

Evidentiary hearing set for drilling permits for Mustang Springs

Clearwater Underground Water Conservation District will continue the evidentiary portion of the public hearing for drilling permits for two wells on the Mustang Springs at Salado development. The evidentiary portion will be 1:30 p.m. Feb. 14 in the Sirena Facility of Tenroc Ranch, 5471 Thomas Arnold Road.

All persons designated as a party to the case by the CUWCD Board President Leland Gersbach are to appear at this meeting.

At meetings on Nov. 8 and Dec. 13, Gersbach and the CUWCD Board and legal counsel reviewed more than 60 requests for standing. The majority of requests for standing came from residents of Hidden Springs who have exempt wells in the Edwards Aquifer BFZ, Upper Trinity Aquifer and Middle Trinity Aquifer.

Jaffe Interests LP (Mustangs Springs at Salado) has requested a permit to drill a 4-inch column well pipe with an initial rate of 320-gpm. The proposed annual production of well #1 is 126.3 acre feet per year, or 41,154,981 gallons. It will be drilled 1,100 feet and completed in the Lower Trinity. Well #1 has 12 wells within a half-mile of its proposed location. One well is completed in the Upper Trinity; nine wells are completed in the Middle Trinity and two wells in the Edwards BFZ.

Jaffe Interests LP has requested a drilling permit for Well #2 with a proposed annual production of 123.5 acre feet or 40,242,599 gallons. Well #2 has one well within a half-mile of its proposed location, completed in the Upper Trinity.

"At final build out, we anticipate that the system will have 1,167 living unit equivalents (LUE)," stated Gretchen Miller, Ph.D., P.E., P.G. Sr. Groundwater Engineer with Collier Consulting on behalf of the developer. "These two proposed PWS wells would be intended to support the first three phases of development. PWS Well #1 would support 322 connections for Phases 1 and 2, and PWS Well #2 would support 315 connections for Phase 3. We project a water use rate of 350 gallons per day per connection. We also anticipate a population of 1,911 persons based on these connection numbers."

According to Miller, the development is currently in negotiation with the city of Georgetown to be released from its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) and form its own Public Water Utility.

"When Mustang Springs applies to the District for an Operating Permit, they will need to provide documentation that the city of Georgetown has consented to Mustang Springs service of the area and is no longer within the City's CCN," Miller stated.

"Collier Consulting is in the process of submitting the design and engineering

specifications for the two proposed PWS wells to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for their review and approval," Miller stated.

A CCN must be attained prior to this Board granting any operating permits for the wells," CUWCD General Manger Dirk Aaron stated in his report to the board. "The wells or the wells' design must be approved by TCEQ for public water supply prior to this Board granting any operating permits for the wells."

Mike Keester, RW Harden & Associates, reviewed the application on behalf of CUWCD and determined the anticipated drawdown "will not inhibit the ability of other users to access groundwater from the Lower Trinity. In addition, the proposed production associated with a future operating permit is less than the volume reported as available for permitting. Based on our current understanding of the system, the nearest Lower Trinity well in use is estimated to experience approximately nine feet of draw down from the annual production after one year. Data provided in association with the well completion reports (Rule 6.9.2(1)) will aid the Board's consideration of the anticipated operating permit applications."

In his executive summary, Aaron recommended approval of the drilling permits with the following special permit conditions:

a. The Applicant shall obtain a CCN from the PUC before any groundwater is produced from the wells contemplated by the drilling permits other than water necessary for the completion of the well and for the prescribed aquifer test (Well Completion Report).

- The Applicant must seek and obtain approval from TCEQ of the well design for both public water supply wells contemplated by the Application prior to producing any groundwater from the wells contemplated by the drilling permits.

- The Applicant shall notify the District before any drilling commences on either proposed site.

- The Applicant shall conduct completion on both wells through the Edwards BFZ aquifer in a manner to avoid any karst feature or karst void that could potentially harm the flow path of groundwater in the Outcrop of the Edwards BFZ aquifer. Such completion may involve conductor or surface casing set in a manner to minimize plugging of subsurface karst features.

- To assess actual changes in water levels due to pumping from the proposed wells and regional water level declines, the pump installer shall install a measuring tube alongside the column pipe (as shown on the Applicant's well design) to allow for monthly or continuous measurement system of the water level using an e-line or other direct measurement method as needed by District Staff.

Pre-2022 low interest rates causing many homeowners to be reluctant to sell/move

The Markets

The venerable Standard and Poor's 500 Stock Index (SPX) finally shook off its superstitious fear of flying and soared nearly 1% above its previous record close of 4796.56 set back in January 2022, to end the week at 4839.81, up 1.17%. It is now 21.83% higher than it was a year ago, and up about 26% over the last three years. For those who may have been tempted to bail out during the dog days of October 2022, the SPX has risen over 35% since then. Our other followed market indicator, the CRSP US Mid Cap Value Index, which suggests what the stock market did without the seven high-flying tech companies dominating the SPX, ended the week at 2457.90, down 0.91%. That leaves it 7.1% below its record high of 2645.68 back in January 2022. The takeaway from the action so far this year is that the major market indicators are still primarily reflecting a few large-cap growth stocks. That will bear watching as the year progresses. Unfortunately, it reminds us of the last years of the 1990s when a few dot-com stocks did much the same thing.

The yield on the benchmark U.S. Treasury 10-year note inched up about a fifth of a point from last week's 3.96%, to 4.15%, reflecting increased optimism about potential economic growth this year. Longer-term rates also inched up, as we have been anticipating, while short-term rates maturing in one year or less remained around the 5.5% they have been. West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) joined in anticipation of strong economic demand this year by rising to \$73.71 per barrel from last week's \$72.68. Interestingly, at least to us, has been the relative lack of movement in oil prices in the face of the many headlines about the supposed disruption in the oil supply caused by the Houthi attacks on Red Sea shipping.

The economy of the United States is getting

back to "normal" after four years of first a pandemic-related recession and then a series of reactions to the economic events associated with it. Over the last five months, inflation has come down to an annualized average of just under 2%, or about where the Federal Reserve wants it to be. Unemployment has remained at the same level as it was in 2019, just before the pandemic, at about 3.7%. It is widely expected that when the Commerce Department makes its gross domestic product (GDP) estimate next Thursday, it will show that the American economy grew 2.8% above inflation last year, a figure that is very close to what economists think is the maximum growth rate the U.S. can accommodate. Then, on Friday will come the Federal Reserve's preferred inflation measure, the PCE Index and that is also expected to show that the inflation monster is finally under control, running very near to the Fed's 2% target.

At the same time, some elements are anything but normal. Short-term interest rates remain between 5.25% and 5.50%, abnormally high for a 2% inflation economy. Federal Reserve Board voting members have consistently warned that they have no plans to cut short-term rates soon and have warned that cuts may not come until late in the year. Additionally, housing prices and mortgage rates are both higher than would be expected in an economy like we are seeing, and that is having an effect.

There are at least two major problems in the housing part of the economy. First, the abnormally low interest rates we saw until 2022 resulted in many homeowners locking in mortgage rates that have been well below the inflation rates we have

seen. Low-interest mortgages make homeowners with mortgages very reluctant to sell their homes and that has created a shortage of homes to buy. That supply and demand imbalance has resulted in higher-than-normal home prices. In previous decades, high house prices resulted in a frenzy of home building. The reason we have not seen an avalanche of new homes being built is partly that abnormally low unemployment rate, partly the caution exhibited by both the housing industry and lenders resulting from the housing collapse of 2008-2009, and partly because the skilled labor needed to build houses is in short supply. The result is that the average single-family, previously owned home was priced at \$277,000 in 2019 but is now \$382,600, a 40% increase during a period when general prices rose 20%.

The other different thing is our ranking in the world economy. Before the pandemic, China and Germany seemed to have a corner on economic growth. Both economies were thriving and growing at high rates based on their massive exports of manufactured goods. Today, China has just experienced the lowest GDP growth in 25 years and Germany's economy likely shrank by 0.3% in 2023. China also just reported that for the second year in a row, there were more deaths than births there.

The bottom line in this, the third week of the new year, remains much the same. The U.S. economy is churning along quite well in the face of abundant pessimism while the export-driven economies of Europe and China are in various degrees of distress. It looks to be an interesting year ahead.



He recorded his final mile on Jan. 17, 2024...running through injury, super heat, ice storms, torn shoes, late night home arrivals and early morning school commitments. He says that he hopes sharing this short story inspires other youth athletes to set goals that are even higher.





Total solar eclipse coming to Salado 1:36 p.m. April 8

In Salado on Monday, April 8, 2024, at about 12:19 p.m. (CDT), the sun will begin to disappear. At 1:36 p.m. night will fall over the village, the stars will come out, and a profound sense of awe will be felt by all those who are fortunate enough to experience this rare event. For three minutes and forty-six seconds the moon will almost exactly block the sun from the perspective of any observer in a 120-mile-wide path along a centerline that enters Texas at Piedras Negras at 1:27 p.m., and leaves Texas as it crosses the Red River northwest of Clarksville at 1:49 p.m. As the sun's final edge disappears and again as it begins to emerge from behind the moon there is a chance to see the "diamond ring" effect as the last or first sunlight is channeled between mountains on the moon.

If this is your first total solar eclipse, experienced eclipse chasers recommend that you not attempt to capture it with a picture or a video. Rather, look around

you as well as at the eclipse. It is a moving experience easily missed if you are focused on your phone or camera.

The April 8 eclipse will be the last in the U.S. for this century, so you don't want to miss it, but DO NOT look at the sun during the partial eclipse phase unless you are using certified solar glasses or certified solar filters on a camera or telescope. Old film, regular camera filters, or other non-certified filters will not block out the invisible ultraviolet light that can be the most damaging. If you don't have certified glasses, poke a small hole through a piece of cardboard or aluminum foil and project the sun through it onto a flat surface. Enjoy the experience, but don't permanently damage your eyes while doing so.

Pace Park in Salado will offer unobstructed views of the solar eclipse as well as parking. There are many other places throughout the village that have parking and unobstructed view. Do not just pull over on the side of the road, especially I-35.


