



SISD voters will decide on 2 proposed bonds

Salado Independent School District voters will decide on two proposed Salado ISD bond issues 7 a.m.-7 p.m. Nov. 7. Polls will be open at 42 locations throughout Bell County and a Bell County voter can cast their ballots at any of the locations. Polling locations can be found at https://bell-countytx.com/departments/elections/election_day_locations.php

The ballot will read as follows:

“PROPOSITION A The issuance of \$235,960,000 of bonds by the Salado Inde-

pendent School District for a new high school; renovations at Thomas Arnold Elementary School; re-purpose existing high school for an intermediate school; information technology infrastructure and HVAC replacements, and levying the tax in payment thereof. This is a property tax increase.”

“PROPOSITION B The issuance of \$34,490,000 of bonds by the Salado Independent School District for a new stadium complex and levying the tax in payment thereof. This is a property tax increase.”

The district has contracted with PBK Architects, Inc. of Austin for design work

at a rate of 6% of the actual construction cost.

The agreement sets out the following costs for items in Proposition A:

New High School: 1,000 Student Capacity with core spaces sized for 1,500 at a cost of \$179,307,000.

TAE 1 & 3 Replacement + Site Improvements: 800 Student Capacity at a cost of \$52,008,750.

Re-purpose Existing High school at a cost of \$1,775,000. The high school will be re-purposed as an intermediate school.

Hearing set Nov. 8 on proposed wells for Mustang Springs

Clearwater Underground Water Conservation District will conduct a public hearing 1:30 p.m. Nov. 8 for a drilling permit for two public water supply groundwater wells from the Lower Trinity Aquifer (Hosston Layer). The hearing will be held at the CUWCD headquarters, 700 Kenney Court in Belton.

The permit request from Jaffe Interests LP (James Kerby owner) is for two water wells to serve the Mustangs Springs at Salado, a 1,106-acre development that has been annexed into the Village of Salado. The development will be built in three phases, with 322 connections in Phase 1 and 2 and 315 connections in Phase. Each connection will require 350 gallons per day for a total of 1,167 Living Unit Equivalent (LUE).

Well 1 will be a maximum 4-inch pipe, 320 gallon per minute well with a proposed production of 126.3 acre-feet per year, or 41.1 million gallons per year.

Well 2 will be a maximum 4-inch pipe, 320 gallon per minute well with a proposed production of 123.5 acre feet per year, or 40.24 million gallons per year.

The developer will have to have the proposed development de-certified (released) from the Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) of the City of

Georgetown in order to form a public water supply.

According to CUWCD General Manager Dirk Aaron, the developer has sought release from the City of Georgetown CCN, but has not yet made application to the Public Utility Commission (PUC) for a new CCN. This must be done before a final operating permit can be issued.

“The wells or the wells’ design must be approved by TCEQ for public water supply prior to this Board granting any operating permits for the wells,” Aaron stated. The developer is in the process of seeking approval for the design of the wells.

In preparation for the public hearing, CUWCD had Michael R. Keester with RW Harden Associates conduct a “Hydrogeologic Evaluation of the Mustang Springs (N3-23-010P and N3-23-011P) Drilling Permit Applications.

In that assessment, Keester concludes that, “the proposed wells will not inhibit the ability of other users to access groundwater from the Lower Trinity. In addition, the proposed production associated with a future operating permit is less than the volume reported as available for permitting. Based on our current understanding of the system, the nearest Lower Trinity well in use is estimated to experience approximately nine feet of drawdown from the annual

production after one year.”

As part of the permitting process, Jaffe Interests LP contracted with Pape Dawson Engineers for a “Hydrogeologic Assessment for Mustang Springs Development Wells in Bell County, Texas” signed by Peter George, Ph.D. P.G.

In that assessment, George states “Two additional phases of development are currently in the scoping process and may be included in future permit requests. Phase 4 consists of multifamily, village/cluster, and mixed-use development with 420 living unit equivalents. Phase 5 consists of a school and commercial development, with 147 living unit equivalents. At final buildout, the development is projected to have 1,167 total living unit equivalents.

The public hearing will give Affected Parties an opportunity to participate in the evidentiary portion of the hearing.

Fiddler, story teller brings words, music to Salado Museum

Scottish fiddler and storyteller, Colin MacLeod, will present a one-hour lecture in word and music at 1 p.m. Nov. 10 in the Lucile A. The lecture, The Scottish Fiddle - Its Journey of Influence from Scotland to the USA, addresses the influence of the Scottish fiddle on folk and popular music in the United States from the 1700s to the present day.

This presentation is sponsored by the Salado Public Library and the Salado Cultural Arts District in partnership with the Salado Museum and College Park.

Suggested donation at the door is \$10. The lecture by Scottish folklorist Ed Miller previously scheduled will not be held this year due to unforeseen circumstances.

Colin MacLeod is originally from Scotland and has been playing Celtic fiddle for more than 40 years. He achieved Grade 8 Violin Distinction, played in Celtic bands in Australia, and has hosted Celtic fiddle workshops in Scotland, Australia and the United States since 2007. Colin regularly performs and teaches, both in person and online, in Europe, Australia and North America.

The Scottish fiddle, in its various forms, has been

present in Scotland since the 1700s. When people emigrated from Scotland to the United States during the 1700s and 1800s, many brought their fiddles with them. The tunes they played would become the foundation for American folk music.

The golf weekend features special guest William W. Reed, past president of The Golf Heritage Society (a global non-profit organization headquartered in Lebanon, Ohio) who will display an extensive collection of historic golf equipment and artifacts at Mill Creek throughout the weekend.

Tee-off ceremonies at noon will include Pipe Major Doug Slauson performing on the course. What makes Hickory Golf unique is that the players use clubs that have a solid hickory wood shaft as did clubs used in the late 19th and early 20th Century. The

players also dress the part, with men wearing vintage-style golfing knickers, jackets and caps.

Smith picked as new SISD Chief Operations Officer

Dr. Ted Smith was selected from a field of 25 applicants to be the Salado ISD Chief Operations Officer.

A committee of six administrators reviewed applications and interviewed six. Committee members were Asst. Supt. Beth Aycock, Director of Special Programs Melanie Kasper, SISD Chief of Police Gary McHone, Thomas Arnold Elementary Principal Katie Mullins, Fi-

nance Director Kelli Rhiddlehoover and Supt. Michael Novotny.

“He has done an outstanding job for the past five years as our middle school principal. He is very knowledgeable about facilities and transportation,” Dr. Novotny said.

“Dr. Smith was very involved in the design and construction of Salado Middle School and participated in the meetings with the architects and construction company,” Dr. Novotny added.

He is certified as a Registered Texas School Business Administrator (RTSBA), which is the highest level of certification with the Texas Association of School Business Officials (TASBO).

Dr. Smith earned a B.S. in Chemistry and Biology from the University of Mary-Hardin Baylor in 2002. He earned a Master of Education from UMHB in 2006. He earned Doctorate in Education Curriculum and Instruction from Baylor University in 2020.

Dr. Smith has 16 years experience as a campus administrator. He served as an assistant principal at Belton High School, Shoemaker High School and Principal of Belton ISD DAEP.

For the past five years, Dr. Smith has been principal of Salado Middle School, where he also served on the District Safety and Security Committee and the Threat Assessment Committee.

He also drives a bus! He holds a Class B Commercial Driver License. “He

frequently drives bus routes and field trips when we are in need of a driver,” Dr. Novotny said.

Dr. Smith will begin his job on Nov. 6. Mike Brooks resigned the position to take the Chief Operations Officer position at Elgin ISD.

Since posting the principal position, the district has received nine applications.

“We will conduct interviews for that position in the next couple of weeks,” Dr. Novotny said. A hire could be made in November.

Third quarter GDP rose at annualized rate of 4.9%

The Markets

The US stock market, as represented by the S&P 500 Stock Index (SPX), went through a now familiar pattern for the week that ended on the 27th. It started up on Monday, leveled off on Tuesday, then slowly ground lower on the last three days of the week to end the week at 4117.37, down 2.53% and at its lowest point in the last six months or so. If we count from the end of week high on July 28, it is now down just over 10%, and thus is hypothetically in a "correction." Of course, there are a lot of ways of looking at that. The SPX is also up 7.34% this year, about 15% higher than it was in mid-October of last year and is nearly 30% higher than it was three years ago (an 8.9% average annual rate of return). But if we want to look for the negative not mentioned in any news story we could find, our dear old SPX is just over 14% lower than it was at the beginning of 2022. The CRSP Mid-Cap Value Index, our other market indicator, followed its older and larger cousin, but with less enthusiasm, declining a mere 1.54% over the last five days, to 2144.15. It is now down over 8% this year, and 17% since last year began but remains 1.25% higher than last October. If all those numbers sound confusing, it is because they are! We are either in an impressive bull market, an either serious or mild correction, or bumping between the two like a blind man in a dark room. It all depends on your perspective.

Also, as is usual as of late, the real excitement was in the quite ephemeral bond market. The benchmark 10-year U.S. Treasury note yield flirted with a 5% yield twice in the week, but then bowed out gracefully yielding 4.84% before taking the weekend off. That is higher than we have gotten used to, but nearly 3% lower than where it ended last week. The shortest-term Treasuries, maturing in less than one-year, remained

around 5.6%, where the yield has held for some time, keeping the Treasury yield curve decidedly inverted. Meanwhile, the 20- and 30-year Treasury bond yields continued edging toward and past 5%. The more we look, the more we see 5% becoming a form of "new normal." Despite the best efforts of the Saudis and the Russians and war in the Middle East, the price of a barrel of West Texas Intermediate crude oil slipped down 4.41% to \$85.09.

The Economy

Without a doubt, the biggest economic news for the week was the official first estimate from our beloved Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) that the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of these United States of America rose at an annualized rate of 4.9% in the third quarter of 2023. While there was much hurrah about that number, what appears to have been largely missed is that number is the same growth reported for the much vaunted, Chinese juggernaut economy for the same period. In fact, since the People's Republic of China (PRC) measures its GDP based on reports from local Communist Party offices rather than from actual national data, academic researchers from the Brookings Institute suggested in a 2019 paper that the PRC GDP report runs about 1.8 points higher than reality. That means in the third quarter of 2023, the U.S. economy very likely outperformed the smaller PRC economy by a whopping 58%!

Not satisfied with that headline-grabbing GDP report, the BEA also reported that Personal Income and Outlays for September rose 0.3% (\$77.8 billion) while Personal Consumer Expenditures (PCE) were up by 0.7% (138.7 billion).

In other words, the spending boom, which drove the GDP report, is not likely to last too long. U.S. consumers are increasing their spending faster than their income is rising. The most watched statistic in the report, the PCE Price Index was up 3.4% in the last 12 months and appeared to be rising at about that annualized level month to month. Given the Federal Reserve's mandated goal of reducing price increases (inflation) to an annualized 2%, it looks like they have some work left to do. That conclusion was the reported reason for the stock market slump.

Speaking of slowing things down, the Mortgage Banking Association announced that the average 30-year home new mortgage rate is now up to 7.9%. Not coincidentally, mortgage applications were down 2.2% from last week, falling to the lowest level since 1995. At the same time, U.S. new home sales surged an astonishing 12.3% in September, according to the Census Bureau. Builders appear to be offsetting the higher mortgage rates with discounts and financial incentives to keep the sales coming. What is unclear is how long house building companies can keep that up.

The bottom line is that the U.S. economy remains on a roll, but ongoing inflation remains stubbornly higher than the Fed will tolerate. Odds appear to be that the Fed will not raise rates at their meeting next month, instead relying on rising longer term rates to slow demand and control price rises. The consensus of economic forecasters has now moved to our view that there will be no significant recession soon. We are glad to see them finally come around to our point of view but find it a bit disturbing to be in concert with the mass of forecasters who are so often wrong.

Imagine a Day Without Water

Texans are familiar with the saying that we know the value of water when the well runs dry. The common convenience of flowing taps may quickly become a dirty, desperate and miserable experience when water ceases to flow.

On Oct. 19, we were encouraged to "imagine a day without water." The purpose of this day was to shed light on the value that water provides for all communities, and the need for further investment in safe and affordable water infrastructure.

Unfortunately, the data indicates that an imagined day without water may soon become a nightmare reality.

Texas is a drought-prone state. Just as 2023 has been a hot and dry year, we have been hit before by severe, persistent droughts that lasted for years on end.

The good news is that we have a plan to prepare ourselves for severe droughts. The State Water Plan describes the water supply projects and smart management strategies needed to deliver water to a growing, drought-prone state.

Just as the water plan offers a blueprint toward hydrological salvation, it offers a harrowing, data-driven description on

what could happen if we're not prepared for the next big drought. For starters, Texas faces a water supply deficit of 6.9 million acre feet — where the number of thirsty people will exceed available water supplies — if we don't expand our water supply portfolio by 2070.

Failing to expand our water portfolio between now and 2070 could inflict \$153 billion in GDP losses and 1.4 million jobs lost — a massive hit to the Texas economic miracle.

Beyond water supply needs, the aging, deteriorating condition of our water systems also threatens our water future. Again, the data tells a sobering story.

Antiquated systems leak enough water per year to fill a major reservoir the size of Lake Buchanan in the Hill Country or Possum Kingdom Lake in North Texas. On top of that, thousands of boil water notices are issued each year, oftentimes due to the poor condition of drinking water systems. Given enough time, dilapidated water systems can fail — as happened in Odessa and Zavalla last year — leaving communities without running water.

While we may easily imagine a day without water, Texans have the option next month to do something about it. If voters approve

its creation in the November constitutional amendment election, the Texas Water Fund would be used for developing new water supplies and fixing failing water systems.

Approved by a bipartisan majority in the Texas Legislature earlier this year, the Texas Water Fund expands the state's financial strategy toward helping communities avoid having to endure days without water.

The Legislature has also authorized a \$1 billion deposit into this new fund, pending voter approval. This modest down payment represents a needed first step toward addressing Texas' long-term water infrastructure challenges, and it sets our state on a smart financial path toward securing our water future.

As we're asked to imagine a day without water, it's worth remembering that the possibility of living without water is real for many communities in Texas. The proverbial well can run dry. On the upside, voters have the option of doing something about it this November.

Document Storage at a cost of \$324,000.

Instructional Technology Upgrades for Interactive Flat Panels (IFP) in Classrooms at a cost of \$486,000.

Bi-Directional Amplifier at a cost of \$351,000.

HVAC Unit Replacement at Existing High School at a cost of \$1,728,000.

The agreement sets out the following costs for items in Proposition B: New Stadium Complex with 5,000 seats at a cost of \$34,489,539.

The proposed projects follow the recommendation of the District's Facility Planning Committee composed of 47 community members and 11 non-voting

administrative members. The committee met seven times since February to build consensus on a long range facilities plan for the district.

The committee recommends the following long range future projects: Second Elementary School, Fine Arts Auditorium for High School and Animal Barn for the High School. These are not included in the propositions.

Zonda Education, in a demographics study for Salado ISD, predicts that enrollment in Salado schools will increase by an average of more than 6% per year through 2032 at which year the enrollment is predicted

to be 4,149 students.

PBK Architects compiled a facilities assessment for the district.

Thomas Arnold Elementary is the oldest of the schools with buildings occupied in 1967 (TAE 1), 1979 (TAE 3) and 1999 (TAE 2). Thomas Arnold Elementary sits on 33.5 acres, which includes the old softball and baseball fields and the current football stadium.

TAE 1 is 48,171 sq. ft and has a Facilities Condition Index of 89%. TAE 2 is 71,191 sq. ft. with an FCI of 35%. TAE 3 is 61,496 sq. ft. with an FCI of 60%.

The design capacity is for TAE is 1,136 students. Enrollment for 2023 is 1,103.

Salado High School was occupied in fall 2008. It sits on 50.00 Acres and is 114,435 sq. ft. It has a design capacity of 659 students. Current enrollment is 734 students.

Salado Middle School is the newest school, sitting on 51.73 acres and serving grades 6-8, opening to students in Fall 2020. It is 136,000 sq. ft. with a Design Capacity of 621 students. Enrollment for 2023 is 603

The ballot will include 14 proposed amendments to the Texas constitution. Verbiage of those amendments can be found at saladovillagevoice.com.

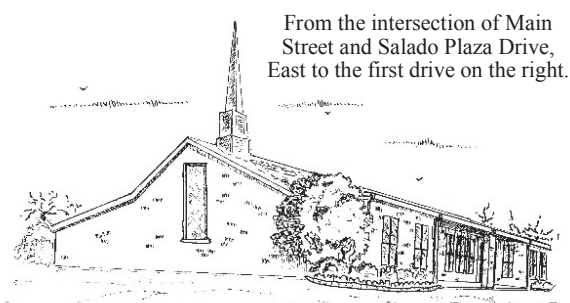

bled as shown, and West led the jack of hearts. Declarer played low from dummy, and East took the ace and returned a heart to dummy's king.

It was obvious to Sherman that East had started with a doubleton heart and was poised to ruff the next heart lead. Had declarer led a trump at this point, East would have taken the ace and put West in with a club to obtain the heart ruff that sets the contract.

But Sherman found a way to prevent West from ever gaining the lead and thereby circumvented the heart ruff. East's two-notrump bid marked him with both the king of diamonds and ace of spades. So, at trick three, Sherman cashed the ace of diamonds and then led the queen. This forced East to cover with the king, whereupon declarer discarded her singleton club!

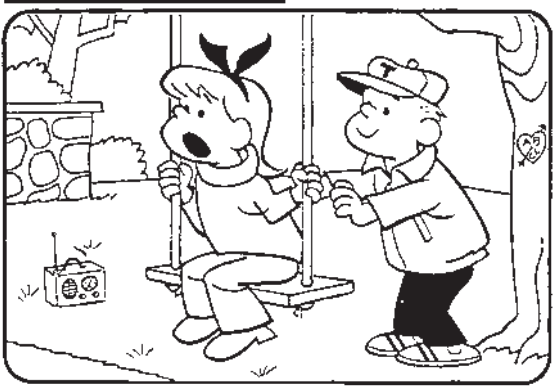
East returned a club, but the chicken had flown the coop. Sherman ruffed, forced out the ace of spades, ruffed the club return, drew trump and ran her hearts to make the doubled contract. Her only losers were a heart, a spade and a diamond.

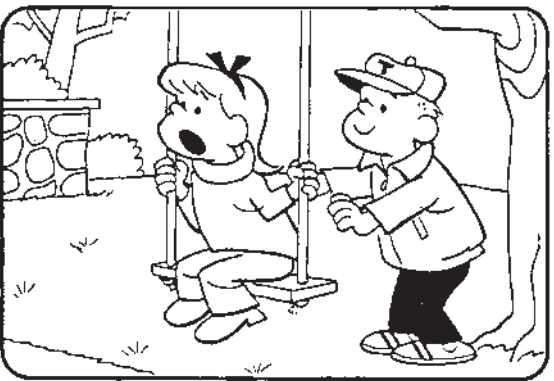

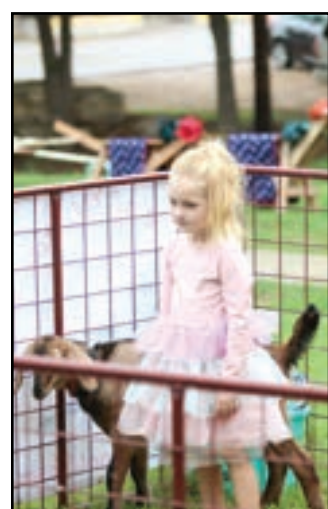

Quail Populations Strongest in Years

AUSTIN —Texas quail hunting season opens Oct. 28, and Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) surveys indicate an increased number of bobwhite and scaled quail in the field thanks to a combination of cooler temperatures and spring rainfall during the start of nesting season.

“Statewide, we are still far from where we would like to be and drought conditions this summer caused us to temper expectations,” said John McLaughlin, TPWD Upland Game Bird Program Leader. “But with that said, quail populations are likely in their strongest position since 2018-19 and primed to grow if winter and spring conditions are favorable again in 2024.”

Despite the summer heat, bobwhite numbers exceeded expectations as birds took advantage of early season nesting opportunities. Thanks to the weather reprieve during that crucial time, TPWD biologists recorded the most promising population survey results of the last five years.

“Birds were abundant and widely distributed in

South Texas and the Gulf Coast Prairies, indicating that the wet-dry cycle we experienced this year was beneficial along the coast and further inland,” said McLaughlin.

Good numbers were also observed in the Texas Panhandle.

“While bobwhite populations are still recovering in these regions, and drought has threatened progress in the short-term, there should be good opportunities to put dogs on the ground and enjoy a hunt with family and friends this season,” Added McLaughlin.

Further west, the Trans-Pecos continues to be the standard bearer for scaled quail populations in Texas. Building off a good nesting season in 2022, birds picked up where they left off and quickly got to work this year.

“Much like with bobwhites, a combination of cooler temperatures and spring rainfall led to reports of early hatches,” added McLaughlin. “Large broods were seen throughout the spring and into the summer. As habitat conditions improved, birds were able to take advantage and put

chicks on the ground. The only speed bump for scaled quail this year was the summer heat, which settled in and enveloped much of the state through July and August.”

While Texas works its way out of the current drought, the winter outlook favors an ongoing El Nino cycle, which should bring average temperatures and above-average rainfall. If conditions hold, both should equate to good hunting conditions in the near-term and favorable conditions for quail populations heading into next spring.

More information about quail populations in Texas can be found on TPWD’s quail webpage. For county specific outlooks, contact a local TPWD wildlife biologist.

Hunters taking advantage of Texas Public Hunting Lands must have the Annual Public Hunting Permit. It is important for public land hunters to consult the Public Hunting Lands Map Booklet to review regulations that may apply to specific areas. The My Texas Hunt Harvest app can be used to complete on-site registration electronically at a public hunting area.

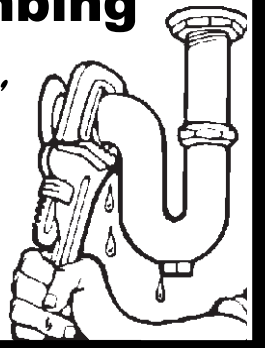

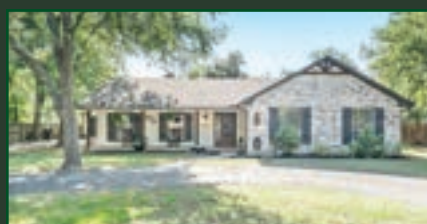

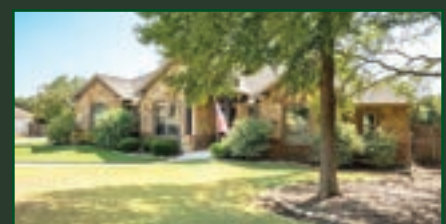
