric company that they would buy so many fabric pieces at one time if they would offer them a better deal. So they buy the overstock sets and the discontinued pieces. By saving time on not having to cut the fabric pieces the savings are passed to the customer. This also means if you see a quilt you really like, you better get it... since their fabric purchases can not be duplicated.

The money they make from the sale of quilts goes into a college fund for their children which motivates the entire family to work even harder.



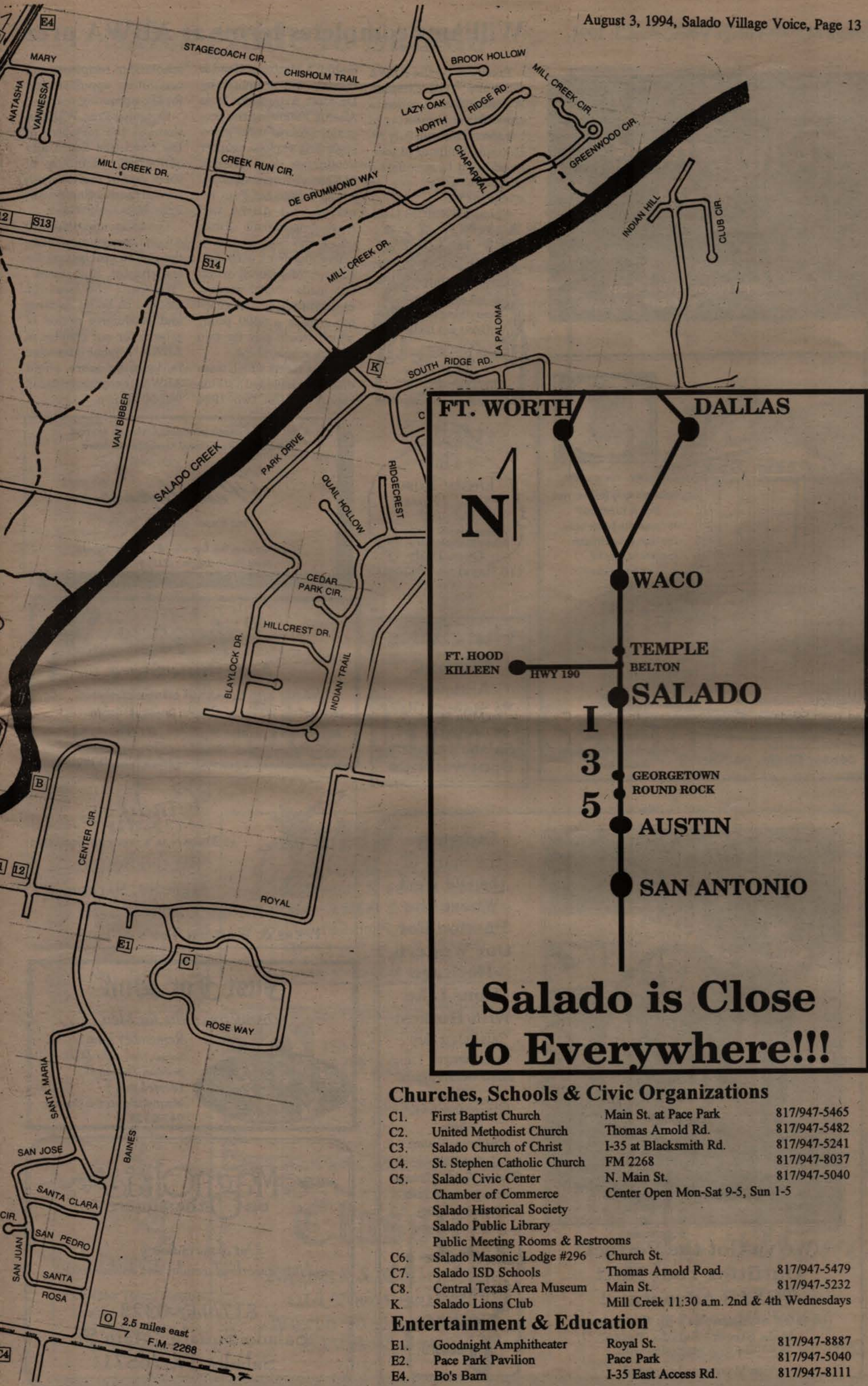

## Outdoor Adventures Lure Travelers To Wisconsin's Great River Road Country

(NAPS)—Those in search of outdoor adventure don't have to travel far, considering what Southwest Wisconsin has to offer—outstanding hiking, bicycling and canoeing.

"The area's rolling hills, bluffs and waterways are a great setting for outdoor recreation," said Moose Speros, administrator of the Wisconsin Division of Tourism.

### Hiking at Its Peak

Wyalusing State Park is famous for the spectacular overlooks where the Wisconsin and Mississippi Rivers converge. Voted one of America's best walks, hikers can catch sight of wild turkeys, eagles and deer.

### Bicycling Rails to Trails

Wisconsin is famous for its "rails to trails" pro-

gram—old railroad tracks converted to bicycling and hiking trails. The 32.5-mile Elroy-Sparta Trail was the first "rails to trails" conversion in the nation. The trail passes through three massive rock tunnels.

The Great River Trail that winds along the shore of the Mississippi traces a 22.5-mile path through Trempealeau and Perrot State Parks to the Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge. The parks' 500-foot bluffs provide stunning river views.

The 21.5-mile La Crosse River State Trail takes riders past farmlands, trout streams and forests. It's an important link between the Great River and Elroy-Sparta trails—together the three trails offer 75 miles

of bicycling.

### Paddlers' Paradise

Canoeing can be a gentle ride down a quiet river or a wild ride amidst whitewater rapids. Southwest Wisconsin rivers offer both.

The Kickapoo River, known as "the most crooked river in the world," is navigable its entire length and offers a gentle and scenic ride.

The Wisconsin River is one of the most popular rivers to navigate, especially along the lower stretch with numerous islands, bluffs and shifting sandbars.

be the "toughest" candidate for Governor. Last week the Democratic incumbent told county sheriffs from around the state that she plans to introduce (if re-elected) legislation that would mandate a statewide curfew for teen-agers in an effort to combat the rising juvenile crime situation. GOPer George Bush, in his effort to unseat Richards, is also favoring a curfew but insists it should be done at the local city or county level.

In either case, it would appear that more and more adults are trying to do, by statute, the job parents fear to do through discipline - keeping their kids home at night.

Young toughs who sleep

all day and prowl all night are probably responsible for the graffiti slapped on the base of the Salado Water Company's main tower near the entrance to Mill creek. If you buy water from the company, you will have a chance, no doubt, to help pay for the damage. If the culprits are found, their parents may be forced to pay the costs - if the presiding judge has any sense. What really needs to be done is to have the parents pay the bill and then have the kids work off an equal amount of money, in time, doing public work - like cleaning up and down the creek or sweeping and cleaning the streets. Use of a cane is not always neces-

sary but public humiliation and retribution may be all that is left to deter juvenile delinquent behavior thanks to the general abdication of parental control.

Only hurdle to all this is the natural inclination of today's parents to defend their kids no matter what and the juvenile justice system that only slaps wrist. No wonder kids run wild - day and night.

And that is the reason why candidates for our highest office in Texas - as well as those seeking legislative seats - are talking tough about kid crime and gaining support from a public sick and tired of youthful disorderly conduct and hooliganism.

## Americans Should Prepare for Disasters

The American Red Cross and True Value store owners across the United States are asking Americans to spend one hour this summer preparing for the worst. - An extra pair of glasses
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- A battery-powered radio, flashlight, and plenty of extra batteries
- An extra set of car keys
- A list of important family health information: the style and serial number of medical devices, such as pacemakers
- Special items for infants, elderly, or disabled family members



The Red Cross Emergency Preparedness Checklist being distributed by True Value was written by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the American Red Cross. The Red Cross disaster relief efforts also are being supported in a nationwide, syndicated television special, **True Value Presents Red Cross Across America**, featuring celebrities from Morgan Freeman to Dan Aykroyd, as well as stories of those who have benefitted from Red Cross disaster assistance.

"We're proud to support the emergency relief efforts of the Red Cross by sponsoring this program," said Porter. 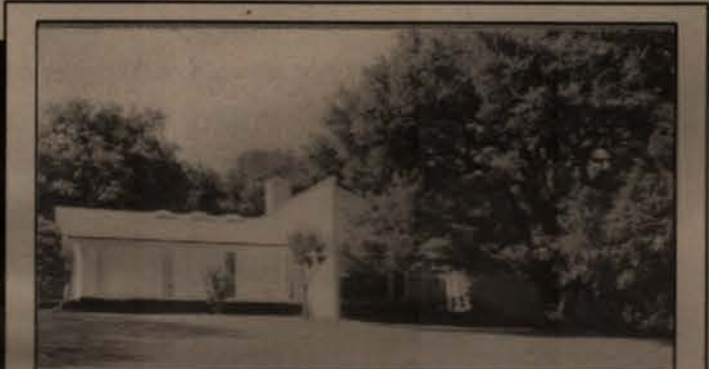

## *To the folks of Salado.*

You've probably noticed all the commotion over at the TYLER HOUSE. Well, I'm the cause of it.

My name is Gene Street. If you've been around here a while, you might remember me as Ernest Gene, the son of Snookie and Billye Street, and the grandson of Ernest and Beulah Williams. I was born over in Prairie Dell. Not long after, we moved to Brownwood but there was always a lot of visiting back and forth. A lot of my relatives still live in Salado, Austin, Bartlett, Temple and Belton. You might remember some of them: Bunk, Pete and Buck Street, Truett and Guinn Williams, Granger Killingsworth, Robert Hodge, J.D. Hinsley and Alfred Smith. Anyway, I'm 53 now and I've been around a little bit, but in all that time, I've never found any place I liked better than Salado.

I live in Dallas. I moved up here after I graduated from Howard Payne University in Brownwood and got out of the Air Force, where I earned the rank of Captain and served in Southeast Asia, the Pacific and the U.S. I also got a master's degree in liberal arts from SMU. In 1972, a partner and I started a restaurant called the Black-eyed Pea, which grew to 47 locations. We sold them to a British company in 1986.

Since then, I've been working on a restaurant called Good Eats. Today we have 14 locations including three licensees in Austin and 11 locations in Dallas and Oklahoma City. I've also opened a restaurant in Acapulco and this September my Texas Embassy Cantina will open in London, England.

I'm known in Dallas for serving a great chicken-fried steak, but I've also operated several Mexican food restaurants including Mother Mesquite's and Tamales. 
