BoA to consider zoning property

Village of Salado board of aldermen will hold a public hearing at 6:30 p.m. Dec. 15 on an ordinance to zone approximately 39.139 acres near the northwest corner of I-35 and FM 2484 Local Retail.

The property was voluntarily annexed into Salado last month and requires zoning by the Village.

A Quick Trip Travel center is planned for the subject property along with several restaurants, a car wash, retail shops and assisted living facility.

Public notice was published in Salado Village Voice, the newspaper of record for the Village of Salado, and property owners within 200 feet of the property were also notified of the proposed zoning.

To date, no comments have been received either for or against the proposed zoning.

The Planning & Zoning Commissioner was scheduled to hold a public hearing Dec. 13 (after press deadline) and make a recommendation to the Board of Aldermen concerning the zoning.

Aldermen will also discuss a Letter of Intent with Pampa Investment Group for the purchase of a 50,000 gallon per day wastewater treatment plant on the property at the northwest corner of I-35 and FM 2484.

Under the agreement, the Village will purchase the wastewater infrastructure for a cost of \$5.5 million.

After the initial \$100,000 payment, the Village will pay 50% of impact fees and 50% of wastewater fees to Pampa Development until the debt is paid in full.

Impact Fees are \$5,025 per LUE for the Village. The Village LUE is 100 gallons per day. At the full capacity of the 50,000 gpd plant, the maximum in impact fees would be \$2,576,000. Half of that would be approximately \$1.3 million.

At full capacity, the plant could generate hundreds of thousands per year in sewer revenues. The high impact

commercial rate is \$17.42 per 1,000 gallons. So the plant could generate \$871 per day in base sewer revenues, or \$317,915 annually. Half of that would be \$158,957.50.

At that rate, it could take up to 26 years to pay the debt, provided there is no interest on the debt.

Pampa Investment will also convey its Texas Commission for Environmental Quality (TCEQ) wastewater treatment permit to the Village. The permit will allow for a wastewater treatment of up to 500,000 gallons per

Pampa Investment is working to disannex the remaining acreage from the Extra Territorial Jurisdiction of Belton so that it can be voluntarily annexed into the Village of Salado.

CELTS International and Pampa Investment Group, LP together own 64 acres at the corner of FM 2484 and I-35 to be developed as the Salado Center.

Salado Center, according to a July 2021 draft development agreement between the Village of Salado and CELTS International and Pampa Investment Group, would include the following: a convenience store, seven fast food restaurants, two sit-down restaurants, a senior housing complex, a large retail store and additional smaller retail spaces with two lift stations, wastewater collections lines and one wastewater treatment plant with an initial treatment capacity of 50,000 gallons per day.

The Village earlier this year entered into a development agreement with QT South LLC for the development of 5.87 acres of land located at the northwest corner of the intersection of FM 2484 and I-35.

The land will be developed as Quick Trip Travel Center. The Quick Trip development agreement prohibits overnight truck park-

It also allows a 100 foot tall free-standing sign on the property. The current sign ordinance limits on-location signs on I-35 to be no taller than 20 foot.

Annual sales tax to Village of Salado top 2021 by 14.18%

Dec. 2022

Bell County continues to show increases in sales tax revenues compared to 2021, with all but one of the 11 cities that levy sales taxes showing increase in their December sales tax checks compared to December 2021. Seven cities showed double digit percentage increases this month.

Village of Salado showed a slight increase of 1.92% over last December. The Village received \$61,888.95 compared to \$60,722.81 in Dec. 2021. For the year, the Village has received \$789,962.49, an increase of 14.18% over the \$691,802.45 paid through Dec. 2021.

The Village is one of three Bell County cities to levy a 1 cent sales tax, while seven other Bell County cities levy a 1.5 cent sales tax and Rogers levies a 1.25 cent sales

Salado Public Library District and Bell County each levy a half-cent sales tax.

For that half-cent tax, Salado Public Library District received a \$53,100.21 December check, which was 5.5% more than last December's payment of \$50,328.09. For the year, the Library had received \$662,744.75, which is 15.61% more than the \$573,239.68 paid through Dec. 2021.

Bell County received \$2.63 million in December, compared to \$2.27 million in December 2021. The County has received \$31.58 million in 2022, which is 13.01% more than the \$27.94 million paid through Dec.

Work-from-home ethic causing sea change in urban real estate markets

The S&P 500 Stock Index (SPX) drifted back below the 4000 level on Monday, Dec. 5, but then seemed to find a comfortable bottom around 3934 and, after testing it several times, closed out the week ending on Dec. 9 at 3934.38, down 3.37% for the week. That slide left it about 17.5% lower than it was when 2022 started, but still up about 9.8% from mid-October, up 76% from March of 2020, and up about 28.5% from three years ago. The other equity index we follow, the CRSP US Mid-Cap Value index declined 2.97% to close at 2379.56. It is now down 8.38% this year and 6.72% from a year ago.


The benchmark 10-Year U.S. Treasury Note's yield climbed 2.14%, causing bond prices to fall in step with the stock market and ended the week at 3.585%. For those of you who are following the score card on this, the Treasury yield curve remains solidly inverted, with the one-year note yielding 4.72%. The price for a barrel of West Texas Intermediate Crude fell almost \$9 per barrel to \$71.45, presaging good news at the gas pump as the national average price for a gallon of regular gasoline dropped to \$3.32 per gallon, about 36% lower than it was in June of this year.

The Economy

The financial media remained stuck in "forecast the Fed" mode, reporting what in other times would be good economic news as bad, and bad economic news as good. The prevailing thought process appears to be that any good news suggesting that the U.S. economy is churning along nicely will cause the Federal Reserve to increase rates further than it would otherwise and thereby make a recession both more likely and more severe. Of course, when one boils that down to the underlying logic (or illogic), it means that reports of healthy growth, job creation, and profits are indicators of a looming recession.

Market & Economic Update

We did get a good indi-

cator of what is happening beneath the surface of the economy and driving inflation as the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) produced its Producer Price Indexes report for November. The one-year increase in wholesale prices came in at 7.4%, which sounds bad, but the core index, less food, fuel, and services was 4.9%, far better than the double digit increases we saw earlier in the year. Better yet, the one month change in prices from October to November was only 0.3%. That still amounts to an annualized increase of about 4%, which is double the Fed's target of 2%, but digging down deeper reveals that disinflation may already be underway. It was what economists call "goods" that led the way into inflation as supply chains buckled around the world and in this report, the core goods inflation this month is only 0.1%, an annualized rate of only about 1.21%.

The BLS also reported on Productivity and Costs for the third quarter in its second revision, and in that report was some excellent news. Labor productivity increased at an annual rate 0.8% for the quarter, rather than the 0.3% posted in the first estimate. In the manufacturing sector, productivity increased at an amazing annual rate of 5.8%. Since wage increases are considered in this report, that means although wages may be rising at a 5% rate, manufacturing production per hour is rising 5.8% faster than that! There are only three basic elements to the growth in a national economy, the number of workers working, the productivity of those workers, and the willingness of customers to purchase the goods and services they provide. People are certainly showing they are willing to buy, and productivity is rising, so the problem continues to be an insufficient number of workers, particularly in the services area. Unfortunately, since a lot more workers are unlikely to show up soon, the Fed needs to cause us to stop being so willing to spend money, particularly on services.

Commercial real estate continued to take hits as bigcity office buildings, particularly in New York City, are unable to fill vacancies. Publicly traded real estate funds have fallen, some by as much as half, and many non-traded "alternative" real estate investment funds have ceased to allow investor withdrawals. One office security company put the average weekday occupancy of office space in New York at about 50%. As leases expire, many tenants are not renewing. This looks more and more like a sea change in the economy as the workfrom-home ethic becomes more established.

As a last, but encouraging piece of news, Goldman Sachs economists published their opinion that the United States would narrowly avoid recession and that PCE inflation (the one the Fed follows) should decline to about 3% by the end of 2023 with only a half percent rise in unemployment. We certainly hope they are right.

Not much has changed in the bottom line. The U.S. economy continues to charge along running a bit hotter than is healthy for the long-term and inflation is still too high, but is coming down, while the rest of the world is probably in or entering a recession. We remain optimistic despite some likely bumpy times in the next few months.

Good news for 65 million Americans on social security

With their run-off victory in Georgia, Democrats now have a mandate to protect Social Security.

Social Security was on the ballot in Georgia's December 6 run-off election.

Senator Reverend Raphael Warnock's re-election victory there should be good news for Gold Star families, paralyzed veterans, seniors, and indeed all of Social Security's over 65 million beneficiaries.

It's bad news for the Wall Street-backed politicians who are determined to reach into our pockets and steal our hard earned benefits.

Defeated Republican nominee Herschel Walker proudly campaigned with and took money from Senator Rick Scott (R-FL), the author of a plan that would put Social Security on the chopping block every five years.

Walker would have been a rubber stamp for this plan — and others that would be even worse.

Senator Ron Johnson's (R-WI) plan would put Social Security on the chopping block every single year. The Republican Study Committee, a group that counts about 75 percent of House Republicans as members, wants to raise the retirement age to 70, slash middle class benefits, and give billions of Social Security dollars to Wall Street and private insurance corporations.

Republican House Leader Kevin McCarthy, who will be House Speaker next year, says he will take

a must-pass debt limit bill hostage to cut our earned Social Security benefits. Senator John Thune (R-SD), the No. 2 Senate Republican leader, has endorsed the same approach — and would have had Walker's support.

As a self-funded program that has no borrowing authority and can only pay benefits if it has sufficient revenue, Social Security does not add one penny to the federal debt. Nevertheless, these Republicans want to cut our earned benefits so badly, they're willing to risk an economic catastrophe by defaulting on our obligations.

Warnock's victory gives Democrats a clear majority in the Senate. Along with President Biden, most of these lawmakers are committed to expanding Social Security — with no cuts while requiring the wealthiest to begin to pay their fair

Social Security embodies the best of our values: that all human beings deserve dignity, freedom, and independence, that hard work should be rewarded, and that we are all connected, sharing the same risks and benefits.

Social Security is as reliable as it is essential. Through pandemics, wars, and economic recessions, Social Security has always continued to reliably pay monthly benefits, allowing its beneficiaries and their

families to pay rent, buy food, and fill life-saving prescriptions.

Americans of all political backgrounds rely on our earned Social Security benefits, and fortunately Warnock supports protecting and expanding them.

As a member of the Senate Aging Committee, Warnock led the successful fight to cap the cost of insulin for seniors. He was part of the winning vote to finally allow Medicare to negotiate with Big Pharma to lower drug prices.

The Spies Who Deserve To Be Out in the Cold

The "Twitter Files" released by Elon Musk give us a more fine-grained understanding of how and why the social media company decided to censor the Hunter Biden laptop story.

This was a woefully stupid decision. The New York Post's account was suspended for two weeks for the offense of coming up with a scoop that we are still talking about and that will surely play a large role in upcoming GOP investigations into Biden family corruption.

That's the kind of thing that newspapers should get awards for; Twitter thought it should get punished for it.

But the Twitter officials caught up in the progressive bubble that caused them to censor first, ask questions later -- all in the name of "safety," of course -- weren't the most blameworthy actors in this episode.

That dishonor belongs to the former intelligence officials who put out a widely cited, deliberately misleading letter suggesting that the Hunter Biden laptop was Russian disinformation. It muddied the discussion over the laptop and gave President Joe Biden a handy tool to try to deflect the laptop story.

These former officials knew what they were doing, traded on their public service for a tawdry political purpose, and have by and large demonstrated no remorse.

Even the former head of trust and safety at Twitter -- who sounds like he just came from a sit-in at a university president's office demanding the disinvitation of a rightwing speaker from campus -- has said Twitter shouldn't have suppressed the Hunter



Biden story

Amazingly, the former officials, once entrusted with some of the most sensitive powers and roles in the U.S. government, aren't as responsible and accountable as a social-media functionary from woke central casting. As a sheer matter of public accountability, their disgraceful performance should be one focus of House Republican investigators beginning in January.

More than 50 former intelligence officials signed the letter, including five former CIA directors or acting directors. Biden cited the letter in a debate with Donald Trump. "There are," he said, "50 former national intelligence folks who said that what ... he's accusing me of is a Russian plant."

That statement was strictly true; it just didn't hold the significance that Biden hoped the average listener would assume. When Trump derisively noted that Biden sounded like he was saying that the laptop was another Russian hoax, Biden doubled down: "That's exactly what we're told."

Of course, we all know that there's no way Biden heard about the laptop with all its tawdry and comprising information and thought, "No, that's not my boy—must be the insidious work of an extremely adept, undetected Russian spy network trying to influence the election"

ing to influence the election."

Now that multiple other

news outlets have confirmed the legitimacy of the laptop, the letter-writers haven't repented about themselves spreading clever disinformation meant to influence the election. They've fallen back on a Jesuitical defense of their handiwork.

And, indeed, the letter-writers played a game. They didn't actually say that the Hunter Biden laptop story was disinformation, at the same time they created that impression. This has given them plausible -- or more accurately, implausible -- deniability.

Cornered about the letter on Fox News, former CIA officer David Priess said that the laptop story, just as the letter asserted, had "all the classic earmarks" of Russian disinformation. That didn't mean it was disinformation, just that it had the earmarks.

That's not how the letter was promoted at the time, though. Nick Shapiro, a prime mover behind the missive and a former top aide under CIA director John Brennan, told Politico, "The real power here however is the number of former, working-level IC officers who want the American people to know that once again the Russians are interfering."

No weasel words there. And the press coverage leaned heavily on the suspicions of the intelligence officials, not their lawyerly caveats.

Even more than the former management of Twitter, the letter-writers have shown they never should be trusted again.

The Lodge is accepting new subscribers for 2023 online at https://saladolodge296.com/ product/masonic-lodge-flag-service/. Current subscribers will be sent renewal notices in late December. Salado Masonic Lodge is one of the oldest institutions in Salado. it was charted by the Grand Lodge of Texas on June 13. 1867 with Col. E.S.C. Robertson as its initial Master of the Lodge. It initially met on the second floor of Salado College until the Masons and the First Baptist Church built a two-story wooden frame building near the banks of Salado Creek in the late 1870s. The Masons met upstairs and the Baptist Church met downstairs until the 1950s when the Baptist Church built its first brick sanctuary building. At that time, the Masons took the top floor of the building and moved it up the hill to its current location on Church St. Salado Masonic Lodge has had two Grand Masters of Texas Masons from its membership: Maj. Archibald Johnson Rose and George W. Tyler. Tyler was the son of Orville T. Tyler who donated the land on which the Baptist Church and Salado Masonic Lodge were built in the 1870s. 

Bell officials encourage residents to challenge FCC broadband map

Belton, TX – The federal government plans to invest billions of dollars bringing high speed internet to American homes. Bell County officials want to do everything possible to ensure that Bell County families benefit from that investment. In the coming weeks, county officials are urging residents review a map created by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and, if

they find inconsistencies, challenge them.

"The amount of money that is being dedicated to expanding rural access to broadband represents a once-in-a-generation investment," County Judge David Blackburn said. "I want to see Bell County residents benefit by this investment of federal tax dollars."

The FCC Broadband Map shows that every area of Bell County currently has access to broadband service. Nevertheless, county leaders know that this is often not the case.

"I have heard from many residents, who have looked at their home on the map and have seen a list of ISPs that claim to have them covered," Judge Blackburn said. "However, when they contact those providers, they are hearing that those companies don't actually serve their address or the speeds that the companies represent do not reflect real-

"This is exactly the kind of feedback that we need to provide the FCC," Blackburn said. "Without it, they can't know that Bell County is not fully served in terms of high-speed internet access."

The FCC Broadband Map was initially developed using data reported by Internet Service Providers (ISPs), but it was always intended to be a living document. Leaders in the FCC have committed to work on verifying as much of the

map as they can. They continue to receive new data and updates from ISPs, but they are quick to point out that the most critical need is for members of the public to offer their insights.

Residents are encouraged to visit the map and check what type of broadband it shows is available at their address. If they discover any information about broadband service that is incorrect, they can submit an Availability Challenge. Additionally, residents can conduct speed tests to provide better data about their service availability.

SAFFRON RISOTTO WITH Parmigiano Reggiano

Serves 4 to 6 Time 35 min

Also known as risotto Milanese, creamy saffron-infused risotto is an Italian classic. Serve as a main course or as a side dish alongside roasted meats and veggies. To create cheese shavings, run a vegetable peeler over the edge of a hunk of Parmigiano Reggiano; they make an

elegant garnish for the dish. INGREDIENTS

6 cups low-sodium vegetable broth

1/2 teaspoon saffron threads 1 tablespoon unsalted butter 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil

1/2 small yellow onion, finely chopped

1 1/2 cup Carnaroli or Arborio rice

1/3 cup grated Parmigiano Reggiano cheese, plus shavings for garnish

1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

1/4 teaspoon fine sea salt 1 piece Parmigiano Reggiano cheese rind (optional) 1/2 cup dry white wine, or another 1/2 cup vegetable

1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley (optional)

METHOD

Combine broth, saffron and cheese rind (if using) in a medium saucepan.

Place on a back burner and keep at a bare simmer.

Melt butter with oil in a large, heavy skillet over medium-high heat.

Add onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until translucent, about 4 min-

Add rice and stir until grains are coated and just become translucent, 1 to 2

Add wine and cook, stirring constantly, until liquid has been absorbed.

Begin adding broth 1/2 cup at a time, stirring fairly constantly and adding more broth only when the previous addition has been almost completely absorbed.

Adjust heat as necessary so mixture simmers but does not stick.

Continue adding broth and stirring until rice grains are tender but still have a soft bite at the center, about 18 to 20 minutes.

When rice is ready, stir in a final 1/2 cup broth and grated cheese, then remove from heat.

Add salt and pepper and garnish with parsley (if using), cheese shavings and more pepper, if desired.



STEP-BY-STEP REASONING

Declarer play is usually an orderly process. Every step declarer takes is based on evidence he accumulates as play progresses. As new evidence is introduced, he makes adjustments, if necessary, in his original plan of action.

Opening lead — three of hearts.

Take this deal where West leads a heart, won by dummy's king. South has three long suits to attack, but a little reflection should convince him that it is futile to try to establish the diamonds

because the opponents, in the meantime, are sure to score at least three hearts and the A-K of diamonds.

The spades can also be ignored for the moment, because if they are divided 3-3, the contract is certain, while if they are divided 4-2, their establishment would lead to only eight tricks at best.

Therefore, by elimination, the suit to attack is clubs, where a 3-2 division assures nine tricks. Accordingly, declarer cashes the ace of clubs at trick two. When East produces the jack, South takes care to play the eight to unblock the suit if West started with four clubs.

Declarer then leads a low club to the nine. If West takes the trick, South has no problem scoring nine tricks with the aid of a subsequent club finesse -so let's assume West ducks. The club suit having been milked dry, declarer now shifts his attention to spades. The objection to playing spades at the start is no longer valid because of the extra club trick gained in the interim.

Just one more precaution is needed, however: To guard against a 4-2 spade division, and to maintain communication with both hands, South leads the spade deuce from his hand at trick four to assure scoring the extra spade trick he needs for his contract.






Shopping Map of Salado
