## Village Artists plan workshops for HS students

SUMMER WORKSHOPS FOR SALADO HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS  
SPONSORED BY THE SALADO VILLAGE ARTISTS

Salado Village Artists announce a series of art workshops to be held this summer at the Salado Art Center for students in the 9th to 12th grade in Salado High School. These workshops will involve drawing and sketching, oil painting and watercolor painting. Students are encouraged to enroll for the entire series, although, single workshops may be taken.

The first workshop will be drawing and sketching class taught by local artists Troy Kelley on June 5-9. This class will meet each morning from 10:00 to noon. According to Kelley this class will stress an overview of drawing, concentrating on line, shading and composition. Students

at all levels of drawing are encouraged to enroll. Although Kelley is best known in Salado for his work as a sculptor, he is also an accomplished artist in other media.

Oil Painting will be the focus of the second workshop in the series to be held on June 14, 15, and 16 and

will meet for three days from 9:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Students may bring a sack lunch. Andy Phair has painted in oils for many years and last year exhibited her paintings at the Cultural Arts Center in Temple. According to Andy Phair this workshop will concentrate on landscapes

## Gunslinging & Charter Schools

Lawmakers down in Austin, have placed the 74th Legislative session in the Texas history books, when they recently passed the infamous "Concealed Weapons Law" which gives nearly anyone who is not under constant supervision the right to buy and carry, in a concealed manner, any sort of handgun, starting the first of the year.

The Governor has promised to sign same, the first chance he gets. The bill has an effective date of September 1, 1995 with full implementation set for January 1, 1996 (Happy New Year, folks).

There are a number of "things" the potential gun slinger must do, before loading up and venturing out into polite society, including a short course on the laws concerning weapon ownership and an even shorter stint on the gun range.

It does seem odd that during this current period in our history- when heavily armed groups are causing mayhem across the nation and reportedly with enough guns in circulation to arm every man, woman and child in America - that we would be busily passing a law that allows adults to go about their daily activities while packing a pistol. The only passably decent

thing about this law is that there are a number of places where guns cannot be carried (Churches, hospitals, schools, government offices, places that allow the sale of alcoholic beverages, gambling dens) and further, the law allows the owners of all types of businesses to prohibit the carrying of weapons within their corporate limits.

Many businesses have already announced plans to post such prohibitions at once thus leaving the gun aficionado with the problem of where to wear his pistol.

If a person's car or the streets end up being the only legal place to carry a concealed weapon - then all of us will have to be a little nicer when it comes time to take the wheel or going for a walk. No more honking or cutting in front of folks. And certainly no nasty hand signals.

These are hot button activities that could result in being on the receiving end of some hot-leaded, pistol packing drugstore cowboy who has had a bad day on the road or at work or who hates the government and thinks you look like an

IRS or ATF investigator! If passage of this law does, in the final analysis, save lives and not cause further murders on the roads, in the home or work place and if a few bad men get plugged by some good guys and the crime rates decline out of fear, then some of this worry will have been in vain.

However, most law enforcement officials think we are flirting with the undertaker while singing the theme songs of the old west.

They fear some innocent bystanders are going to get hurt when someone takes out his gun to stop a crime in progress and ends up spraying half of a busy downtown intersection.

### Charter Schools

The 700 page historic Texas educational reform bill, that recently cleared a joint Senate-House conference committee, and is headed back to both houses for final approval, contains a number of innovative ideas including cutting in half the "no-pass, no-play" penalty (from six to three weeks) that affects all interscholastic activities in Texas. There is a lot to be said for this and had former Governor Mark White agreed to a similar plan during his first term of of-

# Letter concerns OSSF

Dear Editor:

I was very surprised and disappointed to read in your May 17, 1995 edition that the OSSF has now been injected into the purely political issue of whether the Historic District should incorporate. Whether such incorporation should occur is certainly an issue as to which reasonable minds can and do differ. However, for one to inject the OSSF into the debate is uncalled-for and is demeaning to the image and purpose of the OSSF.

Many citizens of Salado (some being members of the Salado Historical Society), including myself, have enthusiastically donated substantial sums of money to the OSSF to restore the school building to its present grandeur and to

erect the brick and iron fence and many citizens of Salado will shortly be called upon to make further contributions for the erection of a bandstand or gazebo. We have purchased bricks, have purchased items at an auction that we really did not need and have donated items for sale at such auction.

What's more, the Historical Society itself contributed \$10,000 to the OSSF for the building and another \$2,000 for the landscaping. It was proud to do so.

All of this was and is to be done with the understanding that the OSSF is purely a charitable corporation enjoying special tax privileges under the Internal Revenue Code, whose purpose was and is to raise

funds for the restoration and operation of the Old Red School House—not to be a pawn or a cloak in local politics.

Mr. Clapp infers that it was necessary to inject the OSSF into this issue because of an alleged fear that the Salado Historical Society might do harm to the Red School House or its operation if successful in incorporating the Historical District. First, the Historical Society has not decided nor has it at this point recommended incorporation of the Historical District. It is merely studying the issue and, in the spirit of full disclosure, has announced that in the paper. Second, to suggest that any person or group in the His-



fice - he might have had a second!

A well deserved pay raise for teachers is another feature of the mammoth reform bill and hopes are high that additional funding can be certified by Comptroller John Sharp.

No doubt the most controversial and far ranging feature of the new education code is the section on Charter Schools which is designed to funnel control of schools back to the local level.

This novel idea is one that will send educators, school boards and school patrons running for higher ground as they come face-to-face with a decision on whether or not to call a district wide election to determine if their schools should come under the "first-in-the-nation" Charter School program. Several States are toying with the notion - but none plan to put it in action by this fall.

Should a district opt for this local control plan, districts would be able to set their own class sizes (provided the kids in a given school are doing at least average work in class); determine which textbooks can or should be used in each classroom; curtail the mountain of paperwork required by state and federal education agencies, plus a variety of other vaguely spelled out home-rule type options.

Governor George Bush talked about this concept of returning control of schools to local districts during his first-ever run for office and the lawmakers picked up on it thanks in large part to the heavy burden all citizens have been under in the past from bloated bureaucracies at all levels.

This reaction has been expected and will continue for some time to come. The same drill is taking place, on a grander scale, at the national level with the planned dissolution of the Commerce, Education and Energy Departments.

The only word of caution that should accompany this new found freedom and local control is to urge careful consideration when flexing new and powerful muscles by local boards of education.

It is true, in most instances, that local folks *should know* what is best for their kids and their schools. There is no room anymore for the "one-size-fits-all" theory of educational governing that has traditionally come from state headquarters.

By the same token, it is

also true that most elected school boards have had little, if any, training in the field of teaching or administering - so our professional staffs should be placed in the top leadership roles when it comes time to study these monumental changes.

We must not allow individual board members - in any district - to lead the way, under the banner of saving tax dollars to the detriment of providing adequate classrooms staffed with top teachers drawing good salaries.

## Novel published on life of Jane Long

Prime Time Press of Austin published *Jane Long of Texas* this spring, a historical novel about the life of the famous pioneer American woman who was a leader in the Texas revolution. Publisher Ruth Barrett has known author Neila Skinner Petrick of Dallas for years and says that while she was writing award-winning videos and magazine articles, serving as a public information officer for the Federal Emergency Management Agency and teaching, she never stopped researching the life of Jane Wilkinson Long. The book is the result of intensive work in search of accurate information about Mrs. Long who died in 1880.

Long was among Stephen Austin's Old Three Hundred, and was a spy and revolutionary in the rebellion that freed Texas from a young and uncertain Mexican government. When Jane first came to Texas in 1821 with her adventurer husband who was later murdered, there were fewer than 7,000 permanent settlers in the huge region.

"The book is a balanced telling of the story, not a revisionist history, which seems to be trendy just now, but through the eyes of a woman who lived it. The story is like a behind-the-scenes view of a prominent segment of American and Texas history," said the publisher.

Many prominent Tejano families are included, along with their contributions to the settling of Texas. A strong subplot involves the contributions of Kian Long, Jane's slave and lifelong companion. The dialogue was perhaps the most difficult thing, but Mrs. Petrick found a recorded interview with a slave from Alabama that had been preserved by a historical association. She used this to create the dialect of Kian, who came from Alabama, just one example of the careful research done to write this

book. According to Elizabeth Dearing Morgan, author of children's books about Jane Long and Mirabeau B. Lamar, Jane Long's life "makes Scarlett O'Hara look like a wimp."

*Jane Long of Texas* is woven together like a tapestry, all knots if you're looking from the underside, but finally an incredibly beautiful pattern, as are all our lives," Mrs. Petrick said.

(2) If no part is to be incorporated, should we continue trying to obtain voluntary compliance with the Historical Guidelines?
