



Mayor will give State of Village

Village of Salado Mayor Michael Coggin will give a State of the Village address during a town hall meeting 6 p.m. March 13 at the Salado Civic Center.

Coggin will discuss several topics to include the formation and financing of a two Public Improvement Districts for the Sanctuary Development and the changes to the Development Agreements with Billie Hanks, the principal owner of Sanctuary, to make them more equitable and beneficial to the Village.

He will also talk about other recently annexed properties into the Village, including Drake's Landing residential development, Eagle Heights mixed use development on Williams Rd. and West Village Rd. and the Salado Town Center development at the corner of I-35 and FM 2484.

He will also discuss Mustang Springs at Salado, which is requesting annexation of its 1,100+ acres off of FM 2843 into the Village. The large development could bring more than 500 homes, multi-family and

some commercial into the Village when fully developed. The developer, James Kerby, will pursue a Public Improvement District to fund water, sewer and road infrastructure. The Village has approved a Development Agreement in which the developer agreed to donate \$365,000 towards the construction of the All Abilities Playground.

The Village recently received the payment from Mustang Springs at Salado and will soon begin work on the All Abilities Playground in Pace Park. Work is expected to begin within two months and take about six months to complete.

Coggin will also address infrastructure projects and needs, including repaving Royal Street and Center Circle. He will also discuss drainage projects that are being funded through COVID-19 federal funds.

The Village and County have recently signed a land lease that will allow the Village to build a municipal building at the County Annex at the intersection of I-35 and FM 2484.

At the end of the question/answer period, in reverse order to the introductions by Nancy Best, each candidate will be given two minutes for closing remarks.

Person of the Year

Apartment rent costs fall, helping to stave off inflation

The Markets

Our dear old stock market indicator, the S&P 500 Stock Index (SPX) climbed out of its recent doldrums as it rose 1.9% to 4045.64 for the week of March 3, once more above the psychologically important 4000 mark. While this week's appreciation brings it up to a gain of 5.38% this year, and a pleasing 12.94% from last October, it remains down 15.6% from its high back at the beginning of last year. Longer-term the SPX has risen 33.6% from three years ago and about 81% from its low point in March of 2020. Meanwhile, its smaller, younger cousin, the CRSP U.S. Mid-Cap Value Index rose 0.93% for the week to 2443.63 and is now up 4.42% this year and only 5.92% lower than its all-time high at the beginning of last year.

Even though the yield on the 10-Year U.S. Treasury note rose above 4% mid-week, it ended at 3.96%, almost exactly where it was a week ago and largely where it has been since last November. The Treasury yield curve too remained about where it has been with six-month and 1-year T-bills paying above 5% while the 30-year bond slipped to 3.9%. In short, the entire Treasury yield curve is upside down. West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) jumped about 4.5% to \$79.86 per barrel on Friday, but remains in a trading range it has occupied, like interest rates, since last November.

The Economy

The economic news for the week would have been, in other times, delightful to behold, but with the Federal Reserve striving to slow economic growth to stamp out inflation, good news once more becomes bad news. The Institute for Supply Management (ISM) issued its monthly survey of service company purchasing managers, and the score came in at 55.1 on a scale

where numbers above 50 indicate expansion. Perhaps more significant was the ISM Service Sector score of 62.6 for new orders. The new orders number is a strong indicator that across the service sector of our economy business activity is growing quickly. In that same report was what the Federal Reserve does not want to see, a four-point rise in hiring to 54, the highest it has been in more than a year. The prime growth areas were in agriculture, construction, and retail trade. Respondents suggested that the supply chain issues they have been wrestling with for the past two years have largely abated.

The ISM Manufacturing Index indicated the reverse of the Service survey as it came in at 47.7, better than last month's 47.4, but still in contraction territory. Because the service sector in the United States is so much larger than the manufacturing sector, the overall United States Composite PMI was at 50.2, indicating the economy is likely to continue in growth mode for at least the next several months. When the PMI scores are combined with the increase in household disposable personal income of 0.6% and the report that jobless claims have continued to fall, and now have been below 200,000 per week for the seventh week in a row, the clear picture is that of an economy largely in growth mode.

It is not as if there was no bad news, which in this environment is good news. New vehicle sales fell in February by 6.2%. Of course, that followed January's sales growth of 8.5%, so even that nominally bad (good) news turns out to be net good (bad) news, sug-

gesting continued economic growth. A growing number of mainstream institutional economic forecasters are now suggesting that there may not be a recession until perhaps late in 2023 and that would be a shallow decline in economic activity with a recovery arriving almost immediately.

A sliver of good news emerged as Apartment List, a national apartment rental listing service, reported that rents fell in every major metropolitan area in the U.S. over the past six months ending in January. Other rental listing agencies reported similar results. When that is combined with a forecast for a major arrival of new apartment spaces this year, it could well mark the turning point in the war on inflation as shelter costs are a major component in the Consumer Price Index.

Internationally, there were a couple of things that helped put our situation in perspective. First, Germany's one-year inflation rate rose to 9.2%, soaring far ahead of what we have seen here. Second, the U.S. has become a major source of crude oil for Europe, with much of that oil coming from the Texas Gulf Coast. That money flowing in for oil purchases is one of the elements combating the much-forecast recession here in the U.S.

Once more, we continue to see a healthy, growing U.S. economy with none of the pre-recession signs we have seen in the past. Inflation remains stubbornly present both here and in Europe, and that bodes ill for the bond market, but the U.S. economy is proving far more resilient than most observers seem to have suspected.

Over 2 dozen misguided lawmakers could undermine American universities

American universities have long attracted the best and brightest from around the world. They come for the sophisticated research opportunities that prevail in academic labs -- funded, in part, by American taxpayer dollars.

But with taxpayer dollars comes political scrutiny. More than two dozen members of Congress just proposed a reinterpretation of the law that fuels this world-class R&D engine. And their short-term political ploy, if adopted, would undermine U.S. leadership in higher education.

Back in the 1970s, leaders in Congress realized that America's research apparatus was not achieving all that it could. While federal funds supported groundbreaking research in academic labs across the nation, those funds came with strings attached. Namely, the government retained title to patents if they arose from research funded in any part by taxpayer dollars.

And the government did poor job of finding companies willing to invest in turning that patented basic research into actual, useful products. The feds licensed fewer than 5% of those patents to the private sector.

University and small business leaders proposed a solution to this waste: decentralization. Rather than Washington bureaucrats licensing federally funded inventions, universities and small companies themselves could license patents they developed with gov-

ernment support.

Formalized in a bipartisan 1980 law colloquially known as the Bayh-Dole Act, this arrangement unleashed a frenzy of university research and successful commercialization.

Thanks to the current congressional proposal, however, Bayh-Dole and sponsored research at America's universities could soon be eviscerated.

Hoping to find a silver bullet to cut drug prices, lawmakers zeroed in on an obscure provision of the Bayh-Dole Act. It allows the government to "march in" and relicense patents derived from federally funded research in a few rare circumstances.

These lawmakers, however, want to twist the original intent of this provision in hopes of marching in on innovative products that, thanks to Bayh-Dole, are already on the market. Essentially, they're proposing to use march-in rights as de facto price controls.

The authors of the 1980 law definitively stated that Congress never intended to grant such authority to the federal government.

And for good reason. If the private sector believed that the government could rip up carefully negotiated license agreements on a whim, firms would not license university research, nor would they pour hundreds of millions, or even billions, of dollars into sponsoring academic research and then developing that research into useful commercial products.

We've already run this

experiment. In 1989, the federal government began inserting a "reasonable pricing clause" into patent licenses and cooperative research and development agreements (CRADAs) between federally funded academic institutions and the private sector.

Instead of lowering drug prices, however, this policy repelled private industry from collaborating with academia.

Resurrecting these failed policies would once again deal a blow to America's research universities. The opportunity to perform research, and collaborate with industry, attracts thousands of bright foreign students to the United States every year. By and large, these students stay in the country and help America maintain a net positive trade imbalance in "intellectual capital."

Gutting American academic research means that more of those students will take their talent and their tuition dollars to competing markets. That'd be a tragic outcome.

Destroying Bayh-Dole's virtuous research and development cycle could upend American higher education. That's an unfathomably high price to pay. Let's not do it.

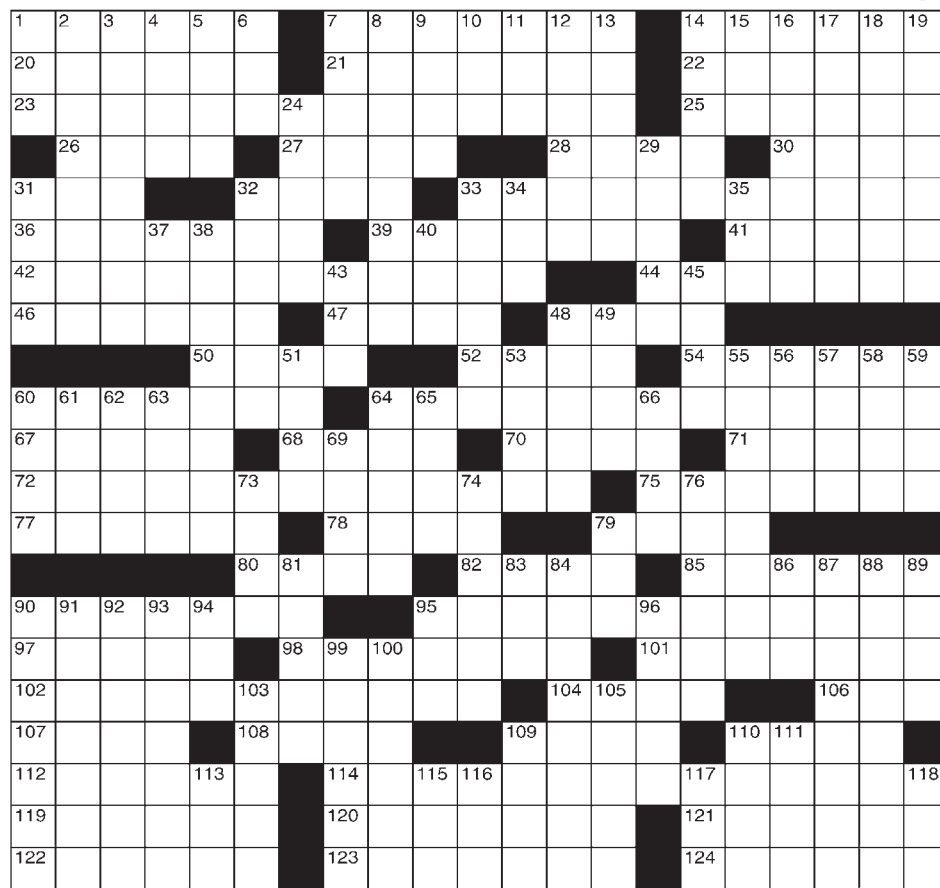

There are many hands where defending mechanically will allow declarer to get home with a contract that could have been defeated.

Consider this deal from a team-of-four match where West led the queen of spades against four hearts. South played low from dummy, as did East, and West continued with the jack. Declarer took the ace, ruffed a spade, played the A-Q of hearts and led a low diamond to the nine.

West cashed two diamonds but was then stymied. He had to lead a club or diamond, either of which would hand South the contract.

At the other table, four hearts was also the final contract. Again West led the queen of spades, ducked in dummy, but here East overtook the queen with the king and returned a diamond. West cashed two diamonds and reverted to spades, thus putting the contract out of reach. South later lost a club trick and went down one.

The second East defended exceptionally well to defeat the contract. Overtaking the queen of spades was not particularly difficult, as West was marked by the bidding and declarer's first play with the Q-J-x.

But East then guessed well to shift to a diamond rather than a club. Had East returned a club at trick two, South could still have made the contract with careful play.

He puts up the ace, leads a spade to the ace and ruffs a spade. He then leads a trump to the jack, ruffs dummy's last spade, cashes the ace of trump and exits with the queen of clubs. 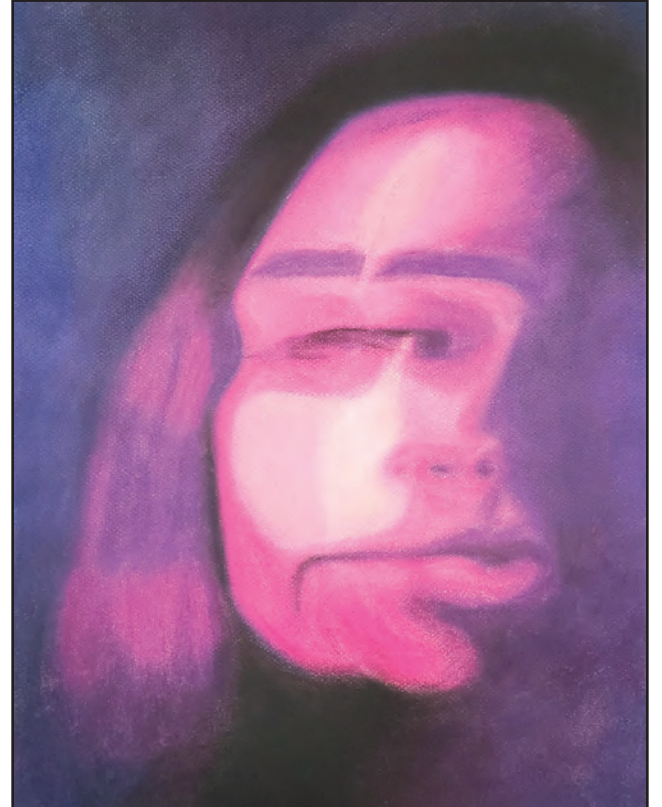

SHS VASE sends 6 artists to state competition

Salado set some new records at the Regional VASE competition. Salado's entries were the most for a single teacher. The entries that were near those numbers were from schools with more than one art teacher.

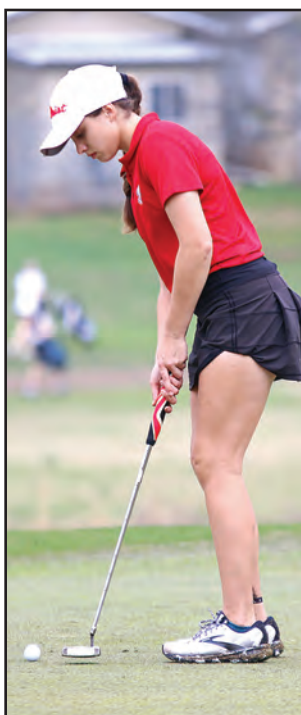

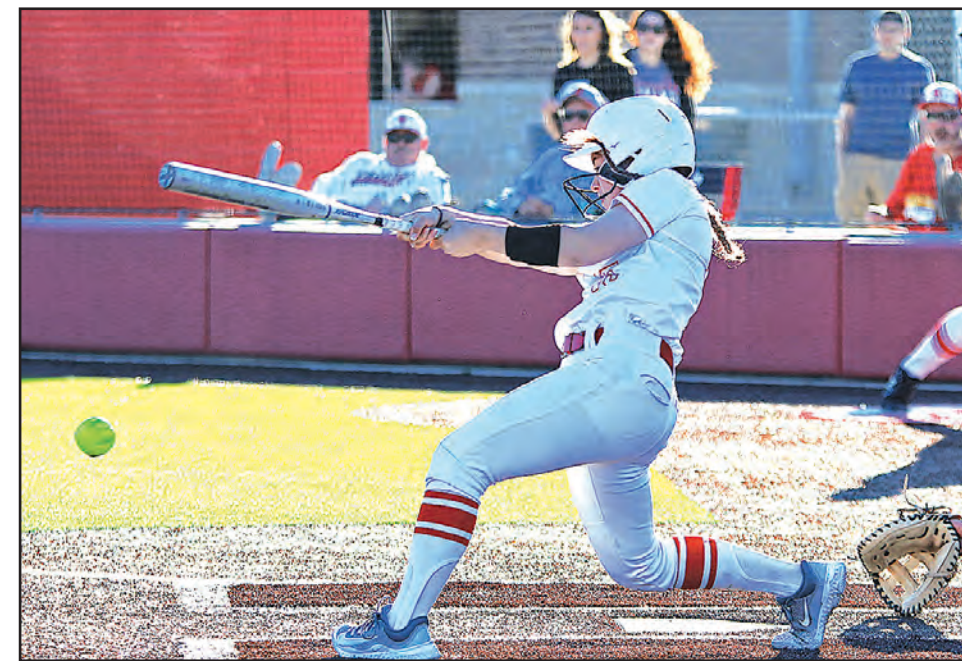

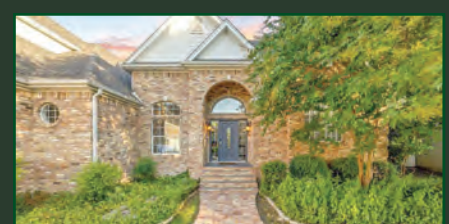
