

## Calling the plays again Westerberg loves his return

"I love calling the plays. I missed doing it," Coach Tom Westerberg said after his Eagles beat the 5A Bryan Rudder Rangers 38-28.

Westerberg returned to Salado, the place where he grew up as an Eagle, after a storied career in Texas football. At Allen High School, the largest school in the state, he coached those Eagles to a 57-game winning streak and three straight state championships, the most in a row in UIL's largest division.

"At that level, with so many players and such a big staff, I was more of a CEO," Westerberg said. "I wasn't calling the plays on the field."

In Salado, he does. And he likes it. And it shows.

"It's kind of like being quarterback from the sideline," Westerberg said. "Maybe that's why we throw so much."

"This is what I thought it could be when I applied to come back home," Westerberg said. "We are 2-0

and have room for improvement. We watch videos on Mondays and look at different things that we could have done better. We look at where we left points on the field."

Last week, the Eagles left two scores on the field, both as a result of penalties. "We'll do better on not making those kinds of mistakes," Westerberg said.

They will need to because the schedule is not an easy one.

This week, Salado will host the #7 Malakoff Tigers in a neutral site. Kickoff is 7:30 p.m. Sept. 9 from Midway Panther Stadium. Tickets are on-line at <https://bit.ly/3ATdW6z>.

Westerberg will have to call some great plays to beat the Tigers, who went 9-4 last year, won their district and lost to West 14-12 in the 3A-Div. II Region II Semi-final.

The Tigers return 21 players from that team, including seven offensive and seven defensive starters. The Tigers are 1-1 with a 21-17 loss to the #6 Grandview Zebras last week.

"They run a spread, but with more of a run game to it," Coach Westerberg said. In their first game of the season, three runners all had 100 yard games. Junior Chauncey Hogg, senior Damien Jackson and sophomore Jason Tennyson each had 111 yards against West Rusk, who the Tigers beat 28-7.

The Eagles defense held Fredericksburg to 188 yards rushing and 95 yards passing in week one. Last week, they held the Rudder Rangers to 67 yards on the ground and 298 passing. The defense did have an interception and two fumble recoveries against Rudder.

With an expanded corps of running backs sharing time, fresh legs may make a difference in the second half of games. Caden Strickland and Brendan Wilson were able to share time in the backfield against Rudder. Meanwhile, receiver Seth Reavis played all 88 offensive snaps. In two games, he has 395 yards receiving and five TD receptions. He also has a rushing TD.

"He got a little tired

against Rudder," Westerberg said. "He was in for every play."

If Malakoff should find an answer to the Luke Law-Reavis connection, Law has five other receivers to pass the ball to.

Coach Westerberg says that Law, in his first two

games as an Eagle, is getting more comfortable in the pocket each week. Providing protection are center Dray McLane, guards Kye Hayes and Jaxson Lieskau and tackles Ethan Van De Plas and Ethan Llobregat.

You may see Law making use of his legs more, as well.

"We ran him a bit more last week," Westerberg said.

The experts at the Bible of Texas Football, Dave Campbell's Texas Football are giving a slight two-point edge to Malakoff. With Westerberg calling the plays, you probably shouldn't bet against him or his Eagles.

## Eligible Texans must register to vote by Oct. 11

Texas Secretary of State John Scott today encouraged all eligible Texas voters to make sure they are registered to vote by October 11th to participate in the upcoming November 8 General Election.

Texas law requires eligible voters to be registered 30 days before Election Day, and since the 30th day before Nov. 8 falls on the Sunday before Columbus Day, eligible Texas voters effectively have two extra days to register this year (Texas Election Code Sec. 13.143(e)).

Secretary Scott urged Texas voters to visit the state's official voting web site - [VoteTexas.gov](http://VoteTexas.gov) - for accurate and comprehensive information on voting in Texas.

"Even though we're a month away from the voter registration deadline, it's never too early to make sure

you're registered, update your registration information if you need to, and prepare yourself to vote in the upcoming election," Secretary Scott said.

"If you're renewing your Texas Driver License or personal ID card online, please take the extra second to check the box to register to vote if you're eligible to do so. If you're registering to vote for the first time, make sure your signed voter registration application is postmarked to your county voter registrar by October 11th. If you simply need to update your voter registration information - such as your name, address or ID numbers - you can do so online through our portal available at [Texas.gov](http://Texas.gov)."

"Don't let the deadline sneak up on you - get registered and start preparing for the upcoming election today by visiting [VoteTexas.gov](http://VoteTexas.gov)!"

### Eligibility for Voter Registration in Texas

You are eligible to register to vote in Texas if:

You are a United States citizen;

You are a resident of the county where you submit the application;

You are at least 17 years and 10 months old on the date your voter registration application is submitted, and you are 18 years of age on Election Day.

You are not a convicted felon (you may be eligible to vote if you have completed your sentence, probation, and parole);

And  
You have not been declared by a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be either totally mentally incapacitated or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote.

### Registering to Vote for the First Time

If you are a first-time Texas voter, make sure to complete your voter registration application and make sure it is postmarked to your county's voter registrar by Oct. 11. To obtain and complete your application, you have several different options:

Complete an application using the SOS Online Voter Registration Application form. Visit <https://www.texas.gov/living-in-texas/texas-voter-registration/>.

Simply fill in the required information, print, sign and mail the completed application directly to your county voter registrar;

Request a printed application from the Texas Secretary of State's office. The Secretary of State's office will mail a postage-paid voter registration application to the address provided; OR  
Contact or visit your county

election office, public library or other local government office to obtain a voter registration application.

Register to Vote When Renewing Your Driver License

If you're not already registered to vote but have an existing Texas Driver License or Texas Personal ID Card, you can register to vote online when renewing, replacing or changing your contact information for either of these cards through the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) at <https://www.texas.gov/driver-services/texas-driver-license-id-renewals-replacements/>.

Follow the steps on the DPS web portal to update your driver license information, and you will be given the option to register to vote when renewing or updating your information.

You can also register to vote while obtaining your Texas Driver License or Tex-

as Personal ID card in person from DPS.

### Update Your Voter Registration Information Online

Whether you've recently moved or changed your name, you can now update all your information on your voter registration record through the Texas Secretary of State's portal on [Texas.gov](http://Texas.gov).

You can also use the same portal to update your voter registration file with your Texas Driver License number, Personal ID card number, or the last four digits of your Social Security number to ensure the information is on file with your county voter registrar.

The special program will be 9 a.m. Sept. 11 at the Salado Holiday Inn, where Salado Creek Ministries meets every week.

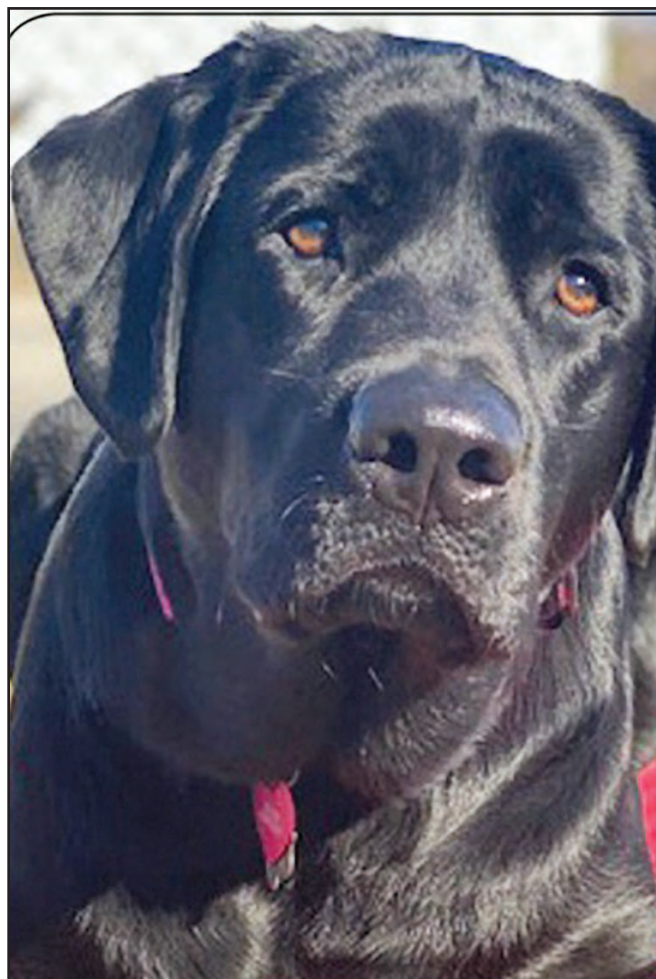
Go Team Therapy Dogs provide comfort in a crisis, a hospital, an airport, a nursing home — anywhere people could use love from a four-legged friend.

AKC-approved Good Canine Citizenship test and undergo a two-day training.

The organization formed during the Waldo Canyon fire in Colorado Springs. The fire destroyed hundreds of homes and more than 32,000 people evacuated, and two teams brought comfort to evacuees in hotels and centers.

The dogs on GO TEAM are evaluated and recommended for the training program. Dogs must pass an AKC approved Canine Good Citizen (CGC) test and be at least one (1) year old prior to attending the class. The two-day class includes real life situations such as working in assisted living and nursing homes, library/literacy events, special community events, TSA airport security drills, elevator/stair drills, airport comfort, interacting with first responders, and much more.

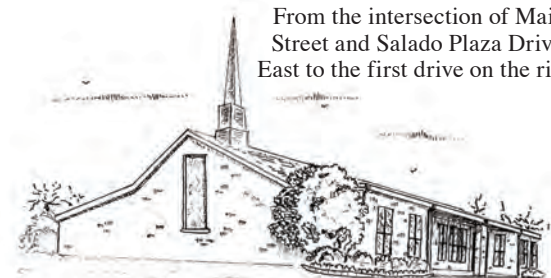

## When good news is bad; markets fear fed rate hike

The Markets

The week that ended on September 2, was one of those weeks we have seen so many times in the past when, as far as the market is concerned, good news is bad news. The problem with the data released this week is that just about all of it indicates a strongly growing U.S. economy. Stock and bond traders are unhappy about that news because they believe that good economic news will cause the Federal Reserve to increase interest rates more and longer in their efforts to slow demand and thereby crush inflation. Higher interest rates can mean lower earnings for some of the highly indebted, faster growing companies, and lower earnings may mean lower stock prices. So, the traders sell stocks in anticipation of lower earnings. Our experience is that a good economy tends to increase earnings, not decrease them, but once the herd of traders starts selling, others start selling too, thinking the fast-moving stock and bond traders must have a good reason to be selling.

The result for the week was a decline in the S&P 500 Stock Index (SPX) of 3.29%, taking the Index down to 3924.26. That leaves it down 18.13% from its high back in early January, but still up 7.02% from its recent low point in mid-June. It is now down about 13.48% from this time last year, but up a whopping 38.12% from three years ago. Our other watched stock index, the CRSP US Mid Cap Value Index, closed at 2325.44, down 2.83% for the week and 10.47% from its high in January, but still up over 7% from its bottom in June.

The yield on the benchmark 10-year U.S. Treasury note rose about 5.25% to 3.20% and as the 2-year yield was at 3.44%, the yield curve is still inverted, although it is an odd inversion. The 20-year T-bond is yielding 3.61%, so the longer-term yield curve is very positive, but there appears

to be a dip in the middle of the curve. As we have written before, these are strange times. The price of West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) dropped an impressive 6.35% To \$87.06 per barrel, the lowest it has been since late January. Following WTI's lead, the average price for a gallon of regular gasoline in the U.S. declined for its 11th straight week to \$3.81 per gallon, just in time for the Labor Day weekend.

### The Economy

The economic data released for the week is telling a clear and unambiguous story. The economy of the United States is growing and driving forward at a fast pace. On Friday, the Labor Department released its monthly Employment Situation Summary and in it was the news that total non-farm payroll employment increased by 315,000 in August. Yes, the unemployment rate rose from July's 3.5% to 3.7% but that was not because jobs were lost, rather it was because the labor force participation rate increased by 0.3% as more people are entering and returning to the job force. Meanwhile, new unemployment claims dropped to 232,000 with the four-week moving average of newly laid-off workers near a half-century low. Add to that the report on August 30 that U.S. Job openings continued to rise in July, and the full set of data now indicates that employers are still begging for workers, and thereby believe that the economy will continue to grow rapidly into the foreseeable future.

Then, the Conference Board chimed in with news that U.S. consumer confidence reversed course in August, rising to 145.4 from

a four-month low of 139.7 in July and improved even more when consumers were asked about where they thought the economy will be six months from now. The University of Michigan consumer sentiment survey echoed that finding with a rise to 58.2 from June's low point of 50. Adding insult to injury, at least from a stock trader's perspective, the Institute for Supply Management (ISM) reported that its August 2022 Manufacturing Purchasing Managers Index (PMI) came in at 52.8 on a scale where numbers above 50 indicate economic growth coming down the road. The commentary with that report from the ISM said, in part, "New order rates returned to expansion levels." even as respondents reported that prices they were paying for raw materials softened.

Across the board, the data continue to indicate that growth is slowing to a more sustainable rate, but also that the economic growth we are seeing is deep and has a great deal of momentum. There continue to be reports that there are transportation and raw material availability constraints affecting business, but they too appear to be moderating. ISM respondents see good growth at least through the rest of this year. The back side of that is that Europe looks more and more to be in a world of hurt economically and China is not looking good either. Once more it appears the United States may need to pull the world through a recession. The open question is whether our economy will be strong enough to pull the world or will we be dragged into a recession here too? Stay tuned as we report on this drama each week.

## Remembering Coach Bobby Dale Peschel

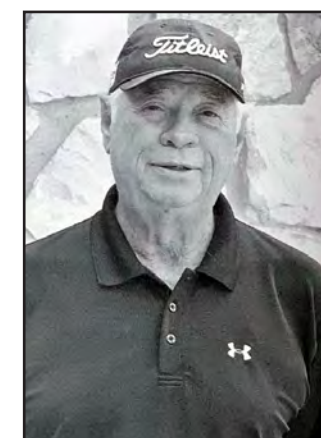
"Coach" Bobby Dale Peschel, 74, died after a hard fight against stage 4 colon cancer on September 2, 2022. He was caring husband, father, grandfather, brother, mentor, coach, teacher, principal, and friend.

Coach Peschel was born June 12, 1948, in Kerrville, Texas, to Gottfried Peschel and Bonnie Minor Peschel. He was raised in Kerrville, Texas, graduated from Tivy High school in 1966, and earned a scholarship in track. He then graduated from Southwest Texas State University with a Bachelor of Science in Education and a minor in History. Later, he completed his Master's in Education and became a principal from 1995- 2003. After he retired as a principal, he returned to be a head golf coach at Salado ISD from 2003-2013, winning multiple golf state titles. However, during his time in education, he coached and touched many hearts and lives.

Bobby Peschel made considerable educational impacts in 1971, starting in Devine, Brady, Rosebud-Lott, Caldwell, Rogers, Clifton, Iraan, and finally, Salado, Texas. After retiring, he was not finished and became Head Golf Coach in Salado. He then officially was retired in 2013.

His legacy is evident in the lives of the young men and women he inspired through his coaching and teaching, as well as when he was a principal. Bobby not only wanted to inspire his students but wanted to have a long-lasting effect on their lives. His goal was to make a difference in the world by listening to others, volunteering his precious time, giving with no strings attached, forging strong relationships, but genuinely wanting those around him to be successful and happy.

A funeral service for Mr. Peschel will be held at 2 p.m. Saturday, September 10, 2022 at Heights Baptist Church. Burial will follow at 11 a.m. Monday, September 12, 2022 at Brown Cemetery in Kerrville, Texas. 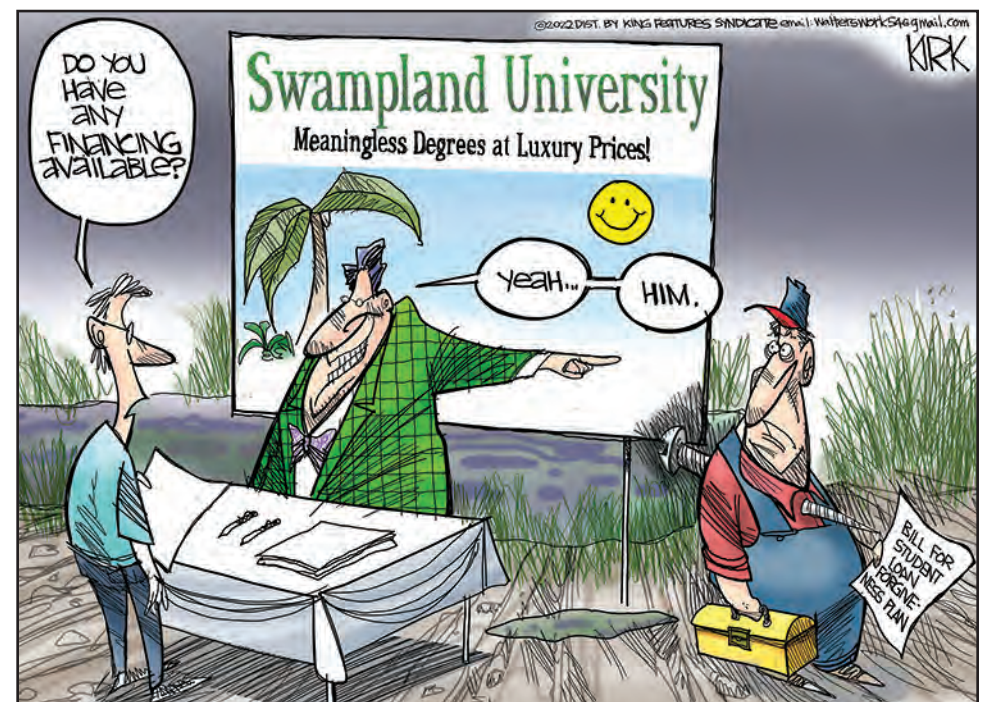

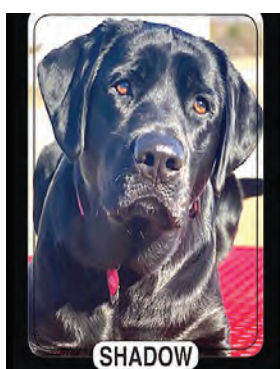

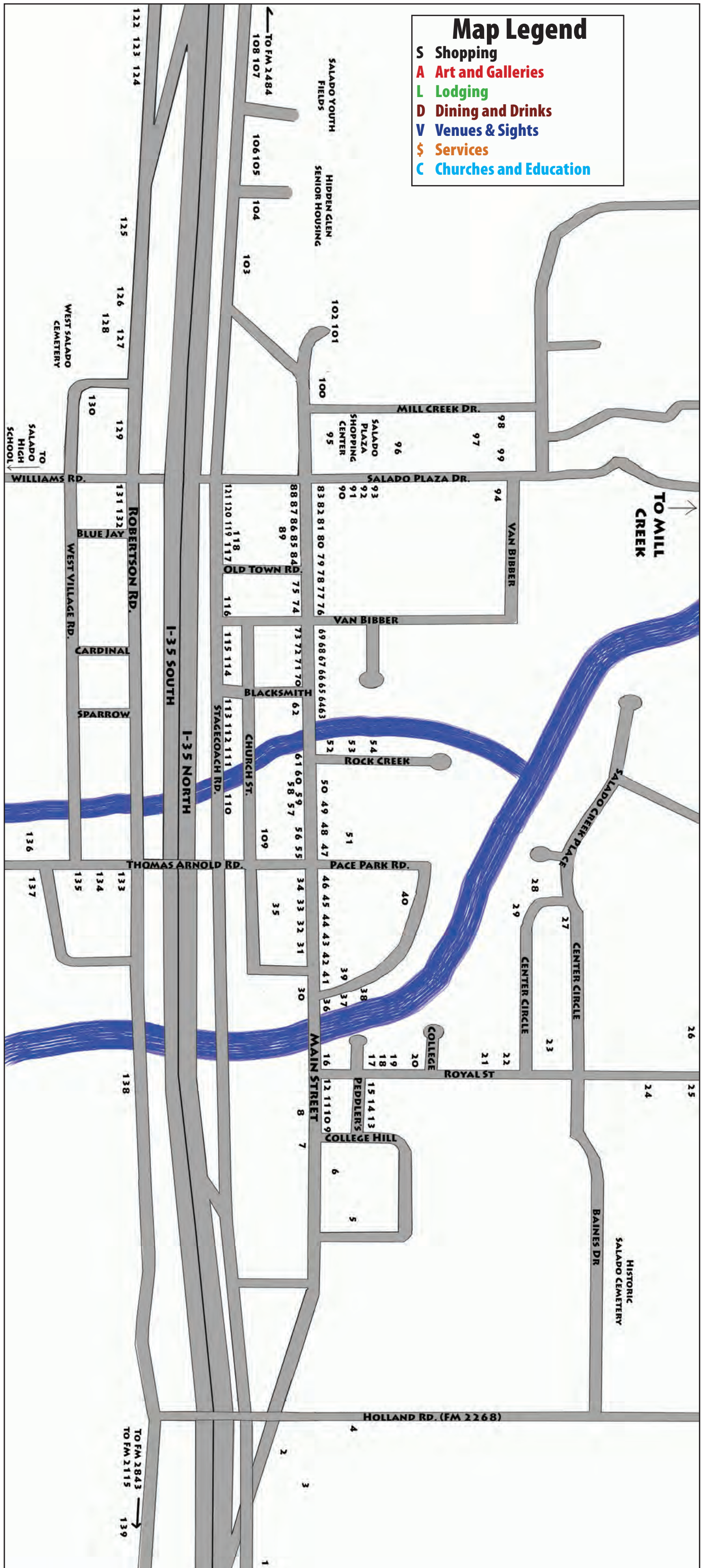

# Eagles get past Rudder

Drew Bird's interception of Bryan Rudder quarterback Xavier Ramirez's pass at the Salado 43 yard line with 5:54 left in the game led to a 38-yard Daniel Chtay field goal with 2:59 left to play, giving the Eagles a 38-28 win on the road.

A minute into the fourth quarter, Rudder recovered a Salado fumble at the Eagle 41-yard line and Ramirez connected with Nate Figgers for 21 yards before finding Kevin Holmes for a 21-yard strike with 9:49 left to knot the score at 28-28.

The Eagles answered with a scoring drive of 13 plays (including defensive penalties for offsides and encroachment and a Salado false start. Facing fourth-and-1, Kase Maedgen gave the Eagles a first down with a 3-yard run. Luke Law found Cade Strickland for a 31-yard touchdown. Chtay connected on the point-after kick for a 35-28 lead with 6:09 left to play.

Rudder was the first to score, taking the opening kick off and driving 72 yards in seven plays. Nate Scoutron scored on an 8-yard run and Antonio Gonzales converted the pint-after for a 7-0 lead.

The Eagles answered on the second play from scrimmage, a 57-yard bomb to Seth Reavis. Chtay made the score 7-7 with 9:01 left in the first.

It would be almost two hours before either team scored, as lightning in the

area kept the teams off the field until 9:30.

Salado recovered a fumble at their own 24-yard line to set up an 11-play scoring drive, capped by a 14-yard pass from Law to Reavis. Chtay kicked the PAT for a 14-7 lead with 10:13 left in the half. Law connected with Strickland for 38 yards to get deep into Ranger territory.

Ramirez moved Rudder down the field with a 23-yard pass to Holmes to get to the Salado 33. He hit Holmes again, but Holmes coughed up the ball and Dusty Rhiddlehoover recovered it at the Salado 26 to set up an eight-play scoring drive. Law hit Roman Law for a 12-yard touchdown strike with 6:53 left in the half. Chtay kicked the extra point for a 21-7 lead with 6:53 left in the half. Law hit Reavis for a 38-yard pass during the drive.

Rudder closed the lead in the final minutes of the half, driving 74 yards in 15 plays. Ramirez found Martin for a 21-yard touchdown with 1:14 left in the half. Gonzales made it 21-14.

After swapping possessions to start the second half, Salado went up 28-14 on a 10-play, 48-yard drive. A defensive pass interference set Salado up for first-and-goal at the Rangers' 7-yard line. Maedgen bulled to the 2-yard line where Law dove in to score on a third down play with 5:56 left in the third. Chtay gave the Eagles a 28-14 lead.

Figgers caught a 38-yard touchdown pass from Ramirez and Gonzales con-

verted the PAT to narrow Salado's lead to 28-21 with 3:15 left in the third.

Law was 18-of-33 for 342 yards and 4 TDs. He ran in a TD as well. Reavis was again his favorite receiver, catching six passes for 183 and two TDs. Strickland caught four passes for 68 yards and a TD. Wilson caught three passes for 47 yards. Kase Maedgen caught two for 16. Morgan Adams caught a pass for 15 yards and Roman Law caught two passes for 13 yards and a TD.

Maedgen led the Salado runners with 24 carries for 83 yards. He had a 38-yard touchdown called back because of a blindside block downfield with 1:32 left to play.

Adam Benavides led Salado with 11 tackles and an assist. Nolan Miller had 7 tackles, 2 assists, a tackle for loss (TFL) and a sack. Dusty Rhiddlehoover, 4 tackle, 2 assists, TFL, fumble recovery (FR); Davis Graham, 3 tackles, 3 assists; AJ Fach, 3 tackles, assist, 2 passes broken up (PBU), 1 caused fumble (CF); Lincoln Hossfeld, 2 tackles, 2 assists; Dawson Barksdale, 2 tackles, 4 assists, TFL; quarterback hurry (QBH); Drew Bird, 3 assists, interception, CF and FR; Garrett Combs, tackle, 4 assists, TFL; Phoenix Flores, 1 tackle; Darius Wilson, 1 tackle.
