

## Ribbon cutting, blessing for bridge 5:30 p.m. Oct. 5

Barrow Brewing Company owners, Graydon and KD Hill, have been working since January 2023 to build a bridge over Salado Creek. They invite the public to celebrate its successful installation at 5:30 p.m. Oct. 5. The Salado Chamber of Commerce will do a ribbon cutting and priests from the Episcopal Diocese of Texas will bless the bridge.

Graydon Hill was motivated to build a pedestrian bridge over Salado Creek last December after a stroller was hit by a car on the Main Street bridge. The Main Street bridge, built in 1922, offers two lanes of traffic and a narrow walkway for pedestrians. During high traffic times, especially during events like Salado's Christmas Stroll, many pedestrians choose to walk in the lanes of traffic because they cannot fit in the walkway.

Hill coordinated this project and obtained approvals where needed from the Corps of Engineers, Texas Parks and Wildlife, and the Village of Salado.

The bridge connects land on the south shore of the creek at Barrow Brewing to Village owned Pace Park.

The bridge is for pedestrian use only and is considered temporary.

In the event of a flood or heavy rain, Hill is able to pull the 60'x6' bridge out of the creek and onto higher ground.

The following history of bridges over Salado Creek was taken from George W. Tyler's History of Bell County.

"For several years after the town was laid out, the citizens of Salado crossed the shallow creek by stepping from rock to rock, or on logs laid across the wider places. These logs were chained to the rocks and would sink down stream during freshets and be replaced when the flood subsided. But when in 1866 a dam was thrown across the stream at the lower end of the village, the water was backed up over the rocks. Then for a time "foot-logs" raised on legs standing in the water and chained to the rocks below were used; but they were narrow, rickety and unsafe, and pedestrians not infrequently tumbled off into the water. A general demand arose for a bridge. To meet this problem as well

as others, it was decided to incorporate the village. Application for incorporation was made under the general law and the county court in January 1867, authorized and election for town officers. On February 23, Judge O.T. Tyler was elected mayor and a board of aldermen was chosen. These officials appointed the other officers, among the Colonel Thos. H. Jones as treasurer. The town officials first tried to raise funds for a bridge by voluntary donations, but finding they could not raise enough by this means, on December 3, 1868, they ordered an issue of bonds...

The bonds were purchased by the citizens of the town. With the proceeds and subscriptions amounting in all to some \$2,500, the municipal authorities proceeded to build a wire cable suspension foot-bridge of substantial construction of unique design and graceful proportions. Two large galvanized rope-wire cables, anchored at each end in strongly built stone abutments, were carried over two double-turreted dressed-stone piers of towers. From these suspended cables wire cords extended down to catch and support the ends of sawed cedar cross bars or joists on which the plank floor was laid. It was one of the first of its kind in the Southwest and was designed, engineered and constructed entirely by home talent-Judge Tyler, Colonel Thos. H. Jones, Judge Wm. H. Garrett, Wm. A. Davis, John Hendrickson and others. It swung some twenty feet above the water and although it could be made to sway enough from side to side to frighten timid souls--especially groups of squealing girls when mischievous boys chose this method of teasing them--it served the people well for more than thirty years. After the county built a combination wagon and foot bridge a few yards upstream the suspension bridge gradually fell into disuse. In 1913 it was finally swept away when a cloud burst in the upper water-shed of Salado Creek sent down a terrific flood that carried away the county bridge as well. The latter was promptly rebuilt, only to be carried away again in the still greater flood of September 9 and 10, 1921.

## Museum opens new exhibit on Oct. 5

Salado Museum and College Park's newest exhibit will open to the public at 5 p.m. Oct. 5.

The new, permanent exhibit tells the story of Salado's beginnings. It showcases artifacts from the Tonkawa tribe and addresses the earliest known residents of this

area. It explains the history of Empresario Robertson, his family, and the early settlers he brought to this region of Texas.

The museum collection includes relics and heirlooms that have been fully catalogued by the Museum Director, Lynnette Jones,

Museum Committee Chair, Debbie Lufburrow, and a team of volunteers. Lisa Gurno, Kathy and Jim Smith, Mike Jones, Pamela Anderson, Nancy Norris and June Batkis have worked on this exhibit and cataloging the museum's extensive collection since February 2023.

Visitors to the exhibit will learn about cowboys on the Chisholm Trail, the museum's earliest days, Stagecoach Inn history, the Scottish Gathering and Highland Games and more.

## Sirena's Creekside Carnaval Oct. 7

On the first weekend of October every year, mermaids take over Salado. Sirena's Creekside Carnaval, hosted by Legacy Salado Inc., a local 501c3 nonprofit, honors the beloved tale of Sirena by bringing together the community and beyond on Oct. 7 at Pace Park for a promenade that celebrates the crowning of the Creekside Carnaval Princess and Catfish King, along with a host of fun, free activities for families. This year, attendees can expect live music, live mermaids, vendors, food trucks, a zoo show, petting zoo, storytime, performances by Native American dancers, and so much more. The promenade starts at 9:30 a.m., and the festival will be 10 a.m.-6 p.m.

The Tonkawa Legend of Sirena is a story near and dear to Saladoans young and old alike. The legend, featuring a young Native Ameri-

can woman named Sirena being tricked into becoming a mermaid by a magical catfish, was brought to life by local artist and sculptor Troy Kelley, who created a bronze sculpture that honors the tale his Native American grandmother told him as a young child.

Each year, Legacy Salado Inc. selects a project that improves and enhances the Village of Salado's public spaces or community members.

Last year alone, Legacy Salado Inc. donated \$48,705 towards Salado's all-abilities playground.

Since the Village of Salado considers the playground project fully funded and construction is slated to begin soon, Legacy Salado has found a new project this year. Driven by a passion to make a difference, the 2023 project will be constructing Little Food Pantries in the

Additionally, after the passage of House Bill 357

during the 88th Legislative Session, the Secretary of State's office is now required to set the date of a runoff election resulting from an election held on a uniform election date. The runoff date for the November 7 election will be December 9.

While there are no runoffs for constitutional amendments, runoffs may be required for some local and special elections.

This information and all the details for casting a ballot can be found at [VoteTexas.gov](http://VoteTexas.gov), Texas' official voting resource.

Salado Independent School District voters will have two Propositions on the ballot. The propositions are

below the 14 proposed constitutional amendments.

Salado Independent School District PROPOSITION A

The issuance of \$235,960,000 of bonds by the Salado Independent School District for a new high school; renovations at Thomas Arnold Elementary school; repurpose existing high school for an intermediate school; information technology infrastructure and HVAC replacements and levying the tax in payment thereof. This is a property tax increase.

PROPOSITION B

The issuance of \$34,490,000 of bonds by the Salado Independent School District for a new stadium

complex and levying the tax in payment thereof. This is a property tax increase.

Texans will vote on 14 proposed amendments as a part of the November 7 Election. Below is the ballot order as drawn.

Proposition 1 - HJR 126 "The constitutional amendment protecting the right to engage in farming, ranching, timber production, horticulture, and wildlife management."

Proposition 2 - SJR 64 "The constitutional amendment authorizing a local option exemption from ad valorem taxation by a county or municipality of all or part of the appraised value of real property used to operate a child-care facility."

Proposition 3 - HJR 132 "The constitutional amendment prohibiting the imposition of an individual wealth or net worth tax, including a tax on the difference between the assets and liabilities of an individual or family."

Proposition 4 - HJR 2 from the second special session "The constitutional amendment to authorize the legislature to establish a temporary limit on the maximum appraised value of real property other than a residence homestead for ad valorem tax purposes; to increase the amount of the exemption from ad valorem taxation by a school district applicable to residence homesteads from \$40,000 to \$100,000; to ad-

just the amount of the limitation on school district ad valorem taxes imposed on the residence homesteads of the elderly or disabled to reflect increases in certain exemption amounts; to except certain appropriations to pay for ad valorem tax relief from the constitutional limitation on the rate of growth of appropriations; and to authorize the legislature to provide for a four-year term of office for a member of the board of directors of certain appraisal districts."

Proposition 5 – HJR 3 "The constitutional amendment relating to the Texas University Fund, which provides funding to certain institutions of higher education to achieve national prominence as major research universities and drive the state economy."

Proposition 6 – SJR 75 "The constitutional amendment creating the Texas water fund to assist in financing water projects in this state."

Proposition 7 – SJR 93 "The constitutional amendment providing for the creation of the Texas energy fund to support the construction, maintenance, modernization, and operation of electric generating facilities."

Proposition 8 – HJR 125 "The constitutional amendment creating the broadband infrastructure fund to expand high-speed broadband access and assist in the financing of connectivity projects."

Proposition 9 – HJR 2, regular session "The constitutional amendment authorizing the 88th Legislature to provide a cost-of-living adjustment to certain annuitants of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas."

Proposition 10 – SJR 87 "The constitutional amendment to authorize the legislature to exempt from ad valorem taxation equipment or inventory held by a manufacturer of medical or biomedical products to protect the Texas healthcare network and strengthen our medical supply chain."

Proposition 11 – SJR 32 "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to permit conservation and reclamation districts in El Paso County to issue bonds supported by ad valorem taxes to fund the development and maintenance of parks and recreational facilities."

Proposition 12 – HJR 134 "The constitutional amendment providing for the abolition of the office of county treasurer in Galveston County."

Proposition 13 – HJR 107 "The constitutional amendment to increase the mandatory age of retirement for state justices and judges."

Proposition 14 – SJR 74 "The constitutional amendment providing for the creation of the centennial parks conservation fund to be used for the creation and improvement of state parks."

The museum hired its first Executive Director in December 2022 and in January 2023, they expanded their operating hours to Tuesday through Saturday 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

## Come Hear the Bagpipes Play in Salado!

November 12, 1961 would be an historic day for Salado. On that day people from around the country came together here to celebrate their Scottish ancestry at the 1st Gathering of All Scottish Clans. This year will mark the 62nd Salado Scottish Gathering, making it the oldest continuous Scottish festival held in Texas.

"All proceeds from the event benefit the Salado Museum and College Park, so we didn't even skip the COVID year. We held a small outdoor ceremony on College Hill and hosted on-line activities with donation opportunities," says Liz Patranella, co-chairman of the Scottish Gathering.

The Scottish Gathering and Highland Games is the place to experience all things Scottish -- the skirl of bagpipes, wearing of the tartan, tossing the caber, Highland dancers, Celtic music, men in kilts, Scots shops, good eats and more.

"One of our main features is the Clan Village, one of the largest gatherings of Scottish Clans in Texas,



where members of more than 40 Scottish clans and societies share information on Scottish history and heritage," Patranella adds.

The weekend begins on Friday afternoon when Scottish singer Ed Miller gives a talk on the Scottish Folksong Revival at the Museum. Friday evening a torchlit ceremony is held on the banks of Salado Creek recreating the Calling of the Clans by Robert the Bruce in 1314 at Bannockburn.

Grounds open at 9 a.m. Saturday on the grounds of Thomas Arnold Elementary School for a full day of activities that includes bagpipe, drumming, Highland dance, and heavy athletics competitions. There is live Celtic music with fiddle and song plus the hilarious Bonniest Knees contest, a Scottish shortbread contest, a food court and shopping.

"The big crowd-pleas-

er is the Bands and Clans Parade that starts at Main Street and North Pace Park Road at noon and moves west along Thomas Arnold Road to enter the festival grounds," Patranella says. "Our official opening ceremonies follow with presentations and a massed bands performance. Spectators are invited to stand along the route or bring lawn chairs to enjoy the parade.

Sunday events begin at 9 a.m. with the Kirkin' o' the Tartan, a traditional devotional service and continues with Pipe and Drum and Highland Dance performances, live music, Pet Costume Contest and Parade, Clan tents, shopping and food booths.
