## 26th Art Fair features works of artists as well as local authors

Art by native Texan Barry Baxley will be part of the 26th Annual Art Fair Aug. 1-2 in Pace Park. The gates will open at 9 a.m. Aug. 1 and 10 a.m. Aug. 2. Each evening the park will close at 5 p.m. Admission to the Fair is \$3 for adults and age 12 and under are admitted free.

Barry Baxley was born in Lubbock, Texas into the fifties era of mom/pop culture. Luckily for him, his paternal grandmother was able to help him break out of the typical mode for a young Texan in those times. "Mammy" Baxley entered into uncharted water for a fifties woman in owning a photography business, The Avalon Studio.

Baxley thrived on visits with her and became interested in color, design and composition. While still a youngster he studied painting in Temple. His Texas landscape scenes and brilliant florals hang

in various locations throughout Texas, while Baxley himself prefers to reside in Dallas.

He studied art at Howard Payne University in Brownwood and finished his degree at the University of Texas at Dallas. He has been inspired by many master painters from Monet, Renior, and Manet, all the way through Roerich, Kandinsky and Klimt and the more modern such as Piet Mondrian and Pablo Picasso.

His own realistic style merges with impressionism to celebrate the good things life has to offer. Does art imitate life or vice-versa? "Well, who knows", Berry says, "but it's fun to think about either way". Why does he paint? "Well, just because it's such marvelous fun and it keeps all my friends on their toes wondering what I'll do next!"

In addition to the mas-

ter artist and fine craftsman, the Salado Public Library will honor Salado authors during their yearly book sale at the Fair.

Salado poet Patsy Sanford will be available to sign her new book of poetry, *Streams of Thought* at the library book booth both days of the Fair.

These authors will also be available at announced times: Elizabeth Silverthorne, Harry Wilmer, A.C. Green, Mo Cutler and Jackie Mills.

Elizabeth Silverthorne, author and teacher has written children's books, *Christmas in Texas*, *Ashbel Smith of Texas*, *Plantation Life in Texas* and others.

Harry Wilmer, founder of the Institute for the Humanities at Salado is the author of several books and a noted psychiatrist.

## Town meeting set here July 23

The Salado Historical Society will sponsor a town meeting and pot luck Supper 6 p.m. July 23 at the Salado Methodist Church.

The speaker will be James McCaine from the Texas Water Commission's On-Site Wastewater Section. McCaine will also answer questions about rapid development and septic tank systems in rural areas of Texas.

Some of the questions that will be addressed are these:

1) The 1990 Department of Health Construction Standards for on-site sewerage facilities is being revised; We would like to know which will affect rural Bell County?

2) At what point of local population increase (e.g., 3000 residents) are septic

tanks considered an inadequate method of sewage disposal?

3) What are the state requirements (not recommendations) for construction of a ) building or a residence: b) a septic system? When must permits be procured for septic systems, electricity, plumbing? Is this different in rural and urban areas?

4) Septic systems density: will the threat of ground saturation vary in different soil types and different geologic settings with close placement of septic systems? Who determines how many are too many, and how is this determined? What is done if this situation is discovered? How can it be avoided?

5) If you were preparing to build a residence in Sal-

ado, what would your concerns about having a septic systems? How much would you be willing to spend? Would you want reassurance about your near neighbors septic systems? Would you want reassurance about possible pollutants in the 5 city water wells? What would be your concerns about Salado Creek and how to guard against its contamination?

The Salado Historical Society invites you to bring a covered dish and a question and join them in learning more about septic systems and the preservation of Salado Creek.

**First Nations: A Current Event  
is Institute symposium Oct. 23-25**

At the urging of the Canadian Consulate in Dallas, the Institute for the Humanities at Salado is presenting a symposium on the indigenous people of Canada. The event, titled **FIRST NATIONS: A CURRENT EVENT**, will take place October 23-25, 1992, at the Longhorn Room of the historic Stagecoach Inn.

**FIRST NATION** will feature Indians and Inuit from Canada and Greenland. Several of the speakers include John Kim Bell, the world's first Native American symphony conductor; Robert Petersen, president of the University of Greenland; Olive Dickason author of Canada's *First Nations: A History of Founding People*; and Bill Reid, world famous Haida sculptor.

This event will occur when the issues of the new Canadian constitution, native self-government,

and Quebec's separation will all come to a climax. It also takes place at the time when increasing attention is being paid to the Free Trade Act and the inter-ethnic struggles in Canada and the United States.

The Institute for the Humanities received partial funding for **FIRST NATIONS** from the Canadian Consulate General, Dallas; the Rockwell Fund, Houston; and the Texas Committee for the Humanities, a state program of the National Endowment for the Humanities.

The Institute for the Humanities is a small, non-profit, autonomous corporation for public programs in the humanities. It is a grass roots organization where world-class scholars come and talk to ordinary people. **FIRST NATIONS: A CURRENT EVENT** is the sixth major symposium sponsored by the Institute since its founding in 1980.

## SVFD holds fundraiser Sept. 12 in Pace Park to purchase Jaws of Life equipment

The Salado Fire Department, an all volunteer force will hold a fundraiser on Sept. 12, to purchase extrication equipment commonly referred to as "The Jaws of Life".

The fundraising activity will be a family style bar-b-que in Pace Park, and an auction of items donated by concerned persons of the community followed by a dance under the stars featuring a C&W-Boogie band.

This rescue equipment cost approximately \$11,000 and is a multi purpose rescue tool. The rate of incidence where it is needed has tripled since 1989-90. Currently the Department must request this equipment from the neighboring Belton Department, if it is not in use by them or reserved as backup for Temple.

If the system is not available the Salado mem-

bers must rely on farm jacks and pry bars to remove injured persons from vehicles, losing precious life saving time.

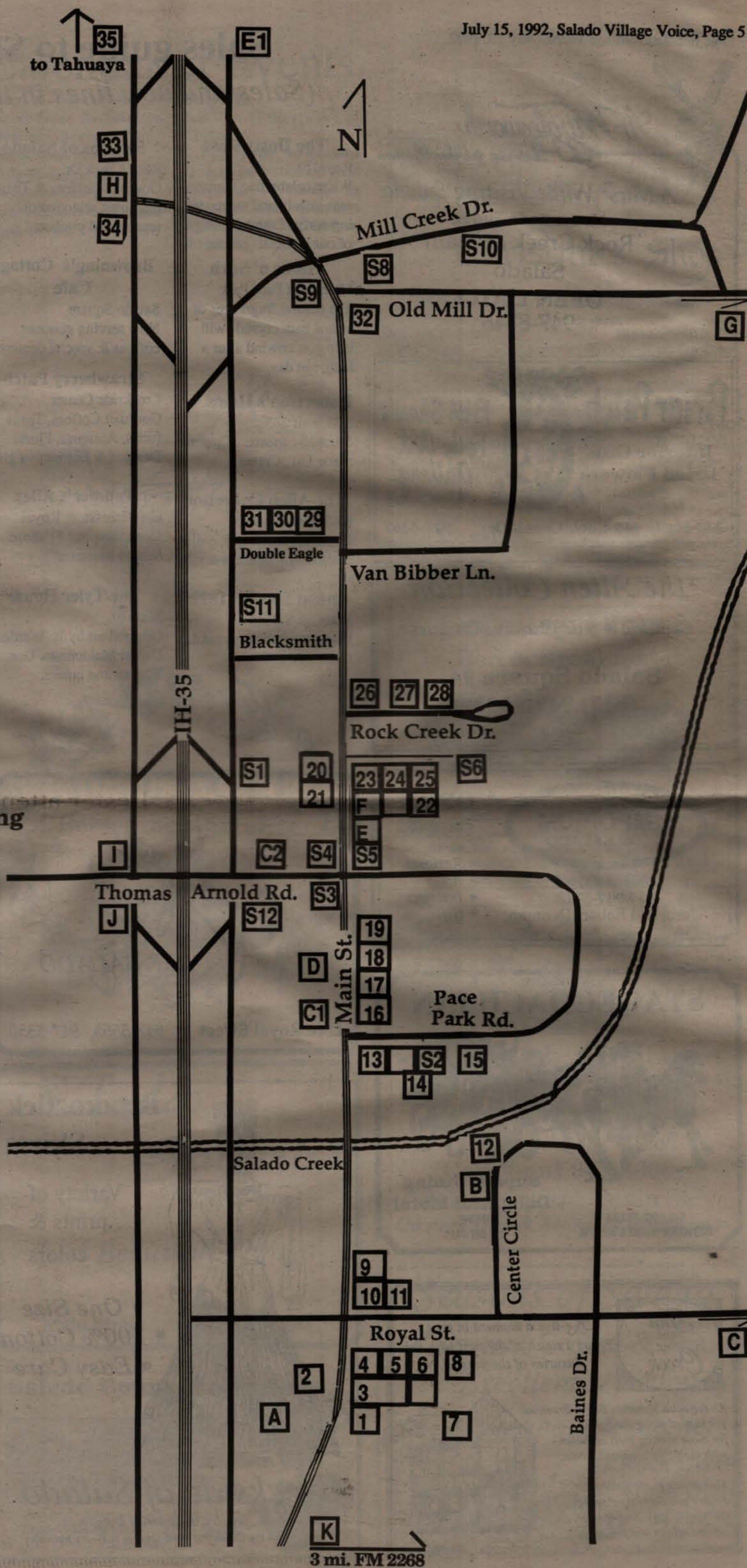

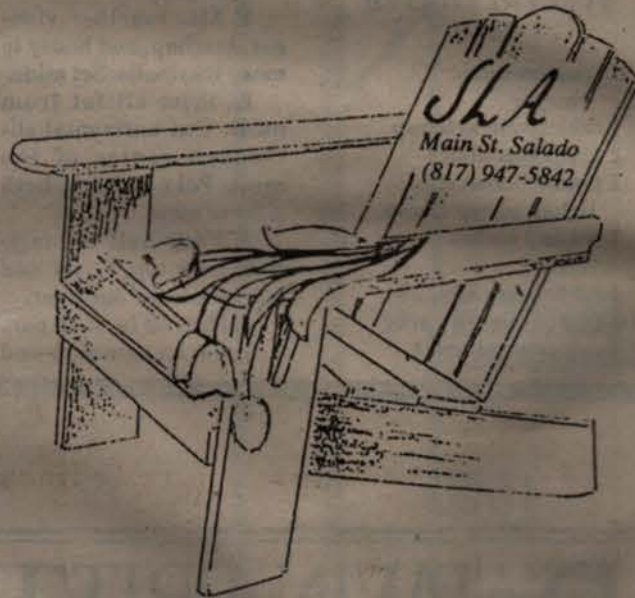
