



Kiss of Death

Kiss of Death is inevitably overshadowed by Pulp Fiction, but it is a much better film. David Caruso (NYPD Blue) makes his move to feature films as Jimmy Kilmartin, an ex-con trying to stay on the straight and narrow.

His cousin convinces him to drive in one more heist, a caper in which Jimmy is caught and serves several years in jail. But he keeps his mouth shut, and Little Junior (Nicolas Cage), brings him in under his wing.

Jimmy is forced to choose between turning in Little Junior or keeping his silence.

It is a terrific story and Caruso is outstanding in his portrayal of the ex-con. Samuel L. Jackson is also strong as Calvin, a police detective who is thrown into a strange friendship with Jimmy by fate.

Kiss of Death is violent, but it does not glorify its violence as Pulp Fiction did. While they are very much the same subject matter and genre, you can hardly compare Kiss of Death with Pulp Fiction.

Providing these leaders could put up with the zigzaggery ego and erratic



The resignation was to take immediate effect.


"There are good and sufficient reasons for this action without considering the stress on my health of which I have been advised to observe," Hector said in his letter.


And finally, stray cats who are hungry and seem to get shot now and then do weigh on the consciences of our citizens.

Epps stated that there was a two fold reason for computerizing the library's collection.

"First to make it easier for public library patrons and secondly to enable students within the Salado Public School System to borrow books from the public library." The public library and the school libraries both utilize the Follett software and are able to share patron and collection information.

Effective Oct. 2, any SISD student will be able to borrow books, audio tapes or video tapes the same as they would from the school libraries. By the end of the year, students will be able to look up in their system and find out what's available at either of the library systems.
