

## Historical Society meets goal to save old Church

The saving and moving of the 1908 Old Salado Church of Christ building to the grounds of the Salado Civic Center could get started as early as this month.

Supporters of the Salado Historical Society learned during a Jan. 27 Gala and Auction that thanks to a donation totaling \$100,000 from the Foster Family Foundation, the group now has enough funds in-hand to move the structure and restore the exterior and interior of the 115-year old church building.

SHS President Bill Kinison told Salado Village Voice this week, that coupling the Foster Family Foundation donation with the \$40,000 raised prior to the auction and the \$23,440 raised during the Gala and Auction, "we think we have enough to move it and restore it. We don't know if we

will have enough to add on the small rooms to the back for storage break room and rest room."

The Historical Society was given permission by the Salado ISD Board of Trustees last year to move and restore the old church building to the grounds of the Civic Center, where it will sit next to the Boles-Aiken cabin, the Denman cabin and the E.M. Hutchens writer's shack that have been relocated there, all projects the Historical Society has undertaken in the last three decades.

The Foster Family Foundation is headed by Morris Foster, a native of Salado and son of the late Wilbur and Jessie Foster. Foster and his sister Lyn Haney grew up in the Salado Church of Christ while it met in the 1908 wood frame building.

Last year, the Foundation committed to a \$50,000 donation, then added another \$10,000 to it. The night of the Gala, it rolled its total

donation up to \$100,000 to save the old building where the Foster kids spent many Sunday mornings.

The Gala was highlighted by the catering of Provecho, a restaurant that opens Feb. 1 at 109 Royal St. Husband and wife team Brooke May and Anuar Ayach will open the restaurant this week. They will continue to operate La Luncheonette restaurant in Belton and their food truck/catering operation Hecho en Queso.

Provecho offered bacon wrapped dates, chimichurri shrimp, Wagyu mushroom burger bites, steak frites on crostini, mini-avocado toast with smoked salmon, ham and gruyere tarts, mini-bean and queso taquitos, charcuterie cups and celebration cake.

The Gala was held at The View at the Creek.

Much of the money raised during the auction, which was gaveled by Bell Co. Commissioner Bobby

Whitson, came on the sale of several folk art stagecoaches, buggies and wagons, all made by Wilbur Foster.

As Wilbur was losing his sight, he continued to make the wooden folk art wagons, cars and buggies to donate to auctions for everything from the Fire Department (for which he built the first truck) to saving the Old Red Schoolhouse on Main to the Salado Chamber of Commerce and more. His wife Jessie would help him manipulate a large lighted magnifying lens so that he could cut, sand and paint the miniature vehicles.

Donated by Carolyn and the late Darwin Britt, the Foster wagons brought in as much as \$1,300 each during the night. Anyone who knew Wilbur or Jessie can easily imagine that they are pleased that those little wagons were donated again and re-sold to raise money to save the church where they raised their family.

## Trustees hire head FB coach

Georgetown Eagles Offensive Coordinator and Associate Head Football Coach Ricky Beaty will be the new Salado Eagles Head Football Coach. Salado ISD Trustees met Jan. 29 and voted unanimously to hire Beaty.

Beaty has taught and coached at Georgetown since 2016. He is the Off-Season and Strength and Conditioning Coordinator, Head Girls Powerlifting Coach, interim Head Track Coach and 7-on-7 coordinator.

While coaching at Georgetown, the Eagles made the playoffs every season with a win percentage over 70%. In 2021-23 seasons, the Eagles have averaged more than 40 points per game and 500 yards per game with a balanced attack of 260 yards on the ground and 240 yards in the air.

Georgetown went 6-5 and 4-2 in 5A-Div. 1 in 2023. In

2022, the Eagles lost in the Region semi-finals to State Finalists College Station, ending their season with a 10-3, 6-1 record.

"Coaches and teachers have a tremendous influence on the lives of young people," Beaty said. "I was able to play under and coach with men that modeled the importance of relationship with our jobs, which led me to this career. Because of this, I believe I have a great plan of action to implement for coaches in our field."

Beaty is a 2007 graduate of Wimberly High School, where he played football. He was a part of the 2005 State Champion team and was named an All-State quarterback in 2006.

He earned a four-year scholarship to Oklahoma State University, where he graduated with a B.A. in social studies education in 2011.

He holds a Masters of Education from Hardin Sim-

mons University in kinesiology, sports and recreation, which he earned in 2013.

His first education job was as a student teacher and assistant coach at Troup ISD in 2011.

He was a graduate assistant at Hardin Simmons in 2012-13 while working on his Master's degree, where he says "I learned to be the hardest working member of a staff that received the least amount of pay. Through this, I was able to learn the value of hard work, which helped provide direction for my future."

In 2013, he became a teacher and the quarterbacks coach at Weatherford High School.

In 2016, he became the varsity wide receivers coach at Georgetown High School. This, he says, "quickly turned in to being my current title of offensive coordinator and associate head coach."

An Open Exchange of Ideas

## Without improvements to transportation technology, infrastructure cannot withstand continued growth

### The Markets

In this last full week of January 2024, the S&P 500 Stock Index (SPX) our prime if flawed indicator of the level of the U.S. stock market, put on quite a show. It closed at a lofty 4890.97, up 1.06% for the week, bringing the year to date rise to 2.54%. That lumbering, venerable index is now just over 20% higher than it was a year ago, 30% higher than it was three years ago and on Thursday of this week, hit a fifth consecutive closing high before slipping back 0.07% to end the week. The other index we follow, the CRSP U.S. Mid-Cap Value index, which tends to give some idea of what is happening in the market if we exclude the “Magnificent 7” super-large cap tech companies that currently drive most of the SPX’s level, rose to 2483.16, up 1.03% for the week, but is still about 6% lower than the record high set in early 2022. It though, is up about 20% in the last three years, and has risen about 40% over the last five.

On the other side of the securities markets, the 10-year U.S. Treasury note ended the week yielding 4.15%, right where it was last week. Short-term Treasuries maturing in less than one year again were the highest yielding with the one-month T-bill paying an annualized rate of 5.54% while the 30-year Treasury bond only offered 4.38%. West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) slipped upward to \$78.23 per barrel, a rise of about 6.6% but well within its recent trading range.

### The Economy

To say the last full week in January was full of major economic news would be to make an historic understatement. The clearest message was and is that the U.S. economy is not behaving like it typically and historically has since World War II. Since that war, and probably before it although we weren’t keeping sufficiently accurate records to be sure, our economy was dominated by the

business cycle and as time went by we got better and better at understanding it. Beginning with the financial crisis of 2008-2009 something changed. Then, post pandemic, it has become obvious that the now highly documented cause and effect relationship that economists have come to assume was as immutable as Newtonian physics has changed dramatically. The U.S. economy is behaving far more like quantum than Newtonian Physics.

The biggest news was that the most widely forecast recession in history didn’t happen in 2023. On Friday, the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) reported that the U.S. economy grew at a 3.3% annualized rate in the fourth quarter. That burst of growth raised Real GDP growth to 2.5% for the year. Yes, I know that many news sources announced and continue to proclaim that the year’s real growth was 3.1%, but they are wrong. We receive the official notification from the BEA, and on the second page of that notice, it states, under, “GDP for 2023,” “Real GDP increased 2.5 percent in 2023...” Still, considering that virtually all forecasts (except ours) called for a recession, that is an impressive number. Note here that our infrastructure simply will not support ongoing growth at that rate. Best estimates are that we can only average around 1.7% per year barring some major changes in transportation technology.

Then the second shoe dropped as the BEA released its Personal Income and Outlays report for December 2023. Personal Income increased \$60 billion, 0.3%, or about 3.6% annualized, as did disposable personal income, while personal consumption expenditures increased \$133.9 billion, 0.7%. Despite that

significant increase in consumer spending, the PCE Price Index (PCI), the inflation measure favored by the Federal Reserve, only rose 0.2% for the month and 2.6% for 2023. Over the past five months, real inflation, as measured by the PCI, has averaged 0.18%, which when annualized comes to 2.18%. Considering the Federal Reserve has set a target inflation rate of 2% per year, it appears we are very close. On top of those numbers, it appears that we are also managing to save about 4% of our income. For reference, just before the pandemic, American’s average saving rates were negative numbers, meaning that consumers were spending more than they were making.

All of those numbers are wonderful, but they reflect what happened last month, and the past is definitely not the future. On Wednesday though, S&P Global released its Flash US Composite PMI (Purchasing Managers’ Index) giving us a glimpse of the future. The U.S. Composite PMI, a report on which way purchasing managers see business going over the next six months or so, rose to 52.3, a 7-month high, from last month’s 50.9 on a scale where numbers above 50 indicate expansion and below indicates contraction ahead. The increase was primarily in service providers.

Once more, the U.S. economy presents itself as robust, healthy, and growing at a probably unsustainable rate. More, we see no indications of a major slowdown. We do think the growth rate will moderate in 2024 simply because it must. We only have so much capacity on our highways, railroads, and airlines and we are nearing full utilization, but, for the moment, it just doesn’t get much better than this.

## I still believe in the late Norman Lear’s America

Today I’m grieving the loss of my friend Norman Lear.

Like millions of other TV viewers, I watched the Emmy Awards on January 15. The show honored Norman, who died late last year, as the Hollywood legend that he was. He was also the most deeply principled and decent human I ever met.

Ours was an “odd couple” friendship: a Jewish man in his 102nd year and a Black millennial. We came together through the organization Norman founded 40 years ago, People For the American Way, which I now lead.

Putting his career on hold to start a social justice nonprofit was as unconventional for a major Hollywood player then as it would be now. But Norman did it because his vision of America was under assault by a surging far-right wing.

Norman’s America is a place where a child of the Depression — whose father went to prison and who saw the worst of humanity while fighting Nazis in World War II — can hang onto a boundless optimism. Norman always had faith in people to grow and change.

Norman’s America is a place where our differences are interesting, but not as important as our common humanity. I remember how he believed that differences are fair game for debate — and definitely for humor. But they’re less important than what we share.

Norman’s America is about forward motion — he was known for saying of a project or a phase of life, “this is over, what’s next?” His America is a place where the promise of the next generation is nurtured by the ones before it — where the experience of elders isn’t jealously guarded but generously shared.

Norman’s America is a place where patriotism isn’t a word we shy away from because it’s been hijacked by authoritarians. “I am a patriot,” he wrote on his 99th birthday, “and I will not surrender that word to those who play to our worst impulses rather than our highest ideals.”

He unabashedly named our organization after the “American Way,” because it drove home his belief that our multiracial, multigenerational, multifaceted progressive values are the product of American history and the hope for its future.

To those who know of Norman only through his TV shows, his vision of America as a place where people ultimately will band together to do the right thing still comes through. Even in the 1970s, the most cynical of decades, Norman’s ethos was anti-cynicism. If his most famous curmudgeon, Archie Bunker, began an episode with an especially wrongheaded conviction, its grip was usually loosened by show’s end. The shows are good-hearted, not mean-spirited, even when tackling serious social problems.

This was the man himself. Before Norman passed, we worked together on an op-ed that started with the question: “What do a Jewish centenarian and Black millennial have in common?” We knew that one of those things was the fact that some people in our country didn’t see us as “true” Americans. Norman reinforced my faith in what was more important: love of country and gratitude for opportunities to make a difference.

Many feelings are familiar in grief: sorrow, and sympathy for family. I also feel something a little more unusual. When a young person passes, we feel outrage at the loss of their potential. It’s less common to say that about a centenarian, but with Norman it’s true. He still had so many irons in the fire, so much potential.

It would have been put to good use against challenges we have today: increasing political division, rising authoritarianism, religious bigotry. It’s on all of us who loved this man and his vision of America to take up the mantle now.

Yes, I still believe in Norman Lear’s America.

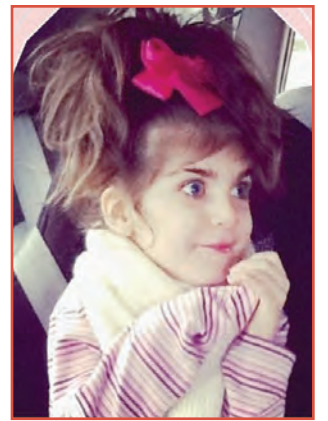

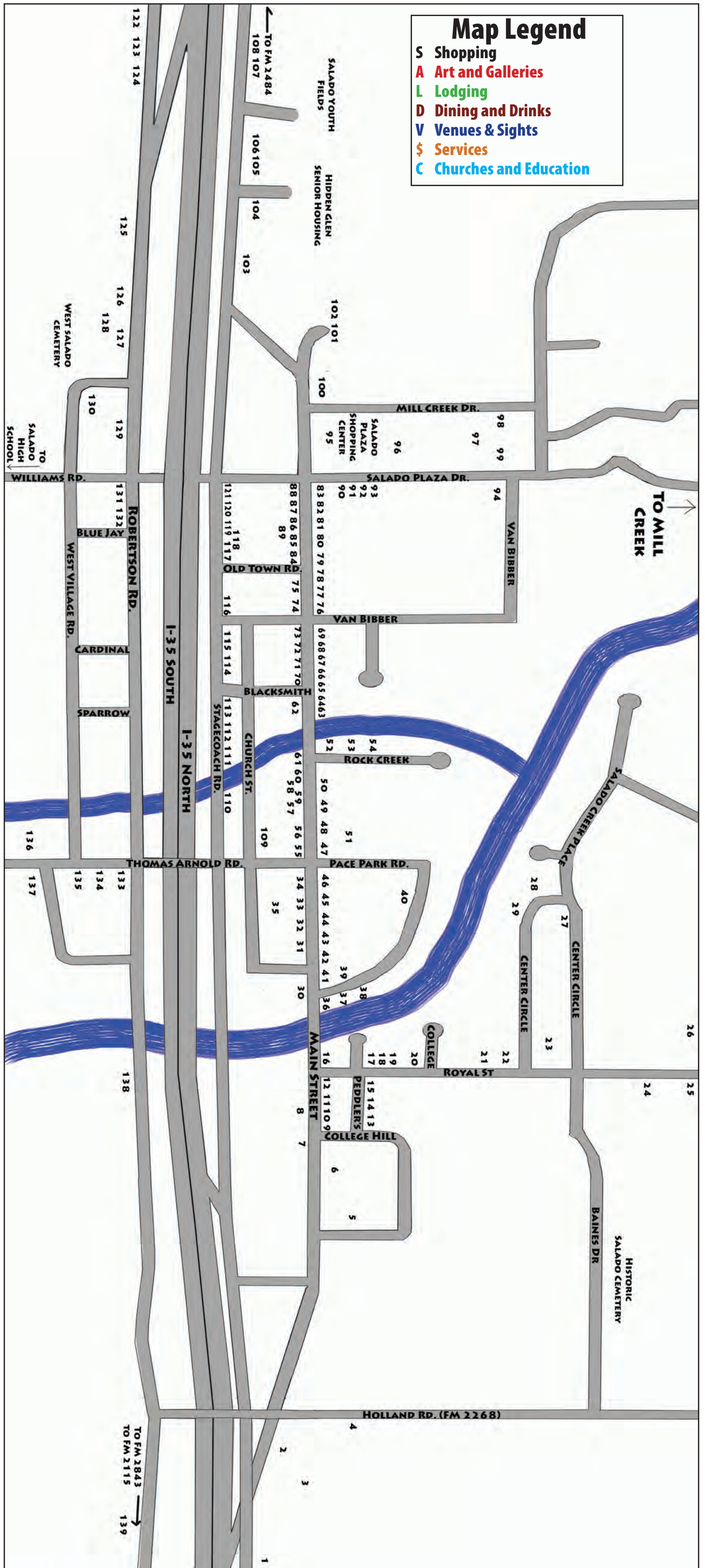
