### Village petitions to join Lone Star Water Authority

The Village of Salado has petitioned for membership in the Lone Star Regional Water Authority (LSRWA) after aldermen voted unanimously March 7 for the petition following a two-hour executive session in which aldermen discussed several items with legal counsel.

Village administrator Manny De La Rosa will be the Village representative to the LSRWA, which was created by the 82nd Texas Legislature. Current member entities, according to the 2021 Brazos G Regional Water Plan, are Sonterra Municipal Utility District (MUD), City of Jarrell and Williamson County.

LSRWA has contracted with the Brazos River Authority for 11,760 acre feet/year (10.5 million gallons per day or MGD). The East Williamson County Water Supply Project, according to the Regional Water Plan, is a transmission system to convey treated water from the BRA East Williamson County Regional Water System water treatment plant at Lake Granger. It utilizes current supplies and new supplies that may be delivered at Lake Granger. The proposed transmission system will connect to the existing delivery pipeline near Circleville and deliver supplies northwest to Jarrell.

The water treatment plant was expanded from 5.5 MGD to 13.5 MGD. Customers currently served through this system include Taylor, Hutto, Thrall, Noack Water Supply Corporation and Jonah Special Utility District.

The Granger WTP could be supplemented by the groundwater from Williamson and Milam counties. The total cost of the project is estimated at \$30.26 million.

#### OTHER BUSINESS

Aldermen met for two hours in executive session to discuss several items in addition to the LSRWA petition:

- Deliberate on service and assessment plans for the Sanctuary East PID. Salado Board of Aldermen will conduct a public hearing 6:30 p.m. April 4 on the establishment of an assessment plan for the Sanctuary East Public Improvement District. The board approved a proposed assessment plan of 30 years with an assessment tax rate of \$0.50 per \$100 valuation at its March 7 board meeting on a motion by Rodney Bell and second by Paul Cox with all aldermen except Jason Howard voting in favor.

- Deliberate on economic development negotiations with Stagecoach 1943, LLC. This item was tabled until aldermen meet with the de-

veloper to review finance numbers. Motion by Bert Henry and second by Jasen Graham, unanimous.

- Deliberate on economic development negotiations with Mustang Springs Utility, LLC. A motion by Graham and second by Henry to enter into negotiations to be brought back to the board at a later passed unanimously.

#### BUSINESS AGENDA

Aldermen discussed and approved several items in the regular business agenda March 7.

- Authorized surplus items to be sold at auction.

- Appointed Christie R. Hurst, RN as alternate representative on the Bell County Public Health District Board of Directors.

- Approved memorandum of agreement for the Centex Sustainable Community Partnership, expiring July 15, 2034. Other community members working with U.S. Army Garrison Fort Cavazos include Killeen, Gatesville, Harker Heights, Nolanville, Belton, Copperas Cove and Lampasas.

- Approved Sustainability Proclamation proclaiming April 2024 as Sustainable Environment Month.

- Approved professional services agreement with Bureau Veritas North America, Inc. for plan review and inspection services.

- Approved \$37,815 change order with Royal Vista, Inc. for additional drainage work.

- Approved paying off a \$9,064.99 balance for a 2020 Chevrolet PPV Tahoe for the Salado police department.

- Approved a three-way stop sign at the intersection of Smith Bluff Rd. and Smith Bluff Way along with rumble strips leading to the stop signs and posting speed limit signs on Smith Bluff Rd. Aldermen mulled a petition from residents along Smith Bluff Rd. to install speed humps or bumps to control speeding.

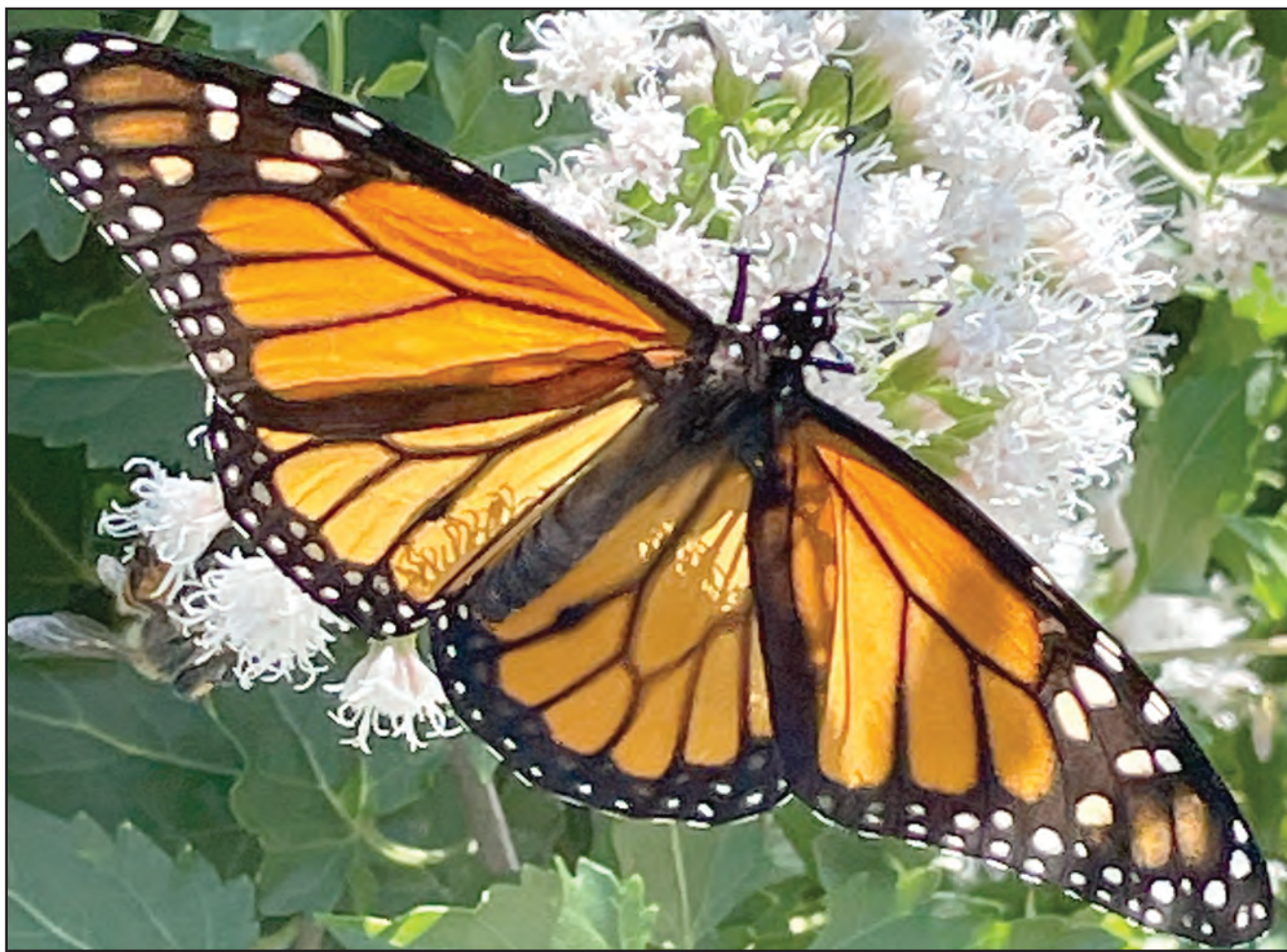
- Removed former village administrator Don Ferguson from banking accounts.

- Approved resolution authorizing village administrator Manny De La Rosa and village accountant Kristi Stegall as representatives of the Village Texpool investment services accounts.

Village administrator Manny De La Rosa told aldermen that work on the All Abilities Playground has been completed.

Police chief Allen Fields reported that the Salado police made three arrests in February, responded to 23 calls for services and made 18 supplemental reports.

Tourism marketing manager April Walker-Davis reported that the visitsaladotx app and website had 190 unique sessions with 169 total users including 59 new users.

### Monarch population down 59% as butterfly begins return north

The World Wildlife Federation recently reported that “New data detailing the abundance of the eastern monarch butterfly colonies wintering in central Mexico’s forests estimate that the species occupied only 2.2 acres during the 2023-2024 winter season—59% less than the previous year when scientists observed 5.5 acres. The annual survey is undertaken by WWF and its partners, including The National Commission of Protected Natural Areas in Mexico and the WWF-TELMEX Telcel Foundation Alliance, and is considered a benchmark for

the overall abundance of the species.

“Scientists believe that climatic variations in the monarch’s breeding areas in Canada and the United States gave rise to high temperatures and drought, which reduced the abundance of milkweed, the only plant in which the butterflies lay their eggs,” according to the WWF Report. “Land-use changes in the United States, combined with the widespread use of herbicides, also contributed to the loss of milkweed and other nectar plants essential to feeding adult monarchs.”

“Fewer monarchs hibernating in their traditional forest habitat in Mexico greatly concerns all of us.

It’s critical that all communities, governments, non-governmental organizations, scientists, and others continue to strengthen our conservation and protection efforts to support the monarch’s unique migration,” said Jorge Rickards, general director of WWF Mexico. “This is not the first time we’ve observed changes in the locations of the largest monarch colonies. It’s telling us that we need to intensify conservation and restoration measures not only in the Monarch Butterfly Biosphere Reserve, but also outside of it.”

The monarch is best known for its amazing migration of up to 2600 miles, navigating by unknown

means to a place where none of the individual butterflies have ever been. How do they know where to go? How do they navigate? Scientists are working on it, but, as yet, there is no definite answer. It is truly one of the most amazing migrations of any creature on earth!

In the fall, the remarkable monarch, which weigh about a half of a gram, migrate through Texas to their overwintering sites in the transvolcanic mountains in the state of Michoacan in central Mexico, about 100 miles west of Mexico City. Monarchs don’t tolerate freezing weather so they must migrate to a warmer climate

### Bell, Salado show dip in sales tax

Bell County showed a decrease in sales tax revenues compared to the previous year. The Village of Salado showed a 0.57% decrease in the March sales tax checks compared to March 2023. Six cities in Bell County showed decreases this month.

Village of Salado received \$56,048.39 compared to \$56,371.40 in March 2023. For the year, the Village has received \$232,363.81, which is 6.42% more than the \$218,345.67 paid through March 2023.

The Village is one of three Bell County cities to

levy a 1-cent sales tax, while seven other Bell County cities levy a 1.5 cent sales tax and Rogers levies a 1.25 cent sales tax.

The Salado Public Library District and Bell County each levy a half-cent sales tax.

For that half-cent tax, Salado Public Library District received a \$47,645.17 March check, which was 1.98% more than last March’s payment of \$46,718.15. For the year, the Library District has received \$186,224.88, which is 8.22% more than the \$172,065.74 paid through March 2023.

Bell County received \$2.26 million in March, which is 6.14% less than what was paid in March 2023. For the year, Bell County has received \$8.34 million, which is 1.71% less than the \$8.49 million paid through March 2023.

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced March 6 that he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose districts \$980.9 million in local sales tax allocations for March, 2.2 percent less than in March 2023.

These allocations are based on sales made in Janu-

ary by businesses that report tax monthly.

The comptroller sent rebates totaling \$622.3 million to Texas Cities, an increase of 1.7% over last March.

The comptroller sent \$202.1 million to transit systems for March, an increase of 6.3% over March 2023.

Counties received \$63.7 million in sales tax rebate checks, an increase of 2.5% over March 2023.

Special purpose districts received \$92.8 million in sales tax rebate checks for March, 2.2% more than last year.

# U.S. economy adds 275,000 jobs in February

## The Markets

Our dear old S&P 500 Stock Index (SPX) in its role as the marker for the U.S. stock market, took a breather this week, falling 0.26% to a still, to us, astonishing level of 5123.69.

That small retreat leaves the SPX up 7.42% so far this year, up about 31% from this time last year, and 32.21% higher than it was three years ago. Once more we are reminded that nearly all the growth in the SPX for the last three years occurred in the last 12 months. Our other followed index, the CRSP U.S. Mid-Cap Value Index rose 1.55% for the week to 2613.96, putting it 3.94% higher this year, nearly 12% higher than this time last year and up 14.45% from three years ago.

The U.S. Treasury 10-year note finished the work week yielding 4.09%, about 2.4% lower than last week, but about

5.4% higher this year. The highest yields continued to be found in the shortest maturities at about 5.5% while the 30-year bond was paying only 4.26%. West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) slipped a bit to \$77.90 per barrel, about 2.6% lower than last week, but still up 8.7% this year.

### The Economy

For those without long memories, it might be good to look back a year to when there was a near-universal prediction of a major recession that would hit the American economy in the third or fourth quarter of 2023. Instead, both

productivity and production took off like a Space X rocket. The pundits and many politicians then warned that the recession would hit late in the year. When again the economy ignored them, they called for the recession to devastate our economy early in 2024. We looked around at the real world as well as at the economic data from across the country and never saw any sign of a coming recession.

The Federal Reserve's Beige Book is one of the most accurate and respected reports about the state of the U.S. economy. In the latest version released on Wednesday, the lead

sentences announced that 2024 began with continued economic growth, employment growth, and relatively low inflation. On Thursday, the Labor Department's U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) produced their revised fourth quarter Productivity and Costs analysis. The lead line in that report announced that nonfarm business sector labor productivity was increasing at an annual rate of 3.2%. It noted that compensation rose too, but only a fraction as much as production. The report also noted that there was a slowing in the manufacturing side of the economy and an acceleration in the services sector. It went on to provide a third estimate of productivity growth in the third quarter, revising it to 4.7%.

For the record, those numbers are phenomenal. Long-term average productivity gains in the United States have been running around 1.3% per year. Oddly, productivity gains tend to come in economic downturns as companies learn to produce more goods and services

with fewer workers and have cut expenses. This time around though, the productivity gains surged even as our GDP grew at an exceptionally high rate.

Of course, there remain those who are proclaiming that the impressive growth in production, productivity, and wages is a temporary blip contrived by the government and we are actually in a slump. Unfortunately for them, the ISM Nonmanufacturing Index, produced by the non-governmental Institute for Supply Management came out this week as well. Remembering that most of our economy is "nonmanufacturing", it is very significant to read that the Index is now at 52.6 on a scale where numbers above 50 signify expansion (growth) and below 50, contraction. New orders and business activity grew at a faster pace than in January. The business activity score, a key element, was reported at 57.2 while new orders, generally an excellent predictor of the economy's direction over the next six

months or so, came in at 56.2. The only metric that appeared to be contracting was inventories, and that is a good sign, suggesting better growth in the future.

Confirming those numbers, the BLS then reported on Friday that the U.S. economy added a net 275,000 jobs in February, considerably more than the 198,000 that generally were forecast, even as wage growth cooled down to a sustainable level. It also reported that unemployment rose to 3.9% as a rush of new workers, composed primarily of women and young people entered the jobs market.

Once again, the bottom line is that unlike most of the rest of the world, the U.S. economy is robust and healthily growing at an amazing rate. Europe continues to have higher inflation combined with an economy at or in recession while the Chinese economy continues to look stressed. While we debate on how to slow things down, the rest of the world is trying to get things going again. This is not a bad place to be.

## We need a Marshall Plan for public media

America's media institutions have had a terrible, horrible, no good, very bad start to 2024.

The Messenger, a well-funded, high-profile news site, dissolved after less than a year. Big newspapers from the Los Angeles Times to the IndyStar saw major layoffs. And Sports Illustrated fell into licensing limbo while sites like BuzzFeed, Vice News, or Complex found themselves at best on life support.

The over 500 media jobs eliminated so far this year reflect a broader, worrying trend. By this year's end, according to one recent estimate, America will have lost one third of all its newspapers — and two-thirds of all its newspaper staff — since 2005.

The losses have been particularly acute in poor and rural communities, leaving ever expanding news deserts all across the nation.

The collapse of news outlets, especially local papers, is robbing our communities of indispensable watch dogs. The disappearance of reporters from city council meetings and public safety hearings is creating oversight vacuums that leave citizens in the dark and enable shady dealings that let the wealthy exercise undue — and undetected — influence.

How did a country once chock-full of influential newspapers morph into a land of news deserts?

One major factor, says University of Pennsylvania media studies scholar Victor Pickard, has been the

disintegration of the advertising model. In short, search engines and social media sites are eating up revenue that once went to local papers.

Hence the rise of paywalls everywhere as more outlets resort to subscriptions. That works well for some, but subscriptions haven't been enough to replace ad funding in most cases — especially for larger publications or those that serve less wealthy audiences.

Other outlets have counted on the benevolence of billionaire buyers. But that creates real concerns about the influence of exorbitantly wealthy owners — who have been increasingly unwilling to foot the bill for quality journalism.

The Washington Post — owned by Jeff Bezos, who recently became the richest man alive again — offered buyouts to 240 employees this past fall. And Los Angeles Times owner Patrick Soon-Shiong's net worth of nearly \$6 billion didn't save the jobs of the 115 workers the paper laid off this January.

Is there an alternative to for-profit journalism? To be sure, we've seen some exciting developments in nonprofit and worker-owned journalism. But these proposals remain limited in scope.

Given all this, some experts are calling for a fundamental rethinking of how we value journalism.

"The information produced by journalism should always be — and should have always been — treated as a public good," Victor Pickard told me. "And that, by its very

nature, is not something that's easily monetized."

Good reporting simply takes more resources to produce than it can easily recoup in digital ad dollars or fundraising. The answer? A real commitment to public media funding.

The United States does, of course, invest some money in public media.

Last year Congress allocated \$535 million to the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, the private nonprofit corporation tasked with investing in public radio and television. And some promising experiments are taking place at the state level, with California, New Mexico, and Washington devoting public tax dollars for local news coverage.

But that funding is a drop in the bucket compared to what's needed.

A 2022 study comparing funding globally found the U.S. spends just \$3.16 per capita on public media, compared to \$142.42 per person in Germany and \$110.73 in Norway. Spending as much on journalism as the United Kingdom does on the BBC would mean \$35 billion a year going to sustaining coverage.

We need, as The Nation's John Nichols recently argued, a "Marshall Plan" for journalism — a robust new era of public funding. Our democracy deserves better than to rely on ad dollars that are rapidly drying up.

to survive. At an altitude of 10,000 to 12,000 feet, the monarchs cluster in oyamel fir trees for warmth. They have fat stores which they utilize during their 4 month dormancy.

Toward the end of February, they become active, looking for water and looking for mates. After mating, they will stream out of the mountains and head north toward Texas looking for milkweed.

There are over a 100 species of milkweed in the Americas. The predominant milkweed in the central fly-way of Texas is antelope horns (Asclepius asperula). Hierba de Zizotes (A. oenotheroides) and green milkweed (A. viridis) are also found.

Spring migrating monarchs arrive in Texas during the last days of March. The

females will lay their eggs only on milkweed. The eggs will hatch and small caterpillars will emerge. Monarch larvae are "eating machines" and will devour enough milkweed to grow 2,000 times in weight. The monarch caterpillar will leave the milkweed plant to pupate, forming a pupa or chrysalis. It takes about a month from the time the egg is laid to the time the adult butterfly emerges or ecloses from the chrysalis. Monarchs that are "born" in Texas will live about a month. They will mate and lay eggs as they continue the spring migration northward. It usually takes two generations to reach the upper Midwest and Lower Canada.

What can we do to help the monarch?

We can create a Mon-

arch Waystation, using the information found at the Monarch Watch website (www.monarchwatch.org).

"To offset the loss of milkweeds and nectar sources we need to create, conserve, and protect milkweed/monarch habitats. We need you to help us and help monarchs by creating 'Monarch Waystations' (monarch habitats) in home gardens, at schools, businesses, parks, zoos, nature centers, along roadsides, and on other unused plots of land. Without a major effort to restore milkweeds to as many locations as possible, the monarch population is certain to decline to extremely low levels." Simply put; monarchs need milkweed and nectar plants for survival.

## Salado Historical Society opens cabins for Wildflower Arts & Crafts

The 24th Annual Wildflower Arts & Crafts Festival is hosted by The Salado Chamber of Commerce. During the event, The Salado Historical Society will open the doors of the circa 1850 Boles-Aiken Log Cabin and the 1867 Denman Cabin. This special event is scheduled March 23-24 at the Salado Civic Center at 601 North Main Street. The festival celebrates artistic creativity while ushering in the spring season.

Everyone will have the opportunity to explore the Boles-Aiken Log Cabin,

meticulously reconstructed and restored to its original 1850 configuration in 1991. This historical cabin was discovered hidden in the walls of an old home on Center Circle Road in Salado, Texas. The restoration team, guided by the Texas Historical Commission's directives, included Charles Abbott, Lonnie Edwards, James Poppell, Bob Stewart, Jose Barraza, Don Holmway, and Steve Wesson.

The Denman Cabin, built in 1867 by Moses H. Denman in Sparta, Texas, has its own fascinating journey.

Having been relocated to Belton in 1950, then to Troy after 1977, then in front of The Barton House in 1982. The cabin found its permanent home in 1996 behind the Civic Center in Salado after being donated to The Salado Historical Society.

Both cabins, located side by side, offer a glimpse into the rich history of Salado. Soon, the Salado Historical Society plans to move the 1908 Old Church Place next to these cabins, creating a historical enclave for the community.

The Salado Historical

Society invites everyone to step into history as they explore the Boles-Aiken Log Cabin and the Denman Cabin during the 24th Wildflower Arts & Crafts Festival. The festival hours are 10 a.m.-5 p.m. March 23, and 10 a.m.-4 p.m. March 24.

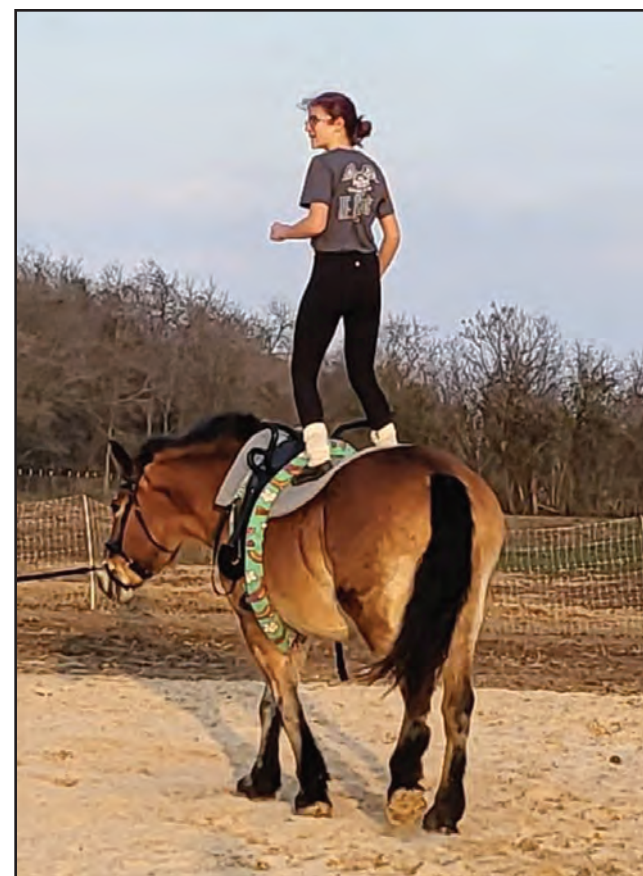

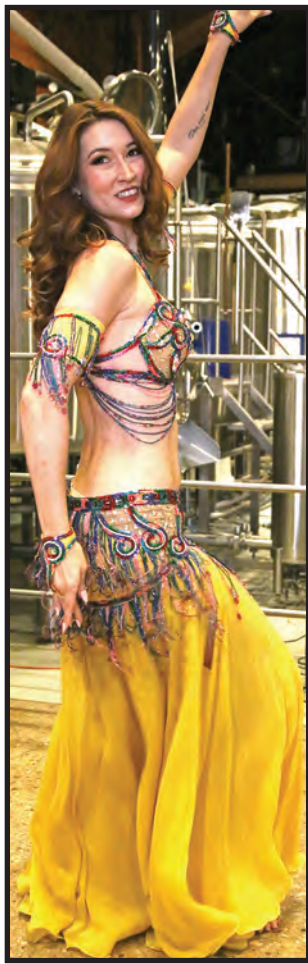

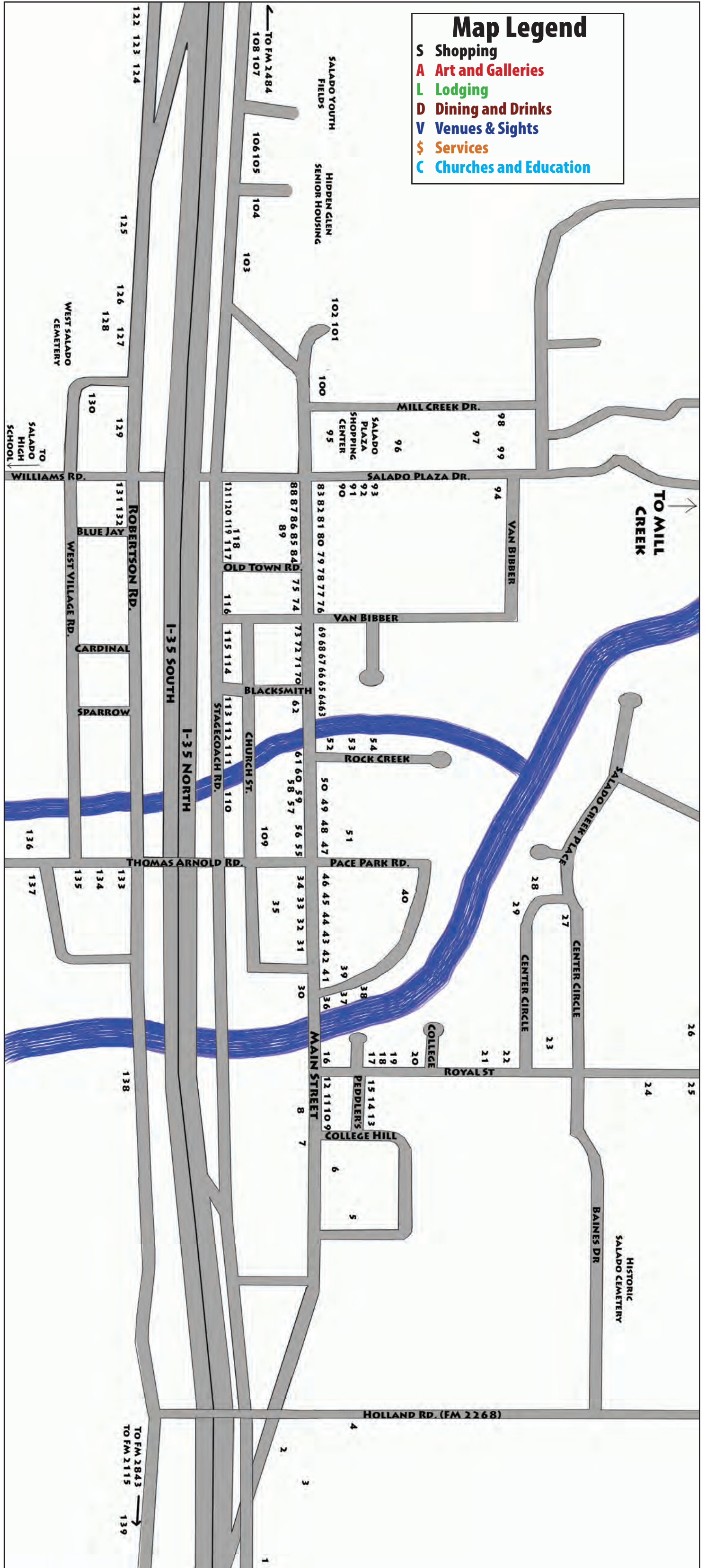
