## Wild Bunch coming for Art Fair Aug. 2-3

*Texas group members join more than 150 artists accepted for show this weekend*

Clifton artist George Boutwell will be leading the Texas Wild Bunch into the 31st Annual Salado Art Fair Aug. 2-3 in Pace Park.

Boutwell has been showing at the Salado Art Fair almost since its inception.

Boutwell is well-known throughout the state and country, having shown his work in countless shows, one-man exhibits and galleries.

He has been awarded Best of Show at numerous shows as well, including Cowtown Invitational, South Oklahoma City Art Assoc. Spring Show, Champions Village Festival in Houston, Texas Wild Bunch Annual Jail Break in Granbury, Special Session in Austin and 1984 Waco Invitational.

He has been featured in numerous magazine articles, including two times in Texas Highways and Austin magazine.

Twice he has been a finalist for the State Legislature's official Texas State Artist.

Joining Boutwell will be Larry Bridges. With more than 30 years experience, Larry Bridges realistically captures and accurately preserves nostalgic subjects, landmarks, and period settings. He offers lithographic prints of pen and ink drawings, as well as the originals. They are available in

black and white or hand watercolored, and framed. Also, he executes pen and ink drawings on a commission basis.

As a member of the Texas Wild Bunch, an elite group of Texas full-time professional artists, his art has been displayed at invitation-only shows, galleries, museums and fine art festivals.

He has been showing as a full-time artist since 1985 and has received First Place and Best of Show awards.

Larry and his wife Sharon now reside in Brady where Larry Bridges Studio and Gallery is opening in 1997.

Fort Worth drybrush artist Dan Brown will also show at the Salado Art Fair this weekend.

Dan Brown paints Texas, her landscape, her wildlife, her historical buildings.

His passion for history is evident in each painting. Brown spent more than two years researching the contribution of the windmill made to the settling of the southwestern United States and in completing 40 paintings to illuminate windmill history.

Born in Midland, Brown grew up in Lubbock and studies art at Texas Tech University. He later studied with William Whiteside, Henry Gasser

and Ronald Thomason.

For the past 18 years, he has traveled Texas to research and paint. His paintings and prints hang in private collections in cities, towns and farmhouses all across Texas, as well as 18 other states, Canada, Japan, Europe, Africa and South America.

Wade Butler is another Wild Bunch member showing at the Salado Art Fair.

He has been a resident of San Marcos since 1960 when he arrived with his military family after a stint in Germany. He is a graduate of Southwest Texas University, where he received a degree in biology and chemistry in 1969 prior to his 15 years with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department as a fisheries biologist.

## MAKING OSHA A PARTNER, NOT AN ENEMY

Calvin Coolidge once said, "The business of the American people is business." Therefore, our government should be working with business not against it. Nowhere does this ring truer than in current debate over reforming the Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA).

As a former small business owner, and having spoken with literally thousands of employers and employees throughout Texas, I am convinced employers and workers alike would benefit if OSHA functioned in a way that helped establish workable safety standards and enforced those standards fairly and reasonably.

Rather than look to OSHA as a partner in safety, many employers I know fear the agency and its random inspections that turn their work sites upside down. We need to put behind us the days of Byzantine regulations and "gotcha" enforcement practices. We must recast OSHA into a modern, effective partner in the rapidly evolving American workplace.

The fundamental, statutory flaw in OSHA is that current law does not require the agency to consider the feasibility and unintended consequences of its regulatory actions. Nor does current law provide the agency with any incentive to do so.

I have a bill before the Senate, the Occupational Safety and Health Reform Act, to transform OSHA from an agency based on fear to one based on cooperation, from an agency of arbitrary procedures to one focused on common sense.

Key elements of my bill would:

- \* Require OSHA to consider the feasibility of the requirements it seeks to impose on employers before promulgating any new regulation.
- \* Require OSHA to weigh the costs and the expected benefits of new regulations and articulate the results each regulation would achieve.
- \* Require OSHA to determine whether it has chosen the most cost-effective means of meeting those goals.

On the enforcement side of the equation, my bill would allow and encourage employers to take their own steps to improve health and safety, as well as to utilize government approved safety consultants to help them improve the workplace. Employers who demonstrate this commitment through low injury rates would be exempt from some of the more unfair and burdensome requirements.

Make no mistake: I realize that there are employers out there for whom safety is not a priority. To them, I say: Beware. My bill will free OSHA to concentrate its resources and enforcement efforts on those employers who willfully disregard workplace safety and health.

But the vast majority of employers want to do right by their employees. They should have the ability to work on meeting health and safety objectives in a way that makes the most sense for their company. For this vast majority of American businesses, we're trying to send relief.



## Early voting continues until Aug. 5 on constitutional amendment

Absentee voting for the August 9, referendum on the statewide constitutional amendment (Proposition One) ends this coming Tuesday, August 5, at 5 p.m. Nearest place for Saladoans to vote in advance of the regular election day, would be the Bell County Courthouse - second floor.

This amendment will, if passed, increase each homeowner's school district homestead exemption from the current \$5 thousand to \$15 grand. **The local tax break will amount to about \$130.00 when tax notices start arriving October 1.**

Prop One also includes a secondary break for school district homeowners in that it will, (again, if passed), allow a person to take his (or her) "frozen" school tax assignment with him should said taxpayer move to a new homestead.

Currently folks over 65 have a tax "hold" on their current domicile only. Any move forces the senior to start over with a new and often times higher tax-freeze level.

**Two good reasons for citizens to vote in favor of the August 9, referendum.**

Thanks to one of this column's steady readers, we have this week correctly entitled the upcoming vote on the constitution as a **referendum rather than an election**, as we failed to do last week.

It was pointed out, correctly, that an election deals with the selection of public officials while a referendum deals only with the "submission of a proposed public measure to a direct popular vote".

Again, we are indebted to our readers - first for reading and second for taking time to advise.

stowed on the long suffering American taxpayers. You know - how much they plan to return from the hard earned bucks we sent them in the first place.

Anyway - the Republicans, the Democrats and the White House are battling to see which group can come up with a plan that pleases the most number of voters while at the same time **further complicating an already disgusting maze of legal gobbledygook called the tax code.**

# LEGAL MATTERS

## IN THE DARK ABOUT CAR REPAIR?

CAR REPAIRS can be one of the biggest headaches a consumer faces. Today's cars and trucks are so complex that it is sometimes very difficult to diagnose problems. This can make it hard for the average consumer to know if the proposed repair will actually fix the car.

It can also make it easy for an unscrupulous mechanic to include unnecessary but expensive work as part of the repair job, use second-hand parts, or bill you for repair work that was not done. We at the Office of the Attorney General want to assist you in avoiding this kind of "repair" job.

### DTPA protects consumers

Texas has no law specifically governing auto repairs. However, the Texas Deceptive Trade Practices Act — the state's most comprehensive consumer protection law — includes several sections that cover repairs. Under this act, it is illegal to:

- Knowingly make a false or misleading statement about the need for parts or repair.
- State that work has been done or that parts were replaced when that is not true.
- Claim that the parts used in the repair are new or original, when in fact they are second-hand or reconditioned.

### Do your homework

The simplest way to avoid a problem is to find a reputable mechanic or repair shop to do your repairs. Ask your relatives or friends for referrals. Call the local Better Business Bureau and our office to see whether anyone has complained about the shops you are considering. Also ask for the names of customers you may contact to see if they are satisfied with the work done by the shop. If you suspect the repair shop has violated the law, and you cannot get the problem resolved to your satisfaction, take your car to another shop and have the repair work inspected. Get the second shop's report in writing. You will need it in the event of mediation or a lawsuit.

Remember, if you refuse to pay a repair bill, the shop owner has the legal right to keep your car until you pay. You may find the only way to resolve the situation is to pay the bill (making clear to the mechanic that you do not agree to it), then either seek mediation or file suit against the shop under the DTPA in small claims court.

### Don't go broke when your car breaks

To reduce the risk of becoming a victim, consider the following tips:

- Always get a written estimate before any work is done.
- Tell the mechanic to call you in advance if additional work is

needed.

- Ask to have the old parts returned to you.
- Get everything in writing, including an explanation of the difference between the estimate and final bill, and keep every piece of paper.
- If your charge is much higher than the estimate, or if the work was done without your authorization, politely, but firmly, question the bill.
- Try to settle the matter amicably before taking any other action.

Honest repair shops know that their business depends on their good reputation. They will try to resolve the problem to everyone's satisfaction.

### For more information

We're here to help. If you have a repair problem that the shop will not correct to your satisfaction, contact the Attorney General's Consumer Protection Office nearest you and ask for a complaint form. Or call us toll free at (800) 621-0508. Also, the consumer complaint form is available at our web site on the Internet at <http://www.oag.state.tx.us>.

Our trained mediators will attempt to resolve the dispute between the consumer and repair shop. Your local Better Business Bureau may also provide mediation services.

## Temple College is focus of Lions Club talk

The hottest market in community education involves senior citizens going back to school to learn computers.

"So they can E-mail their grandkids," said Dick Archer, director of institutional advancement for Temple College, formerly Temple Junior College.

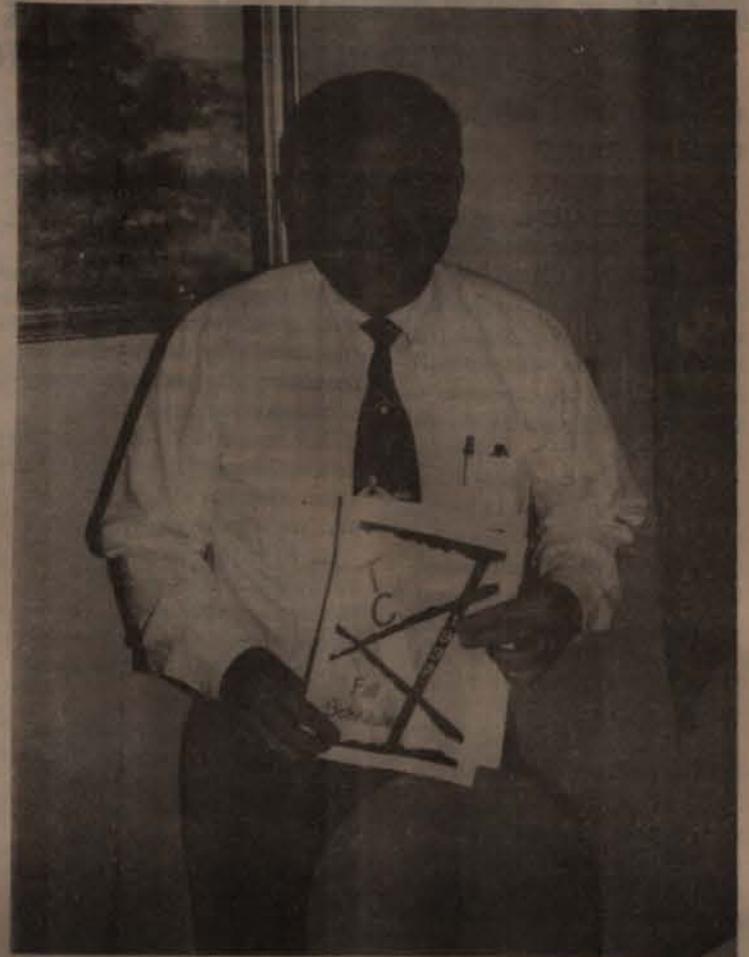
Archer addressed the Salado Lions during their July 23 meeting at Mill Creek Country Club.

Introduced as TC's "public relations man," Archer gave an overview of a community college that has experienced a resurgence since Marc Nigliazzo took over as president two years ago.

Archer reminded the Lions that Dr. Nigliazzo (pronounced Nig-Lee-Ozzo) had addressed them at a similar luncheon after taking over as president in 1995. Archer made a return visit to tell the Lions how Dr. Nigliazzo's ambitious goals have become reality.

Enrollment is expected to reach 3,000 this fall, up from 2,860 last year. Archer said enrollment hovered around 2,400 for several years.

The passage of a \$3.2 million bond issue in June will allow for improvements on the campus and in classrooms. A center for student services will be the first new building on campus in 15 years, Archer

noted.

This lone building will handle what offices in several buildings were once doing. It will also house a much-needed testing center.

In the past, students were forced to go to Waco or Austin to take such tests as college entrance exams and the like.

As for financial aid, Archer said the college offers more than 200 scholarships. While most of the scholarship money

is awarded to students with a specific degree program (such as nursing), nearly a third of it is awarded with "no strings attached" other than financial need.

Archer said the Temple College Foundation Inc. offered more scholarship money last year than in the previous five years. The average scholarship is worth \$500 a semester.

Archer pointed out that TC is supported by taxes from only Temple. In fact, it has the smallest taxing district of the state's 50 community colleges.

The college's biggest fundraising event, the Temple College Foundation Benefit Golf Classic, raised \$12,000 last year. The goal of this year's event, set for Sept. 22 at Wildflower Country Club in Temple, is \$15,000.

The money is used to provide scholarships, reward faculty for outstanding performance and enhance the quality of the academic environment.

There's also the annual jazz festival, which attracted 1,500 people over two days this past April, including several from Salado, Archer said.

As for new projects on campus, TC's nine-hole golf course has been leased to a local business group that plans a \$250,000 project to convert it into a nine-hole executive course. It will remain affordable to the public, Archer stressed.

The course encompasses 78 acres. It was built by German POWs during World War II and dedicated by legendary golfer Byron Nelson.

Another new project involves a 32-unit housing project on three acres behind

the gym. The units are primarily geared for single parents - enrolled in a specific degree program - who need help with transportation and child-care.

Although TC is a two-year college, it offers certain upper-level classes through Texas A&M.

Archer said TC does more technical training than just that related to the health field. In fact, 62 percent of the students are taking vocational/technical courses.

Archer also noted that the allied health programs have helped 272 students get off welfare.

"There are some really exciting things (happening) to allow students to earn several (different) degrees," he said.

Salado High is among the schools working with TC on dual credits, where seniors can take classes to get college credits.

Archer noted that the average TC student is 30 years old, an indication that older people are going back to college.

While some are earning degrees, others are simply taking non-credit courses.

Among the non-credit courses available next month is "Exploring the Internet," where students will "use a live hands-on connection to the information superhighway to

learn what the Internet is, how it works, how to receive documents from virtually anyone, and how to conduct worldwide research."

The class meets Tuesdays and Thursdays, 6:15-8:45 p.m., Aug. 5-14. Cost is \$50, plus a book.

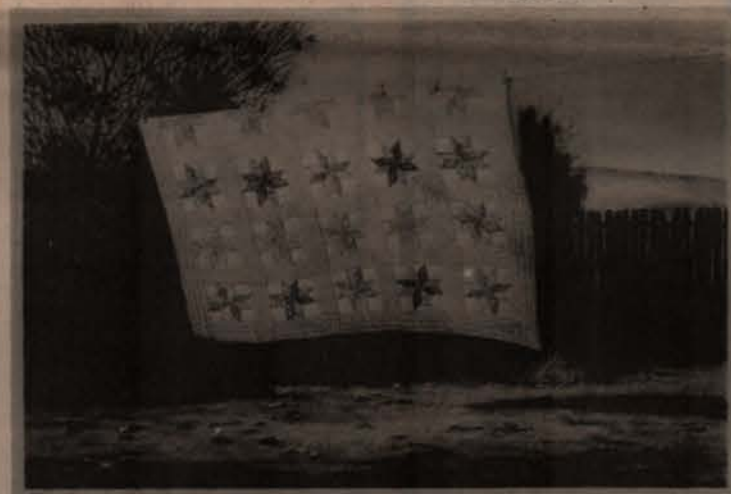

business. She previously worked as a bank officer and a draftsman, doing house plans for a lumber company.

Her thought-process during those days was "I've got to go to work," as opposed to "I get to go to work," which is how she feels now.

Going to school at night to get her master hair stylist license certainly paid off. "I look at this as a career, truly I do," she said, of BoTangles. "The day it becomes a job, it's time to get out."

It's no surprise she's in this line of work, considering that five of her sisters have had their own salons, and two of her three brothers were barbers.

As the youngest of 10 children, Iris got to watch her older siblings work their way into a business she would eventually enter.

"Growing up, I was always in someone's shop, being

amongst it," she said.

She vowed that if she ever had a shop of her own, "you would never see anything in my shop that was pink, or that awful green."

BoTangles is not your ordinary hair salon. Her son wanted to call the place "The Village Cut-up," but Iris "wanted something different, something people would remember."

It's the perfect way to gain an instant personality profile, says Williams. All that is required is a face, not a test with a battery of questions or a name, place of birth or any personality characteristics from the features, shape and lines on the face. She says it has many applications including choosing partners in both your business and professional lives, understanding your customer in sales, an inside track in interviewing, insights into students co-workers, family and friends.

As Williams tells it, she learned face reading when she illustrated, designed and produced ad book for a Fort Worth attorney, author and face reader. "The first requirement he had of me was that I take his classes in Face reading so I'd know what he was looking for in the illustrations, said Williams. "I was actually a bit miffed that he thought I couldn't just draw the features. A nose is a nose, right? Wrong. After taking the classes, I had an appreciation for why he wanted me to begin learning the subject to illustrate is accurately."

The two years it took to draw the 280 illustrations in the book, scan them and actually produce the book gave her ample time to learn the subject from an expert. "Everytime we sat down in his office or a restaurant to go over a new group of illustrations, I'd flood him with questions and quiz him about people sitting nearby. That process proved invaluable both in my ability to more quickly analyze a face to draw it as well as to understand the person behind it! The author,

attorney McFulfer, pursued the subject to use in his jury selections. It was so successful he has become a full time face reader, teacher and jury consultant says Williams.

"Becoming a full time face reader is not my goal," Williams said when asked about it "But sharing my knowledge about the subject is rewarding for me. In this method of a face reading (Amazing Face Reading), the information is geared largely to the positive side, so a face reading is generally mirroring back a person's better qualities. Fro more people they feel truly seen, maybe for the first time. That's worth doing."

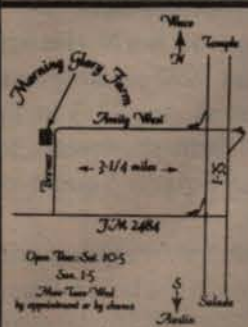

David enjoys firing his creations in the ancient Japanese Raku technique—with a country spin. His glazed bisque ware is fast fired to 1700 degrees in an outdoor kiln, removed while still red-hot and placed into a unique container (the front end loader of the farm tractor) lined with newspaper. The newspaper quickly ignites and combustion activates the glaze. As fire encircles each pot, brilliant flames, ranging in colors from crimson to cobalt blue, paint images onto the clay. The flames are then smothered by wrapping each piece with additional newspapers. Artistic instinct determines when to freeze the graphic images onto the surface by submerging it in water. Each piece is a literal clay canvas, painted with fire.

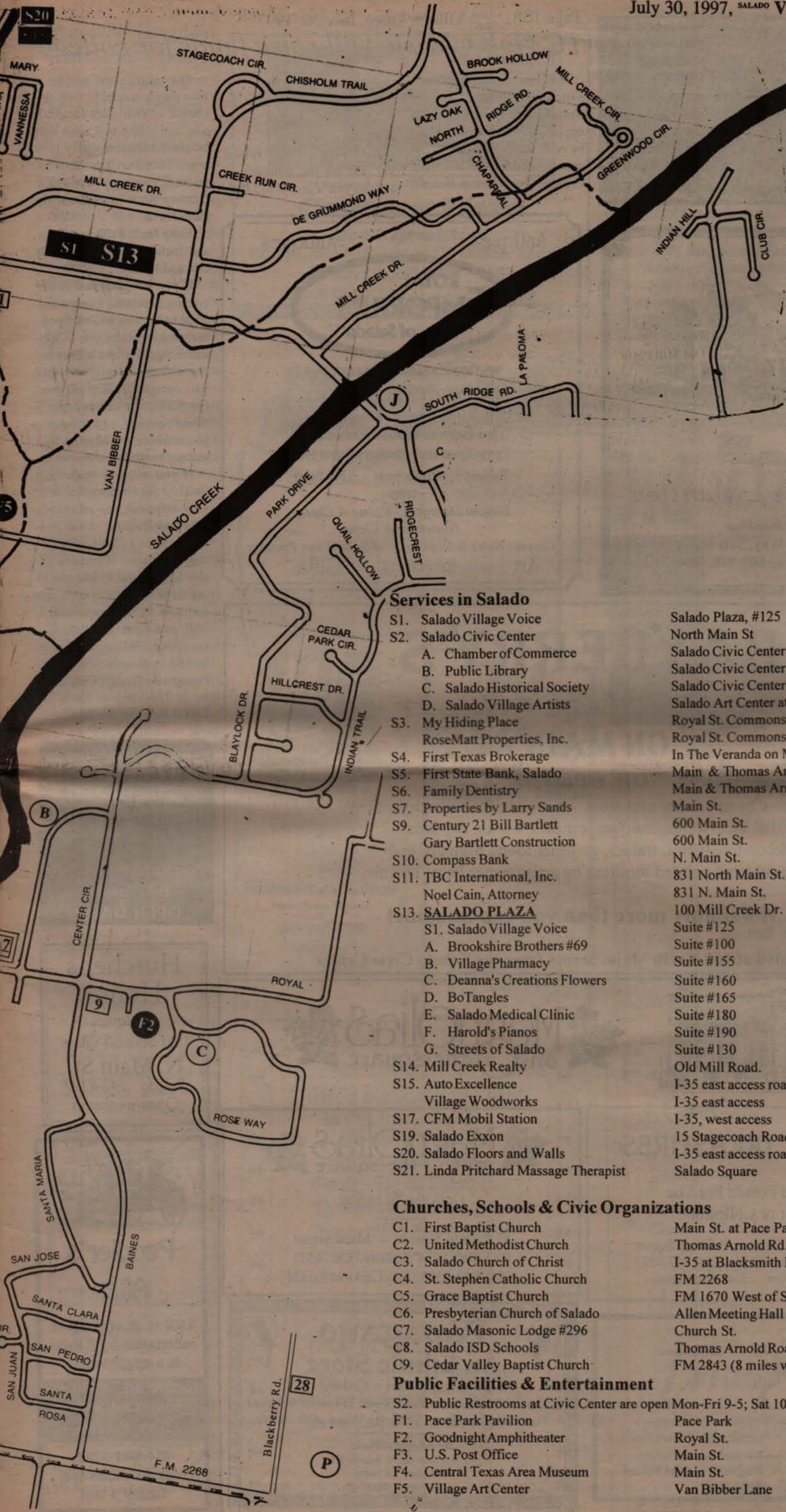

**Positioning for Profit & Meeting Challenges is topic of 43rd annual Beef Cattle Short Course Aug. 11-13**

"Positioning for Profit and Meeting Today's Challenges with Opportunities and Solutions" is the topic for the 43rd Beef Cattle Short Course and Trade Show to be held Aug. 11-13 at Texas A & M University in College Station. Last year's short course attendees were contending with drought, high feed prices, low cattle prices and a whole host of other problems. However, with new favorable conditions, producers can now turn their attention to making a profit that begins with a top quality market calf meeting today's strict market specifications.

The main program begins Aug. 12, addressing the "Changes to Beef Producers." The TAMU Meat Science section will define quality, consistency and value by taking a beef carcass apart on stage to

illustrate the higher and lower valued parts of the carcass for total value determination. Producers will also learn what is expected of fed cattle and how they are valued based upon Texas Ranch to Rail Results.

Several successful producers from across the state will then discuss "Opportunities for Change and Profitability for Today's Cattlemen." Some of their topics to be covered include breeding and management programs for environmentally suited cows and how to produce high-performance, money making calves.

Phil Schooley of the Bloomingfield Livestock Market in Iowa has developed one of the newest marketing concepts in producing top quality calves. You might have read about his program in a feature story in Drovers Journal. His program implements a genetic standard to improve quality, demand and prices for area producers.

Tuesday evening will be topped off with the annual "Aggie Prime Rib Dinner" at 7 p.m.

Wednesday's morning session will deal with "Challenges and Opportunities" sessions with "Solutions for Today's Producers" featuring many of other state beef specialists. A big "Texas Style Bar-B-Que" will follow and precede the afternoon's live animal training program on cattle scoring for profit.

Also, don't forget about the "Cattlemen's College" on Monday. This has become a very popular program and offers fourteen independent workshops, symposiums and seminars.

Dr. Larry Boleman, Professor, Extension Beef Cattle Specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and conference coordinator says, "No where in the nation is so much top-notch, in-depth information provided to its producers as that included in the August 11-13 Texas Beef Cattle Short Course."

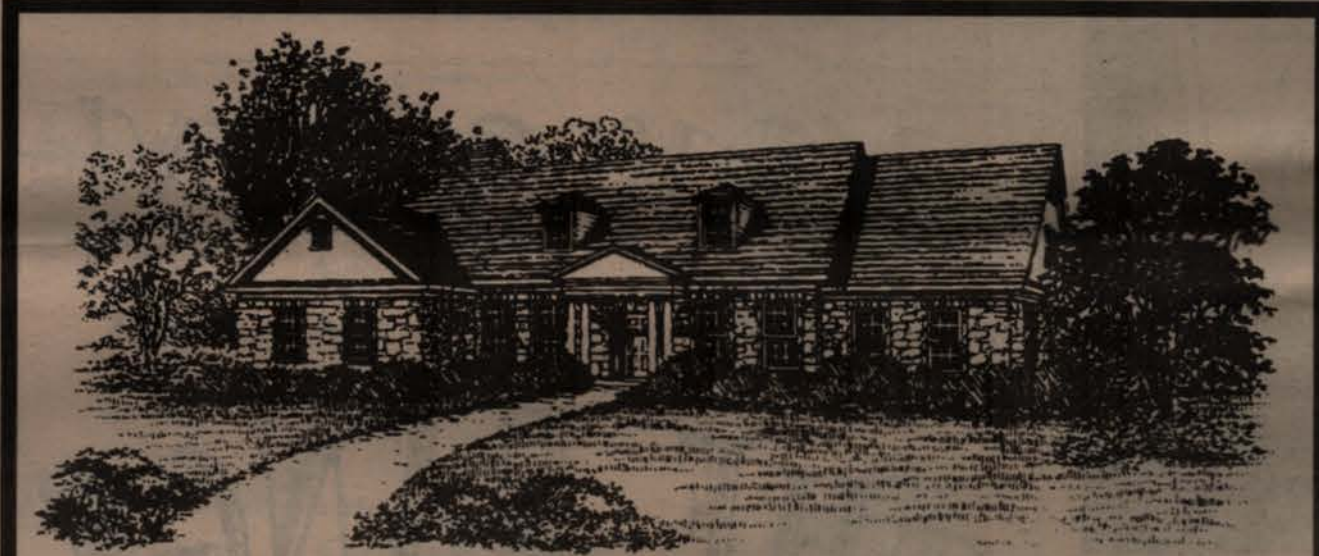

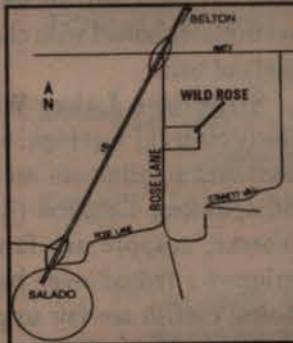
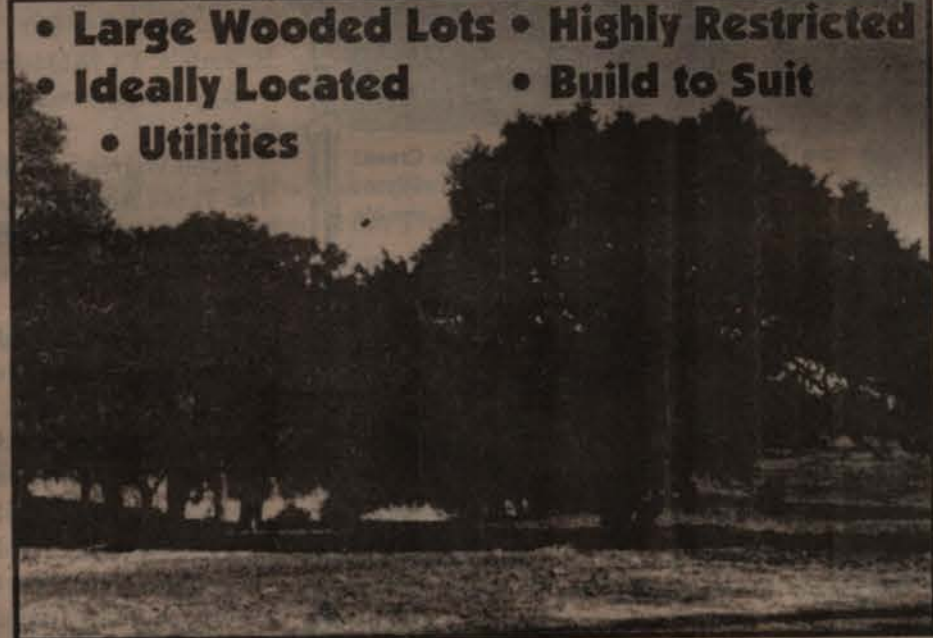

## Fishing rods: The short and the long of it

by Keith R. Warren

Texas Angler

A common question many folks ask me is "why do you use so many different rods?" My obvious reply is that it helps me catch more fish, but there's more to it than that.

Depending upon the type of

fishing you're doing, and where you are fishing, should determine what length of rod you use.

Most of the time I fish horizontally, making long casts. An extra long rod will increase the casting distance and allow you to take up more line

quickly upon a hook set.

Short rods are used in situations where you are fishing vertically (bottom fishing) or having to cast under overhanging brush. A standing angler can easily cast under overhangs with a short rod and not hit the surface with his rod tip upon making the cast.

Rod handles vary in length as well. Short handles such as pistol grips are easy to use and light weight. However, they do not provide the angler with enough leverage as do rods with long handles.

Short handled rods are often used by topwater fishermen as well as others who need to work a lure quickly. The long handle often will get in the way and minimize your efforts to manipulate the lure.

A good rule of thumb is to choose a rod that is at least as tall as you are. (Short anglers have difficulty using longer rods).

All Star Graphite Rods makes different models for all types of fisherman and all types of fish.

Each of their rods are specifically marked for length, action and for specific application (i.e., spinnerbait, crankbait, saltwater and so on).

A good fishing rod is a tool that enable the angler to work the lure more efficiently.

Before you purchase any rod, make sure and check the action. If the rod has tags and stickers hanging from the guide, you can't feel a thing. Some manufacturers tag rods so you can't feel the action (or lack thereof).

Remember, you get what you pay for.

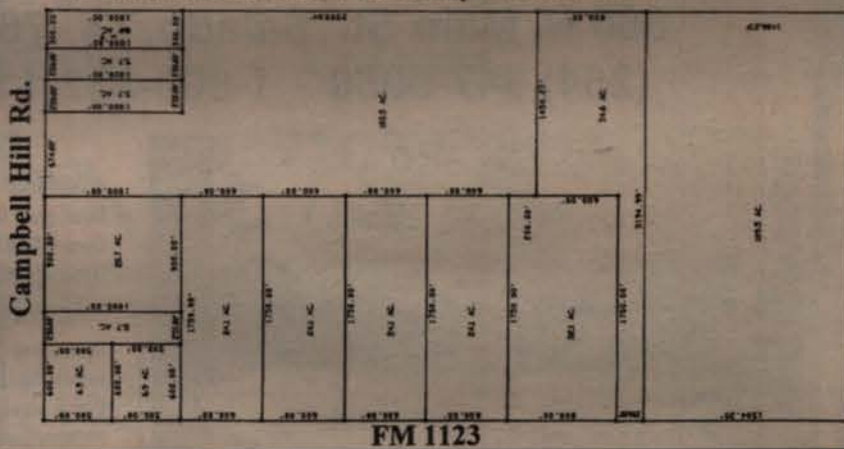

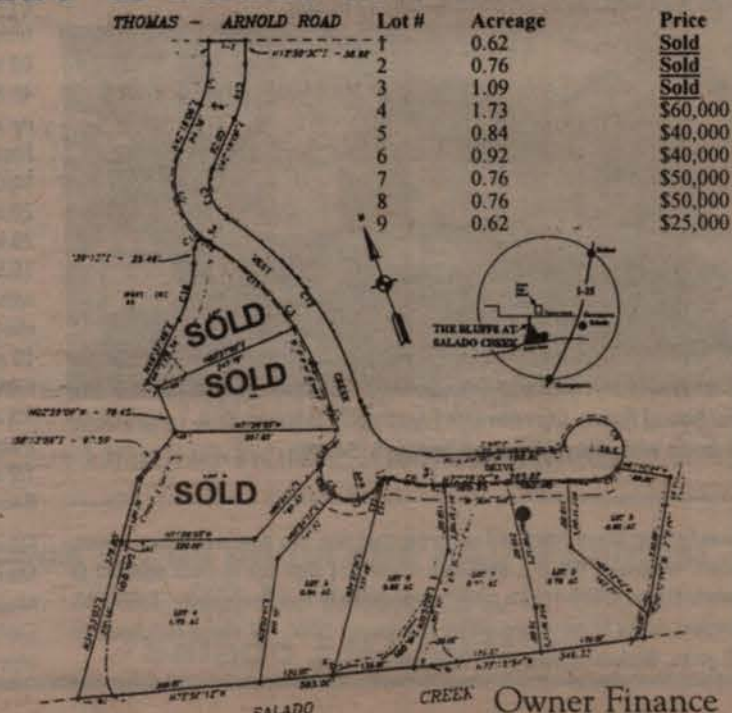

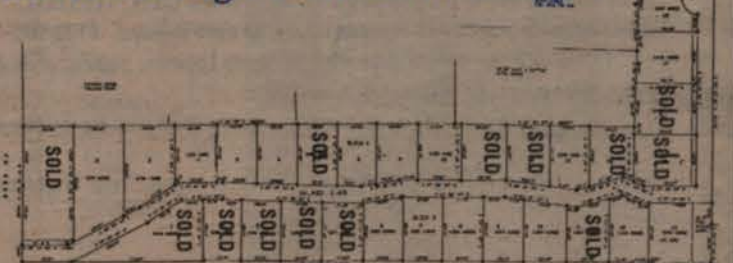
