Historic Halley House on Main sells, to become Bed & Breakfast

Iva Lee Barton of Fort Worth and Salado has purchased the historic Halley House, circa 1865, and the 27 acres on which it is located next to the old red school building on Salado's Main St.

The house was built by Captain Robert Bonner Halley of the Confederate Army and his wife, Lydia, who were parents of eight children. Very active in early Bell County development, Captain Halley served as Sheriff and

County Commissioner in addition to other elected offices.

The two-story eight room Halley House has been awarded a Texas Historical Commission marker and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The large adjoining carriage house was built in 1960.

Mrs. Barton said there are plans underway for the property but that initial emphasis will be in converting the Halley House

into a Bed and Breakfast Inn. Larry and Cathy Sands, former innkeepers in Salado for seven years, will operate the Inn. Sands, who handled the sale of the Halley property, will continue to operate his real estate firm, Properties by Larry Sands, on North Main St.

Other projects for the property will be announced in the near future, but Mrs. Barton did state that a large part of the 27 acres from Main St.

to Van Bibber Lane will be subdivided into residential plots for prestigious homes in keeping with the ambiance of the village and should add to the quality of life in Salado.

Restoration of the Hal-

ley House will commence immediately to complete work done by the former owners during the 1960s.

The formal opening of the Halley House Bed and Breakfast Inn will be early this summer.

Church of Christ celebrates 133 years March 29

The Salado Church of Christ will celebrate March 29, the anniversary of the first services held in Salado 133 years ago in a brush arbor on the north bank of Salado Creek at Main Street. Date of the first meeting of some 36 members of the Church of Christ was March 10, 1859.

The Salado congregation will also be commemorating the first services held in their new building four years ago this month and as a special part of the day long event, members will be inviting their friends and neighbors from Salado and the sur-

rounding area to take part in the combined Historical Anniversary Service and Friends Day. Lunch will be served at noon, following the morning Church service and starting at 1:30 p.m., Leonard Mullens, Minister of the Church of Christ in Salado will conduct a program that will include a song service and a history of the Church in Salado from the early days before the Civil War.

Minister Mullens extended an invitation to all Saladoans to attend the mornings worship service, lunch and afternoon historical program: "To our

many friends in Salado and the surrounding area, we want to give each of you a very special invitation to come and be with us on this important a day in the life of our congregation." Mullens continued: "We have planned an important morning worship service to be followed by a grand meal to be held in the fellowship hall with plenty of time to relax, visit and enjoy the fellowship. This will be followed with a song service and brief presentation of the history of the local Church of Christ."

Wilbur Foster, longtime member of the Salado

Church of Christ, noted: "One hundred thirty-three years is a long history for one congregation in one place. Actually begun before the Civil War as a congregation here in Salado. All of us here hope that our friends and neighbors will join with us on March 29, to help us celebrate our anniversary."

Church services on March 29, will begin at 10 a.m. followed by a meal to be served in the fellowship hall.

The historical service will begin at 1:30 p.m. The new Salado Church of Christ building is located at the corner of Stagecoach Road and Blacksmith Road.

Eagles defeat Bartlett, Rosebud-Lott for tournament win

In their opening game of the Salado Baseball tournament the Eagles defeated the eighth ranked class A Bartlett Bulldogs by a score of 10-4. In the other first round game Rosebud-Lott defeated Jarrell 17-2.

After shutting Bartlett out in their first at bat, the Eagles scored one run in the bottom of the first. After an out was recorded, Chris Jackson reached base on an error. He stole second and then moved to third on a passed ball. Jackson scored on a fielder choice by Richard Berumen.

The Eagles increased their lead with three more runs in the bottom of the second. Ty Warrick led off with a double to left center. Bubba Moore then singled to right to drive in Warrick. Moore advanced to third on an error by the right fielder on his hit. Jereme Hosch then walked and stole second. Both runners advanced on a fielder's choice by Danny Hill. Shawn Morris followed with a single that score Hosch.

Bartlett cut the lead to 4-3 by scoring a run in the third and two in the fourth

inning. In the third with one out. Salado pitcher Jereme Fischer walked a batter. Consecutive singles produced the two runs before the Eagles turned a double play to get out of the inning.

The Eagles clinched the game with one run in the bottom of the fourth and five runs in the fifth. In the big fifth inning, Warrick led off with his second double of the night and moved on to third on an overthrow by the left fielder. An out was recorded before Hosch, Hill and Morris all received walks. This forced in one run and left the bases loaded. Chris Jackson hit a sacrifice fly to score Hosch. only possible candidate on the horizon at this point in time who could lead the revolt - and win - if he only will. More on this later.

Low Vote Is Record

According to the records over at the Bell County Courthouse the vote this past week was the lowest in history. Thirteen percent of the registered Democrats and 10 percent of the GOPers took time to vote and this represented the smallest participation since records have been kept. County Clerk Vada Sutton was dismayed by the turnout and blamed part of it on the newly created state Senatorial district. We agree. This gives us a clear example of the need to vote. Failure to do so puts the power in the other fellow's pocket. Failure to learn from this fiasco will result in losing all our stroke in Austin which is a long way to fall from the heydays of Bell County leadership in most levels of State Government!
