Salado police investigate burglary of local business

On April 28 at approximately 11:30 a.m., Salado Police Department was dispatched to Salado Creek Antiques, located at 511 North Stagecoach Road, Salado, Texas 76571 in reference to a burglary of a building.

Upon arrival, officers observed signs of forced entry into the business.

Contact was made with Charles Gantenbein, Salado Creek Antiques, who identified various items missing, including sterling silver jewelry and several knives.

The scene was photographed and processed for latent evidence.

No suspects have been identified at this time.

This case remains open, and the investigation continues.

The offense occurred between 5:30 p.m. April 27 and 11:30 a.m. April 28.

Applicable statute: Texas Penal Code 30.02 (a)(1):

(a) A person commits an offense if, without the effective consent of the owner, the person:

(1) enters a habitation, or a building (or any portion of a building) not then open to the public, with intent to commit a felony, theft, or an assault.

An offense under this section is a State Jail Felony.

Salado leads County in May sales tax rebates

The Village of Salado leads all 11 Bell County cities for its 14.92% increase in sales tax rebates for May 2024.

The Village of Salado will receive \$86,270.85, an increase of 14.92% compared to last May's payment of \$75,064.41. For the year, The Village is running 7.62% over year-to-date payments in 2023: \$373,317.12 compared to \$346, 876.77 through May 2023.

Bell County showed a decrease in sales tax revenues compared to the previous year. The County's May payment is \$2.94 million, compared to \$3.07 million last May. Five Bell County cities showed decreases in their May payments: Belton, Harker Heights, Holland, Killeen, and Temple.

The Village of Salado is one of three Bell County cities to levy a 1-cent sales tax, while seven other Bell County cities levy a 1.5 cent sales tax and Rogers levies a 1.25 cent sales tax.

The Salado Public Library District and Bell County each levy a half-cent sales tax. For that half-cent tax, Salado Public Library District received a \$65,743.88 May check, which was 7.03% more than last May's payment of \$61,422.97. For the year, the Library District has received \$302,005.65, which is 7.56% more than the \$280,760.41 paid through May 2023.

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced May 8 he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose districts \$1.2 billion in local sales tax allocations for May, 0.4 percent more than in May 2023.

The comptroller sent rebates totaling \$788.7 million to Texas Cities, an increase of 0.3% over last May.

The comptroller sent \$258.7 million to transit systems for May, an increase of 1.1% over May 2023. Counties received \$74.2 million in sales tax rebate checks, an increase of 2.6% over May 2023.

Moody's Analytics: Strong Economy, Healthy Credit

The Markets

Our dear old (and I do mean old) primary stock market indicator, the venerable S&P 500 Index (SPX), coasted benignly through the week that ended on May 10, with barely a ruffled moment other than a so-far unexplained, jump upward followed almost immediately by a return to trend moment on Friday morning. For the week it rose 1.85%, to close at the auspicious number of 5222.68. The SPX is now up about 9.5% this year and is about 26% higher than it was a year ago but is only about 25% higher than it was three years ago. Our other, more mundane, and far less exciting market indicator, the CRSP US Mid Cap Value Index finished the week at 2662.78, up 2.44% this week, 6.22% this year, and about 17% higher than it was three years ago.

On the other side of the market, where debt is king, the benchmark 10-year U.S. Treasury note finished the week yielding a nice even 4.5%. As it has for the last year, the Treasury yield curve remains seriously inverted with the one-month T-bill boasting an annualized yield of 5.51% even as a 30-year Treasury bond only pays 4.64%. As has become normal, the 10-year note sports the lowest interest rate of all the maturities. It is certainly a strange world in the bond markets. The price per barrel of West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) bobbed (or bubbled) along all week rising a mere 0.46% to \$78.35 as the U.S. Market week came to an end.

The Economy

Moody's Analytics summed up the state of the American economy quite neatly this week in a

headline, "Strong Economy, Healthy Credit." In the report, Moody's noted that the total consumer debt and delinquency rate remains in the "green zone" with consumer delinquencies well below the pre-pandemic level and mortgage delinquencies hovering around an historic low, despite credit card balances being at an all-time high. One of the most reliable indicators of an economy headed for trouble is just that number. Before every major economic recession in the past half century, consumer and mortgage delinquencies rose quickly. There have been instances where delinquencies rose and no recession followed, but in our consumer driven economy, stressed consumers are the normal proximate cause of a recession. So far, at least, the coast appears clear.

It is one thing to read the many reports issued by the Departments of Labor and Commerce, as well as the Census Bureau, but the indicator of how well or poorly things are going that is perhaps most relevant is corporate earnings (profits). Most publicly traded U.S. companies have now reported on their financial situation in the first quarter of 2024, so it is time to take stock of what really happened. Earnings per share for companies in the S&P 500 now appear to be 5.2% higher than they were a year ago instead of the 3.4% forecast by Wall Street analysts. Interestingly, the consensus among those analysts is now that in the second quarter, earnings per share will have

risen 9.8% from a year previous. Those growing companies are also reporting that they are still in hiring mode and have no plans to retrench. Once more, even as the pundits sound the warning of an eminent recession, we are having a very hard time finding any indicators that support their claims.

What we are seeing instead of the widely forecast recession is a moderation of economic growth, hopefully back down to a more sustainable level. We recently drove from Central Texas to North Carolina and back, and the limitation holding our economy back to realistic levels was obvious. There is simply no room to put more trucks on the highways. Rail transport seems very much the same. Moody's is now forecasting a 2.5% US GDP growth rate for 2024. If we get that, it will be a healthy rate of growth and about as fast as our economy can consistently grow.

Meanwhile, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics U.S. worker productivity, that wonderful thing that allows us to grow our economy without needing more workers and without undue inflation, grew 0.3% in the first quarter as economic output rose 1.3% and hours worked rose only 1%.

Once more, our report is that the U.S. economy is in amazingly marvelous shape with no signs of bad times ahead. All growth periods do come to an end, but this one appears to still be young and full of vigor.

Girl Scouts of Central Texas cut ribbon on Bluebonnet Shores

Girl Scouts of Central Texas recently held a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the newly renamed Bluebonnet Shores Girl Scout Camp, formerly known as Camp Kachina.

"The renaming of our cherished camp reflects our deep commitment to empowering girls in Central Texas and fostering their love for outdoor adventures. Bluebonnet Shores Girl Scout Camp will continue to serve as a haven for girls to explore, learn, and grow into confident leaders of tomorrow," said Paula Bookidis, Girl Scouts of Central Texas CEO.

"Camping has been a Girl Scout tradition since our beginnings. The first troop of Girl Scouts in Central Texas was formed in 1921, and those Girl Scouts began camping their first summer, sleeping in tents and cooking over fires," Bookidis said. "In 1957, the Bluebonnet Girl Scout Council purchased 248 acres here on the shores of Lake Belton. Proceeds from local Girl Scouts' first official council-wide Girl Scout Cookie Program funded the first buildings on the property. Taking advantage of the lake access, Temple Girl Scouts organized the first Senior Mariner Scout Troop in the area the same year."

The camp opened in 1960 with 62 campers. The summer camp program in its early years included swimming, canoeing, and hiking, with Girl Scouts studying

weather forecasting, astronomy, lashing, outdoor cooking, and soil conservation. Since then, 20,000-30,000 Girls Scout have attended summer camp there.

"Over the last two years, Girl Scouts of Central Texas underwent a study of the Camp Kachina name, seeking to better understand its origin, along with an assessment of our naming by the indigenous people of the Comanche people, to whom the Kachina name was attributed in The Legend of the Bluebonnet, and the Hopi people, for whom the Kachina Doll tradition is best known," she said. "Based on their

assessments, along with that of our youth members who told us we should be respectful of different cultures, we underwent a camp name change process for this camp."

"As in our history, we invited our members to participate in re-naming our camp, both by nominating new names for consideration and voting on the submissions. The submissions presented a clear theme," she said. "Thirty-three percent of name nominations included "Bluebonnet," which is both the Texas state flower and commemorates the original Bluebonnet Girl Scout Council that

founded the camp. Following a final round of voting from our membership, we are excited to formally dedicate this camp with its new official name: Bluebonnet Shores Girl Scout Camp. We look forward to hosting Girl Scouts and our broader community here at Bluebonnet Shores for decades to come."


BCHC to award grants May 20

BCHC awards one-time grants for historical projects in Bell County. The three recipients of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Grants are: The Bartlett Activities Center - \$3,500 for maintenance to Tar and Gravel Roof of 1909 Bartlett Grammar School, Dyess Family Cemetery Association - \$1,000 for 2024 Headstone Re-leveling Project, and Temple Public Library Archives Division - 1,200 for Bell County Rail Digitization Part 1. These grants cover the time period of Oct. 1, 2023-Sept. 30, 2024.

Opening lead — nine of diamonds.

Declarer starts the play of many hands without knowing whether or not he'll make the contract. The outcome might depend strictly on how the defenders' cards are divided, or on how skillfully he or the opponents play their cards.

Take this case where West leads a diamond against four hearts. East wins with the jack and continues with the A-K, declarer ruffing the king.

At this point, South does not know how he will fare. If the missing trumps are divided 2-2, he is sure to make the contract, as his only remaining loser will be a spade. But if the trumps break 3-1, the contract must apparently go down one.

At trick four, declarer leads a heart to the ace and returns a heart to the king. When East shows out on the second heart, the contract appears doomed.

But if South comes from the school that does not concede defeat easily, he tries to picture a distribution of the opposing cards that would allow him to make the contract despite the disappointing trump division. And, if he thinks hard enough, he finds there is still a reasonable chance to get home safely.

He begins by cashing the A-K-J of clubs, discarding a spade from dummy. He then cashes the K-A of spades and exits with a trump, praying that West started with no more than two spades.

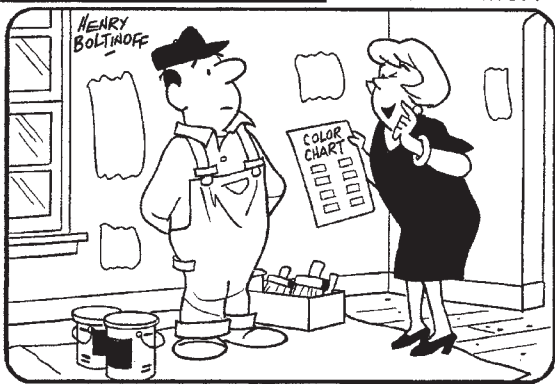
On this occasion, declarer's prayers are answered. West wins the trump but is forced to return a diamond or a club, allowing South to ruff in dummy and discard a spade from his hand, and the contract is home.

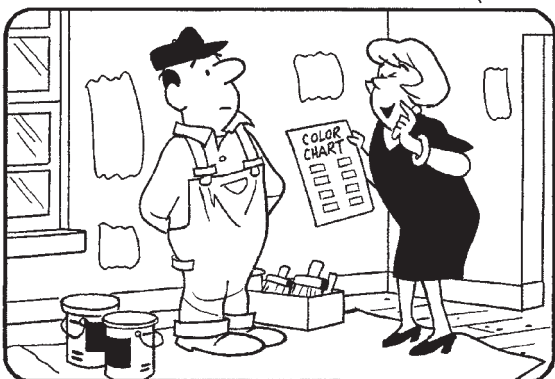
